## Become a Volunteer Women's Group Facilitator

CPAF's shelters host weekly group meetings for clients where space is held for processing and healing. During group meetings, clients participate in art activities, guided discussion, and personal reflections.

**CPAF invites you to apply to be a Volunteer Facilitator.**

Volunteer Women's Group facilitators create a safe space for survivors to continue their healing journey. Volunteers work closely with Family Advocates to plan sessions, coordinate activities, and lead or co-lead the group meeting. Time is also provided for volunteers to practice self-care and process what was said during group with CPAF staff. Women's Group meetings are held every Thursday, from 10am - 12pm and from 6 - 8pm.

Requirements: LiveScan Background check; TB test; volunteer application and interview; completion of CPAF's 65-hour Advocate Training
