



**Study Title:** Attitudes, beliefs, and knowledge related to medical care and research

If you decide to take part in this study, you will be asked to complete 1 HIT using the Amazon Mechanical Turk (MTurk) service. It will take about 15-25 minutes to complete the tasks. The tasks will ask questions about your attitudes, beliefs, and knowledge about some topics related to medical care and research. We estimate that approximately 7000 people will take part in this study.

The risks of participation are minimal. Some of the questions may be upsetting or make you feel uncomfortable. You can skip any of the questions you do not want to answer. Amazon may use this data you provide as per its privacy agreement. To protect the confidentiality of the data, data will be transmitted in an encrypted format (readable only to authorized personnel). There are no expected benefits.

By participating in the Mechanical Turk experiments you will be paid \$0.50 via the Mechanical Turk interface. No direct payments will be sent from the University of Rochester research lab. The University of Rochester makes every effort to keep the information collected from you private. Results of the research may be presented at meetings or in publications, without any reference to you.

**Your participation in this study is completely voluntary.** You are free not to participate or to withdraw at any time, for whatever reason.
