

Podcast #26 – Why do the Heathen Rage?

- 'Why do the Heathen Rage' study comes from Acts 4:25 and Psalms 2:1
- What we see today with all the destruction, may be a sign of the end times
- In the book of Acts, rage in the Greek #5433 means 'too snort like a horse'
- In the book of Psalms, rage in the Hebrew #7283 means 'tumultuous or a crowd of insurrection'
- The heathen gather in groups for their strength, just like when the crowd with mob mentality yelled out to free the known criminal Barabbas and instead to kill Jesus Christ
- The majority of these are weak and don't confront the "strongman" (or woman)
- Instead they try to find the weak or somebody that is alone by themselves to attack
- The Bible book of Acts provides an example for us today
- We need to ask ourselves, "what did the apostles do when heathen raged against them or came against them in large groups?" So, what did the apostles do?
- Here is the answer...they did these 3 things:
 - 1. they turned to the Lord
 - 2. they prayed and
 - 3. then with confidence, preached the truth
- They did these things without looting or hurting others
- We also need to abide by I Timothy 5:8 which is to Provide, Protect and Defend all those
 in our household (I call this the PPD for easy memorizing)



- This is a great topic to keep in mind, so we don't become one like the heathen
- Remember, Christians get their strength from the Lord
- Psalms 2 continues: God laughs at His enemies (whoa...I'd hate to be one of those...)
- So remember; you don't have to worry about a group being stronger than you but always be prepared to fight if and when necessary. Yes, train in self-defense
- What are some of the main signs when evil is involved?
- Ephesians Chapter 6, we battle not just against flesh and blood (physical confrontations) but against spiritual wickedness in high places and leaders of darkness in the world
- So, how do they show themselves what are the tests or criteria to verify evil?
 - 1. One is evil always has or produces **confusion**
 - 2. Two is evil always leaves a **bitter** taste, smell or environment
- Confusion can lead people to doing something wrong. i.e. against the Lord and His word
- Stop and Think; are you (they) hurting someone, breaking things or stealing things?
- Everything we do affects other people (We know you know...but good to review often:)
- The Apostles battled with the biggest hammer there is... the Word of God
- We have to always stop and ask ourselves, "are you/we proud of what you/we do?"
- A God-believing person sits down at night and thinks about how they can improve for tomorrow. Are you proud of what you did this day?
- If you feel ashamed, then you're probably on the wrong side
- Remember to fill yourself up with the Fruits of the Holy Spirit (7 fruits) and put on the
 Armor of God (7 pieces) from Ephesians Chapter 6
- The Armor of God Piece #7 is...to pray for the saints, so be a Christian prayer warrior
- Easy way to remember these relevant scriptures: Psalms 2 & Acts 4 (2 -4)
- So which of our government or society leaders are worthy of following?
- Ask yourself, 'are they publically ashamed of the Lord, the Word of God or prayer?'
- We, Christian Warrior Academy, suggest we NOT follow those who are ashamed. Be
 aware and mark those for the next election in our country and the world
- To summarize, how did the Apostles create change during times of unrest? (Phil Ch. 4)
 What they did was PRAY and use the NAME of the Lord Jesus Christ
