

Galloway's 2000 Thornton sparks Bear win

History was made last night in San Francisco State's little gymnasium as Colleen Galloway went over the 2000 career point total and Cal's women's basketball handily beat the Gators, 70-56.

It was a refreshing sight for Gooch Foster, whose team rebounded nicely from an unimpressive loss against Fullerton last Saturday. The Bears jumped out to a 9-0 lead and kept it the entire game.

And at 7:48 left in the second half, Galloway found daylight in the corner, and popped in numbers 1999 and 2000 with her patented two-handed jumper.

She finished with 19 points to lead all scorers. Brenda DeBacco played 25 minutes and finished with 12 points and eight assists, her best performance of the season.

Chris Sellin scored 10 points, and Karen Smith played all 40 minutes, scoring six points and earning six assists.

Still a problem for the Bears — to say the least — was their free throw shooting. Once near 80 percent, Saturday they shot 37 percent, and last night they were 2-13

for a hilarious 15 percent. Well, Foster might not see much humor in it.

The Bears will go into San Jose State Friday night with a 13-8 record and tied for first place in the NorCal Conference with the Spartans.

San Jose is surprising the entire conference, as it is playing at a level not thought possible without last year's forwards, Debbie Johnson and Winnie Gazzoway.

But last Saturday, Sharon Chatman's team showed how strong it still is when it beat USF, 53-51, to remain undefeated and deal the Dons their second conference loss.

"Neither team played well," said Chatman, in her usual non-nonsense style, "but we won because we were able to come back from an awful first half."

The Spartans shot 33 percent in the first half, and committed 15 turnovers. In the second half, they shot 55 percent and turned the ball over only twice.

"We had some early losses, but I always felt confident that we could do well in conference. I just wasn't sure how well. I'm still not sure just how well we can do."

Cal has two days to ponder that same question.
