Bible Trivia. Make a list of Bible questions that are age-appropriate for various members of the family. For example: Who built an ark to be saved from a flood? Divide into two teams. Members of teams can take turns asking trivia questions of the opposing team. When the game ends, talk about how important it is to learn from God's Word.
