Your Doctor has Prescribed a Dexcom G5® Continuous Glucose Monitoring (CGM) System.

Unlike fingersticks that show your glucose for one point in time, the Dexcom CGM System shows where your glucose is heading and how fast it's getting there with readings every five minutes.

Your doctor has prescribed the Dexcom G5 because you meet the criteria below to qualify for Medicare coverage:

- I have Type 1 or Type 2 diabetes requiring insulin at least 3 times/day or on an insulin pump.
- I need to make frequent insulin dosing adjustments based on the Dexcom CGM readings.
- I currently test my blood sugar 4 or more times a day.
- I have seen my provider within the last 6 months and will continue to see my provider every six (6) months following the initial prescription of the CGM.

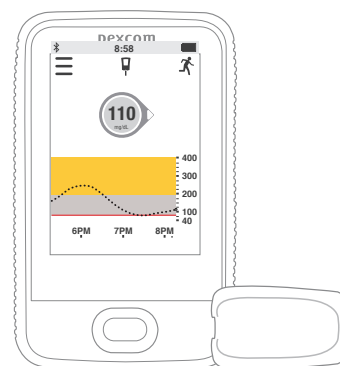

- 1 A Dexcom Patient Sales Specialist will call you to go over any questions you may have.
- 2 When you receive your Dexcom G5 CGM system bundle, a Welcome Card is included to give you a step-by-step introduction for a successful start to your CGM system.
- 3 Your Dexcom G5 CGM system bundle will include:

Welcome Card
1 receiver
1 transmitter
5 sensors
Quick Start Guide
Blood glucose meter
Test strips
Other necessary testing supplies



A Dexcom receiver is included with the Dexcom CGM System.

- 4 During your "Getting Started" period, regular emails will be sent to you from Dexcom to help you with your transition.
- 5 A Dexcom diabetes educator will call you to answer your questions and assist with your CGM training.
- 6 Your Dexcom provider will contact you monthly to confirm and ship your supplies.

BRIEF SAFETY STATEMENT: The Dexcom G5 Continuous Glucose Monitoring (CGM) System ("G5") is a glucose monitoring system indicated for the management of diabetes in persons age 2 years and older. The G5 is designed to replace fingerstick blood glucose testing for diabetes treatment decisions. The G5 also aids in the detection of episodes of hyperglycemia and hypoglycemia. The G5 is intended for single patient use and requires a prescription. **CONTRAINDICATIONS** Do not rely on the G5 CGM data if you have recently taken acetaminophen. Remove the G5 (sensor, transmitter, and receiver) before Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI), Computed Tomography (CT) scan, or high-frequency electrical heat (diathermy) treatment. The G5 is MRI Unsafe. Do not bring any portion of the G5 into the MRI environment. **WARNING** CGM-based diabetes treatment decisions are only approved with the G5, not previous generations of Dexcom CGM systems. Calibrate at least once every 12 hours using a fingerstick. If your G5 does not display a sensor glucose reading and an arrow, or if you are getting inaccurate or inconsistent readings, take a fingerstick. If your glucose readings and alerts do not match your symptoms or expectations, take a fingerstick to confirm. Failure to do so may lead to hyperglycemia or hypoglycemia. The G5 is not approved for use in pregnant women, persons on dialysis or critically ill persons. If a sensor breaks and no portion of it is visible above the skin, do not attempt to remove it. Seek professional medical help if you have infection or inflammation on or near the sensor insertion point. Report broken sensors to Dexcom Technical Support. Sensor placement is not approved for sites other than under the skin of the belly (ages 2 years and older) or upper buttocks (ages 2-17 years).
