## <u>DIVISION OF INTERNAL INVESTIGATION</u> FY2006 ANNUAL STATISTICAL REPORT

The Division of Internal Investigation (DII) opened 298 cases of Illinois State Police employee misconduct during Fiscal Year (FY) 2006. In 86 investigations completed by DII, 35 employees were exonerated; 50 employees received discipline and 1 case is still open. Cases of less serious transgressions (212) were referred to the employee's division to investigate.

In FY06, there were 265 cases of employee misconduct reported by other agencies under the purview of the Governor. Of those cases initiated, 98 were investigated by DII and 167 were referred back to the originating agency for investigation. Of those cases investigated by DII, 57 were cleared, 14 were sustained and in 26 cases the prosecutor declined to prosecute the subject. There is one (1) case still open.

In FY06, 1,422 background investigations were completed. The Retirees Hireback Program completed it seventh year with 56 retirees enrolled and available to conduct background investigations. Due to this program, full-time investigators were able to devote 6,935 hours or 867 work-days of time during the year to handle more critical investigations.
