Standard Knitting Machine Pattern



I used 1 strand of blue mercerized cotton yarn Nm 2/10. The finished sweater weights 310 gr (11 oz). It was knitted with Tension 5, Stitch Dial 4.

Gauge Swatch:

- 33.90 Stitches & 55.05 Rows per 10 cm (4 in).
- Or
- Width of 40 stitches – 11.8 cm (4.7 in);
- Height of 60 rows – 10.90 cm (4.3 in).

The sweater was knitted on my [Silver Reed SK 840](#) , standard electronic knitting machine, using main bed and ribber.

Front and Back are Identical

Start with the carriage at right. Arrange 196 stitches .. LN98..RN98...for the K2 P2 Rib. Cast on using the Broken Toe Cast On method.

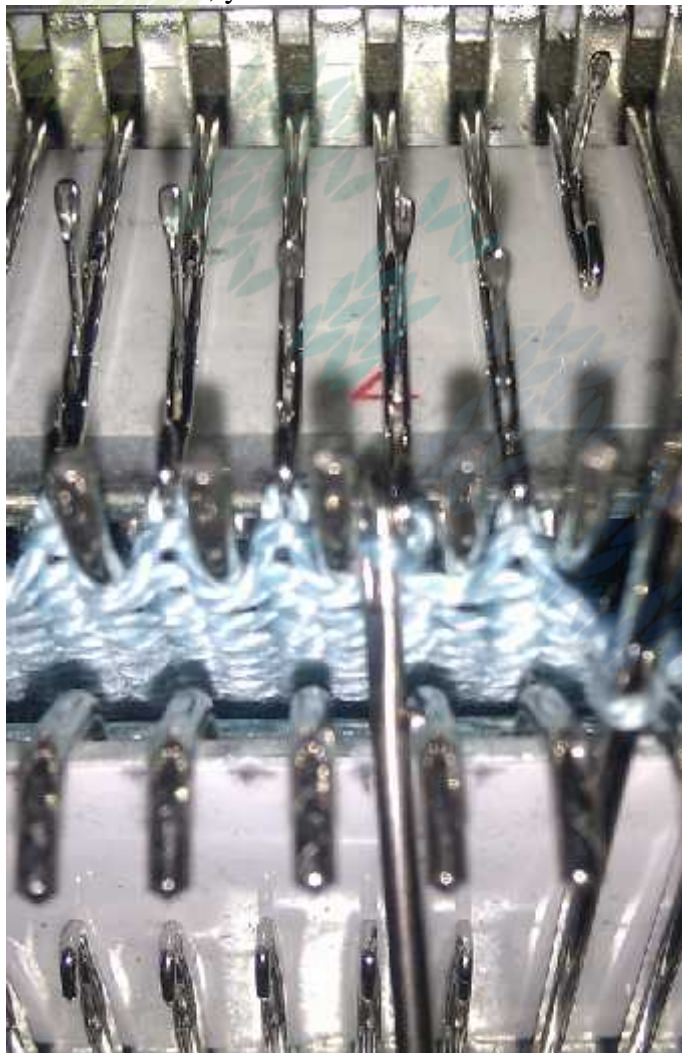

Finish welt with carriage at right.

Transfer all the stitches from the ribber to the main bed.

Knit 258 rows of Stockinette.

Transfer the necessary stitches from the main bed to the ribber for the K2 P2 Rib. Where 1 stitch must remain on main bed also, you transfer the heel of that stitch on the ribber, like so:



Knit 35 rows of K2 P2 Rib (springy version).
Casf off. End of the piece.

As you saw, this sweater is pretty simple, the sewing part is done differently than usual.

Put front and back one on top of the other, with wrong sides between them (right sides outside), sideways with the welt of 70 rows on the left and the welt of 35 rows on the right.

Sew the bottom of the front and back together.

For the top part:

- from left to right, sew together only the welt of 70 rows of the front and back.
- from right to left (where the welt is 35 rows), sew 24 cm of front and back together.

I sewed the bended welt of 70 rows in 4 points: top, bottom and each center of front and back. I did this because it tends to unbend when you wear the sweater.

Now, the sweater is finished.

Hopefully, I made myself clear enough. If not, just look at the picture and you will understand how it needs to be sewed and how you wear it.
