IMPORTANT NOTICE TO VENDORS AND PURCHASERS

Before signing this contract you should ensure that you understand your rights and obligations, some of which are not written in this contract but are implied by law.

WARNING—SMOKE ALARMS

The owners of certain types of buildings and strata lots must have smoke alarms (or in certain cases heat alarms) installed in the building or lot in accordance with regulations under the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*. It is an offence not to comply. It is also an offence to remove or interfere with a smoke alarm or heat alarm. Penalties apply.

WARNING—LOOSE-FILL ASBESTOS INSULATION

Before purchasing land that includes any residential premises (within the meaning of Division 1A of Part 8 of the Home Building act 1989) built before 1985, a purchaser is strongly advised to consider the possibility that the premises may contain loose-fill asbestos insulation (within the meaning of Division 1A of Part 8 of the Home Building Act 1989). In particular, a purchaser should:

- (a) search the Register required to be maintained under Division 1A of Part 8 of the Home Building Act 1989, and
- (b) ask the relevant local council whether it holds any records showing that the residential premises contain loose-fill asbestos insulation.

For further information about loose-fill asbestos insulation (including areas in which residential premises have been identified as containing loose-fill asbestos insulation), contact NSW Fair Trading.

COOLING OFF PERIOD (PURCHASER'S RIGHTS)

- 1. This is the statement required by section 66X of the *Conveyancing Act* 1919 and applies to a contract for the sale of residential property.
- 2. The purchaser may rescind the contract at any time before 5 p.m. on the fifth business day after the day on which the contract was made, EXCEPT in the circumstances listed in paragraph 3.
- 3. There is NO COOLING OFF PERIOD:
 - (a) if, at or before the time the contract is made, the purchaser gives to the vendor (or the vendor's solicitor or agent) a certificate that complies with section 66W of the Act, or
 - (b) if the property is sold by public auction, or
 - (c) if the contract is made on the same day as the property was offered for sale by public auction but passed in, or
 - (d) if the contract is made in consequence of the exercise of an option to purchase the property, other than an option that is void under section 66ZG of the Act.
- 4. A purchaser exercising the right to sool off by rescinding the contract will forfeit to the vendor 0.25% of the purchase price of the property. The vendor is entitled to recover the amount forfeited from any amount paid by the purchaser as a deposit under the contract and the purchaser is entitled to a perfund of any balance.

DISPUTES

If you get into a dispette with the other party, the Law Society and Real Estate Institute encourage you to use informal procedures such as negotiation, independent expert appraisal, the Law Society Conveyancing Dispute Resolution Scheme or mediation (for example mediation under the Law Society Mediation Program).

AUCTIONS

Regulations made under the Property, Stock and Business Agents Act 2002 prescribe a number of conditions applying to sales by auction.

- 2. A lease may be affected by the Agricultural Tenancies 40t 1990, the Residential Tenancies Act 2010 or the Retail Leases Act 1994.
- 3. If any purchase money is owing to the Crown will become payable before obtaining consent, or if no consent is needed, when the transfer is registered.
- 4. If a consent to transfer is required under egislation, see clause 27 as to the obligations of the parties.
- 5. The vendor should continue the vendor's insurance until completion. If the vendor wants to give the purchaser possession before completion, the vendor should first ask the insurer to confirm this will not affect the insurance.
- 6. The purchaser will usually have to pay stamp duty (and sometimes surcharge purchaser duty) on this contract. If duty is not paid on time, a purchaser may incur penalties.
- 7. If the purchase Lagrees to the release of deposit, the purchaser's right to recover the deposit may stand behind the rights of others (for example the vendor's mortgagee).
- 8. The purchaser should arrange insurance as appropriate.
- 9. Some transactions involving personal property may be affected by the Personal Property Securities Act 2009.
- 10. A purchaser should be satisfied that finance will be available at the time of completing the purchase.
- 11. Where the market value of the property is at or above a legislated amount, the purchaser may have to comply with a foreign resident capital gains withholding payment obligation (even if the vendor is not a foreign resident). If so, this will affect the amount available to the vendor on completion.
- 12. Purchasers of some residential properties may have to withhold part of the purchase price to be credited towards the GST liability of the vendor. If so, this will also affect the amount available to the vendor.

The vendor sells and the purchaser buys the property for the price under these provisions instead of Schedule 3 Conveyancing Act 1919, subject to any legislation that cannot be excluded.

- If this contract requires the purchaser to pay any of the deposit by a later time, that time is also essential. 2.3
- The purchaser can pay any of the deposit by giving cash (up to \$2,000) or by unconditionally giving a cheque 2.4 to the depositholder or to the vendor, vendor's agent or vendor's solicitor for sending to the depositholder.
- If any of the deposit is not paid on time or a cheque for any of the deposit is not honoured on presentation, 2.5 the vendor can terminate. This right to terminate is lost as soon as the deposit is paid in full.
- If the vendor accepts a bond or guarantee for the deposit, clauses 2.1 to 2.5 do not apply. 2.6
- If the vendor accepts a bond or guarantee for part of the deposit, clauses 2.1 to 2.5 apply only to the balance. 2.7

BREACH OF COPYRIGHT MAY RESULT IN LEGAL ACTION

- If any of the deposit or of the balance of the price is paid before completion to the vendor or as the vendor 2.8 directs, it is a charge on the land in favour of the purchaser until termination by the vendor or completion, subject to any existing right.

Error or misdescription

- The purchaser can (but only before completion) claim compensation for an error or misdescription in this 6.1 contract (as to the property, the title or anything else and whether substantial or not).
- This clause applies even if the purchaser did not take notice of or rely on anything in this contract containing 6.2 or giving rise to the error or misdescription.
- However, this clause does not apply to the extent the purchaser knows the true position. 6.3

7 Claims by purchaser

The purchaser can make a claim (including a claim under clause 6) before completion only by serving it with a statement of the amount claimed, and if the purchaser makes one or more claims before completion -

- the vendor can rescind if in the case of claims that are not claims for delay -7.1
 - the total amount claimed exceeds 5% of the price; 7.1.1
 - the vendor serves notice of intention to rescind; and 7.1.2
 - the purchaser does not serve notice waiving the claims within 14 days after that service; and 7.1.3
- if the vendor does not rescind, the parties must complete and if this contract is completed -7.2

 - any change in the property due to fair wear and tear before completion; 10.1.4

- a promise, representation or statement about this contract, the property or the title, not set out or 10.1.5 referred to in this contract;
- a condition, exception, reservation or restriction in a Crown grant; 10.1.6
- the existence of any authority or licence to explore or prospect for gas, minerals or petroleum; 10.1.7
- any easement or restriction on use the substance of either of which is disclosed in this contract 10.1.8 or any non-compliance with the easement or restriction on use; or
- anything the substance of which is disclosed in this contract (except a caveat, charge, mortgage, 10.1.9 priority notice or writ).
- The purchaser cannot rescind or terminate only because of a defect in title to or quality of the inclusions. 10.2
- Normally, the purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate or require the vendor to 10.3 change the nature of the title disclosed in this contract (for example, to remove a caution evidencing qualified title, or to lodge a plan of survey as regards limited title).

11 Compliance with work orders

- Normally, the vendor must by completion comply with a work order made on or before the contract date and 11.1 if this contract is completed the purchaser must comply with any other work order.
- If the purchaser complies with a work order, and this contract is rescinded or terminated, the vendor must 11.2 pay the expense of compliance to the purchaser.

Certificates and inspections 12

The vendor must do everything reasonable to enable the purchaser, subject to the nts of any tenant –

- to have the property inspected to obtain any certificate or report reasonably re-12.1
- to apply (if necessary in the name of the vendor) for -12.2
 - any certificate that can be given in respect of the property under legislation; or 12.2.1
 - 12.2.2 a copy of any approval, certificate, consent, direction, naties or order in respect of the property given under legislation, even if given after the contract one, and
- to make 1 inspection of the property in the 3 days before a time appointed for completion. 12.3

13 Goods and services tax (GST)

- Terms used in this clause which are not defined elsewhere in this contract and have a defined meaning in the 13.1 GST Act have the same meaning in this clause.
- pount to the other party under this contract, GST is not Normally, if a party must pay the price or any other 13.2 to be added to the price or amount.
- If under this contract a party must make an adjustment or payment for an expense of another party or pay an 13.3 expense payable by or to a third party (for example, under clauses 14 or 20.7) -
 - 13.3.1
 - the party must adjust or pay on completion any GST added to or included in the expense; but the amount of the expense must be reduced to the extent the party receiving the adjustment or payment (or the representative member of a GST group of which that party is a member) is 13.3.2 entitled to an input taxcredit for the expense; and

- On completion the vendor must give the purchaser any document of title that relates only to the property. 16.1

- Normally, on completion the vendor must cause the legal title to the property (being an estate in fee simple) 16.3 to pass to the purchaser free of any mortgage or other interest, subject to any necessary registration.

- If the vendor gives the purchaser a document (other than the transfer) that needs to be lodged for 16.5 registration, the vendor must pay the lodgement fee to the purchaser, plus another 20% of that fee.
- If a party serves a land tax certificate showing a charge on any of the land, on completion the vendor must 16.6 give the purchaser a land tax certificate showing the charge is no longer effective against the land.

Purchaser

Place for completion

- Normally, the parties must complete at the completion address, which is –

 16.11.1 if a special completion address is stated in this contract that address; or

19 Rescission of contract

 - the deposit and any other money paid by the purchaser under this contract must be refunded; 1921
 - a party can claim for a reasonable adjustment if the purchaser has been in possession; 19.2.2
 - a party can claim for damages, costs or expenses arising out of a breach of this contract; and 19.2.3
 - a party will not otherwise be liable to pay the other party any damages, costs or expenses. 19.2.4

20 Miscellaneous

- The parties acknowledge that anything stated in this contract to be attached was attached to this contract by 20.1 the vendor before the purchaser signed it and is part of this contract.
- Anything attached to this contract is part of this contract. 20.2
- An area, bearing or dimension in this contract is only approximate. 20.3
- 20.4
- If a party consists of 2 or more persons, this contract benefits and binds them separately and together. A party's solicitor can receive any amount payable to the party under this contract or direct in writing that it is 20.5 to be paid to another person.
- A document under or relating to this contract is -20.6
 - signed by a party if it is signed by the party or the party or the party of the par 20.6.1
 - served if it is served by the party or the party's society 20.6.2
 - served if it is served on the party's solicitor, even if the party has died or any of them has died: 20.6.3
 - 20.6.4
 - served if it is served in any manner provided 170 of the Conveyancing Act 1919; served if it is sent by email or fax to the part's solicitor, unless in either case it is not received; 20.6.5
 - served on a person if it (or a copy of it) comes into the possession of the person; and 20.6.6
 - served at the earliest time it is served if it is served more than once. 20.6.7
- 20.7
- An obligation to pay an expense of another party of doing something is an obligation to pay –

 20.7.1 if the party does the thing personally the reasonable cost of getting someone else to do it; or

 20.7.2 if the party pays someone else to do the thing the amount paid, to the extent it is reasonable.

 Rights under clauses 11, 13, 14, 17, 34, 30 and 31 continue after completion, whether or not other rights
- Rights under clauses 11, 13, 14, 17 20.8 continue.
- 20.9
- The vendor does not promise represent or state that the purchaser has any cooling off rights.

 The vendor does not promise represent or state that any attached survey report is accurate or current. 20.10
- A reference to any legislation (including any percentage or rate specified in legislation) is also a reference to 20.11 any corresponding later legislation.

 Each party must do inatever is necessary after completion to carry out the party's obligations under this
- 20.12 contract.
- Neither taking possession nor serving a transfer of itself implies acceptance of the property or the title. 20.13
- The details and information provided in this contract (for example, on pages 1 3) are, to the extent of each 20.14 party's knowledge, true, and are part of this contract.
- Where this contract provides for choices, a choice in BLOCK CAPITALS applies unless a different choice is 20.15 marked.

21 Time limits in these provisions

- If the time for something to be done or to happen is not stated in these provisions, it is a reasonable time. 21.1
- If there are conflicting times for something to be done or to happen, the latest of those times applies. 21.2
- The time for one thing to be done or to happen does not extend the time for another thing to be done or to 21.3 happen.
- If the time for something to be done or to happen is the 29th, 30th or 31st day of a month, and the day does 21.4 not exist, the time is instead the last day of the month.
- If the time for something to be done or to happen is a day that is not a business day, the time is extended to 21.5 the next business day, except in the case of clauses 2 and 3.2.
- 21.6 Normally, the time by which something must be done is fixed but not essential.

Foreign Acquisitions and Takeovers Act 1975 22

 - 23.2.3 'contribution' includes an amount payable under a by-law;
 - 23.2.4 'information certificate' includes a certificate under s184 Strata Schemes Management Act 2015 and s26 Community Land Management Act 1989;
 - 23.2.5 'information notice' includes a strata information notice under s22 Strata Schemes Management Act 2015 and a notice under s47 Community Land Management Act 1989;
 - 23.2.6 'normal expenses', in relation to an owners corporation for a scheme, means normal operating expenses usually payable from the administrative fund of an owners corporation for a scheme of the same kind;
 - 23.2.7 'owners corporation' means the owners corporation or the association for the scheme or any higher scheme;
 - 23.2.8 'the *property*' includes any interest in common property for the scheme associated with the lot; and
 - 23.2.9 'special expenses', in relation to an owners corporation, heans its actual, contingent or expected expenses, except to the extent they are
 - normal expenses;
 - due to fair wear and tear;
 - disclosed in this contract; or
 - covered by moneys held in the capital works fund.
- 23.3 Clauses 11, 14.8 and 18.4 do not apply to an obligation of the owners corporation, or to property insurable by
- 23.4 Clauses 14.4.2 and 14.5 apply but on a unit enatlement basis instead of an area basis.

Adjustments and liability for expects

- 23.5 The parties must adjust under claus
 - 23.5.1 a regular periodic contribution;
 - 23.5.2 a contribution which is not a regular periodic contribution but is disclosed in this contract; and
 - on a unit entitlement basis, any amount paid by the vendor for a normal expense of the owners corporation to the extent the owners corporation has not paid the amount to the vendor.

 - 23.9.1 the special expenses of the owners corporation at the later of the contract date and the creation of the owners corporation when calculated on a unit entitlement basis (and, if more than one lot or a higher scheme is involved, added together), less any contribution paid by the vendor, are more than 1% of the price;
 - 23.9.2 in the case of the lot or a relevant lot or former lot in a higher scheme -
 - a proportional unit entitlement for the lot is not disclosed in this contract; or
 - a proportional unit entitlement for the lot is disclosed in this contract but the lot has a different proportional unit entitlement at the contract date or at any time before completion;
 - 23.9.3 a change before the contract date or before completion in the scheme or a higher scheme substantially disadvantages the purchaser and is not disclosed in this contract; or

- a resolution is passed by the owners corporation before the contract date or before completion to 23.9.4 give a strata renewal plan to the owners in the scheme for their consideration and there is not attached to this contract a strata renewal proposal or the strata renewal plan.
- Notices, certificates and inspections

 - shows its date, general nature, names of parties and any registration number; and 25.4.1
 - has attached a legible photocopy of it or of an official or registration copy of it. 25.4.2
- An abstract of title -25.5
 - must start with a good root of title (if the good root of title must be at least 30 years old, this 25.5.1 means 30 years old at the contract date);
 - in the case of a leasehold interest, must include an abstract of the lease and any higher lease: 25.5.2
 - normally, need not include a Crown grant; and 25.5.3

- To the extent the vendor is liable for any interest until completion. 26.3
- To the extent the purchaser is liable for it, the parties must adjust any interest under clause 14.1. 26.4
- Consent to transfer 27
- This clause applies only if the land (or part of it) cannot be transferred without consent under legislation or a 27.1 planning agreement.
- The purchaser must properly complete and then serve the purchaser's part of an application for consent to 27.2 transfer of the land (or part of it) within 7 days after the contract date.
- The vendor must apply for consent within 7 days after service of the purchaser's part. 27.3
- If consent is refused, either party can rescind. 27.4
- If consent is given subject to one or more conditions that will substantially disadvantage a party, then that 27.5 party can rescind within 7 days after receipt by or service upon the party of written notice of the conditions.
- 27.6 If consent is not given or refused
 - within 42 days after the purchaser serves the purchaser's part of the application, the purchaser 27.6.1 can rescind; or
 - within 30 days after the application is made, either party can rescind. 27.6.2





SEWERED AREAS

As requested the Plan of House Drainage for the above property is attached. These notes are intended to provide information relating to this property. Applicants are requested to ensure that intending purchasers are made fully aware of all aspects of both these notes and the attached Plan. Please note the following important points:-

1. MidCoast Water Services' policy "Building over or adjacent to Watermains, Sewers or Sewerage Rising Mains" basically prohibits any new buildings to be erected closer than 1.5 meters to a Council pipe. This policy also requires special footings to be used when a building is within the 'Zone of Influence' of a sewer.

Residents, builders, developers etc. should note that the existence of a sewer, watermain or sewerage rising main can, and will, prohibit the extent of a development that will be permitted on a block. In the case of sewers, this also applies to a sewer located close to the boundary even if it is within an adjacent block. These restrictions apply to all types of building including houses, garages, sheds, carports etc.

Please contact MidCoast Water Services if you need any clarification on the implication of this policy. Full details are available upon request.

- 2. This Plan indicates the approximate location of existing buildings and pipelines. The issue of the diagram does not imply that the existing plumbing has been inspected by MidCoast Water Services nor that it complies with any standard or code.
- 3. Where there are existing buildings on the site, the issue of this Plan does not imply that they have been erected in accordance with the requirements of a Structural Engineer in relation to any 'Zone of Influence' effects.
- 4. The information on this Plan has been supplied by other parties and MidCoast Water Services will not be held responsible for the accuracy of any details shown. We do, however, endeavour to ensure that drainage diagrams are as accurate as practical when issued.
- 5. The attached Plan indicates the approximate location of Council's sewers only in relation to the abovementioned land.
- 6. It is an offence under the Local Government Act to discharge any rain water or surface water into Council's sewers.
- 7. Development charges will be applied if any new development on this land has a capacity of

more than 1 equivalent tenement (e.g. Development charges will apply for the erection of 2 or more villas, flats, etc. as opposed to one house).

- 8. In the case of non-domestic premises, both new and existing developments may require a Liquid Trade Waste approval. The issue of this Plan does not imply that any such Liquid Trade Waste approval currently exists. Further information should be obtained from MidCoast Water Services. It is an offence to discharge sewage, other than of a domestic nature, into a Council sewer without approval.
- 9. This Plan is issued in accordance with section 17, 18 and 19 of the Local Government (Water Services) Regulations 1999. These notes form part of the Plan and must remain attached it. Any Plan of House Drainage without these notes should not be considered as a true copy.


