IMPORTANT NOTICE TO VENDORS AND PURCHASERS

Before signing this contract you should ensure that you understand your rights and obligations, some of which are not written in this contract but are implied by law.

WARNING—SMOKE ALARMS

The owners of certain types of buildings and strata lots must have smoke alarms (or in certain cases heat alarms) installed in the building or lot in accordance with regulations under the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*. It is an offence not to comply, it is also an offence to remove or interfere with a smoke alarm or heat alarm. Penalties apply.

WARNING—LOOSE-FILL ASBESTOS INSULATION

Before purchasing land that includes any residential premises (within the meaning of Division 1A of Part 8 of the *Home Building Act 1989*) built before 1985, a purchaser is strongly advised to consider the possibility that the premises may contain loose-fill asbestos insulation (within the meaning of Division 1A of Part 8 of the *Home Building Act 1989*). In particular, a purchaser should:

- (a) search the Register required to be maintained under Division 1A of Part 8 of the *Home Building Act 1989*, and
- (b) ask the relevant local council whether it holds any records showing that the residential premises contain loose-fill asbestos insulation.

COOLING OFF PERIOD (PURCHASER'S RIGHTS)

- 1. This is the statement required by section 66X of the *Conveyancing Act* 1919 and applies to a contract for the sale of residential property.
- 2. The purchaser may rescind the contract at any time before 5 p.m. on the fifth business day after the day on which the contract was made, EXCEPT in the circumstances listed in paragraph 3.
- 3. There is NO COOLING OFF PERIOD:
 - (a) if, at or before the time the contract is made, the purchaser gives to the vendor (or the vendor's solicitor or agent) a certificate that complies with section 66W of the Act, or
 - (b) if the property is sold by public auction, or
 - (c) if the contract is made on the same day as the property was offered for sale by public auction but passed in, or
 - (d) if the contract is made in consequence of the exercise of an option to purchase the property, other than an option that is void under section 66ZG of the Act.
- 4. A purchaser exercising the right to cool off by rescinding the contract will forfeit to the vendor 0.25% of the purchase price of the property. The vendor is entitled to recover the amount forfeited from any amount paid by the purchaser as a deposit under the contract and the purchaser is entitled to a refund of any balance.

DISPUTES

If you get into a dispute with the other party, the Law Society and Real Estate Institute encourage you to use informal procedures such as negotiation, independent expert appraisal, the Law Society Conveyancing Dispute Resolution Scheme or mediation (for example mediation under the Law Society Mediation Program).

AUCTIONS

Regulations made under the Property, Stock and Business Agents Act 2002 prescribe a number of conditions applying to sales by auction.

- 2. A lease may be affected by the Agricultural Tenancies Act 1990, the Residential Tenancies Act 2010 or the Retail Leases Act 1994.
- 3. If any purchase money is owing to the Crown, it will become payable before obtaining consent, or if no consent is needed, when the transfer is registered.
- 4. If a consent to transfer is required under legislation, see clause 27 as to the obligations of the parties.
- 5. The vendor should continue the vendor's insurance until completion. If the vendor wants to give the purchaser possession before completion, the vendor should first ask the insurer to confirm this will not affect the insurance.
- 6. The purchaser will usually have to pay stamp duty (and sometimes surcharge purchaser duty) on this contract. If duty is not paid on time, a purchaser may incur penalties.
- 7. If the purchaser agrees to the release of deposit, the purchaser's right to recover the deposit may stand behind the rights of others (for example the vendor's mortgagee).
- 8. The purchaser should arrange insurance as appropriate.
- 9. Some transactions involving personal property may be affected by the Personal Property Securities Act 2009.
- 10. A purchaser should be satisfied that finance will be available at the time of completing the purchase.
- 11. Where the market value of the property is at or above a legislated amount, the purchaser may have to comply with a foreign resident capital gains withholding payment obligation (even if the vendor is not a foreign resident). If so, this will affect the amount available to the vendor on completion.
- 12. Purchasers of some residential properties may have to withhold part of the purchase price to be credited towards the GST liability of the vendor. If so, this will also affect the amount available to the vendor.

The vendor sells and the purchaser buys the property for the price under these provisions instead of Schedule 3 Conveyancing Act 1919, subject to any legislation that cannot be excluded.

Definitions (a term in italics is a defined term)

a certificate within the meaning of s14-220 of Schedule 1 to the TA Act, that clearance certificate

covers one or more days falling within the period from and including the contract

date to completion:

a deposit bond or guarantee from an issuer, with an expiry date and for an amount deposit-bond

each approved by the vendor:

vendor's agent (or if no vendor's agent is named in this contract, the vendor's depositholder

solicitor, or if no vendor's solicitor is named in this contract, the buyer's agent);

document relevant to the title or the passing of title; document of title

the percentage mentioned in s14-200(3)(a) of Schedule 1 to the TA Act (12.5% as FRCGW percentage

the rate mentioned in s4 of A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax GST rate

normally

each of the vendor and the purchaser; party

the land, the improvements, all fixtures and the inclusions, but not the exclusions; property planning agreement

Planning and Assessment Act 1979 entered into in relation to the property;

reauisition

an objection, question or requisition (but the term does not include a claim); the lesser of the FRCGW percentage of the price (inclusive of GST, if any) and the remittance amount

amount specified in a variation served by a party;

rescind this contract from the beginning; rescind

payment which the purchaser must make under s14-250 of Schedule 1 to the TA RW payment

Deposit and other payments before completion 2

solicitor

The purchaser must pay the deposit to the depositholder as stakeholder. 2.1

- Normally, the purchaser must pay the deposit on the making of this contract, and this time is essential. 2.2
- If this contract requires the purchaser to pay any of the deposit by a later time, that time is also essential. 2.3
- The purchaser can pay any of the deposit by giving cash (up to \$2,000) or by unconditionally giving a cheque 2.4 to the depositholder or to the vendor, vendor's agent or vendor's solicitor for sending to the depositholder.
- If any of the deposit is not paid on time or a cheque for any of the deposit is not honoured on presentation, 2.5 the vendor can terminate. This right to terminate is lost as soon as the deposit is paid in full.
- If the vendor accepts a bond or guarantee for the deposit, clauses 2.1 to 2.5 do not apply. 2.6
- If the vendor accepts a bond or guarantee for part of the deposit, clauses 2.1 to 2.5 apply only to the balance. 2.7

Land – 2018 edition

- 2.8 If any of the deposit or of the balance of the price is paid before completion to the vendor or as the vendor directs, it is a charge on the land in favour of the purchaser until *termination* by the vendor or completion, subject to any existing right.
- 2.9 If each *party* tells the *depositholder* that the deposit is to be invested, the *depositholder* is to invest the deposit (at the risk of the *party* who becomes entitled to it) with a *bank*, in an interest-bearing account in NSW, payable at call, with interest to be reinvested, and pay the interest to the *parties* equally, after deduction of all proper government taxes and financial institution charges and other charges.

3 Deposit-bond

- 3.1 This clause applies only if this contract says the vendor has agreed to accept a *deposit-bond* for the deposit (or part of it).
- 3.2 The purchaser must provide the original *deposit-bond* to the vendor's *solicitor* (or if no solicitor the *depositholder*) at or before the making of this contract and this time is essential.
- 3.3 If the *deposit-bond* has an expiry date and completion does not occur by the date which is 14 days before the expiry date, the purchaser must *serve* a replacement *deposit-bond* at least 7 days before the expiry date. The time for service is essential.
- 3.4 The vendor must approve a replacement deposit-bond if
 - 3.4.1 it is from the same issuer and for the same amount as the earlier deposit-band; and
 - 3.4.2 it has an expiry date at least three months after its date of issue.
- 3.5 A breach of clauses 3.2 or 3.3 entitles the vendor to terminate. The right to terminate is lost as soon as
 - 3.5.1 the purchaser serves a replacement deposit-bond;
 - 3.5.2 the deposit is paid in full under clause 2.
- 3.6 Clauses 3.3 and 3.4 can operate more than once.
- 3.7 If the purchaser serves a replacement deposit-bond, the vendor must serve the earlier deposit-bond.
- 3.8 The amount of any *deposit-bond* does not form part of the price for the purposes of clause 16.7.
- 3.9 The vendor must give the purchaser the deposit-bond
 - 3.9.1 on completion; or
 - 3.9.2 if this contract is rescinded.
- 3.10 If this contract is terminated by the vendor -
 - 3.10.1 normally, the vendor can immediately demand payment from the issuer of the deposit-bond; or
 - 3.10.2 if the purchaser *serves* prior to *termination* a notice disputing the vendor's right to *terminate*, the vendor must forward the *deposit-bond* (or its proceeds if called up) to the *depositholder* as stakeholder.
- 3.11 If this contract is terminated by the purchaser
 - 3.11.1 normally, the vendor must give the purchaser the deposit-bond; or
 - 3.11.2 if the vendor serves prior to termination a notice disputing the purchaser's right to terminate, the vendor must forward the deposit-bond (or its proceeds if called up) to the depositholder as stakeholder.

4 Transfer

- 4.1 Normally, the purchaser must serve at least 14 days before the date for completion -
 - 4.1.1 the form of transfer, and
 - 4.1.2 particulars required to register any mortgage or other dealing to be lodged with the transfer by the purchaser or the purchaser's mortgagee.
- 4.2 If any information needed for the form of transfer is not disclosed in this contract, the vendor must serve it.
- 4.3 If the purchaser *serves* a form of transfer and the transferee is not the purchaser, the purchaser must give the vendor a direction signed by the purchaser personally for this form of transfer.
- The vendor can require the purchaser to include a form of covenant or easement in the transfer only if this contract contains the wording of the proposed covenant or easement, and a description of the land benefited.

5 Requisitions

- 5.1 If a form of *requisitions* is attached to this contract, the purchaser is taken to have made those *requisitions*.
- 5.2 If the purchaser is or becomes entitled to make any other *requisition*, the purchaser can make it only by serving it
 - 5.2.1 if it arises out of this contract or it is a general question about the *property* or title *within* 21 days after the contract date;
 - 5.2.2 if it arises out of anything served by the vendor within 21 days after the later of the contract date and that service; and
 - 5.2.3 in any other case within a reasonable time.

6 Error or misdescription

- The purchaser can (but only before completion) claim compensation for an error or misdescription in this contract (as to the *property*, the title or anything else and whether substantial or not).
- This clause applies even if the purchaser did not take notice of or rely on anything in this contract containing or giving rise to the error or misdescription.
- 6.3 However, this clause does not apply to the extent the purchaser knows the true position.

7 Claims by purchaser

The purchaser can make a claim (including a claim under clause 6) before completion only by serving it with a statement of the amount claimed, and if the purchaser makes one or more claims before completion -

- the vendor can rescind if in the case of claims that are not claims for delay -7.1
 - the total amount claimed exceeds 5% of the price;
 - the vendor serves notice of intention to rescind; and 7.1.2
 - the purchaser does not serve notice waiving the claims within 14 days after that service; and 7.1.3
- if the vendor does not rescind, the parties must complete and if this contract is completed -7.2
 - the lesser of the total amount claimed and 10% of the price must be paid out of the price to and 7.2.1 held by the depositholder until the claims are finalised or lapse;
 - the amount held is to be invested in accordance with clause 2.9; 7.2.2
 - the claims must be finalised by an arbitrator appointed by the parties or, if an appointment is not 7.2.3 made within 1 month of completion, by an arbitrator appointed by the President of the Law Society at the request of a party (in the latter case the parties are bound by the terms of the Conveyancing Arbitration Rules approved by the Law Society as at the date of the appointment);
 - the purchaser is not entitled, in respect of the claims, to more than the total amount claimed and 7.2.4 the costs of the purchaser:
 - net interest on the amount held must be paid to the parties in the same proportion as the amount 7.2.5 held is paid; and
 - if the parties do not appoint an arbitrator and neither party requests the President to appoint an 7.2.6 arbitrator within 3 months after completion, the claims lapse and the amount belongs to the vendor.

8 Vendor's rights and obligations

- 8.1 The vendor can rescind if
 - the vendor is, on reasonable grounds, unable or unwilling to comply with a requisition; 8 1.1
 - the vendor serves a notice of intention to rescind that specifies the requisition and those 8.1.2 grounds; and
 - the purchaser does not serve a notice waiving the requisition within 14 days after that service. 8.1.3
- If the vendor does not comply with this contract (or a notice under or relating to it) in an essential respect, the 8.2 purchaser can terminate by serving a notice. After the termination
 - the purchaser can recover the deposit and any other money paid by the purchaser under this 8.2.1
 - the purchaser can sue the vendor to recover damages for breach of contract; and 8.2.2
 - if the purchaser has been in possession a party can claim for a reasonable adjustment. 8.2.3

9

Purchaser's default

If the purchaser does not comply with this contract (or a notice under or relating to it) in an essential respect, the vendor can terminate by serving a notice. After the termination the vendor can -

- keep or recover the deposit (to a maximum of 10% of the price); 9.1
- hold any other money paid by the purchaser under this contract as security for anything recoverable under 9.2 this clause
 - for 12 months after the termination; or 9.2.1
 - if the vendor commences proceedings under this clause within 12 months, until those 9.2.2 proceedings are concluded; and
- sue the purchaser either -9.3
 - where the vendor has resold the property under a contract made within 12 months after the 9.3.1 termination, to recover
 - the deficiency on resale (with credit for any of the deposit kept or recovered and after allowance for any capital gains tax or goods and services tax payable on anything recovered under this clause); and
 - the reasonable costs and expenses arising out of the purchaser's non-compliance with this contract or the notice and of resale and any attempted resale; or
 - to recover damages for breach of contract. 9.3.2

Restrictions on rights of purchaser 10

- The purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate in respect of -10.1
 - the ownership or location of any fence as defined in the Dividing Fences Act 1991: 10.1.1
 - a service for the property being a joint service or passing through another property, or any service 10.1.2 for another property passing through the property (`service' includes air, communication, drainage, electricity, garbage, gas, oil, radio, sewerage, telephone, television or water service);
 - a wall being or not being a party wall in any sense of that term or the property being affected by 10.1.3 an easement for support or not having the benefit of an easement for support;
 - any change in the property due to fair wear and tear before completion; 10.1.4

- a promise, representation or statement about this contract, the property or the title, not set out or 10.1.5 referred to in this contract;
- a condition, exception, reservation or restriction in a Crown grant; 10.1.6
- the existence of any authority or licence to explore or prospect for gas, minerals or petroleum; 10.1.7
- any easement or restriction on use the substance of either of which is disclosed in this contract 10.1.8 or any non-compliance with the easement or restriction on use; or
- anything the substance of which is disclosed in this contract (except a caveat, charge, mortgage, 10.1.9 priority notice or writ).
- The purchaser cannot rescind or terminate only because of a defect in title to or quality of the inclusions. 10.2
- Normally, the purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate or require the vendor to 10.3 change the nature of the title disclosed in this contract (for example, to remove a caution evidencing qualified title, or to lodge a plan of survey as regards limited title).

Compliance with work orders 11

- Normally, the vendor must by completion comply with a work order made on or perfore the contract date and 11.1 if this contract is completed the purchaser must comply with any other work order
- If the purchaser complies with a work order, and this contract is rescinded or terminated, the vendor must 11.2 pay the expense of compliance to the purchaser.

Certificates and inspections 12

The vendor must do everything reasonable to enable the purchaser, subject to the rights of any tenant -

- to have the property inspected to obtain any certificate or report reasonably required. 12.1
- to apply (if necessary in the name of the vendor) for -12.2
 - any certificate that can be given in respect of the property under legislation; or 12.2.1
 - a copy of any approval, certificate, consent, direction, notice or order in respect of the property 12.2.2 given under legislation, even if given after the contract date; and
- to make 1 inspection of the property in the 3 days before a time appointed for completion. 12.3

Goods and services tax (GST) 13

- Terms used in this clause which are not defined elsewhere in this contract and have a defined meaning in the 13.1 GST Act have the same meaning in this clause.
- Normally, if a party must pay the price or any other amount to the other party under this contract, GST is not 13.2
- to be added to the price or amount.

 If under this contract a party must make an adjustment or payment for an expense of another party or pay an 13.3 expense payable by or to a third party (for example, under clauses 14 or 20.7) -
 - 13.3.1
 - the party must adjust or pay on completion any GST added to or included in the expense; but the amount of the expense must be reduced to the extent the party receiving the adjustment or 13.3.2 payment (or the representative member of a GST group of which that party is a member) is entitled to an input lax credit for the expense; and
 - if the adjustment or payment under this contract is consideration for a taxable supply, an amount 13.3.3 for GST must be added at the GST rate.
- If this contract says this sale is the supply of a going concern -13.4
 - the parties agree the supply of the property is a supply of a going concern; 13.4.1
 - the vendor must, between the contract date and completion, carry on the enterprise conducted 13.4.2 on the land in a proper and business-like way;
 - if the purchaser is not registered by the date for completion, the parties must complete and the 13.4.3 purchaser must pay on completion, in addition to the price, an amount being the price multiplied by the GST rate ("the retention sum"). The retention sum is to be held by the depositholder and dealt with as follows
 - if within 3 months of completion the purchaser serves a letter from the Australian Taxation Office stating the purchaser is registered with a date of effect of registration on or before completion, the depositholder is to pay the retention sum to the purchaser; but
 - if the purchaser does not serve that letter within 3 months of completion, the depositholder is to pay the retention sum to the vendor; and
 - if the vendor, despite clause 13.4.1, serves a letter from the Australian Taxation Office stating the 13.4.4 vendor has to pay GST on the supply, the purchaser must pay to the vendor on demand the amount of GST assessed.
- Normally, the vendor promises the margin scheme will not apply to the supply of the property. 13.5
- If this contract says the margin scheme is to apply in making the taxable supply, the parties agree that the 13.6 margin scheme is to apply to the sale of the property.
- If this contract says the sale is not a taxable supply -13.7
 - the purchaser promises that the property will not be used and represents that the purchaser does not intend the property (or any part of the property) to be used in a way that could make the sale a taxable supply to any extent; and

- the purchaser must pay the vendor on completion in addition to the price an amount calculated by multiplying the price by the *GST rate* if this sale is a taxable supply to any extent because of
 - a breach of clause 13.7.1; or
 - something else known to the purchaser but not the vendor.
- 13.8 If this contract says this sale is a taxable supply in full and does not say the margin scheme applies to the property, the vendor must pay the purchaser on completion an amount of one-eleventh of the price if
 - 13.8.1 this sale is not a taxable supply in full; or
 - the margin scheme applies to the *property* (or any part of the *property*).
- 13.9 If this contract says this sale is a taxable supply to an extent
 - clause 13.7.1 does not apply to any part of the *property* which is identified as being a taxable supply; and
 - the payments mentioned in clauses 13.7 and 13.8 are to be recalculated by multiplying the relevant payment by the proportion of the price which represents the value of that part of the *property* to which the clause applies (the proportion to be expressed as a number between 0 and 1). Any evidence of value must be obtained at the expense of the vendor.

 Normally, on completion the vendor must give the recipient of the supply a tax invoice for any taxable supply
- 13.10 Normally, on completion the vendor must give the recipient of the supply a tax invoice for any taxable supply by the vendor by or under this contract.
- 13.11 The vendor does not have to give the purchaser a tax invoice if the margin scheme applies to a taxable supply.
- 13.12 If the vendor is liable for GST on rents or profits due to issuing an invoice or receiving consideration before completion, any adjustment of those amounts must exclude an amount equal to the vendor's GST liability.
- 13.13 If the purchaser must make an RW payment the purchaser must
 - at least 5 days before the date for completion, *serve* evidence of submission of an *RW payment* notification form to the Australian Taxation Office by the purchaser or, if a direction under clause 4.3 has been *served*, by the transferee named in the transfer *served* with that direction;
 - produce on completion a *settlement cheque* for the *RW payment* payable to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation;
 - 13.13.3 forward the settlement cheque to the payee immediately after completion; and
 - 13.13.4 serve evidence of receipt of payment of the RW payment.

14 Adjustments

- 14.1 Normally, the vendor is entitled to the rents and profits and will be liable for all rates, water, sewerage and drainage service and usage charges, land tax, levies and all other periodic outgoings up to and including the adjustment date after which the purchaser will be entitled and liable.
- 14.2 The parties must make any necessary adjustment on completion.
- 14.3 If an amount that is adjustable under this contract has been reduced under *legislation*, the *parties* must on completion adjust the reduced amount.
- The parties must not adjust surcharge land tax (as defined in the Land Tax Act 1956) but must adjust any other land tax for the year current at the adjustment date
 - only if land tax has been paid or is payable for the year (whether by the vendor or by a predecessor in title) and this contract says that land tax is adjustable;
 - 14.4.2 by adjusting the amount that would have been payable if at the start of the year -
 - the person who owned the land owned no other land;
 - the land was not subject to a special trust or owned by a non-concessional company; and
 - if the land (or part of it) had no separate taxable value, by calculating its separate taxable value on a proportional area basis.
- 14.5 If any other amount that is adjustable under this contract relates partly to the land and partly to other land, the parties must adjust it on a proportional area basis.
- 14.6 Normally, the vendor can direct the purchaser to produce a settlement cheque on completion to pay an amount adjustable under this contract and if so
 - 14.6.1 the amount is to be treated as if it were paid; and
 - the *cheque* must be forwarded to the payee immediately after completion (by the purchaser if the *cheque* relates only to the *property* or by the vendor in any other case).
- 14.7 If on completion the last bill for a water, sewerage or drainage usage charge is for a period ending before the adjustment date, the vendor is liable for an amount calculated by dividing the bill by the number of days in the period then multiplying by the number of unbilled days up to and including the adjustment date.
- The vendor is liable for any amount recoverable for work started on or before the contract date on the *property* or any adjoining footpath or road.

15 Date for completion

The parties must complete by the date for completion and, if they do not, a party can serve a notice to complete if that party is otherwise entitled to do so.

16 Completion

Vendor

- 16.1 On completion the vendor must give the purchaser any document of title that relates only to the property.
- 16.2 If on completion the vendor has possession or control of a *document of title* that relates also to other property, the vendor must produce it as and where necessary.
- 16.3 Normally, on completion the vendor must cause the legal title to the *property* (being an estate in fee simple) to pass to the purchaser free of any mortgage or other interest, subject to any necessary registration.
- 16.4 The legal title to the *property* does not pass before completion.
- 16.5 If the vendor gives the purchaser a document (other than the transfer) that needs to be lodged for registration, the vendor must pay the lodgement fee to the purchaser, plus another 20% of that fee.
- 16.6 If a party serves a land tax certificate showing a charge on any of the land, on completion the vendor must give the purchaser a land tax certificate showing the charge is no longer effective against the land.

Purchaser

- On completion the purchaser must pay to the vendor, by cash (up to \$2,000) or settlement cheque 16.7.1 the price less any:
 - deposit paid;
 - remittance amount payable;
 - RW payment; and
 - amount payable by the vendor to the purchaser under this contract, and
 - 16.7.2 any other amount payable by the purchaser under this contract.
- 16.8 If the vendor requires more than 5 settlement cheques, the vendor must pay \$10 for each extra cheque.
- 16.9 If any of the deposit is not covered by a bond or guarantee, on completion the purchaser must give the vendor an order signed by the purchaser authorising the *deposit holder* to account to the vendor for the deposit.
- 16.10 On completion the deposit belongs to the vendor.

• Place for completion

- 16.11 Normally, the parties must complete at the completion address, which is -
 - 16.11.1 if a special completion address is stated in this contract that address; or
 - 16.11.2 if none is stated, but a first mortgagee is disclosed in this contract and the mortgagee would usually discharge the mortgage at a particular place that place; or
 - 16.11.3 in any other case the vendor's solicitor's address stated in this contract.
- The vendor by reasonable notice can require completion at another place, if it is in NSW, but the vendor must pay the purchaser's additional expenses, including any agency or mortgagee fee.
- 16.13 If the purchaser requests completion at a place that is not the completion address, and the vendor agrees, the purchaser must pay the vendor's additional expenses, including any agency or mortgagee fee.

17 Possession

- 17.1 Normally, the vendor must give the purchaser vacant possession of the property on completion.
- 17.2 The vendor does not have to give vacant possession if -
 - 17.2.1 this contract says that the sale is subject to existing tenancies; and
 - the contract discloses the provisions of the tenancy (for example, by attaching a copy of the lease and any relevant memorandum or variation).
- 17.3 Normally, the purchaser can claim compensation (before or after completion) or rescind if any of the land is affected by a protected tenancy (a tenancy affected by Part 2, 3, 4 or 5 Landlord and Tenant (Amendment) Act 1948).

18 Possession before completion

- 18.1 This glause applies only if the vendor gives the purchaser possession of the *property* before completion.
- 18.2 The purchaser must not before completion -
 - 18.2.1 let or part with possession of any of the *property*;
 - 18.2.2 make any change or structural alteration or addition to the property; or
 - 18.2.3 contravene any agreement between the *parties* or any direction, document, *legislation*, notice or order affecting the *property*.
- 18.3 The purchaser must until completion
 - 18.3.1 keep the *property* in good condition and repair having regard to its condition at the giving of possession; and
 - allow the vendor or the vendor's authorised representative to enter and inspect it at all reasonable times.
- 18.4 The risk as to damage to the *property* passes to the purchaser immediately after the purchaser enters into possession.
- 18.5 If the purchaser does not comply with this clause, then without affecting any other right of the vendor 18.5.1 the vendor can before completion, without notice, remedy the non-compliance; and

Land - 2018 edition

- if the vendor pays the expense of doing this, the purchaser must pay it to the vendor with interest 18.5.2 at the rate prescribed under s101 Civil Procedure Act 2005.
- If this contract is rescinded or terminated the purchaser must immediately vacate the property. 18.6
- If the parties or their solicitors on their behalf do not agree in writing to a fee or rent, none is payable. 18.7

19 Rescission of contract

- If this contract expressly gives a party a right to rescind, the party can exercise the right -19.1
 - only by serving a notice before completion; and
 - in spite of any making of a claim or requisition, any attempt to satisfy a claim or requisition, any 19.1.2 arbitration, litigation, mediation or negotiation or any giving or taking of possession.
- Normally, if a party exercises a right to rescind expressly given by this contract or any legislation -19.2
 - the deposit and any other money paid by the purchaser under this contract must be refunded; 19.2.1
 - a party can claim for a reasonable adjustment if the purchaser has been in possession; 19.2.2
 - a party can claim for damages, costs or expenses arising out of a breach of this contract; and 19.2.3
 - a party will not otherwise be liable to pay the other party any damages, sosts or expenses. 19.2.4

20 Miscellaneous

- The parties acknowledge that anything stated in this contract to be attached was attached to this contract by 20.1 the vendor before the purchaser signed it and is part of this contract.
- 20.2 Anything attached to this contract is part of this contract.
- An area, bearing or dimension in this contract is only approximate. 20.3
- If a party consists of 2 or more persons, this contract benefits and binds them separately and together. 20.4
- A party's solicitor can receive any amount payable to the party under this contract or direct in writing that it is 20.5 to be paid to another person.
- A document under or relating to this contract is -20.6
 - signed by a party if it is signed by the party or the party's solicitor (apart from a direction under 20.6.1 clause 4.3):
 - served if it is served by the party or the party's solicitor, 20.6.2
 - served if it is served on the party's solicitor, even if the party has died or any of them has died; 20.6.3
 - 20.6.4
 - served if it is served in any marmer provided in s170 of the Conveyancing Act 1919; served if it is sent by email or fax to the party's solicitor, unless in either case it is not received; 20.6.5
 - served on a person if it (or a copy of it) comes into the possession of the person; and 20.6.6
 - served at the earliest time it is served if it is served more than once. 20.6.7
- An obligation to pay an expense of another *party* of doing something is an obligation to pay 20.7.1 if the *party* does the thing personally the reasonable cost of getting someone else to do it; or 20.7.2 if the *party* pays someone else to do the thing the amount paid, to the extent it is reasonable. Rights under clauses 11, 13, 14, 17, 24, 30 and 31 continue after completion, whether or not other rights 20.7
- 20.8 continue.
- The vendor does not promise, represent or state that the purchaser has any cooling off rights. 20.9
- The vendor does not promise, represent or state that any attached survey report is accurate or current. 20.10
- A reference to any legislation (including any percentage or rate specified in legislation) is also a reference to 20.11 any corresponding later legislation.
- Each party must do whatever is necessary after completion to carry out the party's obligations under this 20.12 contract.
- Neither taking possession nor serving a transfer of itself implies acceptance of the property or the title. 20.13
- The details and information provided in this contract (for example, on pages 1 3) are, to the extent of each 20.14 party's knowledge, true, and are part of this contract.
- Where this contract provides for choices, a choice in BLOCK CAPITALS applies unless a different choice is 20.15 marked.

Time limits in these provisions 21

- If the time for something to be done or to happen is not stated in these provisions, it is a reasonable time. 21.1
- If there are conflicting times for something to be done or to happen, the latest of those times applies. 21.2
- The time for one thing to be done or to happen does not extend the time for another thing to be done or to 21.3 happen.
- If the time for something to be done or to happen is the 29th, 30th or 31st day of a month, and the day does 21.4 not exist, the time is instead the last day of the month.
- If the time for something to be done or to happen is a day that is not a business day, the time is extended to 21.5 the next business day, except in the case of clauses 2 and 3.2.
- Normally, the time by which something must be done is fixed but not essential. 21.6

Foreign Acquisitions and Takeovers Act 1975 22

- The purchaser promises that the Commonwealth Treasurer cannot prohibit and has not prohibited the 22.1 transfer under the Foreign Acquisitions and Takeovers Act 1975.
- This promise is essential and a breach of it entitles the vendor to terminate. 22.2

23 Strata or community title

Definitions and modifications

- This clause applies only if the land (or part of it) is a lot in a strata, neighbourhood, precinct or community scheme (or on completion is to be a lot in a scheme of that kind).
- 23.2 In this contract -
 - 23.2.1 'change', in relation to a scheme, means -
 - a registered or registrable change from by-laws set out in this contract;
 - a change from a development or management contract or statement set out in this contract;
 - a change in the boundaries of common property;
 - 23.2.2 'common property' includes association property for the scheme or any higher scheme;
 - 23.2.3 'contribution' includes an amount payable under a by-law;
 - 23.2.4 'information certificate' includes a certificate under s184 Strata Schemes Management Act 2015 and s26 Community Land Management Act 1989;
 - 23.2.5 'information notice' includes a strata information notice under s22 Strata Schemes Management Act 2015 and a notice under s47 Community Land Management Act 1989;
 - 23.2.6 'normal expenses', in relation to an owners corporation for a scheme, means normal operating expenses usually payable from the administrative fund of an owners corporation for a scheme of the same kind:
 - 23.2.7 'owners corporation' means the owners corporation or the association for the scheme or any higher scheme;
 - 23.2.8 'the *property*' includes any interest in common property for the scheme associated with the lot; and
 - 23.2.9 'special expenses', in relation to an owners corporation, means its actual, contingent or expected expenses, except to the extent they are
 - normal expenses:
 - due to fair wear and tear
 - disclosed in this contract;
 - covered by moneys held in the capital works fund.
- Clauses 11, 14.8 and 18.4 do not apply to an obligation of the owners corporation, or to property insurable by it.
- 23.4 Clauses 14.4.2 and 14.5 apply but on a unit entitlement basis instead of an area basis.

Adjustments and liability for expenses

- 23.5 The parties must adjust under clause 14.1
 - 23.5.1 a regular periodic contribution:
 - 23.5.2 a contribution which is not a regular periodic contribution but is disclosed in this contract; and
 - on a unit entitlement basis, any amount paid by the vendor for a normal expense of the owners corporation to the extent the owners corporation has not paid the amount to the vendor.
- 23.6 If a contribution is not a regular periodic contribution and is not disclosed in this contract
 - 23.6.1 the vendor is liable for it if it was determined on or before the contract date, even if it is payable by instalments; and
 - 23.6.2 the purchaser is liable for all contributions determined after the contract date.
- 23.7 The vendor must pay or allow to the purchaser on completion the amount of any unpaid contributions for which the vendor is liable under clause 23.6.1.
- 23.8 Normally, the purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate in respect of 23.8. an existing or future actual, contingent or expected expense of the owners corporation;
 - a proportional unit entitlement of the lot or a relevant lot or former lot, apart from a claim under clause 6; or
 - 23.8.3 a past or future change in the scheme or a higher scheme.
- 23.9 However, the purchaser can rescind if
 - the special expenses of the owners corporation at the later of the contract date and the creation of the owners corporation when calculated on a unit entitlement basis (and, if more than one lot or a higher scheme is involved, added together), less any contribution paid by the vendor, are more than 1% of the price;
 - 23.9.2 in the case of the lot or a relevant lot or former lot in a higher scheme
 - a proportional unit entitlement for the lot is not disclosed in this contract; or
 - a proportional unit entitlement for the lot is disclosed in this contract but the lot has a different proportional unit entitlement at the contract date or at any time before completion;
 - 23.9.3 a change before the contract date or before completion in the scheme or a higher scheme substantially disadvantages the purchaser and is not disclosed in this contract; or

a resolution is passed by the owners corporation before the contract date or before completion to 23.9.4 give a strata renewal plan to the owners in the scheme for their consideration and there is not attached to this contract a strata renewal proposal or the strata renewal plan.

Notices, certificates and inspections

- The purchaser must give the vendor 2 copies of an information notice addressed to the owners corporation 23.10 and signed by the purchaser.
- The vendor must complete and sign 1 copy of the notice and give it to the purchaser on completion. 23.11
- Each party can sign and give the notice as agent for the other. 23.12
- The vendor must serve an information certificate issued after the contract date in relation to the lot, the 23.13 scheme or any higher scheme at least 7 days before the date for completion.
- The purchaser does not have to complete earlier than 7 days after service of the certificate and clause 21.3 23.14 does not apply to this provision. On completion the purchaser must pay the vendor the prescribed fee for the certificate.
- The vendor authorises the purchaser to apply for the purchaser's own certificate 23.15
- The vendor authorises the purchaser to apply for and make an inspection of any record or other document in 23.16 the custody or control of the owners corporation or relating to the scheme of any higher scheme.

Meetings of the owners corporation

- If a general meeting of the owners corporation is convened before completion -23.17
 - if the vendor receives notice of it, the vendor must immediately notify the purchaser of it; and 23 17 1
 - after the expiry of any cooling off period, the purchaser can require the vendor to appoint the 23.17.2 purchaser (or the purchaser's nominee) to exercise any voting rights of the vendor in respect of the lot at the meeting.

24 **Tenancies**

- If a tenant has not made a payment for a period preceding or current at the adjustment date -24.1
 - for the purposes of clause 14.2, the amount is to be treated as if it were paid; and 24.1.1
 - the purchaser assigns the debt to the vendor on completion and will if required give a further 24.1.2 assignment at the vendor's expense.
- If a tenant has paid in advance of the adjustment date any periodic payment in addition to rent, it must be 24.2 adjusted as if it were rent for the period to which it relates.

 If the *property* is to be subject to a tenancy on completion or is subject to a tenancy on completion –
- 24.3
 - the vendor authorises the purchaser to have any accounting records relating to the tenancy 24.3.1 inspected and audited and to have any other document relating to the tenancy inspected;
 - the vendor must serve any information about the tenancy reasonably requested by the 24.3.2 purchaser before or after completion; and
 - normally, the purchaser can claim compensation (before or after completion) if -24.3.3
 - a disclosure statement required by the Retail Leases Act 1994 was not given when required;
 - such a statement contained information that was materially false or misleading;
 - a provision of the lease is not enforceable because of a non-disclosure in such a statement; or
 - the lease was entered into in contravention of the Retail Leases Act 1994.
- If the property is subject to a tenancy on completion -24.4
 - the vendor must allow or transfer -24.4.1
 - any remaining bond money or any other security against the tenant's default (to the extent the security is transferable);
 - any money in a fund established under the lease for a purpose and compensation for any money in the fund or interest earnt by the fund that has been applied for any other purpose; and
 - any money paid by the tenant for a purpose that has not been applied for that purpose and compensation for any of the money that has been applied for any other purpose;
 - if the security is not transferable, each party must do everything reasonable to cause a 24.4.2 replacement security to issue for the benefit of the purchaser and the vendor must hold the original security on trust for the benefit of the purchaser until the replacement security issues;
 - the vendor must give to the purchaser -24.4.3
 - a proper notice of the transfer (an attornment notice) addressed to the tenant;
 - any certificate given under the Retail Leases Act 1994 in relation to the tenancy;
 - a copy of any disclosure statement given under the Retail Leases Act 1994;
 - a copy of any document served on the tenant under the lease and written details of its service, if the document concerns the rights of the landlord or the tenant after completion; and
 - any document served by the tenant under the lease and written details of its service, if the document concerns the rights of the landlord or the tenant after completion;
 - the vendor must comply with any obligation to the tenant under the lease, to the extent it is to be 24.4.4 complied with by completion; and

24.4.5 the purchaser must comply with any obligation to the tenant under the lease, to the extent that the obligation is disclosed in this contract and is to be complied with after completion.

25 Qualified title, limited title and old system title

- 25.1 This clause applies only if the land (or part of it) -
 - 25.1.1 is under qualified, limited or old system title; or
 - 25.1.2 on completion is to be under one of those titles.
- 25.2 The vendor must *serve* a proper abstract of title *within* 7 days after the contract date.
- 25.3 If an abstract of title or part of an abstract of title is attached to this contract or has been lent by the vendor to the purchaser before the contract date, the abstract or part is *served* on the contract date.
- 25.4 An abstract of title can be or include a list of documents, events and facts arranged (apart from a will or codicil) in date order, if the list in respect of each document
 - 25.4.1 shows its date, general nature, names of parties and any registration number; and
 - 25.4.2 has attached a legible photocopy of it or of an official or registration copy of it.
- 25.5 An abstract of title -
 - 25.5.1 must start with a good root of title (if the good root of title must be at least 30 years old, this means 30 years old at the contract date);
 - 25.5.2 in the case of a leasehold interest, must include an abstract of the lease and any higher lease;
 - 25.5.3 normally, need not include a Crown grant; and
 - 25.5.4 need not include anything evidenced by the Register kept under the Real Property Act 1900.
- 25.6 In the case of land under old system title -
 - 25,6.1 in this contract 'transfer' means conveyance;
 - 25.6.2 the purchaser does not have to *serve* the form of transfer until after the vendor has *served* a proper abstract of title; and
 - each vendor must give proper covenants for title as regards that vendor's interest.
- 25.7 In the case of land under limited title but not under qualified title
 - 25.7.1 normally, the abstract of title need not include any document which does not show the location, area or dimensions of the land (for example, by including a metes and bounds description or a plan of the land);
 - 25.7.2 clause 25.7.1 does not apply to a document which is the good root of title; and
 - 25.7.3 the vendor does not have to provide an abstract if this contract contains a delimitation plan (whether in registrable form or not).
- 25.8 The vendor must give a proper covenant to produce where relevant.
- 25.9 The vendor does not have to produce or covenant to produce a document that is not in the possession of the vendor or a mortgagee.
- 25.10 If the vendor is unable to produce an original document in the chain of title, the purchaser will accept a photocopy from the Registrar-General of the registration copy of that document.

26 Crown purchase money

- 26.1 This clause applies only if purchase money is payable to the Crown, whether or not due for payment.
- 26.2 The vendor is liable for the money, except to the extent this contract says the purchaser is liable for it.
- 26.3 To the extent the vendor is liable for it, the vendor is liable for any interest until completion.
- To the extent the purchaser is liable for it, the parties must adjust any interest under clause 14.1.

27 Consent to transfer

- 27.1 This clause applies only if the land (or part of it) cannot be transferred without consent under legislation or a planning agreement.
- The purchaser must properly complete and then *serve* the purchaser's part of an application for consent to transfer of the land (or part of it) *within* 7 days after the contract date.
- 27.3 The vendor must apply for consent within 7 days after service of the purchaser's part.
- 27.4 If consent is refused, either party can rescind.
- 27.5 If consent is given subject to one or more conditions that will substantially disadvantage a *party*, then that party can rescind within 7 days after receipt by or service upon the party of written notice of the conditions.
- 27.6 If consent is not given or refused -
 - 27.6.1 *within* 42 days after the purchaser *serves* the purchaser's part of the application, the purchaser can *rescind*; or
 - 27.6.2 within 30 days after the application is made, either party can rescind.
- 27.7 Each period in clause 27.6 becomes 90 days if the land (or part of it) is -
 - 27.7.1 under a planning agreement; or
 - 27.7.2 in the Western Division.
- 27.8 If the land (or part of it) is described as a lot in an unregistered plan, each time in clause 27.6 becomes the later of the time and 35 days after creation of a separate folio for the lot.
- 27.9 The date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 14 days after *service* of the notice granting consent to transfer.

28 Unregistered plan

- 28.1 This clause applies only if some of the land is described as a lot in an unregistered plan.
- 28.2 The vendor must do everything reasonable to have the plan registered *within* 6 months after the contract date, with or without any minor alteration to the plan or any document to be lodged with the plan validly required or made under *legislation*.
- 28.3 If the plan is not registered within that time and in that manner -
 - 28.3.1 the purchaser can rescind; and
 - the vendor can *rescind*, but only if the vendor has complied with clause 28.2 and with any *legislation* governing the rescission.
- 28.4 Either party can serve notice of the registration of the plan and every relevant lot and plan number.
- 28.5 The date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 21 days after service of the notice.
- 28.6 Clauses 28.2 and 28.3 apply to another plan that is to be registered before the plan is registered.

29 Conditional contract

- 29.1 This clause applies only if a provision says this contract or completion is conditional on an event.
- 29.2 If the time for the event to happen is not stated, the time is 42 days after the contract date.
- 29.3 If this contract says the provision is for the benefit of a party, then it benefits only that party.
- 29.4 if anything is necessary to make the event happen, each *party* must do whatever is reasonably necessary to cause the event to happen.
- 29.5 A party can rescind under this clause only if the party has substantially complied with clause 29.4.
- 29.6 If the event involves an approval and the approval is given subject to a condition that will substantially disadvantage a *party* who has the benefit of the provision, the *party* can *rescind within* 7 days after either *party* serves notice of the condition.
- 29.7 If the parties can lawfully complete without the event happening -
 - 29.7.1 if the event does not happen *within* the time for it to happen, a *party* who has the benefit of the provision can *rescind within* 7 days after the end of that time,
 - 29.7.2 if the event involves an approval and an application for the approval is refused, a *party* who has the benefit of the provision can *rescind within* 7 days after either *party serves* notice of the refusal; and
 - 29.7.3 the date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 21 days after the earliest of
 - either party serving notice of the event happening;
 - every party who has the benefit of the provision serving notice waiving the provision; or
 - the end of the time for the event to happen.
- 29.8 If the parties cannot lawfully complete without the event happening -
 - 29.8.1 if the event does not happen within the time for it to happen, either party can rescind;
 - 29.8.2 if the event involves an approval and an application for the approval is refused, either *party* can rescind:
 - 29.8.3 the date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 21 days after either party serves notice of the event happening.
- 29.9 A party cannot rescind under clauses 29.7 or 29.8 after the event happens.

30 Electronic transaction

- 30.1 This Conveyancing Transaction is to be conducted as an electronic transaction if -
 - 30.1.1 this contract says that it is a proposed electronic transaction;
 - 30.1.2 the parties otherwise agree that it is to be conducted as an electronic transaction; or
 - 30.1.3 the conveyancing rules require it to be conducted as an electronic transaction.
- 30.2 However, this Conveyancing Transaction is not to be conducted as an electronic transaction -
 - 30.2.1 if the land is not electronically tradeable or the transfer is not eligible to be lodged electronically;
 - 30.2.2 if, at any time after it has been agreed that it will be conducted as an *electronic transaction*, a party serves a notice that it will not be conducted as an *electronic transaction*.
- 30.3 If, because of clause 30.2.2, this *Conveyancing Transaction* is not to be conducted as an *electronic transaction*
 - 30.3.1 each party must -
 - bear equally any disbursements or fees; and
 - otherwise bear that party's own costs;
 - incurred because this *Conveyancing Transaction* was to be conducted as an *electronic transaction*; and
 - 30.3.2 if a *party* has paid all of a disbursement or fee which, by reason of this clause, is to be borne equally by the *parties*, that amount must be adjusted under clause 14.2.

- 30.4 If this Conveyancing Transaction is to be conducted as an electronic transaction -
 - 30.4.1 to the extent, but only to the extent, that any other provision of this contract is inconsistent with this clause, the provisions of this clause prevail;
 - 30.4.2 normally, words and phrases used in this clause 30 (italicised and in Title Case, such as *Electronic Workspace* and *Lodgement Case*) have the same meaning which they have in the participation rules;
 - 30.4.3 the parties must conduct the electronic transaction in accordance with the participation rules and the ECNL;
 - a party must pay the fees and charges payable by that party to the ELNO and the Land Registry as a result of this transaction being an electronic transaction;
 - 30.4.5 any communication from one party to another party in the Electronic Workspace made -
 - after the effective date; and
 - before the receipt of a notice given under clause 30.2.2;

is taken to have been received by that *party* at the time determined by \$13A of the Electronic Transactions Act 2000; and

- a document which is an *electronic document* is *served* as soon as it is first *Digitally Signed* in the *Electronic Workspace* on behalf of the *party* required to *serve* it.
- 30.5 Normally, the vendor must within 7 days of the effective date -
 - 30.5.1 create an Electronic Workspace;
 - 30.5.2 populate the Electronic Workspace with title data, the date for completion and, if applicable, mortgagee details; and
 - 30.5.3 invite the purchaser and any discharging mortgages to the Electronic Workspace.
- 30.6 If the vendor has not created an *Electronic Workspace* in accordance with clause 30.5, the purchaser may create an *Electronic Workspace*. If the purchaser creates the *Electronic Workspace* the purchaser must
 - 30.6.1 populate the Electronic Workspace with title data;
 - 30.6.2 create and populate an electronic transfer,
 - 30.6.3 populate the Electronic Workspace with the date for completion and a nominated completion time; and
 - 30.6.4 invite the vendor and any incoming mortgagee to join the Electronic Workspace.
- 30.7 Normally, within 7 days of receiving an invitation from the vendor to join the Electronic Workspace, the purchaser must
 - 30.7.1 join the Electronic Workspace;
 - 30.7.2 create and populate an electronic transfer,
 - 30.7.3 invite any incoming mortgagee to join the Electronic Workspace; and
 - 30.7.4 populate the Electronic Workspace with a nominated completion time.
- 30.8 If the purchaser has created the *Electronic Workspace* the vendor must *within* 7 days of being invited to the *Electronic Workspace*
 - 30.8.1 join the Electronic Workspace;
 - 30.8.2 populate the Electronic Workspace with mortgagee details, if applicable; and
 - 30.8.3 invite any discharging mortgagee to join the Electronic Workspace.
- 30.9 To complete the financial settlement schedule in the Electronic Workspace -
 - 30.9.1 the purchaser must provide the vendor with *adjustment figures* at least 2 *business days* before the date for completion; and
 - 30.9.2 the vendor must *populate* the *Electronic Workspace* with payment details at least 1 *business day* before the date for completion.
- 30.10 At least 1 business day before the date for completion, the parties must ensure that -
 - 30.10 all electronic documents which a party must Digitally Sign to complete the electronic transaction are populated and Digitally Signed;
 - 30.10.2 all certifications required by the ECNL are properly given; and
 - 30.10.3 they do everything else in the *Electronic Workspace* which that *party* must do to enable the *electronic transaction* to proceed to completion.
- 30.11 If completion takes place in the Electronic Workspace -
 - 30.11.1 payment electronically on completion of the price in accordance with clause 16.7 is taken to be payment by a single settlement cheque;
 - 30.11.2 the completion address in clause 16.11 is the Electronic Workspace; and
 - 30.11.3 clauses 13.13.2 to 13.13.4, 16.8, 16.12, 16.13 and 31.2.2 to 31.2.4 do not apply.
- 30.12 If the computer systems of any of the *Land Registry*, the *ELNO* or the Reserve Bank of Australia are inoperative for any reason at the *completion time* agreed by the *parties*, a failure to complete this contract for that reason is not a default under this contract on the part of either *party*.
- 30.13 If the *Electronic Workspace* allows the *parties* to choose whether financial settlement is to occur despite the computer systems of the *Land Registry* being inoperative for any reason at the *completion time* agreed by the parties
 - 30.13.1 normally, the parties must choose that financial settlement not occur; however

- if both parties choose that financial settlement is to occur despite such failure and financial 30.13.2 settlement occurs
 - all electronic documents Digitally Signed by the vendor, the certificate of title and any discharge of mortgage, withdrawal of caveat or other electronic document forming part of the Lodgement Case for the electronic transaction shall be taken to have been unconditionally and irrevocably delivered to the purchaser or the purchaser's mortgagee at the time of financial settlement together with the right to deal with the land comprised in the certificate of title; and
 - the vendor shall be taken to have no legal or equitable interest in the property.
- A party who holds a certificate of title must act in accordance with any Prescribed Requirement in relation to 30.14 the certificate of title but if there is no Prescribed Requirement, the vendor must serve the certificate of title after completion.
- If the parties do not agree about the delivery before completion of one or more documents or things that 30.15 cannot be delivered through the Electronic Workspace, the party required to deliver the documents or things -

holds them on completion in escrow for the benefit of; and 30.15.1

must immediately after completion deliver the documents or things to, or as directed by; 30.15.2 the party entitled to them.

In this clause 30, these terms (in any form) mean -30.16

> adjustment figures certificate of title

details of the adjustments to be made to the price under clause 14;

the paper duplicate of the folio of the register for the land which exists immediately prior to completion and, if more than one, refers to each such paper

duplicate;

completion time

the time of day on the date for completion when the electronic transaction is to

be settled;

conveyancing rules

the rules made under s12E of the Real Property Act 1900;

discharging mortgagee

any discharging mortgagee, chargee, covenant chargee or caveator whose provision of a *Digitally Signed* discharge of mortgage, discharge of charge or withdrawal of caveat is required in order for unencumbered title to the property to

be transferred to the purchaser,

ECNL

the Electronic Conveyancing National Law (NSW);

effective date

the date on which the Conveyancing Transaction is agreed to be an electronic transaction under clause 30.1.2 or, if clauses 30.1.1 or 30.1.3 apply, the contract

date;

electronic documenţ

a dealing as defined in the Real Property Act 1900 which may be created and Digitally Signed in an Electronic Workspace;

electronic transfe

a transfer of land under the Real Property Act 1900 for the property to be prepared and Digitally Signed in the Electronic Workspace established for the purposes of the parties' Conveyancing Transaction;

electronic transaction

a Conveyancing Transaction to be conducted for the parties by their legal representatives as Subscribers using an ELN and in accordance with the ECNL and the participation rules:

electronically tradeable

aland title that is Electronically Tradeable as that term is defined in the conveyancing rules;

incoming mortgagee

any mortgagee who is to provide finance to the purchaser on the security of the property and to enable the purchaser to pay the whole or part of the price;

mortgagee details

the details which a party to the electronic transaction must provide about any discharging mortgagee of the property as at completion;

participation rules

the participation rules as determined by the ENCL;

to complete data fields in the Electronic Workspace; and populate the details of the title to the property made available to the Electronic Workspace title data

by the Land Registry.

Foreign Resident Capital Gains Withholding 31

This clause applies only if -31.1

- the sale is not an excluded transaction within the meaning of s14-215 of Schedule 1 to the TA 31,1,1
- a clearance certificate in respect of every vendor is not attached to this contract. 31.1.2

The purchaser must -31.2

- at least 5 days before the date for completion, serve evidence of submission of a purchaser 31.2.1 payment notification to the Australian Taxation Office by the purchaser or, if a direction under clause 4.3 has been served, by the transferee named in the transfer served with that direction;
- produce on completion a settlement cheque for the remittance amount payable to the Deputy 31.2.2 Commissioner of Taxation:
- forward the settlement cheque to the payee immediately after completion; and 31.2.3

- 31.2.4 serve evidence of receipt of payment of the remittance amount.
- 31.3 The vendor cannot refuse to complete if the purchaser complies with clauses 31.2.1 and 31.2.2.
- 31.4 If the vendor serves any clearance certificate or variation, the purchaser does not have to complete earlier than 7 days after that service and clause 21.3 does not apply to this provision.
- 31.5 If the vendor *serves* in respect of every vendor either a *clearance certificate* or a *variation* to 0.00 percent, clauses 31.2 and 31.3 do not apply.

Special Conditions

32 Interpretation and general provisions

32.1 Definitions

In this Agreement unless the context otherwise requires:

Agreement means the Contract for Sale and Purchase of the Land between the Vendor and Purchaser including these Special Conditions.

Authority is any government department, local government, government or statutory authority or any other party under a Law which has a right to impose a requirement or whose consent or approval is required in respect of any matter concerning the Property.

Bankruptcy Act means the Bankruptcy Act 1966 (Cth).

Completion Date means the date for completion described on the front page of this Agreement.

Corporations Act means the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth).

GST is a goods and services tax, as governed by the GST Act.

GST Act is A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).

Insolvent shall mean:

- (a) with respect to a party who is a natural person that:
 - (i) he commits an act of bankruptcy or is declared bankrupt or insolvent or his estate otherwise becomes liable to be dealt with under any law relating to bankruptcy and/or insolvency;
 - (ii) he is otherwise unable to pay its debts when they fall due; or
 - (iii) something having a substantially similar effect to any of the circumstances detailed in any of subclauses (i) and (ii) above happens in connection with that person under the law of any jurisdiction; and
- (b) with respect to a party that is a company that:
 - (i) it is (or states that it is) insolvent (as defined in the Corporations Act);
 - (ii) it has a Controller (as defined in the Corporations Act) appointed to any part of its property;
 - (iii) it is in receivership, in receivership and management, in liquidation, in provisional liquidation, under administration or wound up or has had a Receiver appointed to any part of its property;

- it is subject to any arrangement, assignment, moratorium or composition, (iv) protected from creditors under any statute, or dissolved (other than to carry out a reconstruction or amalgamation while solvent on terms approved by the other party to this Agreement);
- an application or order has been made (and, in the case of an application, it (v) is not stayed, withdrawn or dismissed within 30 days), resolution passed, proposal put forward, or any other action taken, in each case in connection with that party, which is preparatory to or could result in any of the circumstances detailed in any of paragraphs (a), (b), (c) or (d) above;
- it is taken (under section 459(F)(1) of the Corporations Act) to have failed to (vi) comply with a statutory demand;
- it is the subject of an event described in section 459(C)(2)(b) or section 585 (vii) of the Corporations Act (or it makes a statement from which the other party to this Agreement reasonably deduces it is so subject); or
- it is otherwise unable to pay its debts when they fall due; or (viii)
- something having a substantially similar effect to any of the circumstances (ix) detailed in any of paragraph (a) to (h) above happens in connection with that person under the law of any jurisdiction.

Interest Period means the period commencing on the day following the Completion Date and ending on the date of actual completion.

Property means the land as described on the front page of this Agreement.

Law is:

- Commonwealth and State legislation including regulations, by-laws, and other (a) subordinate legislation;
- common law and equity; (b)
- (c) Authority requirements; and
- guidelines of the Commonwealth, the State and local governments and Authorities (d) with which either party is legally required to comply.

Purchaser means the purchaser described on the front page of this Agreement.

Services means existing or proposed water, sewerage and drainage, gas, electricity, telephone and other installations (if any) in or upon the Property.

Standard Conditions means the printed clauses of the standard Contract for Sale and Purchase of Land 2018 Edition forming part of this Agreement.

Vendor means the vendor described on the front page of this Agreement.

Law of the Agreement 32.2

This Agreement is governed by the law in force in New South Wales and each party submits to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of that place.

32.3 No assignment, mortgage or charge

The Purchaser may not assign, mortgage, charge or otherwise dispose of all or any of its rights under this Agreement without the prior written approval of the Vendor.

32.4 Entire agreement

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties about its subject matter and supersedes all previous agreements, understandings and negotiations on that subject matter.

32.5 References

In this Agreement (unless the context otherwise requires):

- (a) references to parts, clauses, schedules, exhibits and annexures refer to them of, in and to this Agreement;
- (b) a reference to this Agreement includes all schedules, exhibits and annexures to this Agreement;
- (c) a reference to including, includes or include must be read as if it is followed by (without limitation);
- (d) a reference to a court is to an Australian court;
- (e) a reference to a party is to a party to this Agreement;
- (f) where an expression is defined, any other part of speech or grammatical form of that expression has a corresponding meaning;
- (g) the singular includes the plural and vice-versa;
- (h) a reference to any legislation or legislative provision includes any statutory modification or re-enactment of, or legislative provision substituted for, and any subordinated legislation issued under, that legislation or legislative provision;
- (i) headings do not affect the interpretation of this Agreement;
- (j) a reference to any party includes that party's executors, administrators, substitutes, successors and permitted assigns; and
- (k) a reference to \$, AUD or dollar is to the lawful currency of the Commonwealth of Australia.

33 Amendments to Standard Contract

The Standard Conditions are amended as follows:

- (a) Clause 6.2 is deleted.
- (b) Clause 7.1.1 is deleted.
- (c) Clause 8 is amended by adding the words at the beginning of the clause: "Despite any other provisions in this contract,".

- (d) In line 1 clause 10.1, insert after the word "terminate" the words "or delay completion".
- (e) Clauses 10.1.8 and 10.1.9 are amended by inserting after the word "substance", the words "or existence".
- (f) Clause 10.1.10 is included as follows:
 - "any claim, grant, notice, order or declaration in connection with native title, land rights or heritage protection under legislation, the common law or otherwise."
- (g) Clause 11 is replaced with: "The vendor shall not be liable or responsible for complying with any work order, whether made before or after the date of this contract."
- (h) Clause 12.2 is deleted.
- (i) Clause 14.4.2 is amended by deleting the words "the person who owned land owned no other land".
- (i) Clause 16.2 is deleted.
- (k) Clause 16.5 is amended by deleting the words ", plus another 20% of that fee".
- (l) Clause 16.8 is deleted.
- (m) Clause 18.7 is deleted.
- (n) Clauses 23.6, 23.7 and 23.9 are deleted.
- (o) Clause 28 is deleted.

34 Inconsistency

If there is any inconsistency between any provision in these Special Conditions and the Standard Conditions, these Special Conditions shall prevail.

35 Death, mental illness etc.

If:

- (a) a party (or if two or more persons are selling or purchasing jointly then if any one of them) dies or becomes mentally ill prior to completion; or
- (b) the Purchaser becomes Insolvent,

the other party or the Vendor as the case may be may rescind this Agreement by notice in writing in which event the provisions of clause 19 apply.

36 Particulars of title

For the purposes of clause 4 of this Agreement, the Purchaser acknowledges that the agreement contains sufficient details of the Vendor's title to enable the Purchaser to prepare the form of transfer referred to in that clause.

Special Conditions

37 Condition of the Property generally

37.1 Condition of the Property

The Property is sold in its present state of repair and the Purchaser may not make any objection, requisition, claim for compensation, delay completion or rescind on account of:

- (a) any defects in the Property of which the Purchaser is or ought reasonably on inspection to have been aware; or
- (b) the state of repair of the improvements on the Property or any minor real or apparent breaches of:
 - (i) The *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* or regulations under that Act; or
 - (ii) the *Local Government Act 1993* or any regulations or ordinances under that Act.

37.2 Condition of Inclusions

The Purchaser agrees that:

- (a) any fixtures or items of personal property sold with the Property ("Included Items") are sold in the condition and state of repair and functionality as at the date of this Agreement;
- (b) the Purchaser has inspected and is aware of the condition and state of repair and functionality of those Included Items;
- (c) the Vendor does not warrant that the Included Items or any of them are or will be in good condition or working order as at the date of this Agreement or as at completion; and
- (d) the Vendor cannot be required to remove, repair, replace or spend money on any Included Items before or after completion.

37.3 No warranty by Vendor

The Vendor makes no warranty:

- (a) that no hazardous material is present in, over or on the Property or as to the nature or extent to which the Property is affected by any hazardous materials; or
- (b) of the condition or position of any of the improvements on the Property or of the capacity, quality or condition of the Property or of its adequacy or suitability for the Purchaser's purposes.

37.4 Drainage Matters

The Vendor discloses and the Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that:

(a) there is no sewer or drainage diagram relating to the Property available from the relevant public or local authority for annexure to this Agreement

- for the purposes of Item 2 of Schedule 1 of the Conveyancing (Sale of Land) Regulation 2017;
- (b) there is a septic tank on the Property ("Septic Tank") which the Vendor discloses under File No. 5709/1999/OSSM Mid-Coast Council;
- (c) the Vendor cannot be required to do anything or spend any money before or after completion to ensure that the Septic Tank has or retains a current approval from Mid Coast Council; and
- (d) the Purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition, delay completion, rescind or terminate in respect of:
 - (i) the fact that there is no sewer or drainage diagram attached to this Agreement relating to the Property; or
 - (ii) the approval by or from the Mid-Coast Council to operate the Septic Tank.

38 Consequences of default in settlement

38.1 Notice to Complete

The parties agree that:

- if either party does not complete this Agreement by the Completion Date the other party has the right to make time of the essence of this Agreement by serving a notice to complete the agreement;
- (b) a notice requiring completion after 14 days from its receipt is regarded by the parties as reasonable and sufficient to make the time for completion stated in that notice an essential term of this Agreement; and
- (c) in circumstances justifying the issue by either party of a notice to complete or otherwise to comply with any of the provisions of this Agreement a period of 14 days from receipt of the notice is reasonable and sufficient to make the time for completion or other compliance essential.

38.2 Payment for additional work

If the Purchaser is not ready willing and able to complete this Agreement on the Completion Date and the Vendor has to issue a Notice to Complete:

- (a) the Purchaser must pay to the Vendor the amount of \$350.00 for value additional work to be done by the Vendor's solicitor (excluding GST) in relation to the need to issue the Notice to Complete and attend to matters relating to late completion; and
- (b) payment of the sum required by this clause is an essential term of this Agreement and the Vendor may terminate this Agreement and claim the deposit if the Purchaser fails or refuses to pay this sum to the Vendor.

38.3 Interest

- (a) If completion does not occur on or before the completion date and the Vendor is not responsible for any delay, the Purchaser shall pay to the Vendor, on completion, interest calculated:
 - (i) daily at the rate of 10% per annum;
 - (ii) on the balance of the purchase price payable under this Agreement,

in respect of the Interest Period (other than in respect of any part of the Interest Period during which completion has been delayed due to the fault of the Vendor).

- (b) It is an essential term of this Agreement that the Purchaser must pay the interest (if any) pursuant to this clause 38.3 and the Purchaser may not require the Vendor to complete this Agreement unless the Purchaser pays to the Vendor the interest payable on completion.
- (c) If due to no fault of the Vendor completion takes place after 4.00 p.m. on the completion date or after 4.00 p.m. on any day after the completion date, clause 38.3(a) applies as if completion takes place on the business day after the day on which completion actually takes place.

39 Restrictions

39.1 Excluded matters

The Purchaser may not raise any requisitions or objections or make any claim for compensation or delay completion or rescind or terminate this Agreement in respect of:

- (a) any latent or patent defects affecting the Property;
- (b) any boundary that is not fenced or any fences which are not on the correct boundary or the existence of any give-and-take fencing arrangement between the Vendor and adjoining landowners;
- (c) the existence of any sewers, drains, pipes, cables, wires or installations which pass through, over or under the Property;
- (d) the existence or otherwise of any water, sewerage, drainage, gas, electrical or telephone installations or services to the Property or in any way affecting the Property;
- (e) any breach of any Law in relation to the Property or any structure on the Property; or
- (f) the legality or otherwise of the current use of the Property.

39.2 Services

The Purchaser acknowledges that it is purchasing the Property (subject to s. 52A of the *Conveyancing Act 1919* and the regulations made under that section) subject to the Services and may not raise any requisitions or objections or make any claim for

compensation or delay completion or rescind or terminate this Agreement in respect of:

- the nature, location, availability or non-availability of the Services or (a) defects in the Services;
- whether or not the Property is subject to or has the benefit of any rights or (b) easements in respect of the Services;
- any underground or surface stormwater drain passing through or over the (c) Property or any manhole or vent on the property; or
- any rainwater downpipe being connected to the sewer. (d)

Carrying out of work on the Property before completion 39.3

The Purchaser may not call upon the Vendor to carry out any work or spend any money on the Property including, without limitation, any land rehabilitation or restoration, vegetation clearance, earthworks, rubbish removal, repairs or replacement of any items included in the sale which may sustain breakage, breakdown, damage or destruction except such as is caused by the malicious, intentional or negligent act of the Vendor.

Acknowledgements, warranties and representations 40

- The Purchaser acknowledges the Vendor's disclosure in the annexed (a) certificate under section 10.7 of the Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979 of all environmental planning instruments (including draft environmental planning instruments) affecting the Property as notified by the relevant Council.
- The Purchaser represents and warrants that: (b)
 - it has inspected the section 10.7 certificate and has obtained advice (i) on the section 10.7 certificate and the instruments referred to in the section 10.7 certificate;
 - it is satisfied about the purposes for which the Property may be used (ii) and about all restrictions and prohibitions on development of the Property;
 - it is satisfied as to the nature, quality, condition and state of repair (iii) of the Property;
 - it accepts the Property as it is together with all defects (latent or (iv) patent) and all dilapidation and infestation;
 - it was not induced to enter into this Agreement by and did not rely (v) on any representations or warranties by the Vendor, the Vendor's agent or persons on behalf of the Vendor about the subject matter of this Agreement (including, representations or warranties about the construction, nature or the fitness or suitability for any purpose of the Property or about any financial return or income to be derived

from the Property) except those representations and warranties set out in this Agreement; and

- (vi) it has obtained appropriate independent advice on and is satisfied about:
 - (A) its obligations and rights under this Agreement;
 - (B) the nature of the Property and the purposes for which the Property may be lawfully used;
 - (C) its rights, entitlements and obligations (if any) under the GST Act (or any other Law relating to GST) arising in connection with this Agreement;

 - (iv) the presence in or on the Property of asbestos or contamination.
- (e) This clause 40 does not merge on completion.

41 Land Tax Certificate

For the purposes of clause 16.6 of this Agreement, the Vendor shall serve a current land tax certificate on the Purchaser at least fourteen (14) days before the Completion Date, providing that the certificate served by the Vendor does not have to show that there is no charge on the Property.

42 Agent

No claims etc. 47.4

48 Guarantee

Guaranteed Money means all amounts which at any time for any reason or circumstance are payable, are owing but not currently payable, are contingently owing or remain unpaid (or which are reasonably foreseeable as likely, after that time, to fall within any of those categories), by the Purchaser to the Vendor in connection with this Agreement or any transaction contemplated by it, whether at law, in equity, under statute or otherwise.

Guaranteed Obligations mean all express or implied obligations of the Purchaser to the Vendor in connection with this Agreement and any transaction contemplated by it.

Giving the guarantee 48.2

If the Purchaser does not duly and punctually perform the Guaranteed Obligations in accordance with the terms of the document under which they are to be performed then the Guarantor agrees to perform the Guaranteed Obligations on demand from the Vendor (whether or not demand has been made on the Purchaser). A demand may be made at any time and from time to time.

48.6 Indemnity by Guarantor

As a separate undertaking, the Guarantor indemnifies the Vendor against all liability or loss arising from, and any costs, charges or expenses incurred in connection with:

- (a) The Guaranteed Money not being recoverable from the Guarantor or from the Purchaser
- (b) The Guaranteed Obligations not being duly and punctually performed

because of any circumstance whatsoever.

48.7 Continuing security

- (ii) Prove in competition with the Vendor if a liquidator, provisional liquidator, official manager or trustee in bankruptcy is appointed in respect of the Purchaser of the Purchaser is otherwise unable to pay its debts when they fall due.

- F. As at the date of this agreement the Manager has entered into an agreement as caretaker with the Neighbourhood Association DP 286227, dated 23 December 2015 (the "Caretaker Agreement").

Operative provisions:

- 1. The Appointment of the Manager
- The Owner appoints the Manager to perform the duties and provide the services in this Agreement.
- 1.2 The Manager accepts the appointment.
- 1.3 Deleted.
- The Manager shall supply this Management Agreement document at its cost. Each party shall pay their own costs of checking and engrossing this Agreement.
- The Manager will use its best endeavours to enter into a management agreement in the same terms as this agreement with the other owners of the Neighbourhood Scheme.
- 1.5 This agreement and the duties of the Manager are separate from the duties expressed in the Caretaker Agreement.

2. Interpretation of this Agreement

- 2.1 This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the law for the time being in force in New South Wales and the parties, by entering into this Agreement, are deemed to have submitted to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of that State
- 2.2 In this Agreement except to the extent that the context otherwise requires:-
 - 2.2.1 any term defined in the statement of the names and descriptions of the parties has the meaning there defined;
 - 2.2.2 reference to legislation or a provision of legislation includes change or reenactment of the legislation of a legislative provision substitution for, and legislation and statutory instruments and regulations issued under the legislation;
 - 2.2.3 words denoting the singular include the plural and vice versa;
 - 2.2.4 words denoting individuals or persons include bodies corporate and trusts and vice versa;
 - 2.2.5 headings are for convenience only and will not affect interpretation;

- 2.2.6 reference to a clause, paragraph of schedule is a reference to a clause, paragraph or schedule of this Agreement;
- 2.2.7 reference to a document or agreement includes reference to that document or agreement as changed, notated or replaced from time to time;
- 2.2.8 words denoting any gender include all genders;
- 2.2.9 where the day on or by which anything is to be done is a Saturday, a Sunday or a public holiday in the place in which that thing is to be done, then that thing will be done on the next succeeding business day.
- 2.2.10 where rights or obligations are expressed in this Agreement, such rights or obligations are to be enforced or undertaken in accordance with or subject always to compliance with the Constitution.

3. How long is this appointment

- 3.1 This Agreement commences on the date of execution hereof and will expire on 1 January 2099.
- 4. Rights and obligations of the Manager

General rights and obligations

- 4.1 The Manager must:-
 - 4.1.1 perform the Management Duties in Schedule 1;
 - 4.1.2 perform the Management Duties according to this agreement and the reasonable instructions from the Owner PROVIDED THAT the instructions are consistent with this agreement;
 - 4.1.3 appoint one representative to liaise with the Neighbourhood Association DP 286227 and attend meetings of the Neighbourhood Association DP 286227.
 - 4.1.4 acknowledge the terms and conditions of the Caretaker Agreement.
- The Manager may make agreements with third parties to provide services, goods or materials to assist the Manager to perform its duties other than the Caretaker duties pursuant to the terms of the Caretaker Agreement.

The Manager may, with consent from the Neighbourhood Association DP 286227, place signs on Association Property to assist in the management and operation of Clarendon Forest Retreat.

Functions under the Neighbourhood Management Statement and this Agreement

- In expansion of the Management Duties expressed in Schedule 1, the Manager shall offer the Lots for rental to such persons and for such duration and on such terms and conditions of occupancy as the Manager in its sole discretion shall determine. The Manager shall use its best efforts to be fair and act in good faith in the offering of an available Lot to Guests, consistent with the preferences of the guest for different types, sizes, qualities, locations and rental rates. The Manager shall manage the Lots impartially without favour or treatment to the Owner or to any other owner.
- 4.5 The Manager shall set rental rates for the Owner's Lot, which in the Manager's discretion and opinion shall maximize the rental income from the Lot.
- 4.6 The Manager shall provide the following services:-
 - 4.6.1 a reservation service on a year round basis;
 - the maintenance of a complete set of accounting books for the rental program, kept according to standard accounting practice. The Manager shall prepare and forward to the Owner quarterly statements detailing income earned and expenses incurred in respect of the Owner's Lot together with funds for the profit earned by the Owner' Lot;
 - 4.6.3 the Manager shall keep and preserve for at least five (5) years all records and occupancy statistics of the Owner's Lot;
 - 4.6.4 the Manager shall use its best efforts to cause the Owner's Lot to be occupied by Guests and shall faithfully and diligently pursue the collection of all rents;
 - the Manager shall advertise, market and promote all Lots in Clarendon Forest Retreat at minimal cost and with maximum effect. Such cost is to be at the expense of the owner.
 - 4.6.6 all rental income received in respect of the Owner's Lot managed by the Manager which sum shall be held by the Manager will be paid to the Manager's account.
- The Manager will use its best endeavours to arrange and pay for a public liability cover to the extent \$20,000,000.00 (such policy to be at the expense of the lot owners) on the Manager's policy indemnifying the Proprietors of the Lots and the Neighbourhood Association against any claims arising from loss or damage in the property that are related to the operation of the Management business. This policy will cover the whole of the Neighbourhood parcel of land.

- The Owner agrees to give the Manager uninterrupted control and operation of the letting and managing of the Lot and agrees not to interfere or be involved in any way with the day to day operation of the letting and managing of the Lot except as expressly permitted in this Agreement.
- The Manager will undertake such maintenance and refurbishment of Lots and will supply or arrange the provision of such services for Guests to ensure that Clarendon Forest Retreat maintains a rating by AAA Tourism of a four and a half (4.5) star rating or in the event that AAA Tourism ceases to exist an equivalent four and a half (4.5) star rating by a comparable tourist advisory organisation. Such works to be at the Lot Owners expense.
- 4.10 The Manager may appoint the Caretaker to provide cleaning and maintenance services to the Owner's lot at the Owner's expense as may be required from time to time.
- The Owner acknowledges and agrees that the rights of the Owner or any other owner of a Lot to rebuild, modify, extend or renovate any structure upon a Lot is subject to the Neighbourhood Management Statement and the right of the Manager to refuse to allow such Works if in the Manager's opinion such works are likely to:-
 - 4.11.1 reduce the occupancy rate of the existing completed Cottages upon the Land to less than ninety per cent (90%) of the Prior Occupancy Rate during the financial year during which the works on the Cottages are to be completed.
 - 4.11.2 diminish the ambience and panoramic quality of Clarendon Forest Retreat.

5. General rights and responsibilities of the Owner

- 5.1 The Owner hereby grants to the Manager full and free right in accordance with the terms of this Agreement to lease the Owner's Lot to Guests.
- The Owner acknowledges that the Manager is also the Manager for other owners of Lots that are comparable in standard and competitive in letting fees with the Owner's Lot.
- 5.3 Except to the extent that the Manager has accepted liability pursuant to this Agreement, the Owner shall be liable for all costs of ownership and maintenance of the Lot including, but without limitation to, Council rates, Neighbourhood Association levies, commission payable to the manager pursuant to clause 6, telephone costs and charges, electricity connection costs, electricity charges, building and contents insurance for replacement value, television lease/license costs, cable television operating costs, income tax, any non resident tax and any shortfall between the Owner's share of all such expenses and the income obtained from the letting of the Lot.

5.4 The Owner agrees and acknowledges that the Manager may use the Lot for promotional purposes and provide complimentary accommodation to Influencers at the Managers discretion. The maximum use of the unit for this purpose, is five (5) days per annum.

The Owner or a duly authorised representative of the Owner shall have the right to enter the Lot at all reasonable times for the purpose of inspecting the Lot.

Unless otherwise agreed to by the Manager, 14 days notice must be given prior to inspection of the Lot and such inspection must not disturb Guests staying in the Cottage.

6. Managers Fee

- The Owner shall pay the Manager as a fee for its services pursuant to this Agreement a fee of twelve per cent (12%) of the Gross Operating Receipts received by the Manager plus in addition to that fee such GST as may be payable in respect of the Lot.
- The Parties acknowledge that the Gross Operating Receipts may vary according to the Manager's discretion and according to the source of the business and noting that and without restricting the generality of this clause parts received will vary between ordinary rate, corporate rate, wholesale rate, or otherwise.
- In addition to the fee payable to the Manager, the Manager will also be entitled to deduct from the Gross Operating Receipts the expenses listed in Schedule One together with such other expenses that are in the Manager's opinion necessary for the efficient and profitable conduct of Clarendon Forest Retreat.
- In the event that the fee is insufficient to meet the share of the Owner's contribution to the expenses incurred by the Manager for the services provided in Schedule 1, the Manager shall be entitled to charge the Owner for those services, less any fee received, that is in the Manager's opinion necessary for the efficient and profitable conduct of Clarendon Forest Retreat.
- The Manager will at all times act diligently and will exercise proper management skills to ensure that the expenses to Clarendon Forest Retreat remain commensurate with the expenses expressed in the profit and loss statements prepared for Clarendon Forest Retreat for the year ending 30 June 2012 or such later year as profit and loss statements may be available from time to time.
- The Manager will use its best endeavors to contain any increase in expenses to not more than three per cent (3%) per annum or an amount equal to the consumer price index for Sydney which ever is the greater unless otherwise agreed by the parties hereto to vary those expenses provided that all parties acknowledge that an increase

in the Occupancy Rate will require an increase in expenses to properly and efficiently service the Allotment.

7. Use of Lot by Owner

- 7.1 The Owner shall be entitled to use the Lot for the personal use of the Owner or the Owner's family and friends for a maximum of thirty (30) weeks per calendar year PROVIDED THAT the Owner recognizes that the Lot is available for rental to Guests and shall give the Manager reasonable notice of the Owner's wish to have the Lot made available for personal use.
- Pursuant to clause 7.1 the Owner acknowledges that any rental booking of the Lot prior to the Manager receiving notices of the Owner's desire to use the Lot for personal use shall take priority over the Owner's right to use the Lot PROVIDED THAT:-
 - 8.2.1 if not less than thirty (30) days notice shall have been given by the Owner, the Manager shall make every reasonable effort to accommodate the Owner by shifting the prior rental commitment to another Lot.
 - 8.2.2 this clause will not apply where a Guest specifically requests the Owners Lot and is deemed by the Manager to be sensitive to a change of accommodation.
- 8. Deleted.

9. Termination

- 9.1 The Owner may terminate this Agreement at any time if:-
 - 9.1.1 the Manager breaches this Agreement and that breach continues for more than 28 days after the Owner serves a notice on the Manager to remedy the breach;
 - 9.1.2 the Manager becomes bankrupt, enters into liquidation or enters into an arrangement with its creditors (other than for amalgamation or reconstruction with the consent of the Owner); or
 - 9.1.3 if the Manager is a corporation, a Director of the Manager is convicted of an indictable offence.
- 9.2 The Manager may at its discretion terminate this agreement at any time if:-
 - 10.2.1 the Owner breaches this agreement and that breach continues for more than 28 days after the Manager serves a notice on the Owner to remedy the breach; or

- 10.2.2 the Owner does not pay the Manager the Management Fee or other money it owes the Manager on the due date or within 14 days of the due date.
- 9.3 The Rights expressed in this clause are in addition to and not in reduction of any other Rights vested in the Manager pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.
- 9.4 Notwithstanding the above, the Manager and the Owner may terminate this Agreement by giving each other at least six (6) months' notice of their intention to terminate.

10. Sale of Lot

10.1 If the Owner sells the Owner's Lot at any time during the term of this agreement then the Owner agrees to include as a condition of sale that any purchaser from the Owner agrees to enter into a "New Management Agreement" with the Manager.

11. Permitted assignment by Manager

- 11.1 Subject to clause 11.3, the Manager may assign its interest (in part or in whole) in this agreement on the following terms:-
 - 11.1.1 any assignment must be to a person, partnership, organization or company that has had management experience in the Hotel, Motel, Bed & Breakfast, Managed Apartments, Farm Stay or marketing sector of the Hospitality Industry.
 - 11.1.2 consent of the Owner to the assignment must be obtained prior to the assignment being concluded PROVIDED THAT the Owner will not be entitled to unreasonably withhold the Owner's consent.
 - 11.1.3 if the Manager is a corporation, any change in the legal and/or beneficial ownership of any of the shares in the capital of the Manager or any issue of new capital resulting in a change in the effective management or control of the Manager, or the Manager entering into an amalgamation or agreement to enter into an amalgamation proposal is deemed to be assignment of the Manager's interest in this agreement.
 - 11.1.4 the Manager will, upon any assignment, transfer all its right and title in the business name 'Clarendon Forest Retreat' to the incoming Manager.
- The Manager will give 28 days notification to the Owner of its intention to assign its interest, whether in whole or in part in this agreement, and any notification must provide details of the background and experience of the person, partnership, organization, or company to which the rights pursuant to this agreement are to be assigned.

11.3 Notwithstanding any provision of this Agreement, should the Manager die or suffer a debilitating and incapacitating illness or become mentally incapacitated, or if the Manager is a corporation should any of its officeholders die or suffer a debilitating and incapacitating illness or become mentally incapacitated and be unable to undertake his or her duties and functions within the Manager, then such obligations normally undertaken by the incapacitated Manager or office holder may be assigned in accordance with Clause 11.1 hereof and Clause 9.1.1 will not apply.

12. When the parties are not liable

- 12.1 The Manager is not liable to the Owner for the cost, damage, loss, injury or death caused by:-
 - 12.1.1 the Manager or any other person failing to comply with the Neighbourhood Management Statement;
 - 12.1.2 the Neighbourhood Association or its members failing to comply with its duties under the Community Land Development Act 1989, the Community Land Management Act 1989 and the Neighbourhood Management Statement;
 - 12.1.3 an action taken by the Owner or by the Neighbourhood Association; or
 - 12.1.14 the Owner failing to act appropriately.
- 12.2 The Owner is not liable to the Manager for any cost, damage, loss, injury or death caused by;
 - 12.2.1 the Manager or any person failing to comply with the Neighbourhood Management Statement;
 - 12.2.2 the Manager failing to comply with its duties and obligations under this Agreement;
 - 12.2.3 an action taken by the Manager; or
 - 12.2.4 the Manager failing to act appropriately.
- 12.3 In this clause, a reference to a party includes a reference to the employees, officers, agents, managing agents and contractors of the party.

13. Indemnities by the parties

- 13.1 The Manager is liable for and indemnifies the Owner against any liability or loss arising from, and costs incurred in connection with
 - 13.1.1 damage, loss, injury, or death caused or contributed to by the act, negligence or default of the Manager; and

14.1.2 the Owner doing any thing which the Manager must do under this Agreement but which, in the opinion of the Owner, the Manager has not done or has not done properly.

This indemnity does not apply to any loss or damage caused by or contributed to by the Owner.

- 13.2 The Owner is liable for and indemnifies the Manager against any liability or loss arising from, and costs incurred in connection with
 - 13.1.1 damage, loss, injury, or death caused or contributed to by the act, negligence or default of the Owner; and
 - 13.1.2 the Manager doing any thing which the Owner must do under this Agreement or under the terms of the Neighbourhood Management Statement but which, in the opinion of the Manager, the Owner has not done or has not done properly.

This indemnity does not apply to any loss or damage caused by or contributed to by the Manager.

13.3 In this clause a reference to a party includes reference to the employees, agents, managing agents, officers or contractors of the party

14. The Manager and security

14.1 The Owner acknowledges that the Manager is not the insurer or the guarantor of the security and safety of any person or any property in or upon the land comprising the Owner's Lot.

15. Arbitration

- 15.1 In the event of a dispute arising in respect this Agreement then either the Owner or the Manager may submit the dispute to be resolved by Arbitration.
- The Arbitrator shall be such Arbitrator as shall be appointed by the President for the time being of the Institute of Arbitrators (Australia) and the arbitration shall be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the said Institute of Arbitrator (Australia) applicable from time to time.
- 15.3 The decision of the Arbitrator shall be final and binding on all parties including any obligation on the parties to execute documents and do all things necessary to enable compliance with the decision of the Arbitrator.

16. Dictionary

Meaning of words

- 16.1 Words written **Like This** and some other words have special meanings. This clause explains what they mean. Words that this clause does not explain have the same meaning as they do in the Act.
- 16.2 In this Agreement:

Association Property means Lot 1 in DP286227.

Business Day means a day on which banks in New South Wales are open for business.

Caretaker means the person or entity appointed by the Neighbourhood Association pursuant to the Caretaker Agreement.

Caretaker Agreement means the Caretaker Agreement entered into by the Caretaker and the Neighbourhood Association dated 23 December 2015.

Clarendon Forest Retreat means the land and all improvements erected upon it as well as the fixtures, fittings and infrastructure relevant to the conduct of the business of a high quality holiday resort.

Association Property has the same meaning as defined in the Neighbourhood Management Statement.

Cottage means a dwelling erected on a Lot.

Expenses mean those expenses expressed in Schedule 1 or such other expenses as may be properly incurred by the Manager in exercising his duties pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

Gross Operating Receipts means the gross letting income excluding GST actually received by the Manager in respect of the Allotment.

Guest means a person (other than the Owner or staff, employees, agents or servants of the Manager) who is accommodated.

Influencer means a person employed in or associated with the travel or tourist industry and who has the ability either immediately or in the future, generate additional Guests for the Owner.

Land means the whole of the land comprising the Neighbourhood parcel being the land in DP No. 286227 being 100 acres of land in Coates Road, Possum Brush via Failford and which property is known as Clarendon Forest Retreat.

Land Improvement Plan means those works and improvements to be implemented to the Land in accordance with Schedule 2.

Lawn Area means the grassed areas within the curtilage of each cottage but does not include the whole of a Lot.

Lot means a Neighbourhood Lot as defined in the Neighbourhood Management Statement.

Manager means Cleaver Management Pty Ltd ACN 608 814 642

Managers Fee means the fees payable to the Manager pursuant to clause 6.

Neighbourhood Association means the corporation constituted under section 25 of the *Community Land Development Act 1989* and known as Neighbourhood Association DP No. 286227 or its duly appointed managing agent.

Neighbourhood Management Statement means the Management Statement registered with Deposited Plan No. 286227 pursuant to section 13 (4) of the *Community Land Development Act 1989*as may be amended from time to time.

New Management Agreement means a Management Agreement in the same terms as this Agreement save that the commencement date shall be modified to reflect the date of such New Agreement and provided further that the Party nominated as the Owner will be the Purchaser from the present Owner.

Other Cottages mean those dwellings erected on Lots other than the Owner's Lot.

Owner means the Registered Proprietor of the Lot 7 in DP 286227 the subject of this Agreement.

Owners Ledger means the books of account maintained by the Manager or its accountant, which books of account detail all income and expenses incurred during each financial year in respect of the Owner's Lot.

Prior Occupancy Rate means the occupancy rate of the Owners Lot for the financial year prior to the year in which an event expressed in this Agreement occurs

Rental Profit means the difference between the Gross Rents received and Expenses.

Members means the members of the Neighbourhood Association being the proprietors of the lots in DP286227.

Works mean any work undertaken upon the Land whether of a capital nature or for the purpose of maintenance or repairs.

These are the Management Duties the Manager must perform for the Owner under clause 4.

In this schedule, references to clauses mean clauses in this schedule (unless the context indicates otherwise).

Subject and in expansion to this Agreement, the Manager must comply with instructions from the Owner.

Services for the Owner

- 1.1 Provide management services for the Owner's Lot and the cottage on the Owner's Lot.
- 1.2 Operate, control and manage Clarendon Forest Retreat in accordance with the By-Laws of the Neighbourhood Management Statement.
- Liaise with the Executive Committee of the Neighbourhood Association and its managing agent (if any) to provide assistance to enable compliance with the Community Land Development Act 1989 and the Community Land Management Act 1989.
- Liase with the Caretaker appointed by the Neighbourhood Association to provide assistance to enable compliance with the Community Land Development Act 1989 and the Community Land Management Act 1989.
- 1.5 Provide management and implementation of procedures in accordance with the Bushfire Management Plan and Emergency Evacuation Plan prepared for Clarendon Forest Retreat and as referred to in the Neighbourhood Management Statement, as may be amended from time to time.
- 1.6 Provide other ancillary services at such fees as are agreed between the Owner and the Manager from time to time.

2. Contractors of the Neighbourhood Association or Owner

- 2.1 Monitor the performance of contractors to the Neighbourhood Association or Owner.
- 2.2 Ensure as far as is reasonable that contractors of the Neighbourhood Association or Owner comply promptly and efficiently with their obligations.

3. Security

- 3.1 Issue and accept the return of Security Keys for the Cottages.
- 3.2 Discuss with the Caretaker any breaches of security and report to the police (if warranted).

3.3 Take appropriate action with regard to unauthorised persons or vehicles on the Land comprising the Neighbourhood Scheme (but only if it is safe to do so).

4. Maintenance of the Owner's Lots

- 4.1 Mow the Lawn Area of each Lot to within ten (10) meters, or the curtilage boundary fence, of each Cottage on a regular basis at the Owner's expense.
- 4.2 Maintain all gardens and Lawn Area of the Lots at the Owner's expense.
- 4.3 Maintain and repair at the Owner's expense, if needed, all fences and tracks in use (including drive ways and path ways) of the Lots.

5. Maintenance of cottages on the Lots

- 5.1 Maintain and repair at the Owner's expense when and where necessary (including repainting every 5 years or otherwise as needed) the Cottages both internally and externally to ensure compliance with clause 4.9 to this Agreement.
- 5.2 Provide and maintain at the Owner's expense linen, towels and gowns to each Owner's Cottage.
- 5.3 Provide and maintain at the Owner's expense cutlery and crockery but firstly from the owners spare supplies
- 5.4 Provide and maintain at the Owner's expense cooking utensils but firstly from the owners spare supplies.
- 5.5 Maintain all white goods and replace where necessary at the Owner's expense (subject to the provisions of this Agreement).
- 5.6 Provide, when required, breakfast baskets to Owners and Guests at the Owner's/Guest's expense.
- 5.7 Provide, when required, lunches and dinners to Owners and Guests at the Owner's /Guest's expense.
- 5.8 Provide, when required such ancillary services at an appropriate fee to Owners and Guests as may be offered by the Manager in the Manager's absolute discretion.

7. Administration

7.1 To promote and advertise Clarendon Forest Retreat in newspapers, magazines, via the internet and by the distribution of advertising material, at the Owner's expense.

- 7.2 Employ such staff as may be required to ensure the performance of this Agreement, at the Owner's expense.
- 7.3 Provide reservation systems including on-line reservations and bookings.

8. Swimming Pool and Tennis Court

- 8.1 Liaise with the Caretaker and Neighbourhood Association to ensure that access to the swimming pool and tennis court located on Lot 1 is available to the owners or Guests at reasonable times.
- 8.2 Liaise with the Caretaker and Neighbourhood Association to ensure that all safety equipment as required by the Swimming Pools Act is properly available.
- 8.3 Liaise with the Caretaker and Neighbourhood Association to ensure that access to the swimming pool and tennis court will be at no cost to the Owner, nor to the Guests.
- 9. Reception Area
- 9.1 The Manager will operate a Reception Area at no cost to the Owner.
- 9.2 The Owner acknowledges that the Reception Area is located at Lot 2 of DP 286227.

10. Expenses

The following expenses will normally be incurred by the Manager in the conduct of Clarendon Forest Retreat and will be at the Owner's expense. The parties acknowledge that repairs and maintenance to Association property may also be separately levied to the Owner by the Neighbourhood Association, not in addition to management maintenance but as a separate element where the Neighbourhood Association considers it necessary or appropriate.

- (b) it will perform all of its obligations under the Agreement up to and including the Assignment Date;
- (c) it is legally entitled to make the assignment; and
- (d) it will not be in breach of the Agreement on the Assignment Date.

5. CONSENT AND CONFIRMATION BY NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION

5.1 Neighbourhood Association Consent

The Neighbourhood Association:

- (a) consents to the assignment of the Agreement to the Assignee; and
- (b) confirms that the remuneration payable by the Neighbourhood Association to the Caretaker pursuant to Schedule 1 of the Caretaking Agreement for the year ending on 31 March 2016 is \$55,878.44 plus GST.

5.2 Status of Agreement

The Neighbourhood Association covenants with the Assignee that to the best of its knowledge and belief:

- (a) it was empowered to enter into the Agreement;
- (b) there is no existing breach by the Assignor of the Agreement as at the Assignment Date;
- (c) the interests of the Assignor under the Agreement are not liable to forfeiture or surrender; and
- (d) it will not rely upon any breach of the Agreement by the Assignor or any predecessor thereof in its dealings with the Assignee; and
- (e) subject to clause 8.1, all of the conditions in the Agreement about the assignment have been fulfilled and the assignment is unconditional.

5.3 Covenant by Neighbourhood Association

The Neighbourhood Association covenants to be bound by the provisions of the Agreement from the Assignment Date as if the Assignee was the Caretaker originally named in the Agreement.

5.4 Confirmation of Terms

The Neighbourhood Association in every respect confirms the provisions of the Agreement for the balance term.

5.5 Release

From the Assignment Date the Neighbourhood Association releases the Assignor and any guarantors of the Agreements in respect of anything that occurs after the Assignment Date.

6. COVENANTS BY ASSIGNEE AND NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION

6.1 Bound by Agreements

The Neighbourhood Association and the Assignee:

- (a) ratify and confirm all of the terms and conditions of the Agreement and covenant that henceforth the Agreement shall have full force and effect; and
- (b) agree to be bound by the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

6.2 No Delegation

The Neighbourhood Association and the Assignee acknowledge that it is not the intention of the Neighbourhood Association to appoint the Caretaker as a strata managing agent under section 28 of the Act, nor to delegate to the Caretaker all or any of its functions.

7. TRUSTEE PROVISIONS

If the Assignee enters into this Deed or otherwise at any time holds the Agreements as a trustee of any trust (*Trust*) then, whether or not the Neighbourhood Association has any notice (actual or constructive) of the Trust, the following applies:

- (a) the Assignee warrants it has full power under the Trust to enter into and perform its obligations under the Agreemens and this Deed;
- (b) the obligations and liabilities of the Assignee under this Deed or the Agreements or both extend to the fund and any other assets of the Trust (*Trust Fund*);
- (c) the Assignee shall on the written demand or direction of the Neighbourhood Association exercise all rights of indemnity it may at any time have against the Trust Fund and any beneficiaries or unit holder under the Trust or any of the same for the benefit of the Neighbourhood Association;
- (d) the Assignee is liable under this Deed and the Agreement both in its personal capacity and as trustee of the Trust; and

(e) the Assignee must produce to the Neighbourhood Association the original stamped trust deed (or a photocopy certified by an accountant or solicitor) and all other documents evidencing the Trust and the Trust Fund within 14 days of written request for the same by the Neighbourhood Association.

8. COSTS

8.1 Assignor to Pay Neighbourhood Association Costs

The Assignor must on or before the Assignment Date pay the Neighbourhood Association's reasonable legal and administration costs of obtaining the Neighbourhood Association's consent to the assignment and in relation to the negotiation and execution of this Deed, and any further Deed which may be required by the Neighbourhood Association as a condition of granting consent.

8.2 Each Party to Pay Own Costs

Subject to clause 8.1 each party will pay its own costs of the negotiation, preparation and execution of this Deed except that the Assignee will pay all stamp duty on it.

9. AUTHORITY TO COMPLETE BLANKS

The parties are authorised to complete any blanks in this Deed as agreed to in writing by the parties.

10. FURTHER ASSURANCE

Each of the parties will (and will procure every other person as required) to sign and execute all such further documents and otherwise do all such things as may be necessary or desirable to give full force and effect to this Deed and the transactions contemplated by this Deed.

11. WARRANTY OF AUTHORITY

Each person signing this Deed:

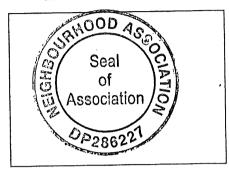

The objectives of this statement are to establish the aims and fundamental principles that this neighbourhood functions upon; to establish a structure of management and responsibility that ensures the aims and principles are achievable; and to establish the by-laws fundamental to the practical functioning of the neighbourhood.

PART 1 BY-LAWS FIXING DETAILS OF DEVELOPMENT

The By-laws in this Part 1 relate to the control and preservation of the essence or theme of the Neighbourhood Scheme and as such may only be amended or revoked by a unanimous resolution of the Neighbourhood Association (See section 17(2) Community Land Management Act 1989).

THEME - CLARENDON FOREST RETREAT

Essence or theme of development

The essence or theme of Clarendon Forest Retreat is the creation of a community offering residential tourism accommodation in harmony with the surrounding land and forest ecosystems, through the design of environmentally-sensitive dwellings and landscaped surrounds which retain native flora and fauna and reduce environmental pollution.

BY-LAW 1 - ARCHITECTURAL AND LANDSCAPE CODE

1.1 Neighborhood Association May Prescribe

The Neighbourhood Association may prescribe, amend and add to an Architectural and Landscape Code in relation to the Neighbourhood Scheme.

1.2 Purpose of Architectural and Landscape Code

The Architectural and Landscape Code may contain:-

- (a) an architectural code providing a detailed definition of the architectural theme and style for improvements constructed on the Lots;
- (b) a landscape code defining the landscaping requirements for the lots; and
- (c) any other matter determined by the Neighbourhood Association.

1.3 Development Control Plan

Any Architectural and Landscape Code must not conflict with the corresponding provisions in Council's Development Control Plan applicable to the Neighbourhood property.

1.4 Section 88B Instrument Setting Out Terms of Easements and Restrictions on the Use of the Land

The provisions of the Architectural and Landscape Code must not conflict with the terms and conditions of any instrument created under s.88B of the Conveyancing Act 1919, as registered with the Deposited Plan.

1.5 Parties Bound

The Architectural and Landscape Code described in this By-Law binds:-

- (a) the Neighbourhood Association;
- (b) each proprietor or occupier or lessee of a Lot; and
- (c) each mortgagee in possession of a Lot.

1.6 Current copy of Architectural and Landscape Code

The Neighbourhood Association must, when requested by the owner of a Lot, provide the owner of the Lot, at a reasonable cost to that owner, with a current copy of the Architectural and Landscape Code.

BY-LAW 2 - DEVELOPMENT WORKS

2.1 Approvals Process

- (a) The owner of a Lot may not commence any works, including without limitation:
 - (i) any new construction,
 - (ii) any building modification or alterations to improvements; and/or
 - (iii) any material landscape modification,

on any Lot or improvements situated on any Lot until an Application containing plans and specifications for the development works has been approved by the Executive Committee in accordance with this By-Law.

- (b) The owner of a Lot must lodge any Application for approval of development works in relation to any Lot with the Executive Committee before carrying out any works on any Lot and prior to the lodging of an application for approval (where approval is required) with Council.
- (c) An Application must contain sufficient information about the development works to enable the Executive Committee to understand with reasonable certainty the nature and extent of the proposed works.
- (d) The Executive Committee may request additional information to enable it to make a decision on an Application.
- (e) The Executive Committee may refer an application to a General Meeting of the Neighourhood Association for its decision.

- (f) The Executive Committee must, within 40 days after it has received all information required by it, advise the Applicant that it either:
 - (i) consents to the Application either unconditionally or subject to conditions and details those conditions; or
 - (ii) refuses to consent to the Application and gives its reasons.
- (g) A decision made by the Executive Committee is final and binding on the Applicant.
- (h) Decisions made at a meeting of the Executive Committee are to be made by a majority of votes of members present and voting at the meeting at which a quorum is present.
- (i) No member of the Executive Committee will be liable for any loss or damage occurring by reason of an act done in the capacity of a member of the Executive Committee except for negligence on the part of that member.

2.2 Application for Approval of Development Works - New Construction, Building Modification, Alterations to Improvements

- (a) The Application for approval must contain:-
 - (i) The plans and specifications for the development works including a complete copy of the application for submission to Council (if any); and
 - (ii) a landscape proposal that complies with clause 2.3 of these By-Laws.
- (b) The Executive Committee must, when considering an Application for approval of proposed works, have regard to and be satisfied that the Applicant has provided adequate details as to the following:-
 - (i) size and shape of the Lot;
 - (ii) character, location, scale, shape, size and height of the proposed works;
 - (iii) suitability and quality of design and materials;
 - (iv) harmony of the external design or appearance with existing improvements on the Lot;
 - (v) effect of the development works on the landscape or scenic quality of the Neighbourhood Scheme;
 - (vi) location and elevation in relation to surrounding structures and topography;

- (vii) whether the development works are consistent with the overall 'theme' of the Neighbourhood Scheme;
- (viii) whether adequate provision has been made for appropriate landscaping;
- (ix) harmony with existing landscaping;
- (x) maximisation of solar efficiency, water and resource conservation;
- (xi) compliance with these By-Laws, any Architectural and Landscape Code or Rules in force at the time the Application is made; and
- (xii) any other matter that the Executive Committee acting reasonably consider should be taken into account.

2.3 Application for Approval of Development Works - Landscape Modification

- (a) The Application for approval must contain:-
 - (i) a description of the nature, kind, shape, height, quantity, location and function of the proposed trees, shrubs and garden areas; and
 - (ii) details of the nature and type of proposed landscaping material and features.
- (b) The Executive Committee must, when considering an Application for proposed landscape modification, have regard to and be satisfied that the Applicant has provided adequate details as to the following:-
 - (i) suitability of design, colour, plant species and landscape materials and features;
 - (ii) quality of design, colour, plant species and landscape materials and features;
 - (iii) location in surrounding structures;
 - (iv) harmony with existing landscape structures;
 - (v) the removal of, or dealing with, existing plants, flowers, shrubs and trees;
 - (xiii) compliance with these By-Laws, any Architectural and Landscape Code or Rules in force at the time the Application is made; and
 - (vi) any other matter that the Executive Committee acting reasonably consider should be taken into account

2.4 Site Works

The owner of a Lot must not:-

- (a) erect, place or allow any person to reside in any form of temporary or demountable structure, including mobile homes, sheds, caravans and the like;
- (b) allow polluted water or other waste material to escape any Lot;
- (c) carry out earth works on any Lot without prior consent under this By-Law and the consent of Council; or
- (d) occupy any dwelling or allow any dwelling to be occupied until that dwelling is completed and a Certificate of Occupancy is issued by Council.

2.5 Other Structures

The owner of a Lot must not:-

- (a) erect any other external structures such as car ports, garages, sheds and stables unless they are of similar design, standard and materials to the dwelling, and are sited so as to minimise any adverse impact on the overall appearance of the Lot and the Neighbourhood Scheme; or
- (b) erect or place any metal garden shed on the Lot.

BY-LAW 3 NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION PROPERTY ("ASSOCIATION PROPERTY")

3.1 Construction on Association Property

The owner or occupier of a Lot must not, except with the approval of the Neighbourhood Association:-

- (a) construct any building or other structure including, without limitation, any fence, screen, pergola or awning on Association property except in accordance with these By-Laws; or
- (b) attach any item as a fixture to Association Property; or
- (c) alter Association Property.

3.2 Development by Neighbourhood Association on Association Property

The Neighbourhood Association must, in respect of any development on Association Property (Lot 1), comply with the intent of any Architectural and Landscape Code and these By-Laws.

BY-LAW 4 MAINTENANCE

4.1 Maintenance of Improvements on Lot

- (a) The owner or occupier of a Lot must:
 - (i) keep the Lot including, without limitation, the exterior of the buildings and any other structures on the Lot, clean and in good repair and condition; and
 - (ii) carry out all maintenance and repairs to the exterior of the buildings and any other structures on the Lot in a proper and workmanlike manner to the reasonable satisfaction of the Neighbourhood Association in accordance with the Architectural and Landscape Code and, without limitation, with materials of the same or similar qualities as those used in the construction of the improvements on the Lot.
- (b) The Neighbourhood Association may give notice to the owner or occupier of a Lot requiring that owner or occupier to comply with the terms of this By-Law.
- (c) If the owner of the Lot fails in his duty to maintain the improvements on his Lot after reasonable notice from the Neighbourhood Association, the Neighbourhood Association may arrange for the necessary works to be carried out and recover the costs of so doing from the owner.

4.2 Maintenance of Landscaped Areas on Lot and on Association Property

- (a) The owner or occupier of a Lot must:
 - (i) keep the landscaped areas of the Lot clean and tidy and in good repair; and
 - (ii) carry out all maintenance in a proper and workmanlike manner and to the reasonable satisfaction of the Neighbourhood Association:
- (b) The owner or occupier of a Lot must not, except with the approval of the Neighbourhood Association, permit any material or goods to be dumped or stored (whether on a temporary or permanent basis) on the Association Property and must do all things to keep the Association Property clean, tidy and free of litter.
- (c) The Neighbourhood Association may give notice to the owner of a Lot requiring that owner to comply with the terms of this By-Law.
- (d) If the owner of the Lot fails to maintain the landscaped area upon the Lot after reasonable notice from the Neighbourhood Association, the

Neighbourhood Association may arrange for the necessary works to be carried out and recover the costs of so doing from the owner of the Lot.

BY-LAW 5 **APPEARANCE**

The owner or occupier of a Lot must not, except with the approval of the Neighbourhood Association, construct, install or maintain on or in a Lot anything which can be seen from outside the Lot and which, in the reasonable opinion of the Neighbourhood Association is not in keeping with the improvements on or the landscaped areas of the Lot or the theme of the Neighbourhood Scheme.

EXISTING DEVELOPMENT APPROVALS BY-LAW 6

- The Lot owners and the Executive Committee acknowledge that at the time of 6.1 creation of this Neighbourhood Scheme the following existing development approvals have been granted by Council:-
 - Consent to development application DA 1001/04 dated 14 May 2004 in (a) respect of, inter alia, the construction of cottages on Lots 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12;
 - Consent to development application (DA 72/2009 dated 17 September (b) 2008 as resubmitted on 22 January 2009 GTCC DA 72/2009/DA) in respect of extensions and renovations to the existing cottage on Lot 2 ("the gatekeepers") being the proposed Retreat Manager's Residence and Retreat Reception Area.;

("the existing Development Approvals").

- The Executive Committee acknowledges that the existing Development 6.2 Approvals for the construction of cottages comply with any Architectural and Landscape Code in relation to the Neighbourhood Scheme and as such, the owner of a Lot with an existing Development Approval and where no dwelling has been erected on that Lot, has the approval of the Executive Committee in accordance with clause 2 of these By-Laws to construct a dwelling in accordance with the requirements of Council.
- No dwellings shall be constructed on Lots 8, 9, 10, 11, & 12 except in 6.3 accordance with the existing Development Approvals, or in accordance with any modified conditions of those existing Development Approvals as may be approved by Council.
- This By-Law ceases to apply on completion of the construction of the dwellings 6.4 in accordance with the requirements of Council.

The area marked on the Concept Plan as Restricted Neighbourhood Property – is restricted under this By-Law for the purposes of construction of Proposed Neighbourhood Facilities comprising a swimming pool, tennis court and communal hall and the carrying out of activities associated with the construction of such proposed Neighbourhood facilities by the Neighbourhood Association for the benefit of all Lot owners, including without limitation:-

- (a) Any form of demolition work, building work, excavation and any work ancillary to, or associated with the building work of the neighbourhood facilities on the Association Property, including, without limitation, any installation of services; and
- (b) Any form of landscaping work or work ancillary to or associated with, the landscaping around the Neighbourhood facilities on the Association Property.
- 7.2 The Neighbourhood Association will have exclusive use of the Restricted Neighbourhood Property for the term of this By-Law.
- 7.3 Restricted Use of the Swimming Pool Area, the Tennis Court Area and the Communal Hall Area will cease when the Executive Committee of the Neighbourhood Association serves a notice informing all Lot owners that construction of all or part of the Neighbourhood Facilities has been completed.
- 7.4 On completion of construction of the Neighbourhood facilities the Neighbourhood Association must amend these By-Laws to provide for rules relating to the use of these Neighbourhood facilities.

PART 3 MANDATORY MATTERS

These are matters which must be addressed in every Neighbourhood Management Statement.

BY-LAW 8 OPEN ACCESSWAYS OR PRIVATE ACCESSWAYS

There are no open accessways or private accessways within the Neighbourhood Scheme.

BY-LAW 9 PERMITTED USES OF AND SPECIAL FACILITIES ON ASSOCIATION PROPERTY

9.1 Association Property

The Association Property is known as Lot 1 on the Neighbourhood plan and for the sake of clarity, it excludes Lots 2 -12 and comprises the following areas as shown on the Neighbourhood Plan;

- (a) The Restricted Neighbourhood Property Proposed Neighbourhood Facilities Area;
- (b) the Open Space area;
- (c) the Tracks in use;
- (d) the Garbage Compound Area; and
- (e) the Lagoon (Exclusion) Area.

There are no special facilities provided on the Association Property.

9.2 The Open Space Area

- (a) The Open Space Area is that part of the Association Property which does not include the restricted neighbourhood property, the tracks in use, the garbage compound area and the lagoon (exclusion) area.
- (b) Subject to these By-Laws, the Open Space Area is available for use by owners and occupiers of Lots and any person on Association property with the consent whether expressed or implied of an owner or occupier of a Lot.
- (c) The Neighbourhood Association is responsible for the control, management, maintenance and repair of the Open Space Area.

9.3 The Tracks in Use

- (a) Subject to these By-Laws, the Tracks in Use are available for use by owners and occupiers of Lots and persons authorised by owners or occupiers of Lots or the Neighbourhood Association.
- (b) The Neighbourhood Association is responsible for the control, management, maintenance and repair of the Tracks In Use.

9.4 Deleted

9.5 The Garbage Compound

- (a) Subject to the terms of the s.88B Instrument, By-Law 12 and any additional regulations made by the Neighbourhood Association, the Garbage Compound is available for use by owners and occupiers of Lots, for the purpose of temporary storage of garbage and recycling material pending collection by Council or its contractors.
- (b) Council will have access to the Garbage Compound under the terms of the s.88B Instrument registered with the Neighbourhood Plan, for the purposes of domestic garbage collection.
- (c) The Neighbourhood Association is responsible for the control, management, maintenance and repair of the Garbage Compound Area.

9.6 Maintenance Of Association Property

- (a) The Neighbourhood Association is responsible for the control, management, operation, maintenance and repair of the Association Property.
- (b) The Neighbourhood Association must impose contributions on the owners of all Lots for the cost of the control, management, operation, maintenance and repair of the Association Property.
- (c) The Neighbourhood Association will ensure that vegetation on the Association property is pruned or slashed regularly, on an as needs basis, in order to ensure proper management for bushfire risk reduction.

9.7 Bushfire and Emergency Management

- (a) Bush fire control facilities and emergency management equipment will be provided on the Association property in accordance with the "Bushfire Management Plan" and "Emergency Evacuation Plan".
- (b) The Neighbourhood Association is responsible for the control, management, maintenance and repair of the bushfire control facilities and the emergency management equipment.

(c) The Neighbourhood Association is responsible for implementing Bushfire Management and Emergency Management procedures as described in the "Bushfire Management Plan" and "Emergency Evacuation Plan".

9.8 Managing, Operating And Maintaining Association Property

The Neighbourhood Association may contract with persons to provide management, operation, maintenance and other services in connection with the Association Property.

9.9 Children on Association Property

- (a) Children on the Association property, unaccompanied by a responsible adult exercising control, remain the legal responsibility of their parent or quardian.
- (b) An owner or occupier of a Lot shall not permit children to be or to remain upon areas of possible danger or hazard to children, in particular in areas of slip or subsidence, streams, dams, creeks and waterways, or to be in the vicinity of livestock, bulls, horses, machinery and so forth unless children are accompanied by a responsible adult exercising control and supervision.

BY-LAW 10 FENCING

10.1 Internal fencing

- (a) Subject to these By-Laws and the *Dividing Fences Act* 1991, the owner of a Lot may construct a fence on the boundary of their neighbourhood Lot and any other neighbourhood Lot or Association property.
- (b) All internal fencing must be constructed of materials compatible with and in harmony with local rural fencing standards.
- (c) Barbed wire must not be used as a fencing material.
- (d) Unless provided otherwise in these By-Laws, all internal fencing within the Association Property must be maintained, repaired and controlled by the Neighbourhood Association including without limitation the fencing of any pool area or tennis court area as may be constructed.
- (e) The Neighbourhood Association may prescribe standards for the height, materials and style of internal fencing permitted.

Subject to these By-Laws and the Dividing Fences Act 1991, the (a) Neighbourhood Association may construct a fence on the boundary of the external perimeter of the Neighbourhood Parcel and adjoining land.

- Unless provided otherwise in these By-Laws, the external perimeter (d) fencing on the Neighbourhood Parcel must be maintained, repaired and controlled by the Neighbourhood Association.

BY-LAW 11 GARBAGE

- 11.1 The owner or occupier of a Lot:-
 - Must dispose of domestic garbage according to the requirements of the (a) Neighbourhood Association and Council;
 - Must not deposit garbage on the Association Property nor on any Lot on (b) within the Neighbourhood Scheme;
 - Must maintain any garbage bin on the Lot in a secure clean and dry (c) condition.
 - Must dispose of any hazardous waste (including but not limited to (d) batteries, construction waste, and bulky items like white goods, oil, paints waste or other toxic substances) outside the Neighbourhood scheme in accordance with the requirements and directions of Council.
 - Must ensure that before garbage is placed in the bin it is securely (e) wrapped or in the case of tins or other containers, drained of its contents so as no leakage of the contents occurs.
 - Must not place any thing in the garbage bin of any other owner or (f) occupier of any other Lot except with the permission of that owner or occupier.
 - Must ensure that garbage is disposed of in accordance with (g) arrangements entered into by the Neighbourhood Association.
- The Neighbourhood Association has provided a garbage compound on 11.2 Association Property for solid waste transfer and collection. All solid waste must be transferred to the garbage compound by the Association or its agent for collection by Council or its contractor and upon this collection the Association or its agent must promptly return each garbage bin to its particular Lot.

11.3 The Neighbourhood Association promotes the minimisation of waste by recycling, reusing, composting and reducing reliance on unrecyclable materials.

BY-LAW 12 SERVICES

12.1 Services - Public Authorities

- (a) Electricity and telephone services are to be supplied to the Neighbourhood Scheme by the service providers through service lines.
- (b) Maintenance of the electricity and telephone services on each Lot is the responsibility of the owner of each Lot.
- (c) Maintenance of the electricity and telephone services located on Association Property is the responsibility of the Neighbourhood Association.

12.2 Services - Water

- (a) The Neighbourhood Association will provide non-potable water services to the Neighbourhood Lots from the Lagoon and water storage tanks located on Association Property.
- (b) The cost of pumping water and of maintaining the pipes and water storage tanks on Association property to ensure the continued flow of non-potable water from the Lagoon to the Lots is the responsibility of the Neighbourhood Association.
- (c) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not except with the approval of the Neighbourhood Association, carry out any works which interferes with the provision of non-potable water services to the Lots or obstruct access to or damage water service pipes or water storage tanks situated within Association Property.
- (d) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must promptly notify the Neighbourhood Association of any damage or defect in the non-potable water service.

12.3 Other – Potable Water and Effluent Disposal

It is the responsibility of the owner of each Lot to provide and maintain:-

- (a) a rainwater management system for the provision of potable water to the Lot; and
- (b) an approved on-site effluent disposal system for the Lot.

BY-LAW 13 INSURANCES

- (a) The Neighbourhood Association must on an annual basis review:
 - (i) all insurances effected by it; and
 - (ii) the need for new or additional insurances covering Association Property.
- (b) The following insurance policies must be kept at all times:
 - (i) public liability for at least \$10 million (\$10,000,000.00);
 - (ii) building and contents policies for all buildings, structures and other improvements on Association property;
 - (iii) workers compensation policies; and
 - (iv) insurance for all risk associated with horses and horse riding within the Neighbourhood scheme.
- (c) Notice of an Annual General Meeting must:
 - (i) include a form of motion to decide whether insurances effected by the Neighbourhood Association should be confirmed, varied or extended; and
 - (ii) for every alternate Annual General Meeting be accompanied by a written valuation of all buildings, structures and other improvements on Association Property made by a qualified valuer.
- (d) The Neighbourhood Association must immediately effect new insurances, vary or extend existing insurances if there is an increased risk or a new risk to the Association Property.
- (e) The owner or occupier of a Lot must not, except with prior written consent of the Neighbourhood Association, do anything that might invalidate, vitiate, suspend or increase the premium for any insurance policy taken out or under consideration by the Neighbourhood Association.

BY-LAW 14 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

14.1 Establishing the Committee

The Executive Committee of the Neighbourhood Association must be established in accordance with Division 2 of Part 2 of the Management Act.

14.3 Meetings

The Executive Committee may meet to conduct business, adjourn and otherwise regulate its meetings as it thinks fit.

14.4 Notice of Meetings

- (a) The Secretary or the member of the Executive Committee who convenes a meeting must, not less than twenty one (21) days before the Executive Committee holds a meeting, provide each owner with:-
 - (i) the notice of intention to hold the meeting; and
 - (ii) the proposed agenda for the meeting

by mail, facsimile or email.

- (b) In the event of an emergency, the time to give notice can be reduced to seven (7) days if all reasonable efforts have been taken to contact each member and each member agrees to hold an urgent meeting.
- (c) Failure to take all reasonable steps to notify a member of a proposed meeting may at the insistence of a majority of members, render the meeting and any decisions null and void.

14.5 Agenda

(b) No other business will be dealt with at a meeting unless details of that business are set out in that agenda for that meeting.

14.6 Place of Meeting

Meetings must be held within the Neighbourhood Scheme, or at the office of the managing agent (if any) or at a place determined by the managing agent (if any) as a suitable venue for all Owners.

Meeting at Request of Members

The Secretary or in the Secretary's absence any member of the Executive Committee must, at the request at not less than one-third of the members of the executive committee convene a meeting within the period of time specified in the request, or if no time is specified, within 21 days of the making of the request.

14.7 Out of Meeting Determinations

Where:

- (a) these By-Laws have been complied with in relation to a meeting;
- (b) each member of the Executive Committee has been served with a copy of a motion for a proposed resolution to be submitted at the meeting;
- the resolution has been approved in writing by a majority of members of the Executive Committee, then the resolution will, subject to Section 38(3) of The *Management Act*, be as valid as if it had been passed a duly convened meeting of the Executive Committee even though the meeting was not held; and
- (d) An owner of a lot or, where the owner is a corporation, the company nominee of the corporation, may attend a meeting but that person may not address the meeting unless authorised by a resolution of the Executive Committee.

14.8 Record keeping and display of Minutes

- (a) Minutes of meetings must be properly kept and held with the Minutes of the General Meetings of the Neighourhood Association and must be made available to Owners of Lots on request.
- (b) The Executive Committee must, within 7 days after holding a meeting, provide each owner with a copy of the Minutes of that Meeting.

14.9 Functions of the Secretary

The functions of the Secretary include:

- (i) preparing and distributing minutes of meetings of the Neighbourhood Association and the Executive Committee;
- (ii) giving, on behalf of the Neighbourhood Association and the Executive Committee, notices required to be given under the *Management Act*;
- (iii) maintaining the Neighbourhood Association roll;
- (iv) supplying certificates in accordance with Clause 2 of Schedule 4 after the Management Act;
- (v) answering communications addressed to the Neighbourhood Association or the Executive Committee:
- (vi) convening meetings of the Executive Committee and the Neighbourhood Association (other then the first annual general meeting);
- (vii) performing administrative or secretarial functions on behalf of the Executive Committee; and

(viii) keeping records under Part 3 of Schedule 1 of the Management Act.

14.10 Functions of the Treasurer

The functions of the Treasurer include:

- (i) the functions set out in Section 36(1) and (2) of the Management Act,
- (ii) notifying owners of Lots of any contributions levied under the Management Act:
- (iii) receiving, acknowledging, banking and accounting for any money paid to the Neighbourhood Association;
- (iv) preparing any certificate applied for under paragraphs (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of Clause 2 of Schedule 4 of the *Management Act*;
- (v) keeping prescribed accounting records under Clause 10 of Schedule 1 of the Management Act;
- (vi) preparing financial statements under Clause 11 of Schedule 1 of the Management Act;
- (vii) notifying owners of Lots of any contribution levied under this Management Statement and collecting such contributions.

14.11 Subcommittees

The Executive Committee may from time to time appoint sub-committees comprising one or more of its members to:

- (a) conduct investigations;
- (b) perform duties and functions on behalf of the Executive Committee; and
- (c) report the findings of the sub-committee to the Executive Committee.

14.12 No Remuneration

Members of the Executive Committee are not entitled to any remuneration for the performance of their functions but are entitled to reimbursement for reasonable out of pocket expenses incurred by them in the performance of their functions.

14.13 Protection of Executive Committee Members from Liability

No member of the executive committee will be liable for any loss or damage occurring by reason of an act done in his or her capacity as a member of the Executive Committee except fraud or negligence on the part of that member.

PART 4 OPTIONAL MATTERS

BY-LAW 15 BEHAVIOUR BY OWNERS, OCCUPIERS AND OTHERS TO PROMOTE SOCIAL HARMONY IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD SCHEME

- (a) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not:-
 - (i) create any noise or behave in a manner likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of the owner or occupier of another Lot or of any person lawfully using Association Property;
 - (ii) obstruct lawful use by any person of the Association Property;
 - (iii) use the Lot for any purpose that may adversely affect the good reputation of the Neighbourhood Scheme;
 - (iv) remove any article form the Neighbourhood Property placed there by direction or authority of the Neighbourhood Association;
 - (v) do any thing that may prejudice the security or safety of the Neighbourhood scheme;
 - (vi) deposit or throw upon the Association Property, other than within the area designated by the Neighbourhood Association, any rubbish or litter or other material likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of any person or to cause harm to the environment;
 - (vii) light or permit to be lit any fire outdoors so as to contravene the requirements of the Bush Fire Council of New South Wales and the prescriptions of the Local Government Act during periods of fire restrictions;
 - (viii) permit any camping on Association Property;
 - (ix) damage Association Property including without limitation any paved area, walkway, accessway, landscape feature, lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or flower or any improvements which form part of or are situated on Association property;
 - (x) use for that owner or occupier's own purposes any part of Association Property; or
 - (xi) use any thing on the Association Property for any purpose other than that for which it was intended.
 - (b) An Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not, without the prior written consent of the Neighbourhood Association:-

- (i) bring onto the Neighbourhood parcel or permit to remain upon the Neighbourhood parcel any heavy vehicle, which might cause damage to the Neighbourhood Property or any building on the Neighbourhood Property;
- (ii) interfere with the operation of any equipment installed in the Neighbourhood Property;
- (iii) do any thing to interfere with damage or deface Neighbourhood Property;
- (iv) use, keep or store on the Lot or any part of the Neighbourhood Property any flammable, chemical, gas or other materials other than chemicals, liquids, gases or other materials used or intended to be used for domestic purposes or in the fuel tank of a motor vehicle or internal combustion engine;
- (v) remove firewood from the Neighbourhood Parcel except with the consent of the Lot owner affected;
- (vi) quarry or carry away any materials of any nature from, nor disturb or remove rock from the Neighbourhood Property; or
- (vii) use any agricultural Biocide for any purpose on any Lot on the Neighbourhood Property. The Neighbourhood Association may from time to time prescribe schedules of permitted domestic Biocides.
- (c) All Owners renting Lots must provide any occupier, lessee or licensee with a copy or summary of this Management Statement and take all reasonable steps to ensure that the lessee, licensee or occupier of the Lot complies with these By-Laws. If a By-Law prohibits an Owner or occupier of a Lot from doing a thing, the Owner or occupier must not allow or cause another person to do the thing.
- (d) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must take all reasonable steps to ensure that Invitees of the Owner or Occupier comply with the Management Statement. If an Invitee does not comply with the Management Statement the Owner or Occupier must take all reasonable steps to ensure that the Invitee immediately leaves the Neighbourhood property.
- (e) The owner or occupier of a Lot must promptly give notice to the Neighbourhood Association of any damage or defect to Association property of which the owner becomes aware.
- (f) No By-Law shall be interpreted so as to prohibit the use of Association Property for passive and peaceful recreational pursuits such as walking, bird watching and the like, provided that, in the view of the Association, such activities do not cause any significant environmental damage to the Association Property.

BY-LAW 16 COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must at the Owner's own expense promptly comply with all laws relating to the Lot including without limitation any requirements, notices and orders of any public authority.

BY-LAW 17 KEEPING OF ANIMALS

- (a) An Owner or Occupier of a Lot:-
 - (i) may keep up to two (2) dogs upon the Lot provided such dogs are chained or suitably secured and kenneled on the Lot between dusk and dawn; and
 - (ii) may keep up to two (2) neutered or spayed domestic cats upon the Lot provided such cats are confined to the dwellings or buildings on the Lot from at least one hour before dusk until at least one hour after dawn.
- (b) An Owner of a Lot may, with the approval of the Retreat Manager, and only while the Owner is in occupation of a Lot, keep up to three (3) horses upon the Lot provided such horses are contained within the boundaries of the Lot and are suitably stabled on the Lot, and are maintained under an adequate regime of animal husbandry
- (c) An Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not keep a dog on the Lot or on the Association Property;
 - (e) unless it is registered in accordance with the Companion Animals Act 1998; or
 - (f) if it has been declared a dangerous dog under the Companion Animals Act 1998.
- (d) An Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not:-
 - (i) permit any animal under his control to enter upon the Association Property or upon any other Lot unless so approved in writing by the Neighbourhood Association or the Owner or Occupier of the other Lot as the case may be;
 - (ii) permit any dog under his control to enter upon the Association Property unless the dog is suitably leashed and restrained or is under the voice command of the registered owner and remains under the care and supervision of the registered owner of the dog or his responsible nominee;
 - (iii) permit a cat of any nature whether neutered, spayed or whole, to enter or remain upon the Association Property;
 - (iv) without the prior written approval of the Neighbourhood Association keep any wild or feral animal, including rabbits, upon the Lot or the Association Property.

- (e) The Neighbourhood Association may remove from the Neighbourhood parcel any animal not kept in accordance with the provisions of By-Law 17.
- (f) The Neighbourhood Association may regulate from time to time to address and control any nuisance which may be caused by the keeping of animals, noting that any regulation cannot prohibit or restrict the keeping on the Lot of a dog used as a guide dog by a completely or partial blind person.

(g) Horse Riding

The following conditions apply to horse riding on the Association property:

- (i) horses must be in the supervision and control of a responsible rider at all times and must be ridden responsibly;
- (ii) horses are not permitted on the Association property other than on the tracks in use and open space area;
- (iii) all riders must hold public liability insurance of at least \$10 million (\$10,000,000.00) in respect of horse riding and provide evidence by way of certificate of currency to the Neighbourhood Association.

BY-LAW 18 ROAD RULES, PARKING AND RESTRICTIONS ON VEHICLES

18.1 Road Rules

- (a) An Owner or occupier of a Lot must not drive any motor vehicle on the tracks in use or any other part of the Neighbourhood property:
 - (i) at a speed in excess of 40 kph;
 - (ii) any vehicle which is not registered for use on public roads in accordance with the laws of New South Wales;
 - (iii) if the driver is not licensed to drive the vehicle on a public road in accordance with the laws of New South Wales; or
 - (iv) which is excessively noisy or produces an excessive level of emissions.
- (b) All motor vehicles must give way to any wildlife or animals.
- (c) To the extent that this By-Law does not govern road rules in the Neighbourhood Scheme, the provisions of the *Road Transport Acts* (NSW) apply.

18.2 Parking

The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not, except with the consent of the Neighbourhood Association:-

- (a) park a vehicle within the Association Property except in a garage or driveway on the Owner's own Lot or on an area on the Association Property designated by the Neighbourhood Association from time to time as being an area where a vehicle may be parked; and
- (b) keep a vehicle of over three (3) tonnes capacity on any Lot.

18.3 Restrictions on Vehicles

With the exception of the rights established under the Neighbourhood Scheme, an Owner or Occupier of a Lot:-

- (a) shall not, without the prior consent of the Neighbourhood Association, use or drive, or permit to be used or driven, any vehicle upon the Neighbourhood Property;
- (b) must not permit trail bikes, road bikes, dune buggies, three wheeled all terrain vehicles or any other motorised vehicles unregistered or unable to be registered with the Roads and Traffic Authority under the provisions of the Road Transport Acts (NSW) to enter upon any of the Lots or upon the Association Property;
- (c) nothing in this By-Law is to preclude the use of the access tracks by:-
 - (i) vehicles delivering goods and materials;
 - (ii) any garbage truck collecting garbage, rubbish or recyclable materials;
 - (iii) vehicles belonging to tradesmen employed in the building or construction of improvements within the Lots or within the Association Property; and
 - (iv) vehicles of the Retreat Manager, its employees or contractors whether upon the access tracks or the Neighbourhood Property while carrying out authorized works to the Neighbourhood Property.
 - (v) agricultural vehicles including tractors and the like or agricultural machinery, whether registered for public road use or not, whether upon the access tracks or the Neighbourhood property while carrying out any authorized upkeep, maintenance or repair works upon the Neighbourhood property or to any Neighbourhood Lot.

BY-LAW 19 FIREARMS AND WEAPONS

An Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not bring or permit to be brought onto the Neighbourhood parcel any licensed or unlicensed firearms or weapons of any description unless such firearms and weapons are first registered with the Neighbourhood Association.

BY-LAW 20 LAUNDRY

The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must ensure that all laundry items hung to dry on their Lots are situated as discreetly as possible and are in a location approved by the Retreat Manager.

BY-LAW 21 TRADING ACTIVITIES

- the Neighbourhood Association may, for the purposes of exercising and (a) performing its powers and duties, carry on a business or trading activity.
- the Neighbourhood Association:-(b)
 - must pay into its sinking fund income derived by it from its (i) business or trading activities; and
 - must estimate how much money it would need to credit to its (ii) sinking fund to meet expenses associated with carrying on its business or trading activity; and
 - must make the estimate under this by-law: (iii)
 - no later than 1 month after incorporation of the 1. Neighbourhood Association; and
 - as the occasion requires at a general meeting that has 11. before it a statement of the existing financial situation and an estimate of receipts and payments.
 - must impose a levy on each member for the contribution to (iv) provide the amount estimated by this by-law; and
 - may distribute any net profit derived by it from carrying its (v) business or trading activities in accordance with Clause 17 of Schedule 1 to the Management Act.
- if the Neighbourhood Association suffers a net loss from carrying on its (c) business or trading activities, then it must impose a levy on each member for a contribution to the sinking fund in order to meet the amount of the net loss.

BY-LAW 22 NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION - RIGHT TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS

Subject to the rights conferred on the Retreat Manager under these by-laws, the Neighbourhood Association may, on its own behalf, contract with persons to:

- (a) Provide management, operation or maintenance and other services in connection with Association property and the Association facilities;
- (b) Provide services or amenities to the owners or occupiers of lots, including without limitation management of the tourism accommodation;
- (c) Provide other services or amenities to Association property or to the owners or occupiers of the lots.

BY-LAW 23 NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION - RIGHT TO REMEDY

If something should have been done which has not been done by an owner or occupier of a lot as required by these by-laws, the Neighbourhood Association may do or carry out that task at the expense of the owner or occupier of the lot who has defaulted in not carrying out the obligations required by it.

BY-LAW 24 NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION - DEBTS OWED

If monies are owing to the Neighbourhood Association and have not been paid, the Neighbourhood Association may recover such monies owing under these by-laws as a debt.

BY-LAW 25 NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION NOT LIABLE

Excepting negligence or fraud of the Neighbourhood Association or any employee of the Neighbourhood Association, the Neighbourhood Association will not be liable for damage to or loss of property or injury to any person on any lot or on the Association property.

BY-LAW 26 INTEREST ON OVERDUE MONEY

- (a) An owner or occupier of a lot must pay the Neighbourhood Association interest on any amount, other than a contribution levied by the Neighbourhood Association under the Management Act, that has become due for payment and remains unpaid from and including the date it becomes due for payment.
- (b) During the period that an amount under this by-law remains unpaid, after demand or notification by the Neighbourhood Association, interest will be calculated on daily balances at the rate equal to 2% per annum above the rate quoted from time to time by the Neighbourhood Association's bankers (as nominated by the Neighbourhood Association) on overdraft accommodation in excess of \$100,000.

BY-LAW 27 RULES

- (a) The Association Property may make Rules relating to the control, management, operation, use and enjoyment of the Neighbourhood Scheme including without limitation:-

 - (ii) The storage, disposal and collection of garbage.
- (b) The Association Property may at any time add, review or vary the rules. An addition or variation to a rule may not be inconsistent with the Management Act, the Development Act, these by-laws or the Development Consent.
- (c) Rules bind an owner, occupier, mortgagee in possession and lessee or licencee of a lot.

BY-LAW 28 REQUIREMENTS OF COMPLIANCE AUTHORITIES

- (a) All requirements and orders of authorities and all laws in connection with any lot and use or occupation of any lot must be complied with by the owner or occupier of such lot.
- (b) An owner of a Lot will indemnify the Neighbourhood Association for any losses or damages incurred by the Neighbourhood Association arising from any breach by that owner in failing to comply with all requirements and orders of authorities and all laws in connection with any lot.

BY-LAW 29 NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION COMMUNICATIONS

All communications, approvals, notices or authorisations by the Neighbourhood Association under these by-laws must be in writing and any complaints, notices or applications or requests for consideration of matters by the Neighbourhood Association must be in writing and forwarded to the manager of the Neighbourhood Association or the secretary of the Neighbourhood Association, or the managing agent where a managing agent has been appointed.

BY-LAW 30 NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION APPROVALS

Neighbourhood Association Approvals required under these by-laws may be given conditionally, unconditionally or withheld in the absolute discretion of the Neighbourhood Association unless expressly provided otherwise in these by-laws.

BY-LAW 31 PRIMA FACIE CERTIFICATES

A certificate signed by the Neighbourhood Association, the secretary or the managing agent about a matter or sum payable to the Neighbourhood Association in connection with the by-laws is prima facie evidence of the amount or any other factual matter stated in it.

A current copy of these by-laws must be exhibited and prominently placed on Association property.

BY-LAW 33 REIMBURSEMENT OF COSTS, CHARGES AND EXPENSES

- (a) An owner or occupier of a lot must pay or reimburse the Neighbourhood Association on demand or any costs, charges and expenses of the Neighbourhood Association in connection with the contemplated or actual enforcement or preservation of any rights under the by-laws against any owner or occupier of a lot.
- (b) The costs, charges and expenses under this by-law include without limitation, expenses incurred in retaining any independent consultant or other person to evaluate any matter of concern and the Neighbourhood Association's administrative costs in connection with those events.

BY-LAW 34 RETREAT MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT

- (a) The Neighbourhood Association and all Lot owners intend to enter into a Retreat Management Agreement with Clarendon Management Pty Limited ACN 018 058 564 ("the Retreat Manager") for the provision of the services and facilities to the Neighbourhood Association and to owners and occupiers of the Lots.
- (b) The Neighbourhood Association and all Lot owners intend to ratify and execute the Retreat Management Agreement at its first Annual General Meeting.

BY-LAW 35 RETREAT MANAGER'S RESIDENCE AND OFFICE ADMINISTRATION

- (a) The Retreat Manager may operate and use Lot 2 as a Reception Office, Retreat Manager's Office, Administration Centre and residence, as permitted by Council.
- (b) The trading hours of the Reception Office, Retreat Manager's Office and Administration Centre will be those hours that the Retreat Manager deems appropriate for the purposes of running the Clarendon Forrest Retreat.
- (c) The Retreat Manager must comply with all requirements and orders of all Authorities and all Laws, Statutes and By-Laws in connection with the use of Lot 2 as a Reception Office, Retreat Manager's office, Administration Centre and residence.

PART 5 BY-LAWS REQUIRED BY PUBLIC AUTHORITY

This part may specify By-Laws made at the request of a public authority. These by-laws may provide that amendments may not be made without the consent of the public authority. For further details see Sch.3, cl.4.

BY-LAW 36 RETREAT MANAGER'S RESIDENCE AND RESTRICTION ON PERMANENT OCCUPANCY

- (a) The Retreat Manager may reside on Lot 2 of the Neighbourhood Scheme in order to carry out the management services.
- (b) With the exception of the Manager's Residence on Lot 2 of the Neighbourhood Scheme, all Lots within the Neighbourhood Scheme must not be occupied by any Owner or Occupier of that particular Lot for longer than thirty (30) weeks in any twelve month period.
- (c) This By-Law is made at the request of Greater Taree City Council and may not be amended, varied or revoked without the prior written consent of Council.

BY-LAW 37 ACCESS

- (d) The Neighbourhood Association, the Retreat Manager and all owners, occupiers, lessees and mortgagees in possession of Lots must implement, operate, manage and maintain the policies, practices and procedures contained in the Bushfire Management Plan, as may be amended from time to time.
- (e) The Neighbourhood Association will hold a current copy of the Bushfire Management Plan and must, when requested by the owner or occupier of a Lot provide a copy at a reasonable cost to that owner or occupier.
- (f) The Protection Measures Plan included as Sheet 47 of this Management Statement forms part of the Bushfire Management Plan.
- (e) This By-Law 39 may not be amended, varied, revoked or appealed without the prior written consent of the NSW Rural Fire Service.

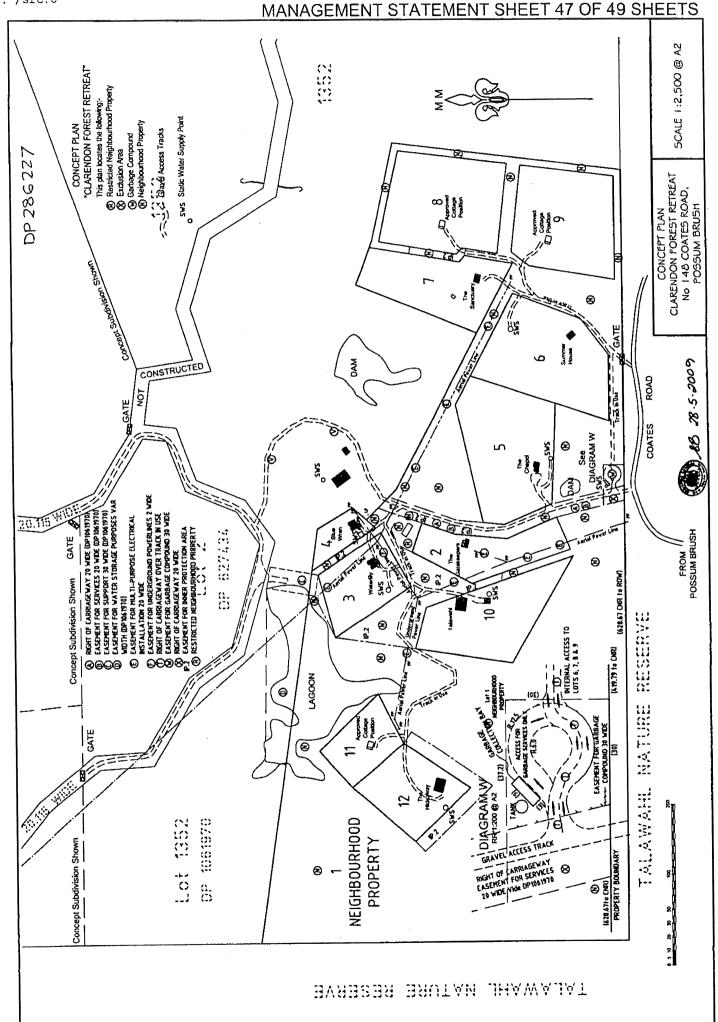

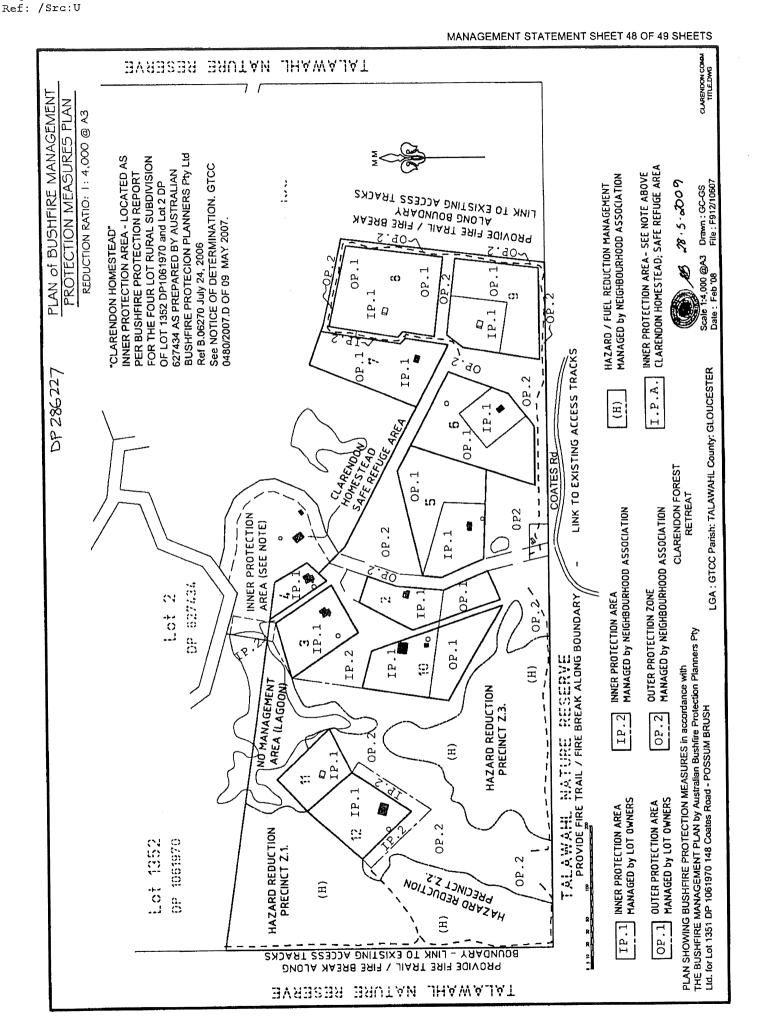

The swimming pool and surrounds shall only be used between the hours of 6.00 am and 9.00 pm, unless prior approval from the Neighbourhood Association has been obtained.

The filtration motor shall be operated between the following hours only:

Monday to Friday (other than a public holiday)

Saturday to Sunday and Public Holidays

7.00am - 8.00pm

8.00am - 8.00pm

By- Law 41.2

A proprietor or occupier using the swimming pool shall exercise caution at all times and shall not run or splash or behave in any manner that is likely to interfere with the use of the pool by other proprietors or occupiers.

By-Law 41.3

In relation to the use of the swimming pool, a proprietor or occupier of a lot shall ensure:

- (a) that his/her invitees and guests do not use the pool unless he or another proprietor or occupier accompanies them;
- (b) that children under 12 years of age are not in or around the pool unless accompanied by an adult proprietor or occupier exercising effective control over them;
- (c) that alcoholic beverages are not taken to or consumed adjacent to the pool and that glass containers or receptacles of any type are not taken to or allowed to remain in or around the pool.

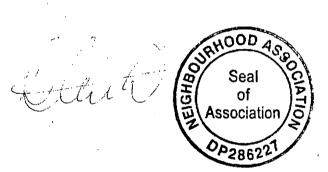

Such a booking shall be maintained by the caretaker or his nominee on a sheet which is to be displayed on a board in the vicinity of the tennis court area. Should the court be unbooked residents shall be at liberty to play on the court. However, if an unbooked group are playing on the court and another unbooked group arrive then that group playing on the court may continue with the use of the court up to the next whole hour, wherein a hand over to the second group may occur. Booked court times take precedence over unbooked times.

The last proprietor or occupier using the court at night must ensure that the lights are switched off if considered necessary the Executive Committee shall have the power to make any required adjustment to the conditions of usage.





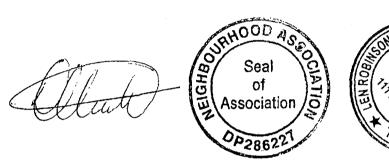

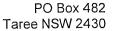

- (e) that the land to which the certificate relates is the subject of a site audit statement within the meaning of that Act,

The land to which the certificate relates IS NOT the subject of a site audit statement within the meaning of that Act.
