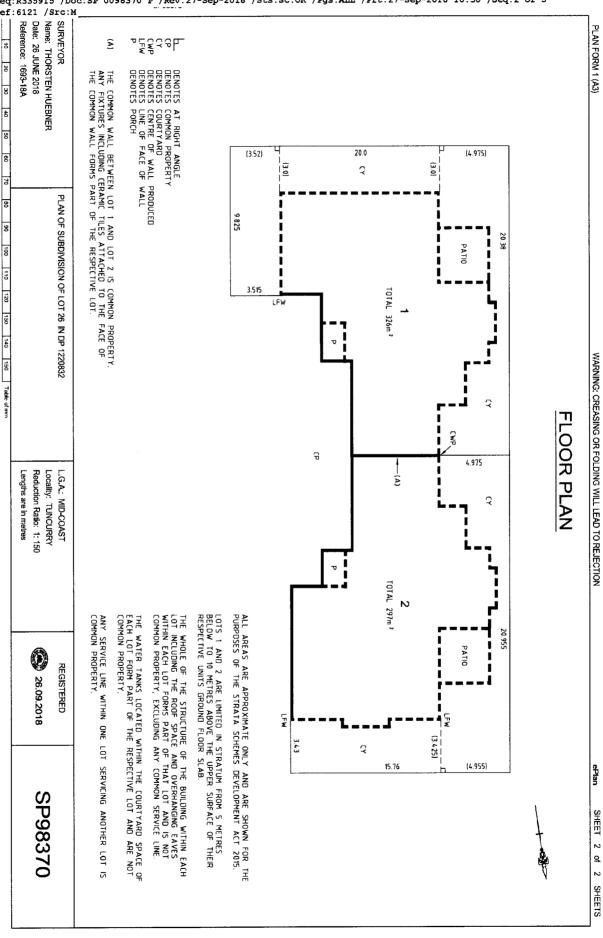

Schedule 3 Model by-laws for residential strata schemes

(Clause 37)

Note. These by-laws do not apply to a strata scheme unless they are adopted by the owners corporation for the strata scheme or lodged with the strata plan.

1 Vehicles

An owner or occupier of a lot must not park or stand any motor or other vehicle on common property, or permit a motor vehicle to be parked or stood on common property, except with the prior written approval of the owners corporation or as permitted by a sign authorised by the owners corporation.

2 Changes to common property

- (1) An owner or person authorised by an owner may install, without the consent of the owners corporation:
 - (a) any locking or other safety device for protection of the owner's lot against intruders or to improve safety within the owner's lot, or
 - (b) any screen or other device to prevent entry of animals or insects on the lot, or
 - (c) any structure or device to prevent harm to children.
- (2) Any such locking or safety device, screen, other device or structure must be installed in a competent and proper manner and must have an appearance, after it has been installed, in keeping with the appearance of the rest of the building.
- (3) Clause (1) does not apply to the installation of any thing that is likely to affect the operation of fire safety devices in the lot or to reduce the level of safety in the lots or common property.
- (4) The owner of a lot must:
 - (a) maintain and keep in a state of good and serviceable repair any installation or structure referred to in clause (1) that forms part of the common property and that services the lot, and
 - (b) repair any damage caused to any part of the common property by the installation or removal of any locking or safety device, screen, other device or structure referred to in clause (1) that forms part of the common property and that services the lot.

3 Damage to lawns and plants on common property

An owner or occupier of a lot must not, except with the prior written approval of the owners corporation:

- (a) damage any lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or flower being part of or situated on common property, or
- (b) use for his or her own purposes as a garden any portion of the common property.

4 Obstruction of common property

An owner or occupier of a lot must not obstruct lawful use of common property by any person except on a temporary and non-recurring basis.

5 Keeping of animals

Note. Select option A or B. If no option is selected, option A will apply.

Option A

- (1) An owner or occupier of a lot may keep an animal on the lot, if the owner or occupier gives the owners corporation written notice that it is being kept on the lot.
- (2) The notice must be given not later than 14 days after the animal commences to be kept on the lot.
- (3) If an owner or occupier of a lot keeps an animal on the lot, the owner or occupier must:
 - (a) keep the animal within the lot, and
 - (b) supervise the animal when it is on the common property, and
 - (c) take any action that is necessary to clean all areas of the lot or the common property that are soiled by the animal.

Option B

- (1) An owner or occupier of a lot may keep an animal on the lot or the common property with the written approval of the owners corporation.
- (2) The owners corporation must not unreasonably withhold its approval of the keeping of an animal on a lot or the common property and must give an owner or occupier written reasons for any refusal to grant approval.
- (3) If an owner or occupier of a lot keeps an animal on the lot, the owner or occupier must:
 - (a) keep the animal within the lot, and
 - (b) supervise the animal when it is on the common property, and
 - (c) take any action that is necessary to clean all areas of the lot or the common property that are soiled by the animal.
- (4) An owner or occupier of a lot who keeps an assistance animal on the lot must, if required to do so by the owners corporation, provide evidence to the owners corporation demonstrating that the animal is an assistance animal as referred to in section 9 of the *Disability Discrimination Act* 1992 of the Commonwealth.

6 Noise

An owner or occupier of a lot, or any invitee of an owner or occupier of a lot, must not create any noise on a lot or the common property likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of the owner or occupier of another lot or of any person lawfully using common property.

7 Behaviour of owners, occupiers and invitees

- (1) An owner or occupier of a lot, or any invitee of an owner or occupier of a lot, when on common property must be adequately clothed and must not use language or behave in a manner likely to cause offence or embarrassment to the owner or occupier of another lot or to any person lawfully using common property.
- (2) An owner or occupier of a lot must take all reasonable steps to ensure that invitees of the owner or occupier:
 - (a) do not behave in a manner likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of the owner or occupier of another lot or any person lawfully using common property, and
 - (b) without limiting paragraph (a), that invitees comply with clause (1).

8 Children playing on common property

- (1) Any child for whom an owner or occupier of a lot is responsible may play on any area of the common property that is designated by the owners corporation for that purpose but may only use an area designated for swimming while under adult supervision.
- (2) An owner or occupier of a lot must not permit any child for whom the owner or occupier is responsible, unless accompanied by an adult exercising effective control, to be or remain on common property that is a laundry, car parking area or other area of possible danger or hazard to children.

9 Smoke penetration

Note. Select option A or B. If no option is selected, option A will apply.

Option A

- (1) An owner or occupier, and any invitee of the owner or occupier, must not smoke tobacco or any other substance on the common property.
- (2) An owner or occupier of a lot must ensure that smoke caused by the smoking of tobacco or any other substance by the owner or occupier, or any invitee of the owner or occupier, on the lot does not penetrate to the common property or any other lot.

Option B

- (1) An owner or occupier of a lot, and any invitee of the owner or occupier, must not smoke tobacco or any other substance on the common property, except:
 - (a) in an area designated as a smoking area by the owners corporation, or
 - (b) with the written approval of the owners corporation.

- (2) A person who is permitted under this by-law to smoke tobacco or any other substance on common property must ensure that the smoke does not penetrate to any other lot.
- (3) An owner or occupier of a lot must ensure that smoke caused by the smoking of tobacco or any other substance by the owner or occupier, or any invitee of the owner or occupier, on the lot does not penetrate to the common property or any other lot.

10 Preservation of fire safety

The owner or occupier of a lot must not do any thing or permit any invitees of the owner or occupier to do any thing on the lot or common property that is likely to affect the operation of fire safety devices in the parcel or to reduce the level of fire safety in the lots or common property.

11 Storage of inflammable liquids and other substances and materials

- (1) An owner or occupier of a lot must not, except with the prior written approval of the owners corporation, use or store on the lot or on the common property any inflammable chemical, liquid or gas or other inflammable material.
- (2) This by-law does not apply to chemicals, liquids, gases or other material used or intended to be used for domestic purposes, or any chemical, liquid, gas or other material in a fuel tank of a motor vehicle or internal combustion engine.

12 Appearance of lot

- (1) The owner or occupier of a lot must not, without the prior written approval of the owners corporation, maintain within the lot anything visible from outside the lot that, viewed from outside the lot, is not in keeping with the rest of the building.
- (2) This by-law does not apply to the hanging of any clothing, towel, bedding or other article of a similar type in accordance with by-law 14.

13 Cleaning windows and doors

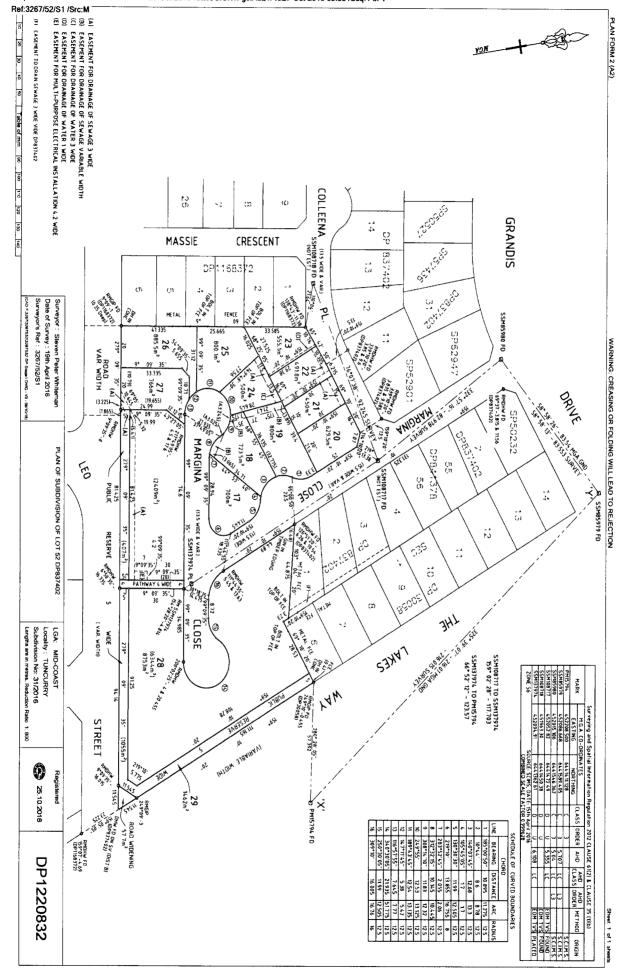

1. MidCoast Water's policy "Building over or adjacent to Watermains, Sewers or Sewerage Rising Mains" basically prohibits any new buildings to be erected closer than 1.5 meters to a Council pipe. This policy also requires special footings to be used when a building is within the 'Zone of Influence' of a sewer.

Residents, builders, developers etc. should note that the existence of a sewer, watermain or sewerage rising main can, and will, prohibit the extent of a development that will be permitted on a block. In the case of sewers, this also applies to a sewer located close to the boundary even if it is within an adjacent block. These restrictions apply to all types of building including houses, garages, sheds, carports etc.

Please contact MidCoast Water if you need any clarification on the implication of this policy. Full details are available upon request.

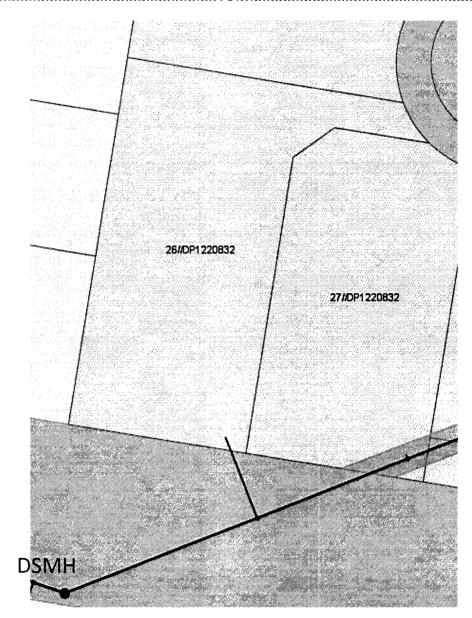

- This clause applies only if this contract says the vendor has agreed to accept a deposit-bond for the deposit 3.1 (or part of it).
- The purchaser must provide the original deposit-bond to the vendor's solicitor (or if no solicitor the 3.2 depositholder) at or before the making of this contract and this time is essential.
- If the deposit-bond has an expiry date and completion does not occur by the date which is 14 days before the 3.3 expiry date, the purchaser must serve a replacement deposit-bond at least 7 days before the expiry date. The time for service is essential.
- The vendor must approve a replacement deposit-bond if -3.4
 - it is from the same issuer and for the same amount as the earlier deposit-bd 3.4.1
 - it has an expiry date at least three months after its date of issue.
- A breach of clauses 3.2 or 3.3 entitles the vendor to terminate. The right to terminate is lost as soon as -3.5
 - the purchaser serves a replacement deposit-bond; or 3.5.1
 - the deposit is paid in full under clause 2. 3.5.2
- Clauses 3.3 and 3.4 can operate more than once. 3.6
- If the purchaser serves a replacement deposit-bond, the vendor must serve the earlier deposit-bond. 3.7
- The amount of any deposit-bond does not form part of the price for the purposes of clause 16.7. 3.8
- The vendor must give the purchaser the deposit-bond -3.9
 - 3.9.1 on completion; or
 - 3.9.2 if this contract is rescinded.
- 3.10 If this contract is terminated by the vendor -
 - 3.10.1
 - normally, the vendor can immediately demand ayment from the issuer of the *deposit-bond*; or if the purchaser *serves* prior to *termination* hotice disputing the vendor's right to *terminate*, the 3.10.2 vendor must forward the deposit-bond (or its proceeds if called up) to the depositholder as stakeholder.
- If this contract is terminated by the purchas 3.11
 - normally, the vendor must give the purchaser the deposit-bond; or 3.11.1
 - if the vendor serves prior to termination a notice disputing the purchaser's right to terminate, the 3.11.2 vendor must forward the deposit-bond (or its proceeds if called up) to the depositholder as stakeholder.

Transfer

- Normally, the purchaser nuclear at least 14 days before the date for completion -4.1
 - 4.1.1
 - the form of transfer; and particulars required to register any mortgage or other dealing to be lodged with the transfer by 4.1.2 the purchaser's mortgagee.
- 4.2
- If any information needed for the form of transfer is not disclosed in this contract, the vendor must *serve* it. If the purchaser serves a form of transfer and the transferee is not the purchaser, the purchaser must give 4.3 the vendo a direction signed by the purchaser personally for this form of transfer.
- The vendprcan require the purchaser to include a form of covenant or easement in the transfer only if this 4.4 contract contains the wording of the proposed covenant or easement, and a description of the land benefited.

- If a form of requisitions is attached to this contract, the purchaser is taken to have made those requisitions. 5.1
- If the purchaser is or becomes entitled to make any other requisition, the purchaser can make it only by 5.2 serving it
 - if it arises out of this contract or it is a general question about the property or title within 21 days 5.2.1 after the contract date;
 - if it arises out of anything served by the vendor within 21 days after the later of the contract 5.2.2 date and that service; and
 - 5.2.3 in any other case - within a reasonable time.

Error or misdescription 6

- The purchaser can (but only before completion) claim compensation for an error or misdescription in this 6.1 contract (as to the property, the title or anything else and whether substantial or not).
- This clause applies even if the purchaser did not take notice of or rely on anything in this contract containing 6.2 or giving rise to the error or misdescription.
- However, this clause does not apply to the extent the purchaser knows the true position. 6.3

7 Claims by purchaser

The purchaser can make a claim (including a claim under clause 6) before completion only by serving it with a statement of the amount claimed, and if the purchaser makes one or more claims before completion -

- 7.1 the vendor can rescind if in the case of claims that are not claims for delay
 - the total amount claimed exceeds 5% of the price: 7.1.1
 - 7.1.2 the vendor serves notice of intention to rescind; and
 - 7.1.3 the purchaser does not serve notice waiving the claims within 14 days after that service; and
- if the vendor does not rescind, the parties must complete and if this contract is completed -7.2
 - 7.2.1 the lesser of the total amount claimed and 10% of the price must be paid out of the price to and held by the depositholder until the claims are finalised or lapse;
 - 7.2.2 the amount held is to be invested in accordance with clause 2.9;
 - 7.2.3 the claims must be finalised by an arbitrator appointed by the parties or, if an appointment is not made within 1 month of completion, by an arbitrator appointed by the President of the Law Society at the request of a party (in the latter case the parties are bound by the terms of the Conveyancing Arbitration Rules approved by the Law Society as at the date of the appointment);
 - the purchaser is not entitled, in respect of the claims, to more than the total amount claimed and 7.2.4 the costs of the purchaser:
 - net interest on the amount held must be paid to the parties in the same proportion as the amount 7.2.5 held is paid; and
 - if the parties do not appoint an arbitrator and neither party request the President to appoint an 7.2.6 arbitrator within 3 months after completion, the claims lapse and the amount belongs to the vendor.

Vendor's rights and obligations

- 8.1 The vendor can rescind if
 - the vendor is, on reasonable grounds, unable or unvilling to comply with a requisition; 8.1.1
 - the vendor serves a notice of intention to resched that specifies the requisition and those 8.1.2 grounds; and

 - recover damages for breach of contract; and 8.2.2 the purchaser can sue the vend
 - 8.2.3 if the purchaser has been in postession a party can claim for a reasonable adjustment.

Purchaser's default 9

If the purchaser does not complewith this contract (or a notice under or relating to it) in an essential respect, the vendor can *terminate* by seving a notice. After the *termination* the vendor can – keep or recover the deposit to a maximum of 10% of the price);

- hold any other money paid by the purchaser under this contract as security for anything recoverable under 9.2 this clause
 - for 12 months after the termination; or 9.2.1

 - 10.1.2 a service for the property being a joint service or passing through another property, or any service for another property passing through the property ('service' includes air, communication, drainage, electricity, garbage, gas, oil, radio, sewerage, telephone, television or water service);
 - a wall being or not being a party wall in any sense of that term or the property being affected by 10.1.3 an easement for support or not having the benefit of an easement for support;
 - any change in the property due to fair wear and tear before completion; 10.1.4

- a promise, representation or statement about this contract, the property or the title, not set out or 10.1.5 referred to in this contract;
- 10.1.6 a condition, exception, reservation or restriction in a Crown grant;
- the existence of any authority or licence to explore or prospect for gas, minerals or petroleum; 10.1.7
- 10.1.8 any easement or restriction on use the substance of either of which is disclosed in this contract or any non-compliance with the easement or restriction on use; or
- 10.1.9 anything the substance of which is disclosed in this contract (except a caveat, charge, mortgage, priority notice or writ).
- 10.2 The purchaser cannot rescind or terminate only because of a defect in title to or quality of the inclusions.
- Normally, the purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate or require the vendor to 10.3 change the nature of the title disclosed in this contract (for example, to remove a caution evidencing qualified title, or to lodge a plan of survey as regards limited title).

11 Compliance with work orders

- 11.1 Normally, the vendor must by completion comply with a work order made on or before the contract date and if this contract is completed the purchaser must comply with any other work order.
- If the purchaser complies with a work order, and this contract is rescinded or terminated, the vendor must 11.2 pay the expense of compliance to the purchaser.

12 Certificates and inspections

The vendor must do everything reasonable to enable the purchaser, subject to the ri nts of any tenant –

- to have the property inspected to obtain any certificate or report reasonably required; 12.1
- to apply (if necessary in the name of the vendor) for -12.2
 - any certificate that can be given in respect of the property under egislation; or 12.2.1
 - a copy of any approval, certificate, consent, direction, notice or order in respect of the property 12.2.2 given under *legislation*, even if given after the contract date; and to make 1 inspection of the *property* in the 3 days before a time abounted for completion.
- 12.3

13 Goods and services tax (GST)

- Terms used in this clause which are not defined elsewhere in this contract and have a defined meaning in the 13.1 GST Act have the same meaning in this clause.
- ampunt to the other party under this contract, GST is not 13.2 Normally, if a party must pay the price or any other to be added to the price or amount.
- If under this contract a *party* must make an accustment or payment for an expense of another party or pay an expense payable by or to a third party (for example, under clauses 14 or 20.7) 13.3
 - the party must adjust or pay in propletion any GST added to or included in the expense; but 13.3.1
 - the amount of the expense must be reduced to the extent the party receiving the adjustment or 13.3.2 payment (or the representative member of a GST group of which that party is a member) is
 - entitled to an input tax credit for the expense; and if the adjustment or payment under this contract is consideration for a taxable supply, an amount for GST must be added at the *GST rate*. 13.3.3
- 13.4
- If this contract says this sale is the supply of a going concern 13.4.1 the parties gree the supply of the property is a supply of a going concern;
 - the verderiust, between the contract date and completion, carry on the enterprise conducted 13.4.2 and in a proper and business-like way;
 - if the purchaser is not registered by the date for completion, the parties must complete and the 13.4.3 maser must pay on completion, in addition to the price, an amount being the price multiplied the GST rate ("the retention sum"). The retention sum is to be held by the depositholder and dealt with as follows –

- the purchaser must pay the vendor on completion in addition to the price an amount calculated 13.7.2 by multiplying the price by the GST rate if this sale is a taxable supply to any extent because of
 - a breach of clause 13.7.1; or
 - something else known to the purchaser but not the vendor.
- If this contract says this sale is a taxable supply in full and does not say the margin scheme applies to the 13.8 property, the vendor must pay the purchaser on completion an amount of one-eleventh of the price if -
 - 13.8.1 this sale is not a taxable supply in full; or
 - the margin scheme applies to the property (or any part of the property). 13.8.2
- If this contract says this sale is a taxable supply to an extent -13.9
 - clause 13.7.1 does not apply to any part of the property which is identified as being a taxable 13.9.1 supply; and
 - the payments mentioned in clauses 13.7 and 13.8 are to be recalculated by multiplying the 13.9.2 relevant payment by the proportion of the price which represents the value of that part of the property to which the clause applies (the proportion to be expressed as a number between 0 and 1). Any evidence of value must be obtained at the expense of the vendor.
- Normally, on completion the vendor must give the recipient of the supply a tax invoice for any taxable supply 13.10 by the vendor by or under this contract.
- The vendor does not have to give the purchaser a tax invoice if the margin scheme applies to a taxable 13.11 supply.
- If the vendor is liable for GST on rents or profits due to issuing an invoice or receiving consideration before completion, any adjustment of those amounts must exclude an amount equal to the vendor's GST liability. 13.12
- If the purchaser must make an RW payment the purchaser must -13.13
 - at least 5 days before the date for completion, serve evidence of submission of an RW payment 13,13,1 notification form to the Australian Taxation Office by the Durchaser or, if a direction under clause 4.3 has been *served*, by the transferee named in the transfer served with that direction; produce on completion a *settlement cheque* for the RW payment payable to the Deputy
 - 13.13.2 Commissioner of Taxation;
 - forward the settlement cheque to the payee immediately after completion; and serve evidence of receipt of payment of the payment. 13.13.3

14 **Adjustments**

 - by adjusting the amount that would have been payable if at the start of the year -14.4.2

 - The land was not subject to a special trust or owned by a non-concessional company; and the land (or part of it) had no separate taxable value, by calculating its separate taxable value on a proportional area basis.
- 14.5 If any other amount that is adjustable under this contract relates partly to the land and partly to other land, the parties must adjust it on a proportional area basis.

- If on completion the last bill for a water, sewerage or drainage usage charge is for a period ending before the 14.7 adjustment date, the vendor is liable for an amount calculated by dividing the bill by the number of days in the period then multiplying by the number of unbilled days up to and including the adjustment date.
- The vendor is liable for any amount recoverable for work started on or before the contract date on the 14.8 property or any adjoining footpath or road.

Date for completion 15

The parties must complete by the date for completion and, if they do not, a party can serve a notice to complete if that party is otherwise entitled to do so.

16 Completion

Vendor

- On completion the vendor must give the purchaser any document of title that relates only to the property. 16.1
- If on completion the vendor has possession or control of a document of title that relates also to other 16.2 property, the vendor must produce it as and where necessary.
- Normally, on completion the vendor must cause the legal title to the property (being an estate in fee simple) 16.3 to pass to the purchaser free of any mortgage or other interest, subject to any necessary registration.
- 16.4 The legal title to the *property* does not pass before completion.
- If the vendor gives the purchaser a document (other than the transfer) that needs to be lodged for 16.5 registration, the vendor must pay the lodgement fee to the purchaser, plus another 20% of that fee.
- If a party serves a land tax certificate showing a charge on any of the land, on completion the vendor must 16.6 give the purchaser a land tax certificate showing the charge is no longer effective against the land.

Purchaser

- On completion the purchaser must pay to the vendor, by cash (up to \$2,000) or settlement cheque -16.7

 - remittance amount payable;

any other amount payable by the purchaser under this contract. 16.7.2

- amount payable by the vendor to the purchaser under this contract; and other amount payable by the purchaser under this contract equires more than 5 cofficers. If the vendor requires more than 5 settlement cheques, the vendor must pay 0 for each extra cheque. 16.8
- If any of the deposit is not covered by a bond or guarantee, on competion the purchaser must give the 16.9 vendor an order signed by the purchaser authorising the depositive der to account to the vendor for the deposit.
- On completion the deposit belongs to the vendor. 16.10

Place for completion

- Normally, the parties must complete at the completion address, which is -16.11
 - if a special completion address is stated in this contract that address; or 16 11 1
 - if none is stated, but a first mortgagee is disclosed in this contract and the mortgagee would 16.11.2 usually discharge the mortgage at a particular place - that place; or
- in any other case the vendor's societor's address stated in this contract.

 The vendor by reasonable notice can require completion at another place, if it is in NSW, but the vendor must 16.12 pay the purchaser's additional expenses in luding any agency or mortgagee fee.
- If the purchaser requests completion at a place that is not the completion address, and the vendor agrees, the purchaser must pay the vendor agricultional expenses, including any agency or mortgagee fee. 16.13

- The vendor does not have to give vacant possession if –

18 Possession before completion

- This clause applies only if the vendor gives the purchaser possession of the *property* before completion. 18.1
- 18.2 The purchaser must not before completion
 - let or part with possession of any of the property; 18.2.1
 - make any change or structural alteration or addition to the property; or 18.2.2
 - contravene any agreement between the parties or any direction, document, legislation, notice or 18.2.3 order affecting the property.
- The purchaser must until completion -18.3
 - keep the property in good condition and repair having regard to its condition at the giving of 18.3.1 possession; and
 - allow the vendor or the vendor's authorised representative to enter and inspect it at all 18.3.2 reasonable times.
- 18.4 The risk as to damage to the property passes to the purchaser immediately after the purchaser enters into possession.
- If the purchaser does not comply with this clause, then without affecting any other right of the vendor -18.5
 - 18.5.1 the vendor can before completion, without notice, remedy the non-compliance; and

- if the vendor pays the expense of doing this, the purchaser must pay it to the vendor with interest 18.5.2 at the rate prescribed under s101 Civil Procedure Act 2005.
- 18.6 If this contract is rescinded or terminated the purchaser must immediately vacate the property.
- If the parties or their solicitors on their behalf do not agree in writing to a fee or rent, none is payable. 18.7

19 Rescission of contract

- If this contract expressly gives a party a right to rescind, the party can exercise the right -19.1
 - only by serving a notice before completion; and 19.1.1
 - 19.1.2 in spite of any making of a claim or requisition, any attempt to satisfy a claim or requisition, any arbitration, litigation, mediation or negotiation or any giving or taking of possession.
- Normally, if a party exercises a right to rescind expressly given by this contract or any legislation -19.2
 - 19.2.1 the deposit and any other money paid by the purchaser under this contract must be refunded;
 - 19.2.2 a party can claim for a reasonable adjustment if the purchaser has been in possession;
 - 19.2.3 a party can claim for damages, costs or expenses arising out of a breach of this contract; and
 - 19.2.4 a party will not otherwise be liable to pay the other party any damages, costs or expenses.

20 Miscellaneous

- The parties acknowledge that anything stated in this contract to be attached was attached by this contract by 20.1 the vendor before the purchaser signed it and is part of this contract.
- 20.2 Anything attached to this contract is part of this contract.
- An area, bearing or dimension in this contract is only approximate. 20.3
- If a party consists of 2 or more persons, this contract benefits and binds them caparately and together. 20.4
- A party's solicitor can receive any amount payable to the party under this compact or direct in writing that it is 20.5 to be paid to another person.
- 20.6 A document under or relating to this contract is
 - signed by a party if it is signed by the party or the party solicitor (apart from a direction under 20.6.1
 - served if it is served by the party or the party's solicity 20.6.2
 - served if it is served on the party's solicitor, even it the party has died or any of them has died; 20.6.3
 - 20.6.4
 - served if it is served in any manner provided in \$470 of the Conveyancing Act 1919; served if it is sent by email or fax to the party solicitor, unless in either case it is not received; served on a person if it (or a copy of it) comes into the possession of the person; and 20.6.5
 - 20.6.6
- 20.6.7 served at the earliest time it is served, if it is served more than once.

 An obligation to pay an expense of another pay of doing something is an obligation to pay—

 20.7.1 if the party does the thing personal the reasonable cost of getting someone else to do it; or 20.7
 - if the party pays someone else to do the thing the amount paid, to the extent it is reasonable. 20.7.2
- Rights under clauses 11, 13, 14, 17/24,30 and 31 continue after completion, whether or not other rights 20.8 continue.
- The vendor does not promise, represent or state that the purchaser has any cooling off rights. 20.9
- 20.10
- The vendor does not promise represent or state that any attached survey report is accurate or current.

 A reference to any *legislation* (including any percentage or rate specified in *legislation*) is also a reference to any corresponding later legislation. 20.11
- Each party must de tratever is necessary after completion to carry out the party's obligations under this 20.12 contract.
- 20.13
- Neither taking possession nor *serving* a transfer of itself implies acceptance of the *property* or the title. The details and information provided in this contract (for example, on pages 1 3) are, to the extent of each 20.14 party's knowledge, true, and are part of this contract.
- Where the contract provides for choices, a choice in BLOCK CAPITALS applies unless a different choice is 20.15 marked.

21 Time limits in these provisions

- If the time for something to be done or to happen is not stated in these provisions, it is a reasonable time. 21 1
- If there are conflicting times for something to be done or to happen, the latest of those times applies. 21.2
- The time for one thing to be done or to happen does not extend the time for another thing to be done or to 21.3 happen.
- If the time for something to be done or to happen is the 29th, 30th or 31st day of a month, and the day does 21.4 not exist, the time is instead the last day of the month.
- If the time for something to be done or to happen is a day that is not a business day, the time is extended to 21.5 the next business day, except in the case of clauses 2 and 3.2.
- 21.6 Normally, the time by which something must be done is fixed but not essential.

 - 'normal expenses', in relation to an owners corporation for a scheme, means normal operating expenses usually payable from the administrative fund of an owners compation for a scheme of 23.2.6 the same kind;
 - tion for the scheme or any 'owners corporation' means the owners corporation or the asset 23.2.7 higher scheme;
 - cheme associated with the lot; 23.2.8 'the property' includes any interest in common property
 - 'special expenses', in relation to an owners corporation eans its actual, contingent or expected 23.2.9 expenses, except to the extent they are
 - normal expenses;
 - due to fair wear and tear;
 - disclosed in this contract; or
 - covered by moneys held in the capital orks fund.
- Clauses 11, 14.8 and 18.4 do not apply to an obligation of the owners corporation, or to property insurable by 23.3 it.
- entitlement basis instead of an area basis. 23.4 Clauses 14.4.2 and 14.5 apply but on a up

Adjustments and liability for expens

- The parties must adjust under clause 14.1 23.5
 - a regular periodic contribution; 23.5.1
 - a contribution which to a regular periodic contribution but is disclosed in this contract; and 23.5.2

 - a copy of any document served on the tenant under the lease and written details of its service, if the document concerns the rights of the landlord or the tenant after completion; and
 - any document served by the tenant under the lease and written details of its service, if the document concerns the rights of the landlord or the tenant after completion;
 - the vendor must comply with any obligation to the tenant under the lease, to the extent it is to be 24.4.4 complied with by completion; and

- the purchaser must comply with any obligation to the tenant under the lease, to the extent that 24.4.5 the obligation is disclosed in this contract and is to be complied with after completion.

- 25.5 An abstract of title -

- The vendor is liable for the mariey, except to the extent this contract says the purchaser is liable for it. To the extent the vendor is liable for it, the vendor is liable for any interest until completion. 26.2
- 26.3
- To the extent the purchaser is liable for it, the parties must adjust any interest under clause 14.1. 26.4
- 27 Consent to transfer
- This clause applies only if the land (or part of it) cannot be transferred without consent under legislation or a 27.1

 The purchaser must properly complete and then serve the purchaser's part of an application for consent to 27.2 transfer of the land (or part of it) within 7 days after the contract date.

- If consent is given subject to one or more conditions that will substantially disadvantage a party, then that 27.5 party can rescind within 7 days after receipt by or service upon the party of written notice of the conditions.
- 27.6 If consent is not given or refused
 - within 42 days after the purchaser serves the purchaser's part of the application, the purchaser 27.6.1 can rescind: or
 - within 30 days after the application is made, either party can rescind. 27.6.2
- Each period in clause 27.6 becomes 90 days if the land (or part of it) is -27.7
 - 27.7.1 under a planning agreement; or
 - in the Western Division. 27.7.2
- 27.8 If the land (or part of it) is described as a lot in an unregistered plan, each time in clause 27.6 becomes the later of the time and 35 days after creation of a separate folio for the lot.
