ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS TO CONTRACT FOR SALE

- 33.1 The purchaser warrants that the purchaser was not introduced to the Vendor or the property by a Real Estate Agent other than the Real Estate Agent, if any, disclosed on the front page of the contract. The purchaser agrees to indemnify the Vendor against any claim for commission, including the Vendor's costs of defending any such claim, which may be made by any Real Estate Agent who asserts that he introduced the Purchaser to the Vendor or that the sale was otherwise brought about by his intervention;
- 33.2 This warranty and indemnity will not merge on completion;
- 33.3 The Vendor warrants that they have not entered into an exclusive agency agreement as at the date hereto with any agent other than the agent named on the front page of the Contract.
- 34.1 In the event of the Purchasers failure to complete this Contract on or prior to the completion date referred to on the front page herein, the Vendor shall be entitled to serve on the Purchaser a Notice to Complete making time of the essence. The parties agree that fourteen (14) days shall be reasonable notice for the purpose of any Notice to Complete.
- 34.2 The Parties further agree that in the event that such notice issues by the Vendor, the Purchaser shall allow on completion to the Vendor the sum of \$220.00 (including GST), the payment of which is an essential term of this Contract.
- 35. The inclusions listed herein are included in the purchase and the purchase price. The purchaser acknowledges:
 - (a) that unless otherwise stated, none of the said inclusions are new;
 - (b) that the Vendor has not made and does not make any representation or warranty as to the state of repair and condition of such items, and
 - (c) they accept all of the said inclusions on the date on which the Purchaser is entitled to possession of the property hereunder in the state of repair and condition that same are now in, with reasonable wear and tear between the date hereof and the date on which the Purchaser is entitled to possession of the property hereunder excepted,

Title to such inclusions shall pass on completion of this agreement and the Vendor shall not be required to give formal delivery in respect thereof.

- (d) they accept the improvements in their present position, condition and state of repair and subject to any defects whether latent or patent (except latent defects in title) and any dilapidation, contamination or infestation.
- 36. The Purchaser acknowledges that the provisions of this Contract constitute the full and complete agreement between the parties. The Purchaser further acknowledges that they enter into this agreement not relying upon any warranties or representations made to them by or on behalf of the Vendor that are not contained in the Contract.

- 39. The Purchasers shall not be entitled to make any objection, requisition or claim for compensation or to rescind or terminate this Contract:
 - (a) If it should be found that the existing fences or any of them, or any parts thereof are off correct boundaries;

If a Rule is inconsistent with the by-laws or the requirements of any relevant Authority, the by-laws or Authority requirements prevail to the extent of the inconsistency.

Obstruction of Common Property

An Owner or Occupier must not obstruct lawful use of Common Property by any person except on a temporary and non-recurring basis.

6. Damage to lawns and plants on Common Property

- (a) An Owner or Occupler must not damage any lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or flower being part of or situated on Common Property.
- (b) An Owner or Occupier must not, except with the prior written approval of the Owners Corporation, use for his or her own purposes as a garden any portion of Common Property.

7. Damage to Common Property

(p)

- (a) An Owner or Occupier must not mair, paint, drive nails or screws or the like into, or otherwise damage or deface, any structure that forms part of Common Property, except with the written approval of the Owners Corporation.
- (b) An approval given by the Owners Corporation under this by-law 7 cannot authorise any additions to Common Property.
- (c) This by-law 7 does not prevent an Owner or person authorised by an Owner from installing:

- (a) An Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not, except with the prior written approval of the Owners Corporation, use or store on the Lot or on Common Property any inflammable chemical, liquid or gas or other inflammable material.

- (b) When an Owner or Occupier takes deliveries or moves furniture or goods through the Building, they must;
 - comply with the reasonable requirements of the Owners Corporation, including requirements to fit an apron cover to the Common Property lift;
 - (ii) repair any damage they (or the person making the delivery) cause to Common Property; and
 - (iii) If they (or the person making the delivery) spill anything onto Common Property, immediately remove the item and clean that part of the Common Property.
- (c) The Owners Corporation may impose the following additional requirements on Owners or Occupiers who are moving in or moving out of the Building:
 - (i) Owners or Occupiers may be required to complete and submit a form to the Owners Corporation containing details of the move, the form of which is to be reasonably determined by the Owners Corporation;
 - Owners or Occupiers may be required to make the moving arrangements.
 and receive their deliveries at specified times on specified days;
 - (iii) Owners or Occupiers may be prohibited from moving items through the foyer(s) of the Building and/or restricted to using the lift; and
 - (iv) Owners or Occupiers may be required to pay a cash bond in an amount reasonably determined by the Owners Corporation from time to time for the purpose of ensuring that Common Property is not damaged during the move. Any bond required must be paid before the move commences and the Owners Corporation must refund the bond (or any part of the bond not required to pay for damage to Common Property caused by the move) to the Owner or Occupier within 48 hours of the move being completed.

- (d) The Owners Corporation may appoint a Strata Manager to assist it to perform its functions under this by-law 15. If this happens, Owners and Occupiers must:
 - (f) make arrangements with the person so appointed when they move in or out of the Building; and
 - (II) comply with the requirements of the person so appointed when they take deliveries or move furniture or goods through the Building.

Building Manager

16.1 Appointment

The Owners Corporation may:

- (a) appoint the Building Manager to provide Services; and
- (b) enter Into the Building Manager Agreement referred to In by-law 18.2 to provide those services.

16.2 Building Manager Agreement

The Building Manager Agreement may contain the following provisions:

- (a) provide for remuneration of the Building Manager of an annual fee to be agreed between the Owners Corporation and the Building Manager; and
- (b) provide for the annual fee to be reviewed annually in accordance with the Consumer Price index.
- (c) the manner in which the Building Manager must carry out the Services;
- (d) the manner in which employees and contractors are to be engaged;
- (e) the manner in which the Building Manager may be reimbursed for expenses; and
- (f) the manner in which the Building Manager Agreement may be assigned.

16.3 Obstruction of the Building Manager

The Owners and Occupiers must not:

- (a) Interfere with or obstruct the Building Manager from providing the services contemplated by the Building Manager Agreement;
- (b) Interfere with or obstruct the Building Manager from using any part of the Common Property in providing the services contemplated by the Building Manager Agreement.

16.4 Delegation by Owners Corporation

Where a by-law requires an act or activity to be reported to the Owners Corporation, unless stated otherwise in the by-law:

- (a) If the Owners Corporation has appointed a Building Manager, that act or activity must be reported to the Building Manager; and
- (b) If the Owners Corporation has not appointed a Building Manager, that act or activity must be reported to a member of the Strata Committee.

17. Floor coverings

- (a) An Owner of a Lot must ensure that all floor space within the Lot is covered or otherwise treated to an extent sufficient to prevent the transmission from the floor space of noise likely to disturb the peaceful enjoyment of the Owner or Occupier of another Lot.
- (b) An Owner must not cover the floor space of a Lot with tiles, timber flooring, or any other substance which may cause a nulsance or disturb the peaceful enjoyment of the Owner or Occupiers of another t.ot without the consent in writing of the Owners Corporation, which consent may be withheld in its absolute discretion.
- (c) If an Owner wants to change the floor covering or treatment of a Lot to other than tire floor covering or treatment existing as at the date of registration of the Strata Plan:
 - (f) the Impact insulation rating of an installed floor covering or treatment must have an impact insulation rating classification of not less than 50 as measured in accordance with AS 1055-1997 and must comply with the requirement of the Building Code of Australia;
 - the Owner of the Lot must notify the Owners Corporation at least 21 days before changing any of the floor coverings or treatments of the Lot; and
 - (iii) following installation of the floor covering or treatment, provide the Owners Corporation with an acoustic report signed by an acoustic engineer or other appropriately qualified person to demonstrate that this by-law 16 has been compiled with.
- (d) By-law 17(b) does not apply to floor space of a Lot comprising a kitchen, laundry, lavatory or bathroom.
- (e) By-law 17(c)(ii) does not affect any requirement under any law to obtain a consent to, approval for or any other authorisation for the changing of the floor covering, treatment or surface.

18. Garbage disposal

18.1 Making rules

The Owners Corporation may make Rules about the storage and removal of garbage from the Site.

18.2 Requirements for Residential Lots

18.3 An owner or occupier of a lot in a strata scheme that does not have shared receptacles for garbage, recyclable material or waste:

- (a) must maintain such receptacles within the lot, or on such part of the Common Property as may be authorised by the owners corporation, in clean and dry condition and (except in the case of receptacles for recyclable material) adequately covered, and
- (b) must ensure that before garbage, recyclable material or waste is placed in the receptacles it is, in the case of garbage, securely wrapped or, in the case of tins or other containers, completely drained or, in the case of recyclable material or waste, separated and prepared in accordance with the applicable recycling guidelines, and
- (o) for the purpose of having the garbage, recyclable material or waste collected, must place the receptacles within an area designated for that purpose by the owners corporation and at a time not more than 12 hours before the time at which garbage, recyclable material or waste is normally collected, and
- (d) when the garbage, recyclable material or waste has been collected, must promptly return the receptacles to the lot or other area referred to in paragraph (a), and
- (e) must not place any thing in the receptacles of the owner or occupier of any other lot except with the permission of that owner or occupier, and
- (f) must promptly remove any thing which the owner, occupier or garbage or recycling collector may have spilled from the receptacles and must take such action as may be necessary to clean the area within which that thing was spilled.

18.4 An owner or occupier of a lot in a strata scheme that has shared receptacles for garbage, recyclable material or waste:

- (a) must ensure that before garbage, recyclable material or waste is placed in the receptacles it is, in the case of garbage, securely wrapped or, in the case of tins or other containers, completely drained or, in the case of recyclable material or waste, separated and prepared in accordance with the applicable recycling guidelines, and
- (b) must promptly remove any thing which the owner, occupier or garbage or recycling collector may have spilled in the area of the receptacles and must take such action as may be necessary to clean the area within which that thing was spilled.

18.5 An owner or occupier of a lot must:

- (a) comply with the local council's requirements for the storage, handling and collection of garbage, waste and recyclable material, and
- (b) notify the local council of any loss of, or damage to, receptacles provided by the local council for garbage, recyclable material or waste.
- 18.6 The owners corporation may post signs on the Common Property with Instructions on the handling of garbage, waste and recyclable material that are consistent with the local council's requirements.

19. Keeping of animals

- (a) Subject to section 139(5) of the Act, an Owner or Occupier may keep up to two small animals on its Lot or on Common Property, if the Owner or Occupier gives the Owners Corporation written notice that it is being kept on the lot.
- (b) The notice must be given not later than 14 days after the animal commences being kept on the lot.
- (c) If an Owner or Occupier of a lot keeps an animal on the lot, the Owner or Occupier must:
 - (I) Keep the animal within the lot, and
 - (ii) Supervise the animal when it is on the Common Property, and
 - (iii) Take any action that is necessary to clean all areas of the lot or the Common Property that are solled by the animal.
- (d) The written notice to the Owners Corporation must include:
 - (I) Details of the type and size (including weight) of the animal; and
 - (ii) a photograph of the animal

and the Owners Corporation may refuse to allow an animal to be kept on the lot other than a: .

- (i) cat;
- (ii) dog (other than a dangerous dog as defined in the Companion Animals Act 1998);
- (iii) caged bird;
- (iv) fish in a secure aquarlum; or
- (v) any other small animal approved by the Strata Committee.

- (e) An Owner or Occupier must ensure that its cat, dog or caged bird is vaccinated and micro chipped, registered with the Council and its registration number is given to the Owners Corporation before and while it is kept on the Owner's or Occupier's Lot.
- (f) An Owner and Occupier must ensure that its cat, dog or bird:
 - (i) is kept within the Lot whenever practicable;
 - (ii) Is carried, leashed, caged or otherwise kept under control when on the Common Property;
 - (iii) Is prevented from fouling the Common Property and that any such fouling is immediately removed; and
 - (iv) does not interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of another Owner or Occupier of a Lot in the Scheme, or damage the Common Property or the property of another Owner or Occupier and that any such damage must immediately be made good at no cost to the Owners Corporation.
- (g) If three or more substantiated complaints about an animal's behaviour are made within a consecutive sixty day period by another Owner or Occupier of a Lot, the Strata Committee is entitled to request by written notice to the Owner or Occupier, that the animal be removed, following which the animal must be removed from the Lot and the Scheme within seven days.
- (h) ... Nothing in this bylaw overrides the operation of the Companion Animals Act 1998.

20. Appearance of Lot

- (a) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not, except with the prior written approval of the Owners Corporation, maintain within the Lot anything visible from outside the Lot that, viewed from outside the Lot, is not in keeping with the appearance of the rest of the Building.
- (b) If a Lot contains a private courtyard, the Owner or Occupier of that Lot must maintain the landscaping and the general appearance of the courtyard in accordance with the landscaping standards and the general standard of the Building.
- (c) The Owner or Occupier must not, without the written consent of the Owners Corporation, affix anything to the exterior of the Building or a Lot within the Building or the Common Property or maintain within the Lot anything visible from outside the Lot that, viewed from outside the Lot, is not in keeping with the appearance of the rest of the Building. This prohibition includes (without limitation):
 - (i) the display of "for sale" or "for lease" signs, or any other form of notice or advertising; and
 - (ii) satellite dishes or antennas.

21. Change in use of Lot to be notified

- (a) An Occupier of a Lot must notify the Owners Corporation if the Occupier uses a Lot in a way that may affect the insurance premiums for the Scheme (for example, if the use results in a hazardous activity being carried out on the Lot, or results in the Lot being used for non-residential purposes).
- (b) Notwithstanding by-law 21(a), the Owner or Occupier is only permitted to use the Lot for residential purposes.

22. Fire safety

- (a) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not do anything or permit any invitees of the Owner or Occupier to do anything on the Lot or Common Property that is likely to affect the operation of fire safety devices on the Site or to reduce the level of fire safety in the Lots or Common Property.
- (b) The Strata Committee must adopt the Fire Safety Management Plan for the Bullding and the Owners and Occupiers must comply with the Fire Safety Management Plan.
- (c) The Owners Corporation must comply with all relevant obligations prescribed by the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000 with respect to all matters concerning fire safety of the Building.

23. Prevention of hazards

The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not do anything or permit any invitees of the Owner or Occupier to do anything on the Lot or Common Property that is likely to create a hazard or danger to the Owner or Occupier of another Lot or any person lawfully using Common Property.

·24. Selling and leasing activities

- (a) The Original Proprietor may on Common Property and any Lot owned by the Original Proprietor:
 - (i) maintain selling and leasing offices and facilities;
 - (ii) maintain signs in connection with those selling and leasing activities; and
 - (iii) conduct selling, leasing and auction activities.
- (b) No other Owner or Occupier may maintain facilities or signs, or otherwise conduct selling or leasing activities, without Owners Corporation approval.

25. Security Keys

(a) If relevant, the Strata Manager will issue security keys or swipes to the Owner of a Lot, but an Owner is not entitled to more keys or swipes than there are bedrooms

in the Owner's Lot except in the case of a one bedroom Lot, where the entitlement is to two sets of keys or swipes.

- (b) The Strata Manager will charge a fee for each Security Key given and may charge a deposit, which will be retained by the Strata Manager if a Security Key must be replaced, and return that deposit if a Security Key or swipe is returned undamaged.
- (c) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot may not duplicate or copy the key or swipe.
- (d) If the Owner or Occupier of a Lot has damaged, lost or had its security key or swipe stolen, then the Owner must immediately notify the Strata Manager which will replace the key at the cost of the Owner.
- (e) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot will return any security key or swipe to the Strata Manager immediately on request.

26. Vehicles and parking areas

- (a) An Owner, or Occupier must not park or stand any motor vehicle or other vehicle on Common Property or allow any invitee of the Owner or Occupier to park or stand any motor vehicle or other vehicle on Common Property except with the prior written approval of the Owners Corporation.
- (b) An Owner or Occupier must not park or stand any motor vehicle or other vehicle in any parking space designated for use by visitors.
- (c) An Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not at any time enclose any car parking space forming part of that Lot, or alter or erect anything on such car parking space.
- (d) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not at any time obstruct driveway or parking areas and will not use any driveway or car spaces for the manufacture, storage or display of goods, materials or any other equipment and the driveways and car spaces are to be used solely for vehicular access and for the parking of vehicles associated with the use of the Lot.
- (e) An owner or Occupier of a Lot must not at any time use any space or the Common Property for:
 - (i) Washing vehicles (other than the car wash bay area if available); and
 - (ii) Repairing, modifying and/or maintaining any vehicle.

27. Structural support in the Building

An Owner or Occupier must not carry out any alteration to any part of the Building which affects structural support to any other part of the Building, without first submitting copies of all relevant plans, and approvals to the Owners Corporation and obtaining the prior written approval of the Owners Corporation to the proposed alteration. The consent of all relevant Authorities required by law must also be obtained for the alterations and any

works approved by the Owners Corporation must be carried out in accordance with the conditions imposed by all relevant Authorities and the Owners Corporation.

28. Access to Inspect or read meters

Where any meter is located within a Lot, the Owner or Occupier of that Lot must, on receiving reasonable notice, give access to persons authorised by the Owners Corporation to allow the reading or servicing of that meter. An Owner or Occupier is entitled to require the presence of the Strata Manager or other authorised employee or representative of the Owners Corporation before granting access to allow inspection or reading of any meter that is located within a Lot.

29. Annual fire safety certification

The Owners Corporation must certify to the Council and the NSW Fire Brigade and provide a Fire Safety Certificate annually confirming that the essential services installed in the Building for the purpose of fire safety have been inspected and at the time of inspection are capable of operating to the required minimum standard.

30. Noise control – plant and machinery .

An Owner or Occupier of a Lot must not cause the emission of noise by the operation of any plant and machinery or other equipment on a Lot that exceeds 5dB(A) above the background noise level when measured at the boundary of the Lot.

31. Public access

An Owner or Occupier will not obstruct a public access way with any materials, vehicles, refuse, skips or the like under any circumstances.

32. Failure to comply with by-laws

- (a) The Owners Corporation may do any act, as an Owner or Occupier of a Lot, that an Owner or Occupier should have done under the Act or these by-laws, but which an Owner or Occupier has not done or, in the reasonable opinion of the Owners Corporation, has not done properly.
- (b) The Owners Corporation must give an Owner and/or Occupier written notice specifying when it will enter an Owner's and/or Occupier's Lot to do any work required to be done in the exercise of the rights conferred on the Owners Corporation under these by-laws. An Owner and/or Occupier must:
 - (i) give the Owners Corporation (or persons authorised by it) access to an Owner's and/or Occupier's Lot as required by the notice and at the cost of that Owner and/or Occupier, and
 - (ii) pay the Owners Corporation the costs incurred for doing the work.
- (c) The Owners Corporation may recover money an Owner or Occupier owes it under these by-laws as a debt payable upon demand.

(d) The rights of the Owners Corporation under this by-law 32 are in addition to those that it has under the Act.

33. Cladding

The ExoTec™ Vero™ Façade Panel must be thoroughly washed down a minimum twice a year and as further documented and updated by James Hardle. This must be done by the Owner or Occupier of a lot and/or the Owners Corporation and documented and recorded to the requirements of James Hardle.

Where walls are protected by soffits above and where good rainfall will not wash down any area of the panel, the wash down twice per year is a maintenance requirement by the Owners Corporation. The wash down process entails the consistent flow of water over the face of the sheet, vertical and horizontal control joints in order to displace the build-up of any salt deposits. It is at the discretion of the responsible parties to do this in the most practical and safe manner available.

It is the responsibility of the Owner or Occupier of a lot and the Owners Corporation to continually update themselves on the minimum washdown and any other requirements by James Hardie as to not void warranty and extend the life of the cladding and the system as a whole. An Owner or Occupier of a lot must consent to the Owners Corporation complying with the requirements of this By Law including (but not limited to) allowing the Owners Corporation or a consultant paid by the Owners Corporation to access their lot for the purpose of completing the washdown process.

34. Use and maintenance of Balconies

- (a) An Owner or Occupier must not, without the written consent of the Owners Corporation, use Balconies or permit Balconies to be used by any other person, to store furniture, goods or any other item. Outdoor furniture kept on balconies:
 - (i) must be in keeping with the appearance of the rest of the Building; and
 - (ii) must not cause damage or be dangerous or have potential to cause damage or injury.
- (b) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must at all times ensure that Balcony drainage is not blocked.
- (c) The Owner of a Lot which contains a Balcony is granted exclusive use and enjoyment of the Balcony Fittings on its Lot, and is responsible for the maintenance and repair of those Balcony Fittings, and must maintain the same in good condition..

35. False Fire Alarm

(a) An Owner or Occupier must not by wilful or negligent act or omission, do or permit anything to be done to cause any Fire Alarm to be activated where such activation of the Fire Alarm could have been prevented by such Owner or Occupier.

- (b) The Owners Corporation is entitled to recover from an Owner or Occupier the Fire Alarm Costs paid by the Owners Corporation in relation to a breach of by-law 35(a) by an Owner or Occupier.
- (c) The Owners Corporation may:
 - demand payment from an Owner or Occupier for any money outstanding under this by-law 35 and recover this amount from the Owner or Occupier as a debt; and
 - (II) Include reference to the debt on notices under section 184 of the Act.

36. Compliance with planning and other requirements

- (a) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must ensure that the Lot is not used for any purpose that is prohibited by law.
- (b) The Owner or Occupier of a Lot must
 - (i) ensure that the Lot is not occupied by more persons than are allowed by law to occupy the Lot;
 - (ii) not permit their Lot to be occupied by more adults than two adults per bedroom;
 - (iii) not permit any bedroom in their Lot to be occupied by more than two adults; and
 - (iv) have more than two beds (other than children's beds or bassinets) in any bedroom.

37. Service of documents on Owner of Lot by Owners Corporation

A document may be served on the Owner of a Lot by electronic means if the person has given the Owners Corporation an e-mail address for the service of notices and the document is sent to that address.

38. Access rights

For the purpose of Part 6 Division 4 of the Act, an Owner or Occupier of a Lot is deemed to have consented to the Owners Corporation entering the Lot, to perform any work described in section 122 of the Act, if the Owners Corporation provides seven days written notice to the Owner or Occupier of its intention to so enter the Lot.

39. Lift

The Proprietor or Occupier of a lot should not allow the conveyance in the Lift of any object likely to damage or dirty the Lift. When using the lift to transport furniture of bulky items the Proprietor or Occupier of a lot must utilise the lift protection curtains.

40. Gymnasium and swimming pool area

- 40.1 The Owners Corporation continues to be responsible for the property maintenance and keeping of the Gymnasium and Swimming Pool Area in a state of good and serviceable repair.
- 40.2 The Owners Corporation may enter the Gymnasium and Swimming Pool Area at all reasonable times for the purpose of discharging its obligation to carry out maintenance or repairs.
- 40.3 The following conditions apply to the use of the Gymnasium and Swimming Pool by the Owners and Occupiers of the Residential Lots:
 - (a) The Gymnasium and Swimming Pool may only be used between the hours of 7.00 am and 9.00 pm or other hours nominated from time to time by the Strata Committee;
 - (b) Children under the age of 15 years of age may use the Gymnasium and Swimming Pool only if accompanied and supervised by an adult;
 - Glass objects, drinking glasses, food and sharp objects are not permitted in the Gymnasium and Swimming Pool;
 - (d) Running, ball playing, noisy or hazardous activities are not permitted in the Gymnasium and Swimming Pool;
 - (e) The Swimming Pool equipment must not, except with the approval of the Strata Committee, be interfered with, operated or adjusted;
 - (f) Sports type footwear must be worn while using the Gymnasium;
 - (g) All users must be appropriately attired whilst using the Gymnasium; and
 - (h) All users must carry a towel.
 - (i) A person on the Gymnasium and Swimming Pool Area with the express or implied consent of an Occupier or Owner, may use the Swimming Pool and Gymnasium provided they comply with any rules about the use of the Gymnasium and Swimming Pool Area.

41. Air-Conditioning Unit

- 41.1 The Occupier or Owner of a lot that uses an air-conditioning system is responsible for the costs of repair and maintenance for that air conditioning system.
- 41.2 The Occupier or Owner or a Contractor of an Occupier or Owner of a Penthouse will have access to the Rooftop Area for the purpose of servicing and repairing Air-Conditioning units.

42. Smoke Penetration

- 42.1 An Owner or Occupier, and any Invitee of the Owner or Occupier, must not smoke tobacco or any other substance on the Common Property.
- 42.2 An Owner or Occupier of a lot must ensure that smoke caused by the smoking of tobacco or any other substance by the owner or occupier, or any invitee of the Owner or Occupier on the lot does not penetrate to the Common Property or any other lot.

43. Building Management Agreement

43.1 Power to Appoint

In accordance with the Act, the Owners Corporation has the power to appoint and enterinto an agreement with a Building Manager to provide caretaking, security, cleaning and other operational services for the Complex.

43.2 Building Manager's Duties

The Building Manager's duties may include:

- caretaking, supervising and servicing the Common Property to a standard consistent with use of lots in the scheme as high class residential apartments;
- (b) attending to or supervising the cleaning, repair, maintenance, renewal or replacement of Common Property and any personal property vested in the Owners Corporation;
- providing services to the Owners Corporation, owners and occupiers including,
 without limitation, the services of a handy person and room cleaning;
- (d) supervising Owners Corporation employees and contractors;
- (e) providing security services to the Owners Corporation;
- (f) providing cleaning services to the Owners Corporation;

44. Letting Agreement

44.1 Power to Authorise

45.2 Terms of Deed

Such Deed must be on reasonable terms including:

- (a) allowing the financier to perform the Manager's obligations under the Building Management Agreement and/or the Letting and Licence Deed by a replacement Manager approved by the Owners Corporation;
- (b) requiring the Owners Corporation to give to the financier any notice given under the Building Management Agreement and/or the Letting and Licence Deed to the Manager at the same time as the Manager is given the notice.

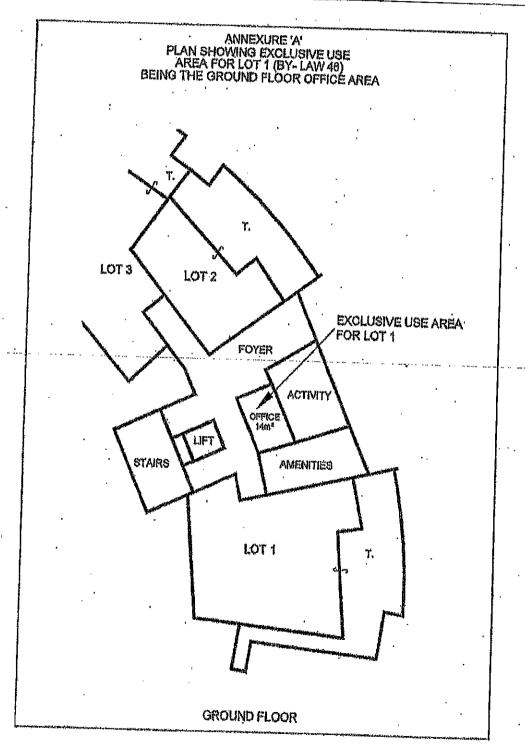

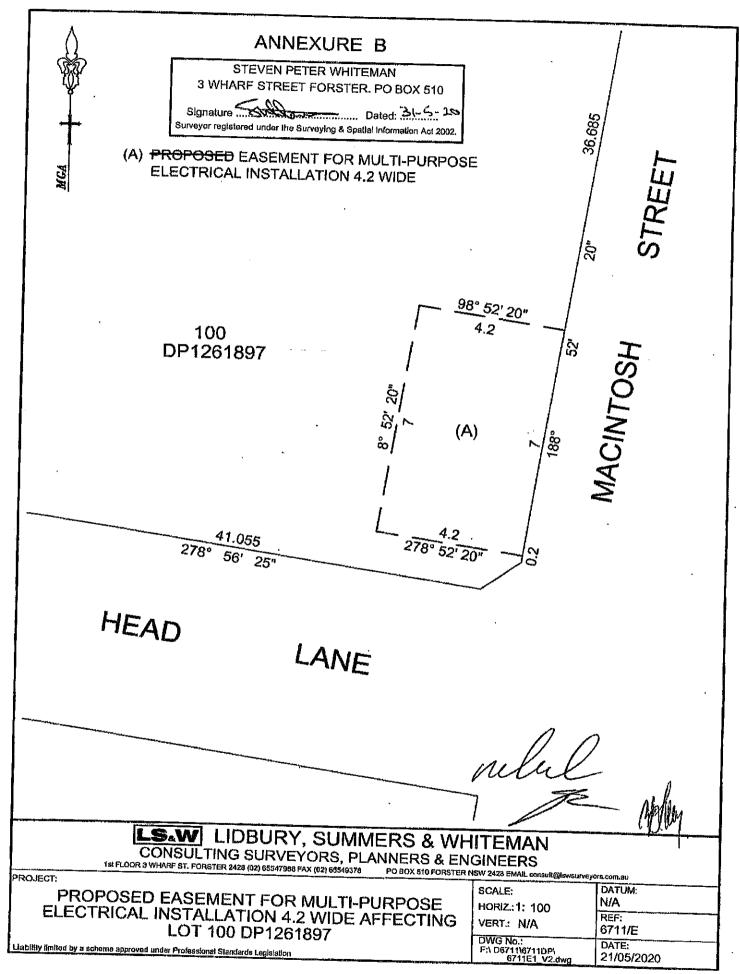

 - 3.4.1 it is from the same issuer and for the same amount as the earlier deposit-bond; and
 - 3.4.2 it has an expiry date at least three months after its date of sue.
- 3.5 A breach of clauses 3.2 or 3.3 entitles the vendor to terminate. The right to terminate is lost as soon as -
 - 3.5.1 the purchaser serves a replacement deposit-bond; or 3.5.2 the deposit is paid in full under clause 2.
- Clauses 3.3 and 3.4 can operate more than once. 3.6
- If the purchaser serves a replacement deposit-bond, the vendor must serve the earlier deposit-bond. 3.7
- The amount of any deposit-bond does not form part of the price for the purposes of clause 16.7. 3.8
- The vendor must give the purchaser the deposit-bond 3.9 on completion; or 3.9.1
 - 3.9.2
- if this contract is rescinded. 3.10 If this contract is terminated by the vendor
 - normally, the vendor can immediately demand payment from the issuer of the deposit-bond; or 3,10,1
 - 3.10.2 if the purchaser serves prior to termination a notice disputing the vendor's right to terminate, the vendor must forward the deposit-bond (or its proceeds if called up) to the depositholder as stakeholder.
- 3.11 If this contract is terminated by the purchaser -
 - 3.11.1 normally, the vendor must give the purchaser the deposit-bond; or
 - if the vendor serves prior to termination a notice disputing the purchaser's right to terminate, the 3.11.2 vendor must forward the deposit-bond (or its proceeds if called up) to the depositholder as stakeholder.

Transfer

- Normally, the purchaser must serve at least 14 days before the date for completion 4.1
 - 4.1.1 the form of transfer: and
 - particulars required to register any mortgage or other dealing to be lodged with the transfer by the 4.1.2 purchaser or the purchaser's mortgagee.
- If any information needed for the form of transfer is not disclosed in this contract, the vendor must serve it. 4.2
- If the purchaser serves a form of transfer and the transferee is not the purchaser, the purchaser must give the 4.3 vendor a direction signed by the purchaser personally for this form of transfer.
- The vendor can require the purchaser to include a form of covenant or easement in the transfer only if this 4.4 contract contains the wording of the proposed covenant or easement, and a description of the land benefited.

5 Requisitions

- If a form of requisitions is attached to this contract, the purchaser is taken to have made those requisitions. 5.1
- If the purchaser is or becomes entitled to make any other requisition, the purchaser can make it only by 5.2 serving it -
 - 5.2.1 if it arises out of this contract or it is a general question about the property or title - within 21 days after the contract date;
 - 5.2.2 if it arises out of anything served by the vendor - within 21 days after the later of the contract date and that service; and
 - 5.2.3 in any other case - within a reasonable time.

Error or misdescription

- Normally, the purchaser can (but only before completion) claim compensation for an error or misdescription in 6.1 this contract (as to the property, the title or anything else and whether substantial or not).
- This clause applies even if the purchaser did not take notice of or rely on anything in this contract containing 6.2 or giving rise to the error or misdescription.
- 6.3 However, this clause does not apply to the extent the purchaser knows the true position.

7 Claims by purchaser

Normally, the purchaser can make a claim (including a claim under clause 6) before completion only by serving it with a statement of the amount claimed, and if the purchaser makes one or more claims before completion -

- 7.1 the vendor can rescind if in the case of claims that are not claims for delay
 - the total amount claimed exceeds 5% of the price; 7.1.1
 - the vendor serves notice of intention to rescind; and 7.1.2
 - the purchaser does not serve notice waiving the claims within 14 days after that service; and 7,1,3
- if the vendor does not rescind, the parties must complete and if this contract is completed -7,2
 - the lesser of the total amount claimed and 10% of the price must be paid out of the price to and 7.2.1 held by the depositholder until the claims are finalised or lapse;
 - 7.2.2 the amount held is to be invested in accordance with clause 2.9;
 - the amount field is to be invested in accordance with clause 2.9; the claims must be finalised by an arbitrator appointed by the parties or, if an appointment is not made within 1 month of completion, by an arbitrator appointed by the President of the Law Society at the request of a participation. 7.2.3 at the request of a party (in the latter case the parties are bound by the terms of the Conveyancing Arbitration Rules approved by the Law Society as at the date of the appointment);
 - the purchaser is not entitled, in respect of the claims, to more than the total amount claimed and 7.2.4 the costs of the purchaser:
 - net interest on the amount held must be paid to the parties in the same proportion as the amount 7.2.5 held is paid; and
 - if the parties do not appoint an arbitrator and neither party requests the President to appoint an 7.2.6 arbitrator within 3 months after completion, the claims lapse and the amount belongs to the vendor.

8 Vendor's rights and obligations

- 8.1 The vendor can rescind if -
 - 8.1.1 the vendor is, on reasonable grounds, unable or unwilling to comply with a requisition;
 - the vendor serves a notice of intention to rescind that specifies the requisition and those grounds; 8.1.2
 - the purchaser does not serve a notice waiving the requisition within 14 days after that service. 8.1.3
- If the vendor does not comply with this contract (or a notice under or relating to it) in an essential respect, the 8.2 purchaser can terminate by serving a notice. After the termination
 - the purchaser can recover the deposit and any other money paid by the purchaser under this 8.2.1 contract:
 - 8.2.2 the purchaser can sue the vendor to recover damages for breach of contract; and
 - if the purchaser has been in possession a party can claim for a reasonable adjustment. 8.2.3

9 Purchaser's default

If the purchaser does not comply with this contract (or a notice under or relating to it) in an essential respect, the vendor can terminate by serving a notice After the termination the vendor can

- 9.1 keep or recover the deposit (to a maximum of 10% of the price);
- hold any other money paid by the purchaser under this contract as security for anything recoverable under this 9.2 clause
 - for 12 months after the termination; or 9.2.1
 - if the vendor commences proceedings under this clause within 12 months, until those proceedings 9.2.2 are concluded; and sue the purchaser either
- 9.3
 - where the yendor has resold the property under a contract made within 12 months after the 9.3.1 termination, to recover
 - the deficiency on resale (with credit for any of the deposit kept or recovered and after allowance for any capital gains tax or goods and services tax payable on anything recovered ∉under this clause); and
 - the reasonable costs and expenses arising out of the purchaser's non-compliance with this contract or the notice and of resale and any attempted resale; or
 - 9.3.2 to recover damages for breach of contract.

Restrictions on rights of purchaser 10

- The purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate in respect of -10.1
 - 10.1,1 the ownership or location of any fence as defined in the Dividing Fences Act 1991;
 - 10.1.2 a service for the property being a joint service or passing through another property, or any service for another property passing through the property ('service' includes air, communication, drainage, electricity, garbage, gas, oil, radio, sewerage, telephone, television or water service);
 - a wall being or not being a party wall in any sense of that term or the property being affected by an 10.1.3 easement for support or not having the benefit of an easement for support;
 - 10.1.4 any change in the property due to fair wear and tear before completion;
 - a promise, representation or statement about this contract, the property or the title, not set out or 10.1.5 referred to in this contract;
 - 10.1.6 a condition, exception, reservation or restriction in a Crown grant;

- 10.1.7 the existence of any authority or licence to explore or prospect for gas, minerals or petroleum:
- 10.1.8 any easement or restriction on use the substance of either of which is disclosed in this contract or any non-compliance with the easement or restriction on use: or
- 10.1.9 anything the substance of which is disclosed in this contract (except a caveat, charge, mortgage, priority notice or writ).
- The purchaser cannot rescind or terminate only because of a defect in title to or quality of the inclusions. 10.2
- Normally, the purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate or require the vendor to 10.3 change the nature of the title disclosed in this contract (for example, to remove a caution evidencing qualified title, or to lodge a plan of survey as regards limited title).

11 Compliance with work orders

- Normally, the vendor must by completion comply with a work order made on or before the contract date and if 11.1 this contract is completed the purchaser must comply with any other work order.
- If the purchaser complies with a work order, and this contract is rescinded or terminated, the vendor must pay 11.2 the expense of compliance to the purchaser.

12 Certificates and inspections

The vendor must do everything reasonable to enable the purchaser, subject to the rights of any tenant -

- to have the property inspected to obtain any certificate or report reasonably required; 12.1
- 12.2 to apply (if necessary in the name of the vendor) for
 - necessary in the name of the vendor) for -any certificate that can be given in respect of the property under legislation; or 12.2.1
 - 12.2,2 a copy of any approval, certificate, consent, direction, notice or order in respect of the property given under legislation, even if given after the contract date; and
- to make 1 inspection of the property in the 3 days before a time appointed for completion. 12.3

13 Goods and services tax (GST)

- Terms used in this clause which are not defined elsewhere in this contract and have a defined meaning in the 13.1 GST Act have the same meaning in this clause.
- Normally, if a party must pay the price or any other amount to the other party under this contract, GST is not to 13,2 be added to the price or amount.
- If under this contract a party must make an adjustment or payment for an expense of another party or pay an 13,3 expense payable by or to a third party (for example, under clauses 14 or 20.7) -
 - 13.3.1 the party must adjust or pay on completion any GST added to or included in the expense; but
 - the amount of the expense must be reduced to the extent the party receiving the adjustment or 13.3.2 payment (or the representative member of a GST group of which that party is a member) is entitled to an input tax credit for the expense; and
 - if the adjustment or payment under this contract is consideration for a taxable supply, an amount 13.3.3 for GST must be added at the GST rate.
- If this contract says this sale is the supply of a going concern -13.4
 - the parties agree the supply of the property is a supply of a going concern; 13.4,1
 - the vendor must, between the contract date and completion, carry on the enterprise conducted on 13.4.2 the land in a proper and business-like way;
 - if the purchaser is not registered by the date for completion, the parties must complete and the 13.4.3 purchaser must pay on completion, in addition to the price, an amount being the price multiplied by the GST rate ("the retention sum"). The retention sum is to be held by the depositholder and dealt with as follows
 - if within 3 months of completion the purchaser serves a letter from the Australian Taxation Office stating the purchaser is registered with a date of effect of registration on or before completion, the depositholder is to pay the retention sum to the purchaser, but
 - if the purchaser does not serve that letter within 3 months of completion, the depositholder is to pay the retention sum to the vendor; and
 - if the vendor, despite clause 13.4.1, serves a letter from the Australian Taxation Office stating the 13.4.4 vendor has to pay GST on the supply, the purchaser must pay to the vendor on demand the amount of GST assessed.
- 13.5 Normally, the vendor promises the margin scheme will not apply to the supply of the property.
- If this contract says the margin scheme is to apply in making the taxable supply, the parties agree that the 13.6 margin scheme is to apply to the sale of the property.
- If this contract savs the sale is not a taxable supply -13.7
 - 13,7,1 the purchaser promises that the property will not be used and represents that the purchaser does not intend the property (or any part of the property) to be used in a way that could make the sale a taxable supply to any extent; and
 - 13,7,2 the purchaser must pay the vendor on completion in addition to the price an amount calculated by multiplying the price by the GST rate if this sale is a taxable supply to any extent because of
 - a breach of clause 13.7.1; or
 - something else known to the purchaser but not the vendor.
- If this contract says this sale is a taxable supply in full and does not say the margin scheme applies to the 13.8 property, the vendor must pay the purchaser on completion an amount of one-eleventh of the price if -

- 13.8.1 this sale is not a taxable supply in full; or
- 13.8.2 the margin scheme applies to the property (or any part of the property).
- 13.9 If this contract says this sale is a taxable supply to an extent
 - clause 13.7.1 does not apply to any part of the property which is identified as being a taxable 13.9.1
 - the payments mentioned in clauses 13.7 and 13.8 are to be recalculated by multiplying the relevant 13.9,2 payment by the proportion of the price which represents the value of that part of the property to which the clause applies (the proportion to be expressed as a number between 0 and 1). Any evidence of value must be obtained at the expense of the vendor.
- Normally, on completion the vendor must give the recipient of the supply a tax invoice for any taxable supply by the vendor by or under this contract.
- 13.11 The vendor does not have to give the purchaser a tax invoice if the margin scheme applies to a taxable supply.
- If the vendor is liable for GST on rents or profits due to issuing an invoice or receiving consideration before 13.12 completion, any adjustment of those amounts must exclude an amount equal to the vendor's GST liability.
- If the purchaser must make a GSTRW payment the purchaser must --13,13
 - at least 5 days before the date for completion, serve evidence of submission of a GSTRW payment 13.13.1 notification form to the Australian Taxation Office by the purchaser or, if a direction under clause 4.3 has been served, by the transferee named in the transfer served with that direction; produce on completion a settlement cheque for the GSTRW payment payable to the Deputy
 - 13,13,2 Commissioner of Taxation;
 - 13.13.3 forward the settlement cheque to the payee immediately after completion; and
 - serve evidence of receipt of payment of the GSTRW payment and a copy of the settlement date 13.13.4 confirmation form submitted to the Australian Taxation Office.

14 **Adjustments**

- Normally, the vendor is entitled to the rents and profits and will be liable for all rates, water, sewerage and 14.1 drainage service and usage charges, land tax, levies and all other periodic outgoings up to and including the adjustment date after which the purchaser will be entitled and liable.
- The parties must make any necessary adjustment on completion. 14.2
- If an amount that is adjustable under this contract has been reduced under legislation, the parties must on 14.3 completion adjust the reduced amount.
- The parties must not adjust surcharge land tax (as defined in the Land Tax Act 1956) but must adjust any 14.4 other land tax for the year current at the adjustment date -
 - 14.4.1 only if land tax has been paid or is payable for the year (whether by the vendor or by a predecessor in title) and this contract says that land tax is adjustable:
 - by adjusting the amount that would have been payable if at the start of the year -14.4.2
 - the person who owned the land owned no other land;
 - the land was not subject to a special trust or owned by a non-concessional company; and
 - if the land (or part of it) had no separate taxable value, by calculating its separate taxable value on a proportional area basis.
- If any other amount that is adjustable under this contract relates partly to the land and partly to other land, the 14.5 parties must adjust it on a proportional area basis.
- Normally, the vendor can direct the purchaser to produce a settlement cheque on completion to pay an 14.6 amount adjustable under this contract and if so -
 - 14.6.1 the amount is to be treated as if it were paid: and
 - the cheque must be forwarded to the payee immediately after completion (by the purchaser if the 14.6.2 cheque relates only to the property or by the vendor in any other case).
- If on completion the last bill for a water, sewerage or drainage usage charge is for a period ending before the 14.7 adjustment date, the yendor is liable for an amount calculated by dividing the bill by the number of days in the period then multiplying by the number of unbilled days up to and including the adjustment date.
- The vendor is liable for any amount recoverable for work started on or before the contract date on the property 14.8 or any adjoining footpath or road.

15 Date for completion

The parties must complete by the date for completion and, if they do not, a party can serve a notice to complete if that party is otherwise entitled to do so.

16 Completion

Vendor

- On completion the vendor must give the purchaser any document of title that relates only to the property. 16.1
- If on completion the vendor has possession or control of a document of title that relates also to other property, 16.2 the vendor must produce it as and where necessary.
- Normally, on completion the vendor must cause the legal title to the property (being an estate in fee simple) to 16.3 pass to the purchaser free of any mortgage or other interest, subject to any necessary registration.
- 16.4 The legal title to the property does not pass before completion.

- If the vendor gives the purchaser a document (other than the transfer) that needs to be lodged for registration, 16.5 the vendor must pay the lodgment fee to the purchaser.
- 16.6 If a party serves a land tax certificate showing a charge on any of the land, by completion the vendor must do all things and pay all money required so that the charge is no longer effective against the land.

Purchaser

- On completion the purchaser must pay to the vendor, by cash (up to \$2,000) or settlement cheque -16.7 16.7.1 the price less any:
 - deposit paid:
 - FRCGW remittance payable;
 - GSTRW payment; and
 - amount payable by the vendor to the purchaser under this contract; and
 - any other amount payable by the purchaser under this contract. 16.7.2
- If the vendor requires more than 5 settlement cheques, the vendor must pay \$10 for each extra cheque. 16.8
- If any of the deposit is not covered by a bond or guarantee, on completion the purchaser must give the vendor 16.9 an order signed by the purchaser authorising the depositholder to account to the vendor for the deposit.
- On completion the deposit belongs to the vendor. 16.10

Place for completion

- 16,11
- Normally, the parties must complete at the completion address, which is 16.11.1 if a special completion address is stated in this contract that address; or
 - 16.11.2 if none is stated, but a first mortgagee is disclosed in this contract and the mortgagee would usually discharge the mortgage at a particular place - that place; of
 - in any other case the vendor's solicitor's address stated in this contract. 16.11.3
- The vendor by reasonable notice can require completion at another place, if it is in NSW, but the vendor must 16.12 pay the purchaser's additional expenses, including any agency of mortgagee fee.
- If the purchaser requests completion at a place that is not the completion address, and the vendor agrees, the 16.13 purchaser must pay the vendor's additional expenses, including any agency or mortgagee fee.

17 **Possession**

- Normally, the vendor must give the purchaser vacant possession of the property on completion. 17.1
- The vendor does not have to give vacant possession if 17.2
 - this contract says that the sale is subject to existing tenancies; and 17.2.1
 - the contract discloses the provisions of the tenancy (for example, by attaching a copy of the lease 17.2.2 and any relevant memorandum or variation).
- 17.3 Normally, the purchaser can claim compensation (before or after completion) or rescind if any of the land is affected by a protected tenancy (a tenancy affected by Schedule 2, Part 7 of the Residential Tenancies Act 2010).

18 Possession before completion

- This clause applies only if the vendor gives the purchaser possession of the property before completion. 18,1
- 18,2 The purchaser must not before completion -
 - 18.2.1 let or part with possession of any of the property:
 - make any change or structural alteration or addition to the property; or 18.2.2
 - contravene any agreement between the parties or any direction, document, legislation, notice or 18.2.3 order affecting the property.
- 18.3 The purchaser must until completion
 - keep the property in good condition and repair having regard to its condition at the giving of 18.3.1 possession; and J
 - 18.3.2 allow the vendor's authorised representative to enter and inspect it at all reasonable times.
- The risk as to damage to the property passes to the purchaser immediately after the purchaser enters into 18.4 possession.
- If the purchaser does not comply with this clause, then without affecting any other right of the vendor 18.5
 - the vendor can before completion, without notice, remedy the non-compliance; and 18.5.1
 - 18.5.2 if the vendor pays the expense of doing this, the purchaser must pay it to the vendor with interest at the rate prescribed under s101 Civil Procedure Act 2005.
- 18.6 If this contract is rescinded or terminated the purchaser must immediately vacate the property.
- 18.7 If the parties or their solicitors on their behalf do not agree in writing to a fee or rent, none is payable.

19 Rescission of contract

- If this contract expressly gives a party a right to rescind, the party can exercise the right -19.1
 - 19.1.1 only by serving a notice before completion; and
 - in spite of any making of a claim or requisition, any attempt to satisfy a claim or requisition, any 19.1.2 arbitration, litigation, mediation or negotiation or any giving or taking of possession.
- 19.2 Normally, if a party exercises a right to rescind expressly given by this contract or any legislation
 - the deposit and any other money paid by the purchaser under this contract must be refunded; 19.2.1
 - 19,2,2 a party can claim for a reasonable adjustment if the purchaser has been in possession;
 - 19.2.3 a party can claim for damages, costs or expenses arising out of a breach of this contract; and
 - a party will not otherwise be liable to pay the other party any damages, costs or expenses. 19.2.4

BREACH OF COPYRIGHT MAY RESULT IN LEGAL ACTION

20 Miscellaneous

- 20.1 The parties acknowledge that anything stated in this contract to be attached was attached to this contract by the vendor before the purchaser signed it and is part of this contract.
- 20.2 Anything attached to this contract is part of this contract.
- 20.3 An area, bearing or dimension in this contract is only approximate.
- 20.4 If a party consists of 2 or more persons, this contract benefits and binds them separately and together.
- 20.5 A party's solicitor can receive any amount payable to the party under this contract or direct in writing that it is to be paid to another person.
- 20.6 A document under or relating to this contract is
 - signed by a *party* if it is signed by the *party* or the *party's solicitor* (apart from a direction under clause 4.3);
 - 20.6.2 served if it is served by the party or the party's solicitor;
 - 20.6.3 served if it is served on the party's solicitor, even if the party has died or any of them has died;
 - 20.6.4 served if it is served in any manner provided in s170 of the Conveyancing Act 1919;
 - 20.6.5 served if it is sent by email or fax to the party's solicitor, unless in either case it is not received;
 - 20.6.6 served on a person if it (or a copy of it) comes into the possession of the person; and
 - 20.6.7 served at the earliest time it is served, if it is served more than once.
- 20.7 An obligation to pay an expense of another *party* of doing something is an obligation to pay
 - 20.7.1 if the party does the thing personally the reasonable cost of getting someone else to do it; or if the party pays someone else to do the thing the amount paid, to the extent it is reasonable.
- 20.8 Rights under clauses 11, 13, 14, 17, 24, 30 and 31 continue after completion, whether or not other rights continue.
- 20.9 The vendor does not promise, represent or state that the purchaser has any cooling off rights.
- 20.10 The vendor does not promise, represent or state that any attached survey report is accurate or current.
- 20.11 A reference to any *legislation* (including any percentage or rate specified in *legislation*) is also a reference to any corresponding later *legislation*.
- 20.12 Each party must do whatever is necessary after completion to carry out the party's obligations under this contract.
- 20.13 Neither taking possession nor serving a transfer of itself implies acceptance of the property or the title.
- 20.14 The details and information provided in this contract (for example, on pages 1 3) are, to the extent of each party's knowledge, true, and are part of this contract.
- 20.15 Where this contract provides for choices, a choice in BLOCK CAPITALS applies unless a different choice is marked.

21 Time limits in these provisions

- 21.1 If the time for something to be done or to happen is not stated in these provisions, it is a reasonable time.
- 21.2 If there are conflicting times for something to be done or to happen, the latest of those times applies.
- 21.3 The time for one thing to be done or to happen does not extend the time for another thing to be done or to happen.
- 21.4 If the time for something to be done or to happen is the 29th, 30th or 31st day of a month, and the day does not exist, the time is instead the last day of the month.
- 21.5 If the time for something to be done or to happen is a day that is not a *business day*, the time is extended to the next *business day*, except in the case of clauses 2 and 3.2.
- 21.6 Normally, the time by which something must be done is fixed but not essential.

22 Foreign Acquisitions and Takeovers Act 1975

- 22.1 The purchaser promises that the Commonwealth Treasurer cannot prohibit and has not prohibited the transfer under the Foreign Acquisitions and Takeovers Act 1975.
- 22.2 This promise is essential and a breach of it entitles the vendor to terminate.

23 Strata or community title

• Definitions and modifications

- 23.1 This clause applies only if the land (or part of it) is a lot in a strata, neighbourhood, precinct or community scheme (or on completion is to be a lot in a scheme of that kind).
- 23.2 In this contract -
 - 23.2.1 'change', in relation to a scheme, means -
 - a registered or registrable change from by-laws set out in this contract;
 - a change from a development or management contract or statement set out in this contract; or
 - a change in the boundaries of common property;
 - 23.2.2 'common property' includes association property for the scheme or any higher scheme;
 - 23.2.3 'contribution' includes an amount payable under a by-law;
 - 23.2.4 'information certificate' includes a certificate under s184 Strata Schemes Management Act 2015 and s26 Community Land Management Act 1989;
 - 23.2.5 'information notice' includes a strata information notice under s22 Strata Schemes Management Act 2015 and a notice under s47 Community Land Management Act 1989;

- 'normal expenses', in relation to an owners corporation for a scheme, means normal operating 23.2.6 expenses usually payable from the administrative fund of an owners corporation for a scheme of the same kind:
- 'owners corporation' means the owners corporation or the association for the scheme or any higher 23.2.7 scheme:
- 'the property' includes any interest in common property for the scheme associated with the lot; and 23.2.8 'special expenses', in relation to an owners corporation, means its actual, contingent or expected 23.2.9

expenses, except to the extent they are -

- normal expenses:
- due to fair wear and tear:
- disclosed in this contract; or

covered by moneys held in the capital works fund.

- Clauses 11, 14.8 and 18.4 do not apply to an obligation of the owners corporation, or to property insurable by 23.3
- Clauses 14.4.2 and 14.5 apply but on a unit entitlement basis instead of an area basis. 23.4

Adjustments and liability for expenses

- 23,5 The parties must adjust under clause 14.1 -
 - 23.5.1 a regular periodic contribution:
 - a contribution which is not a regular periodic contribution but is disclosed in this contract; and 23,5,2
 - on a unit entitlement basis, any amount paid by the vendor for a normal expense of the owners 23.5.3 corporation to the extent the owners corporation has not paid the amount to the vendor.
- If a contribution is not a regular periodic contribution and is not disclosed in this contract -23.6
 - the vendor is liable for it if it was determined on or before the contract date, even if it is payable by 23.6.1 instalments: and
 - 23.6.2 the purchaser is liable for all contributions determined after the contract date.
- The vendor must pay or allow to the purchaser on completion the amount of any unpaid contributions for 23,7 which the vendor is liable under clause 23.6.1.
- Normally, the purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate in respect of 23,8 an existing or future actual, contingent or expected expense of the owners corporation; 23.8.1
 - a proportional unit entitlement of the lot of a relevant lot or former lot, apart from a claim under 23.8.2 clause 6; or
 - a past or future change in the scheme or a higher scheme. 23.8.3
- 23.9 However, the purchaser can rescind if -
 - 23.9.1 the owners corporation when calculated on a unit entitlement basis (and, if more than one lot or a higher scheme is involved, added together), less any contribution paid by the vendor, are more than 1% of the price:
 - in the case of the lot or a relevant lot or former lot in a higher scheme, a proportional unit 23.9.2 entitlement for the lot is disclosed in this contract but the lot has a different proportional unit entitlement at the contract date or at any time before completion:
 - a change before the contract date or before completion in the scheme or a higher scheme 23.9.3
 - materially prejudices the purchaser and is not disclosed in this contract; or a resolution is passed by the owners corporation before the contract date or before completion to 23.9.4 give to the owners in the scheme for their consideration a strata renewal plan that has not lapsed at the contract date and there is not attached to this contract a strata renewal proposal or the strata renewal plan.

 • Notices, certificates and inspections

- The purchaser must give the vendor 2 copies of an information notice addressed to the owners corporation 23.10 and signed by the purchaser.
- The vendor must complete and sign 1 copy of the notice and give it to the purchaser on completion. 23,11

23.12 Each party can sign and give the notice as agent for the other.

- The vendor must serve an information certificate issued after the contract date in relation to the lot, the 23.13 scheme or any higher scheme at least 7 days before the date for completion.
- The purchaser does not have to complete earlier than 7 days after service of the certificate and clause 21.3 23.14 does not apply to this provision. On completion the purchaser must pay the vendor the prescribed fee for the certificate.
- The vendor authorises the purchaser to apply for the purchaser's own certificate. 23.15
- The vendor authorises the purchaser to apply for and make an inspection of any record or other document in 23.16 the custody or control of the owners corporation or relating to the scheme or any higher scheme.
 - Meetings of the owners corporation
- 23.17 If a general meeting of the owners corporation is convened before completion
 - if the vendor receives notice of it, the vendor must immediately notify the purchaser of it; and 23.17.1
 - after the expiry of any cooling off period, the purchaser can require the vendor to appoint the 23.17.2 purchaser (or the purchaser's nominee) to exercise any voting rights of the vendor in respect of the lot at the meeting.

24 **Tenancies**

If a tenant has not made a payment for a period preceding or current at the adjustment date -24.1

24.1.1 for the purposes of clause 14.2, the amount is to be treated as if it were paid; and

- 24.1.2 the purchaser assigns the debt to the vendor on completion and will if required give a further assignment at the vendor's expense.
- If a tenant has paid in advance of the adjustment date any periodic payment in addition to rent, it must be 24.2 adjusted as if it were rent for the period to which it relates.
- If the property is to be subject to a tenancy on completion or is subject to a tenancy on completion 24.3 the vendor authorises the purchaser to have any accounting records relating to the tenancy 24.3.1 inspected and audited and to have any other document relating to the tenancy inspected;
 - the vendor must serve any information about the tenancy reasonably requested by the purchaser 24.3.2 before or after completion; and
 - 24.3.3 normally, the purchaser can claim compensation (before or after completion) if
 - a disclosure statement required by the Retail Leases Act 1994 was not given when required;
 - such a statement contained information that was materially falls or misleading;
 - a provision of the lease is not enforceable because of a nonadisclosure in such a statement; or
 - the lease was entered into in contravention of the Retail Leases Act 1994.
- 24.4 If the property is subject to a tenancy on completion -
 - 24.4.1 the vendor must allow or transfer
 - any remaining bond money or any other security against the tenant's default (to the extent the security is transferable);
 - any money in a fund established under the lease for a purpose and compensation for any money in the fund or interest earnt by the fund that has been applied for any other purpose;
 - any money paid by the tenant for a purpose that has not been applied for that purpose and compensation for any of the money that has been applied for any other purpose;
 - if the security is not transferable, each party fingst do everything reasonable to cause a replacement 24.4.2 security to issue for the benefit of the purchaser and the vendor must hold the original security on trust for the benefit of the purchaser until the replacement security issues;
 - 24.4.3
- the vendor must give to the purchaser

 a proper notice of the transfer (an attornment notice) addressed to the tenant;
 - any certificate given under the Retail Leases Act 1994 in relation to the tenancy;
 - a copy of any disclosure statement given under the Retail Leases Act 1994;
 - a copy of any document served on the tenant under the lease and written details of its service, if the document concerns the rights of the landlord or the tenant after completion; and
 - any document served by the tenant under the lease and written details of its service, if the document concerns the rights of the landlord or the tenant after completion;
 - the vendor must comply with any obligation to the tenant under the lease, to the extent it is to be 24.4.4 complied with by completion; and
 - the purchaser must comply with any obligation to the tenant under the lease, to the extent that the 24.4.5 obligation is disclosed in this contract and is to be complied with after completion.
- 25 Qualified title, limited title and old system title
- 25.1 This clause applies only if the land (or part of it) -
 - 25.1.1 is under qualified, limited or old system title; or
 - 25.1.2 on completion is to be under one of those titles.
- The vendor must serve a proper abstract of title within 7 days after the contract date. 25.2
- If an abstract of title or part of an abstract of title is attached to this contract or has been lent by the vendor to the purchaser before the contract date, the abstract or part is served on the contract date. 25.3
- An abstract of title can be or include a list of documents, events and facts arranged (apart from a will or 25.4 codicil) in date order, if the list in respect of each document
 - shows its date, general nature, names of parties and any registration number; and 25.4.1 25.4.2
 - has attached a legible photocopy of it or of an official or registration copy of it.
- 25.5 An abstract of title
 - must start with a good root of title (if the good root of title must be at least 30 years old, this means 25.5.1 30 years old at the contract date):
 - in the case of a leasehold interest, must include an abstract of the lease and any higher lease; 25.5,2
 - 25,5,3 normally, need not include a Crown grant; and
 - need not include anything evidenced by the Register kept under the Real Property Act 1900. 25.5.4
- 25.6 In the case of land under old system title -
 - 25,6,1 in this contract 'transfer' means conveyance;
 - the purchaser does not have to serve the form of transfer until after the vendor has served a proper 25.6,2 abstract of title: and
 - each vendor must give proper covenants for title as regards that vendor's interest. 25.6.3
- 25.7 In the case of land under limited title but not under qualified title -

- 25.7.1 normally, the abstract of title need not include any document which does not show the location, area or dimensions of the land (for example, by including a metes and bounds description or a plan of the land);
- 25.7.2 clause 25.7.1 does not apply to a document which is the good root of title; and
- 25.7.3 the vendor does not have to provide an abstract if this contract contains a delimitation plan (whether in registrable form or not).
- 25.8 The vendor must give a proper covenant to produce where relevant,
- 25.9 The vendor does not have to produce or covenant to produce a document that is not in the possession of the vendor or a mortgagee.
- 25.10 If the vendor is unable to produce an original document in the chain of title, the purchaser will accept a photocopy from the Registrar-General of the registration copy of that document.

26 Crown purchase money

- 26.1 This clause applies only if purchase money is payable to the Crown, whether or not due for payment.
- The vendor is liable for the money, except to the extent this contract says the purchaser is liable for it.
- 26.3 To the extent the vendor is liable for it, the vendor is liable for any interest until completion.
- To the extent the purchaser is liable for it, the parties must adjust any interest under clause 14.1.

27 Consent to transfer

- 27.1 This clause applies only if the land (or part of it) cannot be transferred without consent under *legislation* or a *planning agreement*.
- The purchaser must properly complete and then serve the purchaser's part of an application for consent to transfer of the land (or part of it) within 7 days after the contract date.
- 27.3 The vendor must apply for consent within 7 days after service of the purchaser's part.
- 27.4 If consent is refused, either party can rescind.
- 27.5 If consent is given subject to one or more conditions that will substantially disadvantage a party, then that party can rescind within 7 days after receipt by or service upon the party of written notice of the conditions.
- 27.6 If consent is not given or refused -
 - 27.6.1 within 42 days after the purchaser serves the purchaser's part of the application, the purchaser can rescind; or
 - 27.6.2 within 30 days after the application is made, either party can rescind.
- 27.7 Each period in clause 27.6 becomes 90 days if the land (or part of it) is -
 - 27.7.1 under a planning agreement; or
 - 27.7.2 in the Western Division.
- 27.8 If the land (or part of it) is described as a lot in an unregistered plan, each time in clause 27.6 becomes the later of the time and 35 days after creation of a separate folio for the lot.
- 27.9 The date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 14 days after *service* of the notice granting consent to transfer.

28 Unregistered plan

- 28.1 This clause applies only if some of the land is described as a lot in an unregistered plan.
- 28.2 The vendor must do everything reasonable to have the plan registered *within* 6 months after the contract date, with or without any minor alteration to the plan or any document to be lodged with the plan validly required or made under *legislation*.
- 28.3 If the plan is not registered within that time and in that manner
 - 28.3.1 the purchaser can rescind; and
 - the vendor can rescind, but only if the vendor has complied with clause 28.2 and with any legislation governing the rescission.
- 28.4 Either party can serve notice of the registration of the plan and every relevant lot and plan number.
- 28.5 The date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 21 days after service of the notice.
- 28.6 Clauses 28.2 and 28.3 apply to another plan that is to be registered before the plan is registered.

29 Conditional confract

- 29.1 This clause applies only if a provision says this contract or completion is conditional on an event.
- 29.2 If the time for the event to happen is not stated, the time is 42 days after the contract date.
- 29.3 If this contract says the provision is for the benefit of a party, then it benefits only that party.
- 29.4 If anything is necessary to make the event happen, each *party* must do whatever is reasonably necessary to cause the event to happen.
- 29.5 A party can rescind under this clause only if the party has substantially complied with clause 29.4.
- 29.6 If the event involves an approval and the approval is given subject to a condition that will substantially disadvantage a *party* who has the benefit of the provision, the *party* can *rescind within* 7 days after either *party* serves notice of the condition.
- 29.7 If the parties can lawfully complete without the event happening -
 - 29.7.1 if the event does not happen within the time for it to happen, a party who has the benefit of the provision can rescind within 7 days after the end of that time;
 - 29.7.2 if the event involves an approval and an application for the approval is refused, a *party* who has the benefit of the provision can *rescind within* 7 days after either *party serves* notice of the refusal; and

- the date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 21 days after the earliest 29.7.3
 - either party serving notice of the event happening;
 - every party who has the benefit of the provision serving notice waiving the provision; or

the end of the time for the event to happen.

- 29.8 If the parties cannot lawfully complete without the event happening
 - if the event does not happen within the time for it to happen, either party can rescind; 29.8.1
 - if the event involves an approval and an application for the approval is refused, either party can 29.8.2 rescind:
 - the date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 21 days after either party 29.8.3 serves notice of the event happening.
- A party cannot rescind under clauses 29.7 or 29.8 after the event happens. 29.9

30 Electronic transaction

- This Conveyancing Transaction is to be conducted as an electronic transaction if 30.1
 - this contract says that it is an electronic transaction; 30,1,1
 - the parties otherwise agree that it is to be conducted as an electronic transaction; or 30.1,2
 - the conveyancing rules require it to be conducted as an electronic transaction. 30,1,3
- However, this Conveyancing Transaction is not to be conducted as an electronic transaction -30.2
 - if the land is not electronically tradeable or the transfer is not eligible to be lodged electronically; or 30,2,1
 - if, at any time after the effective date, but at least 14 days before the date for completion, a party 30.2.2 serves a notice stating a valid reason why it cannot be conducted as an electronic transaction.
- If, because of clause 30.2.2, this Conveyancing Transaction is not to be conducted as an electronic 30.3 transaction -
 - 30,3,1 each party must
 - bear equally any disbursements or fees; and
 - otherwise bear that party's own costs; incurred because this Conveyancing Transaction was to be conducted as an electronic transaction;
 - if a party has paid all of a disbursement of fee which, by reason of this clause, is to be borne 30.3.2 equally by the parties, that amount must be adjusted under clause 14.2.
- 30.4 If this Conveyancing Transaction is to be conducted as an electronic transaction
 - to the extent that any other provision of this contract is inconsistent with this clause, the provisions 30.4.1 of this clause prevail;
 - normally, words and phrases used in this clause 30 (italicised and in Title Case, such as Electronic 30.4.2 Workspace and Lodgment Case) have the same meaning which they have in the participation rules;
 - the parties must conduct the electronic transaction 30.4.3
 - in accordance with the participation rules and the ECNL; and
 - using the nominated ELN, unless the parties otherwise agree;
 - a party must pay the fees and charges payable by that party to the ELNO and the Land Registry as 30.4.4 a result of this transaction being an electronic transaction; any communication from one party to another party in the Electronic Workspace made –
 - 30.4.5
 - after the effective date; and
 - before the receipt of a notice given under clause 30.2.2;

is taken to have been received by that party at the time determined by s13A of the Electronic Transactions Act 2000; and

- a document which is an electronic document is served as soon as it is first Digitally Signed in the 30.4.6 Electronic Workspace on behalf of the party required to serve it.
- 30.5 Normally, the vendor must within 7 days of the effective date -
 - 30.5.1 create an Electronic Workspace;
 - populate the Electronic Workspace with title data, the date for completion and, if applicable, 30.5.2 mortgagee details; and 30.5.3
 - invite the purchaser and any discharging mortgagee to the Electronic Workspace.
- If the vendor has not created an Electronic Workspace in accordance with clause 30.5, the purchaser may 30.6 create an Electronic Workspace. If the purchaser creates the Electronic Workspace the purchaser must populate the Electronic Workspace with title data; 30.6.1
 - 30.6.2 create and populate an electronic transfer.
 - populate the Electronic Workspace with the date for completion and a nominated completion time; 30.6.3 and
 - invite the vendor and any incoming mortgagee to join the Electronic Workspace. 30.6.4
- Normally, within 7 days of receiving an invitation from the vendor to join the Electronic Workspace, the 30.7 purchaser must --
 - 30.7.1 join the Electronic Workspace:
 - create and populate an electronic transfer, 30.7,2
 - 30.7.3 invite any incoming mortgagee to join the Electronic Workspace; and
 - 30.7.4 populate the Electronic Workspace with a nominated completion time.

- 30.8 If the purchaser has created the *Electronic Workspace* the vendor must *within* 7 days of being invited to the *Electronic Workspace*
 - 30.8.1 join the Electronic Workspace;
 - 30.8.2 populate the Electronic Workspace with mortgagee details, if applicable; and
 - 30.8.3 invite any discharging mortgagee to join the Electronic Workspace.
- 30.9 To complete the financial settlement schedule in the Electronic Workspace -
 - 30.9.1 the purchaser must provide the vendor with adjustment figures at least 2 business days before the date for completion;
 - 30.9.2 the vendor must confirm the adjustment figures at least 1 business day before the date for completion; and
 - 30.9.3 if the purchaser must make a GSTRW payment or an FRCGW remittance, the purchaser must populate the Electronic Workspace with the payment details for the GSTRW payment or FRCGW remittance payable to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation at least 2 business days before the date for completion.
- 30.10 Before completion, the parties must ensure that -
 - 30.10.1 all electronic documents which a party must Digitally Sign to complete the electronic transaction are populated and Digitally Signed;
 - 30.10.2 all certifications required by the ECNL are properly given; and
 - 30.10.3 they do everything else in the *Electronic Workspace* which that party must do to enable the *electronic transaction* to proceed to completion.
- 30.11 If completion takes place in the Electronic Workspace
 - payment electronically on completion of the price in accordance with clause 16.7 is taken to be payment by a single settlement cheque;
 - 30.11.2 the completion address in clause 16.11 is the *Electronic Workspace*; and
 - 30.11.3 clauses 13.13.2 to 13.13.4, 16.8, 16.12, 16.13 and 31.2.2 to 31.2.4 do not apply.
- 30.12 If the computer systems of any of the Land Registry, the ELNO or the Reserve Bank of Australia are inoperative for any reason at the completion time agreed by the parties, a failure to complete this contract for that reason is not a default under this contract on the part of either party.
- 30.13 If the computer systems of the *Land Registry* are inoperative for any reason at the *completion time* agreed by the *parties*, and the *parties* choose that financial settlement is to occur despite this, then on financial settlement occurring
 - 30.13.1 all electronic documents Digitally Signed by the vendor, the certificate of title and any discharge of mortgage, withdrawal of caveat or other electronic document forming part of the Lodgment Case for the electronic transaction shall be taken to have been unconditionally and irrevocably delivered to the purchaser or the purchaser's mortgagee at the time of financial settlement together with the right to deal with the land comprised in the certificate of title; and
 - 30.13.2 the vendor shall be taken to have no legal or equitable interest in the property.
- 30.14 A party who holds a certificate of title must act in accordance with any Prescribed Requirement in relation to the certificate of title but if there is no Prescribed Requirement, the vendor must serve the certificate of title after completion.
- 30.15 If the parties do not agree about the delivery before completion of one or more documents or things that cannot be delivered through the *Electronic Workspace*, the party required to deliver the documents or things 30.15.1 holds them on completion in escrow for the benefit of; and
 - 30.15.2 must immediately after completion deliver the documents or things to, or as directed by; the *party* entitled to them.
- 30.16 In this clause 30, these terms (in any form) mean -

adjustment figures details of the adjustments to be made to the price under clause 14; certificate of title the paper duplicate of the folio of the register for the land which exists

immediately prior to completion and, if more than one, refers to each such paper duplicate;

completion time the

the time of day on the date for completion when the electronic transaction is to be settled:

conveyancing rules discharging mortgagee the rules made under s12E of the Real Property Act 1900;

any discharging mortgagee, chargee, covenant chargee or caveator whose provision of a *Digitally Signed* discharge of mortgage, discharge of charge or withdrawal of caveat is required in order for unencumbered title to the *property* to be transferred to the purchaser:

ECNL effective date the Electronic Conveyancing National Law (NSW);

the date on which the *Conveyancing Transaction* is agreed to be an *electronic transaction* under clause 30.1.2 or, if clauses 30.1.1 or 30.1.3 apply, the contract

date;

electronic document

a dealing as defined in the Real Property Act 1900 which may be created and *Digitally Signed* in an *Electronic Workspace*;

electronic transfer

a transfer of land under the Real Property Act 1900 for the *property* to be prepared and *Digitally Signed* in the *Electronic Workspace* established for the purposes of the *parties' Conveyancing Transaction*:

electronic transaction a Conveyancing Transaction to be conducted for the parties by their legal

representatives as Subscribers using an ELN and in accordance with the ECNL

and the participation rules:

electronically tradeable

a land title that is Electronically Tradeable as that term is defined in the

conveyancing rules:

incoming mortgagee

mortgagee details

any mortgagee who is to provide finance to the purchaser on the security of the

property and to enable the purchaser to pay the whole or part of the price;

the details which a party to the electronic transaction must provide about any discharging mortgagee of the property as at completion;

participation rules the participation rules as determined by the ECNL;

populate

to complete data fields in the Electronic Workspace; and

title data

the details of the title to the property made available to the Electronic Workspace

by the Land Registry.

31 Foreign Resident Capital Gains Withholding

31,1 This clause applies only if -

the sale is not an excluded transaction within the meaning of s14 215 of Schedule 1 to the TA Act; 31.1.1

a clearance certificate in respect of every vendor is not attached to this contract. 31.1.2

The purchaser must --31,2

> 31.2.1 at least 5 days before the date for completion, serve evidence of submission of a purchaser payment notification to the Australian Taxation Office by the purchaser or, if a direction under clause 4.3 has been served, by the transferee named in the transfer served with that direction;

> 31.2.2 produce on completion a settlement cheque for the FROGW remittance payable to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation:

forward the settlement cheque to the payee immediately after completion; and 31.2.3

serve evidence of receipt of payment of the FRGGW remittance. 31.2.4

31,3 The vendor cannot refuse to complete if the purchaser complies with clauses 31.2.1 and 31.2.2.

31.4 If the vendor serves any clearance certificate or variation, the purchaser does not have to complete earlier than 7 days after that service and clause 21.3 does not apply to this provision.

If the vendor serves in respect of every vendor either a clearance certificate or a variation to 0.00 percent, 31.5 clauses 31.2 and 31.3 do not apply.

32 Residential off the plan contract

32.1 This clause applies if this contract is an off the plan contract within the meaning of Division 10 of Part 4 of the Conveyancing Act 1919 (the Division).

No provision of this contract has the effect of excluding, modifying or restricting the operation of the Division. 32.2

If the purchaser makes a claim for compensation under the terms prescribed by clause 6A of the 32.3 Conveyancing (Sale of Land) Regulation, 2017 -

the purchaser cannot make a claim under this contract about the same subject matter, including a 32,3,1 claim under clauses 6 of 7, and the claim for compensation is not a claim under this contract.

32.3.2

This clause does not apply to a contract made before the commencement of the amendments to the Division 32.4 under the Conveyancing Legislation Amendment Act 2018.
