# COOLING OFF PERIOD (PURCHASER'S RIGHTS)

- 1. This is the statement required by section 66X of the Conveyancing Act 1919 and applies to a contract for the sale of residential property.
- 2. EXCEPT in the circumstances listed in paragraph 3, the purchaser may rescind the contract at any time before 5 pm on—

(a) the tenth business day after the day on which the contract was made—in the case of an off the plan contract, or

(b) the fifth business day after the day on which the contract was made—in any other case.

There is NO COOLING OFF PERIOD:

- (a) if, at or before the time the contract is made, the ourchaser gives to the vendor (or the vendor's solicitor or agent) a certificate that complies with section 66W of the Act, or
- (b) if the property is sold by public auction, or

(c) if the contract is made on the same day as the property was offered for sale by public auction but passed in, or

(d) if the contract is made in consequence of the exercise of an option to purchase the property, other than an option that is void under section 66ZG of the Act.

4. A purchaser exercising the right to shall off by rescinding the contract will forfeit to the vendor 0.25% of the purchase price of the property. The vendor is entitled to recover the amount forfeited from any amount paid by the purchaser as a deposit under the contract and the purchaser is entitled to a refund of any balance.

DISPUTES

If you get into a dispute with the other party, the Law Society and Real Estate Institute encourage you to use informal procedures such as negotiation, independent expert appraisal, the Law Society Conveyancing Dispute Resolution Scheme or mediation (for example mediation under the Law Society Mediation Program).

If any of the deposit is not paid on time or a cheque for any of the deposit is not honoured on presentation, the 2.5 vendor can terminate. This right to terminate is lost as soon as the deposit is paid in full.

If the vendor accepts a bond or guarantee for the deposit, clauses 2.1 to 2.5 do not apply. 2.6 BREACH OF COPYRIGHT MAY RESULT IN LEGAL ACTION

- 2.7 If the vendor accepts a bond or guarantee for part of the deposit, clauses 2.1 to 2.5 apply only to the balance.

  - any change in the property due to fair wear and tear before completion; 10.1.4
  - a promise, representation or statement about this contract, the property or the title, not set out or 10.1.5 referred to in this contract;
  - a condition, exception, reservation or restriction in a Crown grant; 10.1.6

- 10.1.7 the existence of any authority or licence to explore or prospect for gas, minerals or petroleum;
- 10.1.8 any easement or restriction on use the substance of either of which is disclosed in this contract or any non-compliance with the easement or restriction on use; or

- (f) Omit clause 7.1.1.

- (h) Substitute 1% in place of 10% in clause 7.2.1;
- (i) Clause 8.1.1 delete ",on reasonable grounds,"
- (j) Substitute "7" in place of "14" in Clause 8.1.3.
- (k) Clause 10.1 insert the words "or delay completion," after the words "make a claim or requisition;
- (i) replace "substance" in clauses 10.1.8 and 10.1.9 with "existence".
- (m) Insert clause 10.1.10 "any claim, grant, notice, order or declaration in connection with native title, land rights or heritage protection under legislation, the common law or otherwise."
- (n) Omit clause 13.8 and 13.13
- (o) Omit clause 14.4.2.
- (p) Substitute the word "completed" in place of "started" in clause 14.8.
- (q) Omit from clause 16.12 from the words "but the vendor" to the end of the clause.
- (r) Insert clause 18.8 "the purchaser is not entitled to (and must not) make an objection, requisition or claim after entering into possession."
- (s) Omit clause 19.2.3.
- (t) Insert "or guarantor" after the word "party" in clause 20.4.

- (u) Substitute "3" in place of "7" in clauses 23.13 and 23.14.
- (v) Omit clause 24 to 29 (inclusive).
- (w) Omit clauses 30.1.to 30.3.
- (x) Clause 30.4.5 replace with "any communication from one party to another party in the Electronic Workspace is taken to have been received by that party at the time determined by section 13A of Electronic Transactions Act 2000 (NSW); and"
- (y) Add clause 30.11.4 "the purchaser consents to payment of the deposit as the vendor directs in the electronic workspace on completion."

# 34. Deposit

- (a) The parties authorise and direct the depositholder to invest the deposit in an interest bearing account with a financial institution selected by the depositholder.
- (b) The purchaser must provide the depositholder with the purchaser's tax file number on or before exchange by completing the Tax File Number and FIRB notification form annexed to this contract at Schedule 6.
- (c) The purchaser must provide the depositholder with any other information or assistance necessary for the purposes of the investment of the deposit. If the purchaser fails to do so within 3 business days after the date of this contract (and in this respect time is of the essence) then, despite any other provision in this contract to the contrary, all interest earned on the investment of the deposit will be paid to the vendor.

# (d) If the contract:

- (i) is properly terminated, the party that properly terminates the contract is entitled to the deposit and any interest earned on the investment of the deposit and the parties authorise the depositholder to release the deposit and any interest earned on the investment of the deposit to the party that properly terminates the contract;
- (ii) is disclaimed by a liquidator or trustee in bankruptcy appointed to the purchaser, the parties authorise the depositholder to release the deposit and any interest earned on the deposit to the vendor; or
- (iii) is rescinded on account of breach by the vendor, the purchaser is entitled to the deposit and any interest earned on the investment of the deposit and the parties authorise the depositholder to release the deposit and any interest earned on the investment of the deposit to the purchaser.

### (e) If:

- for any reason other than default on the part of the vendor, the purchaser does not complete this contract on or before the date for completion, or
- (ii) the purchaser does not provide the depositholder with the purchasers tax file number on or before exchange

the vendor is entitled to any interest earned on the investment of the deposit and the parties authorise the depositholder to release the interest earned on the investment of the deposit to the vendor.

- (f) If paragraphs (d) and (e) do not apply, on completion of this contract each party becomes entitled to a half-share of the interest earned on the investment of the deposit and the parties authorise the depositholder to release a half share of the interest earned on the deposit to both the purchaser and the vendor.
- (g) The parties authorise the depositholder to deduct its administrative costs of investing and redeeming the deposit of \$165 (inclusive of GST) from the interest accrued on the deposit before any distribution of interest in accordance with this clause.
- (h) The parties agree to indemnify the depositholder for the costs of preparing and lodging any income tax return required in respect of the investment of the deposit and authorise the depositholder to deduct those costs from the interest earned on the deposit.
- (i) The depositholder has no obligation to invest the deposit:
  - until the purchaser gives the depositholder its tax file number (unless the purchaser is a Foreign Person) and, if the purchaser fails to provide its tax file number within 3 Business Days after the date of this contract, it has no entitlement to interest earned on the deposit (see paragraph (c));
  - unless the deposit is paid in cash and is equal to a minimum of 10% of the price;
  - (iii) until the whole of the deposit is paid:
  - (iv) if the date for completion is anticipated to be less than 90 days after the contract date; or
  - if the purchaser has notified the vendor that it intends to substitute a cash deposit with a deposit-bond in accordance with the terms of this contract.
- (j) The parties agree that the depositholder may terminate the investment of the deposit at any reasonable time prior to date for completion of this contract, so that the deposit and accrued interest will be available at completion or as soon as reasonably practicable after completion. At no time is the vendor or the purchaser entitled to receive any of the interest earned on the investment of the deposit before this contract is completed or terminated.
- (k) The depositholder is not liable to the vendor or purchaser for loss of interest on the deposit, however occurring (other than by reason of fraud by the depositholder).
- (I) The vendor and the purchaser agree that they will give all directions and do all such things as may be necessary to give effect to the provisions of this special condition. The vendor and the purchaser further acknowledge that the deposit shall be deposited with the said bank at the risk of the party who becomes entitled to the deposit on completion, rescission or determination of this contract (whichever occurs).
- (m) If the deposit has been invested in accordance with special condition 33 the vendor and purchaser authorises the depositholder to terminate the investment and pay the deposit and interest earned on the invested deposit in accordance with the provisions of this clause.

(n) The purchaser consents to the deposit being paid to the vendor on completion via the Electronic Workspace.

## 35. Agent

The purchaser represents and warrants that it was not introduced to the land or the vendor either directly or indirectly by any real estate agent or other person entitled to claim commission or fee from the vendor other than the vendor's agent named on the front page of this contract.

# 36. No Representations

The purchaser has, in entering this contract, relied on its own inquiries relating to the Development Lot and the land and has had the opportunity to seek independent legal advice. The purchaser warrants that, unless stated otherwise in this contract, the purchaser has not entered into this contract in reliance on any statement, representation, promise or warranty made by the vendor or on the vendor's behalf, including:

- (a) any statement, representation, promise or warranty in respect of any matter relating to the Development Lot, the land or any matter which has or may have an effect on the land;
- (b) any negotiations or discussions held;
- (c) documents or brochures produced;
- (d) any representation about the view from the land;
- images, computer generated images or content in connection with the land,
   Development Lot or the Estate; or
- (f) the display lot and the sales office.

## 37. Incapacity

- (a) If before the date for completion the purchaser (being an individual):
  - (i) dies; or
  - loses the capacity to complete this contract, or becomes incapable of managing his affairs,

the vendor may rescind the contract in accordance with clause 19.

- (b) If before the date for completion the purchaser (being a company):
  - (i) resolves to go into liquidation; or
  - (ii) has an application for its winding up filed; or
  - (iii) enters into any scheme of arrangement with its creditors; or
  - (iv) has a liquidator, receiver and manager, official manager, administrator or other statutory officer appointed to it,

the vendor may terminate this contract in accordance with clause 9.

(c) If before the date for completion the purchaser (being an individual) becomes or in the reasonable opinion of the vendor appears to become unable to pay their debts when they become due, then the vendor is entitled to issue a notice to complete to the purchaser and, if completion of this contract does not take place in accordance with that notice, to terminate this contract and clause 9 applies.

#### 38. Rates

- (a) If separate rating assessments have not issued for the land before the date for completion, adjustments under clause 14 will be made on the basis that these rates and taxes are already paid:
  - (i) council rates in the amount of \$3,000 per annum;
  - (ii) water and sewerage rates in the amount of \$300 per quarter; and
  - (iii) land tax in the amount of \$1,500 per annum.
- (b) If paragraph (a) applies, the vendor must pay any rates and taxes in respect of the land promptly upon assessment and no further adjustment between the parties will then be made in respect of those items.

### 39. Encumbrances

- (a) If any encumbrance (excluding a caveat lodged by or on behalf of the purchaser) to which this contract is not subject is noted on the certificate of title for the land on completion then:
  - the purchaser must accept a duly executed discharge in registrable form which will remove the encumbrance together with the applicable registration fee; and
  - (ii) when the vendor gives the purchaser the discharge, the vendor is regarded as having given the purchaser a transfer of the land free from the encumbrance.
- (b) Despite any other provision of this contract, the vendor has no obligation to provide to the purchaser on completion a release or discharge (partial or full) of any security interest registered in relation to the vendor on the personal property securities register established under the Personal Property Securities Act 2009.

## 40. Service by Fax

- (a) In addition to the provisions of Clause 20 of this contract, service of any notice or document under or relating to this contract may be effected and shall be sufficient service on a party and that party's solicitor:
  - (i) if addressed to that party or to that party's solicitor at the respective addresses set out in this contract and posted by ordinary pre-paid post and such notice or document shall be deemed to have been received by that party or that party's solicitor on the second business day following the date of posting;
  - if sent by facsimile transmission to the address shown on the letterhead or elsewhere of that party and/or that party's solicitor as being set aside for the transmission of or receipt of facsimile transmissions;

- (iii) any notice validly given by facsimile transmission in accordance with clause 40(a)(ii), in the absence of proof to the contrary, shall be deemed to have been received by the party to whom it was sent on the date of dispatch PROVIDED THAT
  - (A) the recipient's acknowledgment of receipt appears on the sender's copy of the notice, or on the activity record print out of the sender's machine, or the activity record print out of the sender's machine shows a successful transmission of any appropriate size document to the recipient's facsimile machine on the date indicated in the print out; and
  - (B) if the time of dispatch is later than 5.00 pm in the place to which such facsimile transmission is sent it shall be deemed to have been received at the commencement of business on the next business day in that place.

## 41. Completion Date

## 41.1 Date for completion

Completion of this contract will be effected within 21 days from the date of notification by the vendor or the vendor's solicitor of registration of the Plan and the vendor provides the purchaser a copy of the registered documents in accordance with Section 66ZP of the Conveyancing Act, 1919, (NSW).

### 41.2 Time for completion

The parties must complete by 3.30pm on the date for completion.

# 41.3 Completion after 3.30pm

If, due to no fault of the vendor, completion takes place after 3.30pm on any day, this clause 41.3 applies as if completion occurs on the first business day after the date on which completion actually occurs.

### 41.4 Completion booking cancellation

If the purchaser cancels settlement after appropriate arrangements have been made, the purchaser will allow to the vendor a GST inclusive fee of \$165 (inclusive of GST) in respect of each cancellation.

### 41.5 Notice to complete

- (a) The vendor and purchaser agree that:
  - a notice period of not less than 14 days after the date of service of the notice on the recipient is sufficient for the purposes of serving a notice to complete; and
  - (ii) time will be essential for compliance with the notice to complete.
- (b) The vendor or the purchaser giving the notice can, at any time, withdraw its notice to complete without prejudice to its continuing right to give a further notice.

Where the vendor issues a notice to complete, the purchaser must in addition to any other money payable under this contract pay the vendor's solicitor a fee of \$385 (inclusive of

GST) on completion for each notice to complete issued as agreed additional costs arising from the issue of each notice to complete.

### 41.6

Without limitation, if completion takes place after the date for completion, it is an essential term of this contract that on completion of this contract the purchaser must pay interest to the vendor calculated on the unpaid balance of the price at the Default Rate on a daily basis from but excluding the date for completion to and including the date on which this contract is completed. The purchaser need not pay interest for any period where the delay is caused solely by vendor default.

#### Vendor entitlement to caveat 417

Any money payable by the purchaser to the vendor but for any reason unpaid on completion is not waived on completion but remains a capitalised debt due to the vendor on which interest calculated at the Default Rate on a daily basis must be paid by the purchaser until payment in full by the purchaser to the vendor of the sum of the capitalised debt plus interest and any costs incurred by the vendor to recover the capitalised debt. The capitalised debt, interest and costs are secured by a charge over the land after completion and the purchaser hereby authorises the vendor to lodge a caveat over the land in respect of that charge after completion if any such debt is then due.

#### 42. Notices

The parties hereto acknowledge that the period of fourteen (14) days shall be a sufficient period for any notice issued under or pursuant to the provisions of this contract.

# 43. Requisitions on Title

- Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this contract or implied at (a) common law, the purchaser acknowledges that its rights to raise requisitions on title in respect of this contract and the land the subject of this contract shall be limited to raising requisitions in the form annexed at Schedule 4.
- The purchaser shall be deemed to have served upon the vendor's solicitor (b) immediately following the exchange of this contract requisitions in the form annexed and the solicitors for the vendor shall be deemed to have responded to such requisitions in the form annexed at Schedule 5.

## 44. GST

#### 44.1 **Definitions**

- (a) For the purposes of this clause:
  - **ABN** means Australian Business Number (i)
  - ATO means Australian Taxation Office. (ii)
  - GST is as defined in the GST Act. (iii)
  - Commissioner means the Commissioner of Taxation. (iv)
  - Financial Settlement Schedule means the financial settlement schedule (V) under PEXA.

- (vi) Form 1 Notice means a GST property settlement withholding notification required to be given by the purchaser in accordance with section 16-150(2) of Schedule 1 to the TA Act.
- (vii) Form 2 Notice means a confirmation of settlement required to be submitted on completion of this contract by the purchaser, having given a Form 1 Notice.

#### 44.2 GST Treatment

- (a) If the purchaser noted on the front page of this contract is registered for GST purposes AND an ABN is noted then the parties acknowledge and agree that the price noted on the front page of this contract is exclusive of GST and the purchaser is required to pay GST in addition to the price and the vendor will provide the purchaser with a tax invoice at completion of this contract.
- (b) If the purchaser noted on the front page of the contract is not registered for GST purposes or an ABN is not noted then the parties acknowledge and agree that the price noted on the front page of the contract includes GST and the vendor is not required to provide the purchaser with a tax invoice at completion of this contract.
- (c) The vendor reserves the right to utilise the Margin Scheme, created by the GST legislation, under this contract.

#### 44.3 Purchaser warranties

- (a) The purchaser warrants that:
  - (i) if an ABN is not noted on the front page of this contract that the purchaser is not registered or required to be registered for GST purposes; and
  - (ii) if an ABN is noted on the front page of this contract that the purchaser is registered for GST purposes as at the date of this contact.
- (b) The purchaser indemnifies the vendor in respect of any costs and expenses, interest, penalties or fines which may be incurred by the vendor as a result of the vendor's reliance on the purchaser's warranty contained in this clause.

# 44.4 GST Withholding

- (e) If Subdivision 14-E of Schedule 1 to the TA Act applies to the sale of the land, then the following subclauses will apply.
- (f) If the purchaser is required to make an GSTRW Payment in respect of this contract, the purchaser must:
  - (i) give the Commissioner a Form 1 Notice:
    - (A) within 5 days after receiving a Registration Notice; or
    - (B) at such earlier time required under section 16-150 of Schedule 1 of the TA Act;
  - (ii) serve the vendor's solicitor within 2 days of receipt, with a copy of the confirmation received from the ATO on lodgement of the Form 1 Notice, which includes details of the Lodgement reference number (LRN) and Payment reference number (PRN) (Confirmation Notice); and

- (iii) on completion:
  - (A) give the vendor a bank cheque payable to the Commissioner for the GSTRW Payment amount; or
  - (B) if the parties have agreed to complete through PEXA, pay the GSTRW Payment by electronic funds transfer to the account nominated by the Commissioner in the Financial Settlement Schedule.
- (g) At completion, the purchaser must give the vendor:
  - (iv) a declaration by the purchaser confirming that the transaction details provided in the Confirmation Notice are true and correct; and
  - (v) a written direction to the vendor and the vendor's solicitor authorising it to complete, on behalf of the purchaser, a Form 2 Notice.
- (h) After completion, the vendor will:
  - (vi) forward to the ATO any bank cheque received under clause 44(f)(iii)(A);
  - (vii) cause the vendor's solicitor to complete and submit a Form 2 Notice on behalf of the purchaser.
- (i) If the purchaser fails to comply with clause 44(f), the purchaser will be in breach of this contract in an essential respect.
- (j) This clause will not merge on completion.

#### 45. Confidentiality

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges that the terms and conditions of this contract are confidential and must not be disclosed to any other party except in accordance with subclause 45(b).
- (b) The purchaser may only disclose the terms and conditions of this contract to facilitate the completion of the contract, or to establish or enforce any rights under or perform any obligations in accordance with the provisions of this contract. Disclosure may be made to the purchaser's legal adviser, financial adviser and mortgagee (if any) or in circumstances where such disclosure is required by law.
- (c) This clause will not merge on completion.

### 46. Selling and Leasing Activities

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges that both before and after completion the vendor and persons authorised by the vendor may:
  - conduct selling and leasing activities on the Development Lot and in the area of the land in the Plan;
  - (ii) place and maintain in, on the Development Lot and about the area of the land in the Plan (but not the land the subject of this contract) signs in connection with those selling and leasing activities; and

(iii) place and maintain in, on the Development Lot and about the area of the land in the Plan (but not the land the subject of this contract) an office or other facility or both for salespersons, letting agents and managing agents,

as the vendor in its absolute discretion thinks fit.

(b) The benefits of this special condition do not merge on completion and continue in full force and effect until the vendor has completed the sale and/or leasing of all lots which are in the Estate and which are owned by the vendor at any time.

## 47. Sewer Location Disclosure

- (a) The vendor discloses that and the purchaser acknowledges that:
  - (i) as at the date of this contract there may be no diagram available for the land from a recognised sewerage authority (if available from the authority in the ordinary course of administration), indicating the location of the authority's sewer in relation to the land; and
  - (ii) if there is no diagram available from the authority indicating the location of the authority's sewer in relation to the land attached to this contract, any diagram that is attached to this contract showing the expected position of the sewer is provisional and is subject to requirements of the relevant authorities.
- (b) The purchaser will not object to the position of the sewer main provided it has been approved by the relevant authorities and provided that position does not materially and detrimentally affect the ability of the purchaser to erect a residence on the land or materially vary from the position shown on any diagram showing the expected position of the sewer.
- (c) The purchaser shall not make any requisition or any claim, or seek to delay completion or rescind or terminate this contract in relation to anything disclosed in this special condition.

#### 48. Affectations

- (a) For the purposes of this clause, "affectations" means any covenant, easement, restriction or other encumbrance on the title either referred to in this contract or any attachment to this contract or as shown or referred to in the title deed or title deeds attached to this contract.
- (b) The purchaser acknowledges that the purchaser has made all enquiries to be fully satisfied with respect to all affectations and in particular with regards to the legal effect, nature and sustainability of the affectations.
- (c) The purchaser acknowledges that the vendor does not guarantee that the affectations are enforceable or will be upheld by a court or any regulatory authority.
- (d) The purchaser acknowledges that the vendor does not give any guarantee that the affectations will be sustained by or not overridden by any current or future laws or decisions of any court or tribunal.
- (e) The purchaser acknowledges that the vendor does not have any obligation to take any action or do any act, matter or thing to seek to enforce or give effect to the terms of any affectation.

- (f) Subject to the provisions of the Conveyancing Act, 1919, (NSW), the purchaser shall not have any claim against the vendor nor be entitled to take any objection nor make any requisition or claim nor seek to delay completion nor to report the vendor to any regulatory authority by virtue of any act, matter or thing relating to any affectation or as referred to in or covered by the provisions of this clause.
- (g) The provisions of this clause shall not merge on completion but will ensure for the vendor's benefit.

## 49. Plan Registration

The land is sold subject to and conditionally upon registration of the Plan as required by law. Subject to the provisions of the *Conveyancing Act*, 1919, (NSW) the purchaser shall not take nor make any objection, requisition or claim in respect of any minor alterations so made prior to or on the registration of the Plan.

The vendor agrees to pay such monies as may be necessary to register the Plan PROVIDED THAT in the event of such registration not being effected for any reason whatsoever by the Sunset Date, either party may by notice in writing to the other but prior to such registration being effected rescind this contract, whereupon the provisions of Clause 19 shall apply.

#### 50. Variations to Subdivision Plan

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges and agrees that the vendor may make alterations, additions, variations or deletions to the Plan which are required by Council, the Registrar General or which the vendor considers necessary or desirable. Subject to the provision of the Conveyancing Act, 1919 (NSW) the purchaser cannot make a claim, objection or requisition or rescind or terminate the contract or seek to delay completion in respect of any of the following minor variations:
  - (i) a variation affecting the area of the land by less than 5%;
  - (ii) any alternation, addition, variation or deletion required by the Council or the Registrar General;
  - (iii) any change to the lot numbers or configuration of the lots or facilities in the Plan other than the land;
  - (iv) any change which does not materially or adversely affect the land.

#### (Minor Variations).

- (b) If there is a difference between the Plan and the Registered Plan (other than a Minor Variation) which detrimentally affects the land to a substantial extent, subject to the provisions of the Conveyancing Act, 1919, (NSW) the purchaser may only rescind the contract by serving a notice on the vendor and the vendor within 14 days (time of the essence) of the notice that the registration of the Plan is served.
- (c) Any notice of rescission served by the purchaser on the vendor in accordance with this clause must include the reasons for the rescission including but not limited to:
  - (i) any change or inaccuracy which gives rise to the right to rescind, and

- (ii) particulars of how the purchaser would be materially prejudiced by the change or inaccuracy.
- (d) Subject to the provisions of the Conveyancing Act 1919, (NSW) the purchaser acknowledges and agrees that its only right or remedy in respect of a difference between the Plan and the Registered Plan is the right of rescission in this clause and the purchaser cannot otherwise make a claim, objection or requisition or rescind or terminate the contract or seek to delay completion in respect of a difference between the Plan and the Registered Plan.

### 51. Easements etc created on registration of Plan

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges that there are to be created upon registration of the Plan, restrictions as to user and/or easements in the terms of the Draft 88B.
- (b) The purchaser will not, subject to the provisions of the Conveyancing Act 1919 (NSW) as amended, make any objection or make any requisition or claim in respect of the creation of the any restrictions as to the user and/or easements set out in the Draft 88B.

#### 52. Additional Easements etc

Notwithstanding anything else contained in this contract and subject to the provisions of the *Conveyancing Act, 1919* (NSW) as amended, the purchaser shall not be entitled to make any objection, requisition or claim by reason of any easement, right of way, covenant, lease or restriction as to user not being an easement, right of way, covenant, lease or restriction as to user referred to in this contract affecting the land required to be created by any Relevant Authority as a condition of the approval of that Relevant Authority and/or those authorities to the Plan and for registration <a href="PROVIDED THAT">PROVIDED THAT</a> such easement, right of way, covenant, lease and/or restrictions as to user do not materially affect the use by the purchaser of the land the subject of this contract.

### 53. Extension to Registration of Plans

- (a) Subject to the provisions of s66ZS of the Conveyancing Act, 1919 (NSW) if the Plan is not registered by the time set out in clause 49 (or the extended date resulting from the exercise of rights under clause 53(b) and 53(c)) then:
  - (i) the vendor; and
  - (ii) subject to clause 53(c), the purchaser may rescind this contract by notice.
- (b) The vendor may (at any time and as often as necessary) extend the date specified in clause 53(a) by giving the purchaser a certificate from the vendor's project manager, surveyor or builder stating that the construction on the land was delayed because of:
  - (i) damage by fire, explosion, war, civic commotion or act of God; or
  - (ii) disputes with neighbours; or
  - (iii) delay by an Authority in giving any necessary approval; or
  - (iv) weather conditions that prevent work under normal construction practices;or
  - (v) industrial dispute; or

- (vi) a combination of these or any other causes beyond the vendor's reasonable control; or
- (vii) any variation pursuant to the contract for construction on the land.

In that event the date in clause 53(a) is extended by the period or periods of the delay stated in the certificates, **PROVIDED THAT** the extensions of time granted pursuant to this clause 53(b) shall not exceed, in total, twelve (12) months.

(c) If the purchaser wants to rescind this contract under clause 53(a) then the purchaser must give the vendor 21 days notice of its intention to do so. If within that time the vendor gives the purchaser a certificate under clause 53(b) then the purchaser may not terminate this contract under clause 53(a).

### 54. Right to Change Documents

- (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this contract, the vendor may up to the date for completion notify the purchaser of its intention to alter, to add to, vary or delete the Plan or Draft 88B.
- (b) If such an alteration, variation, addition or deletion was contained in the final document or plan and the purchaser would otherwise have had a right to rescind the contract as a result of any such alteration, addition, variation or deletion then the purchaser must exercise that right of rescission by notice in writing to the vendor within 21 days of being notified by the vendor of such alteration, addition, variation or deletion or 14 days of being notified of the registration of the Plan and Draft 88B by the Registrar-General, whichever is earlier, in which respect time is of the essence (rescission period). If this right of rescission is not exercised during the rescission period, this contract becomes binding in all aspects as though the right of rescission has not been included in this contract in which respect time is of the essence (rescission period) whereupon the provisions of clause 19 will apply.

#### 55. Title Particulars

The purchaser acknowledges that the Particulars of Title as advised to the purchaser on notification of the registration of the Plan is sufficient to enable the purchaser to prepare the Transfer and the written statement of the vendor's Title, as referred to in clause 4, shall be deemed to have been served on the purchaser as at the date of this contract.

#### 56. Access to land

- (a) The purchaser (or any representative of the purchaser) is not entitled to access to the Development Lot or the land at any time prior to the date for completion without the consent of the vendor. Such consent will be granted at the vendor's absolute discretion and on conditions prescribed by the vendor from time to time.
- (b) If the vendor grants access to the Development Lot or the land to the purchaser (or any representative of the purchaser) prior to the date for completion, the purchaser agrees that access will be at a time directed by the vendor and on terms and conditions and in the presence of such persons as directed or set by the vendor.

#### 57. Non Merger

Any provision of this contract capable of continuing in force and effect following completion of this contract shall continue in force and effect notwithstanding such completion.

#### 58. Services

- (a) The vendor discloses that:
  - arrangements with Service Providers for the provision of Services to the land have not been concluded as at the date of this contract;
  - (ii) the vendor may be required to enter into arrangements with Service Providers including but limited to easements; restrictions on use, positive covenants, leases, bonds, guarantees or security deposits; and
  - (iii) the vendor may be required to enter into arrangements with the Service Providers for the provision of services to the land or to assume obligations under existing agreements in relation to those arrangements.
- (b) No objection, requisition or claim shall be made by the purchaser in relation to any matter or thing referred to in paragraph 58(a) above PROVIDED THAT the granting of such easements, restrictions on use and positive covenants do not substantially, detrimentally and permanently affect the land.

### 59. Construction Rubbish

- (a) The purchaser shall during the course of carrying out the construction of the Residence upon the land:
  - (i) keep the land in a clean and tidy state and condition;
  - (ii) arrange for the regular collection and removal from the land of all rubbish, refuse and rubble; and
  - (iii) ensure that no building materials or other goods associated with building activities on the land are stored on any nature strip or street adjoining the land.
- (b) The provisions of this clause shall enure for the benefit of the vendor and will not merge on completion.

## 60. Re-Sale of land

- (a) Notwithstanding anything else contained in this contract, if the purchaser transfers the land prior to the commencement of construction of the Residence then the purchaser must:
  - ensure that any new purchaser is bound to the terms and conditions of clause 59 (Construction Rubbish) and this clause 60 (Re-Sale of land), 70(c) (Design Requirements) (Required Clauses); and
  - (ii) not market the land for sale or erect any signage on the land without prior written consent from the vendor.

- (b) The purchaser will indemnify and keep indemnified the vendor from any loss, costs, damages or expenses which arise by virtue of the purchaser or new purchaser not following, adhering to and implementing the requirements of the Required Clauses and clauses 60(a)(i) and 60(a)(ii).
- (c) This clause does not merge on completion.

#### 61. Caveats

The purchaser must not lodge a caveat over the title of the land or the Development Lot before registration of the Plan and, after registration of the Plan, may only lodge a caveat in respect of the land. If the purchaser lodges a caveat not permitted by this clause it must immediately withdraw the same when requested to do so by the vendor. The purchaser hereby appoints the vendor as its attorney to sign any withdrawal of caveat lodged by or on behalf of the purchaser either before registration of the Plan (in respect of the Development Lot) or after registration of the Plan (in respect of any land other than the land the subject of this contract).

### 62. Entire Agreement

The purchaser acknowledges that the provisions of this contract constitute the full and complete understanding between the parties and that there is no other understanding, agreement, warranty or representation whether express or implied in any way extending, defining or otherwise relating to the provisions of this contract or binding on the parties hereto with respect to any of the matters to which this contract relates despite any negotiations or discussions held or any documents or brochures produced prior to the date of this contract.

### 63. Guarantee

- (a) In consideration of the vendor agreeing to sell the land to the purchaser, the Guarantor guarantees to the vendor the due and punctual payment by the purchaser to the vendor of the Guaranteed Money and performance by the purchaser of the Guaranteed Obligations.
- (b) The Guarantor's obligations in this contract are principal obligations and may be enforced against the Guarantor without the vendor first being required to exhaust any remedy it may have against the purchaser.
- (c) This guarantee is a continuing guarantee. The Guarantor's obligations in this contract are absolute, unconditional and irrevocable. The liability of the Guarantor under this contract extends to and is not affected by any circumstance, act or omission which, but for this subclause, might otherwise affect it at law or in equity.
- (d) For the consideration mentioned in clause 63(a), the Guarantor (as primary obligor) must unconditionally indemnify the vendor against, and must pay the vendor on demand the amount of, any loss that the vendor may incur because:
  - (i) Guaranteed Obligations are unenforceable, or
  - (ii) Guaranteed Money is not recoverable from the purchaser or is repaid after it has been recovered.
- (e) If any Guarantor has not executed this contract, then the vendor may request the purchaser to arrange for each Guarantor to execute a deed of guarantee in substantially the same form as this clause 63 within 14 days of the vendor's request. This clause 63(e) is an essential term of this contract.

#### 64. Credit code

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges the vendor has entered into this contract on the purchaser's warranty that:
  - (i) the purchaser does not require credit in order to pay for the land; or
  - (ii) if the purchaser requires credit in order to pay for the land, the purchaser has obtained such credit on reasonable terms prior to the date of this contract.
- (b) The purchaser shall not have any right to terminate this contract by virtue of any non-availability of credit as at the settlement date.

#### 65. Privacy Act

#### 65.1 Consent

The purchaser consents to its Personal Information being;

- (a) used by the vendor or its Associates:
  - (i) in connection with their business; or
  - (ii) as specified in any applicable privacy statement; and
- (b) disclosed by the vendor or its Associates:
  - (i) if required or permitted by law;
  - (ii) as specified in any applicable privacy statement; and
  - (iii) to any person with whom they deal in connection with their business, including persons who are overseas.

#### 65.2 Collection of information

The purchaser acknowledges and agrees that the vendor and its Associates may collect information about the purchaser set out in this contract or made available to the vendor in relation to this contract and that the vendor and its Associates may disclose that information in relation to this contract to:

- (a) their agents (or prospective agents);
- (b) their financiers or financial advisers (or prospective financiers or financial advisers);
- (c) external service providers (including solicitors, insurers and accountants); and
- (d) any person with whom the vendor or is Associates deals with in connection with their business, including persons who are overseas.

#### 66. Purchaser's warranty that it is not a Prohibited Entity

(a) For the purposes of this clause Prohibited Entity means any person or entity which:

- (i) is a "terrorist organisation" as defined in Part 5.3 of the Criminal Code Act 1995; or
- (ii) is listed by the Minister for Foreign Affairs in the Government Gazette pursuant to Part 4 of the Charter of the United Nations Act 1945 which list as at the date of this contract is available from the website of the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade or such other person or entity on any other list of terrorist or terrorist organisations maintained pursuant to the rules and regulations of the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade or pursuant to any other Australian legislation and which is available in the public domain.
- (b) The purchaser warrants that:
  - (i) as at the date of this contract; and
  - (ii) for the period immediately after the date of this contract up to and including the date for completion,
  - (iii) it is not a Prohibited Entity.
- (c) If the purchaser breaches this warranty it must give the vendor notice of the breach within two business days of becoming aware of the breach.
- (d) If the purchaser breaches this warranty the vendor may terminate this contract by written notice to the purchaser and the provisions of clause 9 shall apply.

#### **67. FIRB**

- (a) The purchaser must on or before the date of this contract notify the vendor of its FIRB status by completing the Tax File Number and FIRB Notification form attached to this contract at Schedule 6.
- (b) The purchaser warrants that the purchaser's FIRB status indicated on the Tax File Number and FIRB Notification form attached to this contract is correct and complete.
- (c) If the purchaser does not indicate that it is a Foreign Resident in accordance with clause 67(a) then the purchaser warrants that FIRB cannot prohibit completion of the transfer of the land to the purchaser under the FIRB Act.
- (d) If for any reason FIRB prohibits the transfer of the land to the purchaser at any time before completion, then:
  - (i) the purchaser must immediately notify the vendor of the prohibition in writing; and
  - (ii) the vendor may terminate the contract by giving written notice to the purchaser at any time after the vendor learns of that prohibition and the provisions of clause 9 shall apply.
- (e) The purchaser indemnifies and will keep indemnified the vendor against all losses, damages, liabilities, claims, costs and expenses incurred by the vendor arising out of any breach of this clause by the purchaser.
- (f) If the vendor becomes liable to pay any fee to any Relevant Authority in connection with the purchaser's acquisition of the land because of the purchaser's

residency, including if the purchaser is a Foreign Resident, the purchaser indemnifies the party who has become liable for that fee and must pay to the vendor the amount of the fee on completion. The obligation under this clause is of the essence of the contract.

(g) This clause does not merge on completion of this contract.

### 68. Display

The vendor may use any allotments (other than the land) in the Estate as a display lot and the purchaser will not make any claim against the vendor because of anything set out in this clause 68.

#### 69. Transfer of Development Lot or land from the vendor to a New Vendor

#### 69.1 Transfer

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges that the vendor may transfer its interest in the Development Lot or the land or any part of the Development Lot or land to a New vendor prior to the date for completion.
- (b) Without limitation the New Vendor may be
  - (i) a related body corporate of the vendor, or
  - (ii) any other entity who may acquire an interest in the Development Lot or land or any part of the Development Lot or land.
- (c) The vendor must give the purchaser written notice is it transfers the Development Lot or land or any part of the Development Lot or land. In the notice, the vendor must provide details of the New Vendor.
- (d) The purchaser and any Guarantor each agree:
  - (i) to the transfer of the land or the Development Lot to the New Vendor;
  - (ii) to the vendor novating this contract to the New Vendor;
  - (iii) to accept on completion a transfer of the land in registrable form duly signed by the New Vendor;
  - (iv) if the purchaser has paid the deposit by deposit-bond, to replace the deposit-bond with a new deposit-bond for the same amount in favour of the New Vendor within seven (7) days after being requested to do so by the vendor.
- (e) If required by the vendor, the purchaser and any Guarantor each agree to enter into a deed of novation to novate this contract from the vendor to the New Vendor. These provisions will apply:
  - (i) the vendor must at its cost prepare the deed of novation; and
  - (ii) the purchaser and the Guarantor must each sign the deed of novation and return it to the vendor within 7 days of receiving it from the vendor, and
  - (iii) the deed of novation may contain a provision releasing the vendor from all or any of its obligations under this contract which are not due for

performance at the date of the novation if the New Vendor assumes those obligations.

- (f) The novation or transfer by the vendor pursuant to this clause to the New Vendor will be valid, binding and effective irrespective of whether or not the purchaser is required to or does not execute any documentation as contemplated by clause 69.1(d).
- (g) The vendor agrees to pay any stamp duty payable upon the novation of this contract.
- (h) The vendor indemnifies the purchaser in the event the purchaser is liable for additional stamp duty in respect of this contract or the transfer of the land to the purchaser (above the stamp duty normally payable by the purchaser) arising as a result of the transfer or novation.
- (i) The purchaser irrevocably appoints the New Vendor and each Authorised Officer of the New Vendor individually as the purchaser's attorney (Attorney) and agrees to ratify anything the Attorney does in relation to the novation.
- (j) In the event of either the purchaser or the Guarantor or both failing to comply with their obligations under this clause the Attorney may do whatever is necessary or convenient to enable the vendor to procure that the purchaser and the Guarantor enter into the deed of novation including the signing of the deed of novation as Attorney for either the purchaser or the Guarantor.

The purpose of the power of attorney is to enable the vendor to transfer its interest to the New Vendor in accordance with its rights pursuant to this clause.

### 70. Adjoining land owned by vendor

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges that whilst the vendor or the New Vendor is the owner of any land adjoining the land, the vendor will not be required to contribute to the cost of any fencing.
- (b) This clause is to apply to any resale of the land by the purchaser.
- (c) This clause does not merge on completion of this contract.

#### 71. Design requirements

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges that the purchaser has seen and accepted the Design Guidelines prior to the entering into of this contract.
- (b) The purchaser shall comply with the Design Guidelines in constructing a Residence upon the land and will ensure that any such Residences do not vary from the Design Guidelines without the consent of the vendor.
- (c) The vendor is entitled to request information, documentation, plans and specifications from the purchaser to ensure that any Residence to be constructed upon the land comply with the Design Guidelines.
- (d) The vendor shall be entitled to amend the Design Guidelines from time to time (acting reasonably) having regard to the requirements of any Relevant Authority, market conditions or any other factors relating to or affecting the Estate being developed by the vendor of which the land forms part.

- (e) The purchaser acknowledges that the Design Guidelines may be the subject of a restriction as to user, covenant or other title affectation on registration of the Draft Plan if required by the vendor, Council or any other Relevant Authority.
- (f) The purchaser will not take any objection nor make any requisition or claim or seek to delay completion by virtue of the creation of any restriction as to user, covenant or title affectation which embodies or refers to the Design Guidelines.
- (g) The purchaser acknowledges that the vendor retains an interest (which will not merge on completion pursuant to this contract) to maintain the standards of the development of the land, Estate and adjoining lands owned or to be owned by the vendor now or in the future and will be entitled to apply for and obtain orders against the purchaser, including the obtaining of an injunction against the purchaser, to ensure that the terms of the Design Guidelines are adhered to.
- (h) The purchaser will indemnify and keep indemnified the vendor from any loss, costs, damages or expenses which arise by virtue of the purchaser not following, adhering to and implementing the Design Guidelines with respect to structures which he is to erect upon the land.
- (i) If the purchaser sells the land before the erection of a Residence upon the land, the purchaser will ensure that the buyer from the purchaser enters into a contract which contains a clause similar to this clause for the benefit of the yendor.
- (j) The provisions of this clause shall not merge on completion of this contract.

#### 72. E - Contract

### 72.1 Electronic execution and consents under Electronic Transactions Act 2000

- (a) Each party consents to this contract being signed by any other party in accordance with an electronic communication method that is approved by the vendor.
- (b) Clause 72.2 does not apply if this contract is exchanged in customary paper form.

## 72.2 Dispensing with counterparts

The parties to this contract agree that, despite any custom, practise or code otherwise followed in respect of contracts for the sale of land, this contract:

- (a) is made on its execution by all parties to it;
- (b) need not be executed and exchanged in counterparts; and
- (c) constitutes an original document in an electronic format.

### 72.3 Vendor may require a paper form contract

- (a) The vendor may require by notice to the purchaser that the purchaser sign a customary paper form contract on substantially the same terms as this contract (Paper Contract).
- (b) If the vendor serve a notice pursuant to clause 72.3(a), the purchaser must sign and deliver to the vendor's solicitor the Paper Contract accompanying that notice within 14 days.

- (c) If the purchaser does not comply with clause 72.3(b), then the purchaser appoints the vendor as its attorney to comply with that clause.
- (d) The parties acknowledge and agree that a Paper Contract is only intended to record the detailed terms of the contract in paper form, and confirm that they intend to be and will be bound by the contract on the date of this document.

#### 73. Mine Subsidence

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges receipt of the certificate from the Subsidence Advisory with respect to the land attached to this contract at Schedule 7 a (Mine Subsidence Certificate).
- (b) The purchaser warrants to the vendor it has satisfied itself prior to the entering into of this contract of all matters relating to mine subsidence and the land and the terms of the Mine Subsidence Certificate and shall not take any objection nor make any requisition nor claim nor seek to delay completion by virtue of the Mine Subsidence Certificate or any matter indicated or referred to in that certificate.

### 74. Contract subject to vendor becoming proprietor

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges that this contract is conditional upon the vendor becoming the registered proprietor of the Development Lot (Condition Precedent).
- (b) The vendor undertakes to do all things reasonable to be able to satisfy the Condition Precedent.
- (c) If the Condition Precedent has not been satisfied by 30 June 2021 then either party may by notice in writing to the other but before the satisfaction of the Condition Precedent rescind this contract, whereupon the provisions of clause 19 shall apply.

## 75. Contract subject to Development Consent

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges that this contract is conditional upon the vendor obtaining development consent in relation to the land, Development Lot and the Estate (Applications).
- (b) The vendor undertakes to lodge and pursue the Applications with all due diligence after the contract date (if not already).
- (c) If the Applications have not been consented to by Council (or any other Relevant Authority), or the terms or conditions of any consent issued with respect to any Applications are not acceptable to the vendor by 30 June 2021, then either party may, by notice in writing to the other but before the issue of a consent which is acceptable to the vendor in respect of the Applications, rescind this contract whereupon the provision of clause 19 shall apply.

#### 76. Finance Condition Precedent

- (a) The purchaser acknowledges that this contract is subject to and conditional upon the vendor obtaining sufficient number of qualifying pre-sales of lots in the Estate.
- (b) To enable the vendor to obtain finance for the purposes of effecting the registration of the Plan creating the land (Finance Conditions Precedent).

(c) If the Finance Conditions Precedent are not satisfied or achieved for any reason by the Presale Commitment Date either party may by notice in writing to the other but prior to satisfaction of the Conditions Precedent rescind this contract, whereupon the provisions of clause 19 shall apply.

### 77. Building Envelope Plans

- (a) The vendor discloses and the purchaser acknowledges that:
  - (i) the land may be subject to a positive covenant in favour of Council requiring any Residence to be designed and constructed on the land to comply with a building envelope plan as required by Council, and
  - (iii) that the purchaser has made their own enquires and satisfied themselves in relation to any Council requirements regarding the design and construction of a Residence on the land.
- (b) The purchaser shall not have any claim against the vendor or be entitled to make any objection nor make any requisition or claim nor seek to delay completion nor to report the vendor to any regulatory authority by virtue of any act, matter or thing relation to the Building Covenant or the provisions of this clause.

#### 78. Retaining structures

#### 78.1 Application of clause

This clause applies to any Retaining Structures that:

- have been constructed on the land (whether wholly or partially) by or on behalf of the vendor as at the contract date; or
- (b) will be constructed on the land by or on behalf of the vendor after the contract date.

### 78.2 Purchaser's obligations

The purchaser must

- (a) not do anything or cause anything to be done to affect the structural integrity of the Retaining Structure; and
- (b) not remove, replace or alter the Retaining Structure; and
- (c) keep and maintain the Retaining Structures on the land in a sound structural condition; and
- (d) repair any damage to the Retaining Structure including any damage to drains or disturbance to backfill cause by the construction of structures (including any fencing) above, adjacent to or near the Retaining Structure.

### 78.3 No objection

Subject to any rights of the purchaser under any relevant legislation which cannot be excluded, the purchaser shall not have any claim against the vendor or be entitled to make any objection nor make any requisition or claim nor seek to delay completion nor to

report the vendor to any regulatory authority by virtue of any act, matter or thing relation to the presence of a Retaining Structure on the land.

#### 78.4 Indemnity

The purchaser is liable for and indemnifies the vendor on demand against all Claims arising from or in connection with:

- (a) any damage to the Retaining Structures caused or contributed to b any act, omission, negligence or default of the purchaser, the purchaser's contractors or any other person acting on the purchaser's behalf; and
- (b) any damage to the purchaser's Residence or structures constructed on the land adjacent to or near the Retaining Structures; and
- (c) any damage to dwellings ot structures constructed on land adjoining or surrounding the land caused or contributed to by any act, omission, negligence or default of the purchaser, the purchaser's contractors or any other person acting on the purchaser's behalf; or
- (d) any failure by the purchaser to comply with its obligations under this clause.

#### 78.5 No merger

This clause does not merge on completion of this contract.

#### 79. Cut and fill

- (a) The vendor discloses and the purchaser acknowledges that the land may contain fill at the time of completion of this contract.
- (b) The purchaser shall not have any claim against the vendor or be entitled to make any objection nor make any requisition or claim nor seek to delay completion nor to report the vendor to any regulatory authority by virtue of any act, matter or thing relation to the presence of fill on the land.

80. This Contract is subject to completion of the Contract for sale between the Vendor and the current registered proprietor ("the Head Contract") on or before the date of completion hereof. In the event that the Head Contract is not completed by the date set therein then either party by notice in writing to the other party's solicitor shall be at liberty to rescind this Contract and thereafter the provisions of Clause 19 hereof shall apply. The purchaser acknowledges that completion of this Contract is to occur simultaneously with the completion of the vendors' purchase of the subject property.

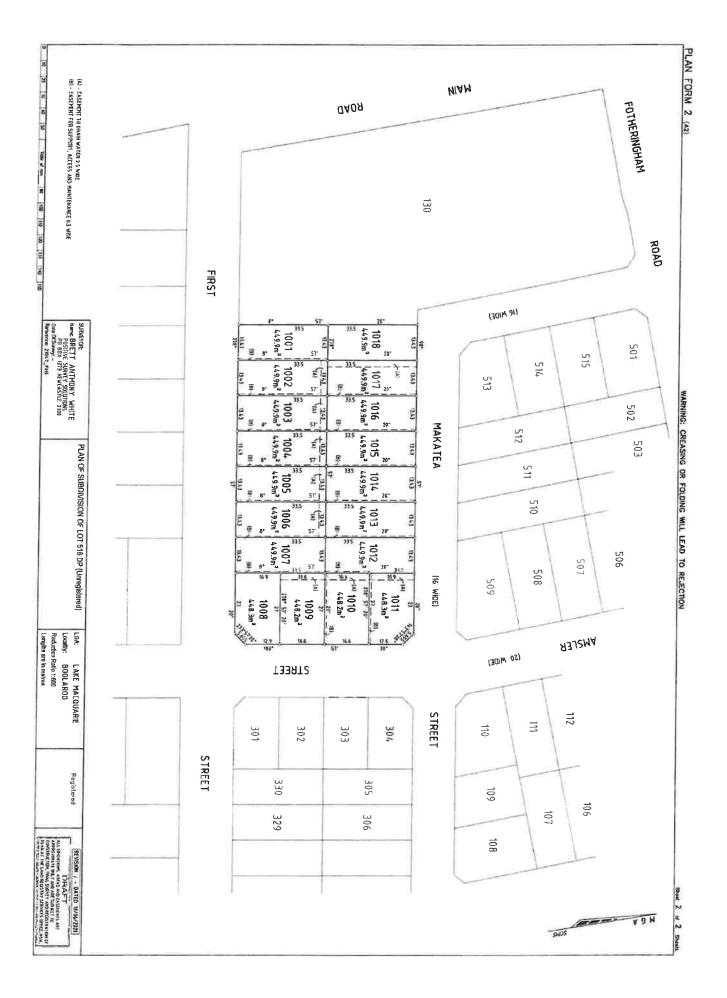

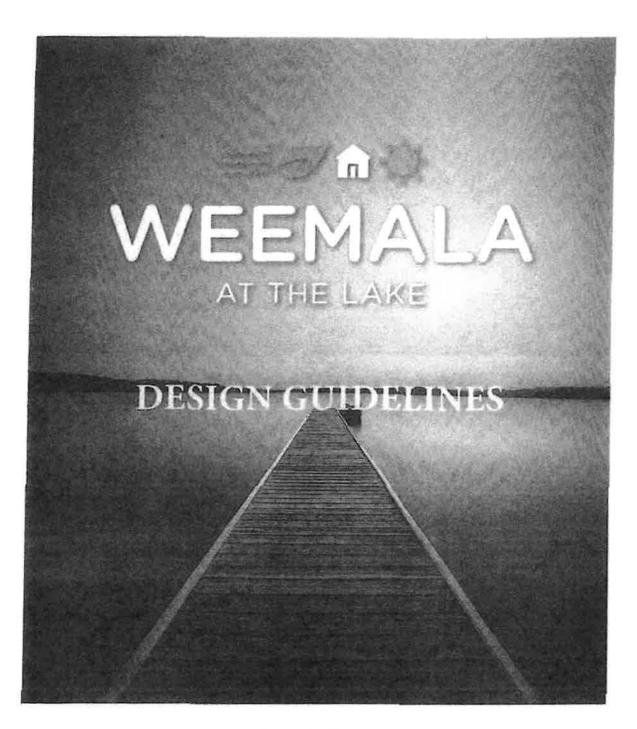

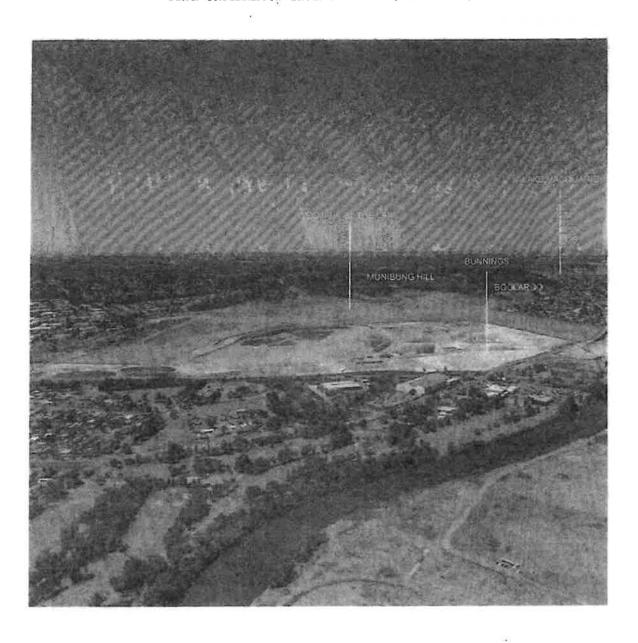

## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

### 1.1 THE PURPOSE

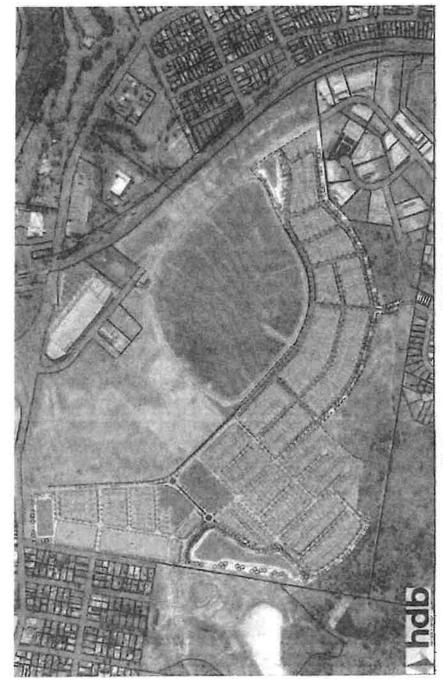
The purpose of this document is to present the development form and standards to guide development in the "Weemala at the Lake" development.

This document has taken the information presented in Lake Macquarie Development Control Plan and sought to interpret this to ensure that the proposed development of Weemala is generally consistent with these principles. The nature and topography of the site requires specific responses that in some circumstances differ from the adopted principles.

There is a strong desire to see the resulting development deliver more than a standard subdivision. Weemala is a site that is at the forefront of the communities consciousness. The final step in the transformation of this site must produce a precinct, a place that delivers on all the promise that the site has to offer.

As such this document represents the developers articulation of the place making principals required for the site. To date this process has resulted in the design and layout of a subdivision which balances the opportunities and constraints of the site to create an engaging and positive contribution to the urban fabric of Lake Macquarie. It is intended that this will continue with further place making exercises to demonstrate how the site specific controls that are included in this document can be combined to deliver an exceptional place to live.

## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

#### 1.2 THE VISION

Weemala at the Lake provides an exemplary example of Master Planning and place making, contributing in a positive way to the surrounding community.

Through Place Making initiatives the area will develop as a community rather then isolated subdivision. Strong connections both physically and socially will be forged between the existing community of Boolaroo and the Weemala development area.

Responding to the site, the built form will provide for a variety of building types and forms, organically generating a development which prioritises function over form and melds with the surrounding neighbourhoods. A key to this is diversity of typology and form. Together with a strong urban theme and central commercial hub.

### 1.3 DEFINITIONS

The following definitions have been adopted for the purpose of this plan

#### Small Lot Housing

Rear-loaded allotments ranging from approximately 300m<sup>2</sup> to 350m<sup>2</sup> are strategically located with immediate access to the mixed-use lots, and landscaped open spaces. These lots will typically accommodate medium density housing, for optimum use of site and central-location.

#### Traditional Lot Housing

Traditional lots typically range from 400m<sup>2</sup> to 500m<sup>2</sup>, allowing adequate space to accommodate common dwelling types, with low-medium density housing.

#### Large Lot Housing

Ranging from 600m<sup>2</sup> and above, these allotments provide larger space to accommodate a size-able dwelling and private open spaces to suit typical suburban lifestyle with greater access to existing services.

## 2.0 APPROVAL PROCESS

#### 2.1 THE PRINCIPLES

Weemala at the Lake seeks to foster innovative built form and the expression of varied architectural forms in the design of homes within the estate.

The design guidelines have been put in place to ensure that the quality and lifestyle for the residents of Weemala at the Lake is maintained, and the integrity, vision and community base is upheld, while still offering flexibility and inspiring personal creativity.

#### 2.2 THE STEPS

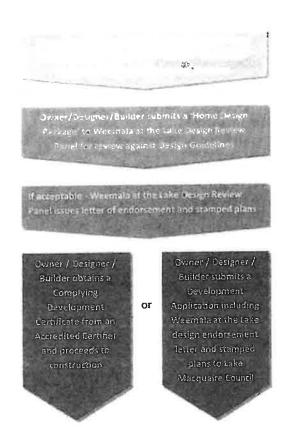
These design guidelines are in addition to statutory and other local authority requirements. Green Capital Group (the Developer) does not warrant that the Lake Macquarie City Council (the local authority) will approve or refuse any house plan, even if it satisfies these Design Guidelines.

You may be able to seek a Complying Development Certificate for your proposed home. You should talk to your builder / designer about this option which may save you time and money. Alternatively you may wish to seek guidance from the Weemala at the Lake Design Review Panel in submitting a development application.

Before you seek a Complying Development Certificate or lodge a Development Application with Lake Macquarie Council, you are required by the Contract of Sale to obtain Design Approval from the Weemala at the Lake Design Review Panel (DRP).

To ensure a great design and smooth design review process, please pass these following technical requirements on to your builder / designer so that a 'Home Design Package' can be prepared for endorsement by the DRP. The key steps are outlined opposite.

You should also make yourself aware of the covenants on the title of your land as these may also affect your design.



## 2.0 APPROVAL PROCESS

### 2.3 THE REQUIREMENTS

Your builder / designer needs to review this document so that a 'Home Design Package' can be prepared for endorsement by the DRP. Design endorsement by the DRP is required before you obtain a Complying Development Certificate or lodge a Development Application with Lake Macquarie Council.

A 'Home Design Package' must include one A3 set of plans comprising the following:

- Site Plan with overall dimensions for all structures; total site and floor area; site coverage; landscape area; all easements and services; dimensioned front, rear and side
- setbacks; vehicle access and levels.
- Floor Plans showing key dimensions; porch dimensions; main building line; garage setback; door and window positions.
- Sections showing dimensioned building heights;
- roof pitch and eaves depth.
- Elevations including all external materials, finishes and colours.
- Landscape Plan (may be shown on Site Plan) showing boundary fencing and or planting; description of planting and location; materials, colours and finishes of hard surfaces such as driveways or paving.
- Any planned retaining walls and or alterations to fencing or retaining walls.

If plans are approved with alterations or more information/ documentation is required, you may resubmit or provide required information within 14 days. If you do not comply, the DRP is able to refuse your application.

If plans are not approved, you may arrange a meeting with DRP consultant Architect/ Planner (HDB Town Planning & Design) to review the application.

When successful endorsement has been achieved, the DRP will issue a letter of endorsement with stamped plans for you to obtain a Complying Development Certificate or lodge a Development Application with Lake Macquarie City Council. This process will normally take 3 to 5 days to complete.

If the DRP cannot resolve an issue, the matter will be submitted to Council.

#### 2.4 VARIATIONS

Variations to these guidelines may be considered on merits. Where a variation is sought the applicant will need to demonstrate how the variation exceeds the desired objectives and presents a superior outcome to that which this document envisages.

## 3.0 SITE DESIGN

### Objectives

- To define a building envelope for each housing type
- Ensure that the building envelope allows for flexible architectural expression
- Allow for separation of housing to maintain privacy and solar access

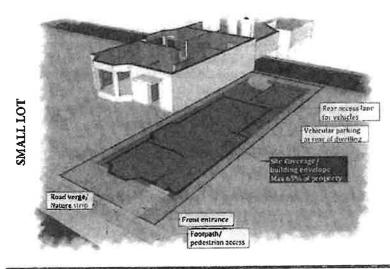
- The maximum site coverage will be 50%
- Small Lot Housing may vary this up to 65%

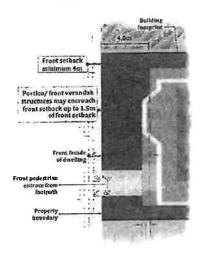
### Front Setback

- All housing forms shall be set back 4m
- Portico structures may encroach up to 0.5m into the front setback. For small lot housing, this may be varied up to 1.5m in to the front setback for a maximum 50% of the building width.

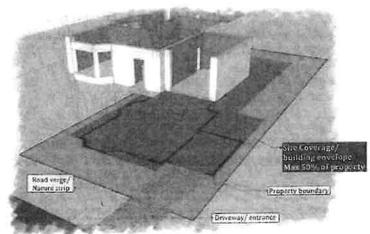

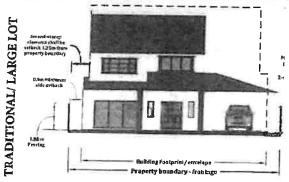
- Single storey elements shall be setback 0.9m from the boundary

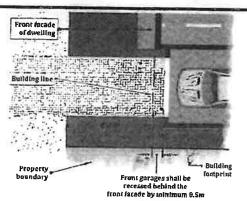

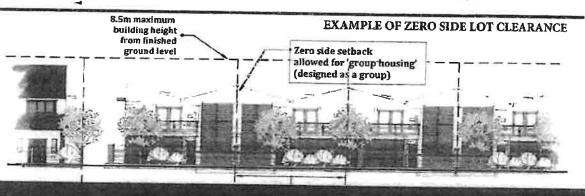
- Small Lot Housing shall access garages from the rear lane (No vehicle access to lots is permitted from primary road frontage)

#### LANDSCAPING

All landscaping must be consistent with the approved landscaping plans

#### ARCHITECTURAL

- Building must be designed by a Registered Designer,
   Architect or DRP approved builder
- The facade of a dwelling shall not be substantially the same as another facade within three lots adjacent to or across the street
- The primary entry must be via the front facade
- Design elements should be used to define and articulate the entry
- Secondary street front addresses must be articulated where visible
- All services shall be hidden from public view including but not limited to
  - satellite dishes
  - air conditioning systems
  - solar hot water systems
  - cloths lines

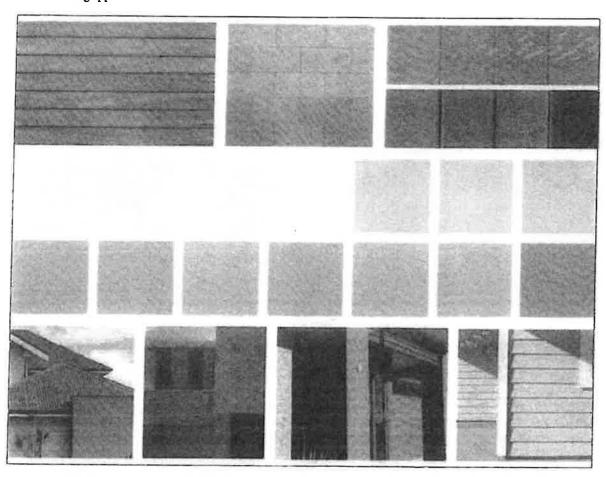

- Materials and colours should generally be natural and muted

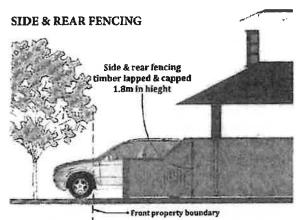

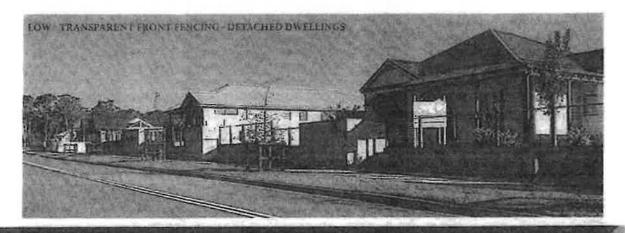
#### FENCING

#### No fence shall

- 1. Exceed 1.8m in height; or
- 2. Be constructed of materials and style other than:
- Brick
- Masonry
- Lap and capped timber
- Such other materials as may be approved in writing by Greencapital Aust P/L
- Colourbond Fencing will only be considered in asset protection zones and where proposed, the colour of Colourbond fencing must be recessive and neutral
- All fencing shall finish at or before the building line
- Front fencing at building line shall be maximum 1.2m high and 50% transparent

- To ensure subsequent usage does not detract from the general standard and value of the development.

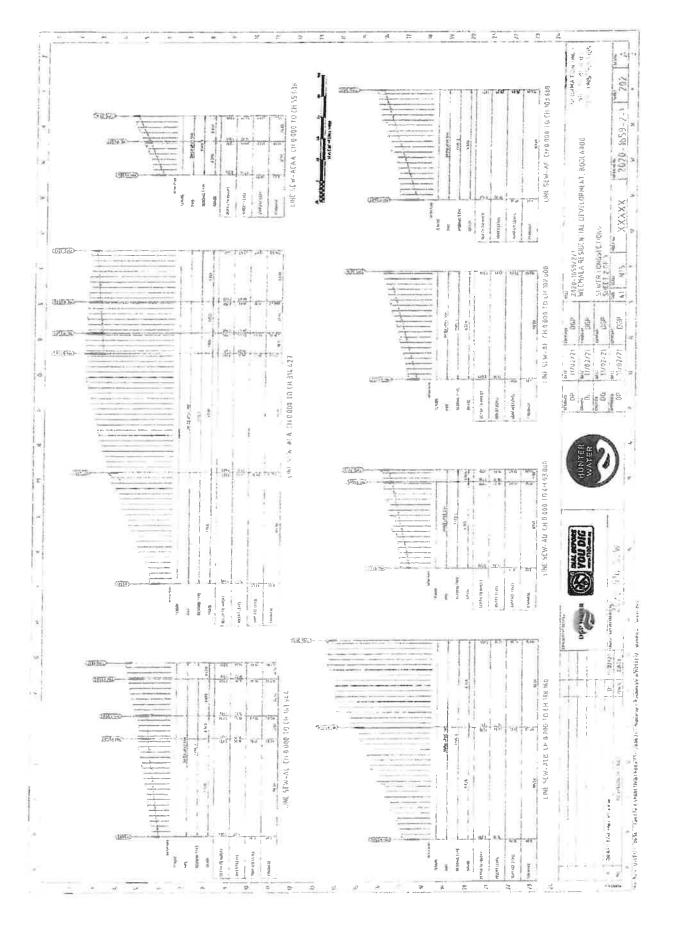
Schedule 8 Hunter Water Proposed Sewer Location Plans

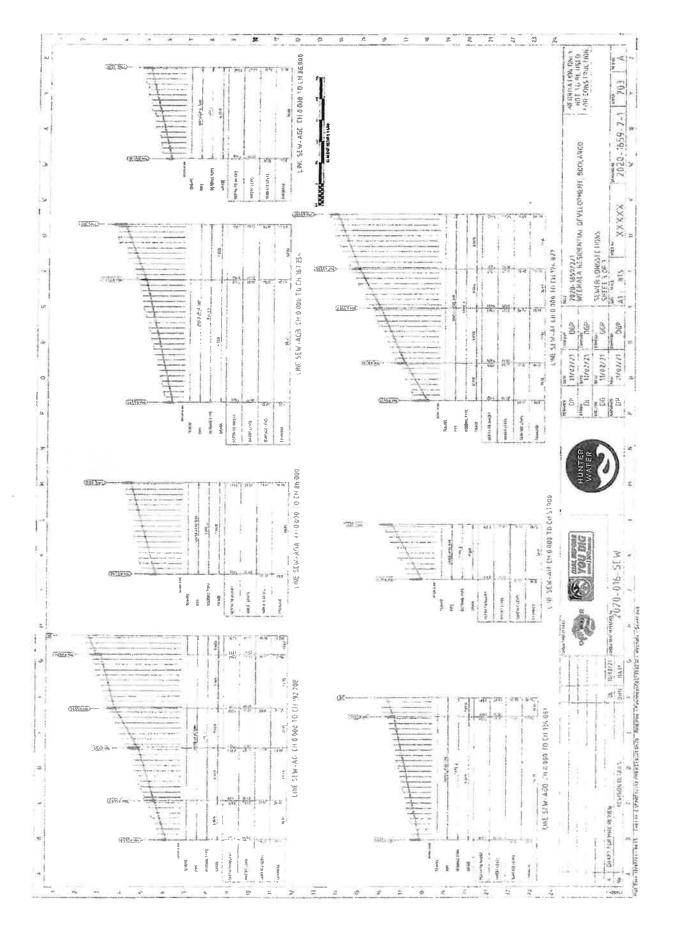


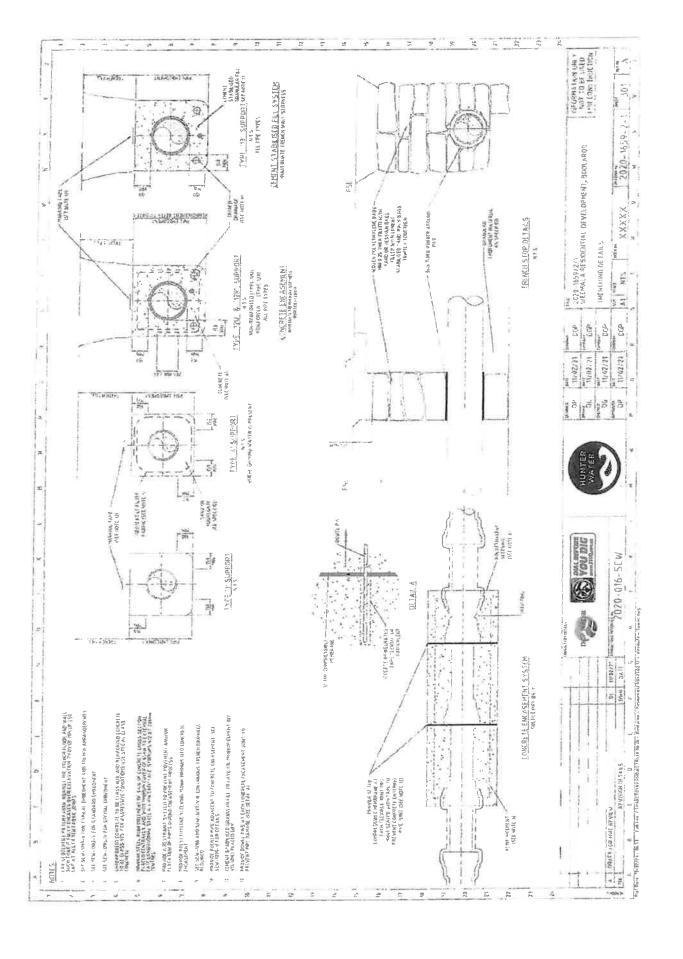
