APPLES

Apple Liberty MM106

(Early Feb) around March



This apple can only be classed as a 10. The skin is red blushed and the flesh crisp and juicy with a good balance between sweet and tart flavours. Very good for fresh eating. Abundant cropper, disease resistant and self fertile. Ripe around March. From the USA, 1978. Deciduous.

Apple Granny Smith MM106 (April/May)



Everyone knows this classic bright green apple with its tangy flavour and crisp white flesh. Bake it, sauce it, slice it, caramelise it, but most of all, simply bite into it. Keeps well. A productive regular tip bearer maturing later in April. You've got to love your Granny.

Developed quite by accident by 'Granny' Smith of New South Wales around 1868 and introduced commercially around 1900. 'Granny Smith' flowers and fruit are produced on the branch tips - be mindful of this when pruning.

Tip bearing. Juicy & crisp when tree-ripened. A great apple which stores 15 weeks plus. Recommended as a pollinator. Australia, 1868.

Captain Kidd (Ripens March/April)

Description: Captain Kidd is a wonderful eating apple, a better coloured form of Kidd's Orange Red. A beautful yellow ground colour flushed red with stripes and russet. Creamy white flesh that's crisp and juicy with a sweet, aromatic flavour. Large, dark pink blossom appears during the spring. A good alternative to Cox and much easier to grow. A healthy tree with it's mildew resistance.

History: Developed in New Zealand. The original Kidd's Orange Red was raised by J.H. Kidd at Greytown, Wairarapa, New Zealand in 1924. Introduced to the UK in 1932.



PLUMS

• Billington Early (Dec / Jan)

Billington PO051-5C \$36 A plum with dark red skin and flesh which is good for eating and jam making. The fruit ripen in early January and pollinators include Black Doris & Omega.

• Luisa (Jan/ Feb)

Virtually freestone, very juicy fruit with yellow flesh and skin, shaped similar to a mango. Exceptional eating quality with sweet aromatic flavour. Best grown in open sunny aspect. Feed with Kings Citrus and Fruit Tree Fertiliser. Stake firmly when planting. Grows 5m. Self fertile but pollination can be with Billington or Elephant Heart

• Black Doris (Mid Feb)

Black Doris PO076-5C \$36 Medium to large fruit; ready in late Jan. It has black skin and dark red flesh. Excellent for dessert and bottling. Pollinate with Billington, Duff's Early Jewel or Santa Rosa.

PEAR (Espalier)

To produce high quality trees that yield well, our pears are grown as double-worked trees. This is a quince rootstock with an inter stem (double worked rods). Mature height 3-4m.

Beurre Bosc (Mid April)

Beurre Bosc PH100-5C \$36 Fruit is med/large and coloured with golden, cinnamon russet. The flesh is yellowish white, very juicy with a rich sweet, piquant flavour and pleasing aroma. Can be cool stored for up to 4 months. Pollinates with Winter Nelis

Winter Nelies (May)

Winter Nelis PH800-5C \$36 A late-season pear ripening in March with regular crops. A long-keeping, dessert-quality pear with a light russet skin. Pollinate: Conference or WBC.



This is a nice small pear with yellow-green skin that is lightly russeted. The flesh is quite firm with a fine texture and good flavour. Sweet and juicy. Good for fresh eating or preserving. Produces good reliable crops. Deciduous.

Pollinators - Beurre Bosc, Doyenne du Comice, or Williams bon Chretein

Conference (ripens Feb – March)

Green skin with some rusting, self fertile, Heavy regular cropper

CHERRY

Compact Stella (late Dec / Jan)

Stella CG216-5 \$36 Maturing late, around Christmas. A large, dark red fruit. Firm flesh, mildly sub-acid. Self-fertile and a great pollinator.

Modesto

Medium sized rich red fruit produced in abundance at Christmas time. The excellent firm red flesh has a memorable flavour. Feed and prune annually for best results. Use fresh or use for jams, jellies, preserves or desserts. Would need to be pollinated with another variety such as Stella or Lapins.

NECTARINE

Nectarine Goldmine



An enduring favourite, this variety has fruit that ripen in mid February. The medium sized fruit have mainly red over green skin. The flesh is white, freestone, juicy and aromatic. Good dessert and fresh eating variety. Vigorous and highly productive tree. Self Fertile. Very sweet white flesh, dessert quality. Red skin over green, ripens in February.

PEACH

Blackboy

Medium sized late variety of peach. Sweet flavoured port wine flesh and dark furry skin with rich purplish red veined flesh. Great for dessert and bottling, colourful and flavoursome.

APRICOT

Apricots Grown on a plum rootstock, mature height 3-4m.

Fitzroy AR149-5 \$36 Originating quite close to the beach in New Plymouth, so it appears suitable for mild winter areas. As the original tree was isolated it appears to be self-fertile. A consistent and heavy cropping tree with fruit ripening in February.

QUINCE

Taihape (Matures Feb = March)

Prolific Yellow Fruit, seemingly fungal resistant.

CITRUS

MANDERINE

Okitsu

Satsumaea easy peel type. Large early. Fruit with high sugar content and mild flavour. Strongest growing of Satsuma

An early Satsuma mandarin with very sweet, easy peel fruit that is seedless unless cross-pollinated. Ripens May-August. Sun and frost hardy, ideal for container growing. 2m mature height, 1.5 width.
