Terms of Engagement

By engaging Canterbury Property Reports Ltd to undertake a building report / property inspection, you agree to the following terms of engagement.

You have instructed Canterbury Property Reports Ltd ("CPR") to carry out an inspection of a property and provide you with a written property inspection report.

You acknowledge and agree that:

- the primary purpose of the inspection is to locate any major defects or issues and to provide you with independent information regarding the condition or state of the property at the time of the inspection so that you can make an informed decision; and
- most properties have minor defects or issues that will need attention. These are often a matter of personal subjectivity and it is not CPR's intention, nor your requirement of us to detail every minor defect observed.

General Scope of Inspection and Report

The general condition of the property will be assessed based on a visual, non-invasive inspection of the components of the property that were readily available, safe and easily accessible at the time of the inspection. The inspection will not include any service items concealed behind walls or joinery (such as plumbing, drainage, wiring, heating, framing, ventilation, insulation or structural members) or which require moving (such as floor coverings, joinery items, furniture, appliances, personal property, vegetation, vehicles, debris or soil).

The builders report is not a substitute for a full Electrical, Plumbing, Drainage Assessment or report nor do we comment on the functions of specialist services such as Alarms, Solar power, Solar water, smoke alarms, whiteware, Kitchen appliances or any other services deemed to be unique to the property. We recommend seeking independent advice and checks by the correct / suitably qualified tradesman or service persons. CPR only provide basic visual inspections for obvious significant damage and provide basic tests to plumbing and electrical items where easily accessible at the time of the inspection.

The observations, comments, evaluations, and conclusions in our report are drawn from visual evidence. No destructive or invasive testing will be undertaken unless specifically referred to in the report. At no time during the inspection will any personal items, furniture or furnishings be moved to gain access to floor or ceiling access hatches. If these areas are unable to be accessed it will be noted in the report and a re-inspection will need to be booked if requested. Any extra inspection will incur a minimum extra cost of \$150.00 Incl GST. It is up to the client to make sure sufficient access hatches are available for our inspectors on the day of the inspection. We will inform the client of this and also request that the person in charge of the property (i.e Agent or other) to have access hatches ready for the inspection.

General Inspection and Report Limitations

You must disclose to CPR if the property that you wish for us to report on is / or has been an "As Is, Where Is" property at any stage of its life. Please refer to the "As Is" Property Information Annexure to determine whether or not this requirement applies.

You must also disclose to CPR if the dwelling / property has sustained significant Earthquake damage and or has had significant earthquake repairs completed. And also, if significant repairs have not been completed. CPR may not be able to provide accurate independent conclusions or informed opinions if repair documentation or any contributing information is not disclosed or provided. We must also me made aware if current EQC or similar disputes

have noted been settled or if the dwelling has had previous botched repairs. Buying or owning any building involves some risk. Even the most thorough and comprehensive inspection cannot be expected to reveal every condition you may consider relevant without disassembling the building. Not everything can be known about a building from a visual inspection.

Buildings are commonly subject to ongoing damage due to design and product failure, wear and tear, deterioration, general accidents, earthquakes, fire, landslides, water penetration, floods, wind driven rain, leaks, snow, ground movement and settlement, additions and extensions, new installations and poor building and services works. The report therefore relates to the condition of the property at the time of the inspection only.

The report will not identify all past, present or likely defects, nor will it mention whether defects are earthquake related. A lot of time has passed since the main Canterbury earthquakes. This makes it difficult to identify the time or cause of any related defects. Descriptions in the report of the systems or appliances relate to the existence only of such systems or appliances and not to adequacy or life expectancy. Any area or component of the building, item or system not specifically identified in the report as having been inspected was excluded from the scope of the inspection.

The inspection will not assess compliance with the New Zealand building code NZS 3604 for any construction work undertaken prior to 1993, including the New Zealand weather tightness code E2, or any structural aspects other than as commented in the report. We will not inspect and will not comment in the report on geological stability, soil conditions, underground services and life expectancy of materials. The report does not include the structural engineering state of the building/s or property.

The report should not be construed as a full weather tightness assessment as no invasive investigation methods will be undertaken during the inspection, unless otherwise agreed with CPR and the property owner.

Terms and Conditions

1. DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 "CPR" means Canterbury Property Reports Limited (NZBN 9429046430472)
- 1.2 "Customer" shall mean the customer/purchaser or any person or company acting or purporting to act on behalf of and with the authority of the customer/purchaser or any person requesting the report from CPR.
- 1.3 "Price" shall mean the cost of the Products as agreed between the Company and the Customer pursuant to clause 5.5 and includes all disbursements, but subject to clauses 5.2 and 5.3 of these terms and conditions.
- 1.4 "Report" shall mean the electronic inspection report produced by CPR relating to the subject property.

2. ACCEPTANCE

2.1 Any instructions received and expressly accepted (either in writing or verbally) by CPR from you for the supply of a Report (once accepted by CPR) constitute a binding contract and acceptance by the Customer of the terms and conditions contained herein.

3. PRICE

- 3.1 The Price payable for the Report by the Customer shall be as agreed in writing or verbally between the Customer and CPR at the time of acceptance of these terms and conditions. The standard pricing structure is based on the cost of inspecting a standard four bedroom dwelling with two bathrooms and one lounge room, subject to:
- a. an additional fee of (from) \$150.00 including GST for the review and comment on

documentation relating to "As Is, Where Is" properties (see above); and b. an additional fee of \$120.00 including GST per hour for any additional reporting required or necessitated due to access limitations identified at the time of the initial inspection; and c. an additional fee of \$50 including GST (per room) if the dwelling includes any additional rooms over and above the standard dwelling referred to above (including, but not limited to offices, media rooms, additional family rooms and sleepouts / additional garages); and d. an hourly rate of \$120.00 Including GST per hour will be applied for re-inspections and amendments to the initial report as needed if CPR is required to re-attend the property for any reason.

- e. an additional fee of \$70.00 including GST if the Customer requires the Report to be delivered in paper format.
- d. Our advertised report prices are based on a maximum property size, being 4 bedroom, 2 bathrooms and 1 living area, and does not include additional out buildings such as sleepouts or additional garages.
- e. Properties older than 1950's may require an individual quote due specialist equipment and additional time needed.
- f. Property's with directly fixed monolithic cladding systems will be subject to a risk review and will require individual pricing.
- 4. PAYMENT
- 4.1 Unless otherwise agreed, payment of the Price for the Report is required to be made in full before CPR will release the Report to the Customer.

- 5. LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY
- 5.1 The contents of the Report are valid for 30 days from the date of the inspection.
- 5.2 The Report is prepared solely for the Customer. Accordingly, (but subject to the limitations stated below) CPR's liability in respect of the contents of the Report is limited solely to the Customer. CPR disclaims all responsibility and accepts no liability to any other party for anything done or not done in reliance on the Report.
- 5.3 CPR does not accept liability or responsibility for any information supplied to it by third parties that may appear in the Report.
- 5.4 Except as otherwise provided by statute, CPR and its agents shall not be liable for any loss or damage of any kind whatsoever, arising from the contents of the Report (including but not limited to any defect identified or un-identified in the inspection and/or Report; any claim, defence or any other legal cost which is directly or indirectly caused by, or in connection to, or arises directly or indirectly out of the actions or effects of mould, fungi, mildew, rot, decay, gradual degradation, micro-organisms, bacteria, protozoa or any similar or like forms in any building or structure; or the failure of the building/s or structure to meet or conform to the requirements of the New Zealand Building Act 2004 and associated regulations and the New Zealand Building Code. Further, CPR shall not be liable to the

Customer for any consequential loss whether suffered or incurred by the Customer or another person and whether in contract or otherwise and irrespective of whether such loss or damage arises directly or indirectly from the Report supplied to the Customer.

5.5 CPR and its agents shall not be liable to the Customer for any loss or damage occasioned to the dwelling (whether as a result of invasive testing or otherwise) in the process of undertaking the inspection for the purposes of producing the Report. Acceptance of these terms and conditions by the Customer shall constitute an unlimited waiver of the Customer's right to bring a claim against CPR for any such loss or damage suffered by the Customer.

5.6 The Customer shall indemnify CPR and its agents against all claims and loss of any kind whatsoever however caused or arising and without limiting the generality of the foregoing of this clause whether caused or arising as a result of negligence of CPR or otherwise, brought by any person in connection with any matter, act, omission, or error by the Company, their agents (including solicitors) or employees in connection with the Report. 5.7 The Consumer Guarantees Act 1993, the Fair Trading Act 1986 and other statutes may imply warranties or conditions or impose obligations upon CPR which cannot by law (or which can only to a limited extent by law) be excluded or modified. 6.3 The Customer agrees that they will not forward the Report to any third parties in the event of the Customer selling the subject property, or otherwise

7. CANCELLATION

- 7.1 The Customer may cancel an inspection no less than 48 hours before the inspection is due to commence. If the inspection is cancelled less than 48 hours before the inspection is due to commence, the Customer will be required to pay a \$100.00 cancellation fee.
- 7.2 The Customer is obligated to provide safe access to all areas of the property that need to be inspected. If the Customer fails to provide a safe environment, the inspector has the unrestricted right to refuse to undertake an inspection of the property/ area. The inspector has the unrestricted right to cancel an inspection if he/she feels that there is a threat to his/her safety. A \$100.00 cancellation fee will be charged to the Customer if the property is un-safe to inspect. The Customer will then be required to re-book an inspection, once the property is safe and secure enough for the inspector to complete the inspection.
- 8. WARRANTY
- 8.1 CPR does not provide any warranty in respect of the contents of the Report.
- 9. MISCELLANEOUS
- 9.1 CPR shall not be liable for delay or failure to undertake the inspection of produce the

Report if the cause of the delay or failure is beyond CPR's control.

- 9.2 Failure by CPR to enforce any of these terms and conditions shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any of the rights or obligations that CPR has under these terms and conditions.
- 9.3 Where these terms and conditions are contrary with any instruction received from the Customer, these terms and conditions shall prevail.

- 10.2 The Customer acknowledges that dwellings of this sort pose unique risks as a result of (without limitation) incorrect installation, and materials that are susceptible to comparatively fast deterioration.
- 10.3 The inspection undertaken by CPR will be undertaken to the best of CPR's knowledge, skill and ability, having regard to all relevant factors, but limited to the extent that:
- a. no comment will be made in respect of any maintenance or repair that has been undertaken following the date of initial installation of the materials;
- b. no invasive testing will be undertaken unless the Customer specifically requests CPR to do so. Accordingly, no comment will be made as to the condition of the framing or other elements of the construction of the dwelling behind the cladding unless an invasive test is authorised;
- c. regard is only given to the state of the dwelling at the time of the inspection; and d. otherwise in accordance with these terms and conditions.
- EQC / Engineers Documentation Review Terms of Engagement

An EQC documentation review is a visual review of repairs to a dwelling that have been completed inline the associated EQC repair documentation (or alike) as provided by the client.

Please Note: As we are now many years on from the Canterbury Quakes it cannot be confirmed if minor cosmetic items are earthquake related / have not been repaired as all properties are subject to typical movement, racking, expansion and contraction, general wear, weathering and ground movement.

The review process does not include any invasive or destructive investigations.

CPR take no responsibility for sourcing the required documentation for a property that is to be inspected.

CPR will review the provided documentation and visually inspect the dwelling to the best of our ability.

Floor Levels:

The aim of the floor level assessment is to understand if there is any minor or major floor level issues. levels are taken in each corner of the room and to the center of the room where accessible. For larger rooms we take measurements approx. 2 meters apart. Floor levels are annotated in photos for each room and will not be produced on a floor plan of the dwelling unless a floor plan has been provided by the client. Floor plans can be created by CPR if required for an additional cost of \$200 Incl GST. If floor slopes are indicated in a floor level assessment, further and more accurate investigations are recommended and in some cases an engineer's involvement may be needed. CPR do not measure the distance between heights that have been plotted in the floor level assessment unless we deem necessary.
