Due diligence checklist

What you need to know before buying a residential property

Before you buy a home, you should be aware of a range of issues that may affect that property and impose restrictions or obligations on you, if you buy it. Moving to the inner city?

High density areas are attractive for their entertainment and service areas, but these activities create increased traffic as well as noise and odours from businesses and people. Familiarising yourself with the character of the area will give you a balanced understanding of what to expect.

If the property is part of a subdivision with common property such as driveways or grounds, it may be subject to an owners corporation. You may be required to pay fees and follow rules that restrict what you can do on your property, such as a ban on pet ownership.

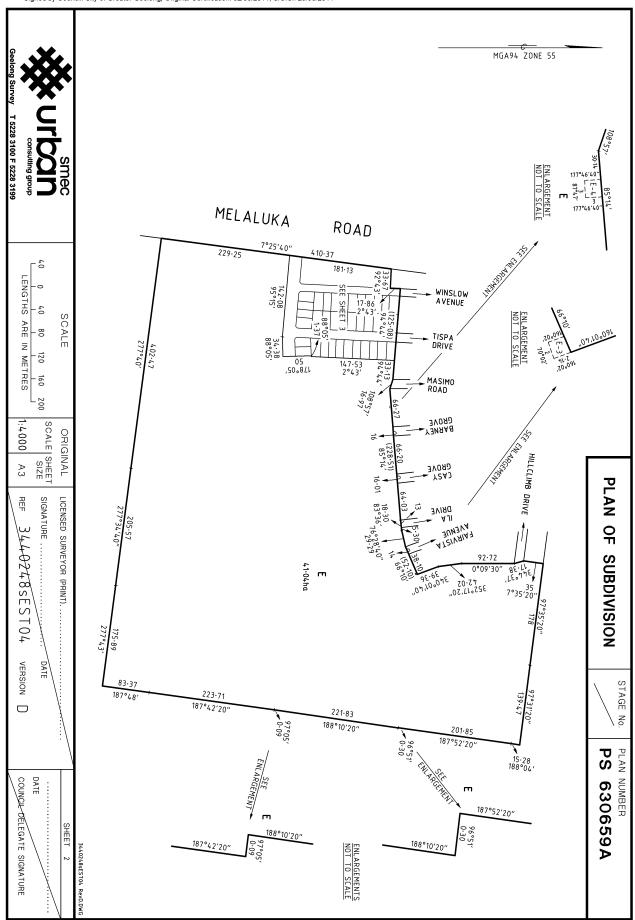

THIS AGREEMENT is made on the 14 day of 0 tober 2008

PARTIES:

- GREATER GEELONG CITY COUNCIL of Municipal Offices of 30 Gheringhap Street, Geelong in the State of Victoria ("the Council"); and
- LEOPOLD PROPERTY DEVELOPMENTS PTY LTD (ACN 119 868 567) of Level 23, 101
 Collins Street, Melbourne in the State of Victoria ("the Owner").

WHEREAS:

- A. The Council is the Responsible Authority pursuant to the Act for the Planning Scheme.
- B. The Owner is or is entitled to be registered as the registered proprietor of the Subject Land.
- C. The Responsible Authority has prepared and exhibited Amendment C139 to the Planning Scheme which proposes to amend the Planning Scheme to rezone the Subject Land from Farming Zone to part Residential 1 Zone and part Public Park and Recreation Zone to allow the Development of the Subject Land by the Owner (Amendment) ..
- D. To facilitate the Development and advance the objectives of planning in Victoria, the Owner and the Council have agreed to enter into this Agreement.
- E. The Subject land is mortgaged by mortgage number AE480985M registered to Capital Finance Australia Ltd on 13 July 2006. As evidenced by the terms of its consent on the execution pages of this agreement, Capital Finance Australia Ltd agrees to be bound by the terms of this agreement.
- F. The Council and the Owner have agreed that without limiting or restricting their respective powers to enter into this Agreement and is so far as it can be treated, this Agreement is made pursuant to Section 173 of the Act.

THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. DEFINITIONS

In this agreement the words and expressions set out in this clause have the following meanings unless the context admits otherwise:

- 1.1. "Act" means the Planning and Environment Act 1987 (Vic).
- 1.2. "Additional Area" means unencumbered land that Council requires the Owner to transfer to it for open space purposes in excess of the Open Space Area, being 10% of the Developable Area as specified in Clause 1.1.8.
- 1.3. **"Agreement"** means this Agreement and any agreement executed by the parties expressed to be supplemental to this Agreement.
- 1.4. "Amendment" means the amendment to the Planning Scheme described in Recital C.
- 1.5. "Catchment Area" means any area of land that drains to or through the Subject Land.
- 1.6. "Council" means the Greater Geelong City Council as the Planning Authority and the Responsible Authority for the Planning Scheme and any subsequent person or body which is the Planning Authority and / or the Responsible Authority for the Planning Scheme.

- 1.7. "Developable Area" means all of the Subject Land, other than areas identified in the Development Plan as required for the transmission or detention of storm water for drainage purposes.
- 1.8. "Development" means the development of the Subject Land generally in accordance with the Development Plan.
- 1.9. "Development Plan" means the development plan contemplated by the Schedule to the Development Plan Overlay of the Planning Scheme introduced to the Planning Scheme by the Amendment.
- 1.10. "Drainage Costs" means the reasonable and commensurate costs incurred in relation to construction of the External Drainage Works.
- 1.11. "External Drainage Works" means the reasonable drainage works to be undertaken within the Catchment Area so as to permit the drainage of the Subject Land in accordance with and to the satisfaction of the lawful requirements of the relevant authority.
- 1.12. "Footpath" means the footpath to be constructed:
 - 1.12.1. within the Melaluka Road reserve to the north of the Subject Land for a length of approximately 850 metres; from the northwest corner of the subject land to the south east corner of the intersection of Warrawee Road and Melaluka Road and being between 1.5 to 1.8 metres in width and in accordance with a survey and design undertaken by the Owner and approved by the Council (Warrawee Footpath); and
 - 1.12.2. in Melaluka Road adjacent to the Subject Land to a width of between 1.5 to 1.8 metres (**Subject Land Footpath**).
- 1.13. "Footpath Sum" means 50% of the reasonable costs incurred or payable in relation to construction of Warrawee Footpath referred to in clause 1.11.1 and 100% of the cost of Subject Land Footpath referred to in clause 1.11.2.
- 1.14. "Internal Drainage Works" means the drainage works within the Subject Land, lawfully required by the relevant authority to drain the Subject Land having regard to the proposed zoning and intended use and development of the Subject Land following approval of the Amendment.
- 1.15. "Law" means any law, act, ordinance, regulation, by-law, order or proclamation and includes the requirements of any municipal or statutory body or of any permit or approval affecting the Subject Land.
- 1.16. "Market Value" has the meaning given in Section 40 of Part 4 of the Land Acquisition and Compensation Act 1986 (Vic), provided that:
 - 1.16.1. For the purpose of establishing Market Value the Subject Land shall be treated as en globo land;
 - 1.16.2. The methodology specified in Section 41 (3) of Part 4 of the Land Acquisition and Compensation Act 1986 (Vic) shall be applied in the determination of the Market Value of the Additional Area.
- 1.17. "Minister" means the minister responsible for administering the Act.
- 1.18. "Open Space Area" means that part or parts of the Developable Area that is being provided by the Owner for open space purposes to satisfy Council's requirement for 10% of the Developable Area to be provided for use as open space.

- 1.19. "Open Space Landscape Master Plan means the plan prepared and forming part of the approved Development Plan (and as amended from time to time) and which details the location of the sporting ovals, future pavilion, carpark and drainage works associated with the sub-regional reserve located in the south-west corner of the Subject Land.
- 1.20. "Owner" means Leopold Property Developments Pty Ltd ACN 119 868 567 being the person now registered by the Registrar of Titles as the proprietor of an estate in fee simple in the Subject Land and the person or persons who subsequently from time to time are registered or entitled to be registered by the Registrar of Titles as proprietor or proprietors in an estate in fee simple in the Subject Land or any part of it.
- 1.21. "Plan of Subdivision" means a plan of subdivision in a form acceptable to the Council that subdivides the Subject Land. The Subject Land may be subdivided in stages.
- 1.22. "Planning Scheme" means the Greater Geelong Planning Scheme.
- 1.23. "Relevant Stage" means the stage shown on the Plan of Subdivision which includes the Open Space Area or the Additional Area, or any part of the Open Space Area or Additional Area.
- 1.24. "Residential Lot" means a lot intended to be finally developed with a dwelling. It does not include a superlot, balance lot or the like which is intended to be further subdivided.
- 1.25. "Statement of Compliance" means a statement of compliance for the Plan of Subdivision issued by the Council under section 21 of the Subdivision Act 1988 (Vic).
- 1.26. "Subject Land" means all of the land contained in Certificate of Title Volume 10952 Folio 041 and known as 251-391 Melaluka Road, Leopold.
- 1.27. "Tribunal" means the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal established under the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal Act 1998 (Vic).

2. INTERPRETATION

In this Agreement unless the context admits otherwise:

- 2.1. the singular includes the plural and vice versa.
- 2.2. a reference to a gender includes a reference to each other gender.
- 2.3. a reference to a person includes a reference to a firm, corporation or other corporate body and that person's successors in law.
- 2.4. if a party consists of more than one person this Agreement binds them jointly and each of them severally.
- 2.5. a word or expression used in this Agreement has its ordinary meaning unless that word or expression is defined in this Agreement. If a word or expression is not defined in this Agreement and it is defined in the Act or the Planning Scheme it has the meaning as defined in the Act or the Planning Scheme. If defined in both the Act and the Planning Scheme it has the meaning as defined in the Planning Scheme.

- 2.6. any reference to an Act, Regulation or the Planning Scheme includes any Acts, Regulations or amendments amending, consolidating or replacing the Act, Regulation or Planning Scheme.
- the introductory clauses to this Agreement are and will be deemed to form part of this Agreement.
- 2.8. the obligations of the Owner under this Agreement, will take effect as separate and several covenants which are annexed to and run to law and equity with the Subject Land PROVIDED THAT if and when the Subject Land is subdivided, this Agreement must be read and applied so that each subsequent owner of a lot is only responsible for those covenants and obligations which relate to that owner's lot (if any).

3. COVENANTS OF THE OWNER

- 3.1. Within 28 days after the issue of a Statement of Compliance for the subdivision that creates the 100th Residential Lot on the Subject Land, the Owner must:
 - 3.1.1. complete construction of the Warrawee Footpath; and
 - 3.1.2. issue the Council with a tax invoice for the Footpath Sum and in accordance with the GST requirements of clause 13.
- 3.2. The Owner must complete the staged construction of the Subject Land Footpath to the satisfaction of the Council not later than the date upon which the Council issues a Statement of Compliance for the corresponding stage of a plan of subdivision which creates Residential Lots.
- 3.3. Prior to the issue of the final Statement of Compliance to be issued that creates Residential Lots within the Development, the Owner must complete construction of the External Drainage Works.
- 3.4. The Open Space Area shall transfer to the Council upon the registration of the Plan of Subdivision or, if the subdivision of the Subject Land is staged, upon registration of the Relevant Stage or stages of which the Open Space Area forms part.
- 3.5. Subject to clause 3.6 the Additional Area shall transfer to the Council upon the registration of the Plan of Subdivision or, if the subdivision of the Subject Land is staged, upon registration of the Relevant Stage or stages of which the Additional Area forms part.
- 3.6. Despite clause 3.5, the Owner is not obliged to transfer the Additional Area to the Council until the Council has paid the Market Value of the Additional Area to the Owner.
- 3.7. The Owner must, at its cost, undertake the Internal Drainage Works.
- 3.8. The Owner must to the satisfaction of the Council, and not later than the date upon which the Council issues a Statement of Compliance for the plan of subdivision which creates Residential Lots in the final stage of the Development, complete at its cost the development of the sub-regional park shown on the Open Space Landscape Masterplan which forms part of the approved Development Plan. The development of the sub-regional park shall include formed and grassed playing areas/ovals with drainage and irrigation, an access road and car park (up to 30 spaces) both made of crushed rock or similar material paths, bollards/fencing and landscaping.

3.9. The Owner must to the satisfaction of the Council fully construct Melaluka Road adjacent to the Subject Land concurrently with the development or staged development of the Subject Land. The construction may be staged such that any portion of Melaluka Road which abuts a stage of a plan of subdivision which creates Residential Lots is completed prior to the issue of a Statement of Compliance for that stage of the plan of subdivision. The construction of Melaluka Road must be completed not later than the date upon which the Council issues a Statement of Compliance for the plan of subdivision which creates Residential Lots in the final stage of the development.

4. COVENANTS AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS OF THE COUNCIL

- 4.1. The Council covenants with the Owner to pay the Footpath Sum within 28 days of the issue of the tax invoice issued pursuant to clause 3.1.2.
- 4.2. The Council agrees that it will pay the Market Value of the Additional Area to the Owner within 28 days of:
 - 4.2.1. the issue of a Statement of Compliance for the Plan of Subdivision which sets aside the Additional Area as a reserve vested in Council; or
 - 4.2.2. the Valuer making his or her decision pursuant to clauses 4.5 and 4.6

whichever is the later.

- 4.3. Should Council require the Owner to transfer to it the Additional Area of open space the Council must pay to the Owner the Market Value of the Additional Area prior to the issuing of a Statement of Compliance for the Plan of Subdivision which sets aside the Additional Area as a reserve vested in the Council.
- 4.4. The Council agrees that it will not require any additional open space to be provided other than the Open Space Area and, if required, the Additional Area. The parties acknowledge that the Council's agreement pursuant to this clause does not prevent the Owner from providing open space in addition to the Open Space Area and the Additional Area at the Owner's discretion.
- 4.5. If the parties cannot agree on the Market Value of the Additional Area within 30 days after the certification of the Plan of Subdivision, either party may request the President of the Australian Property Institute (Victorian Division) to appoint a valuer to determine the Market Value of the Additional Area on the proposed transfer date ("Valuer").
- 4.6. The Valuer must:
 - 4.6.1. have not less than 10 years experience in valuing residential land in Victoria and be a practising valuer at the time of his or her appointment;
 - 4.6.2. act as an expert and not as an arbitrator;
 - 4.6.3. agree, upon accepting the appointment, to make a decision within 14 days of his or her appointment.
- 4.7. The decision of the Valuer is conclusive and binds both parties.
- 4.8. Each party must pay one half of the Valuer's fees and expenses.

- 4.9. The Council will forthwith after the execution of this Agreement register this Agreement on the titles of the Subject Land pursuant to the provisions of Section 181 of the Act.
- 4.10. Council agrees that it will not propose, exhibit or adopt any future amendment to the Planning Scheme concerning development contributions or open space contributions that affect the Subject Land and that is inconsistent with this Agreement.
- 4.11. Council acknowledges that the obligations of the Owner under this Agreement comprise the full and final extent of civil improvement contributions and development works that are required to be made by Council in respect of the development of the Subject Land in accordance with the Development Plan. The Council undertakes not to impose or require any other civil improvement or development works or contributions to be made by the Owner at any time relating to the development of the Subject Land in accordance with the Development Plan other than the provision of, and construction of, facilities and utility services normally associated with the subdivision and development of land including, water supply, stormwater drainage, sewerage, gas and electricity services, telecommunications infrastructure, local roads and footpaths.

5. FURTHER COVENANTS OF THE OWNER

The Owner covenants and agrees that it will:

- 5.1. Notice
 - 5.1.1. bring this Agreement to the attention of all prospective purchasers, mortgagees, transferees, lessees and assigns.
- 5.2. Compliance
 - 5.2.1. the Owner will do all things necessary to give effect to this Agreement;
 - 5.2.2. the Owner consents to the Council making application to the Registrar of Titles to register this Agreement in accordance with Section 181 of the Act and to do all things necessary to enable the Council to do so including signing any further agreement, acknowledgment or document or procuring the consent to this Agreement of any mortgagee or caveator to enable the recording to be made in the register under that Section; and
 - 5.2.3. the Owner will pay to Council, Council's reasonable costs and expenses (including legal expenses) of and incidental to the preparation, drafting, finalisation, engrossment, execution and registration of this Agreement which are and until paid will remain a debt due to Council by the Owner.

6. AGREEMENT UNDER SECTION 173 OF THE ACT

The Council and the Owner agree that without limiting the respective powers to enter into this Agreement and, insofar as can be so treated, this Agreement is made pursuant to Section 173 of the Act.

7. OWNER'S WARRANTIES

Without limiting the operation or effect which this Agreement has, the Owner warrants that:

- 7.1. apart from the parties referred to in this Agreement, or other persons disclosed in writing to the Council prior to the signing of this Agreement, no other person has any interest either legal or equitable in the Subject Land which may be affected by this Agreement or by development or use of the Subject Land pursuant to the Planning Scheme or any permit or approved plan under the Planning Scheme.
- 7.2. the Owner has obtained all necessary authorities and consents to bind all other persons who have any interest either legal or equitable in the Subject Land.

8. SUCCESSORS IN TITLE

Without limiting the operation or effect which this Agreement has, the Owner shall ensure that, unless this Agreement is recorded on the folio of the register which relates to the Subject Land, the Owner's successors in title will:

- 8.1. give effect to and do all acts and sign all documents which will require those successors to give effect to this Agreement; and
- 8.2. execute under seal a deed agreeing to be bound by the terms of this Agreement.

9. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 9.1. If there is a dispute between the parties concerning the interpretation or implementation of this Agreement, that dispute may be referred to the Tribunal for resolution to the extent permitted by the Act.
- 9.2. If there is a dispute concerning any matter which is not referrable to the Tribunal under the Act, that dispute may be referred for arbitration by an Arbitrator agreed upon in writing by the parties or, in the absence of such agreement the Chairman of the Victorian Chapter of the Institute of Arbitrators, Australia or his nominee, for arbitration.
- 9.3. Where provision is made in this Agreement that a matter must be done to the satisfaction or may not be done without the consent of the Council or any of its officers and a dispute arises in relation to such provision, the dispute may be referred to the Tribunal in accordance with Section 149(1)(b) of the Act.
- 9.4. The parties are entitled to legal representation for the purposes of any arbitration or referral referred to in this clause and, unless the Arbitrator, Chairman, nominee or the Tribunal otherwise directs, each party must bear its own costs in such matter.

10. GENERAL MATTERS

10.1. Notices

A notice or other communication required or permitted to be served by a party on another party must be in writing and may be served:

10.1.1. by delivering it personally to that party;

- 10.1.2. by sending it by prepaid post addressed to that party at the address set out in this Agreement or subsequently notified to each party from time to time: or
- 10.1.3. sending it by facsimile provided that a communication sent by facsimile shall be confirmed immediately in writing by the sending party by hand delivery or prepaid post.
- 10.2. a notice or other communication is deemed served:
 - 10.2.1. if delivered, upon delivery;
 - 10.2.2. if posted within Australia to an Australian address, two business days after posting and in any other case, seven business days after posting;
 - 10.2.3. if served by facsimile, at the time indicated on the transmission report produced by the sender's facsimile machine indicating that the facsimile was sent in its entirety to the addressee's facsimile; or
 - 10.2.4. if received after 5.00 pm in the place of receipt or on a day which is not a business day, at 9.00 am on the next business day.

10.3. No Waiver

Any time or other indulgence granted by the Council to the Owner or any variation of the terms and conditions of this Agreement or any judgment or order obtained by Council against the Owner will not in any way amount to a waiver of any of the rights or remedies of Council in relation to the terms of this Agreement.

10.4. Severability

If a court, arbitrator, tribunal or other competent authority determines that a word, phrase, sentence, paragraph or clause of this Agreement is unenforceable, illegal or void then it must be severed and the other provisions of this Agreement will remain operative.

10.5. Further Assurance

The parties to the Agreement shall respectively execute all further documents and do all acts and things reasonably required to effectuate this Agreement.

11. COMMENCEMENT OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement commences on the date of gazettal of the Amendment by the Minister,

12. ENDING OF AGREEMENT

- 12.1. This Agreement ends when the Owner has complied with all of the obligations imposed on the Owner under this Agreement.
- 12.2. If this Agreement relates to more than one lot and the owner of that lot has complied with all of the obligations in relation to that lot, the owner of that lot may request Council to end this Agreement in relation to that lot.
- 12.3. As soon as reasonably practicable after this Agreement has ended in respect of any part of the Subject Land the Council must, at the request and at the cost of the Owner, make application to the Registrar of Titles under s. 183(2) of the Act to

cancel the recording of this Agreement on the register to each such part of the Subject Land.

12.4. Until the registration of this Agreement is cancelled pursuant to section 183 of the Act then upon the Owner complying with all of the obligations imposed on the Owner under this Agreement, the Council and the Owner, including any successors, agree that this Agreement will not apply to or affect the Subject Land.

13. GST

- 13.1. In this clause 13, 'GST Act' means the A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).
- 13.2. Expressions used in this clause and in the GST Act have the same meanings as when used in the GST Act.
- 13.3. Amounts payable and consideration provided under or in respect of this Agreement are GST exclusive.
- 13.4. The recipient of a taxable supply made under or in respect of this Agreement must pay to the supplier, at the time the consideration for the supply is due, the GST payable in respect of the supply. This obligation extends to supply consisting of a party's entry into this Agreement.
- 13.5. A party is not obliged, under clause 13.3, to pay the GST on a taxable supply to it until given a valid tax invoice for the supply.

WHEREAS:

- A. The Council is the Responsible Authority pursuant to the Act for the Planning Scheme.
- B. The Owner is or is entitled to be registered as the registered proprietor of the Subject Land.
