2. Whole Agreement

The Purchaser acknowledges that no information, representation, comment, opinion or warranty by the Vendor or the Vendor's Agent was supplied or made with the intention or knowledge that it would be relied upon by the Purchaser and no information, representation, comment, opinion or warranty has in fact been so relied upon and that there are no conditions, warranties or other terms affecting this sale other than those embodied in this Contract.

That the Purchaser has made investigations and asked all questions in relation to any concerns regarding Material Facts regarding the Property prior to signing this Contract of Sale.

The Vendor and Purchaser acknowledge that the Special Conditions take priority over the General Conditions in this Contract of Sale.

3. Representation and Warranty as to Building and Improvements (if applicable)

- (a) The Purchaser acknowledges that the Vendor has not, nor has anyone on the Vendor's behalf, made any representation or warranty as to the fitness for any particular purpose or otherwise of the property or that any structures comply with the current or any building regulations and the Purchaser expressly releases the Vendor and/or the Vendor's Agents from any claims demands in respect thereof. That the Purchaser has made a physical inspection of the property and made its own investigations regarding the improvements including the materials constructed at the Property.
- (b) The Purchaser confirms he has made enquiries with the Vendor or the Vendor's Agent as to any Material Facts in relation to the Property before signing this Contract of Sale.

4. Planning

The property is sold subject to any restriction as to user imposed by law or by any Authority with power under any legislation to control the use of land. Any such restriction shall not constitute a defect in Title or a matter of Title or effect the validity of this Contract and the Purchaser shall not make any requisition or objection or claim or be entitled to compensation or damages from the Vendor in respect thereof.

5. Director's Guarantee and Warranty

In the event that the Purchaser is a corporate entity then the Director/s signing on behalf of the Corporate Purchaser shall execute the Contract and shall warrant that same is done lawfully in accordance with the Articles of Association of the Purchaser Company and further shall cause either the Sole Director or at least two Directors of the Purchaser Company to execute the form of Guarantee and Indemnity annexed hereto.

6. Foreign Acquisition

The Purchaser warrants that in the event that he or she is a person as defined by the Foreign Acquisitions & Takeovers Act all requirements of the Act have been observed and that any loss occasioned by a breach of such warranty shall form the basis of damages recoverable from the Purchaser.

7. Foreign resident capital gains withholding

- 7.1 Words defined or used in Subdivision 14-D of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)* have the same meaning in this special condition unless the context requires otherwise.
- 7.2 Every vendor under this contract is a foreign resident for the purposes of this special condition unless the vendor gives the purchaser a clearance certificate issued by the Commissioner under section 14-220 (1) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)*. The specified period in the clearance certificate must include the actual date of settlement.
- 7.3 This special condition only applies if the purchaser is required to pay the Commissioner an amount in accordance with section 14-200(3) or section 14-235 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth) ("the amount") because one or more of the vendors is a foreign resident, the property is or will have a market value of \$750,000 or more just after the transaction, and the transaction is not excluded under section 14-215(1)(a) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth).
- 7.4 The amount is to be deducted from the vendor's entitlement to the contract consideration. The vendor must pay to the purchaser at settlement such part of the amount as is represented by non-monetary consideration.
- 7.5 The purchaser must:
 - engage a legal practitioner or conveyancer ("representative") to conduct all the legal aspects of settlement, including the performance of the purchaser's obligations in this special condition;
 and
 - (b) ensure that the representative does so.
- 7.6 The terms of the representative's engagement are taken to include instructions to have regard to the vendor's interests and instructions that the representative must:
 - (a) pay, or ensure payment of, the amount to the Commissioner in the manner required by the Commissioner and as soon as reasonably and practicably possible, from moneys under the control or direction of the representative in accordance with this special condition if the sale of the property settles;
 - (b) promptly provide the vendor with proof of payment; and
 - (c) otherwise comply, or ensure compliance with, this special condition. despite:
 - (d) any contrary instructions, other than from both the purchaser and the vendor; and
 - (e) any other provision in this contract to the contrary.
- 7.7 The representative is taken to have complied with the obligations in special condition 6.6 if:
 - (a) the settlement is conducted through the electronic conveyancing system operated by Property Exchange Australia Ltd or any other electronic conveyancing system agreed by the parties; and
 - (b) the amount is included in the settlement statement requiring payment to the Commissioner in respect of this transaction.
- 7.8 Any clearance certificate or document evidencing variation of the amount in accordance with section 14-235(2) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)* must be given to the purchaser at least 5 business days before the due date for settlement.
- 7.9 The vendor must provide the purchaser with such information as the purchaser requires to comply with the purchaser's obligation to pay the amount in accordance with section 14-200 of Schedule 1 of *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)*. The information must be provided within 5 business days of request by the purchaser. The vendor warrants that the information the vendor provides is true and correct.
- 7.10 The purchaser is responsible for any penalties or interest payable to the Commissioner on account of late payment of the amount.

8. Electronic Conveyancing Special Condition

8.1 This special condition has priority over any other provision to the extent of any inconsistency. This Special Condition applies if the contract of sale specifies, or the parties subsequently agree in writing, that settlement and lodgement of the instruments necessary to record the purchaser as registered proprietor of the land will be conducted electronically in accordance with the *Electronic Conveyancing National Law*.

- 8.2 A party must immediately give written notice if that party reasonably believes that settlement and lodgement can no longer be conducted electronically.
- 8.3 Each party must:
 - (a) Be, or engage a representative who is, a subscriber for the purposes of the *Electronic Conveyancing National Law*
 - (b) Ensure that all other persons for whom that party is responsible and who are associated with this transaction are, or engage, a subscriber for the purposes of the *Electronic Conveyancing* National Law
 - (C) Conduct the transaction in accordance with the Electronic Conveyancing National Law.
- 8.4 The vendor must open the Electronic Workspace ("workspace") as soon as reasonably practicable. The workspace is an electronic address for the service of notices and for written communications for the purposes of any electronic transactions legislation.

- 8.6 Settlement occurs when the workspace records that:
 - (a) The exchange of funds or value between financial institutions in accordance with the instruction of the parties has occurred: or
 - (b) If there is no exchange of funds or value, the documents necessary to enable the purchaser to become registered proprietor of the land have been accepted for electronic lodgement.
- 8.7 The parties must do everything reasonably necessary to effect settlement:
 - (a) electronically on the next business day, or
 - (b) at the option of either party, otherwise than electronically as soon as possible if, after locking of the workspace at the nominated settlement time, settlement in accordance with special condition 8.6 has not occurred by 4.00pm, or 6.00pm if the nominated time for settlement is after 4.00pm.

9. Amendment to General Conditions

9.1 General condition 12.4 is added:

Where the purchaser is deemed by section 27(7) of the *Sale of Land Act* 1962 to have given the deposit release authorisation referred to in section 27 (1), the purchaser is also deemed to have accepted title in the absence of any prior express objection to title.

9.2 Upon execution of the Contract it is acknowledged that General Conditions 24.4, 24.5 & 24.6 do not apply to this Contract.

- 9.3 General Condition 14.2(c) is deleted and replaced with 'serves written notice ending the contract on the vendor or vendors representative by 5pm on the approval date or any later date allowed by the vendor along with a letter from a lender that confirms that the loan application has been declined'.
- 9.4 General Condition 9 is deleted.

10. GST Withholding at Settlement

- 10.1 Words and expressions defined or used in Subdivision 14-E of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)* or in *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act* 1999 (Cth) have the same meaning in this special condition unless the context requires otherwise. Words and expressions first used in this special condition and shown in italics and marked with an asterisk are defined or described in at least one of those Acts.
- This Special Condition applies if the purchaser is required to pay the Commissioner an *amount* in accordance with section 14-250 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)* because the property is *new residential premises* or *potential residential land* in either case falling within the parameters of that section, and also if the sale attracts the operation of section 14-255 of the legislation. Nothing in this special condition is to be taken as relieving the vendor from compliance with section 14-255.
- The amount is to be deducted from the vendor's entitlement to the contract *consideration* and is then taken to be paid to the vendor, whether or not the vendor provides the purchaser with a GST withholding notice in accordance with section 14-255 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)*. The vendor must pay to the purchaser at settlement such part of the amount as is represented by non-monetary consideration.
- 10.4 The purchaser must:
 - (a) engage a legal practitioner or conveyancer ("representative") to conduct all the legal aspects of settlement, including the performance of the purchaser's obligations under the legislation and this special condition; and ensure that the representative does so.
- 10.5 The terms of the representative's engagement are taken to include instructions to have regard to the vendor's interests relating to the payment of the amount to the Commissioner and instructions that the representative must:
 - (a) pay, or ensure payment of, the amount to the Commissioner in the manner required by the Commissioner and as soon as reasonably and practicably possible, from moneys under the control or direction of the representative in accordance with this special condition on settlement of the sale of the property;
 - (b) promptly provide the vendor with evidence of payment, including any notification or other document provided by the purchaser to the Commissioner relating to payment; and
 - (c) otherwise comply, or ensure compliance, with this special condition; despite:
 - (d) any contrary instructions, other than from both the purchaser and the vendor; and
 - (e) any other provision in this contract to the contrary.
- 10.6 The representative is taken to have complied with the requirements of special condition 9A.5 if:
 - (a) settlement is conducted through the electronic conveyancing system operated by Property Exchange Australia Ltd or any other electronic conveyancing system agreed by the parties; and
 - (b) the amount is included in the settlement statement requiring payment to the Commissioner in respect of this transaction.
- 10.7 The purchaser may at settlement give the vendor a bank cheque for the amount in accordance with section 16-30 (3) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)*, but only if:
 - (a) so agreed by the vendor in writing; and
 - (b) the settlement is not conducted through an electronic settlement system described in special condition 10.6. However, if the purchaser gives the bank cheque in accordance with this special condition, the vendor must:
 - (c) immediately after settlement provide the bank cheque to the Commissioner to pay the amount in relation to the supply; and
 - (d) give the purchaser a receipt for the bank cheque which identifies the transaction and includes particulars of the bank cheque, at the same time the purchaser gives the vendor the bank cheque.
- 10.8 The vendor must provide the purchaser with a GST withholding notice in accordance with section 14-255

of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)* at least 14 days before the due date for settlement.

- 10.9 A party must provide the other party with such information as the other party requires to:
 - (a) decide if an amount is required to be paid or the quantum of it, or
 - (b) comply with the purchaser's obligation to pay the amount,

in accordance with section 14-250 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)*. The information must be provided within 5 business days of a written request. The party providing the information warrants that it is true and correct.

10.10 The vendor warrants that:

- (a) at settlement, the property is not new residential premises or potential residential land in either case falling within the parameters of section 14-250 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act* 1953 (Cth) if the vendor gives the purchaser a written notice under section 14-255 to the effect that the purchaser will not be required to make a payment under section 14-250 in respect of the supply, or fails to give a written notice as required by and within the time specified in section 14-255; and
- (b) the amount described in a written notice given by the vendor to the purchaser under section 14-255 of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)* is the correct amount required to be paid under section 14-250 of the legislation.
- 10.11 The purchaser is responsible for any penalties or interest payable to the Commissioner on account of non-payment or late payment of the amount, except to the extent that:
 - (a) the penalties or interest arise from the vendor's failure, including breach of a warranty in special condition 10.10; or
 - (b) the purchaser's reasonable belief that the property is neither new residential premises nor potential residential land requiring the purchaser to pay an amount to the Commissioner in accordance with section 14-250 (1) of Schedule 1 to the *Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)*.

The vendor is responsible for any penalties or interest payable to the Commissioner on account of non-payment or late payment of the amount if either exception applies.

10.12 This special condition will not merge on settlement.

11. Electronic Signature

- 11.1 In this Special Condition 'electronic signature' means a digital signature or a visual representation of a person's handwritten signature or mark which is placed on a physical or electronic copy of this Contract.
- The parties consent to this Contract being signed by or on behalf of party by an electronic signature and the parties warrant and agrees that the electronic signature has been used to identify the person signing and to indicate that the party intends to be bound by the electronic signature.
- 11.3 Each party consents to the exchange of counterparts of this Contract by delivery by email to each parties representative.

12. Swimming Pool (if Applicable)

- 12.1 If the Land includes a swimming pool, spa or pond ("Pool"), the Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that:
 - (a) the Purchaser, as the new owner of the Property, has made its own enquiries regarding the obligations with respect to the Pool and any existing or required safety barriers located at the Property:
 - (b) From settlement the Purchaser will be responsible to comply with the Building Act 1993(Vic) and its Regulations (including any amendments to the Building Act 1993) in relation to a Pool and the required safety barriers;
 - (c) the Purchaser shall not make any claim against the Vendor in relation to the Pool or any existing or required safety barriers;
 - (d) The Purchaser shall indemnify the Vendor against at costs associated with the Pool including any existing safety barriers; and
 - (e) Neither the Vendor nor the Vendor's Estate Agent has made any representations or warranties in relation to the Pool or any safety barriers.

13. Solar Panels (if Applicable)

- 13.1 If there are any solar panels on the Land, the Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that:
 - (a) whether or not any benefits currently provided to the Vendor by Agreement with the current energy service provider (including feed in tariffs) pass to the Purchaser on the sale of the Land is a matter for enquiry and confirmation by the Purchaser, and the Vendor makes no warranty or representation in this regard;
 - (b) the Purchaser will make his own negotiations with the current energy supplier or an energy supplier of the Purchaser's choice with regard to a feed in tariffs for any electricity generated or any benefit provided by the solar panels;
 - (c) neither the Vendor nor the Vendor's Estate Agent have made any representations or warranties with respect to the solar panels or their state of repair or purpose which they were installed.

14. Existing Lease

14.1 If this property is affected by a lease or this Contract of Sale is Subject to a Lease, the Vendor does not warrant that the lease will be in force at Settlement. The Purchaser is not entitled to any compensation from the Vendor and the Vendor will not be in breach of this Contract if the property is vacant on the settlement date.

15. Adjustments

15.1 The Purchaser(s) and/or their representative will prepare and deliver the Statement of Adjustments to the Vendors Representative at least 7 clear days before Settlement, along with supporting certificates from the relevant authorities. Supporting certificates must be dated within 30 days of Settlement Date.

16. Land Tax

16.1 Notwithstanding any other Special Condition or General Condition, if the Contract Price is under the 'Threshold Amount' as prescribed in Section 10I of the Sale of Land Act, then Land Tax will not be adjusted or apportioned at Settlement and will remain the responsibility of the Vendor in accordance with the Section 10G of the Sale of Land Act.

17. Default Interest, Delayed Settlement or Earlier Settlement

17.1 General condition 26 is replaced with the following:

If the Purchaser defaults in payment of any money due under this Contract of Sale then interest at the rate of four per cent (4%) per annum plus the rate for the time being as fixed by section 2 of the *Penalty Interest* Rates *Act 1983* is payable at settlement by the Purchaser to the vendor on any money owing under this Contract of Sale during the period of default without the necessity for a demand and without affecting any other rights or remedies of the vendor.

17.2 The Purchaser acknowledges that in the event that the Purchaser fails to fulfil his or her obligations pertaining to the settlement of the property by the Due Date under this Contract of Sale, all rates, charges and levies in the Statement of Adjustments are to be adjusted from the original Due Date, and not from the new settlement date caused by reason of the delay.

18. Vendor's Losses and Expenses

- 18.1 The Vendor gives notice to the Purchaser and the Purchaser hereby acknowledges that in the event that the Purchaser fails to fulfil his or her obligations pertaining to the settlement of the property by the Due Date under this Contract of Sale, the Vendor will or may suffer the following losses and expenses which the Purchaser would be required to pay, in addition to the interest chargeable on the balance of the purchase price in accordance with the terms of this Contract:
 - a. Penalties and/or interest payable on any loan secured on the property from the Due Date until settlement actually takes place;
 - b. Costs of obtaining bridging finance to complete the Vendor's purchase of another property, plus any interest charged on such bridging finance;
 - c, Penalties payable by the Vendor through any delay in completion of the Vendor's purchase of another property

- d. Reasonable costs of storage of goods and chattels incurred by the Vendor.
- e. Additional legal and conveyancing costs reasonably incurred by the Vendor

CONTRACT OF SALE OF REAL ESTATE—GENERAL CONDITIONS

TITLE

1. Encumbrances

- 1.1 The purchaser buys the property subject to:
 - (a) any encumbrance shown in the Section 32 Statement other than mortgages or caveats; and
 - (b) any reservations in the crown grant; and
 - (c) any lease referred to in the particulars of sale.
- 1.2 The purchaser indemnifies the vendor against all obligations under any lease that are to be performed by the landlord after settlement.
- 1.3 In this General Condition "Section 32 Statement" means a Statement required to be given by a vendor under Section 32 of the **Sale of Land Act 1962** in accordance with Division 2 of Part II of that Act.

2. Vendor warranties

- 2.1 The warranties in general conditions 2.2 and 2.3 replace the purchaser's right to make requisitions and inquiries.
- 2.2 The vendor warrants that the vendor:
 - (a) has, or by the due date for settlement will have, the right to sell the land; and
 - (b) is under no legal disability; and
 - (c) is in possession of the land, either personally or through a tenant; and
 - (d) has not previously sold or granted any option to purchase, agreed to a lease or granted a pre-emptive right which is current over the land and which gives another party rights which have priority over the interest of the purchaser; and
 - (e) will at settlement be the holder of an unencumbered estate in fee simple in the land; and
 - (f) will at settlement be the unencumbered owner of any improvements, fixtures, fittings and goods sold with the land.
- 2.3 The vendor further warrants that the vendor has no knowledge of any of the following:
 - (a) public rights of way over the land;
 - (b) easements over the land;
 - (c) lease or other possessory agreement affecting the land;
 - (d) notice or order affecting the land which will not be dealt with at settlement, other than the usual rate notices and any land tax notices;
 - (e) legal proceedings which would render the sale of the land void or voidable or capable of being set aside.
- 2.4 The warranties in general conditions 2.2 and 2.3 are subject to any contrary provisions in this contract and disclosures in the Section 32 Statement required to be given by a vendor under Section 32 of the **Sale of Land Act 1962** in accordance with Division 2 of Part II of that Act.
- 2.5 If sections 137B and 137C of the **Building Act 1993** apply to this contract, the vendor warrants that:
 - (a) all domestic building work carried out in relation to the construction by or on behalf of the vendor of the home was carried out in a proper and workmanlike manner; and
 - (b) all materials used in that domestic building work were good and suitable for the purpose for which they were used and that, unless otherwise stated in the contract, those materials were new; and
 - (c) domestic building work was carried out in accordance with all laws and legal requirements, including, without limiting the generality of this warranty, the **Building Act 1993** and regulations made under the **Building Act 1993**.
- 2.6 Words and phrases used in general condition 2.5 which are defined in the **Building Act 1993** have the same meaning in general condition 2.5.

3. Identity of the land

- 3.1 An omission or mistake in the description of the property or any deficiency in the area, description or, measurements of the land does not invalidate the sale.
- 3.2 The purchaser may not:
 - (a) make any objection or claim for compensation for any alleged misdescription of the property or any deficiency in its area or measurements; or
 - (b) require the vendor to amend title or pay any cost of amending title.

4. Services

- 4.1 The vendor does not represent that the services are adequate for the purchaser's proposed use of the property and the vendor advises the purchaser to make appropriate inquiries. The condition of the services may change between the day of sale and settlement and the vendor does not promise that the services will be in the same condition at settlement as they were on the day of sale.
- 4.2 The purchaser is responsible for the connection of all services to the property after settlement and the payment of any associated cost.

5. Consents

The vendor must obtain any necessary consent or licence required for the sale. The contract will be at an end and all money paid must be refunded if any necessary consent or licence is not obtained by settlement.

6. Transfer

The transfer of land document must be prepared by the purchaser and delivered to the vendor at least 10 days before settlement. The delivery of the transfer of land document is not acceptance of title. Preparation and delivery of the document can be either in paper form or electronic format via an Electronic Lodgment Network Operator

7. Duties Online Settlement Statement

The vendor will initiate the preparation of a Duties Online Settlement Statement (DOLSS) as soon as practicable after the Contract Date and will provide the purchaser with online access to that document at least 10 days before settlement. The purchaser will sign the DOLSS no later than 7 days prior to settlement.

8. Release of Security Interest

- 8.1 This general condition applies if any part of the property is subject to a security interest to which the **Personal Property Securities Act 2009 (Cth)** applies.
- 8.2 For the purposes of enabling the purchaser to search the Personal Property Securities Register for any security interests affecting any personal property for which the purchaser may be entitled to a release, statement, approval or correction in accordance with general condition 8.4, the purchaser may request the vendor to provide the vendor's date of birth to the purchaser. The vendor must comply with a request made by the purchaser under this condition if the purchaser makes the request at least 21 days before the due date for settlement
- 8.3 If the purchaser is given the details of the vendor's date of birth under condition 8.2, the purchaser must
 - (a) Only use the vendor's date of birth for the purposes specified in condition 8.2; and
 - (b) Keep the date of birth of the vendor secure and confidential.
- 8.4 The vendor must ensure that at or before settlement, the purchaser receives
 - (a) a release from the secured party releasing the property from the security interest; or
 - (b) a statement in writing in accordance with section 275(1)(b) of the **Personal Property Securities Act 2009 (Cth)** setting out that the amount or obligation that is secured is nil at settlement; or
 - (c) a written approval or correction in accordance with section 275(1)(c) of the **Personal Property Securities Act 2009 (Cth)** indicating that, on settlement, the personal property included in the contract is not or will not be property in which the security interest is granted.
- 8.5 Subject to general condition 8.6, the vendor is not obliged to ensure that the purchaser receives a release, statement, approval or correction in respect of personal property
 - (a) that -
 - (i) the purchaser intends to use predominantly for personal, domestic or household purposes; and
 - (ii) has a market value of not more than \$5000 or, if a greater amount has been prescribed for the purposes of section 47(1) of the **Personal Property Securities Act 2009 (Cth),** not more than that prescribed amount; or
 - (b) that is sold in the ordinary course of the vendor's business of selling personal property of that kind.
- 8.6 The vendor is obliged to ensure that the purchaser receives a release, statement, approval or correction in respect of personal property described in general condition 8.5 if
 - (a) the personal property is of a kind that may or must be described by serial number in the Personal Property Securities Register; or
 - (b) the purchaser has actual or constructive knowledge that the sale constitutes a breach of the security agreement that provides for the security interest.
- 8.7 A release for the purposes of general condition 8.4(a) must be in writing.
- 8.8 A release for the purposes of general condition 8.4(a) must be effective in releasing the goods from the security interest and be in a form which allows the purchaser to take title to the goods free of that security interest.
- 8.9 If the purchaser receives a release under general condition 8.4(a) the purchaser must provide the vendor with a copy of the release at or as soon as practicable after settlement.
- 8.10 In addition to ensuring that a release is received under general condition 8.4(a), the vendor must ensure that at or before settlement the purchaser receives a written undertaking from a secured party to register a financing change statement to reflect that release if the property being released includes goods of a kind that are described by serial number in the Personal Property Securities Register.
- 8.11 The purchaser must advise the vendor of any security interest that is registered on or before the day of sale on the Personal Properties Security Register, which the purchaser reasonably requires to be released, at least 21 days before the due date for settlement.
- 8.12 The vendor may delay settlement until 21 days after the purchaser advises the vendor of the security interests that the purchaser reasonably requires to be released if the purchaser does not provide an advice under general condition 8.11.
- 8.13 If settlement is delayed under general condition 8.12 the purchaser must pay the vendor
 - (a) interest from the due date for settlement until the date on which settlement occurs or 21 days after the vendor receives the advice, whichever is the earlier; and
 - (b) any reasonable costs incurred by the vendor as a result of the delay -

- as though the purchaser was in default.
- 8.14 The vendor is not required to ensure that the purchaser receives a release in respect of the land. This general condition 8.14 applies despite general condition 8.1.
- 8.15 Words and phrases which are defined in the **Personal Property Securities Act 2009 (Cth)** have the same meaning in general condition 8 unless the context requires otherwise.

9. Builder warranty insurance

The vendor warrants that the vendor will provide at settlement details of any current builder warranty insurance in the vendor's possession relating to the property if requested in writing to do so at least 21 days before settlement.

10. Settlement

- 10.1 At settlement:
 - (a) the purchaser must pay the balance; and
 - (b) the vendor must:
 - (i) do all things necessary to enable the purchaser to become the registered proprietor of the land; and
 - (ii) give either vacant possession or receipt of rents and profits in accordance with the particulars of sale.
- 10.2 The vendor's obligations under this general condition continue after settlement.
- 10.3 Settlement must be conducted between the hours of 10.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. unless the parties agree otherwise.

11. Payment

- 11.1 The purchaser must pay the deposit:
 - (a) to the vendor's licensed estate agent; or
 - (b) if there is no estate agent, to the vendor's legal practitioner or conveyancer; or
 - (c) if the vendor directs, into a special purpose account in an authorised deposit-taking institution in Victoria specified by the vendor in the joint names of the purchaser and the vendor.
- 11.2 If the land sold is a lot on an unregistered plan of subdivision, the deposit:
 - (a) must not exceed 10% of the price; and
 - (b) must be paid to the vendor's estate agent, legal practitioner or conveyancer and held by the estate agent, legal practitioner or conveyancer on trust for the purchaser until the registration of the plan of subdivision.
- 11.3 The purchaser must pay all money other than the deposit:
 - (a) to the vendor, or the vendor's legal practitioner or conveyancer; or
 - (b) in accordance with a written direction of the vendor or the vendor's legal practitioner or conveyancer.
- 11.4 At settlement, payments may be made or tendered:
 - (a) up to \$1,000 in cash; or
 - (b) by cheque drawn on an authorised deposit-taking institution; or
 - (c) by electronically transferring the payment in the form of cleared funds.

However, unless otherwise agreed:

- (d) payment may not be made by credit card, debit card or any other financial transfer system that allows for any chargeback or funds reversal other than for fraud or mistaken payment; and
- (e) any financial fees or deductions from the funds transferred, other than any fees charged by the recipient's authorized deposit-taking institution, must be paid by the remitter.
- 11.5 For the purpose of this general condition 'authorised deposit-taking institution' means a body corporate in relation to which an authority under section 9(3) of the **Banking Act 1959 (Cth)** is in force.
- 11.6 The purchaser must pay the fees on up to three bank cheques drawn on an authorized deposit-taking institution. If the vendor requests that any additional cheques be drawn on an authorized deposit-taking institution the vendor must reimburse the purchaser for the fees incurred.

12. Stakeholding

- 12.1 The deposit must be released to the vendor if:
 - (a) the vendor provides particulars, to the reasonable satisfaction of the purchaser, that either—
 - (i) there are no debts secured against the property; or
 - (ii) if there are any debts, the total amount of those debts does not exceed 80% of the sale price; and
 - (b) at least 28 days have elapsed since the particulars were given to the purchaser under paragraph (a); and
 - (c) all conditions of S27 of the Sale of Land Act 1962 ("the Act") have been satisfied.
- 12.2 The stakeholder must pay the deposit and any interest to the party entitled when the deposit is released, the contract is settled, or the contract is ended.
- 12.3 The stakeholder may pay the deposit and any interest into court if it is reasonable to do so.
- 12.4 Where the purchaser is deemed by Section 27(7) of the Sale of Land Act 1962 to have given the deposit release authorization referred to in Section 27(1) of the Act, the purchaser is also deemed to have accepted title in the absence of any prior objection to title.

13. GST

13.1 The purchaser does not have to pay the vendor any GST payable by the vendor in respect of a taxable supply made under this contract in addition to the price unless the particulars of sale specify that the price is 'plus GST'.

However, the purchaser must pay to the vendor any GST payable by the vendor:

- (a) solely as a result of any action taken or intended to be taken by the purchaser after the day of sale, including a change of use; or
- (b) if the particulars of sale specify that the supply made under this contract is of land on which a farming business is carried on and the supply does not satisfy the requirements of section 38-480 of the GST Act; or
- (c) if the particulars of sale specify that the supply made under this contract is a going concern and the supply does not satisfy the requirements of section 38-325 of the GST Act.
- 13.2 The purchaser must pay to the vendor any GST payable by the vendor in respect of a taxable supply made under this contract in addition to the price if the particulars of sale specify that the price is 'plus GST'.
- 13.3 If the purchaser is liable to pay GST, the purchaser is not required to make payment until provided with a tax invoice, unless the margin scheme applies.
- 13.4 If the particulars of sale specify that the supply made under this contract is of land on which a farming business is carried on:
 - (a) the vendor warrants that the property is land on which a farming business has been carried on for the period of 5 years preceding the date of supply; and
 - (b) the purchaser warrants that the purchaser intends that a farming business will be carried on after settlement on the property.
- 13.5 If the particulars of sale specify that the supply made under this contract is a 'going concern':
 - (a) the parties agree that this contract is for the supply of a going concern; and
 - (b) the purchaser warrants that the purchaser is, or prior to settlement will be, registered for GST; and
 - (c) the vendor warrants that the vendor will carry on the going concern until the date of supply.
- 13.6 If the particulars of sale specify that the supply made under this contract is a 'margin scheme' supply, the parties agree that the margin scheme applies to this contract.
- 13.7 This general condition will not merge on either settlement or registration.
- 13.8 In this general condition:
 - (a) 'GST Act' means A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth); and
 - (b) 'GST' includes penalties and interest.

14. Loan

- 14.1 If the particulars of sale specify that this contract is subject to a loan being approved, this contract is subject to the lender approving the loan on the security of the property by the approval date or any later date allowed by the vendor.
- 14.2 The purchaser may end the contract if the loan is not approved by the approval date, but only if the purchaser:
 - (a) immediately applied for the loan; and
 - (b) did everything reasonably required to obtain approval of the loan; and
 - (c) serves written notice ending the contract on the vendor within 2 clear business days after the approval date or any later date allowed by the vendor; and
 - (d) is not in default under any other condition of this contract when the notice is given.
- 14.3 All money must be immediately refunded to the purchaser if the contract is ended.

15. Adjustments

- 15.1 All periodic outgoings payable by the vendor, and any rent and other income received in respect of the property must be apportioned between the parties on the settlement date and any adjustments paid and received as appropriate.
- 15.2 The periodic outgoings and rent and other income must be apportioned on the following basis:
 - (a) the vendor is liable for the periodic outgoings and entitled to the rent and other income up to and including the day of settlement; and
 - (b) the land is treated as the only land of which the vendor is owner (as defined in the Land Tax Act 2005);
 - (c) the vendor is taken to own the land as a resident Australian beneficial owner; and
 - (d) any personal statutory benefit available to each party is disregarded in calculating apportionment.

TRANSACTIONAL

16. Time

- 16.1 Time is of the essence of this contract.
- 16.2 Time is extended until the next business day if the time for performing any action falls on a Saturday, Sunday or bank holiday.

17. Service

- 17.1 Any document sent by -
 - (a) express post is taken to have been served on the next business day after posting, unless proven otherwise;
 - (b) registered post is taken to have been served on the fourth business day after posting, unless proven otherwise;
 - (c) regular post is taken to have been served on the sixth business day after posting, unless proven otherwise;
 - (d) email is taken to have been served at the time of receipt within the meaning of section 13A of the *Electronic Transactions (Victoria) Act* 2000.
- 17.2 Any demand, notice, or document required to be served by or on any party may be served by or on the legal

practitioner or conveyancer for that party. It is sufficiently served if served on the party or on the legal practitioner or conveyancer:

- (a) personally; or
- (b) by pre-paid post; or
- (c) in any manner authorised by law or the Supreme Court for service of documents, including any manner authorized for service on or by a legal practitioner.
- (d) by email

17.3 This general condition applies to the service of any demand, notice or document by or on any party, whether the expression 'give' or 'serve' or any other expression is used.

18. Nominee

The purchaser may nominate a substitute or additional transferee, but the named purchaser remains personally liable for the due performance of all the purchaser's obligations under this contract.

19. Liability of signatory

Any signatory for a proprietary limited company purchaser is personally liable for the due performance of the purchaser's obligations as if the signatory were the purchaser in the case of a default by a proprietary limited company purchaser.

20. Guarantee

The vendor may require one or more directors of the purchaser to guarantee the purchaser's performance of this contract if the purchaser is a proprietary limited company.

21. Notices

The purchaser is responsible for any notice, order, demand or levy imposing liability on the property that is issued or made on or after the day of sale that does not relate to periodic outgoings. The purchaser may enter the property to comply with that responsibility where action is required before settlement.

22. Inspection

The purchaser and/or another person authorised by the purchaser may inspect the property at any reasonable time during the 7 days preceding and including the settlement day.

23. Terms contract

- 23.1 If this is a 'terms contract' as defined in the Sale of Land Act 1962:
 - (a) any mortgage affecting the land sold must be discharged as to that land before the purchaser becomes entitled to possession or to the receipt of rents and profits unless the vendor satisfies section 29M of the **Sale of Land Act 1962**; and
 - (b) the deposit and all other money payable under the contract (other than any money payable in excess of the amount required to so discharge the mortgage) must be paid to a legal practitioner or conveyancer or a licensed estate agent to be applied in or towards discharging the mortgage.
- 23.2 While any money remains owing each of the following applies:
 - (a) the purchaser must maintain full damage and destruction insurance of the property and public risk insurance noting all parties having an insurable interest with an insurer approved in writing by the vendor;
 - (b) the purchaser must deliver copies of the signed insurance application forms, the policies and the insurance receipts to the vendor not less than 10 days before taking possession of the property or becoming entitled to receipt of the rents and profits;
 - (c) the purchaser must deliver copies of any amendments to the policies and the insurance receipts on each amendment or renewal as evidence of the status of the policies from time to time;
 - (d) the vendor may pay any renewal premiums or take out the insurance if the purchaser fails to meet these obligations;
 - (e) insurance costs paid by the vendor under paragraph (d) must be refunded by the purchaser on demand without affecting the vendor's other rights under this contract;
 - (f) the purchaser must maintain and operate the property in good repair (fair wear and tear excepted) and keep the property safe, lawful, structurally sound, weatherproof and free from contaminations and dangerous substances;
 - (g) the property must not be altered in any way without the written consent of the vendor which must not be unreasonably refused or delayed;
 - (h) the purchaser must observe all obligations that affect owners or occupiers of land;
 - (i) the vendor and/or other person authorised by the vendor may enter the property at any reasonable time to inspect it on giving 7 days written notice, but not more than twice in a year.

24. Loss or damage before settlement

- 24.1 The vendor carries the risk of loss or damage to the property until settlement.
- 24.2 The vendor must deliver the property to the purchaser at settlement in the same condition it was in on the day of sale, except for fair wear and tear.
- 24.3 The purchaser must not delay settlement because one or more of the goods is not in the condition required by

- general condition 24.2, but may claim compensation from the vendor after settlement.
- 24.4 The purchaser may nominate an amount not exceeding \$5,000 to be held by a stakeholder to be appointed by the parties if the property is not in the condition required by general condition 24.2 at settlement.
- 24.5 The nominated amount may be deducted from the amount due to the vendor at settlement and paid to the stakeholder, but only if the purchaser also pays an amount equal to the nominated amount to the stakeholder.
- 24.6 The stakeholder must pay the amounts referred to in general condition 24.5 in accordance with the determination of the dispute, including any order for payment of the costs of the resolution of the dispute.

25. Breach

- 25.1 A party who breaches this contract must pay to the other party on demand:
 - (a) compensation for any reasonably foreseeable loss to the other party resulting from the breach; and
 - (b) any interest due under this contract as a result of the breach.

DEFAULT

26. Interest

Interest at a rate of 2% per annum plus the rate for the time being fixed by section 2 of the **Penalty Interest Rates Act 1983** is payable on any money owing under the contract during the period of default, without affecting any other rights of the offended party.

27. Default notice

- 27.1 A party is not entitled to exercise any rights arising from the other party's default, other than the right to receive interest and the right to sue for money owing, until the other party is given and fails to comply with a written default notice.
- 27.2 The default notice must:
 - (a) specify the particulars of the default; and
 - (b) state that it is the offended party's intention to exercise the rights arising from the default unless, within 14 days of the notice being given—
 - (i) the default is remedied; and
 - (ii) the reasonable costs incurred as a result of the default and any interest payable are paid.

28. Default not remedied

- 28.1 All unpaid money under the contract becomes immediately payable to the vendor if the default has been made by the purchaser and is not remedied and the costs and interest are not paid.
- 28.2 The contract immediately ends if:
 - (a) the default notice also states that unless the default is remedied and the reasonable costs and interest are paid, the contract will be ended in accordance with this general condition; and
 - (b) the default is not remedied and the reasonable costs and interest are not paid by the end of the period of the default notice.
- 28.3 If the contract ends by a default notice given by the purchaser:
 - the purchaser must be repaid any money paid under the contract and be paid any interest and reasonable costs payable under the contract; and
 - (b) all those amounts are a charge on the land until payment; and
 - (c) the purchaser may also recover any loss otherwise recoverable.
- 28.4 If the contract ends by a default notice given by the vendor:
 - (a) the deposit up to 10% of the price is forfeited to the vendor as the vendor's absolute property, whether the deposit has been paid or not; and
 - (b) the vendor is entitled to possession of the property; and
 - (c) in addition to any other remedy, the vendor may within one year of the contract ending either:
 - (i) retain the property and sue for damages for breach of contract; or
 - (ii) resell the property in any manner and recover any deficiency in the price on the resale and any resulting expenses by way of liquidated damages; and
 - (d) the vendor may retain any part of the price paid until the vendor's damages have been determined and may apply that money towards those damages; and
 - (e) any determination of the vendor's damages must take into account the amount forfeited to the vendor.
- 28.5 The ending of the contract does not affect the rights of the offended party as a consequence of the default.

Louvre Defect Rectification Project-Update

Mr Richard Dennis provided members with an update on the defective louvre rectification project, noting that over the last 12 months he has been working with the OC committee and OC Chairman Bruce Board, Lot 1102, to prepare engineer designed and approved louvre brackets that could be used to manually operate the external louvre by an abseilor (external access) when the windows are cleaned. Richard noted that the purpose of the brackets is to reinforce the structural integrity of the louvres once the actuator (winder) is disconnected from the louvre. Richard noted that review and sign off from an engineer will indemnify the OC of potential liability. Richard presented pictures of the louvre bracket samples and also presented a video of the louvre brackets that were installed in February 2024 as part of a trial to show how the bracket mechanism works and can be set to either 90 degrees or 45 degrees by external abseil access.

Lot 1102 Bruce Board provided members with a detailed explanation of how the louvre bracket works mechanically and explained that the brackets consist of two telescoping cylindrical steel tubes connected by a pin. Bruce advised members that the current brackets are made of galvanised steel and that he and the committee are working with the engineers to refine the design of the bracket so that so that its more efficient, durable and easier to operate.

Bruce noted that the committee has engaged a fabricator that is capable of manufacturing the 100 (plus) brackets and that an abseilor has already inspected the façade of the building and measured the louvre sets as they vary in terms of louvre blades per set. Bruce noted that once the bracket design has been refined and approved by the engineer the brackets will be ordered and installed. Bruce advised members that a further update on this project would be provided once the louvre brackets have been manufactured and an installation date has been scheduled. Bruce reminded owners that the cost related to this work will be covered by the existing maintenance plan funds. No further questions were raised by members.

ACTION: Verticali to provide owners and agents with an update on the louvre project once an installation date has been confirmed.

Paint and Carpet Maintenance Project

Richard advised members that the painting project related to all common hallways, unit doors and the foyer was completed in early 2024 and that overall residents were helpful throughout the project. Richard noted that the replacement of the common hallway carpet (each level) is underway and scheduled to be completed before the end of April 2024. It was noted that the new carpet will be much easier to maintain and clean. Members tabled a vote of thanks to the OC committee for their management of the paint and carpet projects. Richard tabled pictures of the completed painting and carpet works. No further questions were raised by members.

Contractors List

Richard reminded members that a contractors list is available for owners' reference on MIMOR or upon request to the OC Manager. Richard noted that a maintenance reminder letter was issued to all owners/agents in Jan 2024, which reminded owners of their maintenance obligations. Richard noted that the discount maintenance offers for smoke alarms, private plumbing/drains and AC units will be rolled out again in 2024 (mid year).

Private Terrace AC Unit Servicing

Richard reminded members that the maintenance of all private AC units on unit terraces is the responsibility of the owner/agent. Richard noted that currently there is a heavy metal grate that covers the AC units which make access difficult and that a failure to regularly service the AC unit could represent a fire hazard. Richard noted that the OC committee and building manager has been working with Lot 310 to organise a pivot hinge gate design & proposal to make the access of the AC units much easier for the AC techs and for the owners. Lot 310, Jarrod Walls provided members with a summary of the hinge gate and some pictures were presented to members for reference. Lot 310 noted that the retrofit makes access to the AC unit much simpler. It was noted that once the hinge proposal has been finalised and priced by a contractor, an update would be issued to all owners/agents so that they can get the gate installed if they so choose (at each owner's expense).

ACTION: Verticali to provide owners/agents with an update on the AC unit pivot gate proposal once finalised and priced.

Private unit intercom upgrade proposal

Lot 310, Jarrod Walls advised members that he has been working with the OC committee and building management to organise quotes/proposals to upgrade common and private unit intercom systems so that they have greater functionality. Jarrod tabled two (2) quotes and the pros and cons for each of these proposals. Jarrod noted that is awaiting another quote and will report to the committee.

It was noted that the OC would pay to upgrade the common intercom system and each owner would pay to upgrade their private unit intercom. Jarrod advised members that he is waiting for further proposals and an update on this project would be provided to owners/agents once an intercom upgrade rollout plan has been organised by the OC committee. Members thanked Jarrod for his work on this project.

ACTION: Verticali to provide owners/agents with an update on the intercom upgrade project once a plan has been approved by the OC committee.

Vote of thanks to the OC Chairman, OC Committee and Building Management

Members tabled a vote of thanks to the appointed Committee Chairperson Bruce Board, the appointed OC Committee and Building Management for their work throughout 2023.

The Victorian Building Authority (**VBA**) is leading the Victorian State-wide Cladding Audit on behalf of the Victorian Government. The project's focus is on reducing the fire safety risk of buildings found to have combustible cladding – such as expanded polystyrene (EPS) or aluminium composite panels (ACP) with a polyethylene / polymer core.

As part of the audit, an inspection was carried out on the above building. An expert panel (**the panel**) then assessed the results of this inspection on 18 July 2018, along with key fire safety elements of the building. The panel comprised a building surveyor (unlimited), fire safety engineer and representative of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade (**MFB**).

The role of the panel is to consider if combustible cladding significantly affects the safety of occupants and the public and provides recommendations to the Municipal Building Surveyor (MBS) on actions that may be required.

The panel did not identify any ACP or EPS on the building, therefore this building is out of scope for the State-wide Cladding Audit.

Please update occupants about the panel's findings. The VBA suggests that this letter and the attached brochure about fire safety tips for apartment balconies be distributed to occupants and displayed in the building.

It is the building owner's responsibility to ensure that all essential safety measures are maintained in a fully operational manner and records of maintenance are updated and available for inspection. It's also a good time to review the fire safety practices for the building. We recommend the following actions:

- 1. Ensure smoke alarms are in working order and are not obstructed, hindered or disabled.
- 2. Adopt good housekeeping measures to ensure combustible materials or waste are not stored at ground level, on balconies or near temporary fixtures such as blinds or awnings.



- 3. Ignition sources such as barbeques, heaters and smoking should be avoided on balconies or near combustible material.
- 4. Make sure fire doors are not blocked, obstructed or held open.
- 5. All occupants should be familiar with fire safety procedures and the building's evacuation plan.

RULES FOR OWNERS CORPORATION PS 638800J

1. Definitions

In these rules:-

- (a) "Act" means the Owners Corporation Act 2006 (Vic);
- (b) "Building" means the Development located on at 70 Queens Road, Melbourne;
- (c) "Building Manager" means the person appointed by the Owners Corporation to be the building manager for the purposes detailed in these rules;
- (d) **"Owners Corporation Manager"** means the person for the time being appointed by the Owners Corporation as the manager of the Owners Corporation;
- (e) **"Government Agency"** means any government or semi-government, administrative, fiscal or judicial department, commission, authority, tribunal, agency or entity;
- (f) "Land" means the whole of the land described in the Plan;
- (g) "Plan" means Plan of Subdivision No. PS638800J;
- (h) "Owners Corporation" means owners corporation PS638800J;
- (i) "Proprietor of a lot" includes the owner of a lot and an occupier of that lot;
- (j) "Regulations" means Owners Corporation Regulations 2007;
- (k) "Residential Lot" means a lot intended to be used for residential purposes;
- "Security Key" means a key, magnetic card or other device used to open and close doors, gates and locks or to generate alarms, security systems or communication systems in respect of a lot or the common property;
- (m) Unless the context other requires:
 - i. headings are for convenience only;
 - ii. words importing a gender include any gender;
 - iii. an expression importing a natural person includes any company, partnership, joint venture, association, corporation or other Owners Corporation and any Governmental Agency;
 - iv. a reference to a person includes a reference to the person's executors, administration, succession, substitutes (including, without limitation, persons taking by novation) and assigns;
 - a reference to any statute, regulation, proclamation, ordinance or by-law includes all statutes, regulations, proclamations, ordinances or by-laws varying, consolidating or replacing them, and a reference to a statute includes all regulations, proclamations, ordinances and by-laws issued under that statute;
 - vi. a reference to an Owners Corporation includes any elected committee of the Owners Corporation; and

vii. a reference to a thing includes part of that thing.

The obligations and restrictions set out in these rules shall be read subject to the rights, grants or privileges that may be given to any person or persons by the Owners Corporation from time to time and to the extent of any inconsistency, such rights, grants or privileges prevail over these rules in respect of the person or persons to whom they are given.

2. Health, safety and security

2.1. Health, safety and security of lot owners, occupiers of lots and others

A lot owner or occupier must not use the lot, or permit it to be used, so as to cause a hazard to the health, safety and security of an owner, occupier, or user of another lot.

2.2. Storage of flammable liquids and other dangerous substances and materials

- (a) Except with the approval in writing of the Owners Corporation, an owner or occupier of a lot must not use or store on the lot or on the common property any flammable chemical, liquid or gas or other flammable material.
- (b) This rule does not apply to:-
 - chemicals, liquids, gases or other material used or intended to be used for domestic purposes; or
 - ii. any chemical, liquid, gas or other material in a fuel tank of a motor vehicle or internal combustion engine.

2.3. Waste disposal

An owner or occupier must ensure that the disposal of garbage or waste does not adversely affect the health, hygiene or comfort of the occupiers or users of other lots.

2.4. Garbage

- (a) A Proprietor of a lot must not deposit or throw garbage onto the common property except into a receptacle or area specifically provided for that purpose.
- (b) A Proprietor of a lot must dispose of garbage in a manner specified by the Owners Corporation from time to time but otherwise:-
 - glass items must be completely drained, cleaned and deposited in unbroken condition in the area designated for such items by the Owners Corporation;
 - ii. recyclable items, (without limitation, paper, cardboard and plastic) as from time to time nominated by the Owners Corporation must be stored in the area designated for the items by the Owners Corporation.
 - iii. cardboard boxes and packaging must be broken down, tied with string, and neatly packed in the garbage area; and
 - iv. all other garbage must be drained and securely wrapped in small parcels deposited in the garbage chute (where one is provided) situated on the common property.

2.5. Consent of the Owners Corporation

A consent given by the Owners Corporation under these rules will, if applicable, be revocable and may be given subject to conditions that the Proprietor of the lot to which the consent or approval relates is responsible for compliance with.

2.6. Complaints and Applications

Any complaint or application to the Owners Corporation must be addressed in writing to the Owners Corporation Manager, or where there is no Owners Corporation Manager, the secretary of the Owners Corporation.

2.7. Use of Appurtenances

The water closets, conveniences and other water apparatus including waste pipes and drains shall not be used for any purpose other than those for which they are constructed and rubbish or other unsuitable substances shall not be deposited therein. Any costs or expenses resulting from any damage or blockage shall be borne by the Proprietor of the lot causing the damage or blockage.

2.8. Infectious Diseases

In the event of any infectious diseases which may require notification by virtue of any statute, regulation or ordinances affecting any person in any lot, the Proprietor of the lot shall give, or cause to be given, written notice thereof and any other information which may be required relative thereto to the Owners Corporation Manager and shall pay to the Owners Corporation the expenses of disinfecting the Building where necessary and replacing any articles or things the destruction of which may be rendered necessary by such disease.

2.9. Access to Lots

Except in the case of an emergency (in which case no notice shall be required) upon one (1) days notice in writing the Owners Corporation or the Owners Corporation Manager and their servants agents and contractors shall be permitted to inspect the interior of any lot and test the electrical, gas or water installation or equipment therein and to trace and repair any leakage or defect in the said installations or equipment (at the expense of the lot Proprietor in cases where such leakage or defect us due to any act or default of the lot Proprietor or its invitees). The Owners Corporation and the Owners Corporation Manager, in exercising this power, shall ensure that their servants, agents and employees cause as little inconvenience to the lot Proprietor as is reasonable in the circumstances.

3. Management and administration

3.1. Metering of services and apportionment of costs of services

- (a) The Owners Corporation must not seek payment or reimbursement for a cost or charge from a lot owner or occupier that is more than the amount that the supplier would have charged the lot owner or occupier for the same goods or services.
- (b) If a supplier has issued an account to the Owners Corporation, the Owners Corporation cannot recover from the lot owner or occupier an amount which includes any amount that is able to be claimed as a concession or rebate by or on behalf of the lot owner or occupier from the relevant supplier.
- (c) Subrule (ii) does not apply if the concession or rebate:
 - i. must be claimed by the lot owner or occupier and the Owners Corporation has given the lot owner or occupier an opportunity to claim it and the lot owner or occupier has not done so by the payment date set by the relevant supplier; or
 - ii. is paid directly to the lot owner or occupier as a refund.

3.2. Security Keys

- (a) The Owners Corporation may charge a reasonable fee for any additional Security Key required by a Proprietor of a lot.
- (b) A Proprietor of a lot must exercise a high degree of caution and responsibility in making a Security Key available for use by any other Proprietor of a lot and must use all reasonable endeavours including, without limitation, an appropriate stipulation in any lease or licence of a lot to the occupier to ensure the return of the Security Key to the Proprietor or the Owners Corporation.
- (c) A Proprietor of a lot in possession of a Security Key must not, without written consent from the Owners Corporation, duplicate the Security Key or permit it to be duplicated and must take all reasonable precautions to ensure that the Security Key is not lost or handed to any person other than another Proprietor and is not disposed of otherwise than by returning it to the Proprietor or the Owners Corporation.
- (d) A Proprietor of a lot must promptly notify the Owners Corporation Manager if a Security Key issued to it is lost or destroyed.
- (e) A proprietor of a lot must keep the Building Manager informed at all times of the names and the addresses and telephone numbers of all persons in possession of a Security Key so that the Building Manager may maintain a register of Security Key holders which is up to date at all times.

3.3. Fire Control

The building is designed in compliance with the Building Code of Australia as amended by the provisions of the Fire Engineering Report. Details of the "Building Owners Responsibility" summary report are contained in the Apartment Owners Manual. Therefore:-

- (a) a Proprietor of a lot must not use or interfere with any fire safety equipment except in the case of an emergency and must not obstruct any fire stairs or fire escapes;
- a Proprietor of a lot must ensure compliance with all statutory and other requirements relating to fire and fire safety in respect of its lot;
- (c) a Proprietor of a lot must ensure that all smoke detectors installed in the lot are properly maintained and tested monthly and that back up batteries relating to the smoke detectors are replaced whenever necessary; and
- (d) a Proprietor of a lot must comply with all fire safety requirements applicable to occupiers of the Building and the directions of all persons authorised to carry out the required procedures including allowing access to the lot for inspection and maintenance of Range Hood Exhaust Systems, smoke detectors and sprinkler systems, and other compliance issues.

4. Lots

4.1. Change of use of lots

An owner or occupier of a lot must give written notification to the Owners Corporation if the owner or occupier changes the existing use of the lot in a way that will affect the insurance premiums for the Owners Corporation.

4.2. Support and provision of services

Except for the purposes of maintenance and renewal and with the written consent of the Owners Corporation, a Proprietor of a lot must not do anything or permit anything to be done on or in relation to that lot or the common property so that:-

- (a) any support or shelter provided by that lot or the common property for any other lot or the common property is interfered with; or
- (b) the structural and functional integrity of any part of the common property is impaired; or
- (c) The passage or provision of services through the lot or the common property is interfered with.

4.3. Cleaning and Repair of Lots, Balconies and Terraces

- a Proprietor of a lot must keep that lot and any balcony or terrace used in conjunction with the lot clean and in good repair.
- (b) A Proprietor of a lot must ensure its car parking space(s) and nearby common property are free of oil and like substances. The Owners Corporation reserves the right to clean any common property near a Proprietor's space(s) which is stained by oil, petrol or a like substance and charge that Proprietor for the cost. The Owners Corporation will give fourteen (14) days notice of its intention to do such cleaning.

4.4. Signs, Blinds and Awnings

- (a) A Proprietor of a lot must not, without the prior written consent of the Owners Corporation, erect or affix any sign or notice to any part of the common property or within the lots so as to be visible from outside the lot unless approved by the Owners Corporation.
- (b) A Proprietor of a lot must not install or permit the installation of any window coverings other than roller blind and s-fold curtain specified by the Owners Corporation. Blinds should not be attached to the window frame under any circumstances.
- (c) A Proprietor of a lot must not install, or permit the installation of, any awnings other than as approved by the Owners Corporation.
- (d) Nothing in this rule 4.4 prohibits the Proprietor of a lot used as a restaurant, café or for other commercial purposes from affixing a sign to the common property provided the sign:-
 - is for the purpose of identifying the business carried on from the lot and the hours of operation of the business;
 - ii. complies with the requirements of all relevant authorities;
 - iii. is in the immediate vicinity of the lot; and
 - iv. is approved in writing by the holder of a lease or licence from the Owners Corporation of or relating to the particular area of the common property.

4.5. Appearance of a Lot

Without limiting any other of these rules, a Proprietor of a lot must not:-

- (a) without prior written consent of the Owners Corporation maintain inside the lot anything visible from outside the lot that when viewed from outside the lot is not in keeping with the rest of the Building and for the sake of clarity this includes window furnishings;
- (b) install bars, screens or grilles or other safety devices to the exterior of any windows or doors of a lot without the prior written consent of the Owners Corporation;
- (c) operate or permit to be operated on the lot or within it any device or electronic equipment which interferes with any domestic appliance lawfully in use on the common property, another lot or another part of the Building;

- (d) without the prior written consent of the Owners Corporation attach or hand from the exterior of the lot any aerial or any security device or wires;
- (e) install or operate any intrude alarm which emits an audible signal;
- (f) place, display or hand any chattel or item (including any item of clothing or any wind chimes) on or from a balcony or terrace forming part of the common property;
- (g) allow any glazed portions of the lot or the common property that surrounds the lot to be tinted or otherwise treated with the effect that the visual characteristics of the glazing will change;
- install any external wireless, television aerial, skydish receiver, satellite dish or receiver or any other apparatus that can be viewed from the exterior of the Building;
- (i) install any air conditioning unit in a lot other than in a place nominated by the Owners Corporation; or
- (j) install any pipes, wiring, cables or the like to the external face of the Building.

4.6. Painting, Finishing, etc

A Proprietor of a lot must not paint, finish or otherwise alter the external façade of the Building.

4.7. Clothes Drying and Appearance of a Lot

A Proprietor of a lot must not place any washing, towel or other article on the common property or so as to be visible from the common property or from outside the Building without the written consent of the Owners Corporation.

4.8. Compliance with Laws

A Proprietor of a lot must at the Proprietor's own expense promptly comply with all laws relating to the lot including, without limitation, any requirements, notices and orders of any Governmental Agency.

4.9. No Trade or Business in Residential Lots

The Proprietor of a residential lot must not use that lot or any part of the common property relating to residential lots for any trade business or profession nor permit other to do so unless:-

- (a) the person conducting the trade or business is a full time resident of the lot and only operates a home office;
- (b) the planning scheme governing the issue of that lot permits the trade or business to be carried on from that lot;
- (c) any requirements in respect of the trade or business stipulated by any relevant authority from time to time are complied with; and
- (d) the trade or business can be carried on, and is carried on, without causing undue nuisance to the Proprietors of other lots or greater security risk.

5. Use of common property

5.1. Use of common property

(a) An owner or occupier of a lot must not obstruct the lawful use and enjoyment of the common property by any other person entitled to use the common property.

- (b) An owner or occupier of a lot must not, without the written approval of the Owners Corporation, use for his or her own purposes as a garden any portion of the common property.
- (c) An approval under subrule (b) may state a period for which the approval is granted.
- (d) If the Owners Corporation has resolved that an animal is a danger or is causing a nuisance to the common property, it must give reasonable notice of this resolution to the owner or occupier who is keeping the animal.
- (e) An owner or occupier of a lot who is keeping an animal that is the subject of a notice under subrule (d) must remove that animal.
- (f) Subrules (d) and (e) do not apply to an animal that assists a person with an impairment or disability.

5.2. Compliance with Rules by Invitees

- (a) A Proprietor of a lot must take all reasonable steps to ensure that its invitees comply with these rules and in default take all reasonable steps to ensure that its invitees leave the Building.
- (b) A Proprietor of a lot which is the subject of a lease or licence agreement must include in the lease or licence agreement an obligation of the lessee or licensee to observe these rules and must take all reasonable steps, including any action available under the lease or licence agreement, to ensure that any lessee or licensee of the lot and any invitees of that lessee or licensee comply with these rules.
- (c) A Proprietor of a lot shall ensure that, in the event of such Proprietor holding a function or party involving ten (10) or more guests, such Proprietor shall engage security at the front entrance to greet, admit and escort any invitee or guest to the appropriate lift bank and to maintain security during the period of the function. The Proprietor of a lot shall also, in such event, give notice of such function to the Building Manager and ensure that any security staff comply with the requests and directions of the Building Manager from time to time and behave appropriately and courteously to all other members of the Owners Corporation.
- (d) A Proprietor of a lot shall ensure that any selling or leasing agent engaged by such Proprietor shall not place any exhibit or advertising boards at the entry-way to the property in common areas or on the footpath at the entry-way to the property, in common areas or on the footpath at the entry-ways. Any such selling or leasing agent shall be required at any inspection time to ensure the front entry is manned as well as the respective apartment floor level lobby with personnel suitably attired at all times during any open for inspections or auction and to ensure that all persons attending such open for inspection or auction are escorted from the entry to the appropriate lift bank and from the lift lobby of the respective floor level to the relevant property open for inspection or auction.

5.3. Vehicles and parking on common property

An owner or occupier of a lot must not, unless in the case of an emergency, park or leave a motor vehicle or other vehicle or permit a motor vehicle or other vehicle:-

- (a) to be parked or left in parking spaces situated on common property and allocated for other lots; or
- (b) on the common property so as to obstruct a driveway, pathway, entrance or exit to a lot; or
- (c) in any place other than a parking area situated on common property specified for that purpose by the Owners Corporation; or
- (d) to be parked by a visitor to its lot to use other than those spaces allocated to its lot or to visitors.

5.4. Damage to common property

- (a) An owner or occupier of a lot must not damage or alter the common property without the written approval of the Owners Corporation.
- (b) An owner or occupier of a lot must not damage or alter a structure that forms part of the common property without the written approval of the Owners Corporation.
- (c) An approval under subrule (a) or (b) may state a period for which the approval is granted, and may specify the works and conditions to which the approval is subject.
- (d) An owner or person authorised by an owner may install a locking or safety device to protect the lot against intruders, or a screen or barrier to prevent entry of animals or insects, if the device, screen or barrier is soundly built and is consistent with the colour, style and materials of the building.
- (e) The owner or person referred to in subrule (d) must keep any device, screen or barrier installed in good order and repair.
- (f) A Proprietor of a lot shall not mark, paint or otherwise damage or deface, any structure that forms part of the common property without the consent in writing of the Owners Corporation.
- (g) A Proprietor of a lot must not breach the fire regulations by installing unapproved dead locks or peep holes on any lot or common property that would void the Owners Corporation Insurance Policy.

5.5. Interference with Common Property or Services

- (a) A Proprietor of a lot must not, without the prior written consent of the Owners Corporation remove any article from the common property placed there by direction or authority of the Owners Corporation and must use all reasonable endeavours to ensure that those articles are used only for their intended use and not damaged.
- (b) A Proprietor of a lot must not interfere with, alter or modify any of the common services in the Building or the operation of any plant and equipment owned by the Owners Corporation installed on the common property or in any of the lots.
- (c) A Proprietor of a lot must not modify any air conditioning, heating or ventilation system, or associated ducting, servicing that lot without the prior written consent of the Owners Corporation.
- (d) A Proprietor of a lot must not install nor permit the installation of covering to any storage area or storage lot other than as permitted by the Owners Corporation.
- (e) A Proprietor of a lot must not modify any intercom, television aerial or communication system (except telephone connections) servicing that lot without the prior written consent of the Owners Corporation.
- (f) A Proprietor of a lot must not enter any plant room without the consent of the Owners Corporation.
- (g) A Proprietor of a lot must not do any act or thing or allow any act or thing to be done to the lot or the common property that may in any way damage or interfere with the use of cabling, line links, head ends, wiring conduits, boxes, wall plates, splitters and ancillary equipment ("the electronic cabling") installed or to be installed by Project Ascari Pty Ltd in the Building in order to provide telephone service, cable television, internet or other such telecommunications or electronic data or services. t is acknowledged that the electronic cabling remains the property of Project Ascari Pty Ltd.

- (h) A Proprietor of a lot must not do any act or thing to interfere with the fresh air supply, design and pressure equalisation of the Building and shall not place any obstruction or permanent door seal to the base of any apartment entry door.
- (i) A proprietor of a lot must not operate any barbeque or similar cooking appliance other than in an open, ventilated area or balcony. In all circumstances the Proprietor of a lot must not operate any gas barbeque in any winter garden area of any apartment unless strictly in accordance with a specific approval granted and which barbeque shall fully comply with any engineering requirements relating to reticulated gas supply, sprinkler protection, exhaust ducting, and flame failure shut-off valves. For the purposes of this rule, and without limiting the foregoing, under no circumstances shall a Proprietor of any lot operate a gas barbeque in a winter garden using a portable gas bottle.

5.6. Security of Common Property

A Proprietor of a lot or persons thereon from time to time must not do or permit anything which may prejudice the security or safety of the common property or any person in or about the Building.

5.7. Notification of Defects

A Proprietor of a lot must promptly notify the Owners Corporation of the Owners Corporation Manager on becoming aware of any damage to, or defect in, the common property or any personal property vested in the Owners Corporation.

5.8. Compensation to Owners Corporation

The Proprietor of a lot shall compensate the Owners Corporation in respect of any damage to the common property or property vested in the Owners Corporation caused by that Proprietor or its respective tenants, licensees or invitees.

5.9. Restricted use of Common Property

- (a) The Owners Corporation may take measures to ensure the security, and to preserve the safety of, the common property and the lots affected by the Owners Corporation from fire or other hazards and without limitation may:-
 - close off any part of the common property not required for access to a lot on either a temporary basis, or otherwise restrict the access to, or use by, Proprietors of lots of any part of the common property;
 - ii. permit, to the exclusion of Proprietors of lost, any designated part of the common property to be used by any security person as a means of monitoring the security and general safety of the lots, either solely or in conjunction with other lots; and
 - iii. restrict, by means of key or other security device, the access of the Proprietors of lots on one level of the Building to any other level of the Building.
- (b) A Proprietor of a lot must abide by any actions taken by the Owners Corporation in accordance with rule 5.9 (a).

5.10. Vehicles on Common Property

A Proprietor of a lot must not permit oil leakages from any motor vehicle, trailer or motor cycle onto the common property and must reimburse the Owners Corporation for the cost of cleaning or removing any oil stains to the garage or other part of the common property after due notice has been served.

5.11. Storage of Bicycles

A Proprietor must not:-

- (a) permit any bicycle to be stored, kept or left other than in a storage area or a storage cage within a car park lot or part of the lot owned by the Proprietor of the lot or in the areas (if any) of the common property that may be designated by the Owners Corporation or the Owners Corporation Manager for such purposes from time to time; or
- (b) bring or permit any bicycle to be brought into a residential lot or a balcony; or
- (c) bring or permit any bicycle to be brought into the foyer, stairwells, hallways, garden areas, walkways or other parts of the common property except the basement car park levels.

5.12. Interference with Exclusive and Special Rights

- (a) A Proprietor of a lost must not use any parts of the common property in respect of which exclusive use and enjoyment rights may be given or granted by the Owners Corporation to a third party.
- (b) A Proprietor of a lot must not interferer with or obstruct the Owners Corporation Manager from performing its duties under any building management agreement entered into from time to time.

5.13. Building Works

- (a) A Proprietor of a lost must not undertaken any building works within or about or relating to a lot or on or to common property including without limiting the generality of the foregoing the removal of walls between the lots or the installation of cages in storage areas or which affect the external appearance of the Building or any of the common property or which affect the Building structure or services or the fire or acoustic ratings of any component of the Building except in accordance with the following requirements:-
 - such building works may only be undertaken after all requisite permits, approvals and consents under all relevant laws have been obtained and copies given to the Owners Corporation Manager, and then strictly in accordance with those permits approvals and consents and any conditions thereof;
 - ii. the Proprietor of a lot must at all times ensure that such works are undertaken in a reasonable manner so as to minimise any nuisance, annoyance, disturbance and inconvenience from building operations to other Proprietors; and
 - iii. in the case of a storage unit within a lot the works must comply with the standard storage unit details as approved by the Owners Corporation.
- (b) The Proprietor of a lot must not proceed with any such works until the Proprietor:-
 - submits to the Owners Corporation plans and specifications of any works proposed by the Proprietor;
 - ii. supplies to the Owners Corporation such further particulars of those proposed works as the Owners Corporation may request, and as shall be reasonable to enable the Owners Corporation to be reasonably satisfied that those proposed works accord with the reasonable aesthetic and orderly development of the Building, do not endanger the Building and are compatible with the overall services to the Building and the individual floors:
 - iii. Receives written approval for those works from the Owners Corporation, such approval not to be unreasonably or capriciously withheld but which may be given subject to the condition that the reasonable costs of the Owners Corporation (which may include the costs of a building practitioner engaged by the Owners Corporation to consider such plans and specifications) of giving such consent including any additional costs incurred by the Owners Corporation in respect of extra work required to be undertaken by the Owners Corporation Manager and the legal costs relating to the preparation of a Building Works Agreement if the Owners Corporation considers such an Agreement to

be necessary are to be paid by the Proprietor and such approval shall not be effective until such costs have been paid; and

- iv. Pays such reasonable costs to the Owners Corporation.
- (c) The Proprietor of a lot must ensure that the Proprietor and the Proprietor's servants agents and contractors undertaking such works comply with the property and reasonable directions of the Owners Corporation concerning the method of building operations, means of access, use of the common property, on-site management and building protection and hours of work (and the main Building entrance and foyer must not be used for the purposes of taking building materials or building workmen to and from the relevant lot unless the Owners Corporation gives written consent to do so) and that such servants agent and contractors are supervised in the carrying out of such works so as to minimise any damage or to dirtying of the common property and the services therein.
- (d) Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Proprietor of a lot must not use hammer drills or jack hammers in a lot on weekends or public holidays or between the hours of 4pm to 9am on weekdays. Without limiting the rule of 5.13 (c), the Proprietor of a lot must ensure that the Proprietor and the Proprietor's servants agents and contractors undertaking such works observe the following restrictions in respect of the works:
 - i. building material must not be stacked or stored in the front side or rear of the building;
 - ii. scaffolding must not be erected on the common property or the exterior of the Building;
 - iii. construction work must comply with all laws of the relevant Government Agencies;
 - iv. the exterior and the common property of the Building must at all times be maintained in a clean tidy and safe state; and
 - v. construction vehicles and construction workers' vehicles must not be brought into, or parked in, the common property.
- (e) Before any of the Proprietor's works commence the Proprietor must:
 - i. cause to be effected and maintained during the period of the building works, a contractor's all risk insurance policy to the satisfaction of the Owners Corporation; and
 - ii. deliver a copy of the policy and certificate of currency in respect of the policy to the Owners Corporation.
- (f) Access shall not be available to other lots on the Plan or the common property on the Plan for the installation and maintenance of services and associated building works without the consent or licence of the Proprietor of the relevant lot or of the Owners Corporation in the case of the common property.
- (g) The Proprietor of a lot shall immediately make good all damage to, and dirtying of, the Building, the common property, the services thereof or any fixtures fittings and finishes which are caused by such works. If the Proprietor fails to immediately do so the Owners Corporation may in its absolute discretion (or if the Proprietor fails to do so within a reasonable period of time) make good the damage and dirtying and in the event the Proprietor shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Owners Corporation against any costs or liabilities incurred by the Owners Corporation in so making good the damage or dirtying.

5.14. Selling and Leasing

A Proprietor of a lot must not allow erection of any for sale or for lease boards on the common property.

5.15. Proprietors Moving Furniture and other Articles

- (a) Proprietors moving furniture and other articles likely to cause damage or obstructions through the common property must not:-
 - do so without notifying the Building Manager at least 48 hours prior to the proposed move and without receiving approval from the Building Manager for the day and time of the proposed move;
 - ii. do so on a Sunday or public holiday;
 - iii. do so on a Saturday without paying the fee set by the Owners Corporation for the overtime attendance of the Building Manager or other security personnel;
 - iv. permit any carriers or tradespeople to commence operations prior to their making contact upon arrival with the Building Manager;
 - permit any furniture or other articles to be brought into or out of the Building other than
 via the goods hoist or goods lift or basement loading dock;
 - vi. permit any vehicles to restrict access to the car park;
 - vii. permit any carriers to enter the Building other than via the loading dock;
 - viii. conduct operations so as to unduly restrict access of other Proprietors of a lot to the lifts or lobbies or restrict access to fire escapes;
 - ix. place any furniture or items in a lift other than that specified by the Building Manager an, in any event, not until protective covers have been placed in the lift by the Building Manager;
 - x. permit any furniture or other items to come into contact in any way with the lift doors, including static contact or leaning or stacking against the door; or
 - xi. damage the common property.

Proprietors moving in or our of the Building will be liable to the Owners Corporation for any damage caused to the Building in doing so. IF any amount to be paid by a Proprietor of the lot moving in or out is not paid within 14 days of the date of moving (and that Proprietor of the lot is not the owner of the lot), then the Owners Corporation may recover the amount owed from the owner of the lot.

6. Behaviour of persons

6.1. Behaviour of owners, occupiers and invitees on common property

An owner or occupier of a lot must take all reasonable steps to ensure that guests of the owner or occupier do not behave in a manner likely to unreasonably interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of any other person entitled to use the common property.

6.2. Noise and other nuisance control

- (a) An owner or occupier of a lot, or a guest of an owner or occupier, must not unreasonably create any noise likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of any other person entitled to use the common property.
- (b) Subrule (a) does not apply to the making of a noise if the Owners Corporation has given written permission for the noise to be made.

6.3. Behaviour by Proprietors

- (a) A Proprietor of a lot must not wash any motor vehicle in a lot or on common property.
- (b) A Proprietor of a lot when on common property, or on any part of a lot so as to be visible from another lot or from common property, must be clothed and must not use language or behave in a manner likely to cause offence or embarrassment to the Proprietor of another lot or to any person lawfully using common property.
- (c) A Proprietor of a lot must not smoke in the stairwells, lifts, foyers, car park lobbies, loading docks or areas set aside for plant and storage within the common property, or such other parts of the common property as the Owners Corporation or its Owners Corporation Manager may designate from time to time.
- (d) A Proprietor of a lot must not and must not permit any persons under its control to play on any part of the common property or, being a child, unless accompanied by an adult, to remain on any part of the common property comprising a car parking area or other area of possible danger or hazard to children.
- (e) A Proprietor of a lot must not and must not permit any person under its control to use on the common property any skateboards, roller skates or roller blades.
- (f) A Proprietor of a lot must not dispose or permit the disposal of cigarette butts, cigarette ash or any other materials over balconies or in the common property.
- (g) A Proprietor of a lot must not and must not permit persons under its control to consume alcohol on or take glassware onto the common property.

7. Dispute resolution

- 7.1. The grievance procedure set out in this rule applies to disputes involving a lot owner, manager, or an occupier or the Owners Corporation.
- 7.2. The party making the complaint must prepare a written statement in the approved form.
- 7.3. If there is a grievance committee of the Owners Corporation, it must be notified of the dispute by the complainant.
- 7.4. If there is no grievance committee, the Owners Corporation must be notified of any dispute by the complainant, regardless of whether the Owners Corporation is an immediate party to the dispute.
- 7.5. The parties to the dispute must meet and discuss the matter in dispute, along with either the grievance committee or the Owners Corporation, within 14 working days after the dispute comes to the attention of all the parties.
- 7.6. A party to the dispute may appoint a person to act or appear on his or her behalf at the meeting.
- 7.7. If the dispute is not resolved, the grievance committee or Owners Corporation must notify each party of his or her right to take further action under Part 10 of the **Owners Corporations Act 2006**.
- 7.8. This process is separate from and does not limit any further action under Part 10 of the **Owners Corporations Act 2006**.

8. Pets and Animals

8.1. A Proprietor of a lot may only keep an animal on its lot with the consent of the Owners Corporation, which consent, shall not be reasonably withheld. For the sake of clarity, under no circumstances shall any Proprietor of a lot have more than two (2) pets and no canine pet shall be greater than 10kg in weight.

- 8.2. If any animal causes a nuisance the Owners Corporation may give notice to remove the animal from a lot or the common property (or both). The Proprietor must remove the animal from a lot or the common property immediately upon receipt of the notice from the Owners Corporation Manager.
- 8.3. A Proprietor of a lot must ensure that any animal in its control does not urinate or defecate on the common property, including internal courtyards, and must clean up immediately any mess caused by its animal.
- 8.4. A Proprietor of a lot must ensure that any animal in its control is kept on a lead, carried or in a cage whilst on the common property.
- 8.5. A Proprietor of a lot must ensure that animals enter and leave the Building through the car park levels or the basement and not through the main entrance foyer.
- 8.6. Rules 8.1 does not apply to an animal which assists a person with an impairment or disability, however, the Owners Corporation may require the owner of such animal to take reasonable steps to prevent the occurrence of any nuisance and/or damage in accordance with these Rules.

9. Project Ascari Pty Ltd

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, so long as Project Ascari Pty Ltd is a member or occupier and is an owner of a lot in any stage in the Plan, then these rules shall not in any way whatsoever apply to or be enforceable against Project Ascari Pty Ltd where to do so would prevent, hinder, obstruct or in any way interfere with any works of any nature or description that Project Ascari Pty Ltd may be engaged in, or appoint qualified contractors for, and which it may need to carry out in order to complete construction of the Building and facilities comprised in the Plan in any stage. For the purposes of this rule 9, Project Ascari Pty Ltd shall be entitled to programme the completion of any and all parts of the Building at its absolute discretion.

10. Insurance Premiums

A Proprietor of a lot must not, without prior written consent of the Owners Corporation, do or permit anything to be done which may invalidate or suspend any insurance policy or cover or increase the premium for any insurance policy effected by the Owners Corporation or another lot owner.

Statement of advice and information for prospective purchasers and lot owners

Schedule 3, Regulation 17, Owners Corporations Regulations 2018

What is an owners corporation?

The lot you are considering buying is part of an owners corporation. Whenever a plan of subdivision creates common property, an owners corporation is responsible for managing the common property. A purchaser of a lot that is part of an owners corporation automatically becomes a member of the owners corporation when the transfer of that lot to the purchaser has been registered with Land Victoria.

If you buy into an owners corporation, you will be purchasing not only the individual property, but also ownership of, and the right to use, the common property as set out in the plan of subdivision. This common property may include driveways, stairs, paths, passages, lifts, lobbies, common garden areas and other facilities set up for use by owners and occupiers. In order to identify the boundary between the individual lot you are purchasing (for which the owner is solely responsible) and the common property (for which all members of the owners corporation are responsible), you should closely inspect the plan of subdivision.

How are decisions made by an owners corporation?

As an owner, you will be required to make financial contributions to the owners corporation, in particular for the repair, maintenance and management of the common property. Decisions as to the management of this common property will be the subject of collective decision making. Decisions as to these financial contributions, which may involve significant expenditure, will be decided by a vote.

Owners corporation rules

The owners corporation rules may deal with matters such as car parking, noise, pets, the appearance or use of lots, behaviour of owners, occupiers or guests and grievance procedures.

You should look at the owners corporation rules to consider any restrictions imposed by the rules.

Lot entitlement and lot liability

The plan of subdivision will also show your lot entitlement and lot liability. Lot liability represents the share of owners corporation expenses that each lot owner is required to pay.

Lot entitlement is an owner's share of ownership of the common property, which determines voting rights. You should make sure that the allocation of lot liability and entitlement for the lot you are considering buying seems fair and reasonable.

Further information

If you are interested in finding out more about living in an owners corporation, you can contact Consumer Affairs Victoria. If you require further information about the particular owners corporation you are buying into you can inspect that owners corporation's information register.

Management of an owners corporation

An owners corporation may be self-managed by the lot owners or professionally managed by an owners corporation manager. If an owners corporation chooses to appoint a professional manager, it must be a manager registered with the Business Licensing Authority (BLA).

If you are uncertain about any aspect of the owners corporation or the documents you have received from the owners corporation, you should seek expert advice.

PART C - SAFETY-RELATED ACTIVITIES

14. Electrical safety checks

13.

- The rental provider must ensure an electrical safety check is conducted every two years by a licensed or registered electrician of all electrical installations, appliances and fittings provided by a rental provider in the rented premises, and must provide the renter with the date of the most recent safety check, in writing, on request of the renter.
- If an electrical safety check of the rented premises has not been conducted within the last two years at the time the renter occupies the premises, the rental provider must arrange an electrical safety check as soon as practicable.

15. Gas safety activities

This safety-related activity only applies if the rented premises contains any appliances, fixtures or fittings which use or supply gas.

- (a) The rental provider must ensure a gas safety check is conducted every two years by a licensed or registered gasfitter of all gas installations and fittings in the rented premises and must provide the renter with the date of the most recent safety check, in writing, on request of the renter.
- (b) If a gas safety check has not been conducted within the last two years at the time the renter occupies the premises, the rental provider must arrange a gas safety check as soon as practicable.

16. Smoke alarm safety activities

- (a) The rental provider must ensure that:
 - (i) any smoke alarm is correctly installed and in working condition; and
 - (ii) any smoke alarm is tested according to the manufacturer's instructions at least once every 12 months; and
 - (iiii) the batteries in each smoke alarm are replaced as required.
- (b) The rental provider must immediately arrange for a smoke alarm to be repaired or replaced as an urgent repair if they are notified by the renter that it is not in working order.

Note: Repair or replacement of a hard-wired smoke alarm must be undertaken by a suitably qualified person.

- (c) The rental provider, on or before the commencement of the agreement, must provide the renter with the following information in writing:
 - (i) Information about how each smoke alarm in the rented premises operates;
 - (ii) Information about how to test each smoke alarm in the rented premises;
 - (iiii) Information on the renter's obligations to not tamper with any smoke alarms and to report if a smoke alarm in the rented premises is not in working order.
- (d) The renter must give written notice to the rental provider as soon as practicable after becoming aware that a smoke alarm in the rented premises is not in working order.

Note: Regulations made under the Building Act 1993 require smoke alarms to be installed in all residential buildings.

17. Swimming pool barrier safety activities

These safety-related activities only apply if the rented premises contains a swimming pool.

- (a) The rental provider must ensure that the swimming pool barrier is maintained in good repair.
- (b) The renter must give written notice to the rental provider as soon as practicable after becoming aware that the swimming pool barrier is not in working order.
- (c) The rental provider must arrange for a swimming pool barrier to be immediately repaired or replaced as an urgent repair if they are notified by the renter that it is not in working order.
- (d) The rental provider must provide the renter with a copy of the most recent certificate of swimming pool barrier compliance issued under the *Building Act 1993* on the request of the renter.

18. Relocatable swimming pool safety activities

These safety-related activities only apply if a relocatable swimming pool is erected, or is intended to be erected, at the rented premises.

- (a) The renter must not erect a relocatable swimming pool without giving written notice to the rental provider before erecting the pool.
- (b) The renter must obtain any necessary approvals before erecting a relocatable swimming pool.

Note: Regulations made under Building Act 1993 apply to any person erecting a relocatable swimming pool.

This safety-related activity only applies to swimming pools or spas that hold water deeper than 300 mm.

19. Bushfire prone area activities

This safety-related activity only applies if the rented premises is in a bushfire prone area and is required to have a water tank for bushfire safety.

- (a) If the rented premises is in a designated bushfire prone area under section 192A of the *Building Act 1993* and a water tank is required for firefighting purposes, the rental provider must ensure the water tank and any connected infrastructure is maintained in good repair as required.
- (b) The water tank must be full and clean at the commencement of the agreement.

PART D - RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

This is a summary of selected rights and obligations of renters and rental providers under the *Residential Tenancies Act* 1997 (the Act). Any reference to VCAT refers to the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal.

Use of the premises

The renter:

- is entitled to quiet enjoyment of the premises. The rental provider may only enter the premises in accordance with the Act.
- must not use the premises for illegal purposes.
- must not cause a nuisance or interfere with the reasonable peace, comfort or privacy of neighbours.
- must avoid damaging the premises and common areas. Common areas include hallways, driveways, gardens and stairwells. Where damage occurs, the renter must notify the rental provider in writing.
- must keep the premises reasonably clean.

Condition of the premises

The rental provider:

- must ensure that the premises comply with the rental minimum standards, and is vacant and reasonably clean when the renter moves in.
- must maintain the premises in good repair and in a fit condition for occupation.
- agrees to do all the safety-related maintenance and repair activities set out in Part C of the Agreement.

The renter:

 must follow all safety-related activities set out in Part C of the agreement and not remove, deactivate or otherwise interfere with the operation of prescribed safety devices on the premises.

Modifications

The renter:

- may make some modifications without seeking the rental provider's consent. These modifications are listed on the Consumer Affairs Victoria website.
- must seek the rental provider's consent before installing any other fixtures or additions.
- may apply to VCAT if they believe that the rental provider has unreasonably refused consent for a modification mentioned in the Act.
- at the end of the agreement, must restore the premises to the condition it was in before they moved in (excluding fair wear and tear). This includes removing all modifications, unless the parties agree they do not need to be removed.

The rental provider:

must not unreasonably refuse consent for certain modifications.

A list of the modifications that the rental provider cannot unreasonably refuse consent for is available on the Consumer Affairs Victoria website consumer.vic.gov.au/renting.

Locks

- The rental provider must ensure the premises:
 - has locks to secure all windows capable of having a lock; and
 - has deadlocks (a deadlock is a deadlatch with at least one cylinder) for external doors that are able to be secured with a functioning deadlock; and
 - meets the rental minimum standards for locks and window locks.
- External doors which are not able to be secured with a functioning deadlock must at least be fitted with a locking device that:
 - is operated by a key from the outside; and
 - may be unlocked from the inside with or without a key.
- The renter must obtain consent from the rental provider to change a lock in the master key system.
- The rental provider must not unreasonably refuse consent for a renter seeking to change a lock in the master key system.
- The rental provider must not give a key to a person excluded from the premises under a:
 - a family violence intervention order; or
 - a family violence safety notice; or
 - a recognised non-local DVO; or
 - a personal safety intervention order.

Repairs

 Only a suitably qualified person may do repairs – both urgent and non-urgent.

Urgent Repairs

Section 3(1) of the Act defines *urgent repairs*. Refer to the Consumer Affairs Victoria website for the full list of urgent repairs and for more information, visit consumer.vic.gov.au/urgentrepairs.

Urgent repairs include failure or breakdown of any essential service or appliance provided for hot water, cooking, heating or laundering supplied by the rental provider.

The rental provider must carry out urgent repairs after being notified.

A renter may arrange for urgent repairs to be done if the renter has taken reasonable steps to arrange for the rental provider to immediately do the repairs and the rental provider has not carried out the repairs.

If the renter has arranged for urgent repairs, the renter may be reimbursed directly by the rental provider for the reasonable cost of repairs up to \$2500.

The renter may apply to VCAT for an order requiring the rental provider to carry out urgent repairs if:

- the renter cannot meet the cost of the repairs; or
- the cost of repairs is more than \$2500; or
- the rental provider refuses to pay the cost of repairs if it is carried out by the renter.

Non-urgent repairs

- The renter must notify the rental provider, in writing, as soon as practicable of:
 - damage to the premises.
 - a breakdown of facilities, fixtures, furniture or equipment supplied by the rental provider.
- The rental provider must carry out non-urgent repairs in a reasonable time.
- The renter may apply to VCAT for an order requiring the rental provider to do the repairs if the rental provider has not carried out the repairs within 14 days of receiving notice of the need for repair.

Assignment or sub-letting

The renter:

 must not assign (transfer to another person) or sub-let the whole or any part of the premises without the written consent of the rental provider.

The rental provider may give the renter notice to vacate if the renter assigns or sub-lets the premises without consent.

The rental provider:

- cannot unreasonably withhold consent to assign or sub-let the premises; and
- must not demand or receive a fee or payment for consent, other than any reasonable expenses incurred by the assignment.

Rent

- The rental provider must give the renter at least 60 days' written notice of a proposed rent increase.
- The rent cannot be increased more than once every 12 months.
- If the rental provider or agent does not provide a receipt for rent, the renter may request a receipt.
- The rental provider must not increase the rent under a fixed term agreement unless the agreement provides for an increase.

PART E - ADDITIONAL TERMS

21. Further Details (if any)

 - if they believe the renter has failed to follow their duties under the Act.
 - to do a pre-termination inspection where the renter has applied to have the agreement terminated because of family violence or personal violence.
- The renter must allow entry to the premises where the rental provider has followed proper procedure.
- The renter is entitled to a set amount of compensation for each sales inspection.

Pets

- The renter must seek consent from the rental provider before keeping a pet on the premises.
- The rental provider must not unreasonably refuse a request to keep a pet.

Additional General Terms



21.1 Residential Tenancies Act 1997

- (a) All provisions of this agreement are subject to the Residential Tenancies Act 1997 (Victoria) ('Act').
- (b) If there is any inconsistency between a provision of this agreement and the Act, unless the Act permits otherwise, the Act will prevail.

21.2 Renter's obligations

The renter must not:

- (a) use the premises for any other use than its place of residence;
- (b) permit, cause or use the premises for any illegal or unauthorised purpose;
- (c) damage the premises or permit or allow any of its invitees to damage the premises;
- (d) make any modifications or alterations to the premises without the rental provider's written consent unless the modification or alterations are prescribed under the act. The rental provider must comply with the Act in granting or refusing its consent.
- (e) use any of the rental provider's fixtures or fittings for any other use than the intended use;
- (f) cause or permit any interference, nuisance or an invasion of peace or privacy to any neighbouring premises;
- (g) park any vehicles, motorcycles, bicycles or scooters inside the premises and only park such vehicles in an area agreed to by the rental provider;
- (h) use any machinery or equipment owned by the rental provider and left on the premises other than in accordance with the rental provider's or manufacturer's instructions;
- (i) permit any other person than the persons agreed by the rental provider to remain on the premises for more than 14 days;
- (j) smoke or permit any invitee to smoke within the premises;
- (k) without the consent of the rental provider:
 - (i) affix any satellite dishes, television cables or antennas to the premises;
 - (ii) install any air-conditioning units on the premises; or
 - (iii) alter, replace or remove any locks and security devices to the premises other than on the letterbox, and the rental provider must comply with the Act in granting or refusing its consent and it may provide as a condition of consent and that the renter returns the premises to its original condition at the end of the tenancy or that any modification be completed by a suitably qualified person or that the renter pay an additional amount of bond.

21.3 Maintenance and repairs

- (a) The renter must:
 - (i) keep the premises in good condition and repair (subject to reasonable wear and tear);
 - (ii) replace at its cost all blown or damaged light bulbs and fluorescence tubes throughout the tenancy and ensure that all lighting is in a working condition at the end of the tenancy;
 - (iii) make good any damage to the premises caused by the renter or its invitees;
 - (iv) keep the premises clear of any rubbish;
 - (v) dispose of rubbish in accordance with council rules/guidelines and use the appropriate bins provided by or recommended by council;
 - (vi) regularly maintain the gardens (including but not limited to mowing lawns, removing weeds and watering plants, shrubs, trees and flowers) to the same standard as at the commencement of this agreement; and
 - (vii) keep all drains cleared of any blockages and not do anything which may damage any plumbing or block any drains.

21.4 Owners Corporation

- (a) If the *Owners Corporation Act 2006* (Victoria) applies to this agreement the rental provider must give the renter a copy of the rules of the owners corporation at the commencement of the tenancy.
- (b) The renter must comply with the rules of the owners corporation at all times during the tenancy.

Additional General Terms



21.5 End of occupancy

At the expiration or earlier determination of this agreement, the renter must:

- (a) deliver vacant possession of the premises to the rental provider;
- (b) deliver to the rental provider or its agent all keys and security devices;
- (c) leave the premises in the same conditions (fair wear and tear excepted) as set out in the condition report; and
- (d) remove all of the renter's premises and belongings (including fixtures and modifications where required) from the premises and rectify any damage (at the renter's cost) caused by such removal.

21.6 Insurance

- (a) In relation to insurance policies taken out by the rental provider in respect of the Premises, the renter must not do any act or omission which would make an insurance policy invalid.
- (b) The renter acknowledges that it will be responsible to insure its contents (at its own cost).

21.7 Release

- (a) The renter releases the rental provider from any claims, losses, liabilities and/or expenses ('Loss') the renter suffers in connection with the premises or arising out of this agreement, unless such Loss is caused by the rental provider or its agent or someone acting on their behalf.
- (b) The release provided by the renter survives the expiration or termination of this agreement.

21.8 Privacy

- (a) As part of the rental provider leasing the premises to the renter, the renter will be required to give the rental provider or its agent Personal Information (as defined in the *Privacy Act 1998* (Cth)).
- (b) Subject to the *Privacy Act 1998* (Cth), the renter consents to providing such information and permits the rental provider and/or its agent to disclose the information to third parties.
- (c) If the rental provider or its agent is required to maintain a privacy policy in accordance with the *Privacy Act* 1998 (Cth), upon request from the renter, the rental provider or its agent must provide the renter with a copy of its privacy policy.

21.9 Counterparts and Execution

- (a) This agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts. All counterparts together will be taken to constitute one instrument of the relevant document.
- (b) A copy of an original executed counterpart sent by facsimile machine, email or link emailed:
 - (i) must be treated as an original counterpart;
 - (ii) is sufficient evidence of the execution of the original; and
 - (iii) may be produced in evidence for all purposes in place of the original.
- (c) Each party consents to this agreement being signed by any other party in accordance with an electronic communication method and being given or produced by electronic communication, including by link emailed to a party to download an electronic copy.
- (d) Without limiting **clause 39(c)**, the parties acknowledge and agree that electronic signatures will constitute a signature and have the same quality of integrity as a written signature including if the signature is:
 - (i) computer generated;
 - (ii) by computer pen;
 - (iii) by a typed mark or name; or
 - (iv) physically signed on paper and scanned electronically.
- (e) The parties to this agreement agree that, despite any other clause of this agreement and despite custom, practice or code otherwise followed in respect of similar documents to this agreement, if executed electronically this agreement:
 - (i) is made on its execution by all parties to it (including electronic signature);
 - (ii) need not be executed and exchanged in counterparts; and
 - (iii) constitutes an original document in an electronic format.
