Before signing this contract you should ensure that you understand your rights and obligations, some of which are not written in this contract but are implied by law.

WARNING—SMOKE ALARMS

The owners of certain types of buildings and strata lots must have smoke alarms, or in certain cases heat alarms, installed in the building or lot in accordance with regulations under the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*. It is an offence not to comply. It is also an offence to remove or interfere with a smoke alarm or heat alarm. Penalties apply.

WARNING—LOOSE-FILL ASBESTOS INSULATION

Before purchasing land that includes residential premises, within the meaning of the *Home Building Act 1989*, Part 8, Division 1A, built before 1985, a purchaser is strongly advised to consider the possibility that the premises may contain loose-fill asbestos insulation, within the meaning of the *Home Building Act 1989*, Part 8, Division 1A. In particular, a purchaser should—

Cooling off period (purchaser's rights)

- This is the statement required by the *Conveyancing Act 1919*, section 66X. This statement applies to a contract for the sale of residential property.
- 2 EXCEPT in the circumstances listed in paragraph 3, the purchaser may rescind the contract before 5pm on—
 - (a) for an off the plan contract—the tenth business day after the day on which the contract was made, or
 - (b) in any other case—the fifth business day after the day on which the contract was made.
- 3 There is NO COOLING OFF PERIOD—
 - (a) if, at or before the time the contract is made, the purchaser gives to the vendor, or the vendor's solicitor or agent, a certificate that complies with the Act, section 66W, or
 - (b) if the property is sold by public auction, or
 - (c) if the contract is made on the same day as the property was offered for sale by public auction but passed in, or
 - (d) if the contract is made in consequence of the exercise of an option to purchase the property, other than an option that is void under the Act, section 66ZG.
- 4 A purchaser exercising the right to cool off by rescinding the contract forfeits 0.25% of the purchase price of the property to the vendor.
- The vendor is entitled to recover the forfeited amount from an amount paid by the purchaser as a deposit under the contract. The purchaser is entitled to a refund of any balance.

DISPUTES

If you get into a dispute with the other party, the Law Society and Real Estate Institute encourage you to use informal procedures such as negotiation, independent expert appraisal, the Law Society Conveyancing Dispute Resolution Scheme or mediation (for example mediation under the Law Society Mediation Program).

AUCTIONS

Regulations made under the Property and Stock Agents Act 2002 prescribe a number of conditions applying to sales by auction.

WARNINGS

- 2. A lease may be affected by the Agricultural Tenancies Act 1990, the Residential Tenancies Act 2010 or the Retail Leases Act 1994.
- 3. If any purchase money is owing to the Crown, it will become payable before obtaining consent, or if no consent is needed, when the transfer is registered.
- 4. If a consent to transfer is required under legislation, see clause 27 as to the obligations of the parties.
- 5. The vendor should continue the vendor's insurance until completion. If the vendor wants to give the purchaser possession before completion, the vendor should first ask the insurer to confirm this will not affect the insurance.
- 6. Most purchasers will have to pay transfer duty (and, sometimes, if the purchaser is not an Australian citizen, surcharge purchaser duty) on this contract. Some purchasers may be eligible to choose to pay first home buyer choice property tax instead of transfer duty. If a payment is not made on time, interest and penalties may be incurred.
- 7. If the purchaser agrees to the release of deposit, the purchaser's right to recover the deposit may stand behind the rights of others (for example the vendor's mortgagee).
- 8. The purchaser should arrange insurance as appropriate.
- 9. Some transactions involving personal property may be affected by the Personal Property Securities Act 2009.
- 10. A purchaser should be satisfied that finance will be available at the time of completing the purchase.
- 11. Where the market value of the property is at or above a legislated amount, the purchaser may have to comply with a foreign resident capital gains withholding payment obligation (even if the vendor is not a foreign resident). If so, this will affect the amount available to the vendor on completion.

title data the details of the title to the property made available to the Electronic Workspace by

variation a variation made under s14-235 of Schedule 1 to the *TA Act*; within in relation to a period, at any time before or during the period; and

work order a valid direction, notice or order that requires work to be done or money to be spent

on or in relation to the *property* or any adjoining footpath or road (but the term does not include a notice under s22E of the Swimming Pools Act 1992 or clause 22 of

the Swimming Pools Regulation 2018).

Words and phrases used in this contract (italicised and in Title Case, such as *Conveyancing Transaction*, *Digitally Signed*, *Electronic Workspace*, *ELN*, *ELNO*, *Land Registry*, *Lodgment Case* and *Subscriber*) have the meanings given in the *participation rules*.

2 Deposit and other payments before completion

- 2.1 The purchaser must pay the deposit to the *depositholder* as stakeholder.
- 2.2 Normally, the purchaser must pay the deposit on the making of this contract, and this time is essential.
- 2.3 If this contract requires the purchaser to pay any of the deposit by a later time, that time is also essential.
- 2.4 The purchaser can pay any of the deposit by -
 - 2.4.1 giving cash (up to \$2,000) to the depositholder,
 - 2.4.2 unconditionally giving a *cheque* to the *depositholder* or to the vendor, vendor's agent or vendor's *solicitor* for sending to the *depositholder*, or
 - 2.4.3 electronic funds transfer to the *depositholder's* nominated account and, if requested by the vendor or the *depositholder*, providing evidence of that transfer.
- 2.5 The vendor can terminate if
 - 2.5.1 any of the deposit is not paid on time;
 - 2.5.2 a *cheque* for any of the deposit is not honoured on presentation; or
 - 2.5.3 a payment under clause 2.4.3 is not received in the *depositholder's* nominated account by 5.00 pm on the third *business day* after the time for payment.

This right to terminate is lost as soon as the deposit is paid in full.

- 2.6 If the vendor accepts a *deposit-bond* for the deposit, clauses 2.1 to 2.5 do not apply.
- 2.7 If the vendor accepts a *deposit-bond* for part of the deposit, clauses 2.1 to 2.5 apply only to the balance.
- 2.8 If any of the deposit or of the balance of the price is paid before completion to the vendor or as the vendor directs, it is a charge on the land in favour of the purchaser until *termination* by the vendor or completion, subject to any existing right.
- 2.9 If each *party* tells the *depositholder* that the deposit is to be invested, the *depositholder* is to invest the deposit (at the risk of the *party* who becomes entitled to it) with a *bank*, in an interest-bearing account in NSW, payable at call, with interest to be reinvested, and pay the interest to the *parties* equally, after deduction of all proper government taxes and financial institution charges and other charges.

3 Deposit-bond

- 3.1 This clause applies only if the vendor accepts a deposit-bond for the deposit (or part of it).
- 3.2 The purchaser must provide the *deposit-bond* to the vendor's *solicitor* (or if no solicitor the *depositholder*) at or before the making of this contract and this time is essential.
- 3.3 If the *deposit-bond* has an expiry date and completion does not occur by the date which is 14 days before the expiry date, the purchaser must *serve* a replacement *deposit-bond* at least 7 days before the expiry date. The time for service is essential.
- 3.4 The vendor must approve a replacement *deposit-bond* if
 - 3.4.1 it is from the same issuer and for the same amount as the earlier *deposit-bond*; and
 - 3.4.2 it has an expiry date at least three months after its date of issue.
- 3.5 A breach of clauses 3.2 or 3.3 entitles the vendor to *terminate*. The right to *terminate* is lost as soon as 3.5.1 the purchaser *serves* a replacement *deposit-bond*; or
 - 3.5.2 the deposit is paid in full under clause 2.
- 3.6 Clauses 3.3 and 3.4 can operate more than once.

- 3.7 If the purchaser serves a replacement deposit-bond, the vendor must serve the earlier deposit-bond.
- 3.8 The amount of any deposit-bond does not form part of the price for the purposes of clause 16.5.
- The vendor must give the purchaser any original deposit-bond 3.9
 - on completion: or 3.9.1
 - 392 if this contract is rescinded.
- 3.10 If this contract is terminated by the vendor -
 - 3.10.1 normally, the vendor can immediately demand payment from the issuer of the deposit-bond; or
 - 3.10.2 if the purchaser serves prior to termination a notice disputing the vendor's right to terminate, the vendor must forward any original deposit-bond (or its proceeds if called up) to the depositholder as stakeholder.
- 3.11 If this contract is *terminated* by the purchaser –
 - normally, the vendor must give the purchaser any original deposit-bond; or 3.11.1
 - 3.11.2 if the vendor serves prior to termination a notice disputing the purchaser's right to terminate, the vendor must forward any original deposit-bond (or its proceeds if called up) to the depositholder as stakeholder.

Electronic transaction

- 4.1 This Conveyancing Transaction is to be conducted as an electronic transaction unless -
 - 4.1.1 the contract says this transaction is a manual transaction, giving the reason, or
 - 4.1.2 a party serves a notice stating why the transaction is a manual transaction, in which case the parties do not have to complete earlier than 14 days after service of the notice, and clause 21.3 does not apply to this provision,

and in both cases clause 30 applies.

- If, because of clause 4.1.2, this Conveyancing Transaction is to be conducted as a manual transaction 4.2 4.2.1
 - each party must
 - bear equally any disbursements or fees; and
 - otherwise bear that party's own costs;

incurred because this Conveyancing Transaction was to be conducted as an electronic transaction;

- 4.2.2 if a party has paid all of a disbursement or fee which, by reason of this clause, is to be borne equally by the parties, that amount must be adjusted under clause 14.
- 4.3 The parties must conduct the electronic transaction –
 - 4.3.1 in accordance with the participation rules and the ECNL; and
 - 4.3.2 using the nominated ELN, unless the parties otherwise agree. This clause 4.3.2 does not prevent a party using an ELN which can interoperate with the nominated ELN.
- 4.4 A party must pay the fees and charges payable by that party to the ELNO and the Land Registry.
- 4.5 Normally, the vendor must within 7 days of the contract date create and populate an Electronic Workspace with title data and the date for completion, and invite the purchaser to the Electronic Workspace.
- If the vendor has not created an *Electronic Workspace* in accordance with clause 4.5, the purchaser may 4.6 create and populate an Electronic Workspace and, if it does so, the purchaser must invite the vendor to the Electronic Workspace.
- The parties must, as applicable to their role in the Conveyancing Transaction and the steps taken under 4.7 clauses 4.5 or 4.6 -
 - 4.7.1 promptly join the *Electronic Workspace* after receipt of an invitation;
 - 4.7.2 create and populate an electronic transfer.
 - invite any discharging mortgagee or incoming mortgagee to join the Electronic Workspace; and 4.7.3
 - 4.7.4 populate the Electronic Workspace with a nominated completion time.
- If the transferee in the electronic transfer is not the purchaser, the purchaser must give the vendor a direction 4.8 signed by the purchaser personally for that transfer.
- The vendor can require the purchaser to include a covenant or easement in the electronic transfer only if this 4.9 contract contains the wording of the proposed covenant or easement, and a description of the land burdened and benefited.
- 4.10 If the purchaser must make a GSTRW payment or an FRCGW remittance, the purchaser must populate the Electronic Workspace with the payment details for the GSTRW payment or FRCGW remittance payable to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation at least 2 business days before the date for completion.
- 4.11 Before completion, the parties must ensure that
 - all electronic documents which a party must Digitally Sign to complete the electronic transaction are 4.11.1 populated and Digitally Signed;
 - 4.11.2 all certifications required by the ECNL are properly given; and
 - 4.11.3 they do everything else in the Electronic Workspace which that party must do to enable the electronic transaction to proceed to completion.
- 4.12 If the computer systems of any of the Land Registry, the ELNO, Revenue NSW or the Reserve Bank of Australia are inoperative for any reason at the completion time agreed by the parties, a failure to complete this contract for that reason is not a default under this contract on the part of either party.

- 4.13 If the computer systems of the *Land Registry* are inoperative for any reason at the *completion time* agreed by the *parties*, and the *parties* choose that financial settlement is to occur despite this, then on financial settlement occurring
 - 4.13.1 all electronic documents Digitally Signed by the vendor and any discharge of mortgage, withdrawal of caveat or other electronic document forming part of the Lodgment Case for the electronic transaction are taken to have been unconditionally and irrevocably delivered to the purchaser or the purchaser's mortgagee at the time of financial settlement together with the right to deal with the land; and
 - 4.13.2 the vendor is taken to have no legal or equitable interest in the property.
- 4.14 If the *parties* do not agree about the delivery before completion of one or more documents or things that cannot be delivered through the *Electronic Workspace*, the *party* required to deliver the documents or things
 - 4.14.1 holds them on completion in escrow for the benefit of; and
 - 4.14.2 must immediately after completion deliver the documents or things to, or as directed by; the *party* entitled to them.

5 Requisitions

- 5.1 If a form of *requisitions* is attached to this contract, the purchaser is taken to have made those *requisitions*.
- 5.2 If the purchaser is or becomes entitled to make any other *requisition*, the purchaser can make it only by *serving* it
 - 5.2.1 if it arises out of this contract or it is a general question about the *property* or title *within* 21 days after the contract date:
 - 5.2.2 if it arises out of anything *served* by the vendor *within* 21 days after the later of the contract date and that *service*; and
 - 5.2.3 in any other case within a reasonable time.

6 Error or misdescription

- 6.1 *Normally*, the purchaser can (but only before completion) claim compensation for an error or misdescription in this contract (as to the *property*, the title or anything else and whether substantial or not).
- 6.2 This clause applies even if the purchaser did not take notice of or rely on anything in this contract containing or giving rise to the error or misdescription.
- 6.3 However, this clause does not apply to the extent the purchaser knows the true position.

7 Claims by purchaser

Normally, the purchaser can make a claim (including a claim under clause 6) before completion only by serving it with a statement of the amount claimed, and if the purchaser makes one or more claims before completion —

- 7.1 the vendor can rescind if in the case of claims that are not claims for delay
 - 7.1.1 the total amount claimed exceeds 5% of the price;
 - 7.1.2 the vendor serves notice of intention to rescind; and
 - 7.1.3 the purchaser does not serve notice waiving the claims within 14 days after that service; and
- 7.2 if the vendor does not rescind, the parties must complete and if this contract is completed
 - 7.2.1 the lesser of the total amount claimed and 10% of the price must be paid out of the price to and held by the *depositholder* until the claims are finalised or lapse;
 - 7.2.2 the amount held is to be invested in accordance with clause 2.9;
 - 7.2.3 the claims must be finalised by an arbitrator appointed by the *parties* or, if an appointment is not made *within* 1 month of completion, by an arbitrator appointed by the President of the Law Society at the request of a *party* (in the latter case the *parties* are bound by the terms of the Conveyancing Arbitration Rules approved by the Law Society as at the date of the appointment);
 - 7.2.4 the purchaser is not entitled, in respect of the claims, to more than the total amount claimed and the costs of the purchaser;
 - 7.2.5 net interest on the amount held must be paid to the *parties* in the same proportion as the amount held is paid; and
 - 7.2.6 if the *parties* do not appoint an arbitrator and neither *party* requests the President to appoint an arbitrator *within* 3 months after completion, the claims lapse and the amount belongs to the vendor.

8 Vendor's rights and obligations

- 8.1 The vendor can rescind if -
 - 8.1.1 the vendor is, on reasonable grounds, unable or unwilling to comply with a *requisition*;
 - 8.1.2 the vendor *serves* a notice of intention to *rescind* that specifies the *requisition* and those grounds; and
 - 8.1.3 the purchaser does not serve a notice waiving the requisition within 14 days after that service.

- 8.2 If the vendor does not comply with this contract (or a notice under or relating to it) in an essential respect, the purchaser can *terminate* by *serving* a notice. After the *termination*
 - 8.2.1 the purchaser can recover the deposit and any other money paid by the purchaser under this contract;
 - 8.2.2 the purchaser can sue the vendor to recover damages for breach of contract; and
 - 8.2.3 if the purchaser has been in possession a *party* can claim for a reasonable adjustment.

9 Purchaser's default

If the purchaser does not comply with this contract (or a notice under or relating to it) in an essential respect, the vendor can *terminate* by *serving* a notice. After the *termination* the vendor can –

- 9.1 keep or recover the deposit (to a maximum of 10% of the price);
- 9.2 hold any other money paid by the purchaser under this contract as security for anything recoverable under this clause
 - 9.2.1 for 12 months after the *termination*; or
 - 9.2.2 if the vendor commences proceedings under this clause *within* 12 months, until those proceedings are concluded; and
- 9.3 sue the purchaser either -
 - 9.3.1 where the vendor has resold the *property* under a contract made *within* 12 months after the *termination*, to recover
 - the deficiency on resale (with credit for any of the deposit kept or recovered and after allowance for any capital gains tax or goods and services tax payable on anything recovered under this clause); and
 - the reasonable costs and expenses arising out of the purchaser's non-compliance with this contract or the notice and of resale and any attempted resale; or
 - 9.3.2 to recover damages for breach of contract.

10 Restrictions on rights of purchaser

- 10.1 The purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate in respect of
 - 10.1.1 the ownership or location of any fence as defined in the Dividing Fences Act 1991;
 - 10.1.2 a service for the *property* being a joint service or passing through another property, or any service for another property passing through the *property* ('service' includes air, communication, drainage, electricity, garbage, gas, oil, radio, sewerage, telephone, television or water service);
 - 10.1.3 a wall being or not being a party wall in any sense of that term or the *property* being affected by an easement for support or not having the benefit of an easement for support;
 - any change in the *property* due to fair wear and tear before completion:
 - 10.1.5 a promise, representation or statement about this contract, the *property* or the title, not set out or referred to in this contract;
 - 10.1.6 a condition, exception, reservation or restriction in a Crown grant;
 - 10.1.7 the existence of any authority or licence to explore or prospect for gas, minerals or petroleum;
 - 10.1.8 any easement or restriction on use the substance of either of which is disclosed in this contract or any non-compliance with the easement or restriction on use; or
 - anything the substance of which is disclosed in this contract (except a caveat, charge, mortgage, priority notice or writ).
- 10.2 The purchaser cannot *rescind* or *terminate* only because of a defect in title to or quality of the inclusions.
- 10.3 Normally, the purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate or require the vendor to change the nature of the title disclosed in this contract (for example, to remove a caution evidencing qualified title, or to lodge a plan of survey as regards limited title).

11 Compliance with work orders

- 11.1 *Normally*, the vendor must by completion comply with a *work order* made on or before the contract date and if this contract is completed the purchaser must comply with any other *work order*.
- 11.2 If the purchaser complies with a *work order*, and this contract is *rescinded* or *terminated*, the vendor must pay the expense of compliance to the purchaser.

12 Certificates and inspections

The vendor must do everything reasonable to enable the purchaser, subject to the rights of any tenant –

- 12.1 to have the *property* inspected to obtain any certificate or report reasonably required;
- 12.2 to apply (if necessary in the name of the vendor) for -
 - 12.2.1 any certificate that can be given in respect of the *property* under *legislation*; or
 - 12.2.2 a copy of any approval, certificate, consent, direction, notice or order in respect of the *property* given under *legislation*, even if given after the contract date; and
- 12.3 to make 1 inspection of the *property* in the 3 days before a time appointed for completion.

- 13 Goods and services tax (GST)
- 13.1 Terms used in this clause which are not defined elsewhere in this contract and have a defined meaning in the *GST Act* have the same meaning in this clause.
- 13.2 *Normally*, if a *party* must pay the price or any other amount to the other *party* under this contract, GST is not to be added to the price or amount.
- 13.3 If under this contract a *party* must make an adjustment or payment for an expense of another party or pay an expense payable by or to a third party (for example, under clauses 14 or 20.7)
 - 13.3.1 the party must adjust or pay on completion any GST added to or included in the expense; but
 - the amount of the expense must be reduced to the extent the party receiving the adjustment or payment (or the representative member of a GST group of which that party is a member) is entitled to an input tax credit for the expense; and
 - if the adjustment or payment under this contract is consideration for a taxable supply, an amount for GST must be added at the *GST rate*.
- 13.4 If this contract says this sale is the supply of a going concern
 - the *parties* agree the supply of the *property* is a supply of a going concern;
 - the vendor must, between the contract date and completion, carry on the enterprise conducted on the land in a proper and business-like way;
 - if the purchaser is not registered by the date for completion, the *parties* must complete and the purchaser must pay on completion, in addition to the price, an amount being the price multiplied by the *GST rate* ("the retention sum"). The retention sum is to be held by the *depositholder* and dealt with as follows
 - if within 3 months of completion the purchaser serves a letter from the Australian Taxation Office stating the purchaser is registered with a date of effect of registration on or before completion, the *depositholder* is to pay the retention sum to the purchaser; but
 - if the purchaser does not *serve* that letter *within* 3 months of completion, the *depositholder* is to pay the retention sum to the vendor; and
 - 13.4.4 if the vendor, despite clause 13.4.1, *serves* a letter from the Australian Taxation Office stating the vendor has to pay GST on the supply, the purchaser must pay to the vendor on demand the amount of GST assessed.
- 13.5 Normally, the vendor promises the margin scheme will not apply to the supply of the property.
- 13.6 If this contract says the margin scheme is to apply in making the taxable supply, the *parties* agree that the margin scheme is to apply to the sale of the *property*.
- 13.7 If this contract says the sale is not a taxable supply
 - 13.7.1 the purchaser promises that the *property* will not be used and represents that the purchaser does not intend the *property* (or any part of the *property*) to be used in a way that could make the sale a taxable supply to any extent; and
 - the purchaser must pay the vendor on completion in addition to the price an amount calculated by multiplying the price by the *GST rate* if this sale is a taxable supply to any extent because of
 - a breach of clause 13.7.1; or
 - something else known to the purchaser but not the vendor.
- 13.8 If this contract says this sale is a taxable supply in full and does not say the margin scheme applies to the *property*, the vendor must pay the purchaser on completion an amount of one-eleventh of the price if 13.8.1 this sale is not a taxable supply in full; or
 - 13.8.2 the margin scheme applies to the *property* (or any part of the *property*).
- 13.9 If this contract says this sale is a taxable supply to an extent
 - 13.9.1 clause 13.7.1 does not apply to any part of the *property* which is identified as being a taxable supply; and
 - the payments mentioned in clauses 13.7 and 13.8 are to be recalculated by multiplying the relevant payment by the proportion of the price which represents the value of that part of the *property* to which the clause applies (the proportion to be expressed as a number between 0 and 1). Any evidence of value must be obtained at the expense of the vendor.
- 13.10 *Normally*, on completion the vendor must give the recipient of the supply a tax invoice for any taxable supply by the vendor by or under this contract.
- 13.11 The vendor does not have to give the purchaser a tax invoice if the margin scheme applies to a taxable supply.
- 13.12 If the vendor is liable for GST on rents or profits due to issuing an invoice or receiving consideration before completion, any adjustment of those amounts must exclude an amount equal to the vendor's GST liability.
- 13.13 If the vendor *serves* details of a *GSTRW payment* which the purchaser must make, the purchaser does not have to complete earlier than 5 *business days* after that *service* and clause 21.3 does not apply to this provision.
- 13.14 If the purchaser must make a *GSTRW payment* the purchaser must, at least 2 *business days* before the date for completion, *serve* evidence of submission of a *GSTRW payment* notification form to the Australian Taxation Office by the purchaser or, if a direction under either clause 4.8 or clause 30.4 has been given, by the transferee named in the transfer the subject of that direction.

14 Adjustments

- 14.1 *Normally*, the vendor is entitled to the rents and profits and will be liable for all rates, water, sewerage and drainage service and usage charges, land tax, levies and all other periodic outgoings up to and including the *adjustment date* after which the purchaser will be entitled and liable.
- 14.2 The parties must make any necessary adjustment on completion, and -
 - 14.2.1 the purchaser must provide the vendor with *adjustment figures* at least 2 *business days* before the date for completion; and
 - 14.2.2 the vendor must confirm the *adjustment figures* at least 1 *business day* before the date for completion.
- 14.3 If an amount that is adjustable under this contract has been reduced under *legislation*, the *parties* must on completion adjust the reduced amount.
- 14.4 The *parties* must not adjust surcharge land tax (as defined in the Land Tax Act 1956) but must adjust any other land tax for the year current at the *adjustment date*
 - only if land tax has been paid or is payable for the year (whether by the vendor or by a predecessor in title) and this contract says that land tax is adjustable;
 - 14.4.2 by adjusting the amount that would have been payable if at the start of the year -
 - the person who owned the land owned no other land;
 - the land was not subject to a special trust or owned by a non-concessional company; and
 - if the land (or part of it) had no separate taxable value, by calculating its separate taxable value on a proportional area basis.
- 14.5 The parties must not adjust any first home buyer choice property tax.
- 14.6 If any other amount that is adjustable under this contract relates partly to the land and partly to other land, the parties must adjust it on a proportional area basis.
- 14.7 If on completion the last bill for a water, sewerage or drainage usage charge is for a period ending before the *adjustment date*, the vendor is liable for an amount calculated by dividing the bill by the number of days in the period then multiplying by the number of unbilled days up to and including the *adjustment date*.
- 14.8 The vendor is liable for any amount recoverable for work started on or before the contract date on the *property* or any adjoining footpath or road.

15 Date for completion

The *parties* must complete by the date for completion and, if they do not, a *party* can *serve* a notice to complete if that *party* is otherwise entitled to do so.

16 Completion

Vendor

- 16.1 Normally, on completion the vendor must cause the legal title to the *property* (being the estate disclosed in this contract) to pass to the purchaser free of any charge, mortgage or other interest, subject to any necessary registration.
- 16.2 The legal title to the *property* does not pass before completion.
- 16.3 If the vendor gives the purchaser a document (other than the transfer) that needs to be lodged for registration, the vendor must pay the lodgment fee to the purchaser.
- 16.4 If a *party serves* a land tax certificate showing a charge on any of the land, by completion the vendor must do all things and pay all money required so that the charge is no longer effective against the land.

Purchaser

- 16.5 On completion the purchaser must pay to the vendor
 - 16.5.1 the price less any
 - deposit paid;
 - FRCGW remittance payable;
 - GSTRW payment, and
 - amount payable by the vendor to the purchaser under this contract; and
 - 16.5.2 any other amount payable by the purchaser under this contract.
- 16.6 If any of the deposit is not covered by a *deposit-bond*, at least 1 *business day* before the date for completion the purchaser must give the vendor an order signed by the purchaser authorising the *depositholder* to account to the vendor for the deposit, to be held by the vendor in escrow until completion.
- 16.7 On completion the deposit belongs to the vendor.

17 Possession

- 17.1 *Normally*, the vendor must give the purchaser vacant possession of the *property* on completion.
- 17.2 The vendor does not have to give vacant possession if
 - 17.2.1 this contract says that the sale is subject to existing tenancies; and
 - the contract discloses the provisions of the tenancy (for example, by attaching a copy of the lease and any relevant memorandum or variation).
- 17.3 Normally, the purchaser can claim compensation (before or after completion) or rescind if any of the land is affected by a protected tenancy (a tenancy affected by Schedule 2, Part 7 of the Residential Tenancies Act 2010).

18 Possession before completion

- 18.1 This clause applies only if the vendor gives the purchaser possession of the *property* before completion.
- 18.2 The purchaser must not before completion
 - 18.2.1 let or part with possession of any of the *property*;
 - 18.2.2 make any change or structural alteration or addition to the *property;* or
 - 18.2.3 contravene any agreement between the *parties* or any direction, document, *legislation*, notice or order affecting the *property*.
- 18.3 The purchaser must until completion
 - 18.3.1 keep the *property* in good condition and repair having regard to its condition at the giving of possession; and
 - 18.3.2 allow the vendor or the vendor's authorised representative to enter and inspect it at all reasonable times.
- 18.4 The risk as to damage to the *property* passes to the purchaser immediately after the purchaser enters into possession.
- 18.5 If the purchaser does not comply with this clause, then without affecting any other right of the vendor
 - 18.5.1 the vendor can before completion, without notice, remedy the non-compliance; and
 - 18.5.2 if the vendor pays the expense of doing this, the purchaser must pay it to the vendor with interest at the rate prescribed under s101 Civil Procedure Act 2005.
- the rate prescribed under \$101 Civil Procedure Act 2005.

 18.6 If this contract is rescinded or terminated the purchaser must immediately vacate the property.
- 18.7 If the parties or their solicitors on their behalf do not agree in writing to a fee or rent, none is payable.

19 Rescission of contract

- 19.1 If this contract expressly gives a party a right to rescind, the party can exercise the right
 - 19.1.1 only by serving a notice before completion; and
 - in spite of any making of a claim or *requisition*, any attempt to satisfy a claim or *requisition*, any arbitration, litigation, mediation or negotiation or any giving or taking of possession.
- 19.2 Normally, if a party exercises a right to rescind expressly given by this contract or any legislation
 - 19.2.1 the deposit and any other money paid by the purchaser under this contract must be refunded;
 - 19.2.2 a party can claim for a reasonable adjustment if the purchaser has been in possession;
 - 19.2.3 a party can claim for damages, costs or expenses arising out of a breach of this contract; and
 - 19.2.4 a *party* will not otherwise be liable to pay the other *party* any damages, costs or expenses.

20 Miscellaneous

- 20.1 The *parties* acknowledge that anything stated in this contract to be attached was attached to this contract by the vendor before the purchaser signed it and is part of this contract.
- 20.2 Anything attached to this contract is part of this contract.
- 20.3 An area, bearing or dimension in this contract is only approximate.
- 20.4 If a party consists of 2 or more persons, this contract benefits and binds them separately and together.
- 20.5 A *party's solicitor* can receive any amount payable to the *party* under this contract or direct in writing that it is to be paid to another person.
- 20.6 A document under or relating to this contract is -
 - 20.6.1 signed by a *party* if it is signed by the *party* or the *party*'s *solicitor* (apart from a direction under clause 4.8 or clause 30.4);
 - 20.6.2 served if it is served by the party or the party's solicitor,
 - 20.6.3 served if it is served on the party's solicitor, even if the party has died or any of them has died;
 - 20.6.4 served if it is served in any manner provided in s170 of the Conveyancing Act 1919;
 - 20.6.5 served if it is sent by email or fax to the party's solicitor, unless in either case it is not received;
 - 20.6.6 served on a person if it (or a copy of it) comes into the possession of the person;
 - 20.6.7 served at the earliest time it is served, if it is served more than once; and
 - 20.6.8 served if it is provided to or by the *party's solicitor* or an *authorised Subscriber* by means of an *Electronic Workspace* created under clause 4. However, this does not apply to a notice making an obligation essential, or a notice of *rescission* or *termination*.
- 20.7 An obligation to pay an expense of another party of doing something is an obligation to pay
 - 20.7.1 If the party does the thing personally the reasonable cost of getting someone else to do it; or
 - 20.7.2 if the party pays someone else to do the thing the amount paid, to the extent it is reasonable.
- 20.8 Rights under clauses 4, 11, 13, 14, 17, 24, 30 and 31 continue after completion, whether or not other rights
- 20.9 The vendor does not promise, represent or state that the purchaser has any cooling off rights.
- 20.10 The vendor does not promise, represent or state that any attached survey report is accurate or current.
- 20.11 A reference to any *legislation* (including any percentage or rate specified in *legislation*) is also a reference to any corresponding later *legislation*.
- 20.12 Each *party* must do whatever is necessary after completion to carry out the *party*'s obligations under this contract.
- 20.13 Neither taking possession nor serving a transfer of itself implies acceptance of the property or the title.

- 20.14 The details and information provided in this contract (for example, on pages 1 4) are, to the extent of each party's knowledge, true, and are part of this contract.
- 20.15 Where this contract provides for choices, a choice in BLOCK CAPITALS applies unless a different choice is marked.
- 20.16 Each party consents to -
 - 20.16.1 any party signing this contract electronically; and
 - 20.16.2 the making of this contract by the exchange of counterparts delivered by email, or by such other electronic means as may be agreed in writing by the *parties*.
- 20.17 Each *party* agrees that electronic signing by a *party* identifies that *party* and indicates that *party*'s intention to be bound by this contract.

21 Time limits in these provisions

- 21.1 If the time for something to be done or to happen is not stated in these provisions, it is a reasonable time.
- 21.2 If there are conflicting times for something to be done or to happen, the latest of those times applies.
- 21.3 The time for one thing to be done or to happen does not extend the time for another thing to be done or to happen.
- 21.4 If the time for something to be done or to happen is the 29th, 30th or 31st day of a month, and the day does not exist, the time is instead the last day of the month.
- 21.5 If the time for something to be done or to happen is a day that is not a *business day*, the time is extended to the next *business day*, except in the case of clauses 2 and 3.2.
- 21.6 Normally, the time by which something must be done is fixed but not essential.

22 Foreign Acquisitions and Takeovers Act 1975

- The purchaser promises that the Commonwealth Treasurer cannot prohibit and has not prohibited the transfer under the Foreign Acquisitions and Takeovers Act 1975.
- 22.2 This promise is essential and a breach of it entitles the vendor to *terminate*.

23 Strata or community title

• Definitions and modifications

- This clause applies only if the land (or part of it) is a lot in a strata, neighbourhood, precinct or community scheme (or on completion is to be a lot in a scheme of that kind).
- 23.2 In this contract -
 - 23.2.1 'change', in relation to a scheme, means -
 - a registered or registrable change from by-laws set out in this contract;
 - a change from a development or management contract or statement set out in this contract; or
 - a change in the boundaries of common property;
 - 23.2.2 'common property' includes association property for the scheme or any higher scheme;
 - 23.2.3 'contribution' includes an amount payable under a by-law;
 - 23.2.4 'information certificate' includes a certificate under s184 Strata Schemes Management Act 2015 and s171 Community Land Management Act 2021;
 - 23.2.5 'interest notice' includes a strata interest notice under s22 Strata Schemes Management Act 2015 and an association interest notice under s20 Community Land Management Act 2021;
 - 23.2.6 'normal expenses', in relation to an owners corporation for a scheme, means normal operating expenses usually payable from the administrative fund of an owners corporation for a scheme of the same kind;
 - 23.2.7 'owners corporation' means the owners corporation or the association for the scheme or any higher scheme;
 - 23.2.8 'the property' includes any interest in common property for the scheme associated with the lot; and
 - 23.2.9 'special expenses', in relation to an owners corporation, means its actual, contingent or expected expenses, except to the extent they are
 - normal expenses;
 - due to fair wear and tear;
 - disclosed in this contract; or
 - covered by moneys held in the capital works fund.
- 23.3 Clauses 11, 14.8 and 18.4 do not apply to an obligation of the owners corporation, or to property insurable by it.
- 23.4 Clauses 14.4.2 and 14.6 apply but on a unit entitlement basis instead of an area basis.

• Adjustments and liability for expenses

- 23.5 The parties must adjust under clause 14.1
 - 23.5.1 a regular periodic contribution;
 - 23.5.2 a contribution which is not a regular periodic contribution but is disclosed in this contract; and
 - 23.5.3 on a unit entitlement basis, any amount paid by the vendor for a normal expense of the owners corporation to the extent the owners corporation has not paid the amount to the vendor.

- 23.6 If a contribution is not a regular periodic contribution and is not disclosed in this contract
 - 23.6.1 the vendor is liable for it if it was determined on or before the contract date, even if it is payable by instalments; and
 - 23.6.2 the purchaser is liable for all contributions determined after the contract date.
- 23.7 The vendor must pay or allow to the purchaser on completion the amount of any unpaid contributions for which the vendor is liable under clause 23.6.1.
- 23.8 Normally, the purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or rescind or terminate in respect of -
 - 23.8.1 an existing or future actual, contingent or expected expense of the owners corporation;
 - 23.8.2 a proportional unit entitlement of the lot or a relevant lot or former lot, apart from a claim under clause 6: or
 - 23.8.3 a past or future change in the scheme or a higher scheme.
- 23.9 However, the purchaser can rescind if
 - 23.9.1 the special expenses of the owners corporation at the later of the contract date and the creation of the owners corporation when calculated on a unit entitlement basis (and, if more than one lot or a higher scheme is involved, added together), less any contribution paid by the vendor, are more than 1% of the price;
 - 23.9.2 in the case of the lot or a relevant lot or former lot in a higher scheme, a proportional unit entitlement for the lot is disclosed in this contract but the lot has a different proportional unit entitlement at the contract date or at any time before completion;
 - 23.9.3 a change before the contract date or before completion in the scheme or a higher scheme materially prejudices the purchaser and is not disclosed in this contract; or
 - 23.9.4 a resolution is passed by the owners corporation before the contract date or before completion to give to the owners in the scheme for their consideration a strata renewal plan that has not lapsed at the contract date and there is not attached to this contract a strata renewal proposal or the strata renewal plan.

• Notices, certificates and inspections

- 23.10 Before completion, the purchaser must *serve* a copy of an interest notice addressed to the owners corporation and signed by the purchaser.
- 23.11 After completion, the purchaser must insert the date of completion in the interest notice and send it to the owners corporation.
- 23.12 The vendor can complete and send the interest notice as agent for the purchaser.
- 23.13 The vendor must *serve* at least 7 days before the date for completion, an information certificate for the lot, the scheme or any higher scheme which relates to a period in which the date for completion falls.
- 23.14 The purchaser does not have to complete earlier than 7 days after *service* of the information certificate and clause 21.3 does not apply to this provision. On completion the purchaser must pay the vendor the prescribed fee for the information certificate.
- 23.15 The vendor authorises the purchaser to apply for the purchaser's own information certificate.
- 23.16 The vendor authorises the purchaser to apply for and make an inspection of any record or other document in the custody or control of the owners corporation or relating to the scheme or any higher scheme.

Meetings of the owners corporation

- 23.17 If a general meeting of the owners corporation is convened before completion
 - 23.17.1 if the vendor receives notice of it, the vendor must immediately notify the purchaser of it; and
 - 23.17.2 after the expiry of any cooling off period, the purchaser can require the vendor to appoint the purchaser (or the purchaser's nominee) to exercise any voting rights of the vendor in respect of the lot at the meeting.

24 Tenancies

- 24.1 If a tenant has not made a payment for a period preceding or current at the adjustment date -
 - 24.1.1 for the purposes of clause 14.2, the amount is to be treated as if it were paid; and
 - 24.1.2 the purchaser assigns the debt to the vendor on completion and will if required give a further assignment at the vendor's expense.
- 24.2 If a tenant has paid in advance of the *adjustment date* any periodic payment in addition to rent, it must be adjusted as if it were rent for the period to which it relates.
- 24.3 If the property is to be subject to a tenancy on completion or is subject to a tenancy on completion
 - 24.3.1 the vendor authorises the purchaser to have any accounting records relating to the tenancy inspected and audited and to have any other document relating to the tenancy inspected;
 - 24.3.2 the vendor must *serve* any information about the tenancy reasonably requested by the purchaser before or after completion; and
 - 24.3.3 normally, the purchaser can claim compensation (before or after completion) if
 - a disclosure statement required by the Retail Leases Act 1994 was not given when required;
 - such a statement contained information that was materially false or misleading;
 - a provision of the lease is not enforceable because of a non-disclosure in such a statement; or
 - the lease was entered into in contravention of the Retail Leases Act 1994.

- 24.4 If the *property* is subject to a tenancy on completion
 - 24.4.1 the vendor must allow or transfer
 - any remaining bond money or any other security against the tenant's default (to the extent the security is transferable);
 - any money in a fund established under the lease for a purpose and compensation for any money in the fund or interest earnt by the fund that has been applied for any other purpose;
 and
 - any money paid by the tenant for a purpose that has not been applied for that purpose and compensation for any of the money that has been applied for any other purpose;
 - 24.4.2 if the security is not transferable, each *party* must do everything reasonable to cause a replacement security to issue for the benefit of the purchaser and the vendor must hold the original security on trust for the benefit of the purchaser until the replacement security issues;
 - 24.4.3 the vendor must give to the purchaser
 - at least 2 business days before the date for completion, a proper notice of the transfer (an attornment notice) addressed to the tenant, to be held by the purchaser in escrow until completion;
 - any certificate given under the Retail Leases Act 1994 in relation to the tenancy;
 - a copy of any disclosure statement given under the Retail Leases Act 1994;
 - a copy of any document served on the tenant under the lease and written details of its service, if the document concerns the rights of the landlord or the tenant after completion; and
 - any document served by the tenant under the lease and written details of its service, if the document concerns the rights of the landlord or the tenant after completion;
 - 24.4.4 the vendor must comply with any obligation to the tenant under the lease, to the extent it is to be complied with by completion; and
 - 24.4.5 the purchaser must comply with any obligation to the tenant under the lease, to the extent that the obligation is disclosed in this contract and is to be complied with after completion.

25 Qualified title, limited title and old system title

- 25.1 This clause applies only if the land (or part of it)
 - 25.1.1 is under qualified, limited or old system title; or
 - 25.1.2 on completion is to be under one of those titles.
- 25.2 The vendor must *serve* a proper abstract of title *within* 7 days after the contract date.
- 25.3 If an abstract of title or part of an abstract of title is attached to this contract or has been lent by the vendor to the purchaser before the contract date, the abstract or part is *served* on the contract date.
- 25.4 An abstract of title can be or include a list of documents, events and facts arranged (apart from a will or codicil) in date order, if the list in respect of each document
 - 25.4.1 shows its date, general nature, names of parties and any registration number; and
 - 25.4.2 has attached a legible photocopy of it or of an official or registration copy of it.
- 25.5 An abstract of title -
 - 25.5.1 must start with a good root of title (if the good root of title must be at least 30 years old, this means 30 years old at the contract date);
 - 25.5.2 in the case of a leasehold interest, must include an abstract of the lease and any higher lease;
 - 25.5.3 *normally*, need not include a Crown grant; and
 - 25.5.4 need not include anything evidenced by the Register kept under the Real Property Act 1900.
- 25.6 In the case of land under old system title
 - 25.6.1 in this contract 'transfer' means conveyance;
 - 25.6.2 the purchaser does not have to *serve* the transfer until after the vendor has *served* a proper abstract of title; and
 - 25.6.3 each vendor must give proper covenants for title as regards that vendor's interest.
- 25.7 In the case of land under limited title but not under qualified title
 - 25.7.1 *normally*, the abstract of title need not include any document which does not show the location, area or dimensions of the land (for example, by including a metes and bounds description or a plan of the land);
 - 25.7.2 clause 25.7.1 does not apply to a document which is the good root of title; and
 - 25.7.3 the vendor does not have to provide an abstract if this contract contains a delimitation plan (whether in registrable form or not).
- 25.8 On completion the vendor must give the purchaser any document of title that relates only to the property.
- 25.9 If on completion the vendor has possession or control of a *document of title* that relates also to other property, the vendor must produce it as and where necessary.
- 25.10 The vendor must give a proper covenant to produce where relevant.
- 25.11 The vendor does not have to produce or covenant to produce a document that is not in the possession of the vendor or a mortgagee.
- 25.12 If the vendor is unable to produce an original document in the chain of title, the purchaser will accept a photocopy from the *Land Registry* of the registration copy of that document.

26 Crown purchase money

- 26.1 This clause applies only if purchase money is payable to the Crown, whether or not due for payment.
- 26.2 The vendor is liable for the money, except to the extent this contract says the purchaser is liable for it.
- 26.3 To the extent the vendor is liable for it, the vendor is liable for any interest until completion.
- 26.4 To the extent the purchaser is liable for it, the parties must adjust any interest under clause 14.

27 Consent to transfer

- 27.1 This clause applies only if the land (or part of it) cannot be transferred without consent under *legislation* or a *planning agreement*.
- The purchaser must properly complete and then *serve* the purchaser's part of an application for consent to transfer of the land (or part of it) *within* 7 days after the contract date.
- 27.3 The vendor must apply for consent within 7 days after service of the purchaser's part.
- 27.4 If consent is refused, either party can rescind.
- 27.5 If consent is given subject to one or more conditions that will substantially disadvantage a *party*, then that *party* can *rescind within* 7 days after receipt by or *service* upon the *party* of written notice of the conditions.
- 27.6 If consent is not given or refused -
 - 27.6.1 *within* 42 days after the purchaser *serves* the purchaser's part of the application, the purchaser can *rescind*; or
 - 27.6.2 within 30 days after the application is made, either party can rescind.
- 27.7 Each period in clause 27.6 becomes 90 days if the land (or part of it) is -
 - 27.7.1 under a *planning agreement*; or
 - 27.7.2 in the Western Division.
- 27.8 If the land (or part of it) is described as a lot in an unregistered plan, each time in clause 27.6 becomes the later of the time and 35 days after creation of a separate folio for the lot.
- 27.9 The date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 14 days after service of the notice granting consent to transfer.

28 Unregistered plan

- 28.1 This clause applies only if some of the land is described as a lot in an unregistered plan.
- 28.2 The vendor must do everything reasonable to have the plan registered *within* 6 months after the contract date, with or without any minor alteration to the plan or any document to be lodged with the plan validly required or made under *legislation*.
- 28.3 If the plan is not registered within that time and in that manner
 - 28.3.1 the purchaser can rescind; and
 - 28.3.2 the vendor can *rescind*, but only if the vendor has complied with clause 28.2 and with any *legislation* governing the rescission.
- 28.4 Either party can serve notice of the registration of the plan and every relevant lot and plan number.
- 28.5 The date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 21 days after *service* of the notice.
- 28.6 Clauses 28.2 and 28.3 apply to another plan that is to be registered before the plan is registered.

29 Conditional contract

- 29.1 This clause applies only if a provision says this contract or completion is conditional on an event.
- 29.2 If the time for the event to happen is not stated, the time is 42 days after the contract date.
- 29.3 If this contract says the provision is for the benefit of a *party*, then it benefits only that *party*.
- 29.4 If anything is necessary to make the event happen, each *party* must do whatever is reasonably necessary to cause the event to happen.
- 29.5 A party can rescind under this clause only if the party has substantially complied with clause 29.4.
- 29.6 If the event involves an approval and the approval is given subject to a condition that will substantially disadvantage a *party* who has the benefit of the provision, the *party* can *rescind within* 7 days after either *party serves* notice of the condition.
- 29.7 If the parties can lawfully complete without the event happening
 - 29.7.1 if the event does not happen *within* the time for it to happen, a *party* who has the benefit of the provision can *rescind within* 7 days after the end of that time;
 - 29.7.2 if the event involves an approval and an application for the approval is refused, a *party* who has the benefit of the provision can *rescind within* 7 days after either *party serves* notice of the refusal; and
 - 29.7.3 the date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 21 days after the earliest of
 - either party serving notice of the event happening;
 - every party who has the benefit of the provision serving notice waiving the provision; or
 - the end of the time for the event to happen.

- 29.8 If the parties cannot lawfully complete without the event happening
 - 29.8.1 if the event does not happen within the time for it to happen, either party can rescind;
 - 29.8.2 if the event involves an approval and an application for the approval is refused, either *party* can *rescind*;
 - 29.8.3 the date for completion becomes the later of the date for completion and 21 days after either *party* serves notice of the event happening.
- 29.9 A party cannot rescind under clauses 29.7 or 29.8 after the event happens.

30 Manual transaction

30.1 This clause applies if this transaction is to be conducted as a *manual transaction*.

Transfer

- 30.2 Normally, the purchaser must serve the transfer at least 7 days before the date for completion.
- 30.3 If any information needed for the transfer is not disclosed in this contract, the vendor must serve it.
- 30.4 If the purchaser *serves* a transfer and the transferee is not the purchaser, the purchaser must give the vendor a direction signed by the purchaser personally for that transfer.
- 30.5 The vendor can require the purchaser to include a covenant or easement in the transfer only if this contract contains the wording of the proposed covenant or easement, and a description of the land burdened and benefited.

• Place for completion

- 30.6 Normally, the parties must complete at the completion address, which is -
 - 30.6.1 if a special completion address is stated in this contract that address; or
 - 30.6.2 if none is stated, but a first mortgagee is disclosed in this contract and the mortgagee would usually discharge the mortgage at a particular place that place; or
 - 30.6.3 in any other case the vendor's solicitor's address stated in this contract.
- The vendor by reasonable notice can require completion at another place, if it is in NSW, but the vendor must pay the purchaser's additional expenses, including any agency or mortgagee fee.
- 30.8 If the purchaser requests completion at a place that is not the completion address, and the vendor agrees, the purchaser must pay the vendor's additional expenses, including any agency or mortgagee fee.

Payments on completion

- 30.9 On completion the purchaser must pay to the vendor the amounts referred to in clauses 16.5.1 and 16.5.2, by cash (up to \$2,000) or *settlement cheque*.
- 30.10 *Normally*, the vendor can direct the purchaser to produce a *settlement cheque* on completion to pay an amount adjustable under this contract and if so
 - 30.10.1 the amount is to be treated as if it were paid; and
 - 30.10.2 the *cheque* must be forwarded to the payee immediately after completion (by the purchaser if the *cheque* relates only to the *property* or by the vendor in any other case).
- 30.11 If the vendor requires more than 5 settlement cheques, the vendor must pay \$10 for each extra cheque.
- 30.12 If the purchaser must make a GSTRW payment the purchaser must -
 - 30.12.1 produce on completion a *settlement cheque* for the *GSTRW payment* payable to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation;
 - 30.12.2 forward the settlement cheque to the payee immediately after completion; and
 - 30.12.3 serve evidence of receipt of payment of the GSTRW payment and a copy of the settlement date confirmation form submitted to the Australian Taxation Office.
- 30.13 If the purchaser must pay an FRCGW remittance, the purchaser must
 - 30.13.1 produce on completion a *settlement cheque* for the *FRCGW remittance* payable to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation;
 - 30.13.2 forward the settlement cheque to the payee immediately after completion; and
 - 30.13.3 serve evidence of receipt of payment of the FRCGW remittance.

31 Foreign Resident Capital Gains Withholding

- 31.1 This clause applies only if -
 - 31.1.1 the sale is not an excluded transaction within the meaning of s14-215 of Schedule 1 to the *TA Act*; and
 - 31.1.2 a *clearance certificate* in respect of every vendor is not attached to this contract.
- 31.2 If the vendor *serves* any *clearance certificate* or *variation*, the purchaser does not have to complete earlier than 5 *business days* after that *service* and clause 21.3 does not apply to this provision.
- 31.3 The purchaser must at least 2 *business days* before the date for completion, *serve* evidence of submission of a purchaser payment notification to the Australian Taxation Office by the purchaser or, if a direction under either clause 4.8 or clause 30.4 has been given, by the transferee named in the transfer the subject of that direction.
- 31.4 The vendor cannot refuse to complete if the purchaser complies with clause 31.3 and, as applicable, clauses 4.10 or 30.13.
- 31.5 If the vendor serves in respect of every vendor either a *clearance certificate* or a *variation* to 0.00 percent, clauses 31.3 and 31.4 do not apply.

32 Residential off the plan contract

- 32.1 This clause applies if this contract is an off the plan contract within the meaning of Division 10 of Part 4 of the Conveyancing Act 1919 (the Division).
- 32.2 No provision of this contract has the effect of excluding, modifying or restricting the operation of the Division.
- 32.3 If the purchaser makes a claim for compensation under the terms prescribed by sections 4 to 6 of Schedule 3 to the Conveyancing (Sale of Land) Regulation 2022
 - 32.3.1 the purchaser cannot make a claim under this contract about the same subject matter, including a claim under clauses 6 or 7; and
 - 32.3.2 the claim for compensation is not a claim under this contract

33. Amendments to the standard contract conditions

- 33.2 Clause 7.1.1 is deleted.
- 33.3 Clause 8.1.1 is amended by deleting the words "on reasonable grounds".
- 33.4 Clause 14 is hereby varied by the addition of the following sentence after the word "liable":
 - 14.1.1 The amounts and figures for water consumption furnished by the relevant water rating authority, even if estimated or provisional, shall be conclusive for the purpose of such adjustment.
- 33.5 Clause 14.4.2 is deleted.
- 33.6 Clause 16.5 is amended by deleting the words "plus another 20% of that fee"
- 33.7 Clause 18 is hereby varied by the addition of the following clause:
 - The Purchaser cannot make a claim or requisition or delay completion of this Contract after entering into possession of the property.
- 33.8 Clause 25.1.1 is amended by deleting the word "limited".
- 33.9 Clause 25.7 is deleted.

34. Warranty as to Agent

The Purchaser hereby indemnifies and agrees that at all times for the maximum period permitted by law to indemnify and keep indemnified the Vendor from and against any claim, commission, charge, expense, action, suit, proceedings, cost or demand of whatsoever nature by any real estate agent or employee of such real estate agent (other than the Vendor's agent named herein) who establishes that the Purchaser was introduced to the Vendor or to the property by any other agent or employee of him.

35. Deposit of less than 10%

The Vendor and the Purchaser agree that if:

- (a) The Purchaser defaults in the observance or performance of any obligation hereunder which is or the performance of which has become essential; and
- (b) The Purchaser has paid a deposit of less than ten per centum (10%) of the purchase price; and
- (c) the Vendor has terminated this Contract,

then the Vendor shall be entitled to recover from the Purchaser an amount equal to ten per centum (10%) of the purchase price less the deposit paid as liquidated damages and it is agreed that this right shall be in addition to and shall not limit any other remedies available to the Vendor herein contained or implied notwithstanding any rule of Law or equity to the contrary. This clause shall not merge upon termination of this Contract.

36. Deposit by installments

If a cooling off period applies to this contract, the purchaser may pay the deposit holder in 2 instalments as follows:

- (a) On or before the date of this contract 0.25% of the agreed purchase price; and
- (b) In the event of the purchaser proceeding with the purchase on or before 5.00 pm on the fifth business day after the date of this contract a further 9.75% of the agreed purchase price.

37. Subject to finance

- (a) With the written consent of the vendor or their representative, it is a condition of this contract that the purchaser shall obtain approval in writing of finance for the purchase of the property in accordance with this clause and The Schedule.
- (b) The purchaser shall promptly, at the purchaser's expense:
 - i. apply for finance in accordance with The Schedule;
 - ii. make and pursue the finance application, pay all fees, supply all particulars, certificates and valuations, and do all other things as may reasonably be required for the purpose of the application;
 - iii. inform the vendor regarding the progress of the finance application whenever reasonably requested to do so by or on behalf of the vendor:
 - iv. notify the vendor in writing after receipt of written approval or refusal from the Lender.
- (c) This clause is for the benefit of the purchaser who may, prior to rescission of this agreement, waive the benefit thereof.
- (d) If without default on the part of the purchaser the finance approval in writing has not been obtained within the time limited in The Schedule, either party shall be entitled by notice served upon the other to rescind this agreement, provided that if the purchaser has obtained the finance approval in writing prior to service of such notice of rescission by either party, neither party shall thereafter be entitled to rescind this agreement for want of such approval.
- (e) Upon rescission pursuant to this Clause the provisions of Clause 19 shall apply.
 - In the event of a rescission under the terms of this clause, the purchaser shall forfeit to the vendor the sum equivalent to 0.25% of the purchase price being an estimate of the vendor's costs associated with the preparation of the contract and other expenses associated.
 - ii. In order for the purchaser to rescind this Contract pursuant provision (d) above, the notice of rescission must be received by the Vendor's solicitor no later than 5.00pm on the last day the purchaser has to obtain finance approval as determined by item 3 in the Schedule below.

38. Release of deposit

The purchasers agree and acknowledge that by their execution of this contract they irrevocably authorise the vendor's agent to release to the vendors such part of the deposit moneys as they shall require for the purpose of settlement, a deposit and/or stamp duty on any piece of real estate that the vendors negotiate to purchase between the date hereof and the date of settlement hereof.

39. Warranty by Purchaser

The Purchaser warrants to the vendor:

(a) The purchaser is not an undischarged bankrupt and has not committed any act of bankruptcy;

- (b) The Purchaser does not require the approval or consent of the Foreign Investment Review Board to purchase the property:
- (c) The Purchaser is over the age of 18 years.

The Purchaser acknowledges that the Vendor relies on this warranty in entering into this Contract and the Purchaser will indemnify and keep indemnified the Vendor against any loss, expense, fine, damage, penalty and/or liability arising out of or as a consequence of a breach of this warranty by the Purchaser. This indemnity will not merge on completion.

40. Mine Subsidence Board

The Purchaser may rescind this Contract if the owner of the improvements on the land is not entitled, as at the date of this Contract, to claim compensation from the Mine Subsidence Board in respect of any damage to the land and/or improvements arising from mine subsidence and written communication from the Mine Subsidence Board to that effect shall be conclusive for the purposes of this condition.

41. Purchaser acknowledgements

The Purchaser acknowledges that the are purchasing the property:

- (a) In its present condition and state of repair;
- (b) Subject to all defects latent and patent;
- (c) Subject to any infestations or dilapidation;
- (d) Subject to all existing water, sewerage, drainage and plumbing services and connection in respect of the property;
- (e) Subject to any non-compliance, that is disclosed herein, with the Local Government Act or any Ordinance under that Act in respect of any building on the land;
- (f) With the items specified as "inclusions" on the front page of this Contract that are not new;
- (g) Without any representation or warranty from or on behalf of the Vendor as to the state of repair or condition of any inclusions, the Vendor will not be responsible for any mechanical breakdown in respect of any such items;
- (h) Subject to the state of repair and condition of any inclusions as at the date of exchange subject to an reasonable wear and tear between the date hereof and the date on which the Purchaser is entitled to take possession of the property; and
- (i) Subject to title of the inclusions being passed on completion of this Contract and the Vendor shall not be required to give formal delivery in respect thereof.

The Purchaser agrees not to seek, terminate, rescind or make any objection or requisition or claim for compensation arising out of any of the matters covered by this clause.

42. Representations and warranties negatived

Subject to the provisions of Section 52A of the Conveyancing Act, 1919, the Purchaser warrants that, unless otherwise stated in this Contract, the Purchaser has not entered into this Contract in reliance on any statement, representation, promise or warranty made by the Vendor or on behalf of the Vendor including without limitation, any statement, representation, promise or warranty in respect of the nature or fitness or suitability for any purpose of the property or any financial return or income to be derived from the Property and the terms and conditions set out in this Contract contain the entire agreement in relation to the property as concluded between the parties.

The Purchaser further acknowledges that the Purchaser has not been induced to enter into this Contract by any representation, whether verbal or otherwise made by or on behalf of the Vendor which is not set out in the Contract.

43. Covenants

Notwithstanding anything in this Contract to the contrary, the Purchaser agrees not to raise any requisition or objection or make any claim for compensation or rescind or terminate this Contract in breach of any covenant relating to the property. The Purchaser is satisfied as to the terms of the covenants and has inspected the property as is satisfied as to the compliance or non-compliance with such covenants and accepts any such non-compliance. Covenant in this clause excludes any restrictive covenant.

44. Claims by the Purchaser

Notwithstanding the provisions of Clauses 5, 6 and 7 hereof the parties expressly agree that any claim (whether for compensation or not) shall be deemed to be an objection or requisition for the purpose of Clause 7 and 8 hereto entitling the Vendor to rescind this Contract.

45. Late completion

In the event that completion of this Contract shall not take place within the time allowed for completion in Clause 15 hereof, other than due to any act or omission on the part of the Vendor, the Purchaser hereby acknowledges and agrees that the Vendor is entitled to recover from the Purchaser as liquidated damages on completion of this Contract:

- (a) Interest on the balance of the purchase price payable hereunder at the rate of ten per centum (10%) per annum for the period between the expiration of the time allowed for completion pursuant to Clause 15 hereof and the actual date of completion, with such interest being calculated on a daily basis and added to the balance payable on completion;
- (b) The sum of Three Hundred and Thirty Dollars (\$330.00) to cover legal costs and other expenses incurred as a consequence of the delay as a genuine pre-estimate of those additional expenses allowed by the Purchaser as an additional adjustment on completion;
- (c) The Parties agree that payment of such sums is made on account of damages and that the Vendor shall not be required to complete this Contract unless the said sums are paid on completion;
- (d) The Vendor's rights pursuant to this clause do not limit any other rights the Vendor may have against the Purchaser as a result of the Purchaser's failure to complete this Contract in accordance with the provisions of this Contract.

46. Notice to complete

- (a) It is expressly agreed between the parties hereto that in circumstances justifying the issue of a Notice to Complete fourteen (14) days shall be deemed to be reasonable and sufficient notice for that purpose;
- (b) Further, in the circumstances justifying the issue of a Notice to Complete by the Vendor, then the Purchaser shall be liable for the sum of three hundred & thirty dollars (\$330.00) as the agreed reasonable legal expenses incurred by the Vendor as a result of having to issue such Notice to Complete.
- (c) The Purchaser's obligation to pay the sum referred to in clause 42(b) hereof is an essential term of this contract and shall in no way affect, abrogate, limit or inhibit the Vendor's right to take action for recovery of damages that may be suffered by the Vendor as a result of the Purchaser's breach of Contract.
- (d) The party serving the Notice to Complete may:
 - i. At any time, withdraw the Notice to Complete by further notice to the party in default; and
 - ii. At its option, issue a further Notice to Complete.

47. Swimming pool

If a swimming pool forms part of the property:

- (a) The Vendor does not warrant that the swimming pool complies with the requirements imposed by the Swimming Pools Act 1992 (in this clause "the Act") and the regulations prescribed under the Act:
- (b) After completion the Purchaser must comply with the requirements of the Act; and
- (c) The Purchaser cannot make claim, objection or requisition or rescind or terminate in respect of the swimming pool and any non-compliance with the Act and Regulations prescribed under the Act.

48. Survey

Where a Surveyor's Report (or copy thereof) is annexed to the Contract:

- (a) The Vendor does not warrant the accuracy of completeness of the Report; and
- (b) The purchaser will take title subject to and will not make any objection, requisition or claim for compensation or claim any right to rescind or terminate in respect of the matters disclosed or referred to in such Report.

49. Qualified and limited title

- (a) If applicable, the property the subject of this Contract for Sale shall be deemed to be held by the Vendor pursuant to the provisions of the Real Property Act, 1900 and the Purchaser shall not be entitled to make any requisition, claim for compensation or objection with regard to the said Qualified Certificate of Title and the Vendor shall not be called upon to, nor shall the Vendor be obliged to, provide any Old System Title Abstracts of Title or Chronological Index of Title or Old System Title Search Papers and the Vendor shall be entitled to treat the subject property as not being Qualified Title pursuant to part IVA of the Real Property Act, 1900 and the Purchaser shall accept the title to the subject property as being wholly pursuant to the provisions of the Real Property Act, 1900.
- (b) If applicable, notwithstanding any other provision in this Contract for Sale the Vendor shall be under no obligation to provide to the Purchaser any Abstract of Title or Old System Documents in relation to the notation of Limited Title on the subject property.

50. Sewer Diagram

This statement should be read in conjunction with the Community Management Statement of Community Association DP No. 270583 which is binding upon the Neighbourhood Scheme as a subsidiary body of the Community Scheme.

PART 1

BY-LAWS FIXING DETAILS OF DEVELOPMENT

These By-Laws relate to the control and preservation of the essence or theme of the Neighbourhood Scheme and as such may only be amended or revoked by a unanimous resolution of the Neighbourhood Association in accordance with Section 17(2) of the Community Land Management Act, 1989.

1. BY-LAW 1 1-38 FROM COMMUNITY MANAGEMENT STATEMENT

Proprietors of a Lot and the Neighbourhood Association must comply with By-Law 3 in the Community Management Statement in relation to any proposal to carryout New Constructions.

2. BY-LAW 2 PROVISION OF SERVICES

2.1 Under section 24(2) of the Management Act, the Neighbourhood Association intends to enter into an agreement with the Community Association empowering it with the exclusive right to provide management, operational or maintenance services or procure the provision of those services for the Neighbourhood Association.

3. BY-LAW 3 NEIGHBOURHOOD PROPERTY

- 3.1 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not, except with the approval of the Neighbourhood Association, leave anything on or obstruct the use of the Neighbourhood Property.
- 3.2 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not damage Neighbourhood Property including without limitation, any paved area, landscape feature, lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or flower which is part of or situated on Neighbourhood Property.
- 3.3 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not, except with the approval of the Neighbourhood Association or pursuant to By-Laws in force in the Neighbourhood Parcel, use for his own purposes any part of the Neighbourhood Property.
- 3.4 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must give notice to the Neighbourhood Association of any damage to or defect in Neighbourhood Property immediately the proprietor or occupier becomes aware of it.
- 3.5 If a proprietor of a Lot causes damage to Neighbourhood Property (including, without limitation, any road, or paved area, landscape feature, lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or amenities) in connection with the development of that Lot the proprietor of the Lot is liable for any costs incurred by the Neighbourhood Association in restoring the Neighbourhood Property.

The proprietor of any Lot shall be responsible to ensure that any guests comply with the provisions of this By-Law.

4. BY-LAW 4 ARCHITECTURAL STANDARDS

- 4.1 The Architectural Standards and Landscape Standards as required by the Community Management Statement bind:
 - (a) The Neighbourhood Association;
 - (b) Each proprietor or occupier of a Lot;
 - (c) Each mortgagee in possession of a Lot; and
 - (d) Each lessee of a Lot

Other than the Original Proprietor.

4.2 The Neighbourhood Association may determine its own standards provided that such standards are approved in accordance with By Law 3 of the Community Management Statement.

5. BY-LAW 5 AMENDING ARCHITECTURAL STANDARDS AND LANDSCAPING STANDARDS

Right of Community Association to Amend

- 5.1 The Original Proprietor may from time to time create, adopt, add to or alter Architectural Standards for the Neighbourhood Property and any Lot in the Neighbourhood Plan.
- No proprietor of a Lot other than the Original Proprietor is entitled to amend the standards in any way without the prior written consent of:
 - (a) the Community Association or, where the Community Association has delegated the authority, that delegate; and
 - (b) the Original Proprietor.
- 5.4 The proprietor of a Lot is entitled to an up-to-date copy of the Architectural Standards and Landscape Standards from the Neighbourhood Association upon payment of a reasonable fee.
- 5.5 The Landscape Standards and Architectural Standards may be set for any Neighbourhood Development Lot by the Original Proprietor, or the Neighbourhood Association but only if the Original Proprietor gives its consent.
- 5.6 Any application for consent to amend standards must be accompanied with sufficient details to allow all parties to properly consider the application and proposed amendments.
- 5.7 The Original Proprietor may appoint a Design Review Committee. Where the Original Proprietor has appointed a Design Review Committee the Design Review

Committee shall exercise the powers and discretions given to the Original Proprietor contained in By-Laws 5.8 to 5.13.

- 5.8 No Building Modification, New Construction or landscape modification may commence or take place until the plans and specifications for it have been approved by the Original Proprietor as to:
 - (a) suitability to design;
 - (b) colour and materials;
 - (c) quality of design, and materials;
 - (d) harmony of existing design and existing structures;
 - (e) location in relation to surrounding structures and topography;
 - (f) elevation in relation to existing structures and topography; and
 - (g) harmony with existing landscaping; or

for landscaping modifications the suitability and quality of design, colour, plant species and landscape materials and features and the location and elevation and harmony in relation to surrounding structures and topography and the removal of or dealing with existing plants.

- 5.9 Any plans and specifications submitted pursuant to By Law 5.8 must be to the standard required from time to time by the Original Proprietor.
- The decision of the Original Proprietor must be made on the basis of the By-Laws, the Architectural Standards and Landscaping Standards and any rules in force at the time of its decisions. Where the decision has been delegated to a consultant or a manager as the case may be, the consultant or the manager must base his, her or its decision on the same criteria.
- 5.11 The Original Proprietor may as a condition of any approval pursuant to this part require the payment of a bond to be held by the Neighbourhood Association as security for any damage that an applicant. its contractors, employees or agents may cause to Association Property.
- 5.12 If further information is required by the appropriate decision making body or officer then that additional material must be furnished. A decision may be made subject to conditions which may be imposed at the decision maker's discretion.
- 5.13 A decision of the Original Proprietor is binding on any applicant for an approval.

6. BY-LAW 6 CONSTRUCTION ON NEIGHBOURHOOD PROPERTY

- 6.1 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not, except with the approval of the Neighbourhood Association:
 - (a) Construct any building or other structure including, without limitation, any fence, screen, pergola or awning on Neighbourhood Property;
 - (b) Attach any item as a fixture or otherwise to Neighbourhood Property; or
 - (c) Alter Neighbourhood Property.
- Any constructions, attachment or alteration referred to under By-Law 6.1 whether or not done with the approval of the Neighbourhood Association must, unless the Neighbourhood Association gives notice that it does not so require, be kept clean and tidy and in good repair by and at the expense of the proprietor for the time being of the Lot of which the proprietor or occupier who carried out the construction attachment or alteration was proprietor or occupier.

7. BY-LAW 7 NO INAPPROPRIATE USE

The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not use anything on the Neighbourhood Parcel for any purpose other than that for which it was constructed or provided.

8. BY-LAW 8 MAINTENANCE OF STRUCTURES AND LANDSCAPING ON LOT

- 8.1 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must keep the Lot clean and tidy and in good repair and condition.
- 8.2 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must maintain the landscaping on the Lot to a standard equivalent to any reasonable standard as may be set by the Neighbourhood Association form time to time under the Architectural Standards and Landscape Standards and no changes may be made without the consent of the Neighbourhood Association.
- 8.3 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must carry out all maintenance and repairs in a proper and workmanlike manner.
- The Neighbourhood Association may give a notice to the proprietor or occupier of a Lot requiring him to comply with the terms of this By-Law.
- 8.5 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not, except with the approval of the Neighbourhood Association and the Original Owner in accordance with By-Law 5.8:
 - (a) Construct any structure including, without limitation, any fence, screens, pergola or awning on the Lot;
 - (b) Attach any item as a fixture or otherwise on the Lot; or
 - (c) Alter the external walls or the colour thereof of any structure or building erected on the Lot.

8.6 If a proprietor of a Lot causes damage to the landscaping (including without limitation, any road or paved area, landscape feature, lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plan or amenities) in connection with the development of that Lot the proprietor of the Lot is liable for any costs incurred by the Neighbourhood Association in restoring same.

9. BY-LAW 9 THERE IS NO RESTRICTED NEIGHBOURHOOD PROPERTY
There is no Restricted Neighbourhood Property

PART 3

MANDATORY MATTERS

10. BY-LAW 10 OPEN ACCESS WAYS OR PRIVATE ACCESS WAYS

There are no open access ways or private access ways.

11. BY-LAW 11 NEIGHBOURHOOD PROPERTY

There are no facilities on Neighbourhood Property within the Neighbourhood Plan except for the Service Lines.

There is no fencing requirements in relation to the Neighbourhood Property

12. BY-LAW 12 GARBAGE

- 12.1 All Lots within the Neighbourhood Scheme must store their garbage in containers approved by the Executive Committee and same must be kept secure and hidden from view from outside the Lot until collection in accordance with garbage collection services provided by Newcastle City Council.
- 12.2 The Neighbourhood Association may from time to time regulate the procedures for garbage collection in accordance with requirements of the Council.

13. BY-LAW 13 STATUTORY SERVICES

- On installation of a Service Line, a statutory easement may be created over the parts of the Community Parcel for the provision of Services through Service Lines.
- 13.2 The Service Providers and other owners of Service Lines must maintain and repair their respective Service under any statutory rights or obligations of the Service Provider.

- 13.3 If a Service is provided after the registration of the Management Statement, the Neighbourhood Association must prepare a Prescribed Diagram and the Neighbourhood Association must:
 - (a) give its consent to the Prescribed Diagram; and
 - (b) make available all necessary documents including the certificate of title for the Neighbourhood Property to facilitate the registration of the Prescribed Diagram; and
 - (c) if Service Lines are not installed as intended in dedicated public roads then the Neighbourhood Association must prepare and register a Prescribed Diagram showing the Service Lines as installed. All members of Neighbourhood Association must consent to any Prescribed Diagram.

14. BY-LAW 14 INSURANCE

- 14.1 The Neighbourhood Association must take out insurance required under the Management Act.
- 14.2 The Neighbourhood Association must review on an annual basis:
 - (a) All insurances affected by it; and
 - (b) The need for new or additional insurances
- 14.3 Notice of an Annual General Meeting must include a form of motion to decide whether insurances affected by the Neighbourhood Association should be confirmed, varied or extended.
- 14.4 The Neighbourhood Association must immediately:
 - (a) affect new insurances; or
 - (b) vary or extend existing insurances,
 - (c) if there is an increase in risk;
 - (d) or a new risk to the Neighbourhood Property.
- 14.5 A proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not, except with the approval of the Neighbourhood Association, do anything that might:
 - (a) Void or prejudice insurance affected by the Neighbourhood Association;
 or
 - (b) Increase any insurance premium payable by the Neighbourhood Association

15. BY-LAW 15 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Constitution

15.1 The Executive Committee of the Neighbourhood Association must be established in accordance with Division 2 of part 2 of the Management Act.

Notice Board

15.2 The Executive Committee must fix a notice board to some part of Community Property.

Meetings

15.3 The Executive Committee may, subject to By-Laws 15.6 and 15.7, meet together for the conduct of business, adjourn and otherwise regulate its meetings as it thinks fit.

Notice of Meetings

- 15.4 The Secretary or a member of the Executive Committee who convenes a meeting must, not less than 24 hours immediately before the Neighbourhood Executive Committee holds a meeting, display on the notice board:
 - (a) The notice of intention to hold the meeting; and
 - (b) The proposed agenda for the meeting

Meeting Agenda

15.5 The agenda for a meeting must include details of all business to be dealt with at that meeting.

No business may be dealt with at meeting unless details of that business are set out in the agenda for that meeting.

Place of Meetings

15.6 Meetings must be held within a radius of 1km from the Community Parcel.

Meeting at Request of Members

15.7 The Secretary or in his absence any member of the Executive Committee must, at the request of not less than 1/3 of the members of the Executive Committee, convene a meeting within a period of time specified in the request or, if no time is specified, within 14 days of the making of the request.

Out of Meeting Determinations

- 15.8 Where:
 - (a) By-Law 15.4 has been complied with in relation to a meeting:
 - (b) Each member of the Executive Committee has been served with a copy of a motion for a proposed resolution to be submitted at the meeting; and
 - (c) The resolution has been approved in writing by a majority of members of the Executive Committee,

then the resolution will, subject to Section 38(3) of the Management Act, be as valid as if it had been passed at a duly convened meeting of the Executive Committee even though the meeting was not held.

Right of Proprietor to Attend Meetings

15.9A A proprietor of a Lot or, where the proprietor is a corporation, the company nominee of the corporation, may attend a meeting but that person may not address the meeting unless authorised by a resolution of the Executive Committee.

Minutes of Meetings

15.10 Minutes of meetings must be kept properly and held with the minutes of the General Meetings of the Neighbourhood Association.

Distribution of Minutes

15.11 The Executive Committee must, within 7 days after holding a meeting, display a copy of the Minutes of that meeting on the notice board.

The minutes of a Executive Committee meeting must remain on the notice board for a period of at least 14 days.

Functions of a Secretary

- 15.12 The Functions of the Secretary include:
 - (a) Preparing and distributing the minutes of meetings of the Neighbourhood Association and the Executive Committee;
 - (b) Giving, on behalf of the Neighbourhood Association and the Executive Committee, notices required to be given under the Management Act;
 - (c) Maintaining the Neighbourhood Association roll;
 - (d) Supplying certificates in accordance with Clause 2 of Schedule 4 of the Management Act;
 - (e) Answering communications addressed to the Neighbourhood Association or the Executive Committee;
 - (f) Convening meeting of the Executive Committee and the Neighbourhood Association (other than the First Annual General Meeting);
 - (g) Performing administrative or secretarial functions on behalf of the Neighbourhood Association;
 - (h) Performing administrative or secretarial functions on behalf of the Executive Committee; and
 - (i) Keeping records under part 3 of Schedule 1 and part 3 Schedule 3 of the Management Act.

Functions of the Treasurer

- 15.13 The functions of the Treasurer include:
 - (a) The functions set out in Section 36(1) of the Management Act:
 - (b) Notifying proprietors of lots of any contributions of any contributions levied under the Management Act and collecting such contributions;
 - (c) Receiving, acknowledging, banking and accounting for any monies paid to the Neighbourhood Association;
 - (d) Preparing any certificate applied for under paragraphs Section 26 and clause 2 of Schedule 4 of the Management Act;
 - (e) Keeping prescribed accounting records under clause 10 of Schedule 1 of the Management Act; and
 - (f) Preparing financial statements under Clause 11 of Schedule 1 of the Management Act.
 - (g) Notifying proprietors of Lots within the Neighbourhood Plan of any contribution levied under this Neighbourhood Statement and collecting such contribution.

Sub Committee

15.14 The Executive Committee may from time to time appoint sub-committees comprising one or more of its members to :

- (a) conduct investigations;
- (b) perform duties and functions on behalf of the Executive Committee; and
- (c) report the findings of the sub-committee to the Executive Committee.

No Remuneration

15.15 Member of the Executive Committee are not entitled to any remuneration for the performance of their functions but are entitled to reimbursement for reasonable out of pocket expenses incurred by them in the performance of their functions.

Protection of Neighbourhood Executive Committee Members from Liability

15.16 No member of the Executive Committee shall be liable for any loss or damage occurring by reason of an act done in his capacity as a member of the Executive Committee except due to fraud or negligence on the part of that member.

PART 4

OPTIONAL MATTERS

16. BY-LAW 16 NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION'S RIGHT TO CONTRACT

The Neighbourhood Association may contract with persons to provide amenities or services to proprietors or occupiers of Neighbourhood Lots in the Neighbourhood Plan if the Community Association does not do so on its own behalf or on behalf of the Neighbourhood Association under Clause 57 of the Community Management Statement.

17. BY-LAW 17 NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION'S RIGHT TO RECOVER MONEY

The Neighbourhood Association may recover any money owing to it under the By-Laws as a debt.

18. BY-LAW 18 REIMBURSEMENT OF COSTS, CHARGES AND EXPENSES

- A proprietor or occupier of a Lot must pay or reimburse the Neighbourhood Association on demand for the costs, charges and expenses of the Neighbourhood Association in connection with the contemplated or actual enforcement, or preservation of any rights under the By-Laws in relation to the proprietor or occupier.
- 18.2 The costs, charges and expenses under By-Law 18.1 shall include, without limitation, those expenses incurred in retaining any independent consultant or other person to evaluate any matter of concern and the Neighbourhood Association's administration costs in connection with those events.

SHEET 14 of 22

19. BY-LAW 19 INTEREST ON OVERDUE MONEY

- 19.1 A proprietor or occupier of a Lot must pay the Neighbourhood Association interest on any amount, other than a contribution levied by the Neighbourhood Association under the Management Act, that has become due for payment and remains unpaid from and including the date it becomes due for payment.
- 19.2 During the period that an amount under By-Law 19.1 remains unpaid, on demand or at times notified by the Neighbourhood Association, interest shall be calculated on daily balances at the rate equal to 2% per annum above the rate quoted from time to time by the Neighbourhood Association's bankers (as nominated by the Neighbourhood Association) on overdraft accommodation in excess of \$100,000.00.
- 19.3 Interest which is not paid when due for payment may be capitalized by the Neighbourhood Association at monthly intervals and is payable on capitalized interest at the rate and in the manner referred to in By-Law 19.2.
- 19.4 Nothing in this By-Law 19 prevents the Neighbourhood Association from recovering any amount exceeding the interest calculated under this By-Law as a consequence of any amount not being paid when due.

20. BY-LAW 20 RULES

- (a) 20.1 The Neighbourhood Association may make Rules relating to the control, management, operation, use and enjoyment of the Neighbourhood Parcel.
- 20.2 The Neighbourhood Association may at any time add to or alter the rules.
- 20.3 The Neighbourhood Association may not make a Rule or add to or alter a Rule so that it is or becomes inconsistent or in conflict with the Management Act, the Development Act or these By-Laws.
- 20.4 Rules bind a proprietor, occupier, mortgagee in possession and lessee of a Lot and each Neighbourhood Association.

21. BY-LAW 21 COMPLIANCE WITH REQUIREMENTS OF AUTHORITIES

A proprietor or occupier of a Lot must comply on time with all requirements and order of authorities and all laws in connection with the Lot and the use or occupation of the Lot.

SHEET 15922

22. BY-LAW 22 NOTICES TO BE OBSERVED

A proprietor or occupier of a Lot must comply on time with all notice from authorities and all laws in connection with notices relating to the Lot.

23. BY-LAW 23 INSTRUCTING CONTRACTORS

A proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not directly or indirectly instruct agents, employees or contractors of the Neighbourhood Association unless authorized to do so by the Neighbourhood Association.

24. BY-LAW 24 COMMUNICATIONS WITH NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION

Complaints, notices or applicants to or request for consideration of matters by the Neighbourhood Association must be in writing and forwarded to the Managing Agent appointed or if there is no managing agent, to the secretary of the Executive Committee.

25. BY-LAW 25 COMMUNICATIONS FROM NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION

An approval, notice or authorization by the Neighbourhood Association under the By-Laws must be in writing.

26. BY-LAW 26 APPROVALS BY NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION

The Neighbourhood Association may give conditionally or unconditionally or withhold its approval under the By-Laws in its absolute discretion unless expressly provided otherwise in the By-Laws.

27. BY-LAW 27 NO INTERFERENCE

A proprietor or occupier of a Lot shall not:

- (a) Do anything or permit anything to be done in relation to that Lot so that;
 - i) Any support or shelter provided by that Lot for another Lot or Neighbourhood Property or any part of it is interfered with; or
 - Service Lines, garbage services, Private Services or any services within the Neighbourhood Scheme owned by a Service Provider are interfered with; or

SHEET 16 yzz

(b) Use or enjoy the Neighbourhood Property in such a manner or for such a purpose as to interfere unreasonably with the use and enjoyment of the Neighbourhood Property by the owner or occupier of any other Lot or Authorised Person.

28. BY-LAW 28 MAINTENANCE OF VACANT LOTS

- 28.1 A proprietor of a Lot must:
 - (a) if that Lot is vacant, and until such time as building operations on that Lot commence;
 - (i) maintain that Lot to an acceptable standard;
 - (ii) keep the Lot free from debris and rubbish; and
 - (b) once building works commence on the Lot and until completion of the main residential building, do all things reasonably necessary to ensure that the main residential building and associated work is completed without delay and in an efficient manner.

PART 5

BY-LAWS REQUIRED BY PUBLIC AUTHORITIES

29. BY-LAW 29 BUSHFIRE MAINTENANCE

None as the responsibility to carryout the requirements in the report prepared by the Australian Bushfire Protection Planners dated 6 March 2006 is to remain with the Community Association

30. BY-LAW 30 DEFINITIONS, INTERPRETATION AND GENERAL

The following words have these meanings in the By-Laws unless the contrary intention appears:

Annual General Meeting means annual general meeting of the Neighbourhood Association other than the first annual general meeting.

Applicant means:

- In relation to an application to add to or alter the architectural standards
 a proprietor of a Lot or his representative who applies to the Neighbourhood Association for the addition to alteration; or
- (b) In relation to a Building Modification, or a New Construction a proprietor of a Lot or his representative who submits plans and specifications to the review sub-committee for approval.

Architectural Standards means the architectural standards contained in this document as amended from time to time in accordance with the By-Laws.

Authorised Person means a person on the Neighbourhood Parcel with the express or implied consent of a proprietor of a Lot or the Neighbourhood Association or means representatives or employees of Newcastle City Council undertaking Council duties.

Board means the Community Schemes Board constituted under the Management Act.

Building Modification means any modification, addition, alteration or exterior colour change made of or to an existing building or structure on Neighbourhood Property, or a Lot.

By-Law means a By-Law included in the Management Statement.

Community Association means the community association created on registration of Deposited Plan 270583.

Community Titles Legislation means the Development Act, the Management Act and the cognate legislation.

Concept Plan means the plan marked "Concept Plan" contained in the Management Statement.

Council means Newcastle City Council.

Development Act means the Community Land Development Act 1989 and regulations made under it.

Executive Committee means the executive committee of the Neighbourhood Association as constituted or elected from time to time under the Management Act.

First Annual General Meeting means the meeting convened and held pursuant to Section 9 of the Management Act.

Function includes a power, authority and duty.

General Meeting means as annual general meeting or a special meeting of the Neighbourhood Association.

Lot means a lot in the Neighbourhood Plan.

SHEET 18 of 22

Management Act means the Community Land Management Act, 1989 and regulations made under it.

Management Statement means the statement registered with the Neighbourhood Plan from time to time added to, modified or amended in accordance with the Community Title Legislation.

Managing Agent means an agent appointed under Section 50 of the Management Act.

Neighbourhood Association means the corporation that:

- (a) Is constituted by Section 25 of the Development Act on registration of a Neighbourhood Plan; and
- (b) Is established as a Neighbourhood Association by Section 5 of the Management Act.

Neighbourhood Parcel means the land the subject of the Neighbourhood Scheme.

Neighbourhood Plan means deposited plan number 286154.

Neighbourhood Property means the land shown as neighbourhood property in the Neighbourhood Plan.

Neighbourhood Scheme means:

- (a) The subdivision of the land by the Neighbourhood Plan;
- (b) The proposals in any related Development Contact; and
- (c) The rights conferred, and the obligations imposed, by or under the Community Titles Legislation in relation to the Neighbourhood Association, Neighbourhood Property and persons having interest in or occupying Lots.

New Constructions means building work that is intended to be carried out on Neighbourhood Property or a Lot.

Original Proprietor means the original proprietor of all Lots in the Neighbourhood Plan or the Community Association if the Original Owner gives notice to the community Association that it relinquishes its powers under By-Law 35 of the Community Management Statement.

Prescribed Diagram means the diagram relating to the Services Lines marked "Plan of Service work as Executed" contained in the Management Statement and prescribed by Section 36 of the Development Act.

Private Service means a service running through or servicing Lots or Neighbourhood Property.

Rules means the rules made pursuant to By-Law 20.

Secretary means the secretary of the Neighbourhood Association.

SHEET 19 gzz

Service Line means a pipe, wire, cable, duct, conduit or pole by means of which a service is or is to be provided the location of which is illustrated in the Prescribed Diagram.

Service Provider means any statutory or government authority including without limitation, Advance Energy, Telstra, Alinta or the Council.

Statutory Service means a service running through or servicing Lots or Neighbourhood Property provided by a Service Provider.

Treasurer means the treasurer of the Neighbourhood Association.

- 30.2 In the By-Laws unless the contrary intention appears:
 - (a) A reference to an instrument includes any variation or replacement of it:
 - (b) A reference to a statute, ordinance, code or other law includes regulations and other instruments under it and consolidations, amendments, re-enactments or replacements of any of them;
 - (c) The singular includes the plural and vice versa;
 - (d) The word "person" includes a firm, a body corporate, an association or an authority;
 - (e) A reference to a person includes a reference to the persons executors, administrators, successors, substitutes (including, without limitation persons taking by novation) and assigns.
 - (f) A reference to a day is a reference to the period of time commencing at midnight and ending 24 hours later.
 - (g) Headings are inserted for convenience and do not affect the interpretation of this Management Statement.
- 30.3 If the whole or any part of a provision of the By-Laws is void, unenforceable or illegal, it is severed. The remainder of the By-Laws have full force and effect. This By-Law has no effect if the severance alters the basic nature of the By-Laws or is contrary to public policy.
- 30.4 The Neighbourhood Association may exercise a right, power or remedy at its discretion and separately or concurrently with another right, power or remedy. A single or partial exercise of a right, power or remedy by the Neighbourhood Association does not prevent a further exercise of that or of any other right, power or remedy. Failure by the Neighbourhood Association to exercise or delay in exercising a right, power or remedy does not prevent its exercise.
- 30.5 The rights, powers and remedies provided in the By-Laws are cumulative with and not exclusive of the rights, powers or remedies by law independently of the By-Laws.

- 30.6 A reference to an authority, institute, association or body or to any officer of them is in the event of that authority, institute, association, body or officer ceasing to exist or being reconstituted, renamed or replaced or of their respective powers of functions being transferred to any other organization or person deemed to be a reference to the organization or officer established, constituted or appointed in lieu of or as replacement for or which or who serves substantially the same purposes or subject of that authority, institute, association, body or officer.
- 30.7 Any word or expression used in the Management Statement where the first letter is capitalized is a defined term. If such word or expression is not specifically defined in the Management Statement it shall have the same meaning as it has in the Community Titles Legislation unless the context otherwise requires.

### WARNING

The terms of this Management Statement are binding on the Community Association, each subsidiary body within the Community Scheme and each person who is a proprietor, lessee, occupier or mortgagee in possession of a Community Development Lot, Precinct Development Lot, Neighbourhood Lot or Strata Lot within the Community Scheme.
- B. Each poson who is a proprietor, lessee, occupier or mortgagee in possession of a Community Development Lot, Precinct Development Lot, Neighbourhood Lot or Strata Lot is bound by the terms of the Community Management Statement, the terms of the Neighbourhood Management Statement if the Subsidiary Scheme is a Neighbourhood Scheme and the terms of the by-law instrument of the Strata Scheme if the Subsidiary Scheme is a Strata Scheme.

# PART 1 BY-LAWS-FIXING DETAILS OF DEVELOPMENT

These By-Laws relate to the control and preservation of the essence or theme of the Community Scheme and as such may only be amended or revoked by unanimous resolution of the Community Association in accordance with Section 17(2) of the Community Land Management Act 1989.

These By-Laws may relate to the control or preservation of the essence or theme of the development under the Community Scheme by specifying:

- any provisions limiting occupancy under the Scheme to persons of a particular description; and
- (c) the architectural, building or landscaping styles to be permitted; and
- (d) the kind of materials that may be used in buildings and other structures; and
- (e) any provisions requiring that specified Community Association Property be used only for particular purposes; and
- (f) any other kind of restrictions.

### BY-LAW 1 ENVIRONMENTALLY SENSITIVE DEVELOPMENT

- 1.1 The Community Association is charged with maintaining the integrity of the Community Scheme and complying strictly with all relevant Planning Instruments affecting the Community Scheme from time to time.
- 1.2 All Subsidiary Bodies must comply with the standards set by the Community Association.

### ARCHITECTURAL STANDARDS

- 2.1 The Architectural Standards and Landscape Standards bind:
  - (a) the Community Association:
  - (b) each proprietor or occupier of a Lot;

### BY-LAW 3

# AMENDING ARCHITECTURAL STANDARDS AND LANDSCAPING STANDARDS

### Right of Community Association to amend

- 3.1 The Original Proprietor may from time to time create, adopt, add to or alter architectural standards for Community Property and any Lot in the Community Scheme.
- 3.2 No proprietor of a Lot other than the Original Proprietor or a Subsidiary Body is entitled to amend the standards in any way without the prior written consent of
  - the Community Association or, where the Community Association has delegated the authority, that delegate; and
  - (b) the Original Proprietor,
- 3.3 If a Subsidiary Body seeks to add to or alter its respective architectural standards or landscape standards in accordance with these By-Laws then the Community Association must, within a reasonable time, deliver a copy of the alterations or additions to each Subsidiary Body and each proprietor of a Community Development Lot.
- 3.4 The proprietor of a Lot is entitled to an up-to-date copy of the Architectural Standards and Landscape Standards from the Community Association upon payment of a reasonable fee.
- 3.5 The landscape standards and architectural standards may be set for any Community Development Lot by the Original Proprietor, or the Community Association but only if the Original Proprietor gives its consent.
- 3.6 Any application for consent to amend standards must be accompanied with sufficient details to allow all parties to properly consider the application and proposed amendments.

- 3.7 The Original Proprietor may appoint a Design Review Committee. Where the Original Proprietor has appointed a Design Review Committee, the Design Review Committee shall exercise the powers and discretions given to the Original Proprietor contained in By-Laws 3.8 to 3,13.
- 3.8 No building modification, new construction or landscape modification may commence or take place until the plans and specifications for it have been approved by the Original Proprietor as to:
  - (a) suitability of design;
  - (b) colour and materials;
  - (c) quality of design, and materials;

  - (e) location in relation to surrounding structures and topography;
  - (f) elevation in relation to existing structures and topography; and
  - (g) harmony with existing landscaping; or

for landscape modifications the suitability and quality of design, colour, plant species and landscape materials and features ad the location and elevation and harmony in relation to surrounding structures and topography and the removal of or dealing with existing plants,

- 3.9 Any plans and specifications submitted pursuant to By-Law 3.8 must be to the standard required from time to time by the Original Proprietor.
- 3.10 The decision of the Original Proprietor must be made on the basis of the By-Laws, the Architectural Standards and Landscaping Standards and any rules in force at the time of its decisions. Where the decision has been delegated to a consultant or a manager as the case may be, the consultant or the manager must base his, her or its decision on the same criteria.
- 3.11 The Original Proprietor may as a condition of any approval pursuant to this part require the payment of a band to be held by the Community Association as security for any damage that an applicant, its contractors, employees or agents may cause to Association Property,
- 3.12 If furfier information is required by the appropriate decision making body officer then that additional material must be furnished. A decision may be made subject to conditions which may be imposed at the decision maker's discretion.
- 3.13 A decision of the Original Proprietor is binding on any applicant for a decision.

BY-LAW 4 MODIFICATIONS AND NEW CONSTRUCTIONS BY THE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

- 4.1 If the Community Association wants to make:
  - (a) a building modification;

### BY-LAW 5 ASSOCIATION PROPERTY

- 5.1 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not except with the approval of the Community Association leave anything on or obstruct the use of the Association Property.
- 5.2 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not damage Association Property of any kind.
- 5.3 The proprietor or occupier of a Let must not except with the approval of the Community Association use any part of the Association Property to the exclusion of any other person.
- 5.4 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must give notice to the Community Association of any damage or defect in Association Property immediately he or she becomes aware of it.

### BY-LAW 6 CONSTRUCTION ON ASSOCIATION PROPERTY

- 6.1 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not, except with the approval of the Community Association:
  - (a) construct any building or other structure including without limitation a fence, screen, pergola or awning on Association Property;
  - (b) . attach any item as a fixture to Association Property; or
  - (c) alter Association property
- 6.2 Any construction, attachment or alteration referred to in the preceding By-Law whether made with or without approval of the Community Association is at the risk of the person erecting it.

### BY-LAW 7 NO INAPPROPRIATE USE

7.1 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must not use anything on the Community Parcel for any purpose other than that for which it was constructed or provided without the approval of the Original Proprietor.

### BY-LAW 8 CLEANLINESS

- 8.1 The proprietor or occupier of a Lot must keep the lot clean and tidy and in good repair and condition.
- 8.2 The Community Association may give notice to a proprietor or occupier of a Lot requiring him or her to comply with the terms of this By-Law

### BY-LAW 9 RESTRICTED USE OF PRIVATE MOTORISED TRANSPORT

- 10.2 The matters set out under By-Law 10 pursuant to Clause 6 of Schedule 3 of the Development Act apply to form part of this By-Law.
- 10.3 If the owner of a Community Development Lot requires access over an access way in a Subsidiary Parcel and registers a Precinct Plan, Neighbourhood Plan or a Strata Plan requiring access to and egress from the Precinct or Neighbourhood Parcel over such access ways in any Subsidiary Parcel such an access way will be allowed by the Precinct Association, Neighbourhood Association or Owners Corporation (as applicable) without fees.
- 10.4 The provisions of By-Law 10 apply even where the relevant plan contemplates an access way be granted to development on land adjacent to the Community Parcel.
- 10.5 Nothing in this Management Statement binds the Original Proprietor so that the Original Proprietor may be hindered in or prevented from exercising its rights under this By-Law 10.

# CONVERSION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT LOT TO COMMUNITY PROPERTY

- 11.1 If the Original Proprietor wishes to convert part of a Community Davelopment Lot in the Community Plan to Community Property it must give a notice in that regard to the Community Association.

- 13.1 The Community Property includes natural bush land and passive open space and facilities which may be provided include fire traits, cycle/walk ways, Roads and storm water treatment structures, tennis court, swimming pool, BBQ area and house.
- 13.2 The Community Association may contract persons to provide management, operational, maintenance and other services in connection with Community Property.
- 13.3 The Community Association is entitled to make Rules relating to the control, use, management and maintenance of the Community Property in accordance with the Management Act and By-Law 27.

### BY-LAW 14 INTERNAL FENCING

14.1 Fencing must be erected and maintained solely at the cost of the lot proprietor. Where any fence is a dividing fence, the cost of erection and maintenance of the fence must be shared equally between the lot proprietors, except where the adjoining proprietor is either the Original Proprietor or the Association. Neither the Original Proprietor nor the Association is obliged to contribute towards the cost of erection or maintenance of any such fencing.

### BY-LAW 15 STORAGE AND COLLECTION OF GARBAGE

- 15.1 The Community Association must provide on Community Property garbage bins for the storage of garbage which is generated on Community Property.
- 15.2 The Community Association must:
  - deposit all garbage from Community Property and the property of Subsidiary Schemes into the garbage bin and
  - (b) keep the area where the garbage bins are provided clean and tidy.
- 15.3 The Community Association is responsible to ensure that garbage from Association Property is either made available for collection by the local council in accordance with the Council's rules, regulations and ordinances or must otherwise arrange for the removal of garbage by private contractors.

Individual lots will be serviced by Council's regular garbage collection services. Garbage bins are to be stored in a convenient and unobtrusive location on the lot.

### BYLAW 16 SERVICES

- 16.1 No Services will be provided by the Community Association.
- 16.2 If a Service is provided after the registration of the Management Statement, the Community Association must submit a Prescribed Diagram to any Subsidiary Body affected by the amendment to enable that Subsidiary Body to:
  - (b) give its consent to the amendment if such consent is required;
  - (c) make available all necessary documents including the Certificate of Title for the Property of such Subsidiary Scheme to facilitate the registration of the amendment and thereafter the Community Association must register the Prescribed Diagram.

### BY-LAW 17 INSURANCE

- 17.2 The Community Association must take out insurance required under the Management Act including the following policies:
  - to cover any building or structure on the Community Property against damage or destruction by fire, lightning, explosion or other prescribed risk;
  - (b) under the Workers Compensation Act 1987;
  - (c) to cover damage to the Community Property and for death and bodily injury for which the Community Association could become liable in damages;

- (d) to cover damages for which the Community Association could become liable because of work done by a voluntary worker;
- (e) to cover accidental injury to, or accidental death of, a voluntary worker, and
- (f) to cover the possibility of the members of the Community Association becoming jointly liable under a claim arising out of any other event against which the Community Association decides by special resolution to insure.
- (g) to cover public liability over the land in the Community Scheme as required under section 40(2) of the Management Act; and
- (h) any other insurance required.
- 17.2 The Community Association must review, on an annual basis:
  - (a) all of its insurance; and
  - (b) the need for new or additional insurances.
- 17.3 Notice of an Annual General Meeting must include a form of motion to decide whether the insurances of the Community Association should be confirmed, varied or extended.
- 17.4 If there is an increase in risk or a new risk to the Community Property then the Community Association mist immediately:
  - (a) effect new insurances; or
  - (b) vary or extend existing insurances.
- 17.5 An Owner or Occupier must obtain the written approval of the Community Association before it does anything that might:
  - (a) void or prejudice the Community Association's insurance; or
  - (b) increase any insurance premium which the Community Association pays.

### BY-LAW 18 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

### Constitution

- 18.1 (a) The Executive Committee of the Association is constituted under and must be established in accordance with Division 2 of Part 2 of the Management Act.
  - (b) The Executive Committee may meet together for the conduct of business, adjourn and otherwise regulate its meetings as it thinks fit.

### Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer

18.2 The chairman, secretary and treasurer of the Executive Committee can also be respectively the chairman, secretary and treasurer of the Association.

### Notice of Meeting

  - (a) a notice of its intention to hold the meeting; and
  - (b) the detailed agenda proposed for the meeting.

### Agenda

  - display on the notice board, if there is one or provide each proprietor of a Lot with a copy of the minutes of that meeting; or
  - (b) display on the notice board, if there is one, or provide each proprietor of a Lot with a copy of the resolution passed under By-Law 18.11.

If the Executive Committee elects to display a copy of the minutes or the resolution on the notice board then the copy of the minutes and the resolution must be displayed on the notice board for a period of at least fourteen (14) days,

### Powers and duties of Secretary

18.15 The powers and duties of the Secretary of the Association are:

  - receiving, acknowledging, banking and accounting for all money paid to the Association;
  - (c) preparing any certificate applied for under and in accordance with Section 26 and Clause 2 of Schedule 4 of the Management Act;
  - (d) keeping the prescribed accounting records referred to in Clause 10 of Schedule 1 of the Management Act;
  - (e) preparing the prescribed financial statement referred to in Clause 11 of Schedule 1 of the Management Act;
  - (f) the functions set out in Clause 36(1) of the Management Act.
- 18.17 The Executive Committee and its members shall not be liable for any loss or damage which arises as a result of any act done by Executive Committee or the members in it, his or her respective capacity as the Executive Committee or member of the Executive Committee except fraud on the part of the Executive Committee or that

### OPTIONAL MATTERS

#### BY-LAW 19

### SERVICES

- 19.1 The proprietor or occupier of a lot must not.
  - carry out any works which interfere with Services unless the approval of the Community Association and any relevant authority has been first obtained in writing; or
  - (b) obstruct access to overload or damage Services.
- 19.2 Subject to any provision set out in Section 60 of the Management Act, the Association and persons authorised by it may enter a lot at any time in an emergency and otherwise at reasonable times to maintain repair alter add to increase or decrease the capacity of or renew any Service.

### BY-LAW 20 ASSOCIATION MAY ENTER AND DO WORK

- 20.1 The Community Association may (but shall not be obliged to) at the cost of the proprietor of the Lot do anything on a Lot which should have been done by the proprietor or occupier of a Lot under the By-Laws and which has not been done or has not been done as required.
- 20.2 If the Community Association wishes to exercise its right under By-Law 20.1 then the Community Association may:
  - (a) give the proprietor or occupier of the Lot notice of its intention to enter and/or carry our work, and
  - (b) (with or without any persons authorised by the Community Association) enter the Lot at any time after the date specified in the notice given by the Community Association under By-Law 20.1 (a) and remain on the Lot for so long as is necessary to carry out or do the act or thing which is done.

### BY-LAW 21 MORT TO RECOVER MONEY

21.1 The Community Association may recover any money owing to it under the By-Lews as a debt.

### BYLAW 22 CONTROL OF LESSEES/LICENSEES

- 22.1 A Proprietor whose Lot in whole or in part is the subject of a lease or license agreement must:
  - (a) provide the lessee or licensee with a copy of this Management Statement;

(b) require the lessee or licensee to perform and observe the obligations on the

part of the proprietor under the By-Law: and

(c) take all reasonable steps including, without limitation, any action available to him/her under the lease or license agreement to ensure that the lessee or licensee of the Lot and any person on the Neighbourhood Parcel or Strata Scheme with the consent (express or implied) of the lessee or licensee complies with the By-Laws.

23.1 A proprietor or occupier of a Lot must take all reasonable steps to ensure that an Authorised Person complies with the By-Laws.

### BY-LAW 24 REIMBURSEMENT OF COSTS, CHARGES AND EXPENSES

- 24.1 A proprietor or occupier of a Lot must pay or reimburse the Community Association on demand for the costs, charges and expenses of the Community Association in connection with the contemplated or actual enforcement, or preservation of any rights under the By-Laws in relation to the proprietor or occupier.
- 24.2 The costs, charges and expenses under By-Law 24.1 shall include, without limitation, those expenses incurred in retaining any independent consultant or other person to evaluate any matter of concern and administration costs in connection with those matters.

### BY-LAW 25 THINGS DONE AT PROPRIETOR'S OR OCCUPIER'S COST

25.1 Any act or thing which a proprietor or occupier of a Lot is required to or may do under the By-Laws must be done at the cost of the proprietor or occupier.

### BY-LAW 26 ASSOCIATION NOT LIABLE FOR DAMAGE

26.1 The Community Association is not liable for damage to or loss of property or injury to any person in or near the Community Parcel due to any cause other than the fraud of the Community Association or any employee or agent of the Community Association.

### BY-LAW 27 RULES

- 27.1 The Association may with the consent of the Original Proprietor make Rules relating to the control, management, operation, use and enjoyment of the Community Parcel.
- 27:2 The Association with the consent of the Original Proprietor may at any time add to or alter the Rules.
- 27.3 The Association may not make a Rule or add to or alter a Rule so that it is or becomes inconsistent or in conflict with the Management Act, the Development Act or these By-Laws or any management agreement made by the Association and third parties.
- 27.4 Rules bind a proprietor, occupier, mortgagee in possession and lessee of a Lot and the Association.

# BY-LAW 28 MAINTENANCE OF SUBSIDIARY ASSOCIATION PROPERTY

- 28.1 The Community Association shall be responsible for the maintenance and control of Association Property of any Subsidiary Scheme provided that such Association Property shall pursuant to the By-Laws of the Subsidiary Scheme be available to the use and enjoyment of all proprietors of lots in the Community Scheme and its Subsidiary Schemes.
- 28.2 For the purposes of this By-Law, "maintenance" shall include the replacement of any Association Property for which the Community Association has responsibility pursuant

28.3 The Community Association shall pay for or reimburse all Subsidiary Schemes in respect of any insurance premiums in respect of the insurance required or considered prudent in respect of Association Property subject of By-Law 28.1.

### BY-LAW 29 COMPLIANCE WITH REQUIREMENTS OF AUTHORITIES

29.1 A proprietor or occupier of a Lot must comply on time with all requirements and orders of authorities and all laws in connection with the Lot and use or occupation of the Lot.

### BY-LAW 30 CERTIFICATE

30.1 A Cortificate signed by the Association, its Managing Agent (if any) or the Secretary about a matter or a sum payable to the Association in connection with the By-Laws is, except in the case of manifest error, prima facie evidence of the amount or any other matter of fact stated in it.

### BY-LAW 31 COMMUNICATIONS WITH ASSOCIATION

31.1 Complaints, notices or applications to or requests for consideration of matters by the Association must be in writing and forwarded to the Managing Agent of the Association or the Secretary if no managing agent is appointed,

### BY-LAW 32 COMMUNICATIONS FROM ASSOCIATION

32.1 An approval, notice or authorisation by the Association under the By-Laws must be in writing.

### BY-LAW 33 APPROVALS BY ASSOCIATION

- 33.1 The Association may give approval conditionally or unconditionally or withhold its approval under the By-Laws in its absolute discretion unless expressly provided otherwise in the By-Laws.
- 33.2 For the purposes of Clause 6 of Schedule 3 of the Development Act any management agreement entered into between the Community Association and a manager is deemed to be part of this Management Statement.

### BY-LAW 34 RAINWATER RUN OFF

34.1 Neither the Community Association any Subsidiary Association or owner of a Lot nor any other person or entity other than the Original Proprietor may prevent alter or hinder the natural flow of rainwater run off across the Community Association Parcel. The Original Proprietor may utilise the run off in such manner as it sees fit.

### BY-LAW 35 GENERAL RESTRICTIONS

- 35.1 A proprietor or occupier of a Lot other than the Original Proprietor must not do or permit any of the following on the Community Parcel without the consent of the Original Proprietor
  - park any vehicle, boat, trailer or caravan other than in a designated parking space;

- (d) obstruct the lawful use of Community Property or the property of any Subsidiary Scheme;
- dress, speak or act in such a manner as is likely to cause offence to the proprietor or occupier of any Lot or lot in any Subsidiary Scheme;
- (f) operate or permit to be operated any device which interferes with any electronic equipment or appliance which is lawfully used by the Community Association, the association of any Subsidiary Scheme or a proprietor of any Lot;
- (g) use a Lot for any illegal purpose;
- (h) use any building constructed on a Lot as an exhibition home or for the promotion of the sale of homes; or
- (i) display any sign, advertisement, hoarding or similar structure including any sign advertising a Lot to be for sale.

### BY-LAW 36 POWERS OF THE ORIGINAL PROPRIETOR

- 36.1 All powers, discretions and exemptions given to the Original Proprietor by the By-Laws set out in this Management Statement shall terminate upon the first to occur of the following events
  - (a) The Original Proprietor ceases to be the proprietor of a lot in the Community Scheme or any Subsidiary Scheme; or
  - (b) The Original Proprietor gives notice to the Community Association in writing that it relinquishes all of its powers, discretions and exemptions.
- 36.2 The Original Proprietor may relinquishes all of its powers, discretions and exemptions in respect of a Subsidiary Scheme at any time by giving notice to the Community Association and to the relevant Subsidiary Scheme in writing.
- 36.3 Upon the termination of the Original Proprietor's powers, discretions and exemptions in respect of the Community Scheme or a Subsidiary Scheme, those powers, discretions and exemptions shall be exercised and held by the Community Association.
- 36.4 The Community Association may delegate any such power or discretion as it sees fit.

### BY-LAW 37 VEGETATION MANAGEMENT PLAN

- 37.1 The Community Association is responsible for the implementation of the Vegetation Management Plan.
- 37.2 The functions of the Community Association in connection with the Vegetation Management Plan are:

### BY-LAW 39 MAINTENANCE OF VACANT LOTS

- 39.1 A proprietor of a Lot must:
  - (e) if that lot is vacant, and until such time as building operations on that lot commence:
    - (i) maintain that lot to an acceptable standard;
    - (ii) keep the lot free from debris and rubbish; and
  - (b) once building works commence on the lot and until completion of the main residential building, do all things reasonably necessary to ensure that the main residential building and associated work is completed without delay and in an efficient manner.

### 41.1 Definitions

"Aboriginal Heritage Management Plan" means the aboriginal heritage management plan prepared by Ticoon Pty Ltd dated November 2007 for Outlook Estate, Fletcher.

"Annual General Meeting" means an annual general meeting of the Community Association other than the first annual general meeting.

"Architectural Standards" means the architectural standards (if any) created or adopted by the Original Proprietor as added to or aftered as provided in these By-Laws.

"Association" means the Community Association,

"Association Property" means:

- in relation to the Community Scheme the Community Property in the Scheme; or
- (b) In respect of a Subsidiary Scheme the association property of that Scheme, excluding the common property of a strata scheme.

"Authorised Person" means a person on a Community Percel with the Consent express or implied of a proprietor or occupier of a Lot, the Community Association or a Subsidiary Body.

"By-Law" means a bylaw included in the Management Statement.

"Community Association" means the corporation that:

- is constituted by Section 25 of the Development Act on the registration of the Community Plan; and
- (b) establishes a Community Association by Section 5 of the Management Act.

"Community Development Lot" means a lot in the Community Plan which is not Community Property, a public reserve or a drainage reserve and is not land that has become subject to a subsidiary scheme or a Lot that has been severed from the Community Scheme.

"Community Parcel" means the land the subject of the Community Scheme.

"Community Plan" meals Deposited Plan No.

"Community Property" means the Lot shown in the Community Plan as Community Property.

"Community Scheme" means:

- (a) the subdivision of land by the Community Plan;
- (b) the subdivision of the land in the Community Plan by a Precinct Plan, Neighbourhood Plan or a Strata Plan; or

- (c) the proposal in any related development contract; and
- (d) the rights conferred and the obligations imposed by or under the Community Titles Legislation in relation to the Community Association, Community Property, the Subsidiary Schemes and persons having interests in, or occupying Lots.

"Community Titles Legislation" means the Development Act, the Management Act and any cognate legislation.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Newcastle.

"Design Review Committee" means a committee appointed pursuant to By-law 3.7.

"Developer" means the proprietor or proprietors for the time being of a Community Development Lot in the Community Plan.

"Development Act" means the Community Land Development Act 1989 and Regulations made under it.

"Development Activities" means:

- (a) any form of demolition work, building work or work ancillary to or associated with building work on the Community Parcel including, without limitation, the installation of Services;
- (b) any form of landscaping work or work ancillary to or associated with landscaping work on the Community Parcel;
- any form or work other than the forms of work referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this definition which is considered necessary or desirable by the proprietors for the time being of all Community Development Lots;
- (d) the use of any part of the Community Parcel in connection with the forms of work referred to in paragraphs (a) to (c) of this definition; or
- (e) the subdivisions of land forming part of the Community Parcel and all associated works.
- (f) road construction and associated works.

"Development Contract" means the instrument, plans and drawings which are registered with a Community Plan.

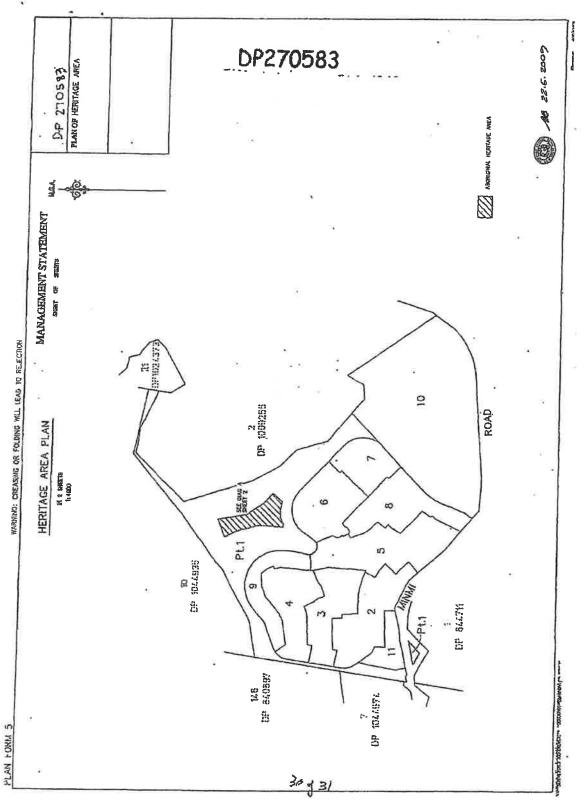

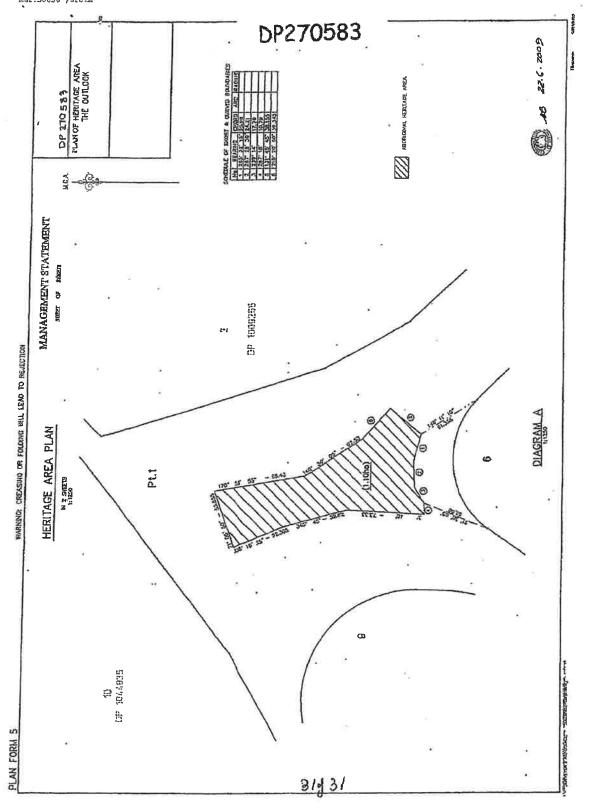

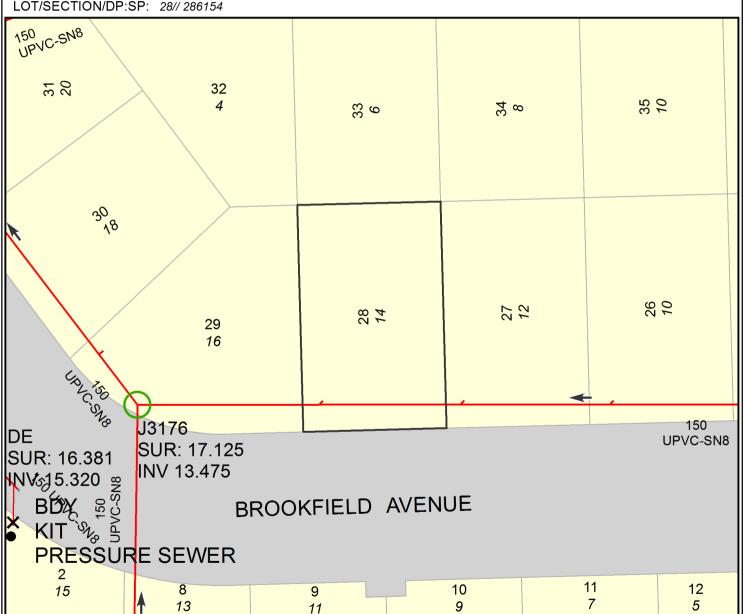
