Currently, information specific to the Kapiti Coast District includes:

 Council-commissioned assessments by Jacobs NZ Ltd, including coastal area-specific risk assessments, a hazard and susceptibility assessment, and the coastal hazards GIS map viewer allowing you to assess how any particular property may be affected.

- A community commissioned coastal hazard risk assessment report by Dr Willem de Lange and related predicted shoreline maps.
- Advice from the Ministry for the Environment and the Department of Conservation on coastal hazard risk identification and management of coastal risks.

Council will consider the information and its possible impact on Kāpiti properties, as part of its review of coastal provisions in the Council's Operative District Plan. On 30 January 2025 Council resolved that this work is a priority to progress.

Earthquakes

Greater Wellington Regional Council holds information on earthquake risks in the Kapiti Coast District. This information, along with associated Earthquake Risk Maps, can be found on the Greater Wellington Regional Council website <u>www.gw.govt.nz/</u>.

Fire

Due to its climate and geographical features, the Kapiti Coast District can be susceptible to risks of fire, including wildfire. More information on this risk can be found in the <u>District Plan</u>, while mapping of the rural wildfire fire risk across the Wellington Region on the Greater Wellington Regional Council website (<u>GWRC rural wildfire risk</u>).

Liquefaction

Due to its geographic location and soil typology, the Kapiti Coast District may be susceptible to liquefaction in the event of an earthquake. Tsunami Evacuation Zones

Tsunami Evacuation Zone Maps have been developed by the Greater Wellington Regional Council to assist emergency preparedness by identifying the areas residents may need to evacuate in the event of a tsunami.

Part of the property is shown to be subject to and adjacent to flood hazards in the Operative District Plan (2021), and the latest Flood Hazard Maps.

The flood hazard identified on the maps provided with this LIM is based on the projected future flooding risk to the property including climate change projections.

The maps show the projected flood extent arising from the 1% AEP or 1% Annual Exceedance Probability Flood Event (that is, a flood event that has a 1% probability of occurring in any one year, often referred to as a 1 in 100 year storm), incorporating the projected 2090 climate change impacts, in conjunction with a 20 year return period high tide.

The nature of the controls imposed by the District Plan depends on where individual sites are located within the 1 in 100 year flood extent; which flood hazard map (operative or latest) is referenced in legislation or the District Plan, and which flood hazard category applies.

Part of the property is shown to be subject to and adjacent to ponding on the Operative District Plan (2021) Flood Hazard Maps, and the latest Flood Hazard Maps.

Ponding are areas where slower-moving flood waters could pond either during or after a flood event. A Ponding Area may be affected by a direct flood risk. Ponding can be associated with rivers and streams as well as the piped stormwater network. Ponding is a direct risk.

The adjacent land and adjoining road carriageway (Te Horo Beach Road) are shown to be subject to a stream corridor on the Operative District Plan (2021) Natural Hazard Maps, and the latest Flood Hazard Maps.

A stream corridor flood hazard is the minimum area able to contain a flood of up to a 1% AEP event magnitude and enable flood water to safely pass to the stream confluence or the sea. It includes flood and erosion prone land immediately adjacent to the stream.

The adjoining road carriageway (Te Horo Beach Road) is shown to be subject to an overflow path in the Operative District Plan (2021) Natural Hazard maps, and the latest Flood Hazard Maps.

Overflow paths generally occur in lower-lying areas on the floodplain which act as channels for flood waters. They can be natural, or artificially formed, and are often characterised by fast flowing water during a flood event. An overflow path is a direct hazard.

- 1. The E-Survey data set(s) must generally conform to the subdivision consent proposal shown on Landlink Plan Number 1030.12-5, Issue B which was submitted with application number RM100220 except where modified by conditions of consent.
- 2. The earthworks and roading shall generally conform to the proposal shown on Landlink Plan Number 1030.12-5B as submitted with application number RM100220 except where modified by conditions of consent.

3. This consent shall remain valid for a period of eight years from the date of issue.

Fees

- 7. Within all lots, no building shall exceed eight metres in height above ground level. For the avoidance of doubt, the terms 'building', 'height' and 'ground level' shall be the same as the District Plan's definitions.
- 8. The floor level of any building within lots 7 to 10 shall not be any higher than 7.5 metres above mean sea level (Wellington Datum). Any building and/or earthworks shall be prohibited on those parts of the site which are above the 8.0 metre AMSL contour line, with the exception of works which may be necessary to construct access and/or flood free sewage disposal fields.
- 9. Within lots 2 to 5 and 7 to 11, the colours of all external components of buildings and structures (including guttering, spouting, and window joinery) shall be restricted to tones within greyness groups A and B of the British Standard (BS) 5252 range, with a maximum reflectivity of 40%.

11. The consent holder shall advise the names of the Developer's or Owner's Representative or Representatives appointed in terms of Clause B(ii) of Part 3 of the Kapiti Coast District Council Subdivision and Development Principles and Requirements 2005 prior to the commencement of work, but no later than one month from the date of issue of this consent.

- 12. The consent holder shall provide a copy signed by the consent holder's contractor of the Contractor Health and Safety Obligation Form as set out in Appendix 2 of Section 6 of the Council's Health and Safety Manual for those situations where connections are to be made to Council owned existing services or roads.
- 13. The consent holder shall advise the names and their professional qualifications and experience of Suitably Qualified Persons required in terms of Clause B(iii) of Part 3 of the Kapiti Coast District Council Subdivision and Development Principles and Requirements 2005. If the Council considers any of the nominated persons are not acceptable then the consent holder shall nominate alternative persons, or the Council may require the consent holder to employ a specified Suitably Qualified Person or Persons at the consent holders cost. Suitably Qualified Persons are required for, but not necessarily limited to, the following areas:
 - Stormwater and flood issues
 - On-site wastewater disposal
 - Rural water supply
 - Wastewater disposal

Earthworks

14. The consent holder shall submit to Council for approval an Earthworks Management Plan (EMP). The EMP shall address all potential adverse effects of the proposed earthworks including, but not limited to, the following



- plan showing the existing and proposed contours,
- windblown sand,
- sediment control and storm water run-off,
- · maintenance of local drainage paths from adjoining properties
- progressive top soiling and re-vegetation immediately following completion of each stage of the works
- the monitoring program for effects of the earthworks on and off site (including transportation of material),
- the control of noise and other construction related effects
- the discovery of an unrecorded archaeological site.

The consent holder shall comply with the requirements of the approved earthworks management plan. Any proposed amendments to the earthworks management plan shall be submitted to the Council for approval. If approved, then the amended earthworks management plan becomes the approved plan.

- 15. Should a waahi tapu or other cultural site be unearthed during earthworks the contractor and/or owner shall :-
 - (a) cease operations;
 - (b) inform local iwi (Ngati Raukawa);
 - (c) inform the NZ Historic Places Trust (NZHPT) and apply for an appropriate authority if required;
 - (d) Take appropriate action, after discussion with the NZHPT, Council and iwi to remedy damage and/or restore the site.

Note: In accordance with the Historic Places Act 1993, where an archaeological site is present (or uncovered), an authority from the NZ Historic Places Trust is required if the site is to be modified in any way.

- 16. The consent holder shall notify Ngati Raukawa in writing a minimum of 48 hours prior to undertaking any earthworks on the site and shall facilitate the observation by lwi of those earthworks.
- 17. The consent holder shall not remove soil support from adjacent lots.
- 18. All batters shall be self-supporting.
- 19. The minimum floor level to the underside of the floor joist or under side of the slab of any habitable dwelling constructed as part of this development shall be 5.0 metres AMSL.

<u>Note</u>: a consent notice under section 221 of the Resource Management Act recording the minimum building level and that any land below RL 4.0 metres amsl is subject to flooding, will be placed on the certificate of title.

- 20. Earthworks shall comply with the requirements of the current issue of NZS 4431, unless otherwise specifically approved by the Council. At the completion of earthworks the consent holder shall provide a report and certificates in the form of Appendix A of NZS 4431 and Schedule 2A of NZS 4404 by a suitably qualified person.
- 21. Foundation design and construction for any new building or additions and alterations to a building on any of the lots not subject to earthworks in accordance with NZS 4431,

shall take into account the findings and recommendations within the subdivision engineering report document entitled Proposed Subdivision of Gawler Farm, Te Horo, dated 29 November 2010.

<u>Note:</u> A consent notice under Section 221 of the Resource Management Act recording this requirement will be placed on the certificate of title.

22. A topographical plan shall be provided showing contours at no greater than 1 metre intervals prior to and on completion of earthworks. The scale of the plan shall be 1:500 and two copies shall be provided.

<u>Note</u>: in situations where earthworks have been required to bring land to above recommended building levels, for flood mitigation purposes, as-built contours and spot levels shall be at suitable detail to clearly show the extent of land brought above the recommended building levels and the levels of that land.

<u>Access</u>

- 23. The rights-of-way shall be formed and metalled. The entrance at the road berm shall be formed, metalled and sealed to the same standard as the existing road. The entrance of the right-of-way is to be swept clean, with all excess material being removed from the road or sealed areas, and shall be in a tidy and presentable state. They are to be constructed not to impede local drainage patterns and shall provide flood free access (i.e. be above 4.0 metres AMSL).
- 24. A rural numbering post shall be provided for each lot fronting Pukenamu Road. This condition will be satisfied by the payment of \$40.50 (GST inclusive) per lot.

Utility Services

- 25. The consent holder shall submit to Council, prior to the commencement of any works within the gas pipeline easement, plans which show details of the construction works proposed and separation distances for earthworks, driveways, temporary crossing points for heavy machinery, underground services, fencing and engineering details of the proposed rights-of-way. The plan shall be accompanied by the written approval of Vector Gas.
- 26. At least two weeks prior to the commencement of physical works, the consent holder shall contact Vector Gas to locate and mark the pipelines on site. The consent holder shall survey and mark the easement boundaries. The nominated positioning of the pipeline shall be added to site plans and all other drawings relating to the area traversed by the pipelines.
- 27. All persons working within 10 metres of the gas pipelines shall undergo pipeline safety awareness training by Vector Gas. Documentation confirming this has occurred shall be provided to Council on request.
- 28. The consent holder shall obtain a permit from Vector prior to any works within 10 metres of the gas pipelines or which may have the potential to impact on the pipelines.

<u>Note</u>: Permits can be arranged at no cost by calling 0800 734 567 and providing at least 48 hours notice.



- 29. A storm water disposal design shall be submitted at the time building consent is sought for each new dwelling, which is in accordance with the principles contained in Part 3 Section E of the Council's Subdivision and Development Principles and Requirements, for approval by the Council.
- 30. A report shall be provided to the Council's Subdivision Engineer by a suitably qualified person, which addresses the suitability of on site wastewater treatment and disposal for each lot. The form of wastewater treatment and disposal on site shall be in accordance with the principles and requirements of Part 3 Section F of the Council's Subdivision and Development Principles and Requirements. Site investigations and tests shall relate to the nominated building site on each lot. The report shall include recommendations for the preferred method(s) of on site wastewater treatment and disposal.

<u>Note:</u> The recommendations for and constraints on the provision of wastewater treatment and disposal will be included in a Consent Notice to be issued by Council pursuant to Section 221 of the Resource Management Act 1991. The Consent Notice shall include reference to the owners' responsibility to maintain and monitor their wastewater disposal so that any adverse effects on the environment are less than minor.

31. It shall be the ongoing responsibility of the owners of the individual lots to provide, maintain and monitor the installation and operation of an individual household water supply in accordance with the Ministry of Health's publication 'Household water supplies, the selection, operation, and maintenance of individual household water supplies' (revised April 2006) that provides a minimum storage capacity of 30,000 litres.

<u>Note:</u> a consent notice will be issued at the time of section 224(c) certification which will include reference to the following:

- The owners' responsibility to construct and maintain on an ongoing basis a system which meets the above performance standard;
- The owners' responsibility to maintain and monitor their water supply so that any adverse effects on the environment are minor.
- 32. Fire fighting requirements shall comply with the New Zealand Fire Service Fire-fighting Water Supplies Code of Practice SNL PAS 4509:2008, including one of the following:
 - A static water supply of at least 45,000-litres which is dedicated for fire fighting purposes and located within 90m of the fire risk; or
 - A fixed static pick-up suction source located within 90m of the fire risk in accordance with appendix B of SNZ PAS 4509:2008; or
 - At the time of construction, a minimum storage of 7,000 litres of water for fire fighting purposes should be provided to each habitable building connected to a domestic sprinkler installed in compliance with the SNL PAS 4509:2008.

An alternative fire fighting solution shall only be accepted if accompanied by the written approval of the Fire Region Manager. Unless an alternative fire fighting solution is approved by the Fire Region Manager, a tank or fixed source shall be installed prior to issue of certification pursuant to section 224(c). If the third option is pursued, a consent notice under section 221 of the Resource Management Act recording this requirement will be issued.

- 33. Power and telecommunication services shall be provided to the approval of the Subdivision Engineer.
- 34. The consent holder shall supply a copy of the Title Plan and shall list and indicate how each condition has been met to the satisfaction of the Council.

Advice Notes

- All costs arising from any of the above conditions shall be borne by the consent holder.
- Contravention of the Land Drainage Act is not permitted and natural drainage patterns are to be preserved.
- The consent holder should not encroach onto adjacent land owned by others without having first obtained their written consent.
- The allocation of street addresses is the responsibility of local authorities under section 319B of the Local Government Act 1974. In order to achieve clear and unambiguous street addresses, street numbers may be changed for a section of or for the entire street rather than just for a single property in accordance with Council's Street Numbering and Naming Policy. There are seven additional allotments created by this resource consent.

• Council's Biodiversity Officer regarded the subdivision as creating an opportunity to secure improvements to the ecological health of the Mangaone Stream through improving the water quality and biodiversity of a tributary.

The following measures are recommended to achieve this:

- Permanent retirement from grazing and permanent exclusion of stock from riparian margins;
- Permanent stock-proof fencing of the "central drain" to create riparian buffer margins no less than 5m in width; and
- Planting appropriate native species of native plants within the buffer margins to improve water quality and biodiversity values.

NB: After discussion with the applicant it was determined that the above items could not be included as conditions of consent as they were not addressing an effect of the subdivision itself. The land uses the items seek to control are related to existing permitted land use activities and as such, in this instance lie outside the scope of the consent.

Reasons for Decisions:

In accordance with Sections 104, 104B and 221(3) of the Resource Management Act 1991, the actual and potential effects associated with the proposed activity have been assessed and are outlined above. I consider that the adverse effects of the proposed activity on the environment will be less than minor and that the proposed activity is not contrary to the Objectives and Policies of the Kapiti Coast District Plan.

Conditions:

General

- 1. The e-survey dataset shall be in general conformity with the Landlink plan numbered 2039-P1-001 Revision G, stamped as 'Final Approved Plans' on 22 January 2020.
- 2. The proposed subdivision shall be constructed and established in general accordance with the following Landlink Limited plan:
 - 2039-P1-001, Revision G, stamped as 'Final Approved Plans' on 22 January 2020;

and the information lodged with application RM190267 together with the further information supplied by Landlink Limited, except where the development must be modified in accordance with any of the conditions of this consent.

Fees, Levies and Contributions

- 3. A Reserve Contribution of **\$48,676.74** is payable, GST inclusive (\$6,953.82 per additional rural allotment).
- 4. Prior to the issue of certification pursuant to section 224(c) of the Resource Management Act 1991, the consent holder shall pay Council Engineering Fees of \$628.00 plus \$314.00 per lot [total \$3,768.00 GST inclusive] for work that may be required for plan approvals, site inspections and consent compliance monitoring, plus any further monitoring charge or changes to recover the actual and reasonable costs that have been incurred to ensure compliance with the conditions attached to this consent.

Engineering

5. Prior to works commencing, the consent holder shall submit copies of the plans and specifications for the engineering development for approval to the satisfaction of the Council's Development Engineer. The engineering development must be in accordance with Paragraphs 1 to 5 of Schedule 1 contained in Part 4 of the Kapiti Coast District Council's (KCDC's) Subdivision and Development Principles and Requirements: 2012 (SDPR:2012). Water Supply

13. The consent holder or future owners of Lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 7 & 8 shall provide on-site potable water storage with minimum 30,000 litres (50,000 litres is recommended).

It shall be the on-going responsibility of the lot owner(s) to provide, maintain and monitor the installation and operation of the individual household water supply in accordance with the Ministry of Health's publication 'Household water supplies, the selection, operation, and maintenance of individual household water supplies' (revised April 2006) that provides a minimum storage capacity of 30,000 litres where council supply is not available.

Note: A Consent Notice under Section 221 of the Resource Management Act will be issued to facilitate the recording of this condition, which is to be complied with on an on-going basis.

14. The consent holder or future owners of Lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 7 & 8 shall provide firefighting water provision complying with the New Zealand Fire Service Firefighting Water Supplies Code of Practice SNZ PAS 4509:2008.

Note: A Consent Notice under Section 221 of the Resource Management Act will be issued to facilitate the recording of this condition which is to be complied with on an on-going basis.

Wastewater

15. The consent holder or future owners of Lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 7 & 8 shall provide onsite wastewater treatment and disposal in general accordance with the findings, recommendations and constraints contained within the report titled "Engineering Investigation for 10 Lot Subdivision for Nick Gawler: 317-319 Te Horo Beach Road, Te Horo" dated 18 December 2019, by Landlink Ltd and in compliance with NZS1547:2012.

The owner is responsible to maintain and monitor their wastewater disposal so that any adverse effects on the environment are less minor.

Note: A consent notice under Section 221 of the Resource Management Act 1991 and registered against the new Computer Freehold Register for Lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 7 & 8. The Section 221 consent notice shall be prepared by Council at the cost of the consent holder. The Section 221 consent notice shall be issued with the Section 224(c) certificate to facilitate the recording of this condition which is to be complied with on an on-going basis.

Stormwater

16. Prior to the issue of a Section 224(c) certificate under the Resource Management Act 1991, the stormwater disposal system shall be designed and constructed for Lots 2-8 in accordance with Part 3 Section E & Part 4 Schedule 4 of KCDC's SDPR:2012 and the requirements and intent of the report titled "Engineering Investigation for 10 Lot Subdivision for Nick Gawler: 317-319 Te Horo Beach Road, Te Horo" dated 18 December 2019, by Landlink Ltd.

Note: Note: 1% AEP event runoff from individual allotments shall be collected and disposed within the individual allotments or right of way. 1% AEP event runoff from the right of way shall be collected and disposed within the right of way.

In the event that the stormwater on-site disposal/attenuation system for individual allotments is not installed prior to the issue of the 224(c) certificate, a Consent Notice under Section 221 of the Resource Management Act will be issued to facilitate the recording of this condition, which is to be complied with on an on-going basis. SCHEME PLAN ORS78A - PROPOSED SUBDIVISION AT PUKENAMU ROAD, TE HORO FOR N C GAWLER

Scheme Plan ORS78A attached shows a revision of Scheme Plan ORS78 which was deferred from consideration at the February meeting of the Subdivisions Subcommittee. The Subcommittee was not satisfied that the information contained on the earlier plan was sufficient to establish that the subdivision complied with the Transitional District Plan. The revised proposal shows the location of the proposed lots in relation to the balance of the farm property. The proposed farm lots (Lot 2 and 4) are increased in size from 5ha to 7ha. The enlarged areas of these lots are appropriate to the land type and potential farming uses, and are consistent with the size of other farm lots in the vicinity previously approved by Council.
