A rare opportunity to secure a well planned and productive rural holding, 'Morella' offers excellent infrastructure, good pasture management, and a renovated home in a peaceful and picturesque setting.

'Morella' is a subdivided into 8 main and 4 smaller holding paddocks, all with sound fencing for livestock management including exclusion fencing around the perimeter of the property. Rolling hills rise from sheltered valleys, with a strong history of pasture improvement and up to 70%* of the property down to phalaris, rye, cocksfoot, and various clovers being complemented by native grasses. The property ranges from 550* to 800* metres above sea level with approx. 2/3 being 700 metres or higher.

Water security is a feature with an average annual rainfall of just over 700ml* (28 inches). Each paddock has at least one dam with a total of 15 across the property including 3 spring fed dams. A stock & domestic bore feeds a 20,000* litre tank which supplies water to the house garden and troughs. Rainwater storage includes a 110,000* litre steel tank, plus an extra 30,000* litres from the sheds. Well established access tracks throughout the property ensure ease of movement and management.

Other improvements include an extremely well designed 3 stand shearing shed with kitchenette and eating space, plus a shower and toilet facilities. The shearing shed also has excellent internal and underfloor storage, and adjoining sheep yards. There is a second set of sheep holding yards in the centre of the property, as well as 2 silos, as well as a large workshop, truck garage, and a 'bulldozer' shed.

Perfectly positioned for privacy and rural views, the renovated 4 bedroom, 2 bathroom home has warmth and charm. A large open-plan living area flows onto a covered deck, overlooking the gardens. Additional features include:

- Reverse cycle air conditioning and a cosy wood heater for year round comfort
- Four bedrooms (two with built-ins) plus a rumpus room or 5th bedroom
- Office space, laundry, and a separate mudroom
- Multiple sun soaked outdoor decks ideal for entertaining.

With an estimated carrying capacity of approximately 900 to 1,000 ewes 'Morella' presents a great opportunity to secure a quality grazing property with excellent infrastructure.

Located at 15km* from Euchareena, 45km* from Molong, 55km* from Orange, 65km* from

Wellington, and 312km* from Sydney.











Monthly Rainfall to Date

Annual Rainfall Deciles



Remnant Vegetation

Remnant vegetation data is based on satellite imagery up to 14 March 2023 at a resolution of 25 metres. Land is classified into three categories: forest, sparse-woody and non-woody. Forest has minimum 20% canopy cover, at least 2 metres high and a minimum area of 0.2 hectares. Sparse-woody has canopy cover between 5-19%.






Agricultural Land Uses
