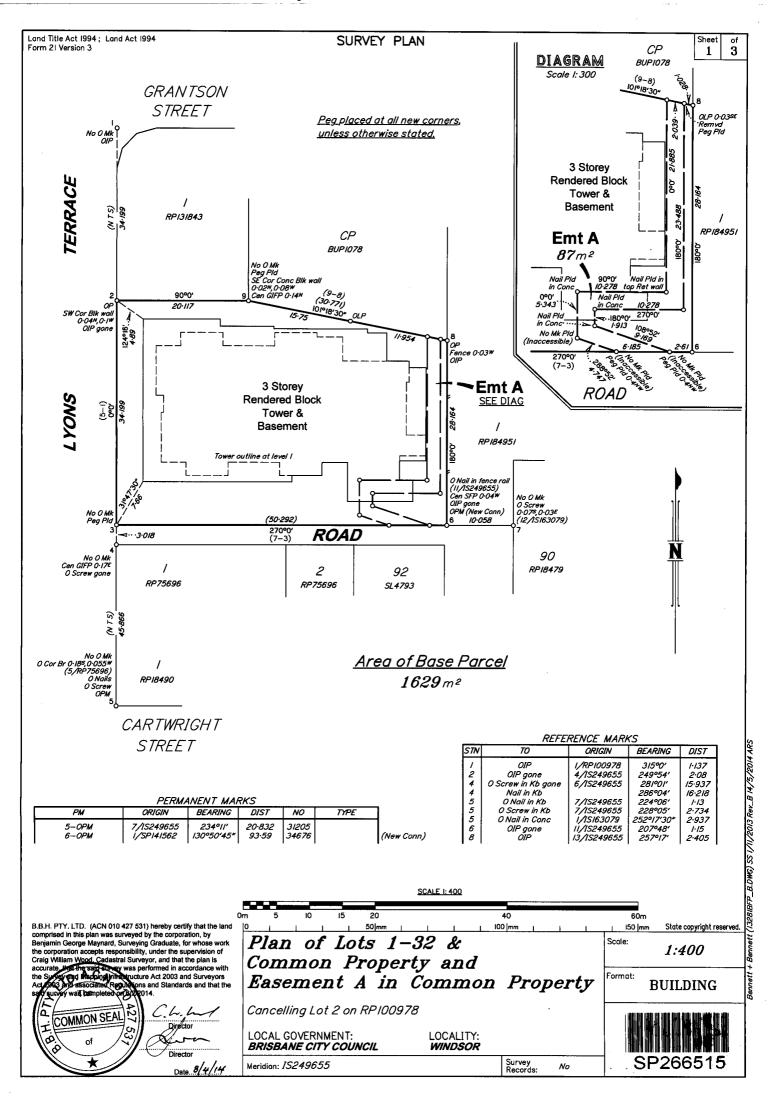

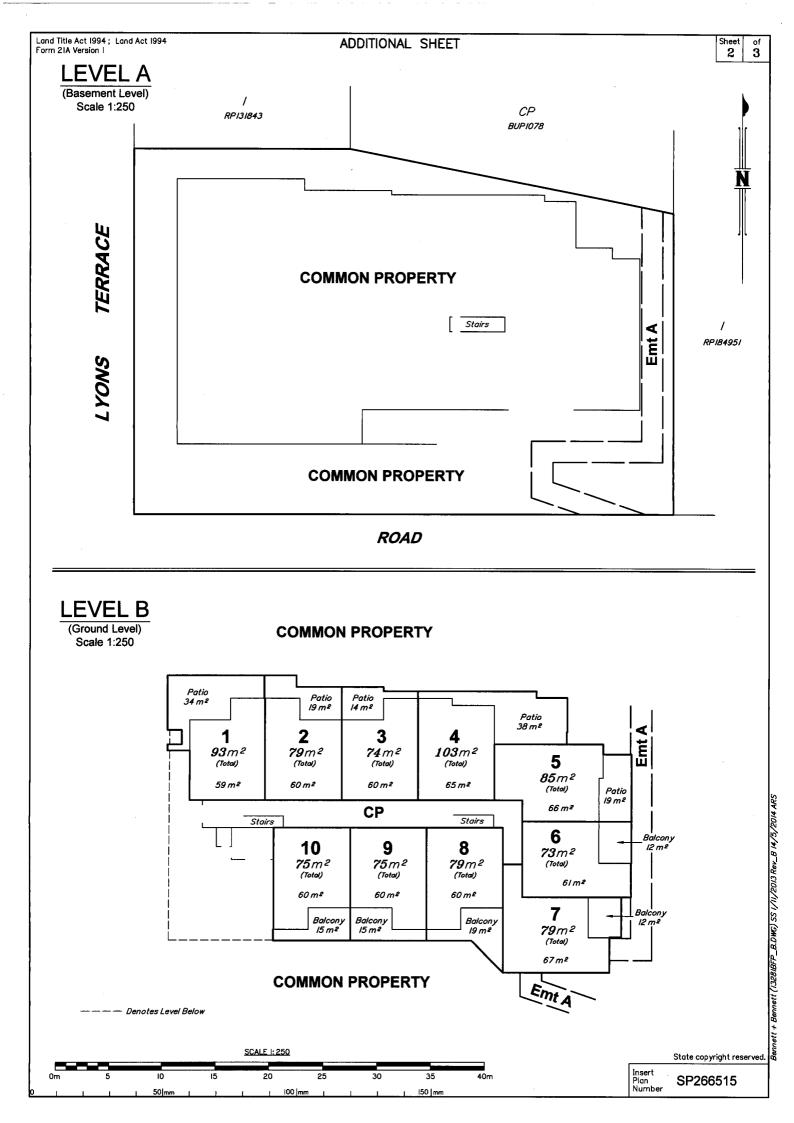

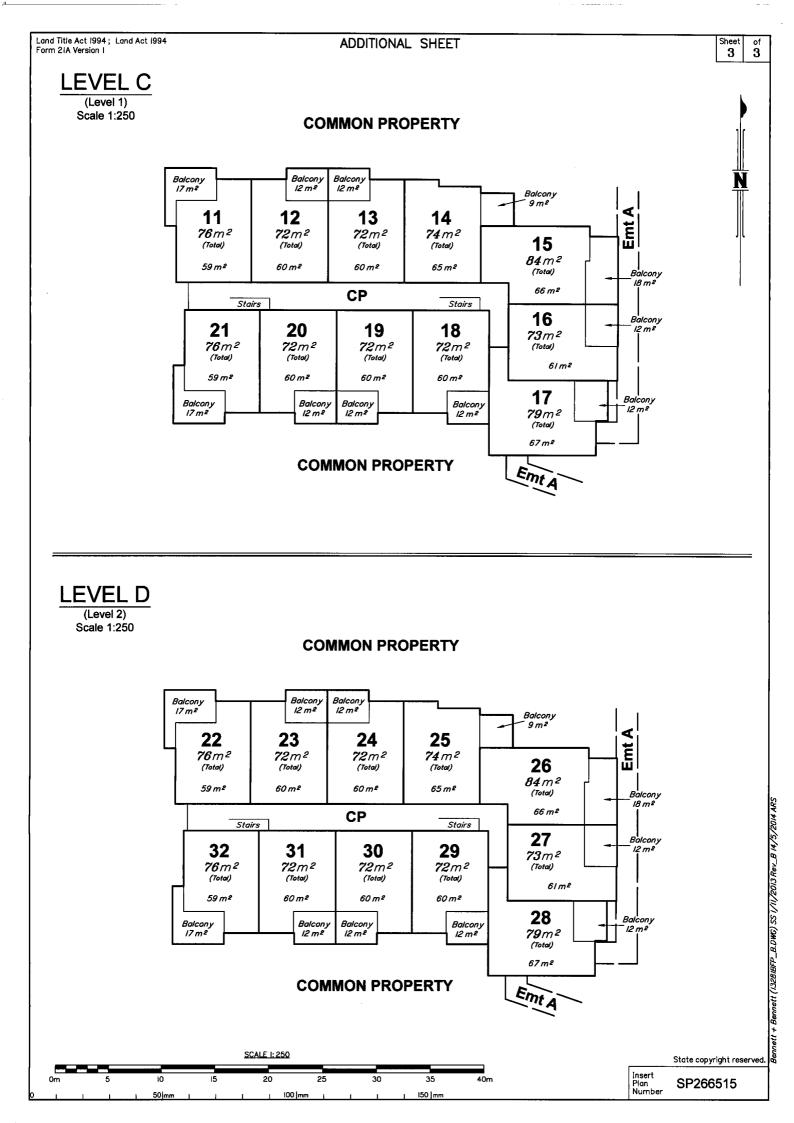

Becoming an owner

When you become an owner of a lot in a community titles scheme, you:

- automatically become a member of the body corporate and have the right to participate in decisions about the scheme;
- must pay contributions towards the body corporate's expenses in managing the scheme; and
- must comply with the body corporate by-laws.

You must tell the body corporate that you have become the owner of a lot in the scheme within 1 month of settlement. You can do this by using the "BCCM Form 8 – Information for body corporate roll". Fines may apply if you do not comply.

For schemes under specified two-lot schemes module, a body corporate under the Body Corporate and Community Management (Specified Two-lot Schemes Module) Regulation 2011 consists of the owners of the two lots in the scheme. The two lot owners make body corporate decisions by agreement (called 'lot owner agreements').

How to get more information

You can inspect the body corporate records which will provide important information about matters not included in this certificate. To inspect the body corporate records, you can contact the person responsible for keeping body corporate records (see below), or you can engage the services of a search agent. Fees will apply. Planning and development documents can be obtained from the relevant local government or other planning authority. Some relevant documents, such as the development approval, may be available from the body corporate, depending on when and how the body corporate was established.

By-laws and exclusive use areas

By-laws can regulate a wide range of matters, including noise, the appearance of lots, carrying out work on lots (including renovations), parking, requirements for body corporate approval to keep pets, and whether smoking is permitted on outdoor areas of lots and the common property. However, by-laws cannot regulate the type of residential use of lots that may lawfully be used for residential purposes. You should read the by-laws before signing a contract.

What by-laws apply?

The by-laws that apply to the scheme are specified in the community management statement for the scheme provided to you by the seller. The community management statement will usually list the by-laws for the scheme. If the statement does not list any by-laws, Schedule 4 of the *Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997* will apply to the scheme. In some older schemes, the community management statement may state that the by-laws as at 13 July 2000 apply. In these cases, a document listing the by-laws in consolidated form must be given with this certificate.

Lot entitlements and financial information

Lot entitlements are used to determine the proportion of body corporate expenses each lot owner is responsible for. The contribution schedule lot entitlement for a lot (as a proportion of the total for all lots) is used to calculate the lot owner's contribution to most body corporate expenses, and the interest schedule lot entitlement for a lot (as a proportion of the total for all lots) is used to calculate the lot owner's contribution to insurance expenses in some cases. Lots may have different lot entitlements and therefore may pay different contributions to the body corporate's expenses.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Financial Statements

SCHEDULE B EXPLANATION OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF SCHEME LAND

Sections 66(1) (f) and (g) of the Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997 are not applicable.

SCHEDULE C

BY-LAWS

1. NOISE

- (a) An Occupier must not create any noise likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of a person lawfully on another Lot or the Common Property.
- (b) Occupiers leaving or returning to Lots late at night or early in the morning must do so with minimum noise.
- (c) The Occupier must request Invitees leaving after 11 pm to leave quietly.

2. VEHICLES

- (1) The Occupier of a Lot must not, without the Body Corporate's written approval:-
 - (i) Park a vehicle, or allow a vehicle to stand, on the Common Property; or
 - (ii) Permit an invitee to park a vehicle, or allow a vehicle to stand, on the Common Property, except for the designated visitor parking which must remain available at all times for the sole use of visitors vehicles.
- (2) An Approval under subsection (1) must state the period for which it is given, with the exception of designated visitor parking.
- (3) However, the body corporate may cancel the approval by giving 7 days written notice to the occupier, with the exception of designated visitor parking.

3. OBSTRUCTION / NUISANCE

- (a) An Occupier must not obstruct lawful use of Common Property by any other person.
- (b) An Occupier must not cause a nuisance or act in such a way so as to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of a person lawfully on another Lot or using the Common Property.

4. DEPOSITING RUBBISH, ETC ON COMMON PROPERTY

- (a) An Occupier must keep a receptacle for garbage in a clean and dry condition and adequately covered on the Lot, or on a part of the Common Property designated by the Body Corporate for that purpose, unless the Body Corporate provides for some other way of garbage disposal.
- (b) The Occupier must:
 - Comply with all local government requirements about disposal of garbage, including the City Waste
 - (ii) Ensure that in disposing garbage, the hygiene, health and comfort of other Occupiers is not adversely affected.
 - (iii) Ensure that any perishable items such as meat, fish, fruit etc, are not placed in receptacles for periods longer than 24 hours prior to local authority collection.
 - (iv) Except where it is a duty of the manager/caretaker, ensure that the receptacles for household refuse are removed from the footpath and returned to their area as soon as possible after local authority

5. DAMAGE TO LAWNS ETC ON COMMON PROPERTY

An Occupier must not:

- (a) Damage any Common Property lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or flower, or
- (b) Use as a garden any portion of Common Property, except with the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee.

DAMAGE TO COMMON PROPERTY 6.

- (a) An Occupier must not mark, paint, or drive nails or screws or the like into, or otherwise damage or deface a structure that forms part of the Common Property, except with the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee.
- (b) This by-law does not prevent an Owner from installing:
 - Any lock or other safety device for the protection of a Lot against intruders, or (i)
 - Any screen or other device to prevent entry of animals or insects to the Lot. (ii)
- (c) The locking, safety device, screen or other device must be constructed in a workman like manner and maintained in a state of good and serviceable repair by the Owner. It must not detract from the amenity of the Scheme Land.

ALTERATIONS TO A LOT 7.

- (a) An Occupier must not make a change to the external appearance of a Lot or make any structural alterations to a Lot, except if Council approval has been granted if necessary and with the with the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee. These alterations will remain the Occupiers or Owners responsibility to repair
- (b) A change to the external appearance or an structural alterations to a Lot includes but is not limited to the erection of aerials, satellite dish, external blinds and awnings, solar hot water system, the installation of an air conditioning unit or changes to utility infrastructure, subject to approval is necessary.

The licensed Letting agent for an owner is to accompany all persons, seeking to let a unit, whilst upon the Common Property, thereby assisting in the security and integrity of the scheme and the individuals property.

WINDOW COVERINGS 9.

Window Coverings must not detract from the aesthetic appearance of the buildings on the Scheme Land.

APPEARANCE OF A LOT 10.

- (a) An Occupier must not hang any washing, towel, bedding, clothing or other article (except on clothes lines provided for the purpose of hanging laundry) on any part of his Lot in such a way as to be visible from another Lot, the Common Property or outside the Scheme Land, except with the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee.
- (b) An Occupier must not display any sign, advertisement, placard, banner, pamphlet or like matter on any part of his Lot in such a way as to be visible from another Lot, the Common Property or outside the Scheme Land, except with the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee.
- (c) All balconies and terraces shown on the approved drawings and documents, are to remain unenclosed with no shutters, glazing, louvres or similar permanent structures other than clearly depicted on the approved drawings.

MAINTENANCE OF A LOT 11.

Each Owner must ensure that his Lot is kept and maintained so as not to allow infestation by vermin or insects or be offensive in appearance to other Occupiers.

STORAGE OF FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS ETC. 12.

An Occupier must not bring to, do or keep on a Lot anything which increases the rate of fire insurance on the Scheme Land, or which may conflict with any insurance policy upon the Scheme Land.

13. KEEPING ANIMALS

- (a) Subject to this by-law and the provisions of the Act, an Owner or Occupier of a lot must not keep any animal upon a Lot or the Common Property without the written consent of the Committee. An occupier of a Lot may keep dogs or cats in the Lot occupied by that Occupier provided that any such animal:
 - (i) does not disturb other Occupiers or Guests; and
 - (ii) is a domesticated pet; and
 - (iii) is toilet trained.
- (b) Should an animal that is permitted under by-law 13(a) die, the Owner or Occupier shall not replace the animal without the written consent of the Committee obtained under by-law 13(a).
- (c) If challenged, the Occupier has the onus of proof (on the balance of probabilities) with respect to matters contained in this by-law 13. The Body Corporate or the Committee may order an animal to be removed from a Lot, the Building or the Common Property if the animal does not meet all the criteria set out in this by-law
- (d) Any approval for the keeping of an animal granted by the Committee or by the Body Corporate may be granted with or without conditions. If conditions are imposed then the Owner or Occupier of a Lot shall imposed, then the approval may be withdrawn at the discretion of the Committee or the Body Corporate.

14. RIGHT OF ENTRY

An Owner or Occupier, upon receiving reasonable notice from the Body Corporate Committee, will permit the Body Corporate Committee or any contractors, sub-contractors, workmen or other person authorised by it, the right of access to his lot for the purpose of carrying out works or effecting repairs on mains, pipes, wires or connections of any water, sewerage, drainage, gas, electricity, telephone or other system or service whether to his lot or to an adjoining lot.

15. SPEED LIMITS

An Occupier or Invitee of a Lot will not exceed the speed limit nominated by the Body Corporate Committee from time to time, while driving any motor propelled vehicle on the common property.

16. SKATE BOARDS / ROLLER BLADES / BICYCLES

An Occupier or Invitee of a Lot will not use or allow to be used skateboards, roller blades or bicycles upon the common property.

17. BEHAVIOUR OF INVITEES

- (a) Occupiers must take all reasonable steps to ensure that their Invitees abide by the by-laws and do not behave in a manner likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of a person lawfully on another Lot or the Common Property.
- (b) Owner will be liable to compensate the Body Corporate for all damage to the Common Property caused by their Occupiers and Invitees.

18. USE OF LOTS

- 18.1 Subject to sub clause 2, an owner or occupier of a Lot shall not use that Lot or permit their Lot to be used:
 - (a) Otherwise than as a residence, save and except that the original owner may use or cause to be used any Lot for the purpose of a display unit;
 - (b) For any purpose that may cause a nuisance or hazard or in any manner likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of owners or occupiers of other Lots or any person lawfully using the Common Property;

- (c) For any illegal or immoral purpose or purposes that will interfere with the good reputation of the Scheme;
- (d) For storage purposes other than the storage of domestic household items normally held in residential community title possessed of the storage of domestic household items normally held in residential community title accommodation; or
- (e) For any other purpose that may endanger the safety or good reputation of persons residing within the Scheme.
- The Body Corporate may authorise an occupier to conduct a business from within a Lot, and shall not 18.2 unreasonably refuse or revoke such approval, so long as:
 - (a) Council approval is obtained;

 - (c) The use would not, in the reasonable opinion of the Committee interfere with the amenity of other occupiers
- Any authority under sub clause 2, may be given subject to conditions which may be varied at the direction of the Body Corporate and may be revoked if such conditions are not complied with. 18.3

19.

Where the Body Corporate spends money to repair damage caused by a breach of the Act or of these by-laws by any Occupier or Invitee then the Body Corporate is entitled to recover the amount spent as a debt in any court action from the Owner of the Lot from which that Occupier or Invitee came.

20.

All owners must pay on demand the whole of the Body Corporate's costs and expenses (including solicitor and own client costs), such amount to be deemed a liquidated debt, incurred in:

- (a) recovering levies or any other money that the Body Corporate is entitled to received from the Owner, and
- (b) all proceedings, including legal proceedings, taken against the Owner concluded in favour of the Body Corporate including, but not limited to, applications for an order by the Commissioner.

AUTHORISED ALLOCATION OF OTHER EXCLUSIVE USE AREAS 21.

- The owner of a lot will be entitled to the exclusive use and enjoyment of those parts of the common property nominated in writing as an authorised allocation by the original proprietor to the body corporate within 12 months after the recording of the Community Management Statement which includes this by-law. 21.1
- Each occupier of a lot to which an authorised allocation attaches must:-21.2
 - (a) Use it in a way not likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of another lot or the common property including another exclusive use area;
 - (b) Use it only for the purpose for which the allocation was granted; and
 - (c) Keep it tidy and free from rubbish.

EXCLUSIVE AREAS 22.

The Body Corporate grants to the owners for the time being of lots in the Community Titles Scheme bearing the number in the first column hereunder the exclusive use for themselves and their licensees of the area bearing the 22.1 letter in the second column hereunder and as identified in Schedule E.

 - (g) 'Owner' means an Owner of a Lot in the Scheme;
 - (h) 'Regulation Module' means the regulation module identified in Item 1 of this Community Management Statement;
 - (i) 'Scheme' means the community titles scheme identified in Item 1 of this Community Management Statement;
 - (j) 'Scheme Land' means the scheme land identified in Item 4 of this Community Management Statement and includes, when the context permits or requires, all improvements thereon.

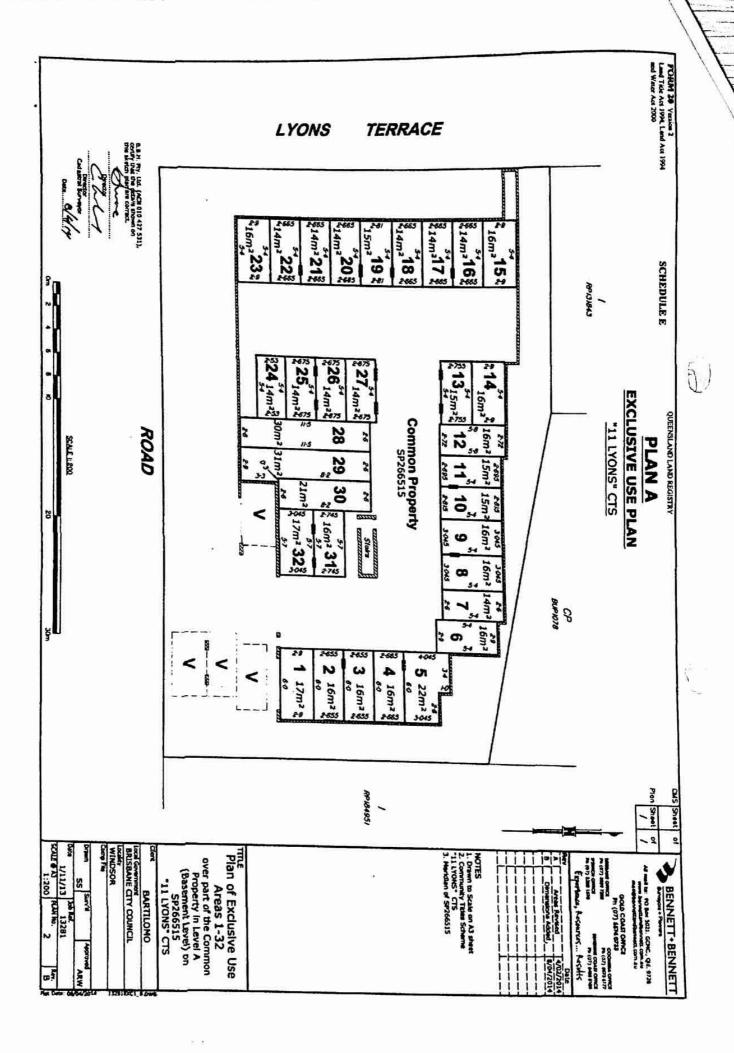

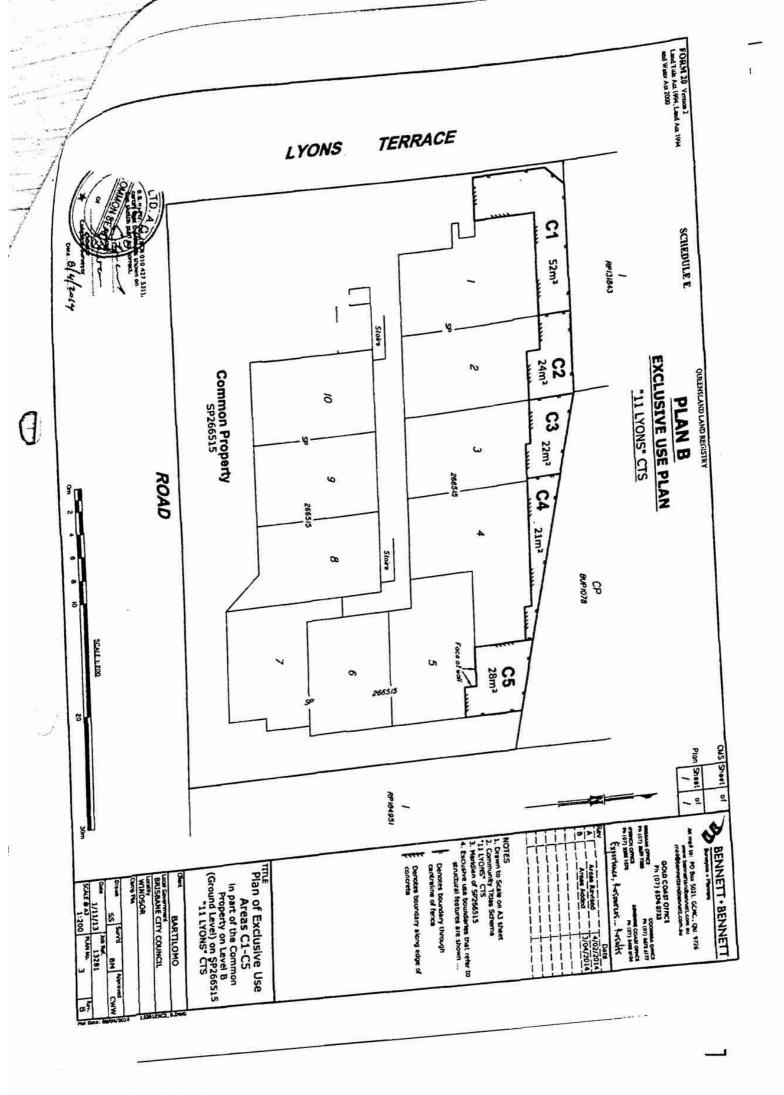

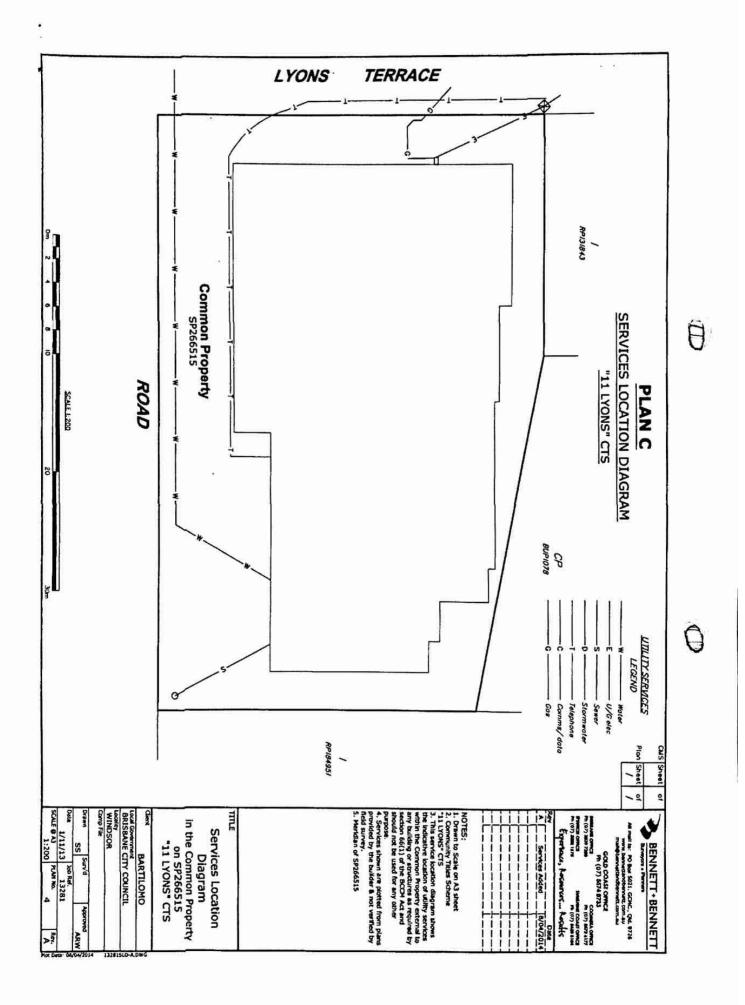
