Becoming an owner

When you become an owner of a lot in a community titles scheme, you:

- automatically become a member of the body corporate and have the right to participate in decisions about the scheme:
- must pay contributions towards the body corporate's expenses in managing the scheme; and
- must comply with the body corporate by-laws.

You must tell the body corporate that you have become the owner of a lot in the scheme within 1 month of settlement. You can do this by using the BCCM Form 8 Information for body corporate roll. Fines may apply if you do not comply.

How to get more information

You can inspect the body corporate records which will provide important information about matters not included in this certificate. To inspect the body corporate records, you can contact the person responsible for keeping body corporate records (see below), or you can engage the services of a search agent. Fees will apply.

By-laws can regulate a wide range of matters, including noise, the appearance of lots, carrying out work on lots (including renovations), parking, requirements for body corporate approval to keep pets, and whether smoking is permitted on outdoor areas of lots and the common property. However, by-laws cannot regulate the type of residential use of lots that may lawfully be used for residential purposes. You should read the by-laws before signing a contract.

The by-laws that apply to the scheme are specified in the community management statement for the scheme provided to you by the seller.

The community management statement will usually list the by-laws for the scheme. If the statement does not list any by-laws, Schedule 4 of the Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997 will apply to the scheme.

Common property and assets

Noise

1. The Occupier of a lot must not create noise likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of a person lawfully on another lot or the common property.

Vehicles

- 2.(1) The Occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval -
 - (a) park a vehicle, or allow a vehicle to stand, on the common property; or
 - (b) permit an invitee to park a vehicle, or allow a vehicle to stand, on the common property, except for the designated visitor parking which must remain available at all times for the sole use of visitors vehicles.
- (2) An approval under subsection (1) must state the period for which it is given, with the exception of designated visitor parking.

Obstruction

3. The occupier of a lot must not obstruct the lawful use of the common property by someone else.

- 4.(1) The occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval -
 - (a) damage a lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or flower on the common property; or
 - (b) use a part of the common property as a garden.
- (2) An approval under subsection (1) must state the period for which it is given.

Damage to common property

7. The occupier of a lot must not leave the rubbish or other materials on the common property in a way or place likely to interfere with the enjoyment of the common property by someone else.

Appearance of lot

- 8.(1) The occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval, make a change to the external appearance of the lot unless the change is minor and does not detract from the amenity of the lot and its surrounds.
- (2) The occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval
 - hang washing, bedding, or another cloth article if the article is visible from (a) another lot or the common property, or from outside the scheme land, or
 - display a sign, advertisement, placard, banner, pamphlet or similar article if (b) the article is visible from another lot or the common property, or from outside the scheme land.
- This section does not apply to a lot created under a standard format plan of (3) subdivision.

Storage of flammable materials

- The occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval, store a flammable substance on the common property.
- The occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval, store a (2)flammable substance on the lot unless the substance is used or intended for use for domestic purposes, or in the case of Lots 6, 7 and 8 is used or intended to be used for purposes associated with the business that is conducted in that lot.
- However, this section does not apply to the storage of fuel in -(3)
 - the fuel tank of a vehicle, boat, or internal combustion engine; or (a)
 - a tank kept on a vehicle or boat in which the fuel is stored under the (b) requirements of the law regulating the storage of flammable liquid.

Garbage disposal

- 10.(1) Unless the body corporate provides some other way of garbage disposal, the occupier of a lot must keep a receptacle for garbage in a clean and dry condition and adequately covered on the lot.
