KITCHEN CARE AND MAINTENANCE GUIDE

Kitchen Cabinets and Doors

Whilst Melteca/Melamine doors are hardwearing and water resistant, they are NOT waterproof. Care should be taken to ensure they are not exposed to high levels of heat, moisture, steam and humidity and that any accidental spills are wiped up immediately. Please contact your plumber immediately should any leaks or seepage occur.

Cleaning

Your kitchen cabinets are manufactured from durable Melteca and Melamine and should be cleaned using a streak-free glass cleaner or a high quality micro-fibre cloth. For more difficult stains, start by using a dish-washing detergent on a damp cloth. To clean glass doors or aluminium doors, spray glass gleaner onto the cloth (not directly onto the glass).

Alternatively use a high quality micro fibre cloth without cleaners. Panel Form vinyl foil wrapped doors should be wiped over using a cleaning agent such as dish-washing detergent or Spray and Wipe. Under NO circumstances should abrasive cleaners such as "Jif" or "Ajax" be used.

Kitchen Benchtops - Care

Your bench is manufactured from low maintenance high pressure laminate. Whilst heat and scratch resistant, care is still needed when taking pots and pans straight from the hob or oven — use a heatproof mat or board to protect the bench. Take care not to drag rough objects across the bench as scratches may damage the surface. And finally do not use a knife to cut directly onto the bench surface. Be aware that the base board of your bench does not have the same waterproof qualities as the top surface. Please contact your plumber immediately should any leeks or seepage occur.

Your Granite bench top is one of the most hard-wearing stones and is almost impossible to scratch under normal kitchen use. It is not damaged by standing hot utensils on it (although this is not recommended) or by sharp knives, although diamond or tungsten implements can scratch the surface. However, things such as beetroot, wine and cooking oil, particularly when hot, may cause a stain on your granite bench top if they are left too long, so you should always clean them up immediately.

Cleaning

Cleaning with dishwashing detergent is usually sufficient, however stubborn food stains may need full strength" Handy Andy" or "Janola" diluted 1 part to 3 water. For everyday of your Granite bench top we recommend wiping the surface of your bench top with warm, soapy water and a damp cloth.

Caesarstone - Care

Caesarstone has outstanding properties to ensure ease of maintenance and longevity of your surfaces. It will withstand exposure to tea, wine, vinegar and strongly coloured substances. Everyday cleaning Caesarstone requires very little maintenance to keep the surface looking like new. For every day, using a warm cloth with mild detergent will suffice.

To avoid damage, it is best to use the appropriate cutting board and never use knives directly on the Caesarstone surface.

Caesarstone will tolerate brief exposures to moderately hot temperatures, however prolonged direct contact with heat from hot pots can cause thermal shock, discolouration or damage. Therefore, never place hot cooking appliances directly onto the surface of Caesarstone. The use of a "hot pad" or appropriate heat proof board will prevent damage from occurring.

Uniquartz - Care

Clean with specialist ceramic hob cleaners available from your supermarket. Burnt on spills can be scraped off using either a glass scraper or the scraper provided by the hob manufacturer.

Sinks are manufactured from high quality stainless steel which provides a surface with maximum durability. However, stainless steel can be scratched or scuffed. When scuffing does occur, please

remember that this is normal and the effect will become uniform with age. The high quality stainless steel will not lose its attractive shine.

Recommended daily care

Regular cleaning is important to maintain the appearance of your sink. Wipe with a soft, soapy cloth, rinse and dry after every use. Drying is very important to eliminate any film build-up that may develop from hard water deposits.

What to AVOID

Bleaches containing hypochlorite will attack stainless steel and cause pitting and staining. Silver dip cleaners containing acids which attack stainless steel and leave a permanent stain. Certain foods, when left for prolonged periods can cause pitting and corrosion. Examples are citric fruit juices, salt, vinegar, mustard, pickles and mayonnaise. Strong acids can damage stainless steel (e.g. Photographic developing liquids or denture cleanser). If they come into contact with the sink, they should be washed away immediately with clean water.

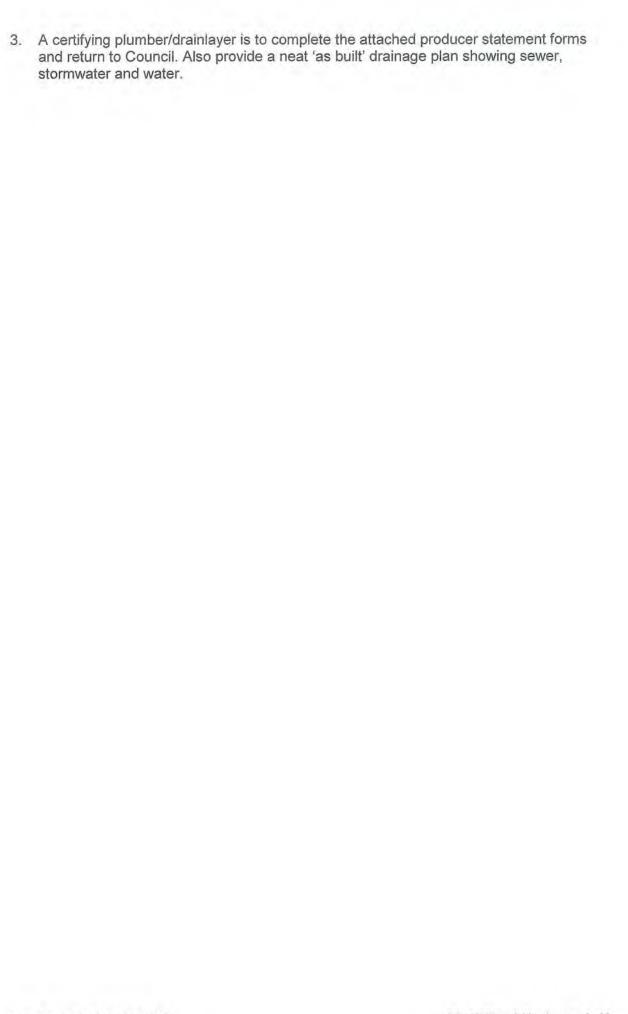

1. INTRODUCTION

This report references the subdivision plans 2275-P1-001B showing the proposed subdivision at 4 Octavius Road Peka Peka.

The property is located on the lower foothills to the north-east of Waikanae township. Its description is as follows:

This report has been prepared solely for the purposes of assessing the suitability of the land for subdivision and the information supplied should not be used for any other purpose.

2. PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

The current application for Resource Consent will lead to the creation of three lots. These lots will range from 8,010m2 to 12,750Ha and will retain the Rural scale. Further future subdivision is possible but is not specifically covered by this report.

This report covers the suitability for subdivision of the site in regard to Natural Hazards, Geotechnical, Stormwater, Wastewater and Water Supply issues, as well as access and provision of utilities.

3. INVESTIGATIONS

As a background to the preparation of the Resource Consent Application, investigations have been carried out into:

- Geotechnical conditions, including Geological setting, slope stability, subsoil conditions and Engineering properties and considerations;
- Identified Hazards and Features, being the Ohariu Fault Hazard Zone and High Voltage Transmission Lines, both as identified in the District Plan;
- c. Specific Building Site assessments.
- d. Water supply and suitability of rainwater collection.

3.1. GEOTECHNICAL INVESTIGATIONS

The property has frontages onto Octavius Road and Hadfield road, and at its western edge borders the Main Trunk rail line. There is an existing residence at the eastern end.

a. Topography

- i. The topography of the site is gently sloping with gradients that are typically "low" (categories as per the GWRC classifications and denoting slopes of 0°-10°). The site is predominantly in pasture with shelter belts at the boundaries of the paddocks. The western, lower end of the property terminates in a section of the Kapiti maritime escarpment with two incised gullies extending to the lower terrace. It is likely that these indicate potential flow paths in wet weather.
- ii. **Soils**. The underlying geology of the site appears to consist of alluvial material incorporating Gravel deposits interspersed with fine grained silts and clays and overlain with Loess. Site investigations included test pits, boreholes prepared for percolation tests, and by observation of exposed cut channels alongside the stream. From previous reports it appears to be within an alluvial fan identified as being 14,000 24,000 years old. More detailed information is included with the penetrometer test results which are appended.

 Groundwater. No indication was sighted of groundwater within the test pits dug on the site.

A pond is located to the south-west of the existing house, which intercepts a spring and surface runoff. An overflow channel extends initially to the north of the pond and then skirts inside the northern boundary to meet with northern-most incised gully which runs through the marine cliff adjacent to the western boundary.

At the time of inspection this channel was flowing until it met a boggy area uphill of the gully. No other surface seepage was noted however the presence of minor gullies indicated that surface flows were probable in significant storm events, and there were areas of saturated soil indicating potential seepage or localised poor drainage.

An aerial photograph of the site taken in 1980 clearly shows the same channel indicating that there has been no significant erosion or movement since that time.

A 100mm diameter piped drain was discovered with a constant minor flow running onto the overflow drain at the point where it turns to run westwards. A source for this flow was not found but it is possible that it is an outlet for a field drain placed to intercept another spring on the site.

- b. **Slope Stability.** An on-site inspection as well as a review of previous reports and photographic records that go back to the 1980's reveal no apparent evidence of an underlying slope instability.
 - i. Experience with similar soils elsewhere in the Waikanae Foothills suggest that excavated slopes of 2 (Horizontal) to 1 (Vertical) will be

stable in heights up 3m. More detailed investigations may be required when assessing the stability of steeper or higher cuts.

c. Liquefaction. Liquefaction is the process where, during earthquake shaking, sand and silt grains in wet soil are rearranged and the water in the spaces between the grains is squeezed.

To liquefy, the soil must be:

- i. loose compacted soils tend not to liquefy
- ii. sandy or silty clays and gravels tend not to liquefy
- iii. wet the soil must be below the water table.
- iv. Liquefaction usually only happens in susceptible soils in moderate to strong ground shaking (when household items start to fall and break).

(Explanation courtesy of Environment Canterbury)

None of these risk factors appear to apply to the site and it is expected there is virtually no risk of Liquefaction.

This is reinforced by the GWRC mapping system which indicates a classification of "none" for Liquefaction risk on the subject site.

3.2. IDENTIFIED HAZARDS

a. Fault Lines

- The Ohariu Fault is shown in the current District Plan Natural Hazards as running approximately 950m to the east of the eastern Boundary of the site. The fault is currently listed as "Uncertain Constrained
- Investigations were carried out adjacent to the subject site in 2003 and 2008 with the latter being reported by Ian R Brown Associates in their "Review of Evidence for an Active Fault Trace", dated August 2008 ("Brown Report")
- iii. The results of this investigation were that previously assessed evidence of a potential fault line running close to the eastern boundary of the property and through 61 Hadfield Road were refuted as being due to another unrelated cause. This has had the effect of pushing the likely fault hazard zone further to the east of the property and as such is no longer considered to be a direct hazard on the site.

b. Noise Corridor.

The operative District Plan identifies a Noise Corridor associated with SH1 which has a boundary 50m inside the property parallel with its western boundary. It is currently anticipated that any building site will be uphill of this line.

4. FOUNDATIONS

Lots 2 and 3 allow for many options for the final siting of a building, beyond the sites specifically identified.

Our site assessment has noted exposed materials in cut faces that indicate likely founding in firm gravels within a silty sand or clay matrix. The existence of large boulders makes it extremely difficult to get meaningful scala penetrometer results. but sufficient testing was undertaken to indicate that the natural ground appears to be suitable for standard house foundations in accordance with NZS 3604.

Test pits indicated some variance across the site with lenses of clay/silt being possible and in one instance was found at depth below a firm gravel layer where scala penetrometer testing indicated refusal had been reached.

We recommend that the site be subject to site specific foundation investigation and design once the final location of a residence and its design has been finalised, and the specific subsoil conditions can be investigated and confirmed. This should ideally be undertaken once excavation for a building platform has been completed and conditions checked at least 2m below final ground level.



5. WATER SUPPLY

Properties in the surrounding area are dependent on rainwater collection. We are not aware of any activities in the area that would make roof water collection unsuitable.

The provisions have been considered in accordance with Rule 11B.3.2(1) of the Proposed District Plan as outlined below:

Water Supply

1. It shall be demonstrated (as evidenced by a report including an environmental impact report from a suitably qualified and experienced person) that:

a) a water supply of sufficient quality (potable for drinking purposes) and quantity can be provided for the activities proposed for the subdivision, including fire fighting;

New dwellings will provide their own water supply systems utilising roofwater collection and storage in compliance with Drinking Water Standards for New Zealand 2005 (Revised 2008). Properties in the surrounding area are also dependent on rainwater collection and we are not aware of any activities in the area that would make roof water collection unsuitable.

The minimum volume of net water storage needs to be 30,000 litres to satisfy the requirements of the KCDC SDPR 2012. However, 50,000 litres is recommended. This will be in addition to any additional storage required for stormwater attenuation. Owners must provide, maintain and monitor the installation and operation of the potable water supply in accordance with "The selection, operation and maintenance of individual household water supplies" (revised 2013), as published by the Ministry of health.

b) The proposed water supply will have no adverse effects on other water users;

The proposed roof water collection and storage, in accordance with Ministry of Health guidelines is independent of and will have no adverse effects on other water users.

c) the proposed supply will have no adverse effects on the water resource; and;

The proposed roof water collection and storage, in accordance with Ministry of Health guidelines will have no adverse effects on the water resource.

d) the proposed water supply will have no adverse effects on natural and physical resources.

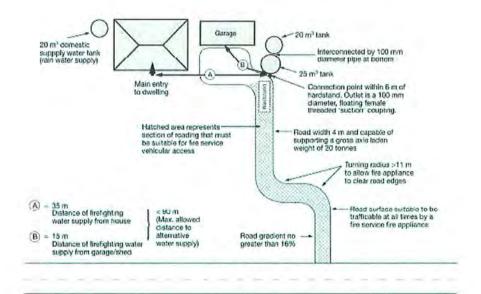

Restricted Discretionary Rule 7A.3.2(1d) requires:

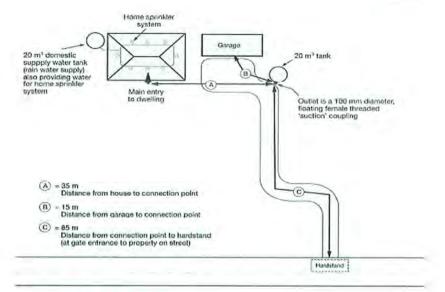
'A firefighting water supply must be provided which complies with the New Zealand Fire Service Firefighting Water Supplies Code of Practice SNZ PAS 4509:2008."

Future dwellings will be required to provide their own water supply systems, most likely comprising of roof water collection and storage. These dwellings will also comply with SNZ PAS 4509:2008 by providing a non-reticulated fire-fighting water supply when dwellings are constructed as set out below.

We respectfully request that the associated condition of consent addressing firefighting requirements of the subdivision may be:

'Firefighting requirements shall comply with the New Zealand Fire Service Firefighting Water Supplies Code of Practise SNL PAS 4509:2008.

Note: An alternative rural firefighting solution shall only be accepted if accompanied by the written approval of the Fire Region Manager. Unless an alternative firefighting solution is approved by the Fire Region Manager, a tank or fixed source shall be installed prior to issue of certification pursuant to section 224(c).'

6. WASTEWATER:

Lot 1 is an existing residence with an on-site wastewater system discharging to a disposal field on the proposed lot 2. It is proposed to locate a new disposal field within the lot 1 boundary as part of the subdivision. All lots will have sufficient area for disposal fields in accordance with NZS 1547:2012.

For the other two lots we have assessed the requirements as follows:

(1) Based on the provisions of NZS 1547:2012 "On-Site Domestic Waste Water Management" the likely disposal field soil type will be within a broad range from "Gravels with an indicative permeability of >3m/day" which are rated as "Category 1" to "Clay Loams" rated as category 4. For a drip irrigation system, with a depth of 100mm – 150mm of good quality topsoil, the suggested worst case irrigation rate is 3.5mm/day. It is noted that an earlier

- investigation by Connell Wagner dated November 2004 at a location at the North-east of the site, determined a soakage rate of 35mm per hour.
- (2) For a 5-person household the likely flow rate will be between 900 and 1000 l/day assuming "Households with standard fixtures" and Roof Water supply. From Table J1, this would require a 3,000 litre septic tank as a minimum size.
- (3) The septic tank should be of a system that produces effluent of secondary treatment quality in accordance with NZS 1547, to suit disposal in highly permeable soils. Assuming drip irrigation at 3.5mm per day, (table M1) the required Disposal Area would be approximately 285m2, and in line with the GWRC guidelines, no reserve area is needed. Permeability testing will need to be undertaken once the actual disposal site is confirmed to check the design permeability and exact area of disposal required. The design must also ensure that the size of the soakage field matches the waste water flow from the expected number of people in the house.

7. STORMWATER

Stormwater attenuation/disposal. It is likely that in a Rural environment, tank storage would be available for storing potable water, so tank-based attenuation is a likely option for the disposal of surplus rainwater, and to achieve Hydraulic Neutrality. The alternative of utilising a soak pit for this as well as disposal of any overflow cannot be ignored however. The calculations for a 250m2 house suggest that;

- An attenuation tank capacity of 5384 litres would be required with an orifice diameter of 30mm, with discharge to ground or via a small soakage trench.
- Outfall Soakage could be managed with a Rainsmart Soak Pit of roughly 10mx0.4mx0.4m depending on site measured soakage (200mm/hour assumed).

8. ACCESS

Existing access is available from Hadfield Road for all lots. Two vehicle crossings are currently provided and it is proposed that these be upgraded with a remediation of the existing surface and an overlay of chip seal or asphalt.

The metalled access tracks will also be remediated as necessary to Rural ROW standard under the SDPR 2012.

9. UTILITIES

Confirmation has been provided by Electra and Chorus that capacity is available for Power and Telecoms respectively.

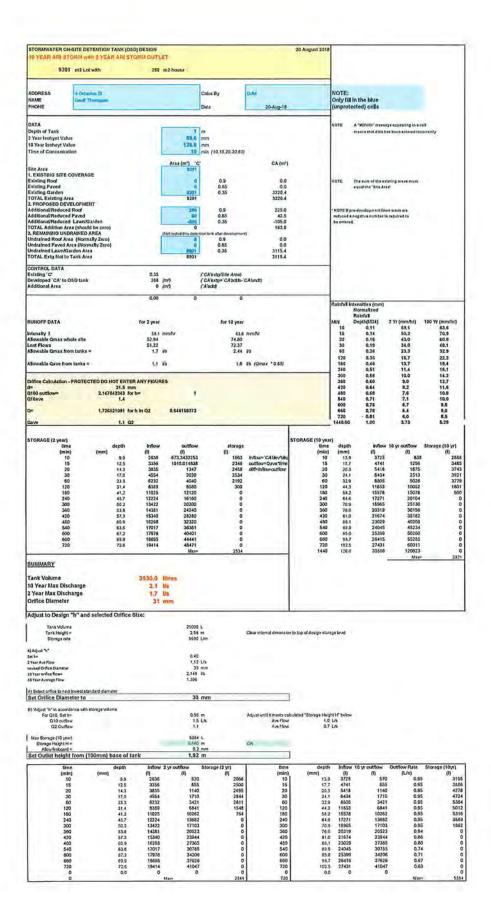
B) OUTFLOW FROM ATTENUATION TANK

The outflow is attenuated to the pre-development level for the critical storm event (Q2) so no further management is strictly necessary for hydraulic neutrality other than a diffused discharge to ground. However for full on site management available soakage can be utilised for the attenuated outflow. For example a Rainsmart soakpit has been sized as follows:

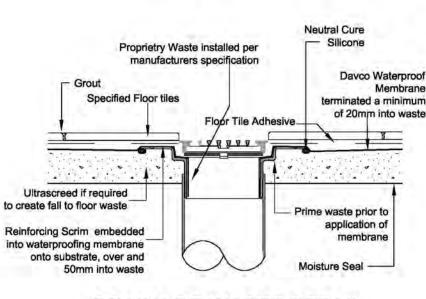


ACRYLIC SHOWER BASE/TILED WALL, CONC FLOOR DETAIL

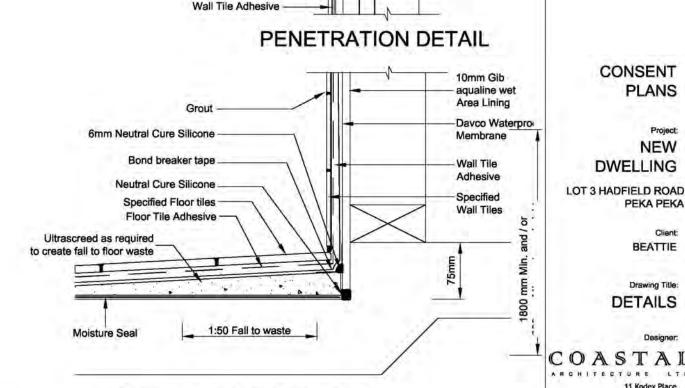

Soils/Foundation Site Requirements

NZS 3604 Timber Framed Buildings is listed as an Acceptable Solution under Clause 3.0 Timber in Acceptable Solution BI/ASI Structure. GHH Woodproducts have developed a range of wall bracing elements tested using P21 testing methods referenced in NZS 3604.

Demand may be calculated by following section 5, Bracing Design of NZS 3604 or using the GIB EzyBrace® software, downloadable from www.gib.co.nz.

EPB bracing systems properties can be easily loaded into the EzyBrace software by way of a software patch downloadable from www.chhwoodproducts.co.nz together with loading instructions.

Specific Design

Ecoply® Barrier structural plywood panels are manufactured to AS/NZS 2269, and is suitable for design and use in earthquake and wind bracing systems constructed in accordance with NZS 3603 and AS/NZS 1170.

Structural plywood to AS/NZS 2269 is the only sheet brace material with properties defined in a published New Zealand timber design code, NZS 3603 Timber Structures, and so can be designed in compliance with Verification Method BI/VMI under Clause 6.0 Timber for use in buildings over three storeys in height.

Timber Floors

When carrying out a bracing design for buildings with timber floor structures, the maximum bracing rating that can be accounted for when summing up the bracing units is 120BUs/m. This does not exclude the Installation of bracing elements that are rated higher than 120BUs/m, however the extra bracing capacity can not be accounted for in the bracing design.

Specific design of floor and sub-floor framing is required for elements rated higher than 120BUs/m.

Adjustments for Wall Height

Adjustment of bracing capacity of walls of different heights and walls with sloping top plates shall be obtained by the following method:

- (a) For wall bracing elements of heights other than 2.4m, the bracing rating determined by test or from table below should be multiplied by 2.4 ÷ element height in metres, except that elements less than 2.4m high shall be rated as if they are 2.4m high.

SITE DESCRIPTION / OVERVIEW

The property is located at Lot 3 – Hadfield Road, Peka Peka. The proposed building platform is on a site yet to be levelled situated towards the middle of the property with a predominately East/West aspect. The site is currently vacant, and it is proposed to construct a 5-bedroom dwelling approximately 220m2 on the build platform.

Legal description Lot 03, Hadfield Road, Peka Peka - with a total site area of 12149 m2

We visited the property on the 12th July 2019 and carried out a site assessment and evaluation for an On-site Domestic Wastewater Management.

The site is located by means of a driveway directly off Hadfield Road. There is a culvert running through the section conveying boundary water, so this means the field will need to be placed 20m clear of this area, so it is proposed to lay the dispersal field along the rear SE & SW boundary within the nominated 2m offset restriction as required. An approx. 300m2 level building platform will be prepared, with the Eastern side acting as the entrance and parking etc. with the remaining section tapering off from the building platform at all corners to natural land levels, and northern boundary runs parallel with the main road North. The site is clear apart from natural vegetation and scrub.

Supply for water would be from harvesting roof water to tank. No Wells or Bores are known to exist in the immediate vicinity.

SOIL ASSESSMENT / INVESTIGATION

Based on AS/NZS 1547:2012 "On-Site Domestic Wastewater Management"

On the day of my on-site evaluation, the weather was fine, with the preceding week being a mixture of fine/overcast conditions with no heavy rainfall encountered within the preceding week.

The topography is gently sloping at the house site towards the North and Western edges to natural run off areas, consisting of grass and natural vegetation, at the back and sides of the property. The Southern side is raised sloping back to the building platform. The eastern aspect provides access to the property.

Soil investigations in 3 different areas where the proposed irrigation field will be located at the Southern side of property, revealed 250 - 300mm of top soil overlaying a light to medium alluvial soil, crumbling & soft, with little moisture found in the top. The base below this is clay/loam so a conservative soil loading of 3.5 will need to be applied to this field.

The depth of seasonal ground water table was not encountered and is not expected to be a problem due to the elevated ground topography. The site indicates that there is no need for a surface water cut off drain at this stage.

Using AS/NZS 1547:2012 Table M1 Recommended Design Irrigation Rate (DIR), soil category has been assessed at 21mm per week = 3mm D.I.R / per day.

SUMMARY

Results of desk top study is confirmed and our assessment of the type of load application system considered best for the site is an aerated multi stage treatment plant with compensated dripper irrigation line for the distribution field.

The irrigation line can be installed on top of the ground and covered with bark or mulch, or mole ploughed 50-100mm into surface of irrigation area.

We propose that the irrigation field be installed at the South Western & South Eastern sides of the property with dripper lines staked to the ground and run through a cleared natural scrub area along the boundary- set back in 2 metres with an 10m x 30m dispersal field staked to the ground following the natural contour of the land – flush valves will be installed at the end of each loop and clearly identified for future maintenance.

This area can be planted with other suitable vegetation which will be maximise nutrient uptake and effluent dispersement.

RESERVE DISPOSAL AREA

There is adequate available reserve land area for disposal; this is not seen as concern with secondary treated waste water treatment system & dripper irrigation.

The irrigation system will incorporate a vacuum break and line flushing valve.

An FlitMaster130micron inline ring disc filter will protect the dripper lateral.

Landscape trees and additional plantings will aid transpiration and nitrate uptake.

PERFORMANCE CERTIFICATE RX Plastics Airtech 9000 On-site Domestic Wastewater Treatment System, OSET NTP Trial 9, 2013/2014

The RX Plastics Airtech 9000 system is a submerged aerated filter wastewater treatment unit. The manufacturer's rated design capacity is 2,000 litres/day. Total liquid volume is 7,000 litres (primary treatment 3300 litres; aeration tank 1,500 litres; clarification: 1,200 litres; pump chamber 1000 litres). Emergency storage is 2,165 litres. No tertiary treatment (such as UV disinfection) is incorporated. It comprises 4 plastic tanks (primary, secondary, clarifier and effluent pump chamber). The manufacturer's stated service frequency is 6 monthly.

Test Flow Rate
The RX Plastics Airtech 9000 system was tested at 1,000 litres/day (equivalent to servicing a 3-bedroom 5 to 6 person household) over an 8 month (35 week) period November 2013 to July 2014 followed by a 1 month (4 week) high load effects test involving 5 days at 2,000 litres per day then 1,000 litres/day over the following 3 weeks.

Testing and Evaluation Procedures

A total of 37 treated effluent samples of organic matter (BOD₅) and 36 treated effluent samples of suspended solids (TSS) at generally six day intervals during weeks 9 to 35 were tested and evaluated against the secondary effluent quality requirements of the joint Australia/NZ standard AS/NZS 1547:2012.

A total of 16 treated effluent samples of organic matter (BOD₅), total suspended solids (TSS), total nitrogen (TN), ammonia nitrogen (NH₄-N), total phosphorus (TP) and faecal coliforms (FC) at generally six day intervals during weeks 23 through 35 were tested and the results benchmarked and rated on their median values. In addition, the energy used by the treatment system was assessed on the mean of consumption levels over the benchmarking period.

AS/NZS 1547:2012 Secondary Effluent Quality Requirements

These requirements are that 90% of all test samples must achieve a BOD₅ of \leq 20 g/m³ and TSS of \leq 30 g/m³ with no one result for BOD₅ being >30 g/m³ and no one result for TSS being >45 g/m³. The RX Plastics Airtech 9000 system achieved a performance level of 100% for BOD5 and 100% for TSS based on the full set of test results in weeks 9 to 35, with no results exceeding the maximums. The RX Plastics Airtech 9000 system thus meets the secondary effluent quality requirements of AS/NZS 1547:2012.

Introduction

Thank you for installing an AirTech™ aerated waste water treatment system. The AirTech™ system is an efficient, lightweight sewerage treatment plant that safely and effectively processes your disposables and wastewater. The unit recycles it as clear, odourless nutrient enriched water to irrigate landscape, shelter belts, coppice wood lots or existing planted areas.

For the environmentally minded this means that the sewage and wastewater is treated on the property where it's produced and then recycled for reuse with little environmental impact on the land.

So welcome to your new wastewater system. It will give you years of reliable service. It is backed and supported by our network of independently trained and approved installation and service technicians.

Our independent, friendly, expert technicians have extensive product and system knowledge and are happy to take your call to provide support wherever you are. It is all part of our commitment to your total satisfaction and peace of mind.

The AirTech™ has been designed recognising the industry's latest Australia/New Zealand joint standard 1546 Part 1 septic tanks –1547 onsite Wastewater Management and A.R.C TP 58. It is local body approved and has been through, and passed all on-site Effluent Treatment National Testing (OSET NTP).

The AirTech™ system meets world health organisation (WHO) effluent quality standards.

The AirTech™ is a tough, robust and effective domestic wastewater system and has been designed by New Zealanders for New Zealand conditions. The design utilises innovative sewage treatment technology and together with modern rotomoulding manufacturing processes at our factories in Ashburton and Hamilton, we can deliver a reliable and efficient wastewater system to you.

System and process

Warranty

The AirTech™ aerated wastewater treatment unit is covered by the RX Plastics extended warranty and covers all polyethylene rotomoulded tanks to be free of defects in workmanship and materials for a period of 15 years.

The electrical componentry, including the alarm, is covered by a two year warranty only. The manufacturers own warranty applies to the Airblower and Disposal Pump, and is a one year warranty.

RX Plastics Ltd hold no responsibility for the installation including the design and care of the installation, this is between the independent installer/service agent and the customer.

Servicing arrangements

Your AirTech™ aerated waste water treatment system requires service and maintenance inspections every six months for continuity of warranty. RX Plastics recommends the system be serviced every six months, by our trained independent service agents/installers. This is a warranty requirement.

Your system alarm set will notify you every six months for you to arrange a suitable time to attend to your AirTech™ system servicing needs.

A record sheet will be completed by your service agent at the time of service. The customer copy is for you, another is made available to your local council and a third copy will be retained by the service agent.

Please call your installer/service agent for servicing costs in your area. Servicing is usually carried out every six months, unless heavy usage occurs, during holiday periods for example, where your system may need to be serviced sooner.

Servicing generally includes:

- 1. A general inspection of tank area, irrigation and drainage
- 2. Cleaning internal bio filter and external filter
- 3. Inspection of all chambers for correct operation and usage
- 4. Checking air blower, submersible pump switch and alarm operation
- 5. Checking sludge return and adjusting if necessary
- 6. Ensuring all lids are secure before leaving area

Note: As with any septic tank, the primary tank will need to be de-sludged (pumped out) every three to nine years.

- · The cost of de-sludging is the home owner's responsibility
- · Never pump out in wet weather as flotation may occur



Your responsibility

As the owner of the system you are responsible for the correct operation and maintenance and to conform to regional and local council requirements.

Council requirements

Now that your AirTech™ system has been installed there are a few council regulations that you must adhere to:

- Irrigated water must not be allowed to run off onto other properties or into waterways
- No fruit or vegetables grown on your property are to be irrigated with effluent from the system. The irrigated water is to be used only for irrigation purposes. It is not suitable for human or animal consumption
- To avoid confusion, use only the purple coloured drip line as this identifies waste water
- The council must approve that the area being landscaped or planted is to their standards
- All storm water and groundwater seepage should be diverted around the disposal and tank areas to avoid entering the system and irrigation area

Holiday precautions

If you are away for more than six weeks please contact your service agent so they can monitor your system.

When you return consider the use of bio starter to restart the biological process, as the anaerobic bacteria in the system would have died due to lack of nutrients.

System and process

So how does it work?

As the proud owner/user of an AirTech™ aerated wastewater sewage treatment system, it is important that you read this manual.

The AirTech™ system has been designed to include a simple owner service programme carried out at six month intervals (depending on usage).

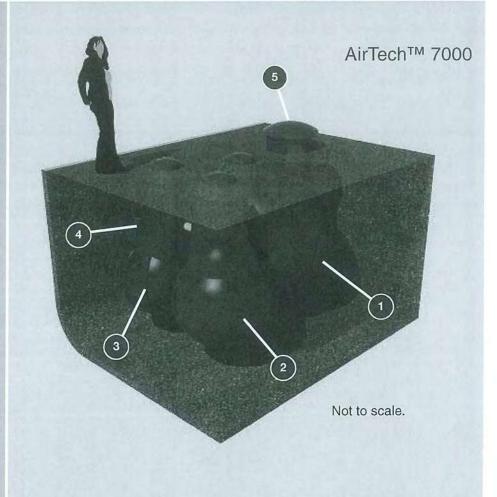
The service requirements of the system should be carried out by an independent, approved qualified service technician.

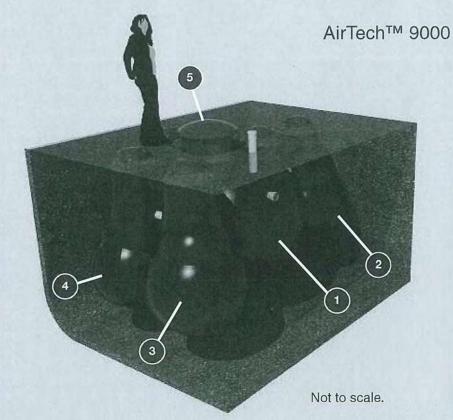
Following and understanding the instructions in this manual will ensure long term trouble free performance of the AirTechTM system.

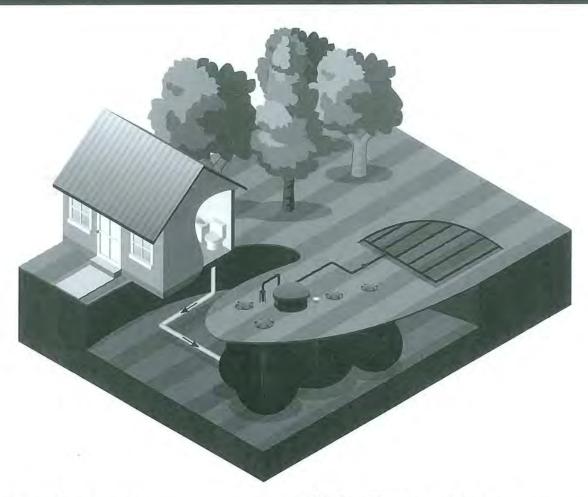
System and process

The unique AirTech™ multi-tank system process is as follows:

- Primary septic chamber (anaerobic digestion).
- Aeration chamber (aggressive aerobic digestion).
- 3 Clarification chamber (dormant settling of suspended solids and sludges).
- 4 Irrigation pump chamber.
- 5 Blower box: housing for Air Blower and Electronics.







Primary septic chamber

This is the main chamber where all household sewage and wastewater is discharged and the settling out of up to 95% of solid waste occurs. There is also a reduction in the biochemical oxygen demand (bod⁵) of up to 40%.

The primary chamber has a large liquid working capacity ensuring maximum retention time allowing anaerobic digestion of the accumulated solid waste. The primary chamber is a sealed chamber making sure there is no crossflow contamination between the separate treatment processes within the system. The outlet is fitted with an industry proven 3mm biofilter minimising solid waste carry-over integrating a flow modulation baffle to manage peak flow levels limiting shock loading of the system.

Aeration chamber

The partially treated wastewater flows into the aeration chamber where aggressive digesting aerobic bacteria can further reduce the suspended solid sludge. Efficient oxygen transfer through fine air diffusion maintains high aerobic activity and population. Increased surface area through additional submerged media enhances and accommodates a greater growth of bacteria.

Clarification chamber

Wastewater effluent is gravity fed into the clarification chamber where, in quiescent conditions, any remaining sludge and suspended material settle and are returned to the primary chamber through a venturi airlift manifold. This continual flow of enhanced activated sludge ensures a healthy treatment plant in periods of low or zero flow to the system.

Irrigation pump chamber

The gravity flow of clean, clear, odourless effluent into the irrigation pump chamber is nutrient enriched and is recycled through a designed irrigation system to enhance landscape, shelter belt or coppice tree woodlots on your property. This chamber is protected with an alarm that will activate in the event of a pump failure, and has a large capacity effluent storage.

5 Blower box

This houses all of the electronic connections (including the alarm set), required for the AirTechTM. Connection from the house is terminated on the outside of this box. The blower provides all of the air required for the aerobic digestion of your waste and must constantly run to achieve best results.

Guideline for using your AirTech™ system



Guidelines for using your AirTech™ septic tank

Your home has a modern waste water treatment plant. This plant treats your household waste water to a high quality and requires bacteria (bugs), to break down the waste matter. The wrong products going down your drains will kill the bugs and the system will not operate correctly.

 Do not turn the power off to the AirTech™ advanced septic tank system (unless you are rinsing your external filter) the bacteria will die and the system will smell

Items not to be flushed down drains

- No bleaches or chlorine (i.e. Napisan Bleach Janola) These products are designed to kill bugs and will kill off the bacteria in the tank causing smells and constant blocking of the Bio (internal) filter. You can use these products if used in a bucket and tip on the lawn or safe place, not down your drain
- No fats or oils

Fats and oils may block the tank filters and kill the bacteria in the tank

No tea leaves or coffee grounds

These may block the filters in the tank and the external filter

No washing paint brushes or disposing of paints

These products will not only kill bacteria in the tank, but the residue is very difficult and costly to remove

No disposable nappies, sanitary napkins, tampons or condoms

These products do not break down and cause a mass build up in the tank, which can cause blockages that can be costly to clean

Do not have a waste disposal unit

This waste takes a long time to break down and the system will require frequent emptying which is very costly

 Use low sudsing laundry powder/liquid and noncaustic dish washing powder

Other household items not to be flushed

- · Cat litter, kitty litter

- · Diapers, baby-wipes
- · Antibiotics, medicines

Guideline for using your AirTech™ system



General do's and don'ts

- · Don't turn your system off
- Do call your service agent when you encounter a problem
- · We recommend that you do your washing up on a daily basis so as not to shock load the system
- · Try to avoid using showers, washing machines, dishwashers etc. all at the same time
- Don't try to service the system yourself as there are health risks to consider and you may compromise your warranty
- Do use common sense, adhering to the basic rules provided throughout this manual, will guarantee a trouble free, and cost effective system

Suitable plants for Evapo-transpiration systems

Evapo-transpiration systems employ the combined effects of evaporation from soil and transpiration from plants to dispose of wastewater effluent. Moisture is wicked up to plant roots and to the soil surface. The plants use the moisture in their growing processes and subsequently transpire the excess through their leaves.

Most frequently asked questions:

· What does the alarm do?

an audible and visual alarm to alert the homeowner of possible issues with the system

. My septic tank is starting to smell, what do I do?

Your systems anaerobic bacteria has died or is dying check the points in the guidelines section (pages 6 & 7) of this manual. If you are still not happy with the results, please consult your independent service agent/installer for assistance

My septic tank is overflowing, what do I do?

Either the filter is blocked and needs cleaning, the power is off, or the pump has failed. Firstly, check that the power is turned on to your system, if it is, check to see if the outlet filter is blocked and needs cleaning. If the pump has failed, call your independent service agent/installer for assistance

 What is the maximum wireless range of the Smart Water System?

2km - 4km is the standard range, with 10km - 15km possible with the optional extended range Yagi Antenna

· Will reception be reduced if trees or walls are in between the AirTech™ and LCD unit?

Any wireless system will have range and reception reduced by obstacles. Similar to the poor reception of radio stations in valleys and near power lines. It is recommended to minimise obstructions in the direct path of the wireless signal. Metal clad walls will cause a drop in signal and use of an external aerial should be considered

 What happens if there is a power cut or the power to the LCD is interrupted?

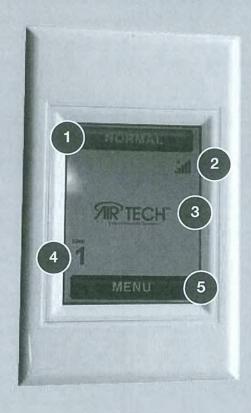
Nothing. Once power is restored the LCD unit will communicate with the tank and previous readings/data will be restored to the screen automatically. No data will be lost and you will not need to re-connect the LCD to the AirTech™ unit

Alarm features and operation

The alarm panel

In 'Normal' mode, your screen should look like this.

- 1 Status button.
- 2 Tank signal strength.
- 3 AirTech™ icon.
- 4 Tank number / Tank 1 = AirTech™.
- Menu button.



Troubleshooting



If you have a fault, your touch screen will be beeping and at the top, in red, it will say 'FAULT'.

- AirTech has a fault, press to see fault.
- 2 Warning icon.



The screen will indicate the fault, either as:

- A High Water Alarm which can mean that your irrigation filter is blocked and needs cleaning, or that you have a problem with your irrigation pump or
- B Aeration Fault which means that your aeration blower is not working or blowing enough air, please call your service agent. The buzzer will go off every 24 hours until the problem is resolved.

Alarm features and operation

Alarm features

The AirTech™ is equipped with a wireless alarm system with sensor interface, this will alert you with an audible and visual alarm so you can contact the service agent network in the event of system malfunction.

This wireless alarm system will also alert you to your six monthly servicing. This alarm will go off every six months and can only be re-set by your service agent after he has serviced the $AirTech^{TM}$ unit.

The face plate should be installed in the laundry or garage, and has a "one glance" LCD display screen with graphics designed for the ultimate in simple, user friendly operation.

Please contact your independent service agent/installer in the event of any alarm alert, this is a sewerage system and may be harmful to health.

General

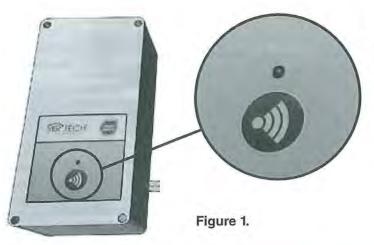
The system will already be paired by your service agent upon installation of your system. The installation process will ensure your AirTech™ unit is connected wirelessly to your base station.

The base station will either be the supplied Wallmount unit or extra option of the Deskmount unit will start flashing to remind you it is time for a service.

Installation

To add an additional AirTech™ (or a water tank)

- The Faceplate will say ...ADD TANK waiting ... the tank unit will have a RED connect light on solid, then press TANK -> ADD.
- For an AirTech™ unit, under the blower box, press the CONNECT button below the RED light (Figure 1) for 2-3 seconds until it flashes green then it turns back to solid red.



- 3. Wireless Alarm is now PAIRED and ready for use.
- 4. On the Alarm Faceplate it will say Septic 1 added, this is now paired with the Tank unit, Touch EXIT on the screen and the AIRTECH™ symbol will be displayed showing the top bar in green and displaying NORMAL.

AirTech™ alarm testing

1. Test Air Switch

In Tank unit, this has a 10 second delay before alarming. The RED connect light in the tank unit will flash once and the Alarm Faceplate will display the TOP BAR in RED reading FAULT, there will also be an audible alarm with a WARNING triangle flashing on the left hand side above Tank 1, when the FAULT bar is touched it will SNOOZE the alarm sound for 24 hours, and the display will show what the fault is and who to contact, this is the same when the float switch eventually alarms.

2. Test float switch

Lift the float switch and watch the Tank unit CONNECT light, it will flash GREEN back to solid RED. The faceplate will show nothing as there is a 30 minute delay on alarming to prevent false alarming. If you want to check the float switch is working at the faceplate touch MENU, then MORE, then ABOUT, tap the centre of the screen saying SMARTWATER 5 times. It will show DIAGNOSTICS, the bottom line INPUTS will show 00000010 for float switch and 00000001 for Air switch of 000000011 for both Float and Air switch.

To remove AirTech™

 To remove AIRTECH™ tank 1 from faceplate, touch MENU, TANK, REMOVE, on SELECT TANK screen select 1 and then YES, exit out and you will be back to original ADD TANK screen ready to PAIR a unit.

To add an additional water tank

1. Follow the information provided with the Tank Unit Kit.

- Any faceplate can be paired to AirTech[™] Tank unit, they ALL have AirTech[™] software
- · You add water tanks the same way
- Can monitor up to 9 AirTech™s with one Faceplace or 1
 AirTech™ and 8 Water Tanks and a Pump controller

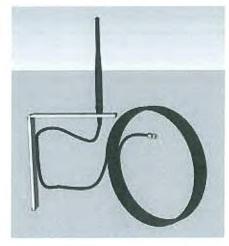

Welcome to your new smart water alarm set. This operates on wireless signals so there are a few considerations to keep in mind:

- Installation of the AirTech™ system generally requires line of sight between the ground tank unit and the LCD base station. If there are significant obstacles affecting reception, this can normally be resolved with the use of higher gain antenna. The antennas can be externally mounted for better reception.
- 2. The signal is strong but may be affected by having the antenna of the AirTechTM below ground. Water and soil absorb the radio waves and can affect connection to the AirTechTM unit.

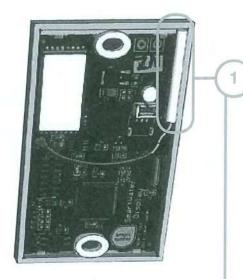

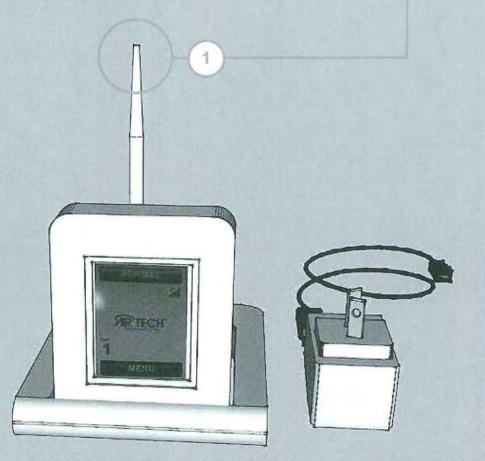

Antenna

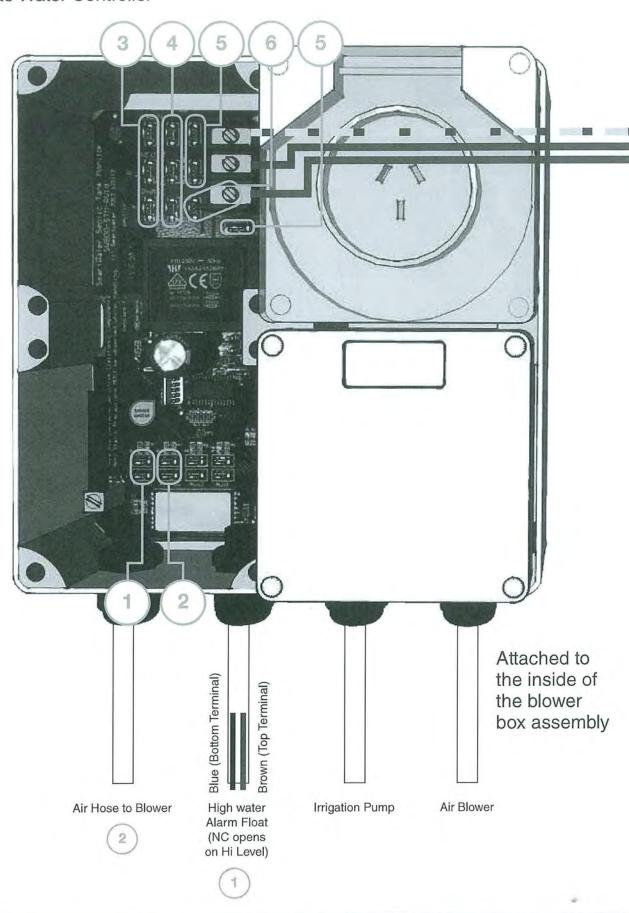
Should be installed vertically and should be as high above ground as possible (Figure 2 and Figure 3).

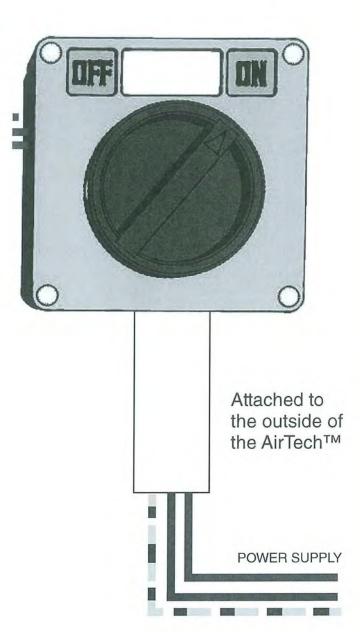


AirTech™ wiring diagram

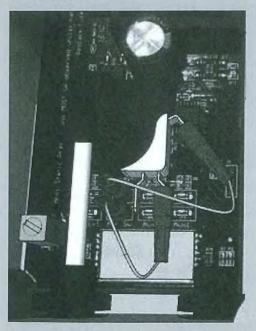

RCBO or MCB/RCD combination rating is to be minimum of 16Amp.

- High water Alarm Float (NC opens on Hi Level)
 brown wire to the top and blue to the bottom terminal.
- AirSwitch connected to the terminals and the air hose connecting to the air blower via a gland (see image below).



- Irrigation Discharge pump is connected here (terminals top to bottom Earth, Neutral, Phase).
