Cleaning your filter / Bio Starter

Cleaning out your filter

Although your waste water system is serviced on a regular basis, there is one crucial task that you as the occupants of the house should schedule, as part of your regular home maintenance.

The outlet filter on your waster water system must be cleaned regularly to reduce the stress on your pump, and it helps keep your power bill down too. We recommend cleaning the filter once a month (1st of each month, so that it is easy to remember), and the filter is kept squeaky clean.

Most modern systems have a filter that looks like, or is similar to this:



How do I clean it?

- 1. Always wear rubber gloves when cleaning your filter
- 2. First switch your system off at the power source
- 3. To remove the cartridge, hold the bottom of the casing and screw the collar clockwise to undo
- 4. Rotating the disc cartridge for a minute or two under the garden hose is usually sufficient to clean all the silty residue off the filter (so that the discs spin is best)
- 5. Put the cartridge back in the casing and screw back on hand tight only
- 6. Remember to switch the power to the system back on!

'Water Alarm'

When the 'Water' alarm activates, it is usually because the filter is blocked. The filter should be cleaned immediately the alarm activates, as your pump will be continuously trying to pump water out and cannot. This will cause undue stress, and will possibly shorten the life of the pump.

If you clean the filter and the alarm does not go off after half an hour or so, please ring your installer or service agent as there may be a problem.

We certify that the products to be supplied by our company for this project, meet or exceed the requirements of the New Zealand Building Code, NZS 4211:1985 Performance of Windows and NZS 4223 Glazing in Buildings.

More specifically, we will manufacture the aluminium windows and doors for this project in accordance with the design and manufacturing specifications provided by NATIONAL ALUMINIUM LTD, and those required by NZS 4223.

Window and door units to be manufactured to these specifications have been tested to, and comply with, the wind pressure rating, deflection, weather performance and glazing requirements of the above New Zealand Standards.

The products to be supplied by our company for this project, can be expected to have a serviceable life of not less than 15 years in accordance with section B2 of the New Zealand Building Code. This relates specifically to the structural elements of the windows and doors.

Over time, even with regular maintenance, decorative elements and non-structural fittings such as handles, fasteners, roller mechanisms, mohair and other similar components may require replacement as they wear out. This process does not contravene the Durability Requirements of section B2 of the New Zealand Building Code or this Producer Statement.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

GENERAL

- The information contained in this manual, and all other information or advice given at any time by Rheem New Zealand Limited in connection with the purchase, installation or use of a Rheem water heater, is given in good faith. Subject to any rights the owner may have under the "Consumer Guarantees Act 1993", Rheem New Zealand Limited will not be liable to any person for any inaccuracy or omission in the information or advice arising through the fault or negligence of Rheem New Zealand Limited or any other person or through any other cause whatsoever.
- This water heater is not intended to be operated, adjusted or tampered with by young children or infirm
 persons. Young children should be supervised to ensure they do not play with the water heater.

ABOUT YOUR WATER HEATER

Q. DOES THE WATER QUALITY AFFECT THE WATER HEATER?

A. Your water heater is suitable for most public water supplies, however, some water qualities may have a detrimental effect on it. If you are in a known harsh water area please refer to page 6.

Q. HOW HOT SHOULD THE WATER BE?

A. All models (temperature range 60 - 70°C) require an authorised person to make any temperature adjustments. For reasons of safety and economy, we advise the thermostat is adjusted to the lowest setting that meets your needs.

The New Zealand Building Code requires a stored temperature setting of not less than 60°C. A tempering valve set at a maximum of 55°C must be used on domestic wet areas.

Q. HOW DO I KNOW IF THE WATER HEATER IS INSTALLED CORRECTLY?

A. Refer to the installation requirements on page 4.

Q. HOW LONG WILL THE WATER HEATER LAST?

A. There are a number of factors that affect the life of the water heater. These include; the water quality, water pressure, water temperature and the usage pattern, however, your Rheem water heater is supported by a comprehensive warranty (refer to page 7).

The life of the water heater may be extended by arranging for an authorised person to inspect the anode and replace it, if required.

The suggested time after installation when the anode should be inspected is:

Vitreous Enamel 8 years

Optima 10 years

For softened water supplies or in areas of poor water quality, it is recommended the anode be inspected 3 years earlier than shown (refer to "Water Quality" on page 6).

HOW THE WATER HEATER WORKS

SINGLE AND TWIN ELEMENT MODELS

Water stored within the water heater is heated by the electric heating element. The thermostat controls the electricity supply to the heating element so that a constant water temperature is maintained. As the cold water is heated it expands approximately 1/50 of its volume and, as a result, a small amount of water is discharged from the cold water expansion valve.

NON-SIMULTANEOUS ELEMENT MODELS

The two heating elements are wired for non-simultaneous operation, so that only one heating unit can operate at a time. The bottom heating unit is usually connected to an off-peak (overnight) supply and the top heating unit to a continuous supply. The red link wire must be removed from the terminal block during installation if two separate power supplies are to be used. Leaving the link in place ensures both elements operate correctly with a single power supply.

The basic operation is as follows: when the water temperature at the top of the water heater has reached the set temperature, the thermostat switches the top element off. This creates a circuit to the bottom heating element by switching the neutral.

SAFETY

On all models, a Temperature and Pressure Relief valve is supplied with each water heater. It can be found inside the front cover and must be mounted on top of the water heater.

Also fitted to the water heater is a thermostat, which incorporates an over-temperature thermal cut-out device.

Warning: The operation of the thermal cut-out indicates a possible dangerous situation. The thermostat and thermal cut-out is to only be adjusted or reset by an authorised service person.

These safety devices must not be tampered with, or removed, and under no circumstances operate the water heater unless both devices are fitted.

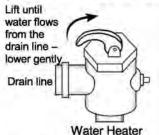
REGULAR CARE

MANUALLY OPERATING THE TEMPERATURE AND PRESSURE RELIEF (TPR) VALVE:

The easing lever (see diagram. 1) on the TPR valve should be operated regularly to remove lime deposits and verify that it is not blocked. It is very important that you raise and lower the lever gently.

Warning: To ensure the relief valve is working correctly, operate the relief valve easing lever at least every six months. Failure to do this may result in the water heater over-pressurising.

If water does not flow freely from the drain line or the valve fails to completely close and water continues to be discharged, contact the Rheem Service Department, phone 0800 657 335, or the nearest Rheem Service Centre (look in the Yellow Pages under "Plumbers).

GOING ON HOLIDAYS:

If you plan to be away from home for one or two nights, we suggest that you leave the water heater switched on. However, if you plan to stay away more than a few nights, conserve energy by switching the water heater off at the isolating switch, or at the main switchboard. In locations where freezing could occur, you should leave the water heater turned on.

SAVE A SERVICE CALL

CHECK THE ITEMS BELOW BEFORE MAKING A SERVICE CALL. YOU MAY BE CHARGED FOR SERVICE IF THE FAULT IS NOT RELATED TO THE WATER HEATER MANUFACTURE OR PARTS SUPPLIED WITH THE WATER HEATER BY RHEEM.

WATER DISCHARGING FROM EXPANSION CONTROL VALVES

It is normal for the cold water expansion valve and the temperature and pressure relief valve to discharge a small quantity of water during the heating cycle. If either of these valves discharge more than a bucket full of water in 24 hours, one of the following may be the cause.

- Continuous dribble
 - Try gently raising the easing lever on the relief valve for a few seconds. This may dislodge small particles of foreign matter and clear the fault.
- Heavy flow of hot water until the water is cold then stops while the water reheats
 Immediately turn off the electricity supply to the water heater. Call the Rheem Service Department or look in the Yellow Pages under "Plumbers" for your nearest Rheem Service Centre or www.rheem.co.nz to arrange an inspection.
- A steady flow of water (often at night)

This may indicate that your cold water pressure sometimes rises above the design pressure of the water heater. A Pressure Limiting valve should be installed, or if one is installed, it may need replacing.

NOT ENOUGH HOT WATER (or no hot water)

Is the electricity turned on?

Check the switch marked 'water heater' at the switchboard and the water heater isolating switch. Check the fuse or circuit breaker marked 'water heater'.

WHERE THE WATER HEATER IS CONNECTED TO AN OFF PEAK (NIGHT RATE) ELECTRICAL TARIFF, THE SUPPLY MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE AT CERTAIN TIMES OF THE DAY.

- Do you have the correct size heater for your requirements?

 Before to the sizing guide in the Bhoom sales literature or the Bhoom was a least to the Bhoom was a least
 - Refer to the sizing guide in the Rheem sales literature or the Rheem website.
- Is one outlet (especially the shower) using more hot water than you think? Carefully review the family's hot water usage and if necessary, check the shower flow rate. For maximum efficiency we recommend the flow rate through the shower is between 8 to 10 litres per minute (mixed hot and cold). This can be achieved by installing a flow control valve if provision is not made to fit a flow restrictor in the shower rose.
- Ensure the thermostat setting is appropriate. Note, some models require an authorised person to make electrical thermostat adjustments.

HIGH ELECTRICITY BILLS

- Consider recent changes to your hot water usage pattern and check if there has been an increase in tariffs since your previous account.
- Is either of the expansion valves discharging too much water?

- Is one outlet (especially the shower) using more hot water than you think?
- Is there a leaking hot water pipe, dripping hot water tap, etc?
 Even a small leak will waste a surprisingly large quantity of hot water and energy. Replace faulty tap washers, and have your plumber rectify any leaking pipe-work.

INSTALLATION

Please take careful notice of the advice given as Rheem New Zealand Limited will not be liable for any loss or damage suffered as a result of the incorrect installation of the water heater, or any failure to check the capability of the electrical supply wiring to the water heater.

The water heater must be installed by a certified person or registered plumber and the installation must comply with the New Zealand Building Code, Rheem Installation Instructions, AS/NZS 3000 electrical installations and all local codes and regulatory authority requirements. Note that no warranty costs will be payable where the water heater is located in a position that does not comply with the Rheem water heater installation instructions or relevant statutory requirements, where the unit is installed in a position that does not allow safe or ready access, the cost of that access shall not be payable (refer to "Rheem Warranty" on page 7).

WATER HEATER LOCATION

Water heaters with a galvanised outer casing are only suitable for indoor installations, whereas water heaters with a painted casing are suitable for both indoor and outdoor installations.

Clearance must be allowed for servicing and removal of the water heater and it must be accessible without the use of a ladder or scaffold. (Typical clearances are: TPR valve removal 135 mm, Element Cover and Element Removal 400 mm). Also, you must be able to read the information on the rating plate and if possible, leave headroom of one water heater length so the anode can be inspected or replaced.

CONNECTION SIZES

- Hot and Cold water connections: RP ¾ / 20.
- Relief valve connection: RP ½ / 15.

INLET/OUTLET CONNECTIONS

A union must always be provided at the cold water inlet and hot water outlet for disconnection reasons. All connection sockets on the water heater are parallel threaded and therefore tapered brass nipples must be used to ensure watertight connections. Both connections are fitted with plastic liners and it is important that they remain in situ for the water heater to function properly. These liners will be pushed into the correct position as the fitting is being screwed in.

NON RETURN VALVE

A non return valve must be installed on the cold water line to the water heater.

PIPE SIZES

The cold water line to the water heater should be the same size or bigger than the hot water line from the water heater. For best results, choose the most suitable pipe size for each individual application.

COLD WATER EXPANSION VALVE

A cold water expansion valve must be fitted to the cold water line to the water heater.

TEMPERATURE AND PRESSURE RELIEF VALVE

When fitting the temperature and pressure relief valve, ensure the probe has not been bent. Seal the thread with PTFE tape, or similar, as recommended by the valve manufacturer and screw the valve into the off-centre socket. Do not use a wrench on the valve body – use the spanner flats provided. Drain the TPR valve with a pipe the same size as the valve outlet. The drain must run downwards to a visible point outside the house, preferably over a gully trap.

In some setups or circumstances, such as if freezing could occur, an air break must be provided in the drain within 300 mm of the TPR valve, refer to the New Zealand Building Code - Clause G12 for requirements and acceptable solutions for the running of hot water drain line(s).

Warning: The drain line from the TPR valve must be in copper. A Rheem mains pressure water heater must <u>not</u> be installed and operated without a suitable (valve that complies with AS 1357.1) temperature and pressure relief valve. Under no circumstances block the outlet of this valve or its drain pipe.

WATER SUPPLY PRESSURE

Maximum permitted mains water pressure - refer product label and Table 5.2 AS/NZS 3500.4. Note inlet pressure control valve is required where maximum permitted mains pressure is likely to be exceeded. Minimum inlet pressure: 60 kPa

PRESSURE LIMITING/REDUCING VALVE

If the water supply pressure exceeds the requirements of Table 5.2 AS/NZS 3500.4, a pressure limiting valve with a maximum setting of 500 kPa is to be fitted in the installation.

SAFE TRAY AND SEISMIC RESTRAINTS

The water heater must be installed with a properly drained safe tray where there is the possibility of water damage to furniture, carpets or building. All water heaters must be restrained to protect against seismic forces. (Refer to the Zealand Building Code for acceptable solutions.)

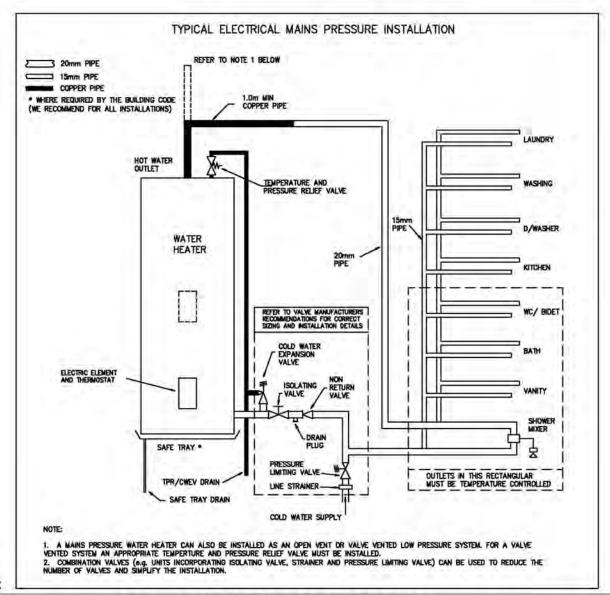


DIAGRAM 2:

CONNECTIONS - ELECTRICAL

The electrical installation must be completed in accordance with AS/NZS 3000. All water heaters are designed for 230 VAC, 50 Hz mains operation and a means of disconnection from the power supply must be incorporated in the fixed wiring during installation.

A flexible 20 mm conduit is required for the electrical cable to the water heater. The conduit is to be connected to the unit with a 20 mm plain to screw adaptor. Connect the power supply wires directly to the terminal block and earth tab connection, ensuring there are no excess wire loops inside the front cover. For details, refer to the wiring diagram on the inside of the element cover. A separate heating element earth wire is not required because the element earths by the thread of the element boss or the flange being in contact with the element socket.

COMMISSIONING

TO FILL AND TURN ON THE WATER HEATER

Warning: The power supply to the water heater must not be switched on until the water heater is filled with water and an "earth continuity test", as outlined in Annex A of AS/NZS 60335.1 has been carried out. Failure to do so will damage the element and shorten its life and may create a dangerous situation.

- Open all of the hot water taps in the house (don't forget the shower). Open the cold water isolation valve
 fully to the water heater to force the air out of the taps. As water flows freely from each tap, close it. Check
 the pipe-work for leaks.
- Switch on the electrical supply at the isolating switch to the water heater.

TO TURN OFF THE WATER HEATER

If it is necessary to turn off the water heater on completion of the installation, such as on a building site or where the premises is vacant, then;

- Switch off the electrical supply at the isolating switch to the water heater.
- Close the cold water isolation valve at the inlet to the water heater.

DRAINING THE WATER HEATER

- Switch off the electrical supply at the isolation switch to the water heater.
- Close the cold water isolation valve.
- Operate the relief valve easing lever to release the pressure in the water heater.
- Drain the water heater through the drain valve or plug.
- Undo the top outlet union or operate the relief valve easing lever again to let air into the water heater and allow the water to drain

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT WATER QUALITY

WATER SUPPLY CHEMISTRY

Water quality can have a detrimental effect on water heater operation, components and life expectancy and may affect the warranty.

Warning: This water heater must be installed in accordance with advice given to be covered by the Rheem warranty.

Your Rheem water heater is manufactured to suit the water condition of most local authority water supplies. However, some water supplies can have a detrimental effect on the water heater and its operation and/or life expectancy. This water heater must only be connected to a water supply which complies with these specifications for the Rheem warranty to apply. If you are unsure of your water chemistry you may be able to obtain information from your local water supply authority or you can contact Rheem and we will provide you with contact details of a suitable agency capable of testing your water for compliance with Rheem standards. Water quality tests must be carried out at the owner's cost.

HARSH WATER AREAS

Rheem water heaters are designed for use in areas where the Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) content of the water supply is less than 2500 mg/L.

In areas where the TDS exceeds 600 mg/L it is possible the standard magnesium anode fitted to the water heater, may be excessively active. To alleviate this, the magnesium anode should be replaced with an aluminium anode. Where the TDS of the water is less than 40 mg/L, such as when the water has been deionised or is from an alpine supply, a high potential anode should be used. The changing of anodes must be carried out by a plumber or qualified service person.

CAUTION

If your water supply has a TDS greater than 600 mg/L and the anode has not been changed, there is a possibility of hydrogen gas accumulating in the top of the water heater during long periods of no use. If, under these conditions, the water heater has not been used for two or more weeks the following procedure should be carried out before using any electrical appliances (e.g. automatic washing machines and dishwashers) which are connected to the hot water supply.

The hydrogen, which is highly flammable, should be vented safely by opening a hot tap and allowing the water to flow. There should be no smoking or naked flames near the tap whilst it is turned on. Any hydrogen gas will be dissipated as indicated by an unusual spurting of the water from the tap. Once the water runs freely again any hydrogen in the system will have been released.

SATURATION INDEX

The saturation index is used as a measure of the water's corrosive or scaling properties. In a scaling water supply calcium carbonate is deposited out of the water onto any hot metallic surface. When scaling water has a saturation index greater than +0.40 an expansion control valve must be fitted on the cold water line after the non-return valve.

Where the saturation index exceeds +0.80, low watts density elements should be used. Where the saturation index is less than -1.0, a corrosive resistant heating unit should be used (contact your local Rheem Service Department or an authorised service person).

Scaling water is water that containing levels of calcium carbonate (total hardness in excess of 200 mg/litre at any time when the water heater is operating) Scaling water can block and prevent the pressure & temperature relief valve from operating, resulting in damage to the water heater storage cylinder and water components. A cold water expansion control valve must be fitted where in all areas with scaling water to assist in preventing blockage of the pressure and temperature relief valve.

Warning: Failure to install an expansion control valve where scaling water conditions occur may result in the water storage cylinder failing or under certain circumstances over pressurising.

To avoid damage to the storage cylinder and components Rheem strongly recommends scaling water be treated before entering the water heater by fitting appropriate water filters, conditioners, etc – refer to your local water authority for information on water in your area. A build up of white sediment on the hot taps or shower rose can be indicative of scaling water. Contact Rheem if this condition is observed.

Warning: Damage caused by scaling water can affect the Rheem warranty.

The Rheem warranty of this water heater will not cover resultant faults on components, including storage tank, due to the effects of sludge and/or sediment as a result of connection to a water supply from silted or untreated sources, i.e. springs, dams, bores, rivers or town supplied from a bore.

WATER HEATERS NOT INSTALLED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ABOVE ADVICE WILL NOT BE COVERED BY THE RHEEM WARRANTY.

Mains Pressure Electric Water Heater Product Warranty New Zealand Only

In addition to your legal right, in New Zealand Rheem New Zealand Limited makes the following promise to the owner. We will repair or, if necessary, replace a defective unit or part of it, which has failed due to faulty manufacture on the following terms and conditions:

1. THE RHEEM WARRANTY - GENERAL

- 1.1 This warranty is given in respect of sales in New Zealand by Rheem New Zealand Limited of 475 Rosebank Road.
- 1.2 Rheem offer a trained and qualified national service network who will repair or replace components at the address of the unit subject to the terms of the Rheem warranty in New Zealand contact your Rheem Service Centre on 0800 657 335.
- 1.3 For details about this warranty, you can contact your Rheem Service Centre in New Zealand on 0800 657 335.
- 1.4 The terms of this warranty are set out in section 2 and apply to units manufactured after 1st July 2016.
- 1.5 If a subsequent version of this warranty is published, the terms of that warranty will apply to units manufactured after the date specified in the subsequent version.

2. TERMS OF THE RHEEM WARRANTY AND EXCLUSIONS TO IT

- 2.1 The decision of whether to repair or replace a faulty component is at Rheem New Zealand Limited's sole discretion.
- 2.2 Where a failed component or unit is replaced under this warranty, the balance of the original warranty period will remain effective. The replacement does not carry a new Rheem warranty.
- 2.3 Where the unit is installed outside the boundaries of a metropolitan area, defined by Rheem as further than 25 km from a Rheem service centre, the cost of transport, insurance and travelling between the Rheem service centre and the installed site shall be the owner's responsibility.
- 2.4 Where the unit is installed in a position that does not allow safe or ready access, the cost of that access, including the cost of additional materials handling and/or safety equipment, shall be the owner's responsibility. In other words, the cost of dismantling or removing cupboards, doors, walls, roofs or trap doors and the cost of any special equipment to bring the unit to floor or ground level or to a serviceable position is not covered by this warranty.
- 2.5 This warranty only applies to the original and genuine Rheem unit in its original installed location and any genuine Rheem replacement parts. It does not cover any plumbing, gas fitting or electrical parts supplied by the installer, that are not an integral part of the unit, e.g. pipe-work, pressure limiting valve, stop valves, non-return valves, electrical switches, pumps and fuses.
- 2.6 The Rheem warranty does not cover faults that are a result of:
 - a) Accidental damage to the unit or any component, for example Acts of God such as floods, storms, fires, lightning strikes and the like and Third party acts or omissions.
 - b) Misuse or abnormal use of the unit.
 - c) Installation or use not in accordance with the Owner's Guide and Installation Instructions, New Zealand Building Code requirements or with relevant statutory and local requirements including failure to install a properly drained safe tray where required by the owners guide and installations.
 - d) Connection at any time to a water supply that does not comply with the water supply guidelines as outlined in the Owner's Guide and Installation Instructions, or poor water quality outside the limits specified in the owners guide and installation instructions.
 - Repairs, attempts to repair or modifications to the unit by a person other than Rheem Service or a Rheem Accredited Service Technician.
 - f) Faulty plumbing or faulty power supply.
 - g) Failure to maintain the unit in accordance with the Owner's Guide and Installation Instructions.
 - h) Transport damage.
 - Fair wear and tear from adverse conditions (for example, corrosion).
 - Cosmetic defects.
- 2.7 If you require a call out and we find that the fault is not covered by the Rheem warranty, you are responsible for Rheem Service Centre call out costs. If you wish to have the relevant component repaired or replaced by Rheem that service will be at your cost.
- 2.8 Subject to any statutory provisions to the contrary, this warranty excludes any and all claims however arising including under contract or tort for damage to furniture, carpet, walls, foundations or any other consequential loss or incidental expenses either directly or indirectly due to leakage from Rheem unit, or due to leakage from fittings and/ or pipe work of metal, plastic or other materials caused by water temperature, workmanship or other modes of failure.
- 2.9 This warranty excludes to the extent permissible all implied warranties set out in the sale of goods act 1908 (New Zealand) and all guarantees set out in the consumers guarantees act 1933 (New Zealand) to the extent that the goods are acquired for the purpose of resupply in trade consumption in the course of a process of production or manufacture or repairing or treating in trade other goods or fixtures on land.

3. WHAT IS COVERED BY THE RHEEM WARRANTY FOR THE UNITS DETAILED IN THIS DOCUMENT

3.1 Rheem will repair or replace a faulty component of your unit if it fails to operate in accordance with its specifications as follows:

- 4.2 You are **not** entitled to make a claim under this warranty if your unit:
 - a) Does not have its original serial numbers or rating labels.
 - b) Is not installed in New Zealand.

 - c) If Rheem determines that you have a valid warranty claim, Rheem will repair or replace the unit in accordance with this warranty.
- 5.2 Any expenses incurred in the making of a claim under this warranty will be borne by you.

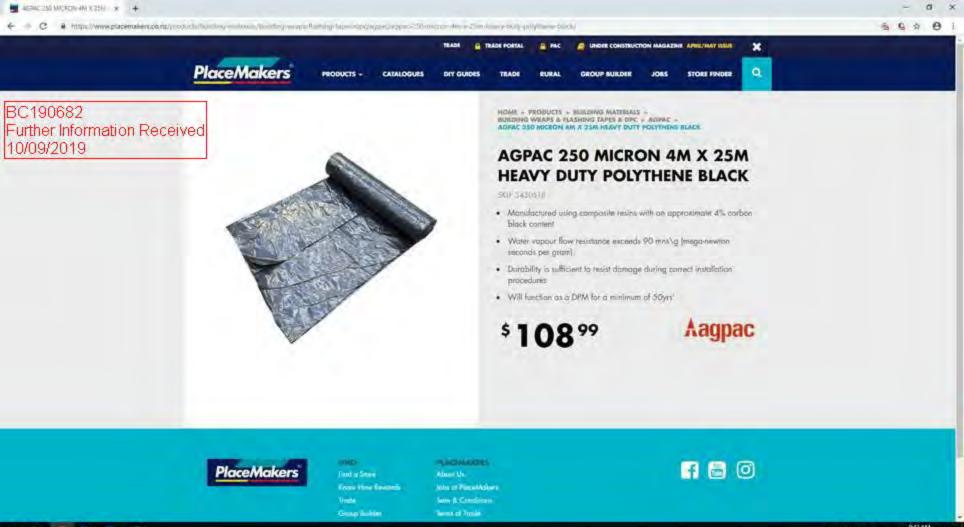

Product

- 1.1 Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding is a cavity-based bevelbacked fibre cement weatherboard wall cladding. It is designed to be used as part of an external cladding system for residential and light commercial type buildings where domestic construction techniques are used.
- 1.2 Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding consists of Linea® Weatherboard, which is a bevelbacked fibre cement weatherboard, fixed over timber battens to form the cavity. The cladding is finished with a latex paint system.
- 1.3 The cladding incorporates a primary and secondary means of weather resistance (first and second line of defence) against water penetration by separating the cladding from the external wall framing with a nominal 20 mm cavity. The cavity allows for any occasional ingress of water that may get past the external skin to drain to the exterior of the building, and any remaining moisture to dry by evaporation.

Scope

- 2.1 Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding has been appraised as an external wall cladding for buildings within the following scope:
 - · the scope limitations of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 1.1; and,
 - constructed with timber framing complying with the NZBC; and,
 - with a risk score of 0-20, calculated in accordance with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Table 2; and,
 - · situated in NZS 3604 Wind Zones up to, and including Extra High.
- 2.2 Linea Weatherboard Cavity Cladding has also been appraised for weathertightness and structural wind loading when used as an external horizontally fixed wall cladding solution for buildings within the following scope:
 - the scope limitations of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 1.1 with regards to building height and floor plan area; and,
 - · constructed with timber framing complying with the NZBC; and,
 - situated in specific design wind pressures up to a maximum design differential ultimate limit state (ULS) of 2.5 kPa.
- 2.3 Linea® Weatherboard must only be installed horizontally on vertical surfaces.
- 2.4 Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding is appraised for use with aluminium window and door joinery that is installed with vertical jambs and horizontal heads and sills. [The Appraisal of Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding relies on the joinery meeting the requirements of NZS 4211 for the relevant Wind Zone.]

[Note: Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding can be used to provide fire resistance rated construction, but these aspects have not been assessed by this Appraisal and are outside its scope.]



Building Regulations

New Zealand Building Code (NZBC)

3.1 In the opinion of BRANZ, Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding if designed, used, installed and maintained in accordance with the statements and conditions of this Appraisal, will meet the following provisions of the NZBC:

Clause B1 STRUCTURE: Performance B1.3.1, B1.3.2 and B1.3.4. Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding meets the requirements for loads arising from self-weight, earthquake, wind, impact and creep [i.e. B1.3.3 [a], [f], [h], [j] and [g]]. See Paragraphs 9.1 - 9.3.

Clause B2 DURABILITY: Performance B2.3.1 [b], 15 years and B2.3.2. Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding meets these requirements. See Paragraphs 10.1 and 10.2.

Clause C3 FIRE AFFECTING AREAS BEYOND THE FIRE SOURCE: Performance C3,7. Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding meets this requirement. See Paragraph 12,1.

Clause E2 EXTERNAL MOISTURE: Performance E2.3.2, Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding meets this requirement, See Paragraphs 14.1 - 14.5.

Clause F2 HAZARDOUS BUILDING MATERIALS: Performance F2.3.1. Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding meets this requirement and will not present a health hazard to people.

3.2 This is an Appraisal of an Alternative Solution in terms of New Zealand Building Code compliance.

Technical Specification

- 4.1 Linea® Weatherboards are bevelback weatherboards with a tongue and groove at each end for jointing. The weatherboards are pre-primed with an acrylic primer on the front face and both edges. Linea® Weatherboards are 16 mm thick and are available 135 mm, 150 mm and 180 mm wide. All boards are supplied 4200 mm long.
- 4.2 Linea® Weatherboards are manufactured from a reduced density cellulose fibre cement formulation. The boards are formed, cut to length and then cured by high-pressure autoclaving. After autoclaving, a bevel is cut on the back face of the weatherboards, the front edge at the bottom of the board is chamfered and the ends are tongue and grooved for jointing. Linea® Weatherboards are manufactured to meet the requirements of AS/NZS 2908.2.

Accessories

- 4.3 Accessories used with Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding which are supplied by James Hardie New Zealand are:
 - Axent™ Trim a 16 mm thick fibre cement trim manufactured from a reduced density cellulose fibre cement formulation. Axent™ Trim is pre-primed with an acrylic primer on the front face and both edges, and is available in sizes of 84 mm and 100 mm wide by 2600 mm long.
 - External and internal corner mouldings chromate treated aluminium external box corner, 90° internal corner 'W' mould. The mouldings are available in 2700 mm and 4000 mm lengths.
 - Corner soakers 90° soakers are available for 135 mm, 150 mm and 180 mm Linea®
 Weatherboards. The soakers are available in chromate treated aluminium, copper and stainless steel.
 - Cavity vent strip uPVC, available in 3000 mm lengths.
- 4.4 Accessories used with Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding which are supplied by the building contractor are:
 - Flexible wall underlay building paper complying with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1 Table 23, or breather-type membranes covered by a valid BRANZ Appraisal for use as wall underlays.
 - Flexible building underlay support polypropylene strap, 75 mm galvanised mesh, galvanised wire, or additional vertical battens for securing the flexible building underlay in place and preventing bulging of the bulk insulation into the drainage cavity. [Note: mesh and wire galvanising must comply with AS/NZS 4534.]



- Rigid wall underlay Plywood or fibre cement sheet complying with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Table 23, or rigid sheathing covered by a valid BRANZ Appraisal for use as rigid air barrier systems.
- Flexible sill, head and jamb flashing tape flexible flashing tapes complying with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 4.3.11, or flexible flashing tapes covered by a valid BRANZ Appraisal for use around window and door joinery openings.
- Cavity battens nominal 50 mm wide by 25 mm thick [minimum finished size of 45 mm wide by 18 mm thick] timber treated to Hazard Class H3.1.
- Joinery head flashings folded from aluminium or galvanised steel to suit the window or door trim opening. Refer to NZS 3604, Section 4 and NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Table 20 for durability requirements.
- Planted sill and scribers timber treated to Hazard Class H3.1, pre-primed before installation.
- Window and door trim cavity air seal air seals complying with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.1.6, or self-expanding, moisture cure polyurethane foam air seals covered by a valid BRANZ Appraisal suitable for use around window, door and other wall penetration openings.
- Flexible sealant sealant complying with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, or sealant covered by a valid BRANZ Appraisal for use as a weather sealing sealant for exterior use.
- . Cavity batten fixings 40 x 2.8 mm flat head hot-dip galvanised nails.
- Linea® Weatherboard fixings 60 x 3.15 mm flat head hot-dip galvanised HardieFlex nails or stainless steel ring shank HardieFlex nails (for concealed nailing in NZS 3604 wind zones up to and including Very High), 75 x 3.15 mm jolt head hot-dip galvanised nails or stainless steel ring shank nails (for face nailing in NZS 3604 wind zones up to and including Very High), and 90 x 4.0 mm jolt head hot-dip galvanised nails or stainless steel ring shank nails (for face nailing in the NZS 3604 Extra High Wind Zone and specific design wind pressures up to a maximum design differential ULS of 2.5 kPa).
- Axent™ Trim fixings 60 x 3.15 mm or 75 x 3.15 mm hot-dip galvanised jolt head nails and stainless steel ring shank jolt head nails.

[Note: Stainless steel fixings must be Grade 316 and hot-dip galvanising must comply with AS/NZS 4680].

Paint System Specification

- 4.5 Paint systems are not supplied by James Hardie New Zealand and have not been assessed, therefore they are outside the scope of this Appraisal.
- 4.6 All exposed faces, including top edges at sills and all bottom edges of Linea® Weatherboard, Axent™ Trim and accessories must be finished with a latex exterior paint system complying with any of Parts 7, 8, 9, or 10 of AS 3730.

Handling and Storage

- 5.1 Handling and storage of all materials supplied by James Hardie New Zealand or the building contractor, whether on site or off site, is under the control of the building contractor. Linea® Weatherboards must be stacked flat, off the ground and supported on a level platform. They must be kept dry at all times either by storing under cover or providing waterproof covers to the stack. Care must be taken to avoid damage to edges, ends and surfaces. Weatherboards must always be carried on edge.
- 5.2 Accessories must be stored so they are kept clean, dry and undamaged. All accessories must be used within the maximum storage period recommended by the manufacturer.

Technical Literature

6.1 Refer to the Appraisals listing on the BRANZ website for details of the current Technical Literature for Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding. The Technical Literature must be read in conjunction with this Appraisal. All aspects of design, use, installation and maintenance contained in the Technical Literature and within the scope of this Appraisal must be followed.



Design Information

Framing

Timber Treatment

7.1 Timber wall framing behind Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding must be treated as required by NZBC Acceptable Solution B2/AS1.

Timber Framing

- 7.2 Timber framing must comply with NZS 3604 for buildings or parts of a building within the scope limitations of NZS 3604. Buildings or parts of a building outside the scope of NZS 3604 must be to a specific design in accordance with NZS 3603 and AS/NZS 1170. Where specific design is required, the framing must be of at least equivalent stiffness to the framing provisions of NZS 3604. Studs must be at maximum 600 mm centres in Low, Medium, High and Very High Wind Zones and maximum 400 mm centres for the NZS 3604 Extra High Wind Zone and specifically designed buildings. Nogs must be fitted flush between the studs at maximum 800 mm centres (for studs at 600 mm centres) or maximum 1200 mm centres (for studs at 400 mm centres).
- 7.3 Timber framing must have a maximum moisture content of 24% at the time of the cladding application. [If weatherboards are fixed to framing with a moisture content of greater than 24% problems may occur at a later date due to excessive timber shrinkage.]
- 7.4 Timber wall framing must have a maximum moisture content of 18% before the weatherboards are painted.

General

- 8.1 When the Linea[™] Weatherboard Cavity Cladding is used for specifically designed buildings up to 2.5 kPa ULS wind pressure, only the weathertightness and structural aspects of the cladding are within the scope of this Appraisal. All other aspects of the building need to be specifically designed and are outside the scope of this Appraisal.
- 8.2 Punchings in the cavity vent strip provide a minimum ventilation opening area of 1000 mm² per lineal metre of wall.
- 8.3 At ground level the bottom edge of Linea® Weatherboards must be kept clear of paved surfaces, such as footpaths, by a minimum of 100 mm and unpaved surfaces by 175 mm in accordance with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Table 18. The ground clearances to finished floor levels as set out in NZS 3604 must be adhered to.
- 8.4 At balcony, deck or low pitch roof/wall junctions, the bottom edge of Linea® Weatherboards must be kept clear of any adjacent surface, or above the top surface of any adjacent roof flashing by a minimum of 50 mm.
- 8.5 All external walls of buildings must have barriers to airflow in the form of interior linings with all joints stopped for wind zones up to and including Very High, and rigid underlays for buildings in the Extra High wind zone and specifically designed buildings up to 2.5 kPa design differential ULS wind pressure. Unlined gables and walls must incorporate a rigid sheathing or an air barrier which meets the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Table 23. For attached garages, wall underlays must be selected in accordance with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.1.3.4, Where rigid underlays are used, the cavity batten fixing lengths must be increased by a minimum of the thickness of the underlay.
- 8.6 Where cladding penetrations are wider than the cavity batten spacing, allowance must be made for airflow between adjacent cavities by leaving a minimum gap of 10 mm between the bottom of the vertical cavity batten and the flashing to the opening.
- 8.7 Where Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding abuts other cladding systems, designers must detail the junction to meet their own requirements and the performance requirements of the NZBC. Details not included within the Technical Literature have not been assessed and are outside the scope of this Appraisal.



Interstorey Junctions

8.8 Inter-storey drained joints must be constructed in accordance with the Technical Literature. Interstorey drained joints must be provided to limit continuous cavities to the lesser of 2-storeys or 7 metres in height, in accordance with the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.1.9.4 [b].

Structure

Mass

9.1 The mass of the 135 mm wide Linea® Weatherboard when installed on the wall is 25.7 kg/m² at equilibrium moisture content (EMC). The mass of the 150 mm wide board is 24.9 kg/m² at EMC and the mass of the 180 mm wide board is 23.9 kg/m² at EMC. Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding is therefore considered a light wall cladding in terms of NZS 3604.

Impact Resistance

9.2 Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding will resist impacts likely to be encountered in normal residential use. The likelihood of impact damage to the cladding when used in light commercial situations should be considered at the design stage, and appropriate protection such as the installation of bollards and barriers provided for vulnerable areas.

Wind Zones

9.3 Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding is suitable for use in all Wind Zones of NZS 3604 up to, and including, Extra High where buildings are designed to meet the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 1.1, or up to 2.5 kPa ULS wind pressure where buildings are specifically designed.

Durability

Serviceable Life

- 10.1 Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding installations are expected to have a serviceable life of at least 50 years provided the paint coating system is maintained in accordance with this Appraisal to ensure the Linea® Weatherboards and fixings remain dry in service. Linea® Weatherboards must be painted within 3 months of fixing.
- 10.2 Coastal locations can be very corrosive to fasteners, especially locations within distances of up to 500 m from the sea including harbours, or 100 metres from tidal estuaries and sheltered inlets, and otherwise as shown in NZS 3604, Figure 4.2. These coastal locations are defined in NZS 3604 as Zone D. To achieve a 50 year serviceable life in Zone D, Linea® Weatherboards must be fixed with stainless steel fasteners. Fasteners outside Zone D may be hot-dip galvanised steel.
- 10.2 Microclimatic conditions, including geothermal hot spots, industrial contamination and corrosive atmospheres, and contamination from agricultural chemicals or fertilisers can convert mildly corrosive atmosphere into aggressive environments for fasteners. The fixing of Linea® Weatherboards in areas subject to microclimatic conditions requires specific design in accordance with NZS 3604. Paragraph 4.2.4, and is outside the scope of this Appraisal.

Maintenance

- 11.1 Regular maintenance is essential for Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding installations to continue to meet the NZBC durability performance provision and to maximise their serviceable life.
- 11.2 Annual inspections must be made to ensure that all aspects of the cladding system, including the paint coating system, flashings and any sealed joints remain in a weatherproof condition. Any damaged areas or areas showing signs of deterioration which would allow water ingress must be repaired immediately. Sealant and paint coatings must be repaired in accordance with the sealant or paint coating manufacturer's instructions.
- 11.3 Regular cleaning (at least annually) of the paint coating surface is recommended to remove grime, dirt and organic growth and to maximise the life and appearance of the coating. Paint systems must be recoated at approximately 7-15 yearly intervals in accordance with the paint manufacturer's instructions.

LINEA® WEATHERBOARD CAVITY CLADDING

11.4 Minimum ground clearances as set out in this Appraisal must be maintained at all times during the life of the cladding. [Failure to adhere to the minimum ground clearances given in this Appraisal and the Technical Literature will adversely affect the long term durability of Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding.]

Control of External Fire Spread

12.1 Linea® Weatherboard has a peak heat release rate of less than 100 kw/m² and a total heat released of less than 25 MJ/m² in accordance with NZBC Acceptable Solution C/AS1, Table 5.1. The system is suitable for use on buildings with a SH Risk Group classification, at any distance to the relevant boundary. Linea® Weatherboard is also suitable for use where a non combustible material is specified. When Linea® Weatherboard is finished with a paint coating of not more that 1.0 mm in thickness, the exterior surface finishes requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solutions C/AS2 – C/AS6, Paragraph 5.8.1 do not apply in accordance with NZBC Acceptable Solutions C/AS2 – C/AS6, Paragraph 5.8.2 a].

Prevention of Fire Occurring

13.1 When Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding is finished with a paint coating of not more than 1.0 mm in thickness, clearance separations from chimneys and flues are not required. However, when used in conjunction with, or attached to heat sensitive materials, the heat sensitive material must be separated from chimneys and flues in accordance with the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solutions C/AS1 - C/AS6, Paragraph 7.5.9 for the protection of combustible materials.

External Moisture

- 14.1 Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding, when installed in accordance with this Appraisal and the Technical Literature will prevent the penetration of moisture that could cause undue dampness or damage to building elements.
- 14.2 The cavity must be sealed off from the roof and sub-floor space to meet code compliance with Clause E2.3.5.
- 14.3 Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding allows excess moisture present at the completion of construction to be dissipated without permanent damage to bullding elements to meet code compliance with Clause E2.3.6.
- 14.4 The details given in the Technical Literature for weather sealing are based on the design principle of having a first and second line of defence against moisture entry for all joints, penetrations and junctions. The ingress of moisture must be excluded by detailing joinery and wall interfaces as shown in the Technical Literature. Weathertightness details that are developed by the designer are outside the scope of this Appraisal and are the responsibility of the designer for compliance with the NZBC.
- 14.5 The use of Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding where there is a designed cavity drainage path for moisture that penetrates the cladding, does not reduce the requirement for junctions, penetrations, etc to remain weather resistant.

Internal Moisture

15.1 Buildings must be constructed with an adequate combination of thermal resistance and ventilation, and space temperature must be provided to all habitable spaces, bathrooms, laundries and other spaces where moisture may be generated or may accumulate.

Water Vapour

15.2 Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding is not a barrier to the passage of water vapour, and when installed in accordance with the Technical Literature and this Appraisal will not create or increase the risk of moisture damage resulting from condensation.



Installation Information

Installation Skill Level Requirements

16.1 Installation of Linea® Weatherboard and accessories supplied by James Hardie New Zealand and the building contractor must be completed by tradespersons with an understanding of cavity construction and bevelback weatherboard installation, in accordance with instructions given within the Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding Technical Literature and this Appraisal.

System Installation

Building Underlay and Flexible Sill and Jamb Tape Installation

17.1 The selected building underlay and flexible sill and jamb tape system must be installed by the building contractor in accordance with the underlay and tape manufacturer's instructions prior to the installation of the cavity battens and the rest of the Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding system. Flexible building underlay must be installed horizontally and be continuous around corners. Underlay must be lapped 75mm minimum at horizontal joints and 150mm minimum over studs at vertical joints. Generic rigid sheathing materials must be installed in accordance with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1 and be overlaid with a flexible wall underlay. Proprietary systems shall be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Particular attention must be paid to the installation of the building underlay and sill and jamb tapes around window and door openings to ensure a continuous seal is achieved and all exposed wall framing in the opening is protected.

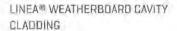
Cavity Battens

- 17.2 Cavity battens must be installed over the building underlay to the wall framing at maximum 600 mm centres where the studs are at 600 mm centres or at 400 mm centres when studs are at 400 mm centres. The battens must be fixed in place with 40 x 2.8 mm hot-dip galvanised flat-head nails at maximum 800 mm centres.
- 17.3 Where studs are at greater than 400 mm centres, a building underlay support must be installed over the building underlay between the cavity battens at maximum 300 mm centres.

Linea® Weatherboard Installation

- 17.4 Linea® Weatherboards may be cut on site by power saw. Holes and cut-outs may be formed by drilling a number of holes around the perimeter of the opening required and tapping out the centre with a hammer, or by using a hole saw.
- 17.5 Weatherboards must be dry prior to installation. Before the weatherboards are installed, cut ends exposed to the exterior such as at aluminium box corners or internal corners must be sealed with an acrylic sealer to reduce the absorbency of the fibre cement.
- 17.6 Linea® Weatherboards must be installed starting at the bottom of the wall. A cant strip (H3.1 treated timber or fibre cement) must be fixed behind the bottom course of weatherboards to ensure the weatherboards are set at the correct angle. The cant strip must be continuous around the perimeter of the building. The bottom course of weatherboards must overhang the bottom plate by a minimum of 50 mm.
- 17.7 Before the weatherboards are installed, the corner detail must be prepared to suit the selected option, e.g. external box corner, corner soaker. The necessary flashings, including window flashings, must be installed before commencing weatherboard fixing.
- 17.8 The first course of weatherboards must be full length, i.e. 4200 mm and commence from an external corner. Jointing of Linea® Weatherboards is made off the stud using the pre-cut tongue and groove joint. Tongue and groove joints may be located centrally between the studs, but must be no closer than 100 mm to the edge of a stud. A bead of sealant must be applied to the front side of the tongue before the corresponding board is inserted. Subsequent courses of weatherboards must be installed so that the tongue and groove joints are staggered by 600 mm minimum from joints in the previous course.

- 17.9 Linea® Weatherboards must have a minimum lap of 30 mm, and should be set out so as near to a full board as possible will finish under and over windows and doors and at the top of the wall. A storey rod can be used to accurately position weatherboard courses.
- 17.10 Linea® Weatherboards must be fixed to each stud using concealed fixings behind the lap of the boards or face nailing, except that face nailing must be provided at all corners and vertical edges of openings.
- 17.11 Concealed fixing must be carried out using 60 x 2.8 mm hot-dip galvanised or stainless steel Hardieflex nails depending on the location see Paragraph 10.2. Nails must be fixed 25 mm from the top edge of the board and must be driven flush with the board surface.
- 17.12 Face nailing must be carried out using 75 x 3.15 mm hot-dip galvanised or stainless steel jolt-head nails in NZS 3604 wind zones up to and including Very High, or 90 x 4.0 mm hot-dip galvanised or stainless steel jolt-head nails in the NZS 3604 Extra High Wind Zone and specific design wind pressures up to a maximum design differential ULS of 2.5 kPa, depending on the location see Paragraph 10.2. Nails must be fixed 15 mm up from the bottom of the board and punched a maximum of 2 mm below the surface of the board. When stainless steel nails are used, the top board at each lap must be pre-drilled.
- 17.13 Linea® Weatherboards can be hand or gun nailed. Nails must not be closer than 25 mm to the end of the board when hand nailing, or closer than 50 mm when gun nailing. [Note: Gun nailing must only be used for cancealed nailing.]

Aluminium Joinery Installation

- 17.14 Aluminium joinery and associated head and sill flashings must be installed by the building contractor in accordance with the Technical Literature. A 7.5 mm nominal gap must be left between the joinery reveal and the wall framing so a PEF rod and air seal can be installed after the joinery has been secured in place.
- 17.15 After installing the window and door joinery, Axent™ Trim, planted sills and scribers may be installed in accordance with the Technical Literature to provide additional weatherproofing for the joinery/ weatherboard junction.

Inspections

17.16 The Technical Literature must be referred to during the inspection of Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding installations.

Finishing

17.17 The paint coating manufacturer's instructions must be followed at all times for application of the paint finish. Linea® Weatherboards and trim must be clean and dry before commencing painting.

Health and Safety

- 18.1 Cutting of Linea® Weatherboard must be carried out in well ventilated areas, and a dust mask and eye protection must be worn.
- 18.2 When power tools are used for cutting, grinding or forming holes, health and safety measures as set out in the Technical Literature must be observed because of the amount of dust generated.
- 18.3 Safe use and handling procedures for Linea® Weatherboard and the components that make up the cladding system are provided in the relevant manufacturer's Technical Literature.



Basis of Appraisal

The following is a summary of the technical investigations carried out:

Tests

- 19.1 The following testing has been completed by BRANZ:
 - BRANZ expert opinion on NZBC E2 code compliance for Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding was based on testing and evaluation of all details within the scope and as stated within this Appraisal. Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding was tested to E2/VM1 (as contained within NZBC Clause E2, Third Edition, Amendment 5). The testing assessed the performance of the foundation detail, window head, jamb and sill details, meterbox head, jamb and sill details, balustrade to wall junction, parapet cap and internal and external corners. In addition to the weathertightness test, the details contained within the Technical Literature have been reviewed, and an opinion has been given by BRANZ technical experts that the system will meet the performance levels of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1 for drained cavity claddings.
 - Uniform wind face load tests to simulate wind pressures on 12 mm thick Linea® Weatherboards
 were carried out by BRANZ, and the results were used in assessing 16 mm thick Linea®
 Weatherboard used in Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding.
 - Cone Calorimeter testing to determine the peak rate of heat release and total heat release of Linea® Weatherboard was completed by BRANZ. The testing was carried out in accordance with AS/NZS 3837.
- 19.2 Linea® Weatherboards have been tested by a James Hardie NATA accredited laboratory in accordance with AS/NZS 2908.2. The testing covered: soak-dry, bending strength, warm water soaking, heat/rain, freeze/thaw and apparent density. The test methods and results have been reviewed by BRANZ and found to be satisfactory.
- 19.3 Testing has been carried out by James Hardie New Zealand to determine the modulus of rupture and inter-laminar bond strength of carbonated and non-carbonated Linea® Weatherboard. The test methods and results have been reviewed by BRANZ and found to be satisfactory.

Other Investigations

- 20.1 Weathertightness, structural, fire and durability opinions have been provided by BRANZ technical experts.
- 20,2 Site visits have been carried out by BRANZ to assess the practicability of installation, and to examine completed installations.
- 20.3 The manufacturer's Technical Literature has been examined by BRANZ and found to be satisfactory.

Quality

- 21.1 The manufacture of Linea® Weatherboard has been examined by BRANZ, and details regarding the quality and composition of the materials used were obtained by BRANZ and found to be satisfactory.
- 21.2 The quality of materials, components and accessories supplied by James Hardie New Zealand is the responsibility of James Hardie New Zealand. The quality control system of James Hardie New Zealand has been assessed and registered as meeting the requirements of ISO 9001: 2008.
- 21.3 Quality on site is the responsibility of the installer.
- 21.4 Designers are responsible for the building design, and building contractors are responsible for the quality of installation of the building underlay, cavity battens, Linea® Weatherboard and accessories in accordance with the instructions of James Hardie New Zealand.
- 21.5 Building owners are responsible for the maintenance of Linea® Weatherboard Cavity Cladding in accordance with the instructions of James Hardie New Zealand.

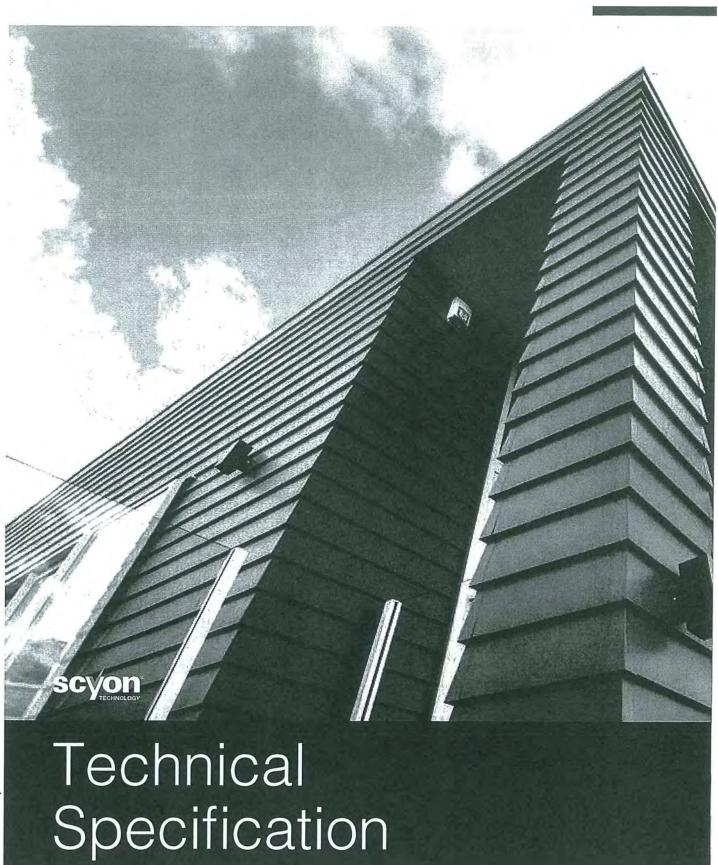

Application and scope

1.1 APPLICATION

Linea® Weath®rboard is a 16mm thick, pre-primed bevel back fibre cement weatherboard and is classified as lightweight wall cladding suitable for residential and light commercial construction using timber framed external walls. Linea Weatherboard is available in 135mm, 150mm and 180mm widths.

James Hardie also has available:

- Axent™ Fascia in two widths. Axent Fascia is a 16mm thick, pre-primed fibre cement product designed to accommodate James Hardie soffit linings.
- Axent™ Trim comes in a variety of widths for use as decorative trims around openings and external corners. Axent Trim is a 16mm thick, pre-primed fibre cement product.

Specifier

If you are a specifier or other responsible party for a project ensure that the information in this document is appropriate for the application you are planning and that you undertake specific design and detailing for areas which fall outside the scope of these specifications.

Installer

If you are an installer ensure that you follow the design, moisture management principles, associated figures and material selection provided by the designer and this James Hardie Technical Specification.

All the details provided in this document must be read in conjunction with the specifiers specification.

1.2 SCOPE

This specification covers the use of Linea Weatherboard on buildings that fall within the scope limitations of the New Zealand Building Code (The NZBC) Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 1.1.

This specification includes the use of Linea Weatherboard in both direct to stud and cavity construction method and must be read in conjunction with the current BRANZ Appraisals for Linea Weatherboard.

This specification also covers the use of Linea Weatherboard in cavity construction for specific design projects (SED) subject to a wind pressure of 2.5kPa (ULS) maximum. This document is intended for use by architects, designers, specifiers or builders who are involved in specifying Linea Weatherboard. The document also serves the purpose of an installation manual for this product.

1.3 DETAILS

Various Linea Weatherboard details are provided in the Details section of this document. This specification and details in CAD file are also available to download from our website at www.jameshardie.co.nz.

1.4 SPECIFIC DESIGN

For use of Linea Weatherboard outside this published scope, the architect, designer or engineer must undertake specific design.

For advice on designs outside the scope of this specification, Ask James Hardie on 0800 808 868.

2 Design

CODEMARK

2.1 COMPLIANCE

Linea Weatherboard direct fixed and cavity cladding has been issued a CodeMark certificate number GM-10-30018 which confirms Linea Weatherboard is deemed to comply with the requirements of the NZBC. Please refer to our website www. jameshardie.co.nz for a copy of the CodeMark certificate. Linea Weatherboard also has a BRANZ Appraisal number 446 (2010) and 447 (2010) at www.branz.co.nz or www.jameshardie.co.nz.

2.2 RESPONSIBILITY

The specifier or other party responsible for the project must ensure that the information and details in this specification are appropriate for the intended application and that additional detailing is performed for specific design or any areas that fall outside the scope of this technical specification. For applications outside the scope of this literature and figures which are not provided herein, the architect, designer or engineer must undertake specific design and it should be ensured that the intent of their design meets the requirements of the NZBC.

All dimensions shown are in millimetres unless noted otherwise. All New Zealand Standards referenced in this manual are current edition and must be complied with.

James Hardie conducts stringent quality checks to ensure that any product manufactured falls within our quality spectrum. It is the responsibility of the builder to ensure that the product meets aesthetic requirements before installation. James Hardie will not be responsible for rectifying obvious aesthetic surface variations following installation.

2.3 SITE AND FOUNDATION

The site on which the building is situated must comply with the NZBC Acceptable Solution E1/AS1 'Surface Water', Foundation design must comply with the requirements of NZS 3604 'Timber-framed Buildings' or be as per specific engineering design. The grade of adjacent finished ground must slope away from the building to avoid any possibility of water accumulation in accordance with the NZBC requirements.

2.4 SURFACE CLEARANCES

The clearance between the bottom edge of cladding and paved/ unpaved ground must comply with section 9.1.3 of E2/AS1. The finished floor level must also comply with these requirements. These clearances must be maintained throughout the life of the building.

Linea Weatherboards must overhang the bottom plate on a concrete slab by a minimum of 50mm as required by the NZBC Acceptable Solution, E2/AS1 Table 18.

On the roofs and decks the minimum clearance must be 50mm.

Do not install external cladding such that it may remain in contact with water or ground.

2.5 MOISTURE MANAGEMENT

It is the responsibility of the specifier to identify moisture related risks associated with any particular building design.

Wall construction design must effectively manage moisture, considering both the interior and exterior environments of the building, particularly in buildings that have a higher risk of wind driven rain penetration or that are artificially heated or cooled. Walls shall include those provisions as required by the NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1 'External Moisture'. In addition, all wall openings, penetrations, junctions, connections, window sills, heads and jambs must incorporate appropriate flashings for waterproofing. The other materials, components and installation methods used to manage moisture in the walls, must comply with the requirements of relevant standards and the NZBC. For information in relation to designing for weathertightness, refer to BRANZ and the Ministry of Business Innovation & Employment (MBIE) updates on the following websites, respectively www. branz.co.nz and www.dbh.govt.nz.

2.6 STRUCTURE

Timber framing must comply with NZS 3604 for buildings or parts of buildings within the scope limitations of NZS 3604. Buildings or parts of buildings outside the scope of NZS 3604 must be to a specific engineering design in accordance with NZS 3603 and AS/NZS 1170. Where specific engineering design is required. the framing stiffness must be equivalent to or more than the framing provisions of NZS 3604. In all cases stud spacing must not exceed 600mm centres maximum for buildings designed to NZS 3604 and 400mm centres maximum for specific engineering design buildings subject to design wind pressures higher than 1.5kPa.

For timber frame walls longer than 12m, it is best practice to allow for construction joints to accommodate movements generated due to timber shrinkage or deflection etc.

2.7 WIND LOADING

Linea Weatherboard cladding is suitable for use in all wind zones as defined in NZS 3604. It is also suitable for use in SED buildings exposed to wind pressures up to 2.5kPa (ULS).

For wind pressures higher than those mentioned above, contact James Hardie at 0800 808 868 for assistance.

2.8 STRUCTURAL BRACING

Linea Weatherboard direct fixed installed as per Linea Weatherboard specific bracing details will provide bracing for buildings designed and constructed in accordance with NZS 3604. The Linea Weatherboard bracing systems have been independently tested by SCION using direct fixed construction. The following range of bracings can be achieved

- Wind 75 130 BU'S/m
- Earthquake 67 101 BU'S/m.

Refer to the James Hardie Bracing Design Manual for details.

2.9 FIRE RATED WALLS

Walls clad with Linea Weatherboard using a direct fix or cavity construction method can achieve fire ratings of up to 90/90/90 when constructed in accordance with the James Hardie 'Fire and Acoustic' Design Manual. Linea Weatherboard must be face fixed for Fire Rated applications.

Refer to Fire and Acoustic Design Manual for further information about fire rated systems.

2.10 ENERGY EFFICIENCY

External walls constructed as per this technical specification, using Linea Weatherboard and bulk insulation, where the area of glazing is 30% or less of the total wall area, complies with the minimum R-value requirements for walls as per the NZBC Acceptable Solution H1/AS1 (The NZBC Clause H1 Energy Efficiency), Replacement Table 1. To meet the minimum thermal insulation requirements for the construction, the bulk insulation as specified in Table 1 must be used. This insulation may be substituted with insulation material having higher R-values. Thermal insulation of a wall is affected when the depth of the timber framing is increased or decreased or stud spacing is decreased. The calculation used in Table 1 is based on a timber framing size 90 x 45mm and an internal lining material such as James Hardie Villaboard® Lining or a 10mm plasterboard.

Total construction R-Value depends on the insulation material used and the framing ratio. The insulation material R-Values specified in this table are for stude spaced at 600mm c/c and nogs spaced at 800mm c/c.

To achieve higher construction R-Values the wall insulation material must be replaced with an insulation material having higher R-Values to suit the requirements.

For further guidance on insulation requirement refer to current edition of 'House Insulation Guide' published by BRANZ.

3 Framing

3.1 GENERAL

This Linea Weatherboard technical specification is only suitable for timber-framed buildings. Other framing materials are outside the scope of this specification.

For Steel Framing refer to James Hardie Claddings Installation to Steel Framing Technical Supplement.

3.2 TIMBER GRADE

Timber must be graded in accordance with NZS 3631 'New Zealand Timber Grading Rules'. The timber grade to be used must be in accordance with NZS 3604 requirements.

3.3 DURABILITY

To comply with the NZBC requirements the external framing must be treated to a minimum H1.2 treatment. Refer to the NZBC Acceptable Solution B2/AS1 Durability for further information about the durability requirements. For timber treatment information refer to NZS 3602 (Timber and Wood-Based Products for use in Buildings) and NZS 3640 (Chemical Preservation of Round and Sawn Timber) for minimum timber treatment selection and treatment requirements. Also refer to framing manufacturer's literature for further guidance on timber selection.

Framing must be protected from moisture at sites in accordance with the recommendations of framing manufacturers.

Note: refer to NZS 3602 for information about the allowable moisture content in timber.

3.4 FRAME CONSTRUCTION

For buildings within the scope of NZS 3604 the framing sizes and set-out must comply with NZS 3604 with stud, nog/dwang centres as required by this specification.

In case of gable end trusses sitting on top plates of the external wall frame, the frame size must be in accordance with truss design and specification supplied by the frame and truss manufacturer/supplier supported by independent design producer statement.

3.4.1 Direct fixed construction method

The following framing must be provided for direct fixed construction method:

- Studs must be provided at 600mm centres maximum.
- Nogs must be provided at 1200mm centres maximum.
- Double studs are required at internal corners.
- · Extra packers may be required at external corners.
- Extra studs are required for aluminium internal corner sections.

3.4.2 Cavity construction method

The following framing must be provided for cavity construction method:

- When studs are at 600mm centres the nogs must be provided at 800mm centres maximum,
- When studs are at 400mm centres the nogs may be provided at 1200mm centres maximum.
- · Double studs are required at internal corners.
- · Extra packers may be required at external corners.
- Extra studs are required for aluminium internal corner sections.

3.4.3 Specific Engineering Design (SED)

For EH wind zone and specific engineering design projects the timber framing is required to be designed in accordance with NZS 3603 and AS/NZS 1170. The minimum framing sizes and layout must comply with this specification.

- · Stud spacing 400mm centres maximum
- · Nog spacing 1200mm centres maximum
- · Other requirements as per 3.5.2 above

3.5 TOLERANCES

In order to achieve an acceptable wall finish, it is imperative that framing is straight and true. Framing tolerances must comply with the requirements of NZS 3604 and the manufacturer's specifications. All framing must be made flush.

4 Preparation

4.1 FLEXIBLE UNDERLAY OR HOMERAB PRE-CLADDING

Flexible underlay must be provided as per the requirements of the NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1 'External Moisture' Table 23. The flexible underlay must be fixed in accordance with E2/AS1 and the underlay manufacturer's recommendations. Walls which are not lined on the inside face (e.g. garage walls or gable ends) must include a rigid sheathing or an air barrier behind the cladding which complies with the requirements of the NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1 Table 23. For attached garages, flexible underlays must be selected in accordance with the NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.1.3.4. HomeRAB Pre-Cladding is suitable for use in these applications. It must be installed in accordance with James Hardie Rigid Air Barriers installation manual.

4.2 RIGID AIR BARRIER

For EH wind zone or Specific Engineering Design (SED) projects where the design wind pressures are between 1.5kPa (ULS) and 2.5kPa (ULS), RAB Board (6mm) must be used. Refer to James Hardie Rigid Air Barriers installation manual for information regarding its installation.

4.3 FLASHING

All wall openings, penetrations, intersections, connections, window sills, heads and jambs must be flashed prior to weatherboard installation. Please refer to moisture management requirements in Clause 2.5. The flexible underlay must be appropriately incorporated with penetration and junction flashings. Materials must be lapped in such a way that water tracks down to the exterior on the face of flexible underlay. The selected flashing materials must comply with the durability requirements of Table 20 of the NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1.

4.4 VENT STRIP

The James Hardie uPVC cavity vent strip must be installed at the bottom of all walls constructed using the drained and ventilated cavity construction method. James Hardie uPVC vent strip has an opening area of 1000mm2/m length. It is important that the openings in the vent strip are kept clear and unobstructed to allow free drainage and ventilation of cavities.

4.5 CAVITY BATTENS

Buildings with a risk score of 13-20 calculated in accordance with the NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1 Table 3 require Linea Weatherboards to be installed on a cavity.

The cavity battens provide airspace between the frame and cladding and are considered a "packer" only in this specification.

The timber battens must be minimum H3.1 treated in accordance with NZS 3640 (Chemical Preservation of Round and Sawn Timber) to comply with the durability requirements of B2/AS1.

Cavity battens must comply with E2/AS1 and:

- . be minimum 18mm thick.
- · be minimum as wide as the width of studs.
- must be fixed by the cladding fixings to the main framing through the flexible underlay.
- · fix cavity battens to stude at maximum 600mm centres,
- until claddings are fixed the battens need only to be tacked to framing with 40 x 2.8mm nails at 800mm centres maximum.

(Batten fixing is required temporarily to keep them straight on the wall during construction.)

4.6 INTERMEDIATE SUPPORT

Where study are at 600mm centres an intermediate means of restraining the flexible underlay and insulation from bulging into the cavity must be installed. An acceptable method to achieve this is using one of the following:

- · intermediate cavity batten between the studs; or
- · 75mm galvanised mesh; or
- polypropylene tape at 300mm centres fixed horizontally and drawn taut.

No intermediate supports are required:

- · where studs are at maximum 400mm centres; or,
- · when rigid sheathings instead of flexible underlays are used.

4.7 CORNERS

Anticipated joist shrinkage must be allowed for in the design process. Do not run trims or aluminium extrusions continuously across solid floor joists. There are a number of options to select from when detalling external corners:

- 90° corner soaker in aluminium, copper or stainless steel.
 Refer to Figures 7 and 33.
- 135° corner soaker 180mm aluminium, contact James Hardie
- Box corners using Axent Trim. Refer to Figures 3, 4 and 30.
- · Mitred corners to weatherboards, Refer to Figures 5 and 31,
- Aluminium boxed corners. Refer to Figures 6 and 32.

There are a number of options to select from when detailing internal corners:

- · Scribed corner. Refer to Figures 8 and 34.
- 90° or 135° Aluminium W-mould, Refer to Figures 9, 10, 35 and 36,

4.8 JUNCTIONS AND PENETRATIONS

Refer to Clause 2.5 of this specification for moisture management requirements. All windows and doors must be detailed as per the requirements of this specification. James Hardie has developed the window details for Linea Weatherboards which meet the performance requirements of E2 'External Moisture', an approved document of the NZBC. Refer to Figures 11 to 22 and 38 to 51.

5 Fixing Linea Weatherboard

5.1 GENERAL

The horizontal lap of Linea Weatherboards must be 30mm minimum. In certain scenarios you may require to creep up the lap. This must not exceed 33mm. Linea Weatherboards must be kept dry whilst in storage prior to and during fixing. Cut ends which are exposed after installation or where sealant is applied to the boards such as slimline box corners, internal corners, mitred external corners etc, must be primed prior to installation. Dust and loose material must be removed before priming.

A minimum H3.1 treated timber cant strip must be provided to support the bottom board on the wall. Refer to Figure 1 and Figure 26.

5.2 FASTENER DURABILITY

Fasteners must meet the minimum durability requirements of the NZBC. NZS 3604 specifies the requirements for fixing's material to be used in relation to the exposure conditions and are summarised in Table 2.

Also refer to the NZBC Acceptable Solution 'E2/AS1' Table 20 and 21 for information regarding the selection of suitable fixing materials and their compatibility with other materials.

5.3 NAIL SIZE AND FIXING METHOD

Linea Weatherboards and Axent Trim must be fixed to timber with the types of nails specified in Tables 3 and 4, in accordance with the following requirements:

- Linea Weatherboard can either be face/exposed fixed or concealed fixed.
- Linea Weatherboard must be fixed into studs at maximum 600mm centres. Fixing centres to coincide with stud spacing. Refer to Figure 2 and 28.
- All concealed nails must be driven flush with the board surface.
- When concealed fixing Linea Weatherboards, nails must be driven under the lap of boards, except at all corners and vertical edges of openings where Linea Weatherboards must be face fixed. Refer to Figure 2 and Figure 29.
- Nails must be fixed 25mm from the end of the board when hand nailing. For gun nailing refer to Section 5.4.
- When using concealed fixing method, any gaps that may appear under the lap due to site conditions can be minimised by fixing a jolt head nail through the lap as per the exposed nailing method. Refer to Figure 2 and 29.
- When using concealed fixing method, Linea Weatherboard can also be tied together by face fixing through the lap using 32mm brad nails if desired.

 When face fixing Linea Weatherboard, the upper board must be pre-drilled before fixing with a jolt head nail.

5.4 GUN NAILING

Linea Weatherboard can also be gun-nailed with a D head or RounDrive nail when concealed fixing method is used.

- Gun-nailing must not be used when Linea Weatherboard is used for bracing.
- · Nails must be no closer than 50mm from the ends of boards when gun nailing is used - double studs will be required.
- · Be minimum length and gauge as per Table 3.
- · Be finished flush with surface of board.

6 Jointing

The ends of Linea Weatherboards are jointed off-stud by means of a tongue and groove joint. Tongue and groove joints may be located centrally between study but no closer than 100mm from the edge of a stud. The joints must be staggered by 600mm minimum. Flexible sealant must be applied in the tongue and groove joint at the time of installation.

Note: Protective coating of Linea Weatherboard and Axent Trim is required in order to meet the durability requirements of the NZBC.

7.1 PREPARATION AND PRIMING

The Linea Weatherboard and Axent Trim must be dry before painting. Punch and fill all exposed nails a maximum of 2mm below the surface. Fill the hole with an exterior grade builders fill, allow to cure and sand smooth ready for priming. Prime the filled holes in accordance with paint manufacturer's specifications.

It is not recommended to seal under the lap of weatherboards as It helps circulation of air behind the weatherboard cladding.

7.2 SEALANTS

All sealants must demonstrate the ability to meet the relevant requirements of the NZBC and hold a current BRANZ Appraisal. Application and use of sealants must comply with manufacturer's instructions. Sealants, if coated, must be compatible with the paint system.

7.3 PAINTING

All Linea Weatherboards are pre-primed on their face and bottom edge with a factory applied acrylic base coat.

Linea Weatherboard must be painted within 90 days of installation. There is no restriction on the LRV of paint to be applied on the Linea Weatherboard. All exposed faces, including the top edges under the sills and bottom edges of Linea. Weatherboard, Axent Trim and accessories must be finished with latex exterior paint system complying with any of parts 7, 8, 9, and 10 of AS 3730.

Dark coloured paints can be used on Linea Weatherboard and Trim. The dark colours in certain environments may fade over a period of time, Special paints/coatings are required in certain harsh environments.

Stainless steel soakers are generally left natural. For painting over stainless steel soakers, refer to paint manufacturer as special preparation and paints are required.

8 Storage and handling

Paint selection and the preparation required is dependant on paint chosen. Refer to the paint manufacturer for information before starting painting.

Linea Weatherboards and Axent Trim must be laid flat on a smooth level surface. To ensure optimum performance, store weatherboards under cover and keep dry prior to fixing. If the weatherboards should become wet, allow to dry thoroughly before fixing. Do not carry weatherboards on the flat, carry in the vertical position to avoid excessive bending.

9 Maintenance

The extent and nature of maintenance will depend on the geographical location and exposure of the building. It is the responsibility of the specifier to determine normal maintenance requirements to comply with The NZBC Acceptable Solution B2/AS1. As a guide, it is recommended that basic normal maintenance tasks shall include but not be limited to:

- Washing down exterior surfaces every 6-12 months*,
- Re-applying exterior protective finishes**,
- Maintaining the exterior envelope and connections including joints, penetrations, flashings and sealants,
- . Cleaning out gutters, blocked pipes and overflows as required,
- Pruning back vegetation close to or touching the building,
- The clearances between the bottom edge of Linea
 Weatherboard and the finished/unfinished ground must always be maintained.
- Stainless steel soakers used in extreme coastal conditions or in sea spray zones may show some signs of 'tea staining'. It is an aesthetic issue and to minimise staining soaker must be washed/polished frequently.

*Do not use a water blaster to wash down the cladding.

*In extreme coastal conditions or sea spray zones, wash every 3-4 months.

**Refer to your paint manufacturer for washing down and recoating requirements related to paint performance.

10 Product information

10.1 MANUFACTURING AND CLASSIFICATION

James Hardie New Zealand is an ISO 9001 Telarc certified manufacturer. Linea Weatherboard and Axent Trim are manufactured to meet the requirements of AS/NZS 2908.2: 2000 'Cellulose-Cement Products', Linea Weatherboard has a classification of Type A Category 3 in accordance with this Standard, Linea Weatherboard is an advanced lightweight cement composite building product incorporating James Hardie proprietary Scyon technology. The basic composition of product is Portland cement, ground sand, cellulose fibre and water.

Linea Weatherboard has a bevel back and tongue and groove at the ends for jointing. The bottom front edge of Linea Weatherboard is chamfered. The weatherboards are supplied pre-primed on their face and bottom edge with an acrylic primer.

Linea Weatherboards and Axent Trim are identified by the printing at regular intervals of the name Linea on the back face.

10.2 JAMES HARDIE TRIM

The Axent Trim, used for box corners, around windows and doors as well as special architectural features, is also made with the CLD technology and is supplied pre-primed with an acrylic primer.

10.3 DURABILITY

Linea Weatherboard and Axent Trim, when installed and maintained as per the technical specification, will meet the durability requirements for claddings as required in the NZBC Approved Document B2 'Durability'.

10.3.1 Resistance to moisture/rotting

Linea Weatherboard and Axent Trim have demonstrated resistance to permanent moisture-induced deterioration (rotting) and has passed the following tests in accordance with AS/NZS 2908,2:

- Water Permeability (Clause 6.2)
- Warm Water (Clause 6.4)
- · Heat Rain (Clause 6.5)
- Soak Dry (Clause 6.6).
- · Freeze-Thaw (Clause 8.2.3)

10.3.2 Control of External Fire Spread

Linea Weatherboard meets the requirements of Appendix C C7.1.1 and is classified as 'Non-Combustible Material' which is suitable for use as external wall cladding and complies with the requirements of Paragraph 5.4 of the NZBC Acceptable Solution C/AS1 and Paragraph 5.8.1 of Acceptable Solutions C/AS2 to C/AS6 of the NZBC.

10.3.3 Alpine regions

In regions subject to freeze/thaw conditions, Linea Weatherboard must not be in direct contact with snow or ice build up for extended periods, e.g. external walls in alpine regions subject to snow drifts over winter.

The Linea Weatherboard has been tested in accordance with AS/NZS 2908.2 Clause 8.2.3.

10.4 PRODUCT SIZES AND MASS

Available sizes of Linea Weatherboard and Axent Trim and its weight are given in Table 6.

10.5 SIZE AND WEIGHT

Linea Weatherboard is categorised as a Light Weight Wall Cladding as described in NZS 3604. Physical properties of Linea Weatherboard and Axent Trim are provided in Table 6.

11 Safe working practices

Working instructions

HardieBlade™ Saw Blade

The HardieBlade™ Saw Blade used with a dust-reducing saw connected to a HEPA vacuum is ideal for fast, clean cutting of James Hardie fibre cement products. A dust-reducing saw uses a dust deflector or a dust collector connected to a vacuum system. When sawing, clamp a straight-edge to the sheet as a guide and run the saw base plate along the straight edge when making the cut.

Hole-forming

For smooth clean cut circular holes:

Mark the centre of the hole on the sheet.

Pre-drill a pilot hole.

Using the pilot hole as a guide, cut the hole to the appropriate diameter with a hole saw fitted to a heavy duty electric drill.

For irregular holes:

Small rectangular or circular holes can be cut by drilling a series of small holes around the perimeter of the hole then tapping out the waste piece from the sheet face.



Tap carefully to avoid damage to sheets, ensuring that the sheet edges are properly supported.

Storage and handling

All James Hardie building products should be stored to avoid damage, with edges and corners of the sheets protected from chipping.

James Hardie building products must be installed in a dry state and be protected from rain during transport and storage. The product must be laid flat under cover on a smooth level surface clear of the ground to avoid exposure to water or moisture, etc.

Quality

James Hardie conducts stringent quality checks to ensure that any product manufactured falls within our quality spectrum. It is the responsibility of the builder to ensure that the product meets aesthetic requirements before installation. James Hardie will not be responsible for rectifying obvious aesthetic surface variations following installation.

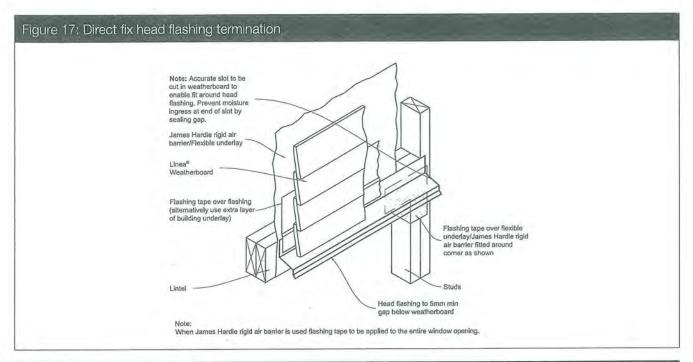


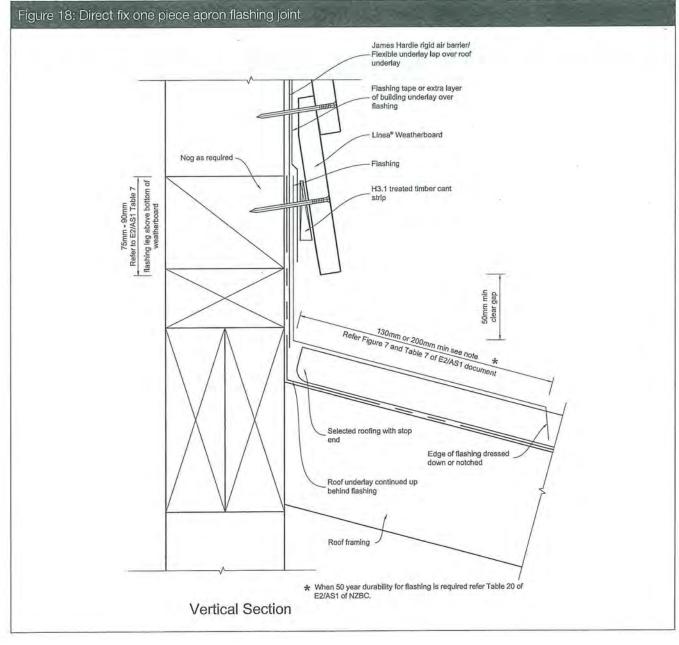


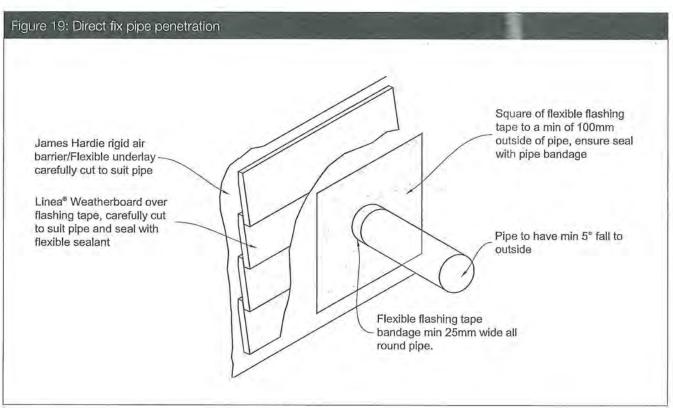


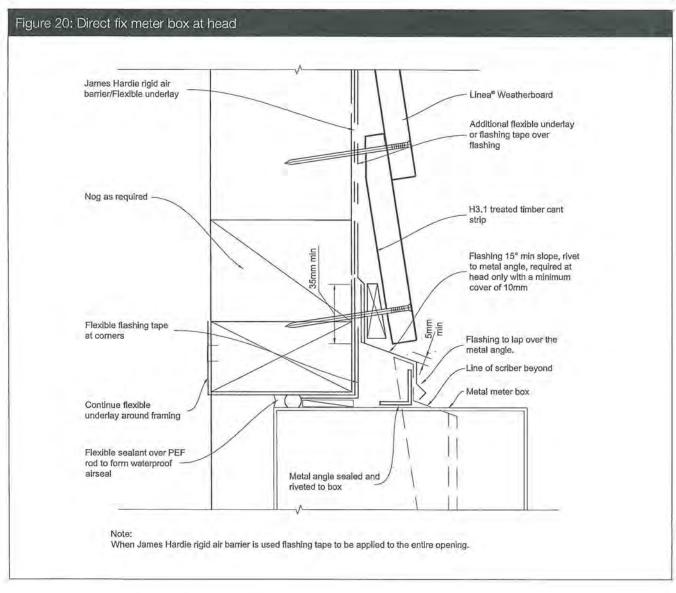


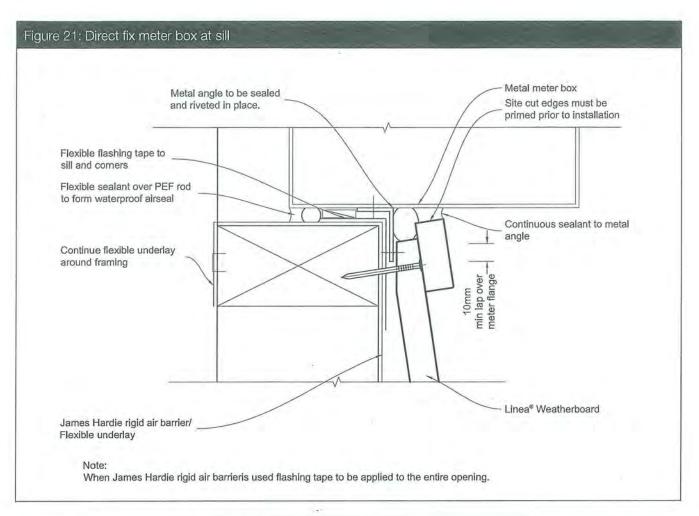


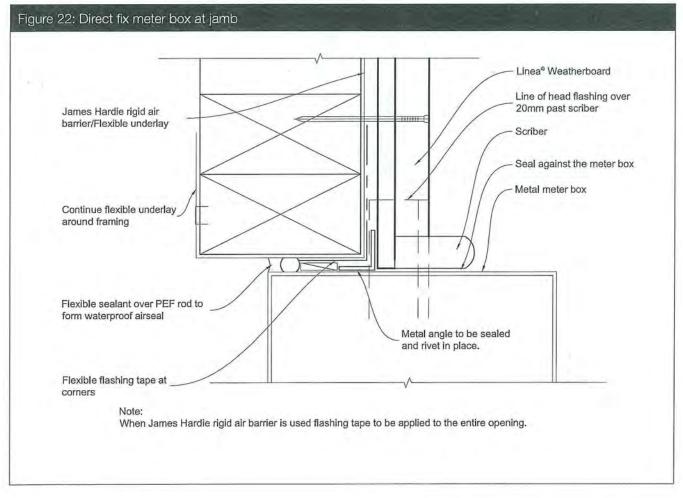


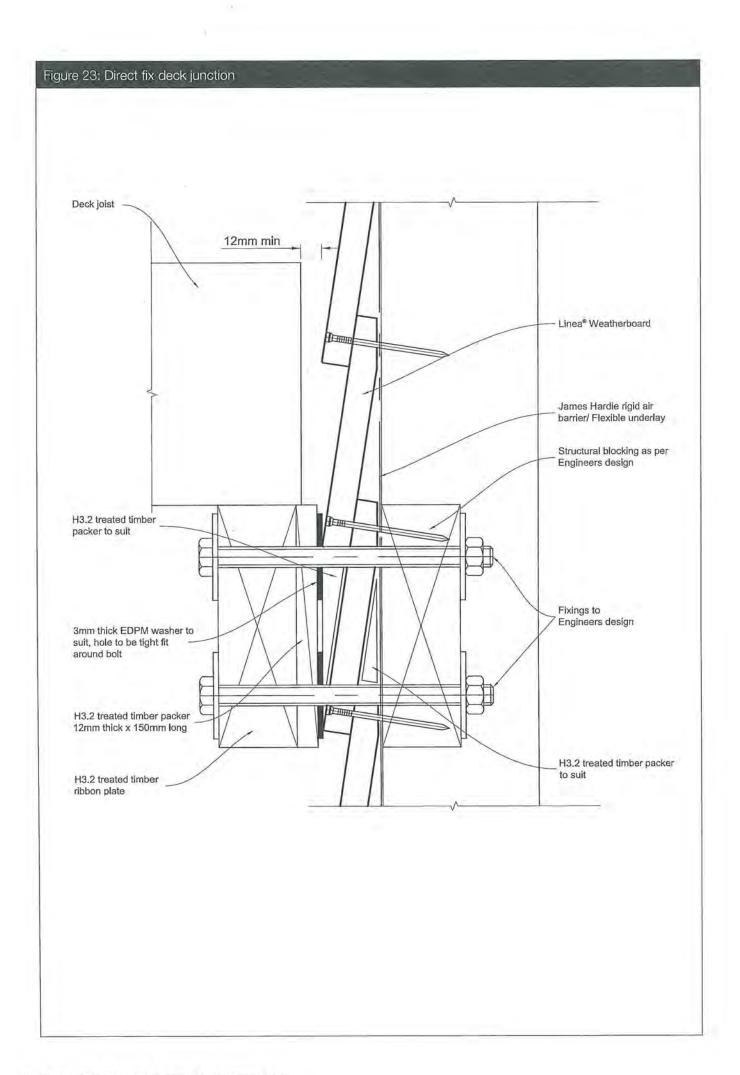


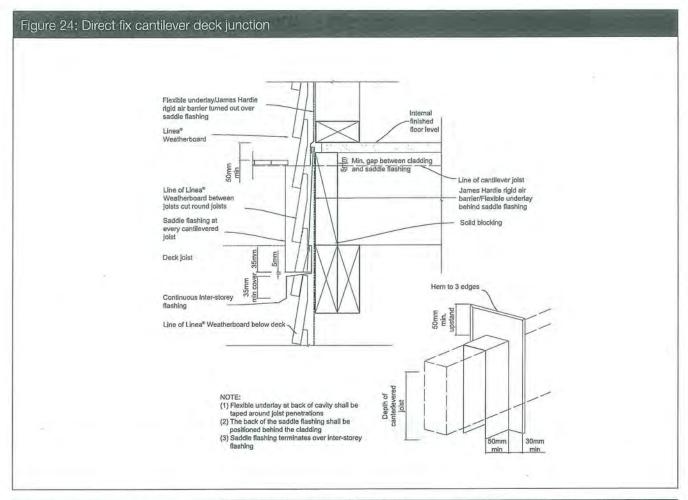


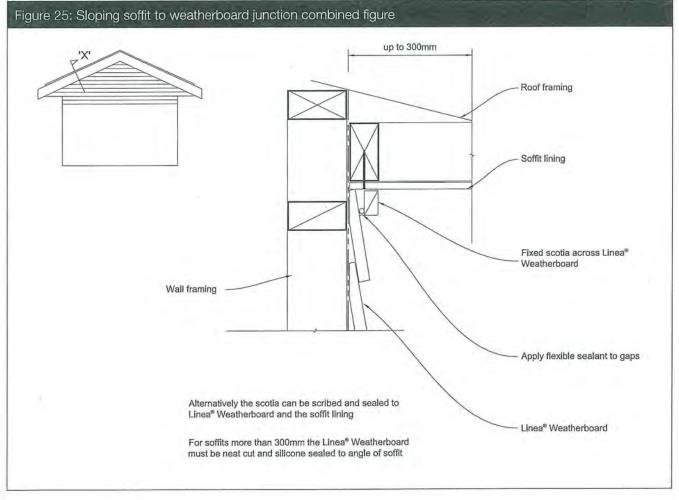


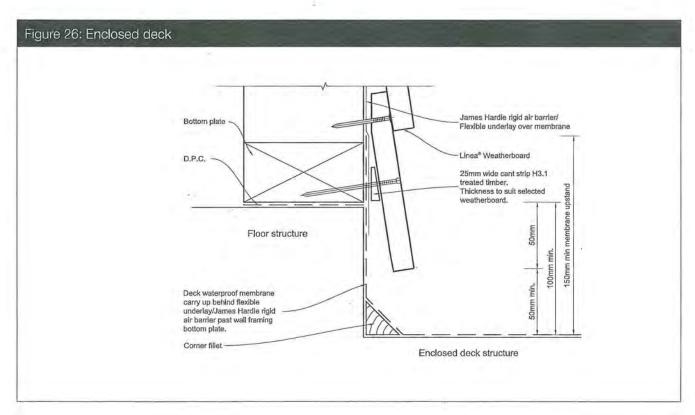


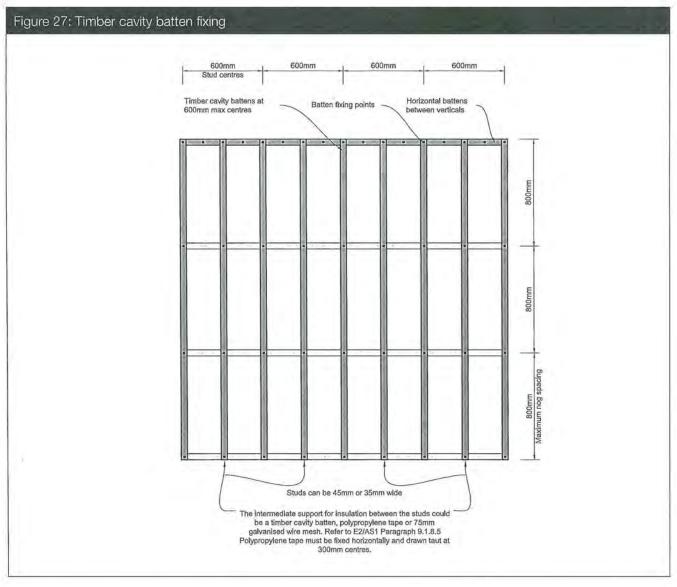


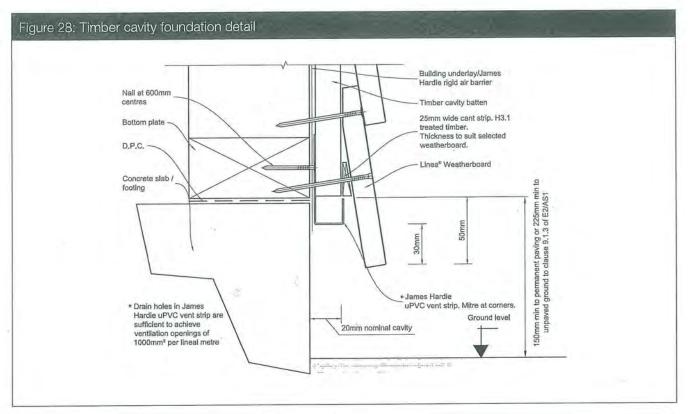


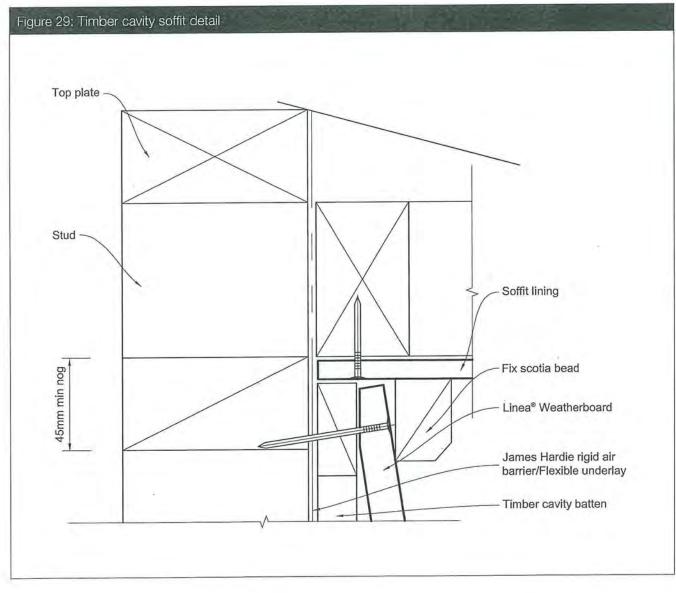


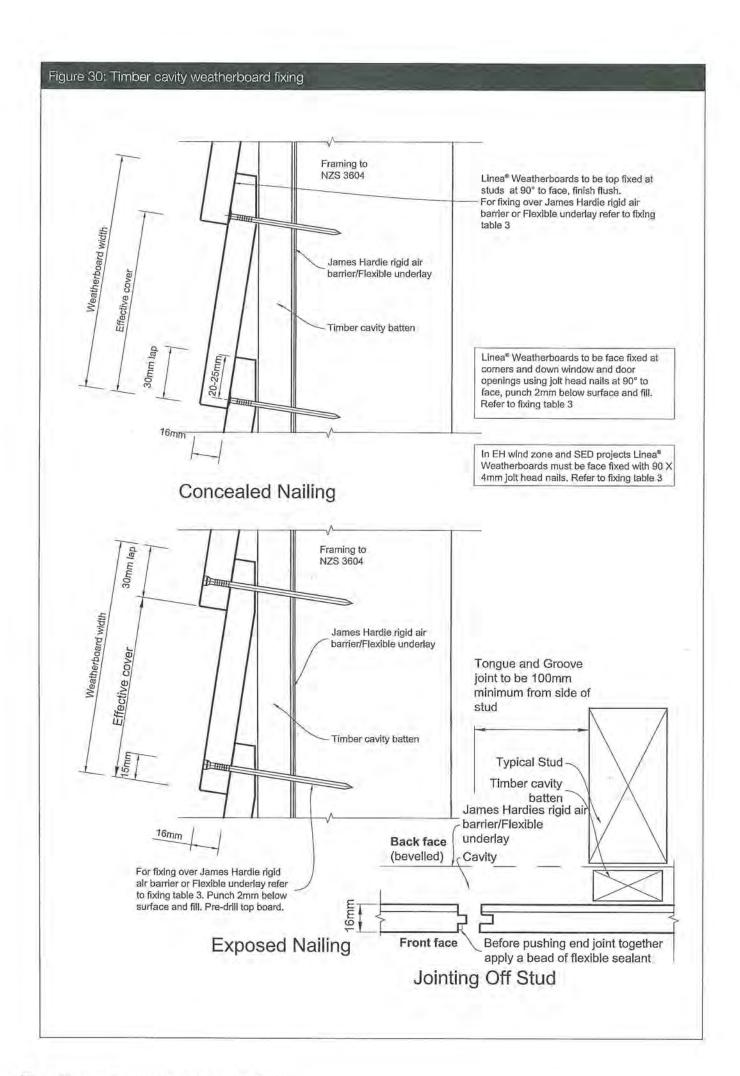


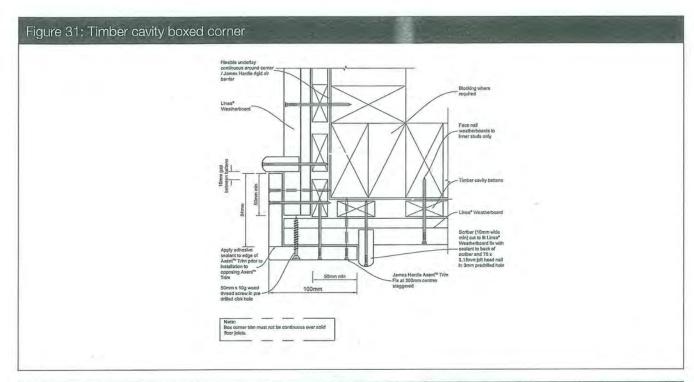


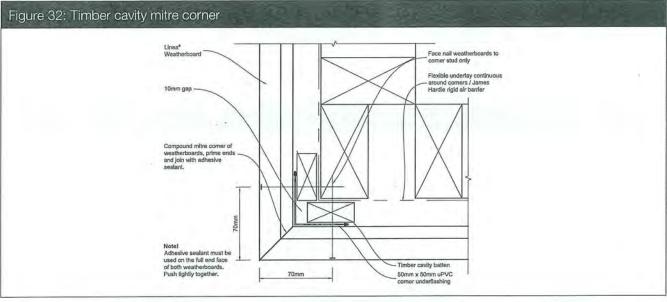


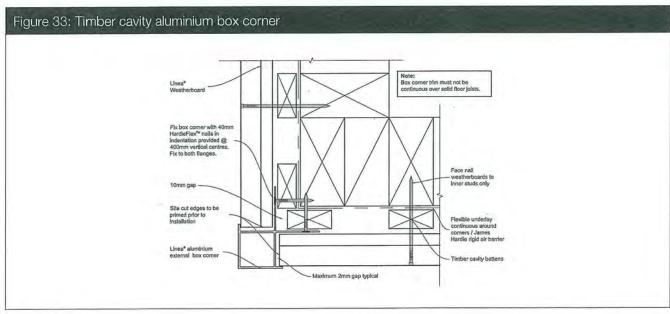


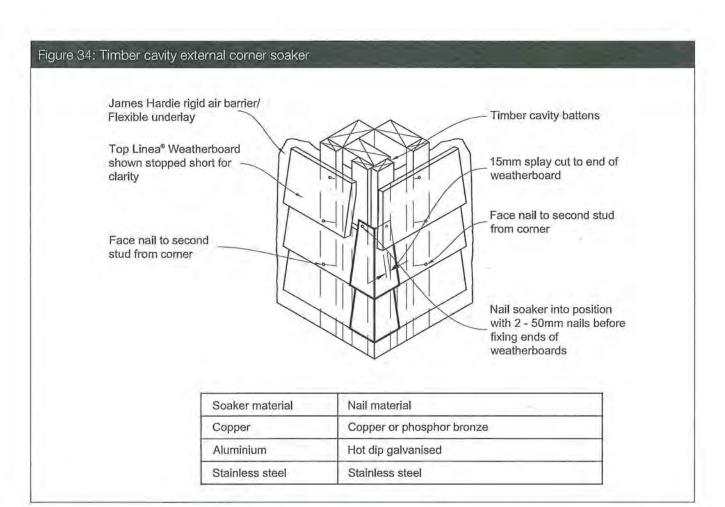


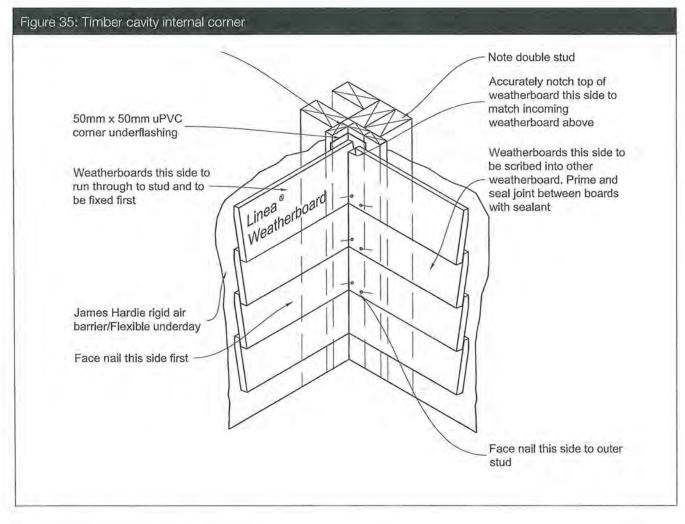


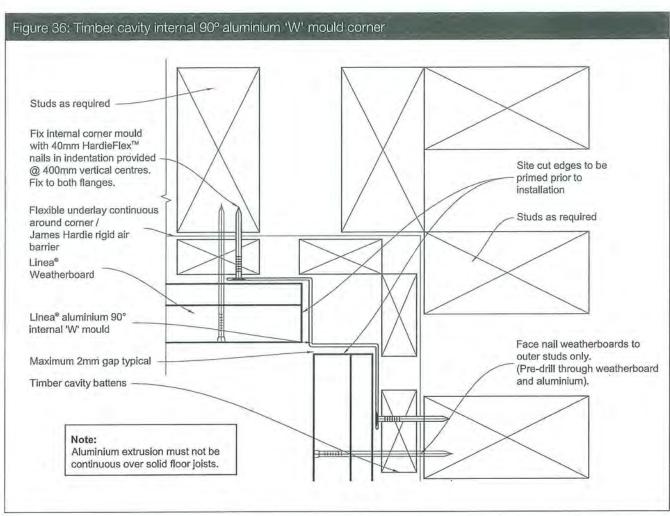


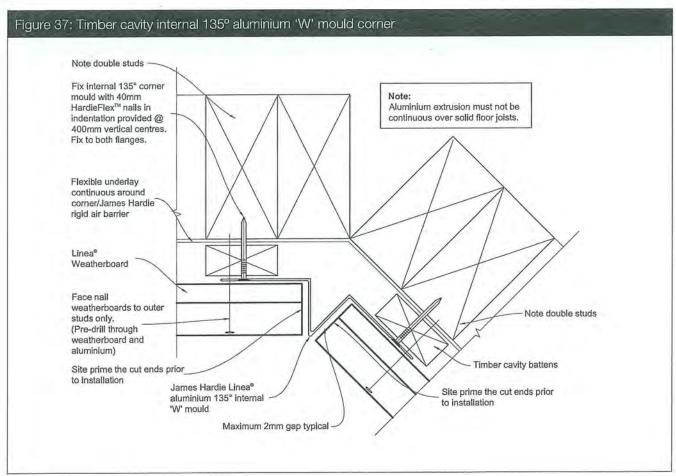














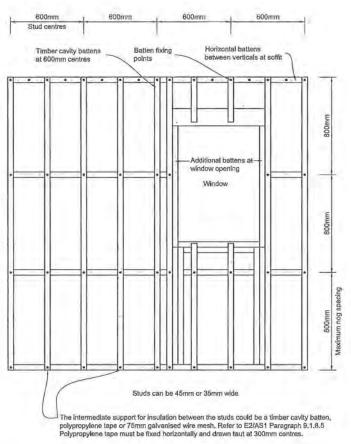
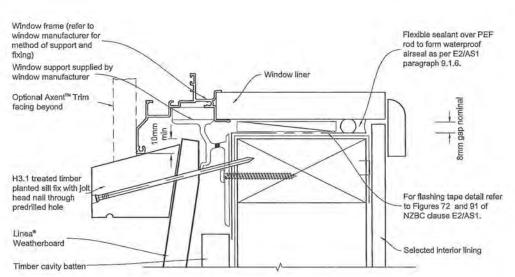
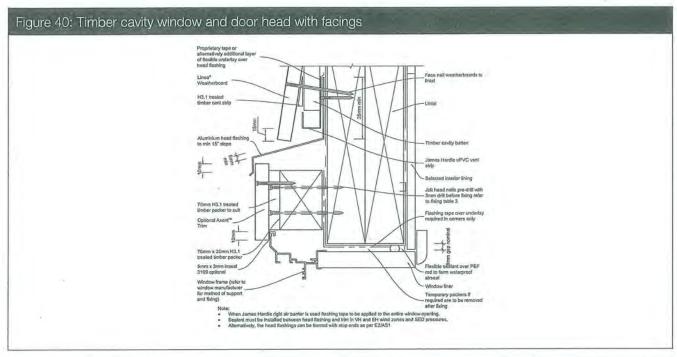


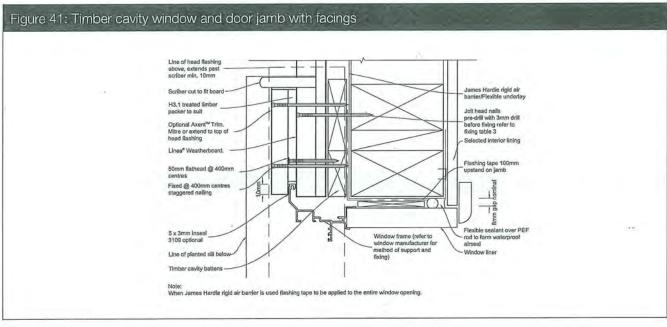
Figure 39: Timber cavity window sill with facings

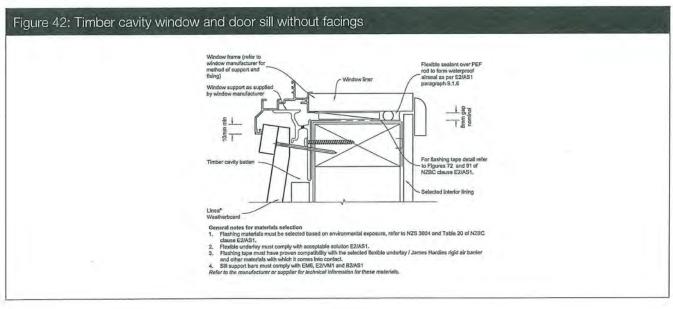


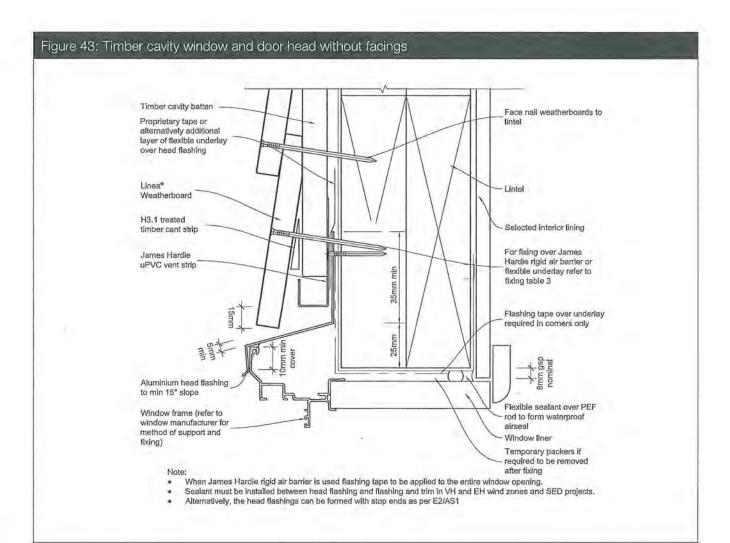

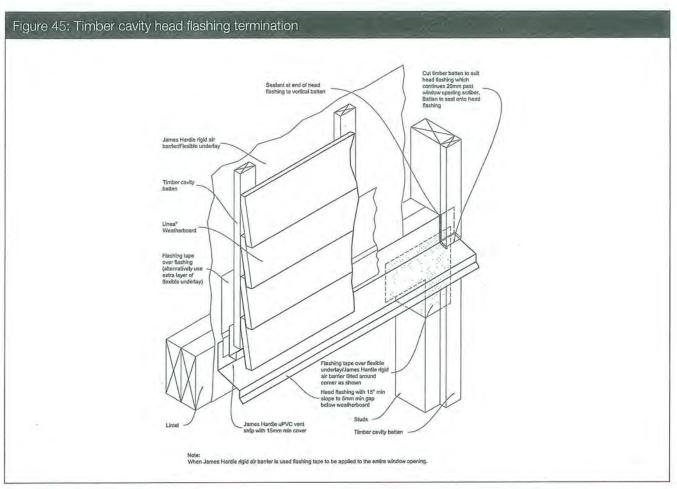


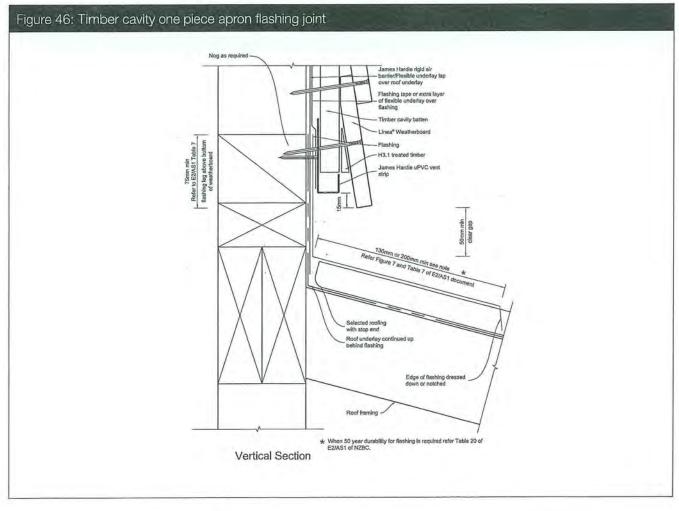


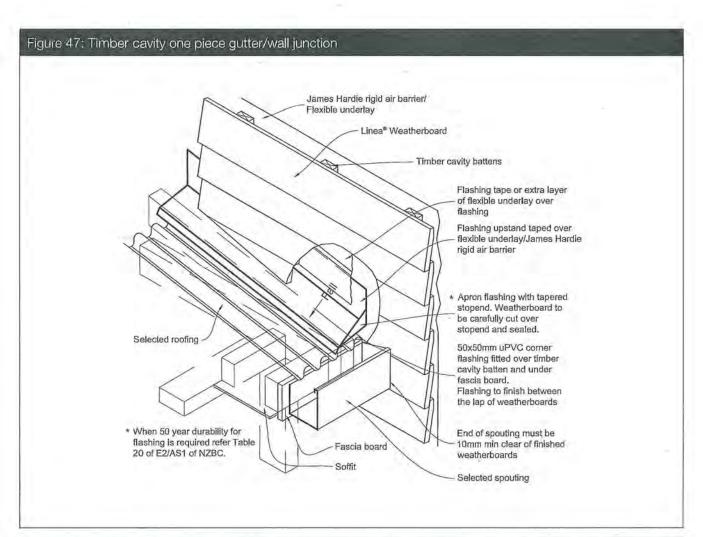


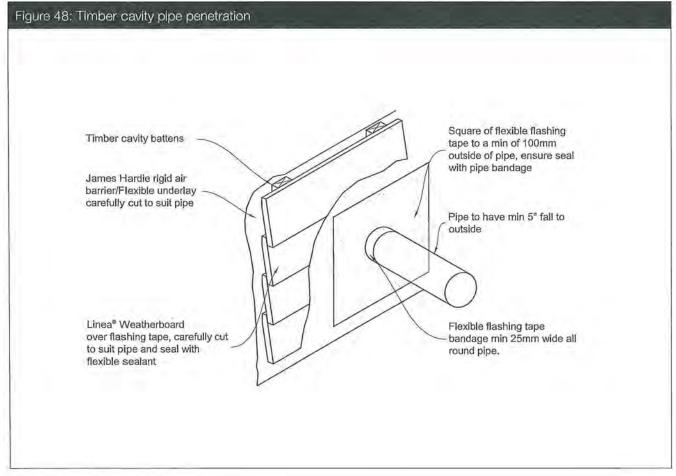


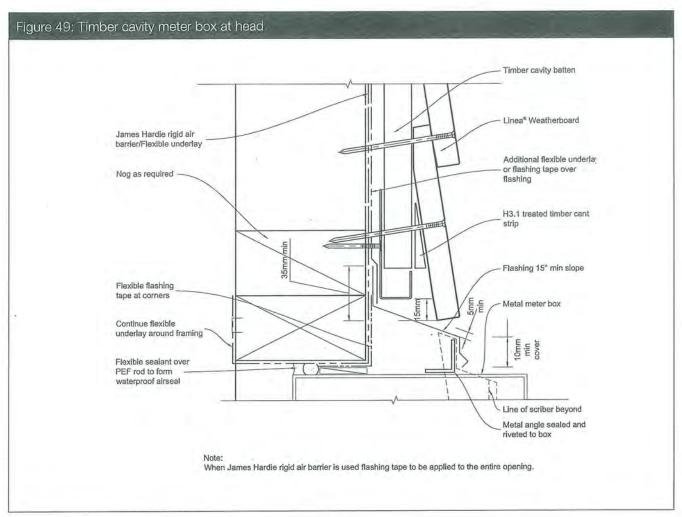


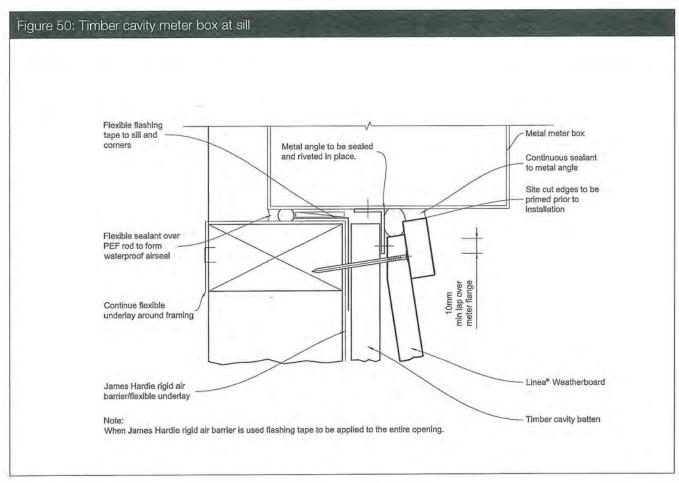


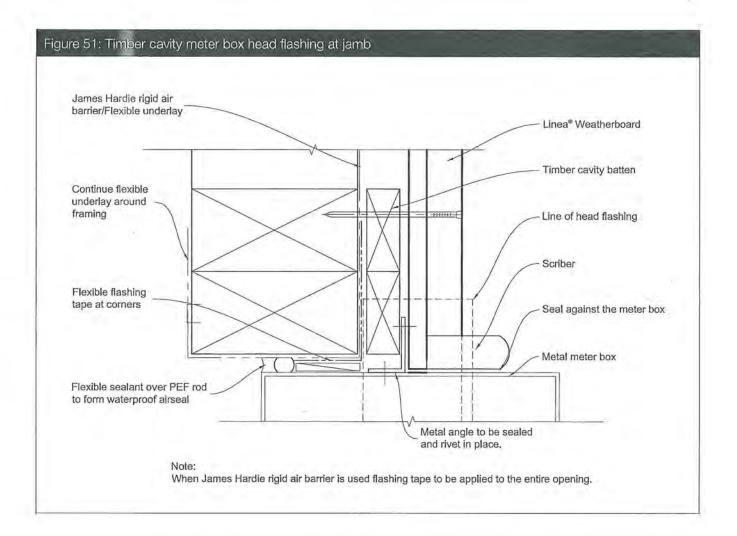


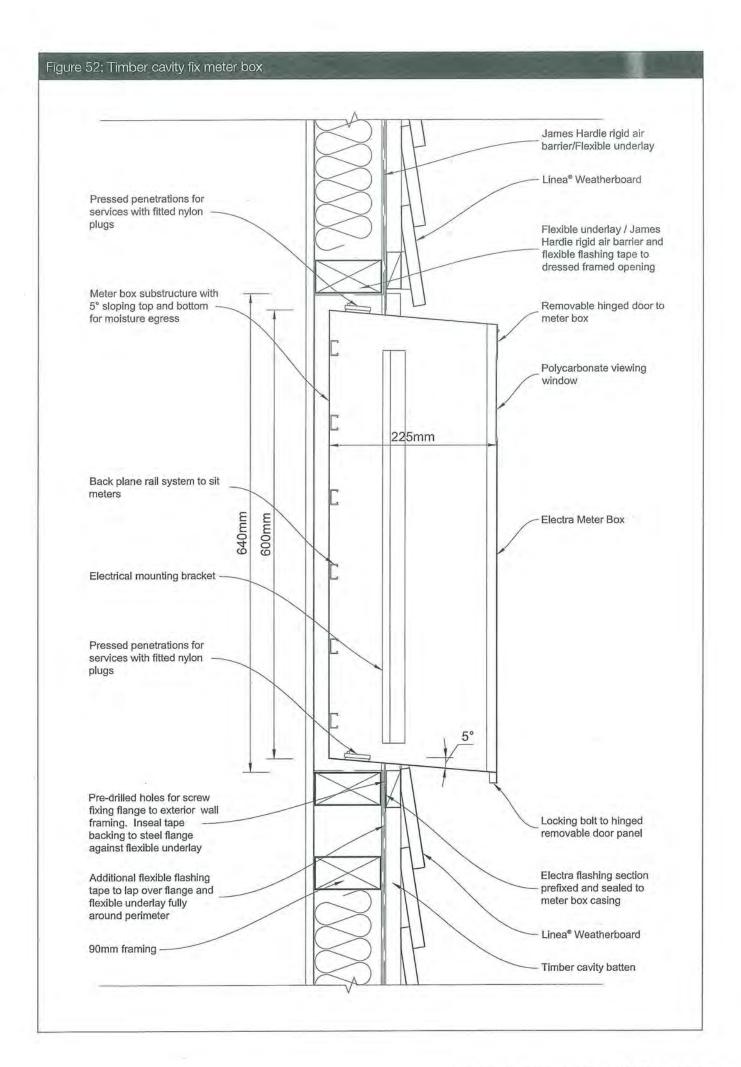


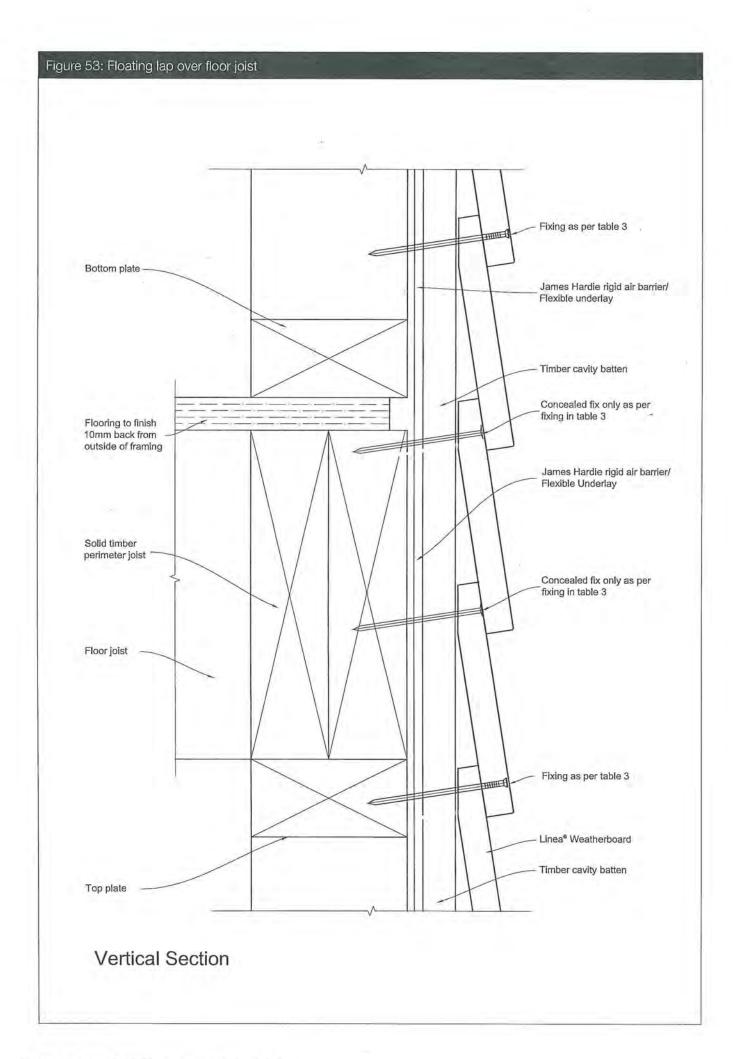


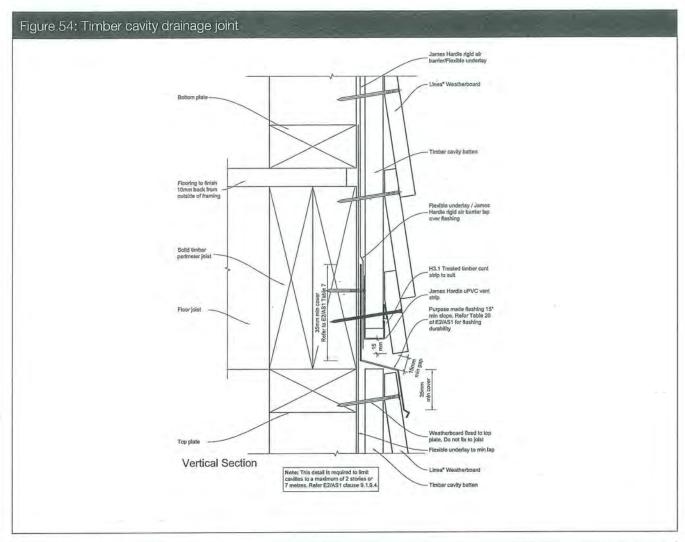












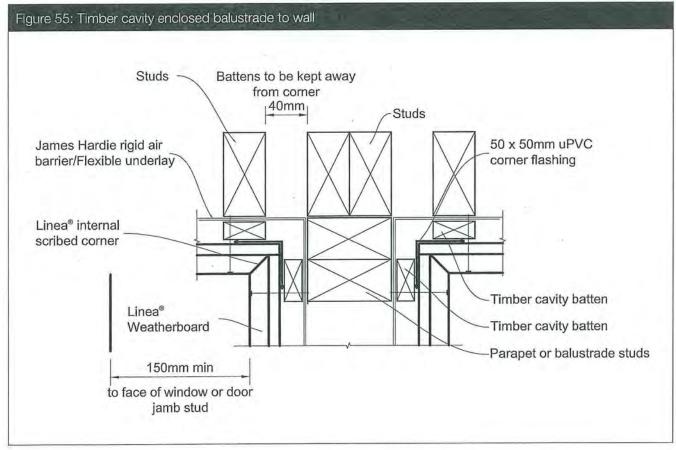
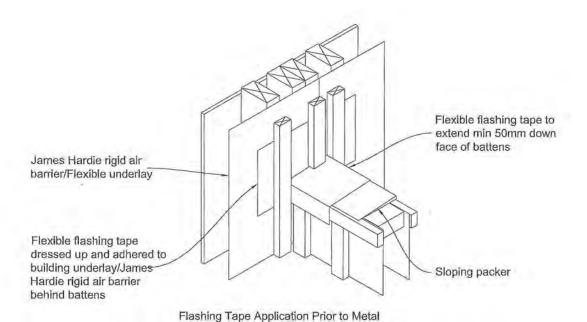
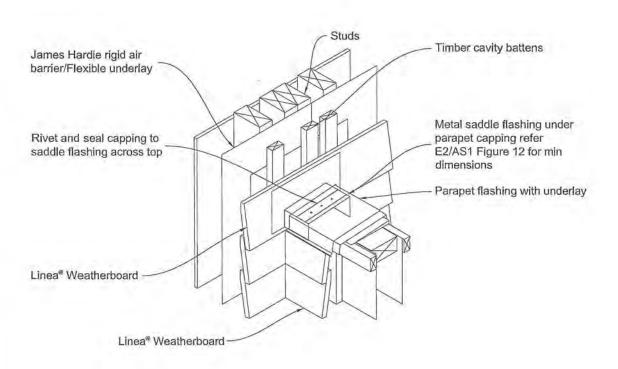
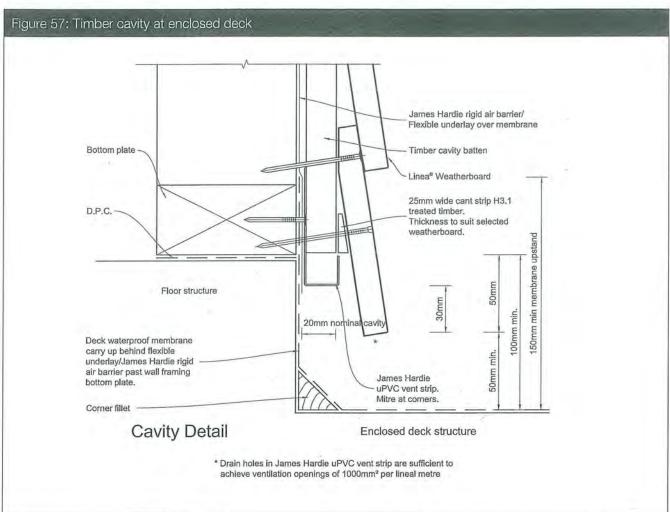


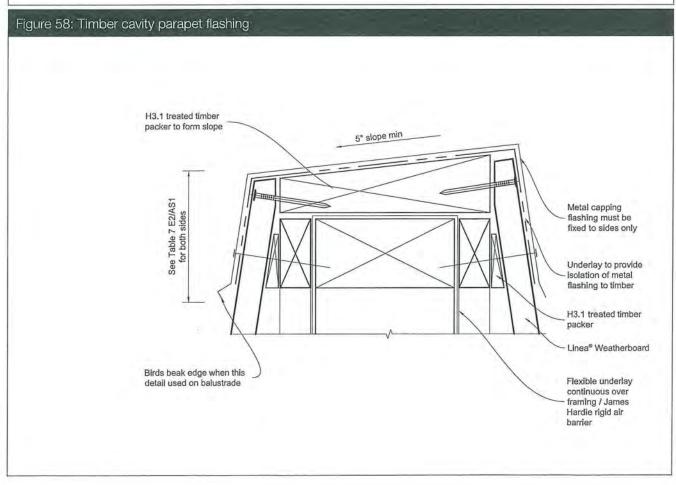
Figure 56: Timber cavity enclosed balustrade to wall

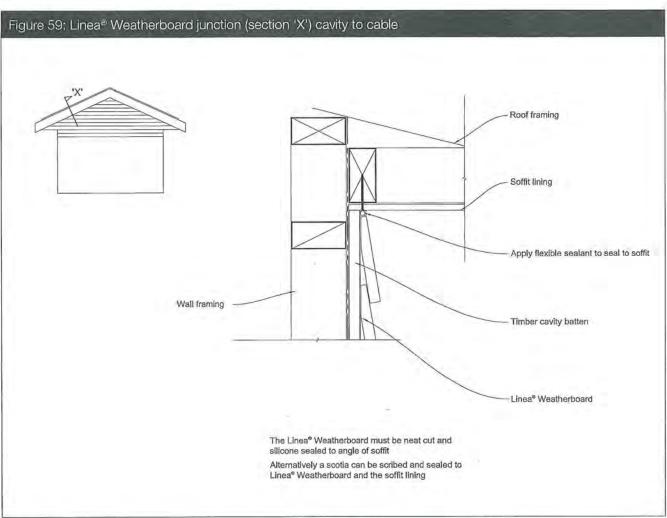


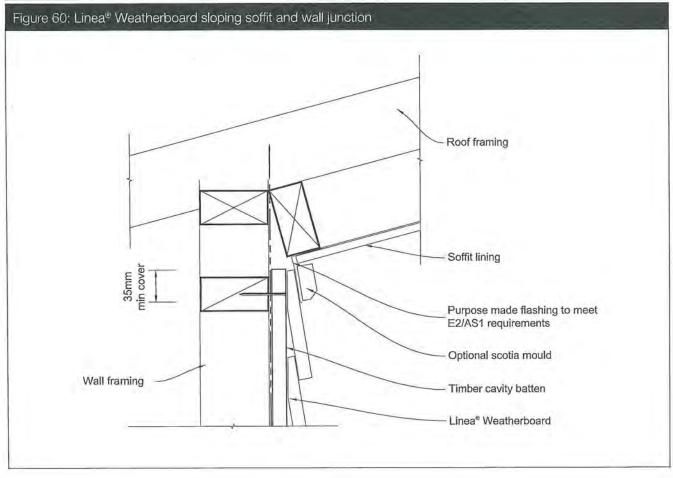

- Linea® Weatherboard to have sealed butt joint over batten at each corner of opening.

Warranty: James Hardie New Zealand ("James Hardie") warrants for a period of 25 years from the date of purchase that the Linea® Weatherboard (the "Product"), will be free from defects due to defective factory workmanship or materials and, subject to compliance with the conditions below, will be resistant to cracking, rotting, fire and damage from termite attacks to the extent set out in James Hardie's relevant published literature current at the time of installation. James Hardie warrants for a period of 15 years from the date of purchase that the Axent™ Trim and accessories supplied by James Hardie will be free from defects due to defective factory workmanship or materials.

Nothing in this document shall exclude or modify any legal rights a customer may have under the Consumer Guarantees Act or otherwise which cannot be excluded or modified at law.

CONDITIONS OF WARRANTY:

The warranty is strictly subject to the following conditions:

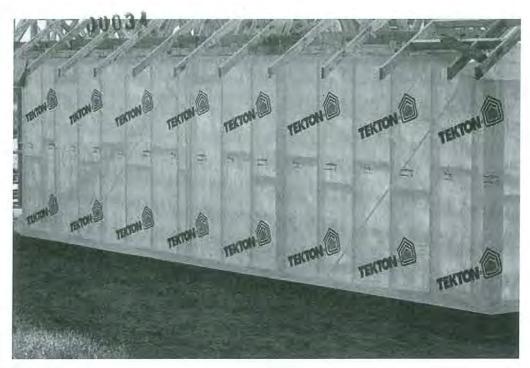

Product

1.1 Tekton® Building Wrap is a synthetic breather-type flexible wall underlay and air barrier for use under direct and non-direct fixed wall cladding on timber and steel framed buildings. The product is manufactured of a coated spun-bonded polypropylene.

Scope

- Tekton® Building Wrap has been appraised for use as a flexible wall underlay on timber framed buildings within the following scope:
 - the scope limitations of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 1.1 with regards to building height and floor plan area; and,
 - · with absorbent wall claddings directly fixed to framing; and,
 - with absorbent and non-absorbent wall claddings installed over an 18 mm minimum drained cavity; and,
 - with masonry veneer in accordance with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1; and,
 - · situated in NZS 3604 Wind Zones up to, and including Very High.
- 2.2 Tekton® Building Wrap has been appraised for use as a flexible wall underlay on steel framed buildings within the following scope:
 - the scope limitations of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 1.1 with regards to building height and floor plan area; and,
 - with absorbent and non-absorbent wall claddings installed over an 18 mm minimum drained cavity; and,
 - · with masonry veneer subject to specific design; and,
 - · situated in NZS 3604 Wind Zones up to, and including Very High.
- 2.3 Tekton® Building Wrap has been appraised for use as a flexible wall underlay over rigid wall underlays on timber and steel framed buildings within the following scope:
 - the scope limitations of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 1.1 with regards to building height and floor plan area; and,
 - with absorbent and non-absorbent wall claddings installed over an 18 mm minimum drained cavity; and,
 - with masonry veneer in accordance with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1 for timber framed buildings or specific design for steel framed buildings; and,
 - situated in NZS 3604 Wind Zones up to and including Extra High.
- 2.4 Tekton® Building Wrap has also been appraised for use on buildings subject to specific weathertightness design. Building designers are responsible for the building design and for the incorporation of Tekton® Building Wrap into their design in accordance with the declared properties and the instructions of Marshall Innovations Limited.

Building Regulations

New Zealand Building Code (NZBC)

3.1 In the opinion of BRANZ, Tekton® Building Wrap, if used, designed, installed and maintained in accordance with the statements and conditions of this Appraisal, will meet, or contribute to meeting the following provisions of the NZBC:

Clause B2 DURABILITY: Performance B2.3.1 [a], not less than 50 years, B2.3.1 [b], 15 years and B2.3.2. Tekton® Building Wrap meets these requirements. See Paragraphs 9.1 and 9.2.

Clause E2 EXTERNAL MOISTURE: Performance E2.3.2. When used as part of the cladding system, Tekton® Building Wrap will contribute to meeting this requirement. See Paragraphs 12.1 – 12.3.

Clause F2 HAZARDOUS BUILDING MATERIALS: Performance F2.3.1, Tekton® Building Wrap meets this requirement and will not present a health hazard to people.

3.2 This is an Appraisal of an Alternative Solution in terms of the New Zealand Building Code compliance.

Technical Specification

- 4.1 Tekton® Building Wrap is a 100 g/m² light grey sheet polypropylene membrane material approximately 0.6 mm thick.
- 4.2 The product is supplied in rolls 1.370 m x 74 m and 2.743 m x 37 m. The product is printed with the Tekton® logo repeated along the length of the roll. The rolls are wrapped with an instruction sticker.

Accessories

- 4.3 Accessories used with Tekton® Building Wrap which are supplied by the installer are:
 - Fixings staples, clouts, screws or proprietary wrap fixings, or other temporary fixings to attach
 the wall wrap to the framing.
 - Wall underlay support polypropylene strap, 75 mm galvanised mesh or galvanised wire, or vertical cavity battens where required to support the wall wrap in accordance with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.1.8.5.

Handling and Storage

5.1 Handling and storage of the product, whether on or off site, is under the control of the installer. The rolls must be protected from damage and weather. They must be stored on end, under cover, in clean, dry conditions and must not be crushed.

Technical Literature

Refer to the Appraisals listing on the BRANZ website for details of the current Technical Literature for Tekton® Building Wrap. The Technical Literature must be read in conjunction with this Appraisal. All aspects of design, use, installation and maintenance contained in the Technical Literature and within the scope of this Appraisal must be followed.

Design Information

Timber and Steel Framing

7.1 Studs must be provided at maximum 600 mm centres. Dwangs must be fitted flush between the studs at maximum 1200 mm centres.

General

7.2 Tekton® Building Wrap is intended for use as an alternative to conventional building papers which are fixed over timber and steel framed walls in order to limit the entry of wind into building cavities, and to act as a secondary barrier to wind-driven rain.



- 7.3 The material also provides a degree of temporary weather protection during early construction. However, the product will not make the building weathertight and some wetting of the underlying structure is always possible before the building is closed in. Hence, the building must be closed in and made weatherproof before moisture sensitive materials such as wall or ceiling linings and insulation materials are installed.
- 7.4 Tekton® Bullding Wrap must not be exposed to the weather or ultra violet light for a total of more than 60 days before being covered by the wall cladding.
- 7.5 Tekton® Building Wrap is suitable for use under wall claddings as a wall underlay as called up in NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Table 23, except that it must not be used with non-absorbent wall claddings such as vinyl or metal based sidings or weatherboards in direct fixed installations. Tekton® is suitable for use under cavity based wall claddings as a non-absorbent synthetic wall underlay as called up in NZS 2295, Table 2.4 on steel framed buildings. Refer to Table 1.
- 7.6 Tekton® Building Wrap is also suitable for use as an air barrier to walls that are not lined, such as attic spaces at gable ends, as called up in NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.1.4 [c]. Refer to Table 1.

Note 1: Further testing of Tekton® Building Wrap was completed to determine the effect of the high pH level on the wall underlay and materials it is likely to come into contact with during its serviceable life. The testing confirmed that the high pH had no adverse effects on the wall underlay performance, or the performance of other materials.

7.7 In cavity installations where the cavity battens are installed at greater than 450 mm centres, the wall underlay must be supported between the battens to prevent the wall underlay bulging into the cavity space when bulk insulation is installed in the wall frame cavity in accordance with the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.1.8.5.



Stucco Plaster

- 7.8 Tekton® Building Wrap is suitable for use as a non-rigid backing material for stucco plaster in accordance with the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.3.5.1. The wall underlay must be supported with 75 mm galvanised mesh or plastic tape or wire at 150 mm centres run across the cavity battens to limit deflection to a maximum of 5 mm in accordance with the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.3.5.2.
- 7.9 Tekton® Building Wrap may also be used as a slip layer over rigid backings for stucco plaster in accordance with the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.3.3 (b).

Structure

8.1 Tekton® Building Wrap is suitable for use in all Wind Zones of NZS 3604 up to, and including, Very High when used as a flexible building underlay, and all Wind Zones of NZS 3604 up to, and including, Extra High when used as an overlay for rigid building underlays.

Durability

9.1 Tekton® Building Wrap meets code compliance with NZBC Clause B2,3.1 [a], not less than 50 years for building wraps used where the cladding durability requirement or expected serviceable life is not less than 50 years, and code compliance with NZBC Clause B2.3.1 [b], 15 years for building wraps used where the cladding durability requirement is 15 years.

Serviceable Life

9.2 Provided it is not exposed to the weather or ultra-violet light for a total of more than 60 days, and provided the exterior cladding is maintained in accordance with the cladding manufacturer's instructions and the cladding remains weather resistant, Tekton® Building Wrap is expected to have a serviceable life equal to that of the cladding.

Control of Internal Fire and Smoke Spread

10.1 Tekton® Building Wrap has an AS 1530 Part 2 flammability index of not greater than 5 and therefore meets the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solutions C/AS2 to C/AS6, Paragraph 4.17.8 b], for the surface finish requirements of suspended flexible fabric used as an underlay to exterior cladding that is exposed to view in occupied spaces. It may therefore be used with no restrictions in all buildings.

Prevention of Fire Occurring

11.1 Separation or protection must be provided to Tekton® Building Wrap from heat sources such as fire places, heating appliances, flues and chimneys, Part 7 of NZBC Acceptable Solutions C/AS1 – C/AS6 and NZBC Verification Method C/VM1 provide methods for separation and protection of combustible materials from heat sources.

External Moisture

- 12.1 Tekton® Building Wrap must be used behind claddings that meet the requirements of the NZBC, e.g. such as those covered by NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, or claddings covered by a valid BRANZ Appraisal.
- 12.2 Tekton® Building Wrap, when installed in accordance with the Technical Literature and this Appraisal, will assist in the total cladding systems compliance with NZBC Clause E2.
- 12.3 When used as an air barrier, particular care must be taken to ensure an air tight barrier is achieved, and weather sealing at all openings and penetrations through the cladding meets the requirements of the NZBC.

Installation Information

Installation Skill Level Requirements

13.1 Installation must always be carried out in accordance with the Technical Literature and this Appraisal, by competent tradespersons with an understanding of wall wrap installation.

Wrap Installation

- 14.1 Tekton® Building Wrap must be fixed to all framing members at maximum 300 mm centres with hot-dip galvanised, large-head clouts 20 mm long, zinc plated 6-8 mm staples, self-drilling screws, or proprietary wrap fixings. The membrane must be pulled taut over the framing before fixing.
- 14.2 Tekton® Building Wrap must be run horizontally and must extend from the upper-side of the top plate to the under-side of the bearers or wall plates supporting ground floor joists, or below bottom plates on concrete slabs. Horizontal laps must be no less than 75 mm wide, with the direction of the lap ensuring that water is shed to the outer face of the membrane. End laps must be made over framing and be no less than 150 mm wide.
- 14.3 The wall underlay should be run over openings and these left covered until windows and doors are ready to be installed. Openings are formed in the membrane by cutting on a 45 degree diagonal from each corner of the penetration. The flaps of the cut membrane must be folded inside the opening and stapled to the penetration framing. Excess wall underlay may be cut off flush with the internal face of the wall frame.
- 14.4 Tekton® Building Wrap can be added as a second layer over head flashings in accordance with the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 9.1.10.3.
- 14.5 When fixing the product in windy conditions, care must be taken due to the large sail area created by wide roll widths.
- 14.6 Any damaged areas of Tekton® Building Wrap, such as tears, holes or gaps around service penetrations, must be repaired. Damaged areas can be repaired by covering with new material lapping the damaged area by at least 150 mm and taping, or by taping small tears.

Inspections

14.7 The Technical Literature must be referred to during the inspection of Tekton® Building Wrap installations.

Basis of Appraisal

The following is a summary of the technical investigations carried out:

Tests

- 15.1 The following tests have been carried out on Tekton® Building Wrap by Scion: Folding strength of paper in accordance with AS/NZS 1301.423; edge tear resistance and tensile strength in accordance with AS/NZS 4200.1 and air resistance in accordance with BS 6538-3.
- 15.2 The following tests have been carried out on Tekton® Building Wrap by BRANZ: Absorbency in accordance with AS/NZS 4201.6, Vapour transmission in accordance with ASTM E 96B, Shrinkage in accordance with AS/NZS 4201.3, Water barrier in accordance with AS/NZS 4201.4 and pH of extract in accordance with AS/NZS 1301.421. A range of these tests were completed before and after Tekton® Building Wrap was exposed to ultra-violet light.
- 15.3 The Flammability Index of Tekton® Building Wrap has been evaluated in accordance with AS 1530.2.

Other Investigations

- 16.1 A durability opinion was given by BRANZ technical experts.
- 16.2 Site inspections were carried out by BRANZ to assess methods used for the installation of Tekton® Building Wrap, and to examine completed installations.
- 16.3 The marketer's Technical Literature, including installation instructions, have been examined by BRANZ and found to be satisfactory.



Quality

- 17.1 The manufacture of Tekton® Building Wrap has not been examined by BRANZ, but details regarding the quality and composition of the materials used were obtained by BRANZ and found to be satisfactory. BRANZ has taken note of product certification by ICC-ES and CCMC covering quality aspects associated with the product.
- 17.2 The quality of supply to the market is the responsibility of Marshall Innovations Limited.
- 17.3 Building designers are responsible for the design of the building, and for the incorporation of the wall wrap into their design in accordance with the instructions of Marshall Innovations Limited.
- 17.4 Quality of installation is the responsibility of the installer in accordance with the instructions of Marshall Innovations Limited.

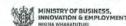

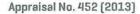

Product

1.1 Sika Boom® is a self-expanding polyurethane foam air seal used around window and door penetrations and other cladding fenestration trim cavities to assist with weathertightness and energy efficiency.

Scope

- 2.1 Sika Boom® has been appraised for use as an air seal around window and door penetrations and other cladding fenestration trim cavities in buildings within the following scope:
 - the scope limitations of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 1.1 with regard to building height and floor plan area; and,
 - · situated in NZS 3604 Wind Zones up to, and including Extra High.
- 2.2 Sika Boom® has also been appraised as an air seal with window and door joinery that is designed and manufactured in accordance with NZS 4211, situated in NZS 3604 Wind Zones up to, and including Extra High, and where the cladding is an Alternative Solution and/or the building is outside the scope limitations of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 1.1. The weathertightness design of the window and door joinery penetrations and other cladding fenestration trim cavities in these situations has not been assessed and is outside the scope of this Appraisal.

Building Regulations

New Zealand Building Code (NZBC)

3.1 In the opinion of BRANZ, Sika Boom® Air Seal, if designed, used, installed and maintained in accordance with the statements and conditions of this Appraisal, will meet or contribute to meeting the following provisions of the NZBC:

Clause B2 DURABILITY: Performance B2.3.1 (b), 15 years. Sika Boom® Air Seal meets this requirement. See Paragraphs 8.1 and 8.2.

Clause E2 EXTERNAL MOISTURE: Performance E2.3.2. When used as part of a cladding system, Sika Boom® Air Seal will contribute to meeting this requirement. See Paragraphs 10.1 – 10.4.

Clause F2 HAZARDOUS BUILDING MATERIALS: Performance F2.3.1, Sika Boom® Air Seal meets this requirement and will not present a health hazard to people.

- 3.2 This is an Appraisal of an Acceptable Solution in terms of New Zealand Building Code compliance as follows:
 - self-expanding foam air seal in accordance with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1 Paragraph 9.1.6.

- 3.3 This is an Appraisal of an Alternative Solution in terms of New Zealand Building Code compliance as follows:
 - assisting the weathertightness performance of the building envelope in accordance with Paragraph 2.2 of this Appraisal.

Technical Specification

4.1 Products and accessories supplied by Sika (NZ) Ltd are as follows:

Air Seal

Sika Boom® – a single component self expanding moisture cure polyurethane foam. Available
as Sika Boom® – G a 750 ml can fitted with an adaptor system for use with a one component
dispensing gun and Sika Boom in 250 ml, 500 ml, 750 ml Multi positional cans. [Note these can
be used in any position, the can does not have to be inverted to allow the foam to be propelled].

Accessories

- Sika Boom® Cleaner a solvent based cleaner for the dispensing gun.
- 4.2 Accessories supplied by the building contractor are as follows:
 - · One-component dispensing gun.
 - PEF backing rod a closed cell polyethylene foam (PEF) backing rod complying with ASTM C1330.

Handling and Storage

5.1 The handling and storage of Sika Boom® on site is the responsibility of the installer. Sika Boom® has a shelf life of 12 months if stored in unopened packaging under dry, cool conditions at temperatures between 5°C and 35°C. The product must be stored out of direct sunlight.

Technical Literature

- 6.1 Refer to the Appraisals listing on the BRANZ website for details of the current Technical Literature for Sika Boom®. The Technical Literature must be read in conjunction with this Appraisal. All aspects of design, use, installation and maintenance contained in the Technical Literature and within the scope of this Appraisal must be followed.
- 6.2 Some installation instructions are also printed on the can. The can label also contains uses outside the scope of this Appraisal.

Design Information

General

- 7.1 The use of air seals is critical to assist the weathertightness performance of window and door joinery installations at the trim cavities, and other wall penetrations. Air seals also assist energy efficiency by reducing heat loss through these cavities.
- 7.2 Sika Boom® is designed to be used as a gap-filling air seal around window and door trim cavities and wall penetrations, e.g. plumbing pipes. It is designed for use in interior locations, and along with its good gap-filling capacities it has excellent adhesion to most materials. Two exceptions are polyethylene or polypropylene. However, testing completed on window installations incorporating polyethylene building wraps and polyethylene backed flashing tapes has shown that any potential lack of adhesion between Sika Boom® and the polyethylene will not affect its performance as an air seal.
- 7.3 Sika Boom® is designed to prevent air leakage at the interior face of the window and door trim cavitles and wall penetrations. This prevention of air leakage assists in achieving the overall airtightness requirements of the trim cavity.
- 7.4 A PEF backing rod complying with ATSM C1330 must be used in all trim cavities and around wall penetrations to support the Sika Boom[®]. At the same time the backing rod prevents the trim cavity from being completely filled by restricting the depth of the air seal to a maximum of 45 mm.

7.5 Sika Boom® is not designed to overcome poor detailing and workmanship of window or door joinery installation. It is designed to be used in conjunction with flashing systems, not as a substitute.

Durability

8.1 Assessment of durability to meet the NZBC is based on difficulty of access and replacement of the air seal, and the ability to detect failure of the air seal both during normal use and maintenance of the building.

Serviceable Life

8.2 When air seals are installed using Sika Boom® in accordance with this Appraisal (i.e. in dry, interior environments where the product is inaccessible, and completely sheltered from exposure to sunlight, chemicals, solvents and temperature extremes), they will remain serviceable for at least 15 years.

Prevention of Fire Occurring

9.1 Separation or protection of the Sika Boom® from heat sources such as fire places, heating appliances, flues and chimneys must be provided. Part 7 of NZBC Acceptable Solutions C/AS1 - C/AS6 and NZBC Verification Method C/VM1 provide methods for separation and protection of combustible materials from heat sources.

External Moisture

- 10.1 Sika Boom® is a self-expanding polyurethane foam complying with the requirements of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1 Paragraph 9.1.6.
- 10.2 When installed over a PEF backing rod complying with ASTM C1330, window, door and other penetration openings in exterior walls incorporating Sika Boom® can minimise the risk of airflows carrying water into the building wall.
- 10.3 Sika Boom®, when installed in accordance with this Appraisal, will assist the total cladding system in complying with NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1.
- 10.4 Buildings outside the scope of NZBC Acceptable Solution E2/AS1, Paragraph 1.1 are the subject of specific weathertightness design. The designer must incorporate air seal details to meet their own requirements and the performance requirements of the NZBC. These details are outside the scope of this Appraisal.

Installation Information

Installation Skill Level Requirements

11.1 Installation of Sika Boom® must be completed by competent tradespersons with an understanding of air seal installation, in accordance with the instructions given in the Technical Literature and this Appraisal.

General

- 12.1 Before the installation of Sika Boom®, the installer must refer to the contract documentation, E2/AS1 and the cladding system manufacturer's Technical Literature for guidance on the installation requirements of air seals in their system.
- 12.2 Substrate surfaces must be clean and free from any surface contaminants such as dust or grease that may cause loss of adhesion. Window and door joinery or wall penetrations must have been installed and firmly secured in place.
- 12.3 Substrate surfaces should be moistened with a mist of water before the installation of Sika Boom®. The moisture assists by accelerating the curing of the air seal and creating a more homogeneous cell structure.
- 12.4 After installation of the PEF backing rod, Sika Boom® must be extruded into the gap between the window or door reveal liner or wall penetration and the timber frame or building wrap at the internal face of the cavity using the dispensing gun. Once extruded, it will expand to fill the gap and form a continuous air seal.

- 12.5 Sika Boom® that has spilled but not cured can be removed with Sika Boom® Cleaner.
- 12.6 Sika Boom® that has cured can be trimmed with a sharp knife.

Health and Safety

13.1 Safe use and handling procedures for Sika Boom® are provided on the can. Extra care must be taken when using the product in areas where there is insufficient ventilation, and suitable respiratory equipment must therefore be worn. Additional information on the product is available in the Material Safety Data Sheet available from Sika (NZ) Ltd.

Basis of Appraisal

The following is a summary of the technical investigations carried out:

Tests

- 14.1 A BRANZ ad-hoc test was completed to confirm the suitability of Sika Boom® for use as an air seal. The test results were reviewed by BRANZ experts and found to be satisfactory.
- 14.2 Cyclic and static pressure water leakage tests in accordance with AS/NZS 4284 were carried out by BRANZ on typical window installations to assess the practicability of expanding foam air seals.

Other Investigations

- 15.1 The practicability of installation was assessed by BRANZ and found to be satisfactory.
- 15.2 A Material Safety Data Sheet for Sika Boom® has been reviewed by BRANZ and found to be satisfactory.
- 15.3 A durability opinion has been given by BRANZ technical experts for Sika Boom® when used as an air seal.

Quality

- 16.1 The manufacture of the product has not been examined by BRANZ, but details of the quality and composition of the materials used were obtained and found to be satisfactory. The manufacturer is an ISO 9001:2008 Certified manufacturer.
- 16.2 The quality of supply of the product to the market is the responsibility of Sika [NZ] Ltd.
- 16.3 The quality of installation of the product on site is the responsibility of the installer.
- 16.4 Building designers are responsible for the design of the building, and for the incorporation of the air seal into their design in accordance with the instructions of Sika [NZ] Ltd.

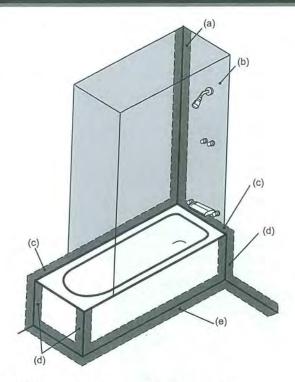
Preferred Method

- Use a bond breaker to create a "coved" corner detail either Abelrod, 50mm bond breaker tape or Davsil silicone sealant.
- b) Application of primer.
- c) The Australian Standard (AS 3740 Waterproofing of Wet Areas within Residential Buildings) calls for the membrane to be applied under the screed to receive tiles, but it is recommended that the membrane be applied over the screed laid to falls.
- d) Sand Cement Screed to ensure that a minimum of 1:80 fall to the waste is created. This equates to a 12.5mm fall over 1m. Note: A slurry coat of Davelastic mixed 1:1 with neat cement should be used to improve the adhesion of the screed if being applied over the membrane.
- e) Application of Tile Adhesive.
- f) Application of Grout.
- g) Use a flexible sealant either Davsil or Colorcaulk in all wall/floor and wall/wall joins.
- h) Ceramic Tiles
- Drain Flange ensure application of membrane is turned down into the drain flange.



1.2 Shower Recess Detailing

- AS 3740 calls for the membrane to be applied up the wall to 1800mm or to the height of the shower rose, out to a width of 150mm.
- However, it is recommended that the entire wall is coated with the membrane, up to the height of the shower rose.
- Apply the membrane over the entire floor area.
- d) If enclosed by a shower screen, apply the membrane up over the hob, and at least 150mm beyond the outside edge of the hob. If unenclosed, apply the membrane up over the hob, and out to a 1500mm radius from the shower rose.
- Apply the membrane to the base of the wall, at least 150mm above the height of the hob.

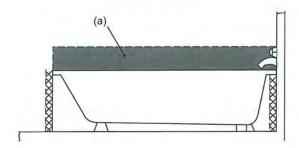

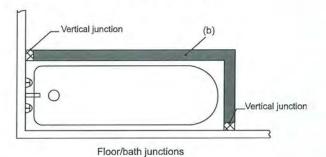

- However, it is recommended that the entire wall is coated with the membrane, up to the height of the shower rose.
- Apply the membrane 150mm wide at the base of the bath wall sheet.
- Apply the membrane 150mm wide over the vertical corners of the bath.
- Apply the membrane 150mm wide along the bath/floor joint. If the bath is enclosed with a shower screen, this will be sufficient. If the bath is unenclosed, continue applying the membrane over the floor, out to a 1500mm radius from the shower rose.



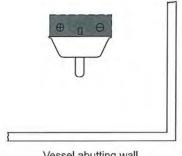

- b) Apply the membrane 150mm wide along the bath/floor joint.

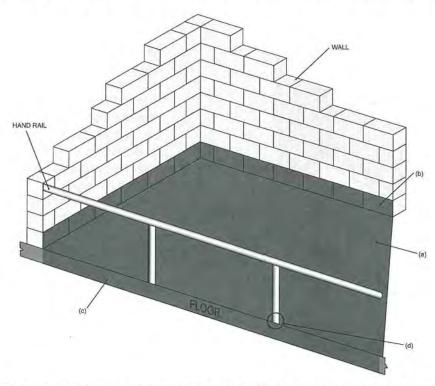

2. Waterproofing, Roofs Decks and Balconies



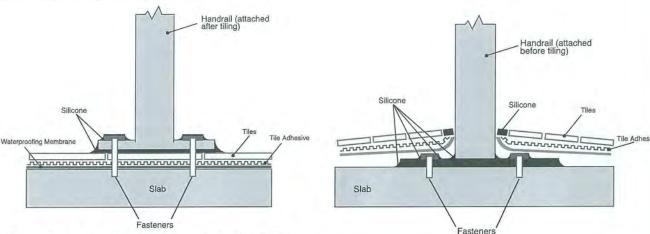
- a) Ensure the deck is constructed with falls to the edge or to the drains which are a minimum 1:100 (ie10mm over 1m)*. If this has not been built into the floor, it will require a cement/sand screed be used to achieve this fall. Apply the membrane over the entire balcony floor, or over the screed if one has been applied.
- b) Apply the membrane up the wall at least 100mm, or to the first course of bricks.
- c) Apply the membrane over the front edge of the balcony and the underside of that front edge (if structurally possible).
- Ensure all gaps around handrail penetrations are carefully sealed, prior to covering with the membrane (Refer to Section 2.2.1).
- * As necessary, treat any cracks or joints per instructions in Section 5.

2.1 Metal Roofs

- a) Ensure the metal surface is thoroughly cleaned and dry.
- Any rust needs to be removed with a wire brush or grinder. Treat with rust treatment as required.
- c) Fill any holes with Duraseal Putty (Refer to Section 4.2 for detailed hole repair).
- d) Allow to cure for 24 hours.
- e) Coat with two coats of Brushable Duraseal allowing it to cure for at least 7 days at 20°C before overcoating with Silvershield.
- f) Coat with Silvershield allowing to dry for 24 hours at 20°C.

2.2 Rail/Pipe Penetration Details

2.2.1 Hand Rail Penetration



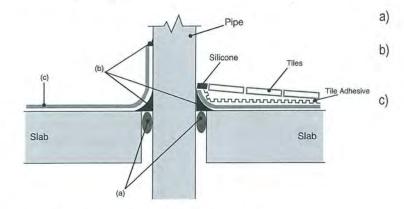
For a situation where the handrail is attached after tiling:

- a) Ensure the handrail and the fastening bolts are applied over one full tile.
- b) Apply Davsil silicone sealant around the perimeter of the base plate, the sides of the base plate and over the head of the fastening bolts, to ensure it is fully sealed.

For a situation where the handrail is attached prior to tiling:

- a) The membrane is turned up the penetration to the point where the tiling will finish.
- b) The tiles & grout would be applied.
- c) Davsil silicone sealant used to seal the gap between the tiles and the penetration.

2.2.2 Pipe Penetration



If required, use Abelrod backer rod to fill gap between slab and pipe. Apply Davsil (silicone sealant) over joint to form a corner cove, and to top of the membrane to finally seal it. Apply membrane after use of appropriate primer over concrete slab, (and suitable primer over the pipe penetration). Membrane should be turned up the pipe 100mm.

For a situation where the balcony is to be tiled:

- d) The membrane is turned up the penetration to the point where the tiling will finish.
- e) The tiles and grout would be applied.
- f) Davsil Silicone sealant used to seal the gap between the tiles and the penetration.

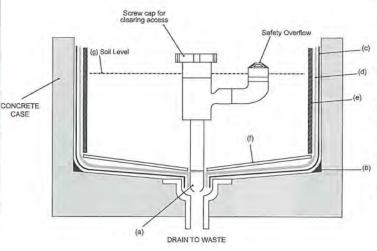

3. Planter Boxes

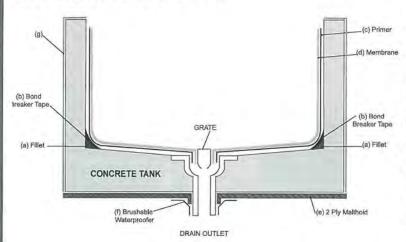


- a) Grate to stop roots going down drain waste.
- b) Davsil (silicone) or Sodaflex 603 as bond breaker in corners, allow to cure.
- * Treat any cracks as per instructions in Section 5.
- c) Prime with suitable primer.
- d) Apply the membrane over the entire surface.
- e) Fibre cement protection board to stop root damage to the membrane.
- f) Drainage cell recommended that this be wrapped in geo-filter fabric, to protect the membrane from root damage, and aid in drainage of moisture to the outlet.
- g) Soil level should be 100mm below the membrane.

NOTE: The suitability of plants to be installed should be considered, as certain rooting systems are aggressive and may penetrate the membrane.

4. Water Tanks/Ponds

4.1 Concrete Tanks (Potable)



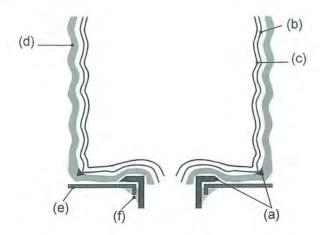
Surface Preparation

Ensure the tank is emptied and dried. If required, use a suitable biocide to remove any signs of biological growth/contamination, then allow to dry. Treat any cracks, joints as per instructions in Section 5. Ensure all sharp protrusions are removed/treated prior to application. All laitance must be removed by mechanical means. The tank needs to be thoroughly dried before starting work.

- (a) Apply a fillet into the corners using a 4:1 sand:cement screed, gauged with diluted Davelastic (mixed 1 part Davelastic to 3 parts water). Allow 24 hours to set.
- (b) Apply a bond breaker tape (eg, Duct tape), over the fillet, extending 20mm either side of fillet.
- (c) Apply primer coat over the entire tank surface. Allow to dry.
- (d) Apply 2 coats of membrane, allowing suitable drying/airing in between coats. Allow the final coat to dry for a minimum of 10 days, and then wash the membrane and allow it to dry thoroughly, at least twice, before filling.
- (e) To prevent water ingress from beneath the tank, it is recommended to sit the tank on a bed of Malthoid.
- (f) Apply a coat of Brushable Waterproofer to seal Malthoid to drain outlet and make base watertight.
- (g) It is also suggested the exterior of the tank be coated with Duraflex, a suitable exterior coating membrane system, to prevent water ingress.

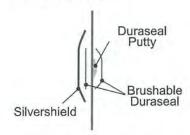

4.2 Metal Tanks (Potable)



Surface Preparation

Detailed Hole Repair



- Abrade surface with wire brush to remove any signs of rust.
- · Treat with rust treatment as required.
- Fill hole with Duraseal Putty. Allow to cure 24 hours.
- Coat inside and out with Brushable Duraseal coating 100mm radius from hole.
- Coat any Brushable Duraseal on the exterior of the tank which will be exposed to UV light with Silvershield.

General Surface Repair

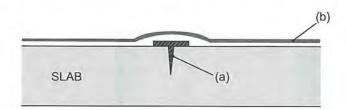
- Ensure the tank is emptied, thoroughly cleaned and dry.
- Use a suitable biocide to remove any sign of biological growth/contamination, then allow to dry.
- Use a wire brush or grinder to remove any signs of rust and treat holes as mentioned above. Use a suitable rust treatment method as required to treat rust spots.
- Coat the treated area coating 100mm radius from the edge of the treated area with Brushable Duraseal.
- (a) Apply Duraseal Putty as bond breaker onto corner, and against inside flange of drain outlet.
- (b) Prime entire inside using Bitumen Paint. Allow to dry 24 hours.
- (c) Coat tank with 2 coats Brushable Duraseal, allowing 24 hours drying between coatings. Allow the final coat to dry for a minimum of 10 days, and then wash the membrane and allow it to dry thoroughly, at least twice, before filling.
- (d) Apply a coating of Silvershield over the entire outside of the tank, should it require overcoating, or wherever any of the bitumen products are exposed to UV light.
- (e) To protect the base of the tank from moisture, it is recommended to sit the tank on a bed of Malthoid.
- (f) Apply a coat of Brushable Duraseal to seal the Malthoid to the drain outlet and make the base watertight.

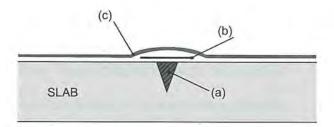
5. Treatment of Expansion Joints and Cracks

5.1 Non Structural Cracks (NOT Subject to Movement) < 0.5mm



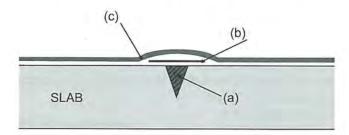
- a) Fill the crack with the membrane and apply a 50mm wide band of membrane over the length of the crack and allow to dry.
- b) Apply membrane to remainder of area, after use of suitable primer.

5.2 Non Structural Cracks (NOT Subject to Movement) > 0.5mm



- a) Route out the joint to form a 'V' shaped groove with a hand or power chisel, to a depth and width of approximately 25mm. Dampen the chiselled out crack with clean water and whilst still damp, fill the joint with Lanko 731 repair mortar or Duragrout. Finish flush with the concrete surface and allow 24 hours to cure.
- b) Apply a 100mm band of membrane over the filled crack and allow to dry.
- c) Apply the membrane to the remainder of the area after use of suitable primer.

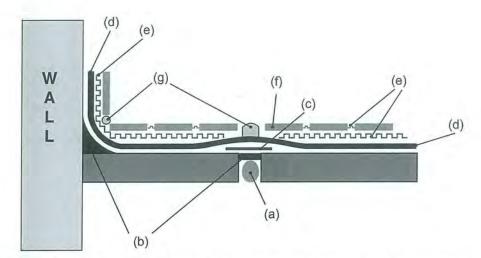
5.3 Structural Cracks (Subject to Movement)



<u>NOTE:</u> All structural cracks should be subject to investigation by a structural engineer prior to any remedial action. We offer the following as a guide only - each case needs to be assessed on its individual merits,

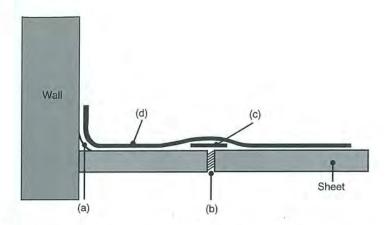
- a) Fill the crack with a flexible sealant Davsil (Silicone) or Sodaflex 603 (Polyurethane). Allow 24 hours to cure. In the case of large cracks, Abelrod can be used to pack the body of the crack, before filling with Davsil or Sodaflex 603.
- b) Apply a 100mm wide strip of Polyethylene/Polypropylene tape over the total length of the crack extending either side of where the crack finishes. * Ensure the surface is clean prior to application of the tape, to achieve good adhesion.
- c) Apply the membrane to the remainder of the area after use of suitable primer.

5.4 Expansion Joints



- a) For wide joints (>10mm), the use of Abelrod (Polyethylene foam backer rod) is recommended.
- b) Use Davsil (silicone) or Sodaflex 603 (Polyurethane) to fill the remainder of the joint, and to provide a bond breaker at the wall/floor junction. (Narrow joints of <10mm can be filled with Davsil or Sodaflex 603 only).
- Apply a 50mm wide strip of polyethylene/polypropylene tape over the total length of the expansion joint.
 * Ensure the surface is clean prior to application of the tape, to achieve good adhesion.
- d) Apply the membrane to the remainder of the area, after use of a suitable primer.
- e) & f) Application of adhesive, tiles and grout ensuring the expansion joint is NOT tiled over.
- g) Use Davsil (silicone) or Sodaflex 603 (Polyurethane) to fill the expansion joint and the wall/floor joint in the tiled surface.

5.5 Sheet Joint Detail



NOTE: Ensure the floor sheeting material used is suitable for the intended application - consult the manufacturer for suitability. All floor sheeting material must be fixed in accordance with the manufacturers instructions. All joint detailing must also be carried out in accordance with the manufacturers instructions. In the absence of suitable instructions for joint detailing we offer the following suggestion, however this does not override manufacturers instructions:

- a) Davsil (Silicone) or Sodaflex 603 (Polyurethane) bond breaker.
- b) Davsil or Sodaflex 603 in sheet joint, if the joint is greater than 1mm. For butt jointed sheets, or joints of less than 1mm, the use of a flexible sealant is not necessary.
- c) Polyethylene/Polypropylene tape 50mm wide, to be placed over all joints, prior to application of membrane (including joints of less than 1mm). * Ensure the surface is clean prior to application of the tape, to achieve good adhesion.
- Apply membrane, after use of a suitable primer.

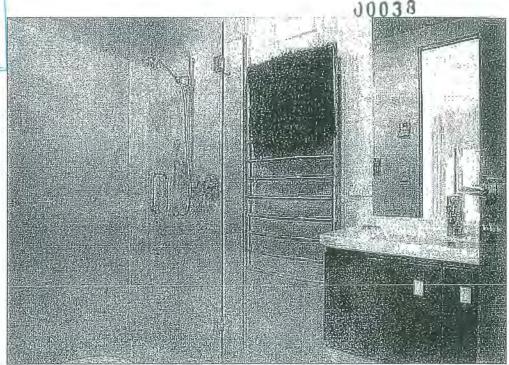

Product

1.1 Dayco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid are liquid-applied waterproofing membranes for use under ceramic or stone tile finishes in internal wet areas.

Scope

- 2.1 Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid have been appraised for use as waterproofing membranes for internal wet areas of buildings, within the following scope:
 - on floor substrates of concrete, flooring grade particleboard, plywood, compressed fibre cement sheet and fibre cement sheet tile underlay, and on wall substrates of concrete, concrete masonry, wet area fibre cement sheet lining systems and wet area plasterboard lining systems; and,
 - · when protected from physical damage by ceramic or stone tile finishes; and,
 - where floors are designed and constructed such that deflections do not exceed 1/360th of the span.
- 2.2 The use of Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid on concrete slabs and walls where hydrostatic or vapour pressure is present is outside the scope of this Appraisal.
- 2.3 Movement and control joints in the substrate must be carried through to the tile finish. The design and construction of the substrate and movement and control joints is specific to each building, and therefore the responsibility of the building designer and building contractor and is outside the scope of this Appraisal.
- 2.4 Ceramic or stone tile finishes are outside the scope of this Appraisal.
- 2.5 The membranes must be installed by ParexGroup Pty Limited Approved and Trained Applicators.

Building Regulations

New Zealand Building Code [NZBC]

3.1 In the opinion of BRANZ, Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid if designed, used, installed and maintained in accordance with the statements and conditions of this Appraisal, will meet the following provisions of the NZBC:

Clause B2 DURABILITY: Performance B2.3.1 [b] 15 years. Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid meet this requirement. See Paragraph 9.1.

Clause E3 INTERNAL MOISTURE: Performance E3.3.6, Interior wet area floors and walls incorporating Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid will meet this requirement. See Paragraphs 11.1 – 11.7,

Clause F2 HAZARDOUS BUILDING MATERIALS: Performance F2.3.1. Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid meet this requirement and will not present a health hazard to people.



Technical Specification

- 4.1 Materials supplied by ParexGroup Pty Limited are as follows:
 - Davco K10 Plus A flexible [Class III as defined in AS/NZS 4858], single pack, water based polyurethane waterproofing membrane, it is supplied as a grey paste in 20 litre pails or green paste in 4 and 20 litre pails.
 - Davco K10 Rapid A flexible (Class III as defined in AS/NZS 4858), single pack, water based
 polyurethane waterproofing membrane. It is supplied as a yellow paste in 5 and 15 litre pails.
 Ultraprime An acrylic based multipurpose primer for all porous substrates. It is supplied as a
 clear liquid in 1 and 5 litre containers.
 - Ultrabond Is a grey, flexible, two part primer/bond enhancer for use over difficult or nonporous substrates. It is supplied as a kit made up of a 20 kg bag and a 5 litre pail.

Handling and Storage

5.1 All materials must be stored inside, up off concrete floors, in dry conditions, out of direct sunlight and out of freezing conditions. The membrane products have a shelf life of 12 months from date of manufacture in the original unopened packaging. Once opened, the products must be used.

Technical Literature

6.1 Refer to the Appraisals listing on the BRANZ website for details of the current Technical Literature for Davco K10 Plus and K10 Repid. The Technical Literature must be read in conjunction with this Appraisal. All aspects of design, use, installation and maintenance contained in the Technical Literature and within the scope of this Appraisal must be followed.

Design Information

General

- 7.1 Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid are for use in buildings where an impervious waterproof membrane is required to floors and walls to prevent damage to building elements and adjaining areas.
- 7.2 The membranes must be protected from physical damage by the application of ceramic or stone tile finishes.
- 7.3 Movement and control joints may be required depending on the shape and size of the building or room, and the tile finish specified. Design guidelines can be found in the BRANZ Good Practice Guide to Tiling.
- 7.4 Timber floor framing systems must comply with NZS 3604, or where specific engineering design is used, the framing shall be of at least equivalent stiffness to the framing provisions of NZS 3604, or comply with the serviceability criteria of NZS 4203. In all cases framing must be provided so that the maximum span of the substrate as specified by the substrate manufacturer is met and all sheet edges are fully supported. Timber framing systems supporting the substrates must be constructed such that deflections do not exceed 1/360th of the span. Where NZS 3604 is used, the allowable joist spans given in Table 7.1 shall be reduced by 20%.

Substrates

Plywood

8.1 Plywood must be a minimum of 17mm thick complying with AS/NZS 2269, CD Grade Structural with sanded C face upwards and treated to H3 [CCA treated]. LOSP treated plywood must not be used. The plywood must be supported with dwangs or framing with a maximum span of 400 mm in each direction, fixed with 10 g x 50 mm stainless steel countersunk head screws at 150 mm centres on the edges and 200 mm through the body of the sheets.



Fibre Cement Compressed Sheet/ Fibre Cement Sheet Tile Underlay

8.2 Fibre cement compressed sheet must be manufactured to comply with the requirements of AS 2908.2 and must be specified by the manufacturer as being suitable for use as a wet area substrate. Installation must be in accordance with the instructions of the manufacturer.

Concrete and Concrete Masonry

8.3 Concrete and concrete masonry substrates must be to a specific engineering design meeting the requirements of the NZBC, such as concrete construction to NZS 3101 and NZS 3604, Concrete Slab-On-Ground Floors and Concrete masonry to NZS 4229 and NZS 4230.

Wet Area Wall Linings

- 8.4 Plasterboard wall linings must be manufactured to comply with AS/NZS 2588, and be covered by a valid BRANZ Appraisal for use in internal wet areas.
- 8.5 Fibre cement sheet must be manufactured to comply with the requirements of AS 2908.2 and must be specified by the manufacturer as being suitable for use as a wet area lining. Installation must be in accordance with the instructions of the manufacturer.

Durability

Serviceable Life

9.1 Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid, when subjected to normal conditions of environment and use, are expected to have a serviceable life of at least 15 years and be compatible with ceramic or stone tile finishes with a design service life of 15-25 years.

Maintenance

- 10.1 No maintenance of the membranes will be required provided significant substrate movement does not occur and the tile finish remains intact. Regular checks must be made of the tiled areas to ensure they are sound and will not allow moisture to penetrate. Any cracks or damage must be repaired immediately by repairing the tiles, grouts and sealants.
- 10.2 In the event of damage to the membrane, the tiling must be removed and the membrane repaired by removing the damaged portion and applying a patch as for new work.
- 10.3 Drainage outlets must be maintained to operate effectively, and ceramic or stone tile finishes must be kept clean.

Internal Moisture

- 11.1 Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid are impervious to water and when appropriately designed and installed will avoid the likelihood of water penetrating behind linings or entering concealed spaces.
- 11.2 Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid are suitable for use to contain accidental overflow to meet NZBC Clause E3.3,2. A means of Code Compliance for overflow is given in NZBC Acceptable Solution E3/AS1, Paragraph 2.
- 11.3 Surfaces must be finished with ceramic or stone tile finishes. A means of Code Compliance to NZBC Clause E3.3.3 is given in NZBC Acceptable Solution E3/AS1, Paragraph 3.1.1 [b] and 3.1.2 (b).
- 11.4 Falls in showers and shower areas must be a minimum of 1 in 50. In unenclosed showers, falls must extend a minimum of 1500 mm out from the shower rose. Floor wastes must be provided and the floor must fall to the outlet.
- 11.5 The waterproofing membrane must completely cover shower bases, and for unenclosed showers it must extend a minimum of 1500 mm out from the shower rose. Further design guidance on waterproofing wet areas, including waterproofing walls and junctions can be obtained from AS 3740, the BRANZ Good Practice Guide to Tiling, and flooring and wallboard manufacturers.
- 11.6 Where water resistent wall finishes such as prefinished sheet materials are used, they must flash over the membrane a minimum of 30 mm.
- 11.7 BRANZ recommends the entire floor be covered by a waterproof membrane for bath, shower and spa rooms where wood-based floors are used.



Installation Information

Installation Skill Level Requirement

- 12.1 Installation must always be carried out in accordance with the Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid Technical Literature and this Appraisal by, or under the supervision of, a Licensed Building Practitioner (LBP) with the relevant Licence Class and an understanding of Internal wet area construction.
- 12.2 Installation and finishing of components and accessories supplied by ParexGroup Pty Limited and its approved applicators must be completed by trained applicators, approved by ParexGroup Pty Limited.

Preparation of Substrates

- Substrates must be dry, clean and stable before installation commences. Surfaces must be smooth and free from nibs, sharp edges, dust, dirt or other materials such as oil, grease or concrete formwork release agents.
- 13.2 Concrete substrates can be checked for dryness by using a hygrometer as set out in BRANZ Bulletin No. 585. The relative humidity of the concrete must be 75% or less before membrane application.
- All voids, cracks, holes, joints and excessively rough areas must be filled to achieve an even and uniform surface. Junctions of substrate abutments, such as at wall/floor and wall/wall junctions must have a bond breaker joint system installed as set out in the Technical Literature.
- 13.4 If required, substrates must be primed with the appropriate primer and allowed to cure before the membrane is installed.

Membrane Installation

- 14.1 Installation must not be undertaken where the substrate surface temperature is below 5°C or above 35°C.
- 14.2 The membrane must be applied in two coats at the rates set out in the Technical Literature. The total finished system thickness of the Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid must be a minimum of 1.2 mm.
- 14.3 Application can be made by roller [medium/long nap] or brush [long bristle].
- 14.4 Clean up may be undertaken with water while the membrane is still wet.

Tiling

- 15.1 The membrane must be fully cured before tiling. The cured membrane must be protected at all times to prevent mechanical damage, so may require temporary covers until the finishing is completed.

Inspections

 - Construction of substrates, including crack control and installation of bond breakers and movement control joints.
 - Moisture content of the substrate prior to the application of the membrane.
 - Acceptance of the substrate by the membrane installer prior to application of the membrane.
 - Installation of the membrane to the manufacturer's instructions, particularly installation to the correct thickness and use of reinforcement.
 - Membrane curing and integrity prior to the installation of tiles including protection from mechanical damage during curing and prior to tile installation.



Basis of Appraisal

The following is a summary of the technical investigations carried out:

Tests

- 17.1 The testing on Davco K10 Plus and K10 Rapid has been undertaken by various organisations:
 - Testing to AS/NZS 4858: 2004 Appendix A including effect of heat aging, bleach, detergent and water on tensile and elongation, Water Vapour Transmission to ASTM E96-92 and cyclic movement.
