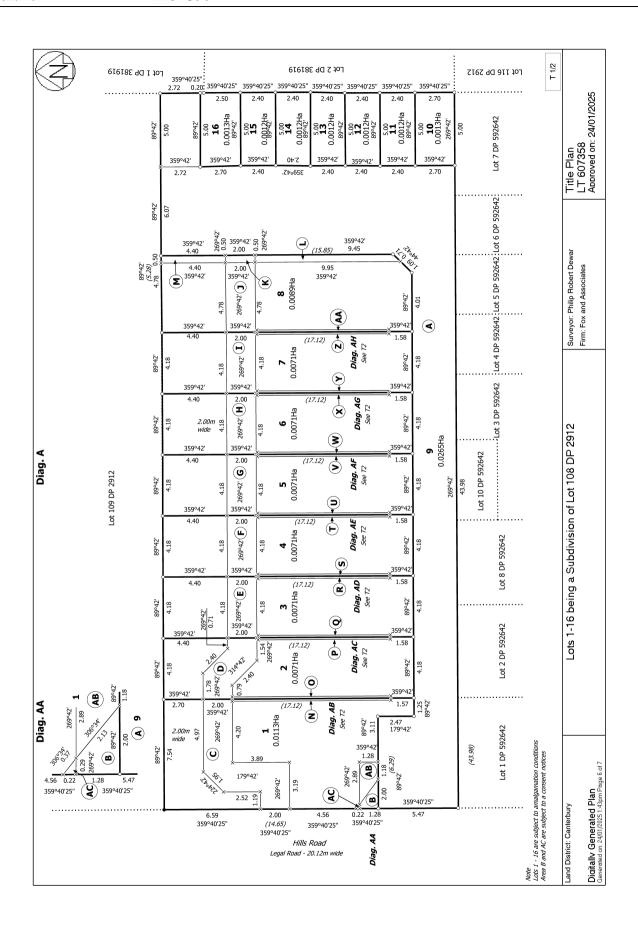

8. **Arbitration**

- 8.2 If the dispute is not resolved within 20 working days from the date on which the parties begin their negotiations the parties will submit to the arbitration of an independent arbitrator appointed jointly by the parties. If the parties agree, the person appointed may act as an expert and not as an arbitrator.

The Developer requires that, the Burdened Land and the Benefited Land be subject to the provisions of this Instrument for the benefit of each of the Burdened Land and the Benefited Land to ensure that the Development is administered in a co-ordinated and harmonious manner and to conserve and enhance the character, value and amenity values of the Development.
- 2.3. The purposes of this instrument are to:
 - (a) require the Covenantor to be bound by (where applicable) the covenants under this Instrument and to receive the benefit of (where applicable) the covenants under this Instrument;
 - (b) require the Covenantor to insure its Property, as more specifically recorded in clause 6 (the **Insurance Obligations**); and
 - (c) set out the Covenantor's obligations in respect of the maintenance of its Property and the Common Property, as more specifically recorded in clause 6 (the **Property Obligations**).
- 2.4. The Developer requires that this Instrument shall be and remain registered against the Records of Title to the Burdened Land and Benefited Land so that:

 - (b) remain a Member while the Covenantor continues to be the registered Owner of that Property; and
 - (c) fulfil and continue to fulfil the obligations of a Member as set out in this Instrument
- 3.3. The Covenantor covenants and agrees:

4. The Residents Association

- 4.1. The rules of the Residents Association (as recorded in this clause 4) shall dictate how the Owners make those decisions that they are required to under this Instrument.
- 4.2. The Covenantor agrees that the primary method of communication for matters relating to the Residents Association will be via email. In this regard, the Covenantor covenants with the Covenantee that it will:
 - (a) provide the other Owners (and any other third party reasonably requiring it, such as a property manager) with its contact email address as soon as practicable following settlement of its purchase of a Property; and
 - (b) upon receipt of the above information, compile it into a list which records each Owner's email address (**Owners List**).
- 4.3. The Covenantor agrees that all decisions of the Residents Association shall be made at a meeting of the Residents Association (**Meeting**) and covenants with the Covenantee to abide by the below requirements of a Meeting:
 - (a) any Owner can convene a Meeting by giving a minimum of ten (10) working days' notice in writing to each of the Owners (in accordance with clause 11.2), with that notice to record the date, time and place of that Meeting, and the proposed agenda;
 - (b) decisions shall be made by majority vote unless stated otherwise in this Instrument;
 - (c) each Owner shall exercise one vote for each Property that Owner owns. In the event there is more than one Owner of a Property, then:
 - (i) those Owners must exercise their vote jointly;
 - (ii) one person/entity can exercise a vote on behalf of a jointly owned Property, unless written notice has been issued to the other Owners, which records that all of the Owners of that Property must be at a Meeting to exercise a vote jointly; and

- (iii) an Owner may nominate a proxy (such as a property manager) by way of notice (in accordance with clause 11.2) to all the other Owners who are eligible to attend that Meeting to vote on their behalf;
- (d) voting at a Meeting can be exercise by way of a show of hands, a private vote or by way of email. If it is to be conducted by private vote, such private vote can be done under the supervision of a non-Owner (such as a property manager or solicitor) appointed by agreement between the Owners present at the particular meeting.
- 4.4. The Covenantor acknowledges and agrees that:
 - (a) the Residents Association shall hold one combined Meeting in relation to matters concerning the Property Obligations and the Insurance Obligations;
 - (b) the quorum for a Meeting shall be three Owners; and

Alternatively, a non-Owner, such as a property manager can be nominated as secretary by a majority of those in attendance. In any event a copy of the minutes must be delivered to all Owners (in accordance with clause 11.2) within five (5) working days following the Meeting.

5. Bank Accounts

- 5.1. The Covenantor acknowledges and agrees that the Owners will decide at a meeting, to either nominate a property manager, accountant or similar, or three (or more) of the Owners as stakeholder (Stakeholder) to hold and operate a bank account, for the benefit of the Owners in relation to the Property Obligations and the Insurance Obligations (the Bank Account). Crockers Body Corporate Management Limited is appointed the initial Stakeholder to hold and operate the Bank Account.
- 5.2. The Covenantor acknowledges and agrees that all payments from the Bank Account must first be approved at a Meeting.
- 5.3. The Covenantor acknowledges that the Owners must procure that the Stakeholder make available to all Owners, at each Meeting, the most recent statement of each bank account to which that Meeting relates.

6. Obligations of the Owners

- 6.1. The Covenant covenants with the Covenantee to:
 - (a) contribute to each Bank Account in accordance with clause 7 below;
 - (b) keep its Property in good order and repair; and

 - (c) maintain in good working order at all times the exterior solar lighting bollards situated on its respective Property such that in the hours of darkness the lighting illuminates the share accesses and entrances to the Properties, and any common/utility area within the Development. The lighting shall be maintained at the cost of each Owner of the particular Property to which the light(s) are located on and is to be set on an automatic night sensor switch.

6.6. The Covenantor must:

- (a) ensure its Property is kept clean at all times and any lawns, gardens, grounds, shrubs, trees, foliage, yards or paved areas within its Property are kept neat and tidy and are regularly maintained;
- (b) not change the exterior colour of the Unit and improvements on its Property without the prior written consent of all Covenantors and must keep the same well maintained and in a clean and tidy condition including regularly clearing any guttering;
- (c) not change the height or type of fencing on its Property;
- (d) keep the roof of the Unit and the fascia, gutters and external cladding of the same Unit in good order and repair having regard to the overall condition of the Unit;
- (e) not erect, fix or place any aerial, satellite dish, antenna or similar device on or to the exterior of its Unit or install any gas bottle, washing line or other structure so that it is visible from any public road;
- (f) not leave rubbish or recycling material on its Property except in designated Christchurch City Council rubbish bins and such bins must not be left in such a way that interferes with the use of any right of way area by the other owners or occupiers of a Property;
- (g) ensure that all rubbish bins are collected from the kerb and returned to the designated bin storage area on the designated Christchurch City Council rubbish collection day;
- (h) not park on any part of the Land designated as a right of way area;

- (i) keep clean all glass contained in windows or doors of its Unit and replace any cracked or broken glass within 72 hours of the glass being broken with glass of the same or better weight and quality;
- (j) not make or permit any noise or carry out or permit any conduct or behaviour, on any Property, which is likely to interfere with the use and enjoyment of other Owners or occupiers of their Properties;
- (k) provide a full copy of these Covenants and any amendments thereof to any tenant or occupier of its Properties;
- (I) use its best endeavours to insure the Unit and improvements situated on its Property with the same insurance company as the other Owners. To assist with the adherence of this covenant the Covenantors must provide each other with their contact details and act in good faith in their dealings with each other.
- (m) contribute equally on a pro rata basis with all other Owners to any operating and maintenance costs associated with any exterior solar lighting bollards and the electric access gates installed on Common Property on the Land.

7. Contribution to Bank Account

- 7.1. The Covenantor covenants that it will transfer to the Bank Account on the first day of each month the amount determined at a Meeting on account of the cost to meet the cost to satisfy the Property Obligations and the Insurance Obligations (including the Collective Insurance Policy).
- 7.2. The Covenantor acknowledges:
 - (a) those contributions recorded in clause 7.1 shall be adjusted up every three years form the date of this Instrument in accordance with any increase in the Consumer Price Index published by Statistics New Zealand (or the like index in the event that index is replaced) over that same period, provided that the Owners (by way of a decision at a Meeting) may elect to increase or decrease the amount and/or frequency of those contributions; and

This payment(s) will be without prejudice to the other rights of the Covenantee in relation to the enforcement of this Instrument, including but not limited to the recovery from the Covenantor of an amount equal to the Covenantee's loss and costs as a result of the breach of this Instrument by the Covenantee;
- (d) the Covenantee is able to instruct a law firm and/or debt collector to act for the Covenantee in respect of the recovery of the debt owned by the Covenantor and in such event the Covenantee may recover the cost of the same from the Covenantor; and
- (e) if any default by the Covenantor results in the Bank Account not maintaining sufficient monies for the Owners to meet their relevant obligations, then the other relevant Owners are required to contribute to the Bank Account an equal share of the amount required to enable the requisite Owners to meet the relevant Obligations. Each Owner who contributes a share pursuant to this clause shall be able to recover the amount of that share, together with interest (at the rate of 12.0% per annum) from the Covenantor.

10. Dispute Resolution

- 10.1. If a dispute arises between the Covenantor and Covenantee in relation to matters touching or concerning this Instrument (**Dispute**), the following procedure must be followed:
 - (a) the party initiating the Dispute must provide full written particulars of the Dispute to all other Owners and call a Meeting for the Owners to discuss the Dispute, and endeavour to resolve the Dispute at that Meeting;
 - (b) if the Dispute is not resolved at the Meeting, the Owners must appoint a mediator by mutual agreement (or if agreement cannot be reached, that mediator is to be appointed by the President for the time being of the Canterbury-Westland Branch of the New Zealand Law Society or the body that replaces that society) to attend a Meeting, for the purposes of resolving the Dispute; and
 - (c) if the Dispute is not resolved at the Meeting which is attended by the mediator, the Dispute must be referred to arbitration in accordance with the Arbitration Act 1996 and conducted by a single arbitrator to be agreed on by the Owners (or failing agreement, to be appointed by the President for the time being of the Canterbury-Westland Branch of the New Zealand Law Society or the body that replaces that society).

11. General

- 11.1. The Covenantor's liability under this Instrument shall not be released, varied or affected in any way by any delay, extension of time or other indulgence to the Covenantor suffered or permitted by the Covenantee or by any failure or neglect of the Covenantee to enforce the rights or powers recorded in this Instrument.

- 7. If a Party Wall requires demolition for any reason other than pursuant to this clause 2 the parties shall proceed to build a substitute Party Wall.
- 8. The construction of any Party Wall, any substitute Party Wall and any modification to any party wall shall be carried out:
 - 8.1. in a proper and competent manner;

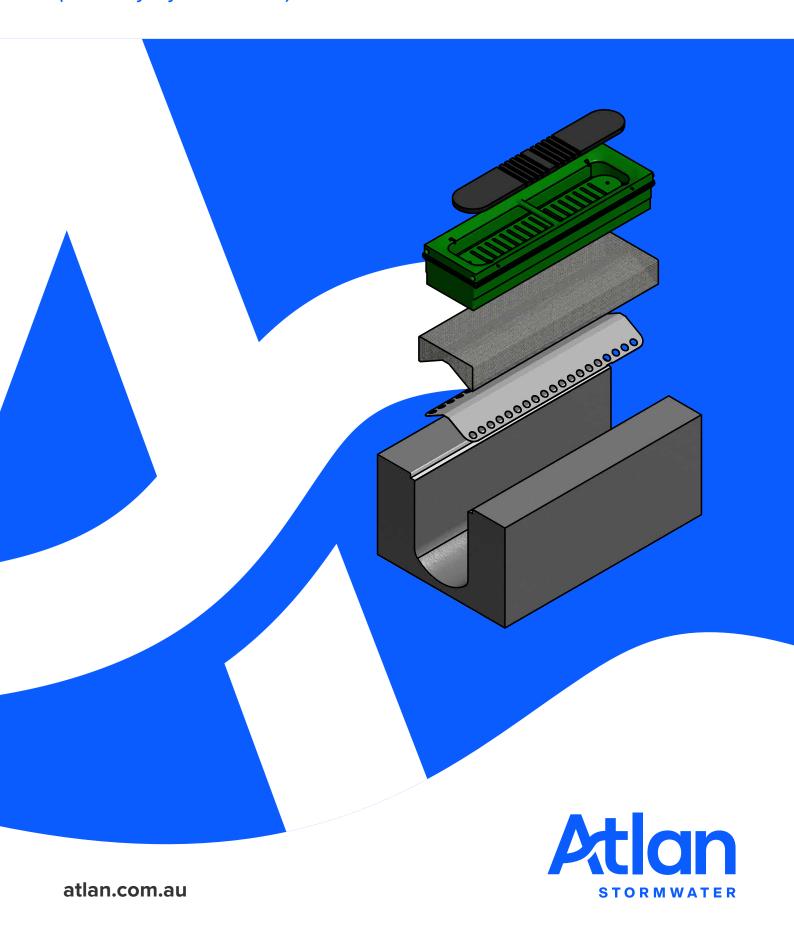



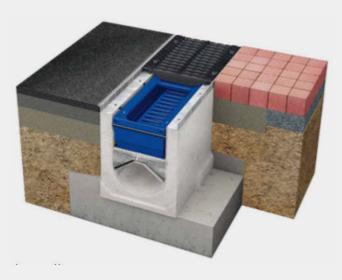
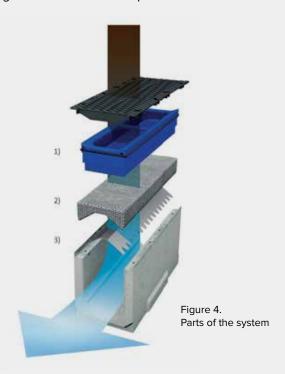


Figure 2. FlowGuard installation

The treatment takes place directly below the surface covers, it is easy to inspect and maintain. There is only low head loss. Filter media is kept in bags, there is no loose material in the channel. Filter media has to be replaced after at least 10 years. Highest bearing capacities of the channel allow to install the system in nearly every situation (Figure 2).

The filter media removes pollutants including PAH, hydrocarbons and heavy metals. It also binds phosphorous and ammonium from stormwater. The two step treatment train separates solids and dissolves substances separately.

The system is ideal for car parks (Figure 3), roads, industrial areas and airports. Highest pollutant levels in stormwater runoff can be reduced to acceptable loads for groundwater and surface waters. The modular design allows the adaption to nearly every site condition.

- Length of a standard unit: 1.0 m (3.28 ft)
- Inner channel diameter: 0.30 m (0.98 ft)
- Connectable area: 269 ft2/m to 1076 ft2/m (25 m2/m to 100 m2/m) according to site conditions and water quality aims.

THE MODULAR INTERIOR OF THE HYDROSYSTEM FILTER CHANNEL (Figure 4)

- Purpose build concrete or polycrete parts for the system provide maximum safety and optimum handling.
- The bags with the filter media are placed on a specific baffle.
- The sedimentation box is fixed with four brackets to quarantee a horizontal position.



MAINTENANCE

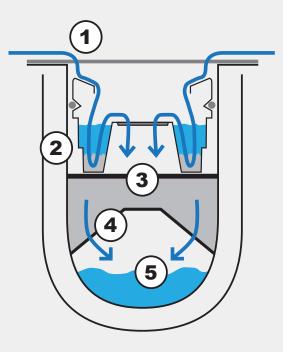


Figure 5. Working Principle of the FlowGuard

WORKING PRINCIPLE (Figure 5):

- Water enters the system from both sides of the channel
- 2. The sedimentation box removes coarse solids such as sand, leaves etc.. A rubber seal prevents a bypass directly to the filter bag.
- 3. The pre-treated water flows through a granulate filter media. Dissolved pollutants are removed by adsorption and precipitation.
- 4. The cleaned water passes to the bottom section of the channel and can be discharged to groundwater or surface waters.

Because of the pollutants and harmful substances within the stormwater systems have to be controlled and cleaned in regular intervals.

A detailed maintenance manual is supplied by the manufacturer for each installation.

The following maintenance is necessary for the FlowGuard:

ANNUAL CONTROLS

- Visual inspection of the system: after opening the cover (Figure 6) it has to be checked that all functional components are present and that they are in the correct condition (plastic body and filter pad).

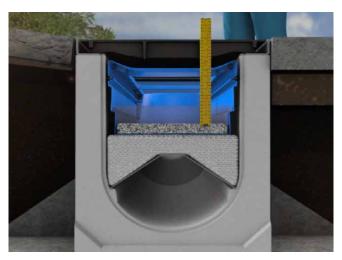


Figure 7. Checking the height of the sediment

- The height of the mud in the sedimentation box has to be checked (Figure 7).

EMPTYING THE SEDIMENTATION BOX

- At intervals of four months, the sedimentation box should be emptied.
- For this purpose the plastic part must be lifted out
 of the channel and the collected sediment and
 the leaves must be emptied or sucked out with a
 suction device suitable for this purpose. Therefore
 first the cap has to be opened and the water has to
 be discharged onto the filter pad (Figures 8 and 9).

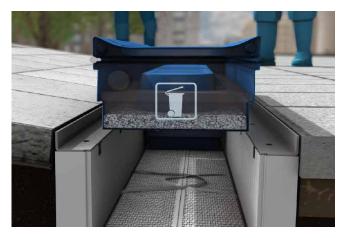


Figure 10. The sediment has to be emptied into a waste bin

- Leaves and sediments have to be emptied into a waste bin (Figure 10).
- In the case of channels with untypical low or high solid loads the periods for emptying the sedimentation box may differ.

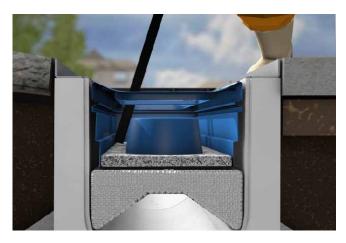


Figure 11. The sedimentation box can be also cleaned by a vacuum cleaner

CHANGE OF THE FILTER UNIT

 At the latest after one year of operation, the filter pads must be replaced. To do this, the old pads have to be replaced by new ones (Figure 14). The exchange takes place alternately. The old filter pads are to be returned to the manufacturer where the filter material is disposed of properly.



Please note:

 The water pumped from the sedimentation box may only be directed into a combined or wastewater sewer. In general, the water must not be discharged into surface waters, a storm sewer or an groundwater infiltration system.
