1.1 Description of Proposal

The owners of this site propose the servicing of an existing 3 bedroom and 1 bedroom dwellings.

1.2 Site Description

This site, located at 142 Huia Street, is a an irregular shaped rural property. Property is generally covered with pasture grass and trees. The Property is pasrt of a new sub-divison. Property boundaries are on Huia Street to the East and other like properties on all other boundaries.

1.3 Wastewater Volume

In calculating the wastewater flows we have allowed for a maximum occupancy of 7 persons, based on the proposed 3 bedroom and 1 bedroom dwellings (as per AS/NZS 1547:2012 Table J1). Total wastewater production is based on an allowance of 145 litres per person per day (as per AS/NZS 1547:2012 Table H3, Note 2), which is conservative given that water supply is roof collected rain water and standard water fixtures will be used throughout the house.

1.4 Wastewater Volume

The Existing Septic system that is proposed will treat the wastewater to a high standard prior to dispersal using a LPED dispersal system into a purpose-designed ETS bed system, where the removal of nutrient will continue, both in the receiving soils and by plant uptake.

The system will be capable of producing reductions in Biochemical Oxygen Demand, Total Suspended Solids, Nitrogen, and Coliforms to a standard that meets the requirements (see details below). 1.6 Land Application System

1.7 Surface & Ground Water

It is proposed to treat the water to a high standard prior to discharge and the proposed irrigation system will introduce the water into the topsoil horizon using ETS Beds. A low application rate of treated effluent into the topsoil will significantly reduce the likelihood of, any breakout or runoff or any risk of surface water contamination. With the ground water levels being >1.2m this conservative DLR also means the risk of ground water contamination is virtually nil. 1.8 Air Quality

The proposed Existing Septic system will produce no noticeable odour when functioning correctly. Any odour will be contained within the tanks. The land application system will load the soil at a rate that should not cause ponding, spraying or aerosol of the effluent that could potentially cause odours. Risk Minor to Nil.

1.9 Visual Impact

The tanks are installed wholly below ground level with only the lids being visible. The lids will protrude approximately 100mm to prevent egress of storm water into the system. The disposal field will be located in a purpose designed mulched and intensively planted disposal area. Warning signs may be installed to indicate the presence of the disposal area, although probably not necessary in a domestic situation, also the area may be fenced to restrict access.

1.10 Environmental Risks

Risks are associated with this proposal are minor. The treatment system will be automated, and the Home Owner will be given a 'Home Owners Care Guide' which explains the necessary visual checks to ensure no issues arise with the system, specifically – solids build-up - high water level – discharge failure – filter blockage.

Peak flow into the system are not expected to be significant and the system includes a large emergency storage volume.

1.11 Maintenance Requirements

The maintenance requirement of this system is minimal, with the system fully automated. 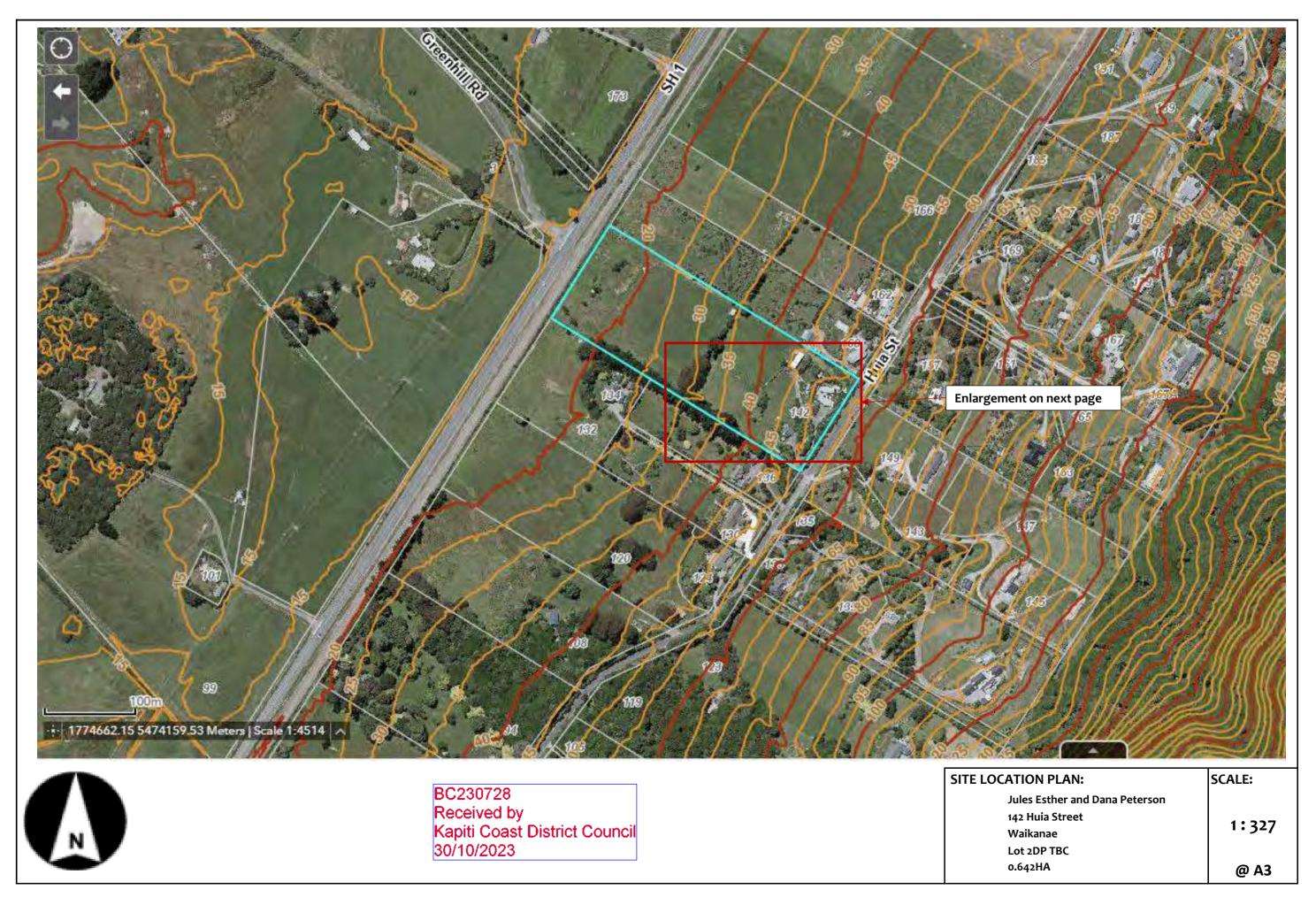

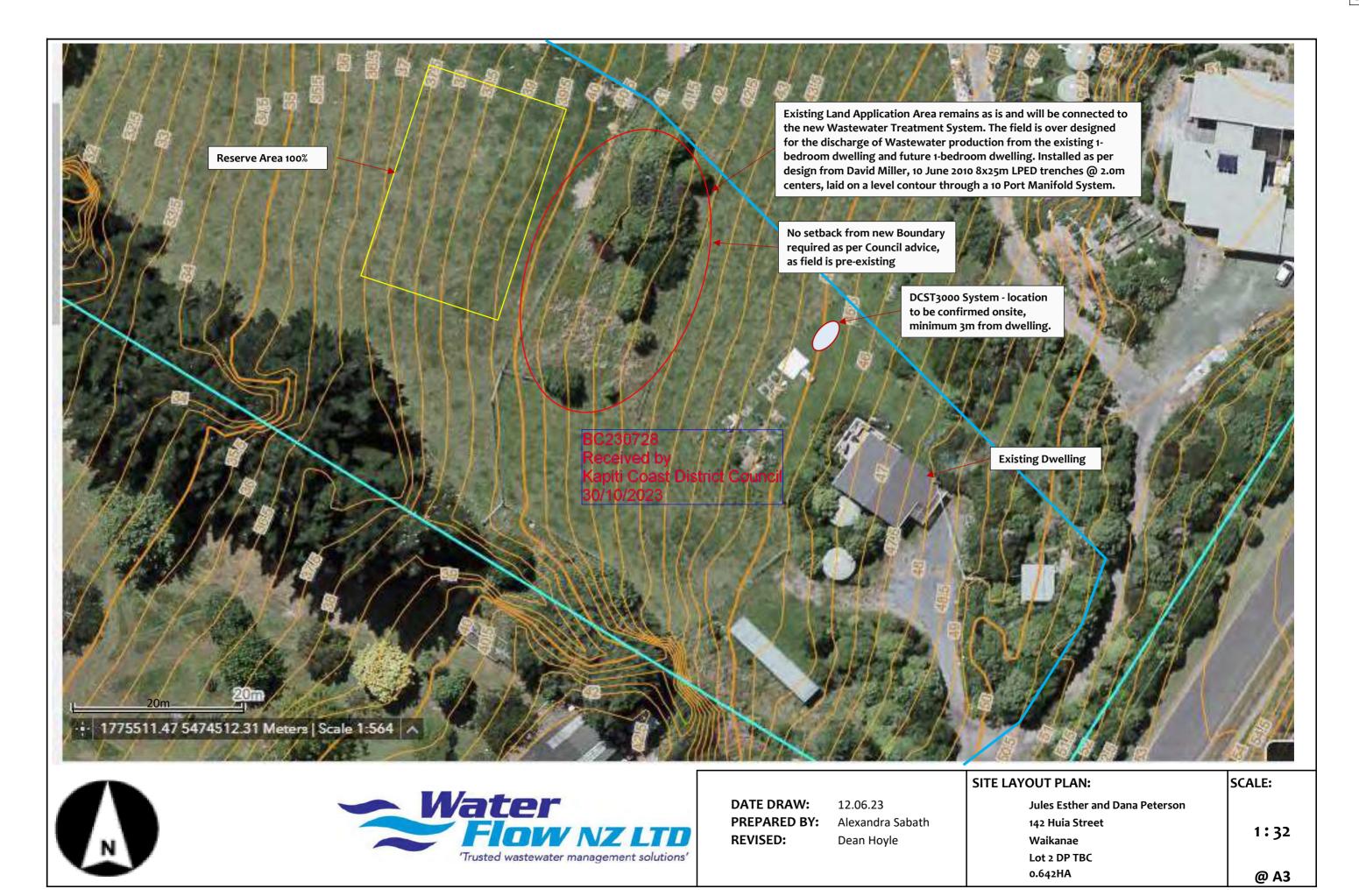
The disposal field will need to be protected from traffic and animal grazing. Planting this area is recommended to increase Evapotranspiration.

Assessment of Environmental Effects

Jules Esther and Dana Peterson of 142 Huia Street, Waikanae Lot 2 DP TBC

1.1 Description of Proposal

The owners of this site propose the servicing of an existing 1 bedroom and new 1 bedroom dwellings.

1.2 Site Description

This site, located at 142 Huia Street, is a an irregular shaped rural property. Property is generally covered with pasture grass and trees. The Property is pasrt of a new sub-divison. Property boundaries are on Huia Street to the East and other like properties on all other boundaries.

1.3 Wastewater Volume

In calculating the wastewater flows we have allowed for a maximum occupancy of 4 persons, based on the proposed 1 bedroom and 1 bedroom dwellings (as per AS/NZS 1547:2012 Table J1). Total wastewater production is based on an allowance of 145 litres per person per day (as per AS/NZS 1547:2012 Table H3, Note 2), which is conservative given that water supply is roof collected rain water and standard water fixtures will be used throughout the house.

1.4 Wastewater Volume

The DCST3000 system that is proposed will treat the wastewater to a high standard prior to dispersal using a LPED irrigation system, into a purpose-designed disposal field where the removal of nutrient will continue, both in the receiving soils and by plant uptake.

The system will be capable of producing reductions in Biochemical Oxygen Demand, Total Suspended Solids, Nitrogen, and Coliforms to a standard that meets the requirements (see details below). The system will cater for the wastewater requirements of the private dwellings (domestic wastewater) and will not service any commercial or trade waste sources. Risk Minor to Nil.

1.5 Proposed Treatment System

The objective of the treatment system is to reduce and remove much of the contaminants from the wastewater prior to discharge into the receiving soil. This will improve the long-term performance of the disposal field as well as reducing the risk to the receiving environment. The system will consist of:

- DCST3000
- Reln Outlet Filter

- Existing Land Application System

The system is constructed using injection molded tank. The system produces treated effluent with BOD <150mg/l, Suspended solids <40mg/l.

1.6 Land Application System

The existing irrigation system uses a LPED irrigation and manifold system, ensuring an even delivery of moisture over the entire irrigation field and a conservative DLR of 1.45mm. We propose the use of 25mm lateral tube with 3.0mm perforations at 3.0m centres and laid out at 2.0mtr apart. This LPED line will then be covered by 100mm topsoil. Densely planting this area will greatly enhance evapo-transpiration and be very beneficial especially in the wetter months of the year.

1.7 Surface & Ground Water

It is proposed to treat the water to a high standard prior to discharge and the proposed irrigation system will introduce the water into the topsoil horizon using LPED irrigation. A low application rate of treated effluent into the topsoil will significantly reduce the likelihood of, any breakout or runoff or any risk of surface water contamination. With the ground water levels being >1.2m this conservative DLR also means the risk of ground water contamination is virtually nil. A majority of the undeveloped areas of this site are suitable for a LPED disposal field when the necessary setbacks are observed. Risk Minor to Nil.

1.8 Air Quality

The proposed DCST3000 system will produce no noticeable odour when functioning correctly. Any odour will be contained within the tanks. The LPED irrigation system will load the soil at a rate that should not cause ponding, spraying or aerosol of the effluent that could potentially cause odours. Risk Minor to Nil.

1.9 Visual Impact

The tanks are installed wholly below ground level with only the lids being visible. The lids will protrude approximately 100mm to prevent egress of storm water into the system. The disposal field will be located in a purpose designed mulched and intensively planted disposal area. Warning signs may be installed to indicate the presence of the disposal area, although probably not necessary in a domestic situation, also the area may be fenced to restrict access.

1.10 Environmental Risks

Risks are associated with this proposal are minor. The treatment system will be automated, and the Home Owner will be given a 'Home Owners Care Guide' which explains the necessary visual checks to ensure no issues arise with the system, specifically – solids build-up - high water level – discharge failure – filter blockage.

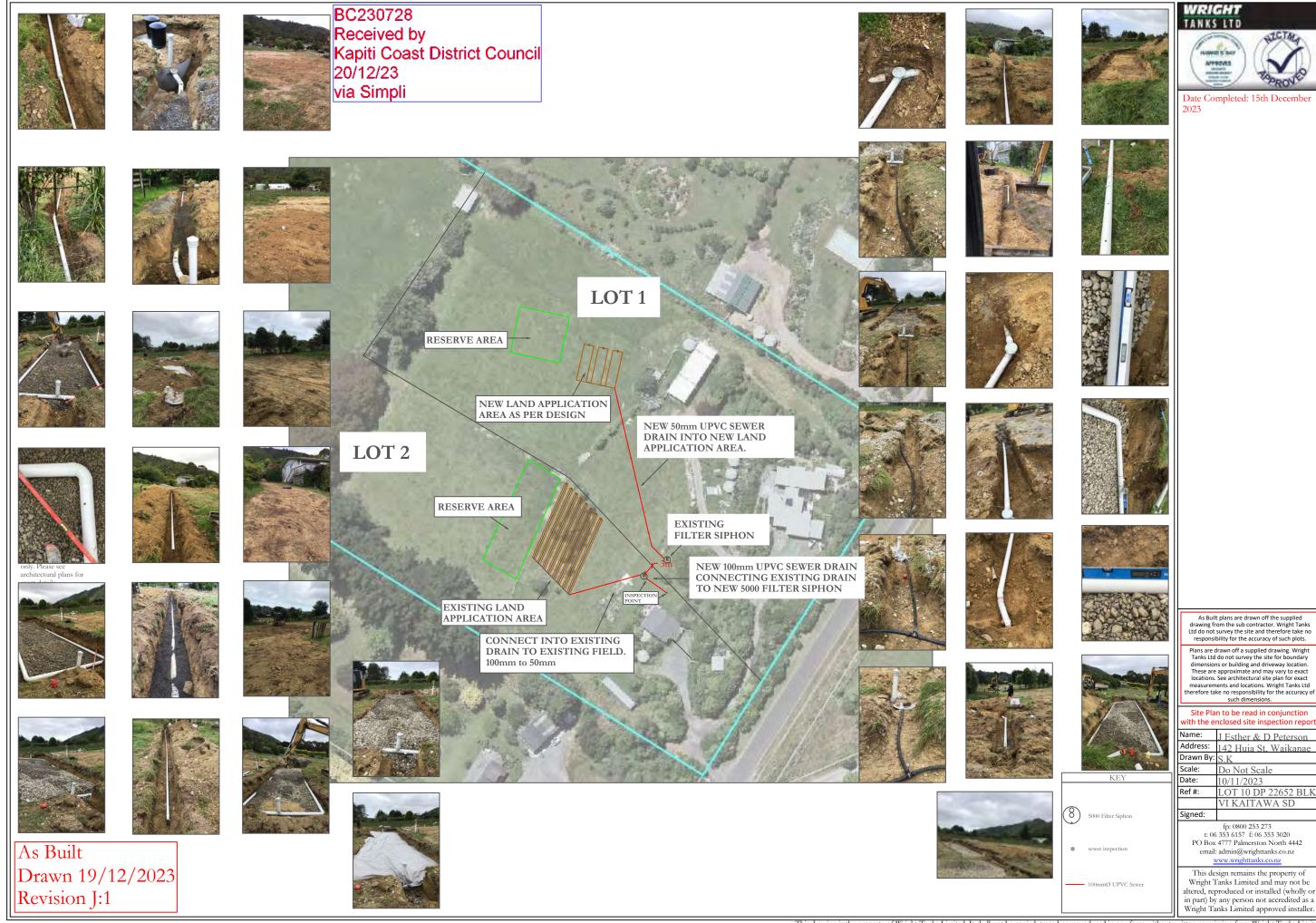
Peak flow into the system are not expected to be significant and the system includes a large emergency storage volume.

1.11 Maintenance Requirements

The maintenance requirement of this system is minimal, with the system fully automated. The system requires little input from the operator apart from the regular visual checks of the treatment system and land application system. All other maintenance interventions must be carried out by service persons familiar with the operation of the system and approved by the manufacturer. Maintenance may include checking of the dissolved oxygen levels, cleaning of effluent outlet filter, removal of excess sludge volume, checking of control panel function, etc....

The disposal field is quite possibly the most important and sensitive part of the treatment system and requires a reasonable amount of maintenance to keep it functioning well. Any leaking or damaged LPED irrigation must be fixed quickly using the appropriate materials, the planting must be maintained, weeds removed and grass kept cut.

The LPED irrigation should be kept covered with a suitable bark, mulch, or topsoil. Warning signs such as ponding, odours, and signs of excessive growth act as an indicator to possible problems. The owners will be verbally informed at the commissioning of this system of all maintenance requirements and strongly advised to have a service contract in place prior to final sign off of the system installation.

Pre-slab plumbing (concrete slab): When all plumbing and drainage pipes have been installed, prior to backfilling.

Pre-slab building (concrete slab): When DPM has been placed with all laps and penetrations sealed, reinforcing in place and in position with chairs as appropriate.

Sub-floor (timber suspended floor): When all sub-floor connections, joists and required blocking, and any suspended plumbing pipe work have been completed, but before any flooring or base boards have been fitted. Relocated dwellings require a sub-floor inspection prior to the base boards being fitted.

Drainage: When all drainage works is completed and is under test, before backfilling occurs. As laid drainage plan is required at time of inspection.

Pre-wrap: When all roof and wall framing is complete, including any exterior sheet bracing, but before building wrap has been installed.

Pre-clad: When building wrap and window and door flexible flashing tape has been installed, cavity battens (cavity systems), cavity closers and all flashing systems are in place, but before joinery has been installed.

Weathertightness: When exterior cladding has been installed, flashings in place, air seals fitted to openings, but before any coating system have been applied.

Pre-line (plumbing): When all internal plumbing is complete and plumbing pipe work is under test pressure.

Pre-line (building): When the exterior of the building is weather tight, all structural components (including bracing) have been completed and wall insulation is in place.

Wet area membranes, decks, roofs and shower area: Pre application of wet area membrane, when all outlets and flashings have been installed, ready for membrane installation.

Post application of wet area membrane.

Post-line: When all interior linings have been installed, but before skirting, Scotia or plastering stopping. Installation details of screws check of wall bracing element.

Block: When all masonry block work including block foundations for slab floors, is completed, reinforcing in place and washout openings in place.

Brick Veneer: When veneer is at half height and all flashings are in place.

Retaining wall: Pre application of waterproof membrane system.

Post application of waterproof membrane system.

Protection installed for membrane system and installation of perforated drainage system before back filling.

Final: Final inspections are carried out at the completion of the project and may include entire project, plumbing, drainage and storm water. The Code Compliance Certificate is issued if the building work complies with the approved building consent.

Free Standing Fireplace: Final inspection required only.

In Built Fireplace: Inspection required before installation and after installation.

3.3.1 General

- 3.3.1.1 Piled *foundations* to support a timber floor shall consist of a system of:
- (a) ordinary piles, as described in Paragraph 3.3.4
- (b) anchor piles, as described in Paragraph 3.3.5
- (c) braced piles as described in Paragraph 3.3.6.

3.3.1.2 Materials

The grade, species and preservative treatment for timber piles in piled *foundations* shall be in accordance with Table 2.7.

The grade, species and preservative treatment for timber subframing (for example braces, bearers, floor joists, *blocking*) shall be in accordance with Table 2.7. This table identifies the separate requirements for timber that is protected from the weather but exposed to ground atmosphere, or timber that is exposed to exterior weather conditions but not in ground contact.

Concrete for pile *footings* shall be ordinary grade complying with NZS 3109. For strength see Paragraph 3.1.6.2.

Any steel connections within 600 mm of the cleared ground level shall be a minimum of Type 304 stainless steel.

3.3.2 Piles

3.3.2.1 Piles shall directly support the bearers.

3.3.2.2 Pile height

The maximum height of piles above cleared ground level (CGL) shall be:

- (a) 600 mm to the centre of the highest fixing for anchor piles, and
- (b) dimensioned so that height to *finished* floor level (FFL) does not exceed 2.0 m.

The minimum clear distance under a bearer, supported by a pile, to *cleared ground level* is 300 mm.

3.3.2.3 Cross section

Timber piles shall be a minimum of 140 mm diameter for round piles or 125 x 125 mm square for sawn piles.

3.3.3 Footings

3.3.3.1 Loading

Piles shall not be loaded with the dead weight of the *simple house* until the concrete is a minimum of 24 hours old. The concrete shall not have a slump exceeding 60 mm at the time of placing. If at any time during the 24 hours the ambient temperature drops below 10° C, then the time before loading shall be extended to 48 hours.

3.3.3.2 Minimum depth

The bottom of a pile *footing* shall be concrete cast in-situ against *good ground* at a minimum depth below *cleared ground level* of:

- (a) for an ordinary pile 200 mm
- (b) for a braced pile 450 mm
- (c) for an anchor pile 900 mm.

The minimum thickness of concrete shall be 200 mm.

3.3.3.3 Plan size

All footings shall be 350 x 350 mm if square or 400 mm diameter if circular.

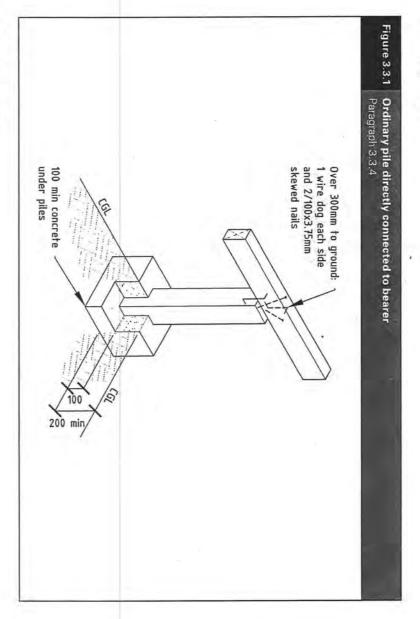
3.3.3.4 Embedment

Each pile shall be embedded in its *footing* such that there is a minimum depth of 100 mm concrete below the bottom of the pile.

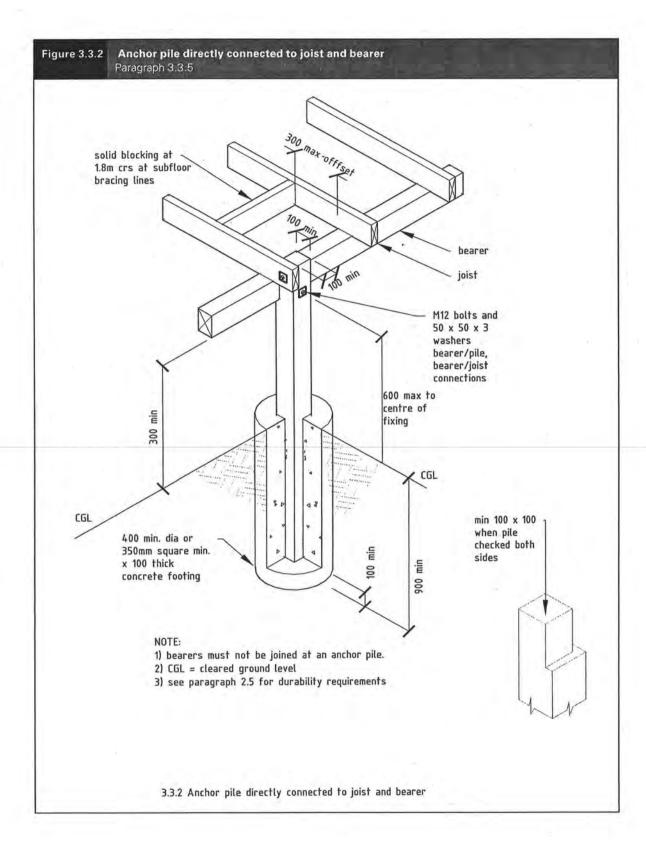
The fixings of bearers to ordinary piles shall be 2/4.9 mm wire dogs together with 2/100 x 3.75 mm nails or 4/100 x 3.75 mm nails skew driven into the piles (see Figure 3.3.1).

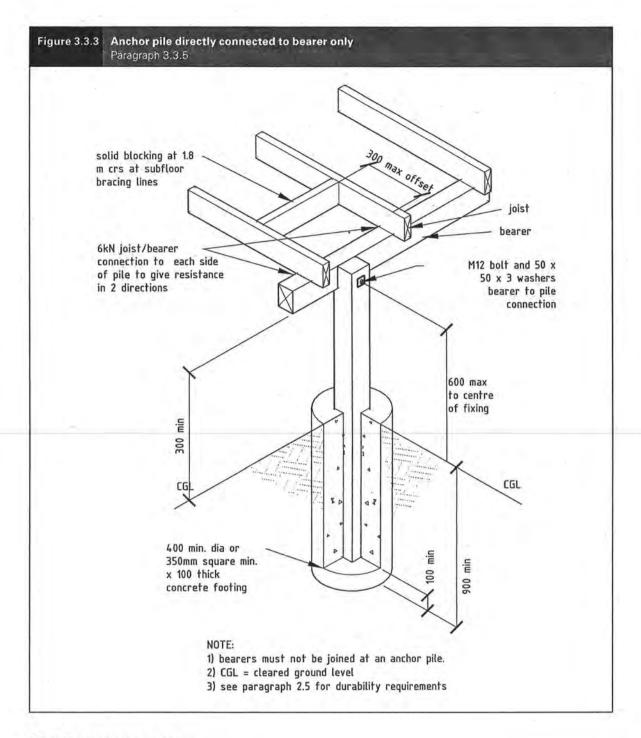


3.3.5 Anchor piles

The fixings of bearers and floor joists to anchor piles shall be M12 bolts or 12 mm threaded rod as shown in Figures 3.3.2 and 3.3.3. Alternative *proprietary fixings* having a *capacity* of 12 kN in tension and compression along the bearer and timber joist may be used.

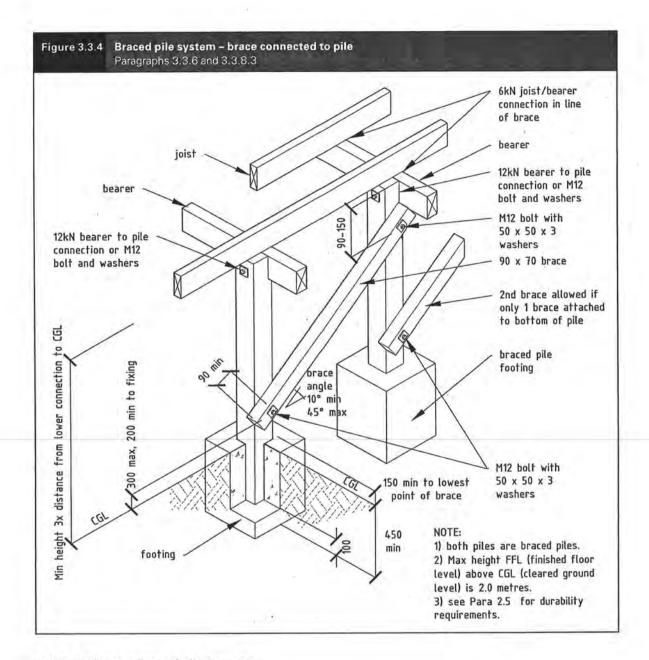

3.3.6 Braced pile systems

3.3.6.1 A braced pile system consists of 2 piles, each with a 450 mm deep *footing*, between which a *diagonal brace* is fixed in accordance with Paragraph 3.3.8 (see Figures 3.3.4 to 3.3.6).

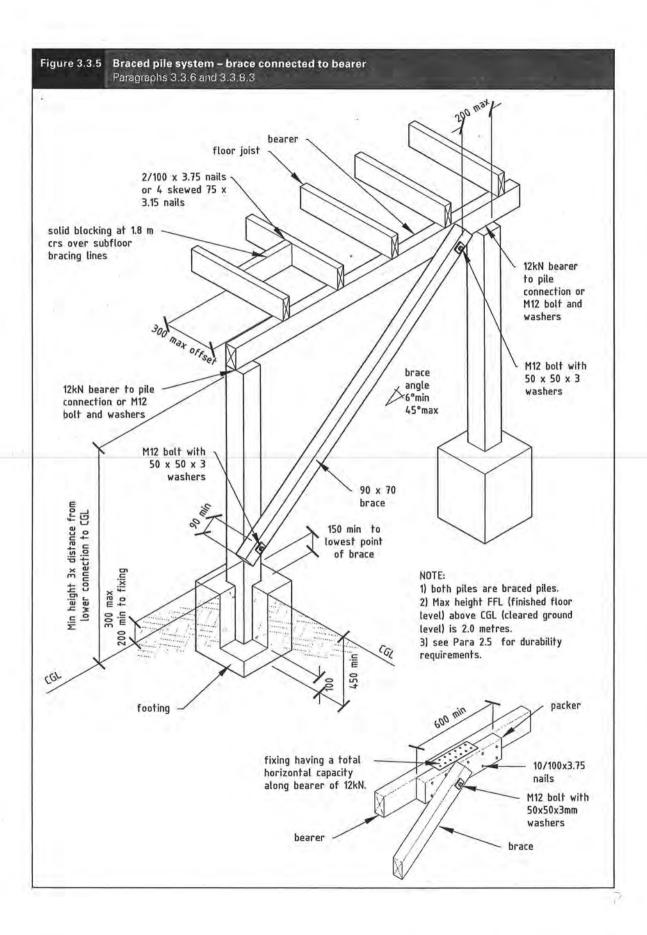


3.3.6.2 Where a braced pile system is repeated as a series of braced piles, with braces sloping in the same direction, it shall be in accordance with Figure 3.3.4.

3.3.6.3 Only one brace shall be attached to the top of a braced pile. Two braces may be attached to the bottom of a braced pile, but only if they are at right angles to each other and not in line.

3.3.6.4 Height

The minimum height of a braced pile above cleared ground level shall be three times the distance from cleared ground level to the lower brace fixing (see Figures 3.3.4 to 3.3.6).



3.3.7 Diagonal braces

3.3.7.1 Diagonal braces shall slope between 10° and 45° to the horizontal except that a minimum slope of 6° may be used when the braces are connected to a bearer or joist.

3.3.7.2 A *diagonal brace* shall consist of one continuous length of 90 x 70 mm timber.

3.3.8 Brace connections

3.3.8.1 A diagonal brace shall be connected at each end by an M12 bolt with a $50 \times 50 \times 3$ mm washer at each end passing through the centre line of the brace not less than 90 mm from its end and at right angles to the brace.

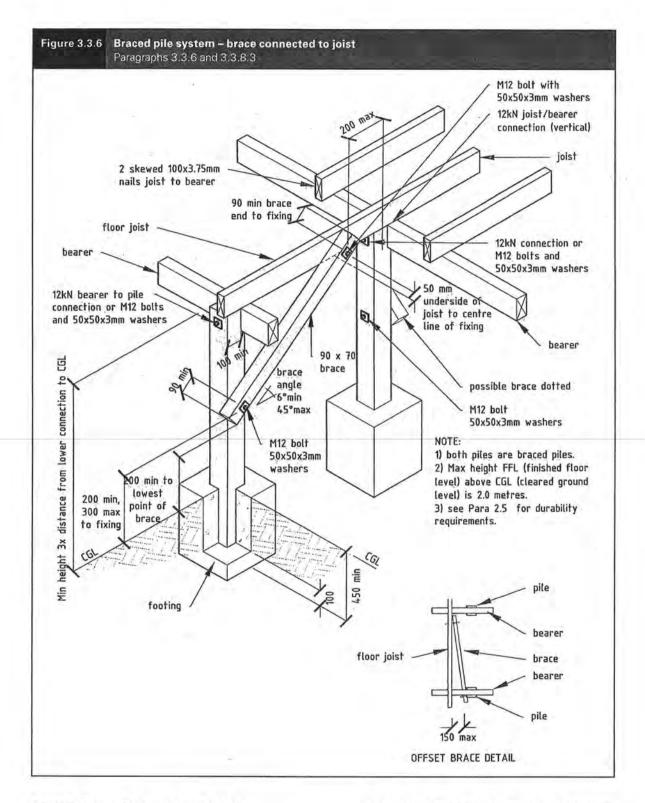
3.3.8.2 Brace, lower end connection

The lower end of the diagonal brace shall be fixed to the bottom of a braced pile by a M12 bolt through the centre line of the pile, between 200 and 300 mm above cleared ground level.

3.3.8.3 Brace, upper end connection

The upper end of the *diagonal timber brace* shall be fixed to one of the following members as set out below.

- (a) Braced pile: the bolt shall pass through the top end of the pile not less than 90 mm, nor more than 150 mm, from the top of the pile. The bolt shall pass through the centre line of the pile (see Figure 3.3.4).
- (b) Bearer: the bolt shall pass through the centre line of the bearer not more than 200 mm measured along the bearer from the centre line of the nearest support (see Figure 3.3.5). Where required for the alignment of the brace, the gap between the bearer and diagonal brace shall be bridged by a timber packer fixed to the bearer with 10/100 x 3.75 mm nails and a fixing having a capacity of 12 kN along the direction of the bearer. The packer shall be the same depth as the bearer and not less than 600 mm long.
- (c) Joist: the bolt shall pass through the joist, not less than 50 mm from its lower edge and not more than 200 mm measured along the joist, from the centre line of the nearest pile (see Figure 3.3.6). The top of the diagonal timber brace shall not be more than 150 mm horizontally out of line from the bottom of the brace (see Figure 3.3.6).



3.3.9 Fixings of bearers and joists

3.3.9.1 The bearer shall be fixed to each braced pile with either:

- (a) a M12 bolt, or
- (b) a proprietary fastener of:

- 12 kN capacity in the horizontal direction where the brace is attached to the pile
- (ii) 12 kN capacity in the vertical direction where the brace is attached to the bearer
- (iii) 12 kN capacity in the vertical direction where the brace is attached to the joist.

3.3.9.2 Where the brace is attached to the pile, two floor joists in the area immediately above the upper end of the brace shall be fixed to the bearer with fixings each having a *capacity* in the horizontal direction of the brace of 6 kN.

3.3.9.3 Where the brace is attached to the joist, the joist to bearer fixing shall have a *capacity* in the vertical direction of 12 kN.

3.3.10 Subfloor bracing

3.3.10.1 Bracing lines

Bracing lines providing horizontal support shall run in two directions at right angles to each other and be located:

- (a) in perimeter subfloor framing
- (b) in internal lines parallel to perimeter subfloor framing
- (c) at not more than 6 m spacing
- (d) in the perimeter of timber deck structures projecting over 2 m from the simple house.

3.3.10.2 Internal bracing lines

Each internal bracing line shall have a bracing capacity not less than 70 bracing units. Bracing shall be evenly distributed along each line.

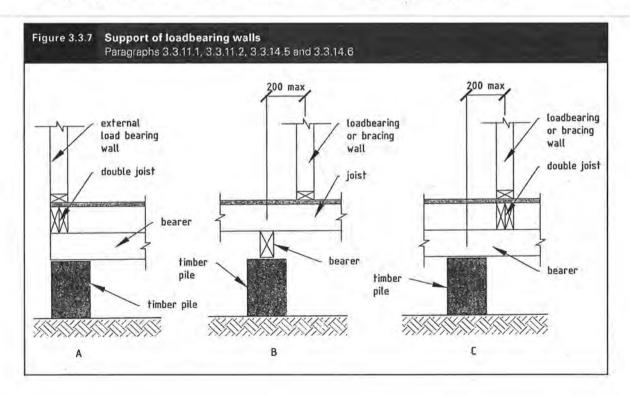
3.3.10.3 External bracing lines

Each external subfloor bracing line shall have a total bracing capacity of not less than 10 bracing units per metre of external wall.

3.3.11 Support of loadbearing and wall bracing elements

3.3.11.1 A bearer shall be provided within 200 mm, centre-to-centre, of *loadbearing* walls immediately above, and which are at right angles to the joists (see Figure 3.3.7B).

3.3.11.2 Where a bearer supports a loadbearing wall or wall bracing elements running parallel to the floor joists, it shall itself be supported by a pile within 200 mm, centre-to-centre, of the loadbearing or bracing wall (see Figure 3.3.7C).

3.4.1 General

Decks shall be constructed with the maximum dimensions of:

- (a) 3 m centre-to-centre from house pile to outer deck pile
- (b) 2 m from cleared ground level to the decking surface.

Stairs from the timber deck to the external ground level are outside the scope of this Acceptable Solution.

Decks from which it is possible to fall 1.0 m or more shall be fitted with a timber barrier in accordance with this section and Figures 3.4.1 to 3.4.4.

Comment:

Designs for an external stair or alternative design solutions for the deck barrier will need separate engineering documentation for the building consent authority to consider.

3.4.2 Materials

The grade, species and preservative treatment for timber in *decks* and barriers (for example the *framing*, posts, rails, *balusters* and *handrail* capping) shall be in accordance with Table 2.7.

Timber decking shall be a minimum 30 mm thick, merchant grade radiata pine treated to Hazard Class H3.2.

All bolt or coach screw fixings shall have a $50 \times 50 \times 3$ mm washer inserted between the timber surface and the head and nut.

All metal components shall comply with Paragraph 2.5. Any steel connections within 600 mm of the *finished ground level* shall be a minimum of Type 304 stainless steel.

3.4.3 Piles

Deck piles shall be minimum 125 x 125 mm timber piles in accordance with Paragraphs 3.3.1 and 3.3.2. Footings shall be as per Paragraph 3.3, which specifies ordinary piles, anchor piles or part of a braced pile system.

3.4.4 Bearers

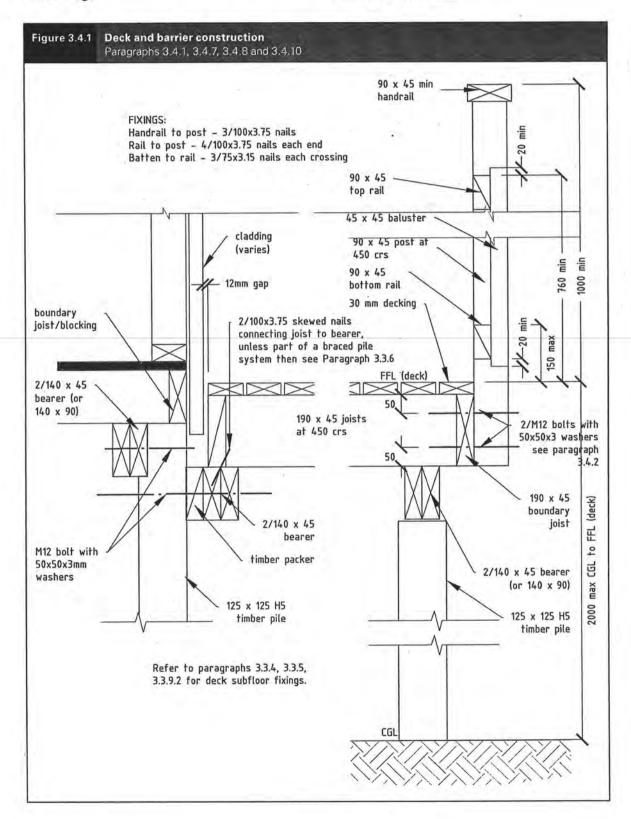
Bearers shall be 2/140 x 45 mm. The maximum span for bearers shall be 1.65 m.

3.4.5 Timber Packer to pile/bearer

Packing to be 140 mm deep where required (width to ensure 12 mm minimum clearance to *cladding*).

3.4.6 Joists

Joists shall be 190 x 45 mm at 450 mm centres, fixed at bearers with 2 skewed 100 x 3.75 mm nails.



3.4.7 Boundary joist

Boundary joists shall be 190 x 45 mm. Where a barrier is installed, the boundary joist shall be fixed to all joists as per Figures 3.4.1, 3.4.2 and 3.4.3.

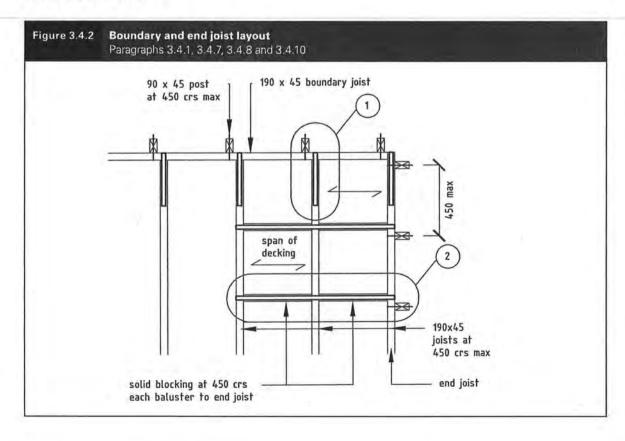
3.4.8 End joist

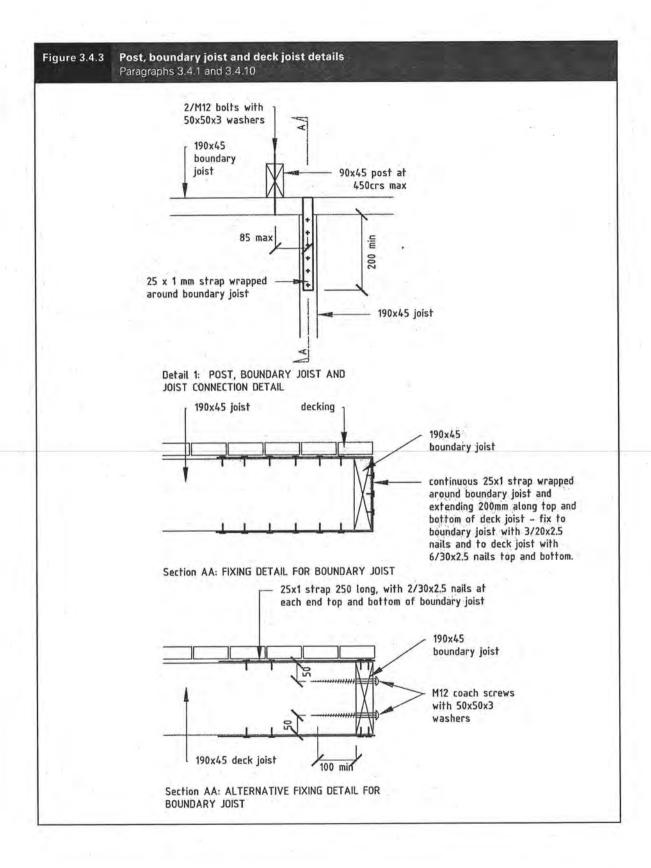
Where a post is fixed to an end joist, 190 x 45 mm solid *blocking* pieces shall be inserted within 85 mm of the post and fixed as per Figures 3.4.1, 3.4.2 and 3.4.4.

3.4.9 Decking

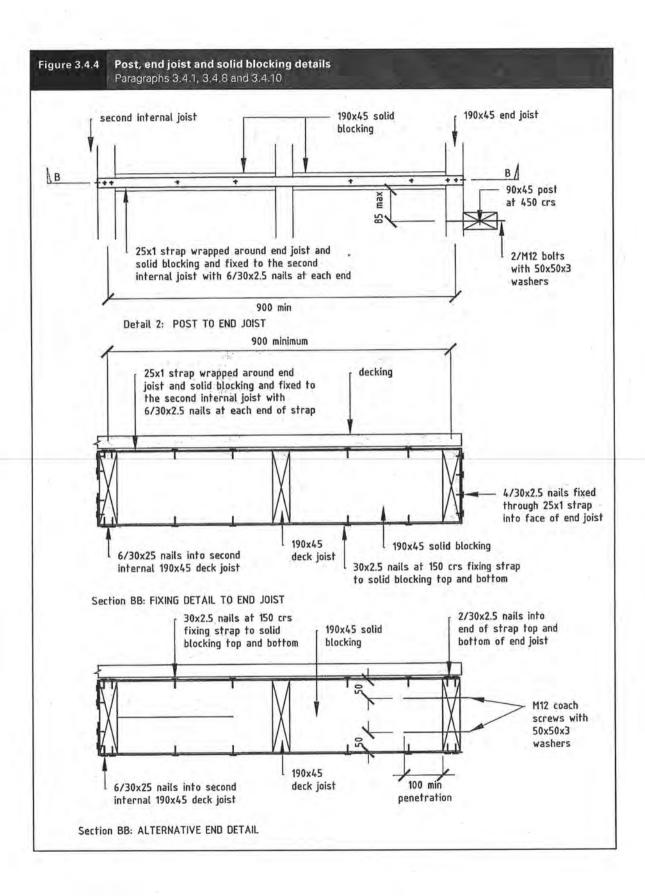
3.4.9.1 Decking shall be minimum 30 mm thick, grip-tread type grooved radiata pine, as per Paragraph 3.4.2.

3.4.9.2 Fix decking with 75 x 3.15 mm annular-grooved decking nails. All decking joints and ends shall be drilled for nailing. Decking shall be spaced minimum 2 mm and fixed at each joist with a minimum of two nails. Joints in decking to be staggered and made over joists.

3.4.10 Post

The barrier shall have 90 x 45 mm posts at 450 mm maximum centres and fixed to *boundary joists* or end joists with two M12 bolts as per Figures 3.4.1 to 3.4.4.

3.4.11 Top rail

The barrier shall have a 90 x 45 mm top rail fixed to the posts with 4 skewed 100 x 3.75 mm nails.

3.4.12 Bottom rail

The barrier shall have a 90 x 45 mm bottom rail fixed to the posts with 4 skewed 100 x 3.75 mm nails.

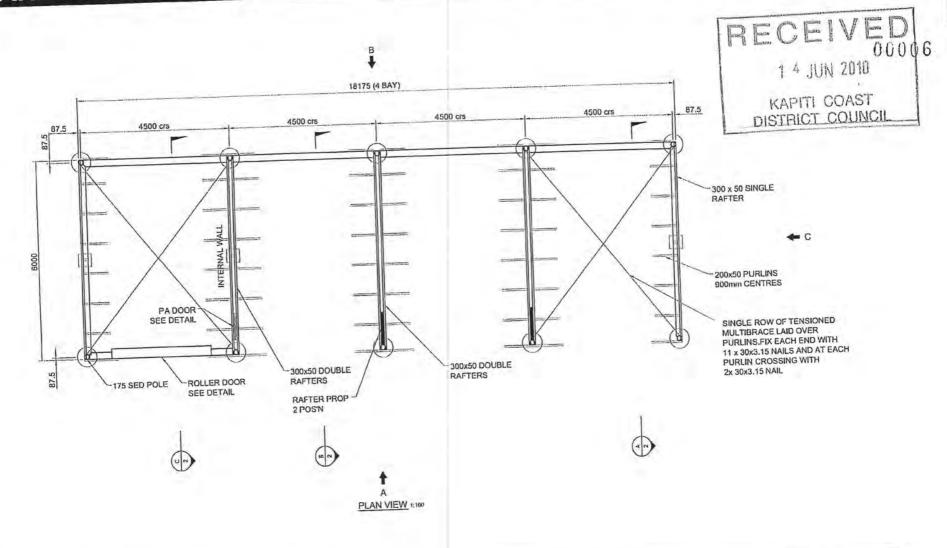
3.4.13 Balusters

Vertical balusters spanning between the rails shall be a minimum of 45×45 mm battens with a maximum of 100 mm gaps between. The battens shall be fixed with $3/75 \times 3.15$ mm nails providing 25 mm minimum penetration to top and bottom rails.

3.4.14 Handrail (capping)

The handrail shall be 90×45 mm (120 mm maximum width) fixed with $3/100 \times 3.75$ mm nails to the top of each post.

INTRODUCTION

This design relates to a bedroom house being built on . The water supply will be provided by a pressure pump from water storage tanks.

Test holes dug in the area of the proposed effluent disposal area reveal of 200 to 300mm of topsoil overlaying a stony clay base which is consistent with soil category 5 as defined in AS/NZS 1547:2000 being a poorly drained light clay requiring a specific engineering design.

Traditional gravity septic tank systems in this area have a history of poor performance largely due to the effluent trenches being constructed below the water table or in the clay layer where the soakage is minimal. This, together with the known faults of traditional septic tank systems, namely, septic tank sludge sealing the natural pores in the ground and gravity fed effluent overloading the soil around the point of entry, have resulted in many septic tank systems failing.

This design seeks to extend the life of traditional septic tank soakage trenches by filtering the effluent and evenly distributing it throughout the effluent trenches using a Low Pressure Effluent Dosing (LPED) system. The effluent will be filtered and demand dosed by an Orenco (OSI) automatic dosing siphon to filter the effluent and distribute it evenly into the topsoil. OSI flow control assemblies are required at the beginning of each trench.

The design criteria is based on AS/NZS 1547:2000 for a 1 bedroom cottage (with 2 occupants) and a 4 bedroom house (to be built at a later date) with up to 6 occupants, each using 140 litres of water per day, giving a total wastewater usage of 1120 litres per day. The effluent disposal area is 400 square metres giving a design loading rate (DLR) of 2.8 litres per square metre per day.

The effluent trenches can be extended in the future if desired or required and a reserve area, of equal size, should be set aside for this purpose. Similarly a secondary sewage treatment system can be added to the septic tank to produce a colourless, odourless effluent. Both the secondary treatment system and/or trench extensions are additional to the work required for this installation

WASTEWATER DESIGN

- 1. The new septic tank shall be 6000 litres in capacity fitted with an ORENCO effluent filter with a sealed access riser brought to the surface. This design incorporates the Innoflow 'Designer' program which uses an ORENCO ('OSI') screened syphon to protect the effluent beds from carry over solids and evenly dose load the effluent trenches. The 'OSI' filter screen reduces the total suspended solids (TSS) from the septic tank to 33 parts per million. Tests from over 4800 septic tanks over a 15 year period confirm the reliability and validity of this filters performance. As this is a proprietary system specifically designed for Orenco products substitution of other brands of effluent filter is NOT permitted.
- Install an ORENCO automatic dosing syphon in the septic tank as detailed in the manufacturers installation instructions (attached).
- Install the 80ø transport line as per the manufacturers instructions (attached) ensuring there that no air locks can form in the pipeline.

- 4. The effluent disposal trenches are to be 8 x 25 metre trenches spaced 2 metres apart as shown on the accompanying plans. This disposal system can also be extended in size in the future if desired or required. The trenches are 200mm deep and 200mm wide with the 32ø pressure pipe laid inside 110ø Novaflow. The Novaflow must be covered with a permeable shade cloth which prevents soil being washed into the Novaflow and is also sufficiently permeable to allow the circulation of air Flushing points situated inside fresh air inlets are to be located at the end of each lateral.
- 5. The laterals are drilled with evenly spaced 3mmØ squirt holes at 2.0 metre centres drilled into the top of the lateral pipes. This ensures the effluent discharge rate from each lateral does not exceed the designed parameter of 1.45 litres per minute and evenly distributes the effluent throughout the trenches.
- Flow control assemblies are to be fitted at the beginning of each trench. If, during installation, the ground levels at the beginning of each effluent trench are found to vary, they must be recorded and communicated to me so I can calculate the correct size hole to be drilled in the flow control discs assemblies.

The Flow Control Assemblies - Hole Sizing Chart is included in this report for this purpose. These holes compensate for the hydraulic differential between disposal trenches at varying levels. If you do not have the correct drill sizes, an engineering workshop may drill the holes for you at is critical the correct sizes be drilled. The flow control details will be forwarded to the Council as an addendum to this design and can be attached to the consent documents.

PLANTING

The owner should prevent stock access to the disposal area by additional fencing as required. This area should be planted with selected trees and shrubs to assist transpiration; a list of suitable plants is attached. As trees transpire a significant volume of water this process is an integral part of effluent disposal. Grass, moderately mown, should complement the planting.

MAINTENANCE

The filter screen and syphon should be inspected on an annual basis and I enclose a leaflet on the maintenance procedure for your information. The siphon base should also be inspected to ensure there is no build up that might inhibit its operation.

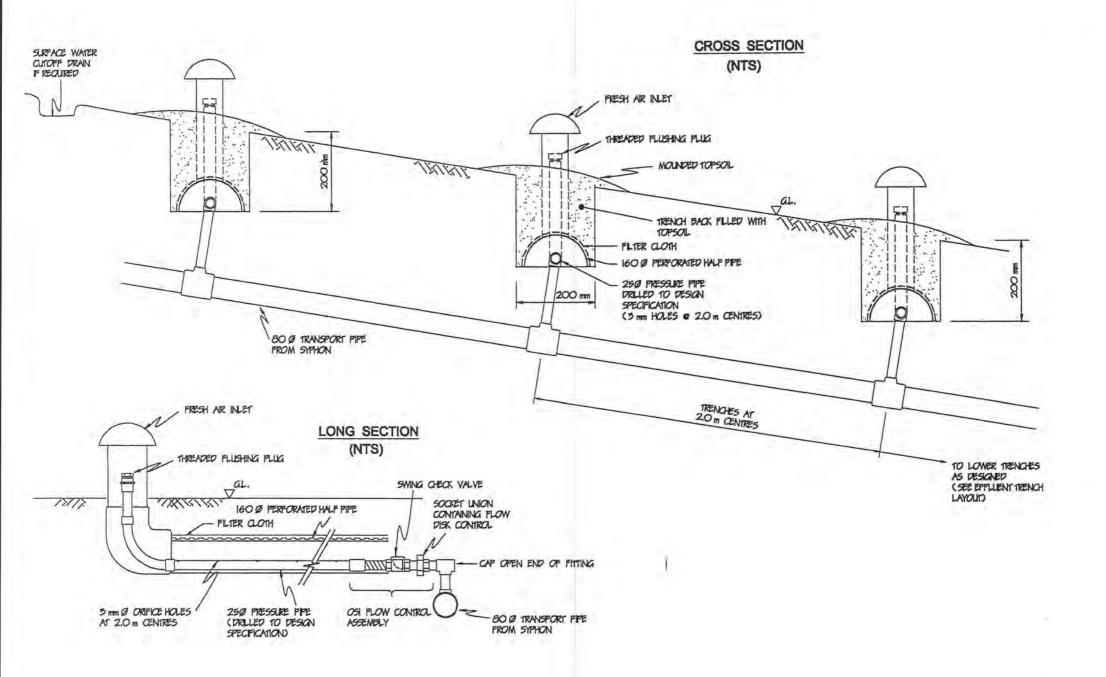
If there is a sediment build up in the siphon base this should be hosed down and the effluent distribution laterals may need flushing. This can be done by opening the flushing points and briefly operating the syphon to clear the lateral lines.

This work is generally carried out by the installing plumber with records of inspections and maintenance being kept as an addendum to the wastewater report.

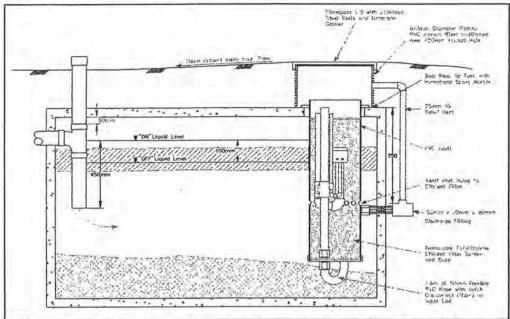


Figure 1: Schematic of Typical Septic Tank With Dosed Discharge Using an OSI Screened Siphon

OVERVIEW

General

The Innoflow Septic Tank Effluent Siphon (STES) kit is designed to provide all the benefits of dose loading and pressure distribution of wastewater, while still keeping with the Innoflow philosophy of low maintenance. The kit should be installed by an Innoflow Trained Installer to ensure the equipment is installed and commissioned according to the manufacturer's specifications.

Equipment Supplied

- Ribbed PVC Riser (610 mm diam by 450 mm) with bolt catchers and 25 mm quick fit rubber grommet
- · Sealing lockable fibreglass lid with two screws and an allen key
- PVC screen vault with screen effluent filter and removable siphon unit (NOTE: the vault and siphon unit should have matching letters)
- Flexible hose discharge assembly with quick release fitting
- 50 mm Tank Discharge pipe
- 50 mm x 25 mm x 80 mm Tee discharge fitting
- 25 mm air relief vent with elbow

Minimum Tankage

- A 3300 ltr septic tank with internal height of 1.4 m. We recommend a 4500 ltr septic tank with internal
 height of 1.6 m. The increased volume improves the tank's performance and the 1.6 m height ensures the
 inlet holes to the screened vault are optimally placed in the clear zone between the sludge and scum layers.
- The tank requires a 450 mm diameter access hole over the outlet end of the tank, approximately 200 mm from the end of the tank.
- The septic tank must be installed level to ensure correct operation of the siphon (+/- 6 mm per m).
- Note that the outlet pipe provided with the kit should be installed 750 mm from the top of the tank.

Installation Overview

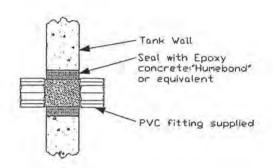
- 1. Fitting the siphon unit inside the screened vault
- 2. Installation of the outlet pipe
- Installation of Riser
- 4. Fit the air relief vent
- 5. Installation of the Vault and discharge hose assembly
- 6. Disposal field setup (NOTE: The transport pipe needs to be a minimum of 80mm diam)
- 7. Startup and testing



INSTALLATION

Step 1. Install the discharge fitting (provided) in the discharge end or side of the septic tank, 750 mm down from the top of the tank

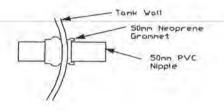
Detail 1 - Concrete Tank



Detail 1 illustrates installation of the fitting in a concrete septic tank.

Cut a 100 mm diameter hole in the tank wall and firmly pack grout around the tank fitting. Use an Epoxy grout like "Humebond" or equivalent.

Detail 2 - Fibreglass or Polyethylene Tank



Detail 2 illustrates installation of the fitting in a fibreglass or polyethylene tank.

Drill a 72 mm diameter hole with a hole saw and insert the 50 mm neoprene grommet, which is provided on request. Lubricate the 50 mm (Pressure Pipe) PVC nipple with gasket lube, silicone or Vaseline and insert it through the grommet.

- Step 2. Apply Teflon tape or pipe dope to thread on all threaded PVC fittings.
- Step 3. Check to be sure the neoprene washer is properly sealed in the pin lug connector on one end of the 50 mm PVC flex hose. Without the washer, the connection will leak and the siphon will not operate.
- Step 4. Connect the end of the hose with the PVC female adaptor to the 50mm PVC fitting inside the septic tank wall. Tighten firmly by hand. Then connect the 50 mm PVC elbow provided to the 50 mm PVC male adaptor protruding from the bottom of the siphon vault.
- Step 5. Lift the free end of the 50 mm PVC flex hose out of the septic tank and attach, by means of the 50 mm pin lug connector, to the 50 mm PVC elbow in the bottom of the vault. Tighten firmly by hand.
- Step 6. The Dosing Siphon is to be suspended in the septic tank and supported from top of the tank by the two support pipes provided. Install the support pipes in the holes in the top of the Siphon's PVC vault, using the screws provided to lock the pipes in position.
- Step 7. Lower the dosing siphon/vault into the empty septic tank.



- Step 8. Pour about 4 litres of water into each open vertical pipe at the top of the dosing siphon assembly. If the traps are not filled at this time, the system will not operate. In addition, be sure the flexible hose is completely filled with water. Any air trapped in the discharge hose will cause erratic behaviour. Place a 200 mm concrete block or similarly weighted object on top of the vault to prevent floating.
- Step 9. Connect the air-relief vent from the air-relief adaptor fitting up and into the riser. When connected to a pipeline the siphon will not operate unless it is vented in this manner.
- Step 10. Run water into the septic tank until the siphon discharges. Discharge occurs when the water level is about 25 mm above the top of the siphon bell dome. Observe the siphon through several cycles. Erratic behaviour usually indicates trapped air either in the flexi hose or in the main transport pipe.
 - ✓ The system is now operational and will continue to function automatically.

Note: 80 mm diameter pipe should be used from the dosing tank to the drainfield, mound, trench, etc. and must slope continuously downward to prevent air-entrapment problems that can cause greatly reduced flow and/or pressure. Test and operate siphon before backfilling transport pipe trench to be sure air-entrapment problems have not occurred.

INSTALLATION IN OPERATIONAL SEPTIC TANKS

CAUTION: The atmosphere in an operational septic tank may be poisonous! It is not necessary nor is it recommended that a person enter the tank. Only licensed septic tank installers should be employed to perform the work.

Installation is the same as for new tanks with these exceptions :

- The tank must be uncovered to provide working room to install the vault and to cut the discharge hole.
- 2. The tank contents must be pumped to bring the liquid level below the discharge hole.
- 3. After the hole is cut into the septic tank, securely fasten one end of the discharge fitting (connected 50 mm male adaptors) to the female adaptor on one end of the 50 mm flex hose. The hose is stiff enough that the end with the discharge fitting can be lowered through the vault hole and pushed out the discharge hole in the end or side of the septic tank. Grout can then be used to seal the discharge fitting in place. Seal off any other discharge pipe in the tank with an expandable dollar plug or cap.



SIPHON MAINTENANCE (Model ST204)

We recommend that a visual inspection be made periodically (perhaps twice annually) to ensure the system is operating. Care should be taken when removing the manhole lid so that leaves or other debris do not fall into the vault thus by-passing the screen and creating a potential for blockage. If the siphon is not dosing, but merely trickling, it can be restarted by lifting the siphon/vault assembly about 300 mm to recharge the bell with air before setting it back in place. Whenever the dosing tank is pumped, the vault and screen should be removed and both should be flushed with a hose. To remove the screen and siphon from the vault, remove the support pipes and unscrew the 20 mm plug. The siphon and screen will now lift out.

Initially the siphon should be inspected once a month to ensure it is operating properly. A battery operated counter connected to a liquid float is the easiest method of monitoring a siphon's activity and is highly recommend for all siphon installations. Not only does a counter allow a quick, easy method of checking a siphon's operation, it also can alert the user to problems such as leaking plumbing fixtures and tank infiltration. Excessive dose cycles are recorded when either of these problems are present. A notepad is recommended to keep a record of monthly counter readings. Without a counter, a visual inspection is necessary and water must be run into the tank until the siphon triggers. Although not difficult, this method is very time consuming and does not allow the user to catch problems such as leaking fixtures.

A high water alarm is not necessary since siphon failure does not result in a high water condition. A high water alarm installed in a tank with a dosing siphon would only be appropriate if there was concern that the downstream components (drainfield, trenches, etc) might plug completely and back up into the dosing tank.

If upon inspection the siphon is not operating properly, it should be monitored weekly for perhaps a couple of weeks once the siphon has been re-started to ensure proper operation is continuing.

The screen should be inspected annually and cleaned if necessary. Normally, the screen will only need to be cleaned when the tank requires solids pumping. If the screen does require cleaning, the following steps should be followed:

- Remove the vault from the tank. Disconnect the hose from the bottom of the vault and remove the support pipes from the top of the vault. Take care not to drop the discharge hose. It is a good idea to fix a string to the end of the hose to prevent this.
- 2. Unscrew the fitting on the side of the vault that holds the siphon in place. Remove the siphon from the vault.
- 3. Slide the screen out of the vault. The siphon, screen, and vault can now be cleaned using a spray nozzle to hose the solids off back into the tank.
- Re-assemble the siphon and vault by following the above steps in reverse, Re-prime the siphon as described next.

RE-PRIMING

If the siphon is removed for cleaning, it will be necessary to re-prime the siphon and refill the hose with water. The siphon is re-primed by filling the 50 mm vertical pipes with about 4 litres of water. If the tank contents are not pumped out the hose must be physically held down while refilling in order to allow air to escape and the hose to sink. A notched length of wood or a bent length of steel bar may aid in holding the hose down while refilling. If the siphon is removed for cleaning and the tank contents are pumped out, both the hose and trap still need to be filled as described above, but the hose will be much easier to fill as it will not have a tendency to float. However, the hose should be visually inspected to see that it is not stuck in a position above the tank outlet as this will cause siphon malfunction.



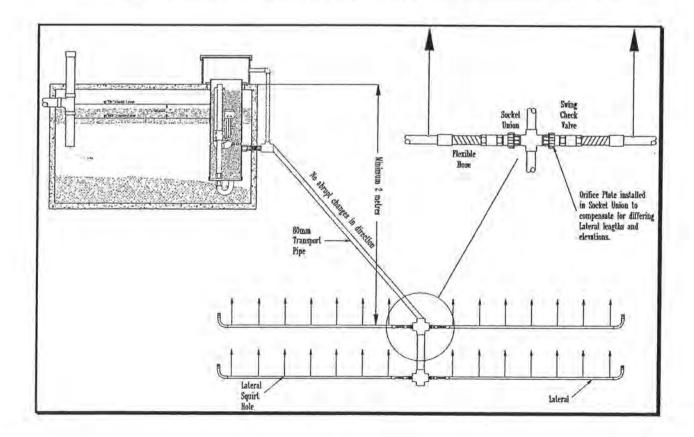
TROUBLESHOOTING

Virtually all siphon failures result with the siphon operating in a dribbling mode. Dribbling occurs when the liquid level stays relatively constant in the tank and the flow rate leaving the tank is equal to or less than the flow rate entering the tank. A dribbling siphon may be caused by one of the following problems:

- 1. A plugged snifter tube or even momentary blockage of the snifter tube.
- 2. A hose that is above the outlet level of the siphon or air that is trapped in the hose.
- 3. High flow rate entering the dosing tank at the same time the siphon is at the end of its discharge cycle.
- A crack in the siphon bell or associated piping. A crack is usually caused by damage in shipping or handling. Please call Innoflow for replacement or instructions to repair damage.

If the siphon loses its prime and starts to dribble rather than dose, it is necessary to re-prime the siphon. If the malfunction was caused from the hose floating, it will also be necessary to sink and refill the hose with water. Re-priming is usually accomplished simply by lifting the Screened Vault Assembly up just enough to expose the bottom of the bell, thereby replenishing the air under the bell necessary for proper operation. It is not desirable to lift the vault completely from the tank as the hose will lose its water and may float in the tank. If the vault is lifted completely from the tank, it will be necessary to refill the hose with water. As described above, the hose must be physically held down while refilling it if the tank is full.

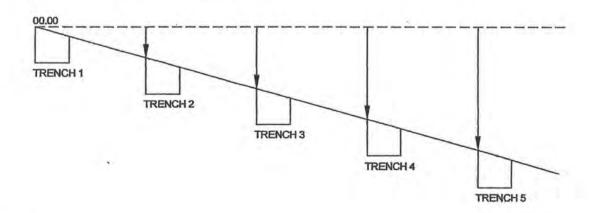
