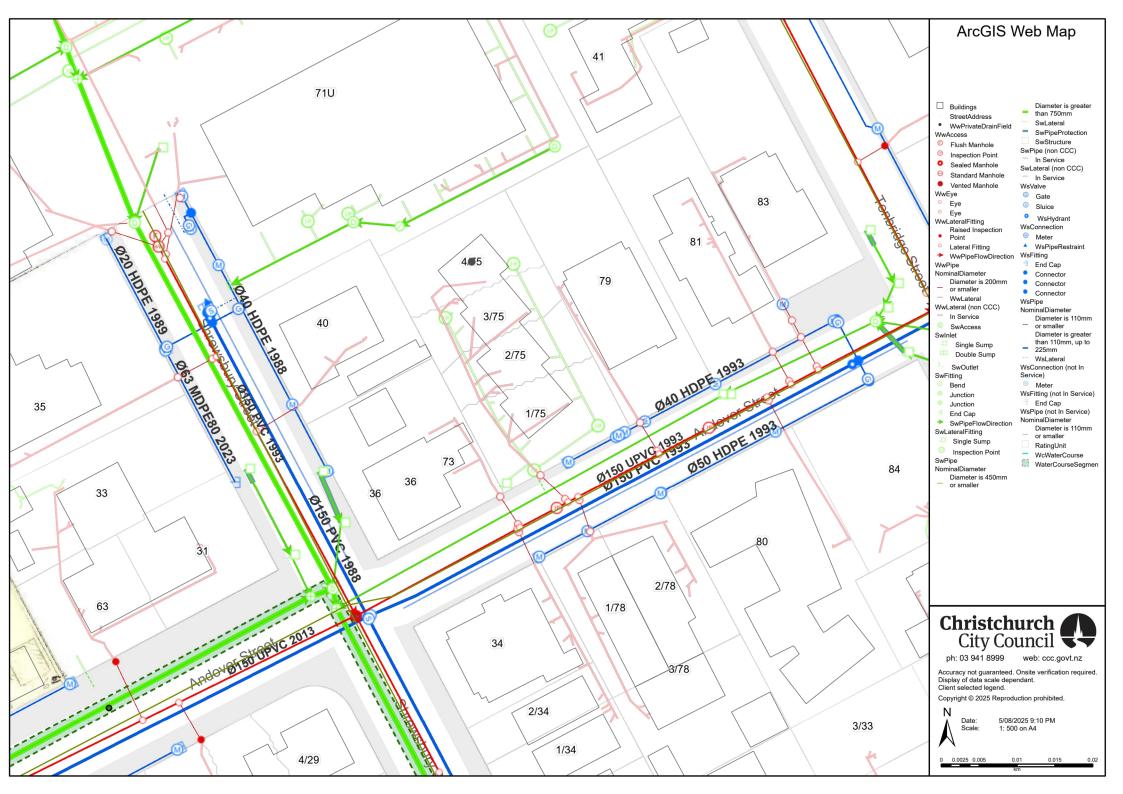

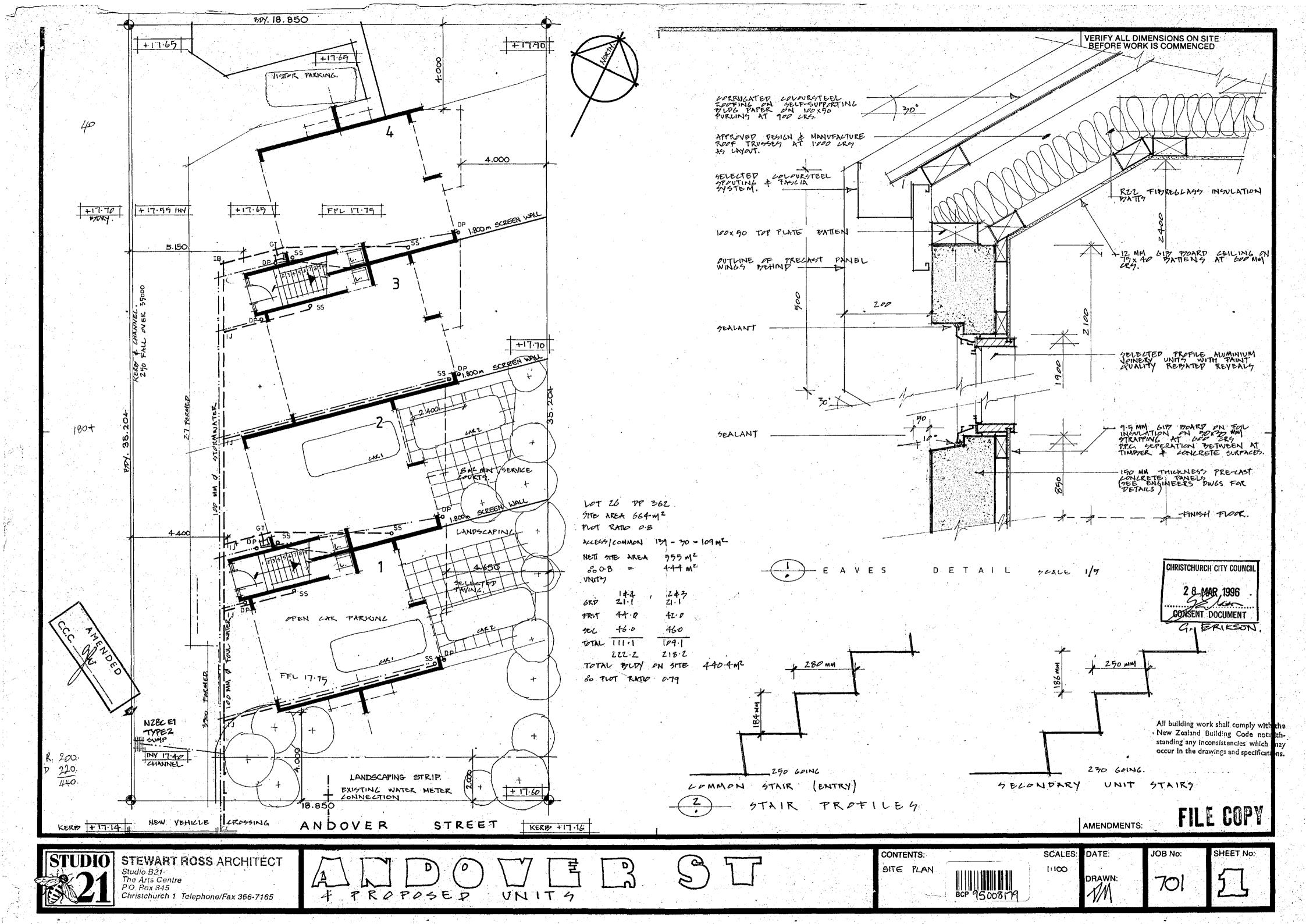

1 INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE OF WORK

SL Engineering Group Limited has been engaged by Peridot Engineering Limited to carry out a geotechnical investigation report at 75 Andover Street, Merivale. This assessment was for investigating and evaluating the subsurface condition and to provide geotechnical recommendation for repairing/ relevelling/ rebuilding the foundation of the existing dwelling.

Geotechnical investigation procedures for the property are as follow:

- Desktop study
 - Review publicly available information of the site from New Zealand Geotechnical Database (NZGD),
 Christchurch City Council (CCC), and Canterbury Maps
- Site investigation including
 - Site walkover
 - Shallow ground investigation (Scala penetrometer tests and hand augers)
 - Deep ground investigation via cone penetration test (CPT).
- Geotechnical Investigation Report
 - Liquefaction hazard assessment based on above geotechnical investigation
 - Provision of geotechnical characterisation of the site.
 - Advice on foundation repair option for the existing dwelling
 - Reporting of investigation findings.

2 SITE DESCRIPTION

2.1 Existing Site Conditions

The site is located on a flat topography and a residential area of the Merivale suburb. Its legal description is "Lot 1 DP 74166". The site has a three-storey dwelling to the section. The total site area is approximately 664 m2.

It is understood that the existing dwelling is going to be repaired to relevel the floor and remained at this section.

3 SITE GEOLOGY

3.1 Published Geology

The soils of the area are designated as Late Quaternary alluvium and colluvium IQd (Refer Geological maps). These are mainly consolidated quartzofeldspathic and mafic-rich sands in fixed dunes, with this sandy clay beds. These soils are of the Holocene Period and tend to be less than 20 thousand years old.

Our onsite soil investigation is similar to the published geology and no major discrepancies have been noted.



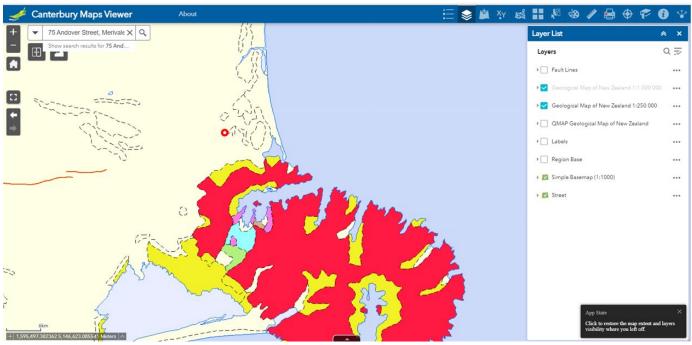


Figure 1: Geological Map of Christchurch

3.2 MBIE Land Classification

The site is currently mapped as "Blue Zone, Technical Category 3, Yellow" as defined by the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) Residential Technical Categories. This indicates that the land has higher probability to have moderate to high land damage from liquefaction in future significant earthquakes.

4 GEOTECHNICAL DESKTOP STUDY

A desktop study has been undertaken by reviewing of available geotechnical information and summarised as follows,

4.1 Minimum Finished Floor Level (FFL)

Based on Christchurch city council flood management map

- The site is not located within the CCC Flood Management Area (FMA).
- Floor levels have been not assessed by the Christchurch City Council (CCC) and a specific floor level has not been given for the site.
- The minimum and average (mean) ground elevation at the property is approximately 12.18m and 12.83m above the Christchurch Drainage Datum.

4.2 Site History

The history of the site has been studied using the details given in Canterbury maps website and summarised below.



<u>Vulnerability to Liquefaction:</u> The vulnerability to liquefaction damage of this site categorised as <u>MEDIUM</u> as shown in the figure below.

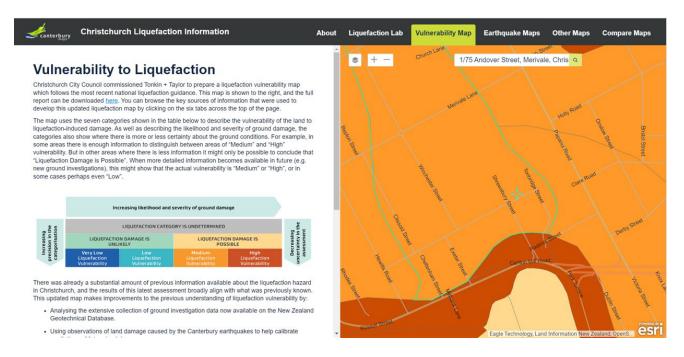


Figure 2: Vulnerability to Liquefaction

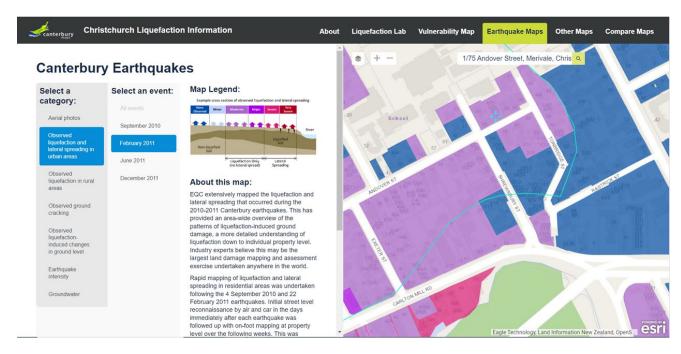


Figure 3: Observed Liquefaction and Lateral spreading in February 2011

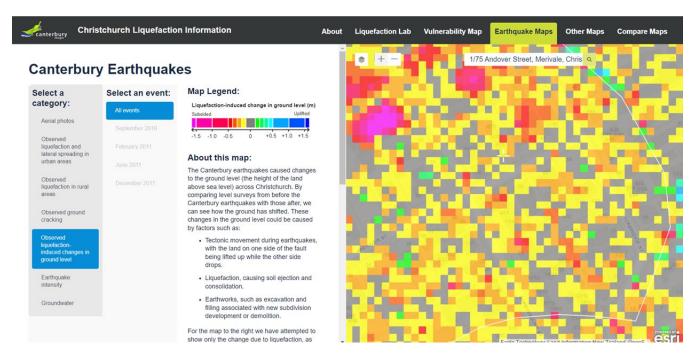


Figure 5: Observed Liquefaction Induced Settlement

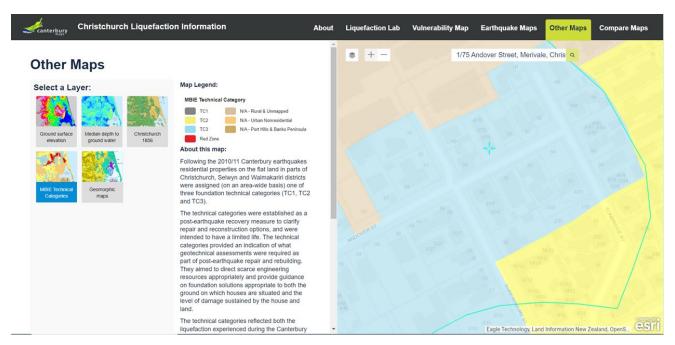


Figure 6: Technical Categories

5 GEOTECHNICAL FIELD INVESTIGATION

5.1 Ground test

Deep ground investigation has been carried out by LandTest Limited (Mcmillan Drilling) on behalf of SL Engineering Group Limited on 22nd September 2022, comprising two Cone Penetrometer Tests (CPT) up to 15m depth from natural ground level.

A shallow ground investigation has been also carried out by Peridot Engineering Limited and Mcmillan Drilling on behalf of SL Engineering Group Limited on 22nd September 2022, comprising of 4 Dynamic Cone Penetrometers (DCPs) and 4 Hand augured bore holes (HA).

5.2 Subsurface Condition

Refer to 'Appendix B' of this report for the CPT locations and the bore logs depicting the soil profile found on site. Totally four scala tests were carried within the development site and the soil profile was plotted for each of them.

As per the CPT and hand augers, 100mm-400mm thickness of topsoil/ undocumented fill was observed at site overlying a 1.2m thick sandy silt layer. A varying thickness of sense sand layer was observed below the sandy silt layer, which was extending up to 3m -6m below the ground level. A 2m thick clayey silt and silty clay layer was observed below the dense sand layer and overlaying a thick of dense Sand layer. The cone resistance of CPTs was reached slightly more than 20 MPa below 10m from the ground level before it was terminated at 15m.

5.3 Ground Water Conditions

Ground water was encountered at hand auger 4 and CPT location at approximately 1200mm – 1500mm below the ground level, which is matching with the CPT test results.



5.4 Site Walkover Field Inspection

A site visit was undertaken by SL Engineering on 22nd September 2022 to study the site condition and observe for other features. There were no hummocks, cracks, soil scarp, deep seated or shallow seated failures noted on the site.

5.5 Slope Stability

The site is on a flat topography. Slope stability (static) shall not be an issue. The historic aerials of the property from Geomaps and Google Earth, show that no slope instability features were noted on the site or in the immediate area next to the site.

6 INVESTIGATION RESULTS

6.1 Seismic Coefficients

The input Peak Ground Acceleration (PGA) for the models was obtained from NZS 1170 standard, for a temporary condition with 500-year return period, with subsoil **class D**, and Importance Level (IL) of 2. From these, the following PGA has been adopted for the liquefaction analysis.

6.2 Seismic Subsoil Classification

The site's subsoil classification has been assessed based on our site investigation results and the known geology of the area, in accordance with New Zealand Standard for Structural Design Actions NZS1170.5:2004. The site subsoil classification is considered to be **Class D- Deep soil**.

6.3 Soil Liquefaction Assessment

Susceptibility to cyclic liquefaction of non-plastic soils and cyclic softening of plastic soils has been assessed using in-situ CPT data in the vicinity of the property.

Analyses were carried out using proprietary software CLiq (Geologismiki) and followed the methodology of the MBIE guidelines. The structure importance level of the building is IL2, taken from NZS 1170:

The following methods have been adopted for the soil liquefaction assessment:

- Cone penetration test-based soil liquefaction triggering method (Boulanger and Idriss 2014);
- Liquefaction strength of materials (Olson & Stark; Ozener 2013);
- Seismic induced settlement of liquefiable layers using the method proposed by Zhang et al (2002).

The summary of the liquefaction assessment result is summarised in the table below.

Appendix B presents the determined potential liquefiable and cyclically softened ground layers for the site.

6.4 Lateral Deformation

Based on the procedure outlined by the MBIE (2012), an assessment of the global lateral movement of the site and lateral stretch across the building footprint have been undertaken as follow.

From the data obtained from Canterbury map as per figure 3 above, there is not significant lateral spreading was observed from the seismic events happened between September 2010 and December 2011.

6.5 Summary of Structural Assessment

A structural assessment was carried out by Peridot Engineering Limited on 18 March 2022 on this property. The assessment report is attached in appendix C of this report. The summary and conclusion of the site assessment as follows.

Multi-unit Residential dwelling

- 1) Existing Foundation Type Type C2 slab on grade foundation with Timber-framed suspended timber floor spanning between the precast panel.
- 2) The overall floor level variation across the entire foundation of this multi-unit complex, based on a common datum, was 76mm with the floor slopes exceeding general construction tolerance.
- 3) Localised floor slopes exceeding 1: 200 (0.5%) throughout the dwelling.
- 4) Evidence of previous cracking to the concrete slab foundation was observed during site investigation. As per the Scope of Works by EQC crack repairs had been carried out to the concrete slab-on-grade foundation in the garage of each flat; however, cracking damage to the internal slab was still observed.
- 5) Globally, the foundation showed a sloping pattern towards the north and east of the dwelling

Conclusion by Peridot

The multi-unit complex on this property has likely sustained moderate earthquake-related damage and the floor level variation across the multi-unit complex can be attributed to the CES. Peridot is of the opinion that foundation of the multi-unit complex needs to be fully re-levelled.

7 RECOMMENDATIONS

7.1 Foundation Remediation

Based on the information provided by Peridot assessment report and our site walkover, the existing building observed to be a three-storey concrete wall structure with ground floor garage and suspended floor upper level. SL Engineering could not observe the foundation during the site walkover as the foundation was recessed below the existing ground finish level. However, by engineering experience, this type of precast panel with light weight suspended timber floor building likely to have a strip footing underneath the precast panel with ground floor slab on grade system.

MBIE guidelines does not applicable for the above three-storey concrete wall building. However, based on the site investigation and geotechnical desktop study, SL Engineering is of the opinion that the foundation re-levelling option for the dwelling can be considered from a geotechnical perspective.



Based on the information from the structural assessment and measured floor levels, the foundation appears have settled all around the perimeter. Therefore, from a geotechnical perspective and for the future performance, we are of the opinion that full perimeter foundation beam lifting is recommended to relevel the floor levels

Foundation Relevelling

The foundation system can be fully re-levelled by mechanical lifting using portable jacks and/or screw piles. The lifting sequence need to be detailed by a qualified chartered structural engineer and Appendix A1 of the MBIE Guidance: Part A, Appendix A1.1.3 can be used as a reference. The underpinning pad should be design by a qualified chartered structural engineer according to the bearing pressure specified in section 7.2 of this report.

For the lifting using the portable jacking, the excavation should be 900mm below the ground level. The excavation base needs to be compacted using hand equipment and backfilled with 300mm thick no-fines concrete before placing the jacking pad on top of it. The excavation base should be at least 200mm bigger than the pad size on four sides. The base of the excavation needs to be compacted using hand equipment before placing no fines concrete. The underpinning excavation should be monitored prior to pouring concrete by a geotechnical engineer to confirm if there is no evidence of organic /soft soil. If mechanical jacks are used to relevel, the jacking pits should be filled with grout.

Lifting using screw piles, the base of the screw pile should be terminated between 3m and 4m below the ground level to avoid punching failure during liquefaction.

If any alternative dwelling foundation re-levelling methodologies are considered, please contact us for further advice from a geotechnical perspective.

Foundation re-levelling works using portable jacks may cause a differential settlement up to 30mm – 50mm (between flat 1 and flat 4) during future earthquakes. It is recommended to use a screw pile to re-level the building and use it as a permanent support if the above-mentioned differential settlement and total settlement is hard to accommodate into the building.

7.2 Structural Design Parameters

The following parameters to be considered for structural design calculations on the subject property:

Soil bulk density of fill
 Internal friction angle of existing material (φ')
 Ultimate Bearing Capacity @ 600mm bgl (qult)
 Material reduction factor for bearing capacity
 0.5 (Static)
 0.6 (Seismic)

1. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE OF ENGAGEMENT

Peridot Engineering Limited (Peridot) has been engaged by Eddie Clark (Flat 1), Jan & Marc Roberts (Flat 2), Todd & Rochelle Giles (Flat 3), and Gerald & Jo Lieshout (Flat 4) to act as an independent engineering expert in relation to a non-invasive inspection of the residential property located at 75 Andover Street, Merivale, Christchurch 8014.

This report outlines the findings of our investigation, our review of the documents provided, opinions and recommendations based on our findings in our capacity as an independent engineering consultant.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

Peridot has been requested to undertake a non-invasive inspection of the residential building at above address. The purpose of the inspection was to determine the extent of damage caused as a result of the series of seismic events since the September 2010 event and to provide an independent professional engineering repair strategy to address the damage identified.

In order to assist in developing our opinion, Peridot has completed the following activities:

- 1. A site inspection completed on 01 February 2022, including the following:
 - a. Visual inspection to confirm characteristics and overall dimensions of the building.
 - b. Non-intrusive survey of the building including:
 - Floor and ceiling level survey using Zip-Level Pro-2000.
 - Wall verticality survey using SmartTool Digital 1200mm Level.
 - General visual damage survey.
 - Amenity slope survey (windowsills, bench tops and door heads) where necessary.

3. PROPERTRY DESCRIPTION

3.1 SITE DESCRIPTION

The site is located in an existing residential subdivision in Merivale, Christchurch, and has a flat topography. No site-specific geotechnical investigation was undertaken as part of this assessment.

The site is classified as "Green Zone, Technical Category 3, blue" area as given by the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE). The MBIE states that moderate to significant land damage from liquefaction is possible on TC3 land in future significant earthquakes.

EQC liquefaction and lateral spreading observations obtained from the Canterbury Geotechnical Database show "No observed ground cracking or ejected liquified material" following the September 2010 earthquake events and "No lateral spreading but minor to moderate quantities of ejected material" following the February 2011 earthquake events.
