





Becoming an owner

You must tell the body corporate that you have become the owner of a lot in the scheme within 1 month of settlement. You can do this by using the BCCM Form 8 Information for body corporate roll. Fines may apply if you do not comply.

How to get more information

You can inspect the body corporate records which will provide important information about matters not included in this certificate. To inspect the body corporate records, you can contact the person responsible for keeping body corporate records (see below), or you can engage the services of a search agent. Fees will apply.

However, by-laws cannot regulate the type of residential use of lots that may lawfully be used for residential purposes. You should read the by-laws before signing a contract.

The by-laws that apply to the scheme are specified in the community management statement for the scheme provided to you by the seller.

Lot entitlements are used to determine the proportion of body corporate expenses each lot owner is responsible for. The community management statement contains two schedules of lot entitlements –a contribution schedule of lot entitlements and an interest schedule of lot entitlements, outlining the entitlements for each lot in the scheme. The contribution schedule lot entitlement for a lot (as a proportion of the total for all lots) is used to calculate the lot owner's contribution to most body corporate expenses, and the interest schedule lot entitlement for a lot (as a proportion of the total for all lots) is used to calculate the lot owner's contribution to insurance expenses in some cases. Lots may have different lot entitlements and therefore may pay different contributions to the body corporate's expenses.

It is acceptable for only one office holder (Director or Secretary) of a Corporate Entity to execute on behalf of the Corporation in this instance, as by doing so they confirm they are signing as Agent on behalf of the Corporation and hold the requisite authority to do so - Refer to Part [45-2070-4] of the Land Title Practice Manual. The name and A.C.N of the corporation must be included in the 'Entity' field.

Body Corporate Manager under Chapter 3, Part 5 means a Body Corporate Manager appointed under Chapter 3, Part 5 of the respective Module Regulations to perform the functions of the body corporate committee. SCHEDULE C BY-LAWS

1. Noise, nuisance and behaviour

- (1) The occupier of a lot must not create noise likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of a person lawfully on another lor or the common property.
- (2) An occupier must not use, or permit the use of, a lot or the common property in a way that:
 - (a) causes a nuisance of hazard;
 - (b) interferes unreasonably with the use and enjoyment of another lot; or
 - (c) interferes unreasonably with the use or enjoyment of the common property.
- (3) An occupier must exercise effective control over any children while on scheme land as to ensure they comply with by-law 1(2).

2. Vehicles

- (1) The occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval -
 - (a) park a Vehicle, or allow a Vehicle to stand on the common property; or
 - (b) permit an invitee to park a Vehicle, or allow a vehicle to stand on the common property except for the designated visitor parking which must remain available at all times for the sole use of visitors Vehicles
- (2) An approval under section (1) must stake the period for which it is given with the exception of designated visitor parking.
- (3) However, the body corporate may cancel the approval by giving 7 days written notice to the occupier with the exception of designated visitor parking.

3. Towing

(1) In the event that an owner or occupier breaches by-law 2(1) the Body Corporate may, at its discretion and via its duly appointed committee, authorise and appoint a company (the Company) to place a

notification (the notification) on the offending Vehicle requesting the owner or occupier remove the offending Vehicle from the prohibited area, within 24 hours.

- (2) In this event, the Body Corporate and its duly appointed committee will not be responsible for any further actions associated with the placement of the notification. Any dispute will be a matter exclusively between the owner or occupier and the Company.
- (3) In the event that an owner or occupier continues to breach by-law 2(1) by failing to remove the offending Vehicle (irrespective of the notification being given), the Body Corporate may, at its discretion and via its duly appointed committee, authorise and appoint the Company to carry out the removal of the offending Vehicle from the scheme land. In this event the Body Corporate will not be responsible for any further actions associated with the removal or retrieval of such Vehicle. Any dispute will be a matter exclusively between the relevant owner or occupier and the Company.
- (4) The Body Corporate and its duly appointed committee will not be held liable for any charges, costs or invoices associated with the Company's services. The matter will be exclusively between the relevant owner and occupier and the Company.
- (5) The Body Corporate and its duly appointed Committee will not be held liable for any action performed pursuant to the abovementioned by-laws.

Vehicle means any type of car, motor bike or other form of transport which the Committee (acting reasonably) designates as a 'vehicle' from time to time.

4. Electric Vehicle charging

- (1) An owner or occupier must ensure that all charging devices used are compliant and are stored in a safe manner within the manufacturer's specifications and not used in a way which would cause a hazard or increase the risk of harm, injury or damage to persons or property.
- (2) An owner or occupier must only charge an Electric Vehicle within his/her own allocated garage space.
- (3) An owner or occupier must not, without the Body Corporates' written approval, use the common property power to charge an Electric Vehicle.
- (4) An owner or occupier must not, without the Body Corporates' written approval, install a charging device/charging station on their lot or the common property.

Electric Vehicle means all types of vehicles powered by electricity, including but not limited to electric cars, electric motorcycles, electric scooters, electric skateboards, electric hover boards and any other equivalent means of electric transportation.

5. Obstruction

The pathways and driveways on the common property and any easement giving access to the scheme land shall not be obstructed by any of the proprietor or occupiers or invitees or licensees of lots or used by them for any purpose other than the reasonable ingress to and egress from their respective lots and to and from their exclusive use areas (if any) and no proprietor or occupier of a lot shall park of stand or permit to be parked or stood upon common property (other than the part of the common property over which the proprietor or occupier has exclusive use) any vehicle except with the consent in writing of the body corporate.

6. Damage to lawns etc.

- (1) The occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval-
 - (a) damage a lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or flower on the common property, or
 - (b) use a part of the common property as a garden.
- (2) An approval under subsection (1) must state the period for which it is given.
- (3) However, the body corporate may cancel the approval by giving 7 days written notice to the occupier.

7. Damage to common property

(1) An occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval, mark, paint, drive nails, screws or other objects into, or otherwise damage or deface a structure that forms part of the common property.

- (2) However, an occupier may install a locking or safety device to protect the lot against intruders, or a screen to prevent entry of animals or insects, if the device or screen is soundly built and is consistent with the colour, style and materials of the building.
- (3) The owner of a lot must keep a device installed under subsection (2) in good order and repair.

8. Behaviour of invitees

- (1) A proprietor or occupier of a lot must take all reasonable steps to ensure that the invitees of the proprietor or occupier do not behave in a way likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of another lot or the common property.
- (2) A proprietor of a lot which is the subject of a lease or licence agreement shall lake all reasonable steps, including any action available under any such lease or licence agreement, to ensure that any lease or license or other occupier of the lot or their invitees employees and agents comply with the provisions of the by-laws.
- (3) The proprietor or occupier of a lot shall be liable to compensate the body corporate in respect of all damage to the common property or personal property vested in it caused by an invitee of the proprietor or occupier of their invitees.
- (4) Where these by-laws restrict the behaviour or activity of a proprietor or occupier there shall be imposed upon that proprietor or occupier the obligation not to cause or permit that behaviour or activity.

9. Leaving of rubbish on the common property

The occupier of a lot must not leave rubbish or other materials on the common property in a way or place likely to interfere with the enjoyment of the common property by someone else.

10. Appearance of lot

- (1) The occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval, make a change to the external appearance of the lot unless the change is minor and does not detract from the amenity of the lot and its surrounds.
- (2) The occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval -
 - (a) hang washing, bedding or another cloth article if the article is visible from another lot or the common property, or from outside the scheme land; or
 - (b) display a sign, advertisement, placard, banner, pamphlet, or similar article if the article is visible from another lot or the common property, or from outside the scheme land.
- (3) This section does not apply to a lot created under a standard format plan of subdivision.

11. Storage of flammable materials

- (1) The occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval, store a flammable substance on the common property.
- (2) The occupier of a lo must not, without the body corporate's written approval, store a flammable substance on the lot unless the substance is used or intended for use for domestic purposes.
- (3) However, this section does not apply to the storage of fuel in -
 - (a) the fuel tank of a vehicle, boat or internal combustion engine; or

(b) a tank kept on a vehicle or boat in which the fuel is stored under the requirements of the law regulating the storage or flammable liquid.

Garbage disposal

- (1) Unless the body corporate provides some other way of garbage disposal, the occupier of a lot must -
 - (a) keep a receptacle for garbage in a clean and dry condition and adequately covered on the lot, or
 on a part of the common property designated by the body corporate for the purpose;
 - (b) store the general refuse wheelie bins within each occupier's gate.
- (2) The occupier of a lot must -
 - (a) comply with all local government local laws about disposal of garbage; and
 - ensure that the occupier does not, in disposing of garbage, adversely affect the health, hygiene
 or comfort of the occupiers of other lots.
 - (c) Ensure that they, in disposing of garbage, do not leak garbage fluids onto the common property. The occupier must clean any leakage on the common property from the disposal of garbage as soon as reasonably practical.
- (3) The Body Corporate shall be responsible for internal (on site) collection of refuse anti recyclables from the common property. To this extent the Body Corporate shall:-
 - enter into an agreement with the Brisbane City Councils City Waste Services to provide a bulk bin collection service to the common property;
 - indemnify Brisbane City Council and its agents in respect of any damage to the pavement and other driving surfaces; and
 - (c) shall notify future owners of individual lots that the developments has been approved on the basis that an indemnity for refuse collection vehicles to enter the property.

13. Keeping of animals

- (1) An occupier must not, except with the committee's written approval:
 - (a) bring or keep an animal on a lot or the common property; or
 - (b) permit an invitee to bring or keep an animal on a lot or the common property.
- (2) An approval given under this by-law may be given on conditions, as the committee considers reasonable and appropriate in the circumstances.
- (3) In seeking approval, an occupier must provide to the committee such information which the committee reasonably requests in order to consider the application, including (however not limited to) information going to the animal's species, colour, name, health, history, registration and vaccination status, and exhibited behaviours.
- (4) In addition, any approval will always be subject to the following conditions:
 - the animal must be kept within the lot and/or exclusive use area (ensuring however that the animal
 does not cause a nuisance to other occupiers and is suitably contained within such area);
 - (b) the animal must be restrained or carried when leaving or entering the lot;
 - (c) the animal must not be allowed to urinate or defecate on common property;
 - (d) the animal must be domesticated;
 - (e) the animal must be toilet trained;
 - (f) any mess caused by the animal must be cleaned up, including ensuring any offensive smells are eliminated as soon as possible;
 - (g) the animal must be kept free of vermin and disease;
 - (h) the animal must be properly groomed;

 if requested by the committee, the owner of the animal must supply a veterinary certificate as to the animal's health;

- the animal must not make any noise or cause any disturbance that is likely to interfere with the
 enjoyment of the occupier of another lot or any person lawfully using the common property;
- (k) all local government requirements must be complied with as regards the animal (including as regards registration of the animal).
- (5) An occupier must comply with any reasonable request of the committee to ensure that all applicable conditions of approval are met. If any conditions are not met, the approval may be withdrawn by the committee, however the committee must first give the occupier a reasonable opportunity to respond to any contravention of the conditions.
- (6) Continued confirmed complaints regarding an animal may result in the approval being withdrawn.
- (7) An application for written approval for an animal under by-law 13(1)(a) by an occupier, who is not the owner, must be accompanied by a consent from the owner of the lot.
- (8) This by-law does not apply to a person who has a right to be accompanied by a guide, hearing or assistance dog under the *Guide*, *Hearing or Assistance Dogs Act 2009*.
- (9) Where an animal is approved pursuant to this by-law, that approval will not apply to any replacement or additional animal/s. Upon the passing of a prior approved pet the owner/occupier must seek a new approval for any future animal.
- (10) Prior approvals given will not be affected by this by-law.
- (11) For the purpose of this by-law, a reference to an 'animal' includes (but is not limited to) dogs, cats, fish, birds, snakes, lizards and crustaceans.

14. Recovery of Body Corporate

If the body corporate expends money to make good damage caused by a breach of the Act or of these by-laws by any proprietor or by any tenants, guests, servants, employees, agents, children, invitees or licensees of the proprietor or any of them the body corporate may recover the amount so expended as a debt in any action in any court of competent jurisdiction from the proprietor of the lot at the time when the breach occurred.

15. Illegal Use of a Lot Prohibited

A proprietor or occupier or a lot must not use (or permit) the lot or the common property for any illegal, unlawful or immoral purpose.

16. Duties of a Proprietor

A proprietor or occupier of a lot ("the lot") must:

- (1) Permit the body corporate and its agents, at all reasonable times on notice (except in case of emergency when no notice shall be requited), to enter the lot for the purpose of inspecting the same and maintaining, repairing or renewing pipes, wires, cables and ducts for the time being existing in the lot and capable of being used in connection with the enjoyment of any other lot or common properly, or for the purpose of ensuring that the by-laws are being observed.
- (2) Forthwith carry out all work that may be ordered by any competent public authority or local government in respect of the lot other than such work as may be for the benefit of the building generally, and pay all rates, taxes, charges, outgoings and assessments that may be payable in respect of the lot;
- (3) Repair and maintain the lot in good and repair, (reasonable wear and tear and damage by fire, storm), and keep the lot clear and free of vermin infestation;
- (4) Only use and enjoy the common property in such a manner as will not unreasonably interfere with the use and enjoyment thereof by other proprietors or tenants or their invitees, licensees, employees, servants and agents;
- (5) Not use the lot (or permit) the same to be used in such manner or for such purpose as shall cause a nuisance or hazard to any occupier of another lot (whether a proprietor or not) or the associates and staff of such occupier;

(6) Notify the body corporate forthwith upon any change of ownership, lease or sub-lease, or of any mortgage or other similar dealing in connection with the lot;

- (7) Not without the consent in writing of the body corporate or the relevant government authority, as necessary, perform any works or erect any structure to allow the same in on or to the lot which will in any way alter the external appearance of the building or the layout and construction of the services being the property of the body corporate:
- (8) Not allow outside radio or television aerials or telecommunication reception dishes or bowls or other similar apparatus to be erected without written permission of the body corporate;
- (9) Not allow any structural alteration to be made to any lot, (including any alteration to gas, water or electrical installations) without the prior permission in writing of the body corporate (other than as may be allowed in accordance with the Act or the regulation module applicable to the Community Titles Scheme) or the relevant government authority), as necessary;
- (10) Not allow any extended blinds or awnings (other than those installed and incorporated by the original proprietor in the development of the building) to be erected without the prior consent in writing of the body corporate;
- (11) Ensure that the windows in the lot are kept clean, and ensure those windows are promptly repaired with fresh glass of the same kind and weight as at present it the window glass becomes broken or cracked in any case where the replacement of such broken or cracked glass is not the responsibility of the body corporate;
- (12) Not waste water, and shall ensure that all water taps in the lot or on common property are properly turned off after use;
- (13) Give to the body corporate prompt notice of any accident to or defect in the water pipes, gas pipes, electric installations or fixtures in the lot which comes to his knowledge, and allow the body corporate full authority (by its agents or servants) in the circumstances having regard to the urgency involved, to examine or make such repairs or renovations as they may deem necessary for the safety and preservation of the building as often as may be necessary;
- (14) Give a copy of these By-laws to the lessee or tenant or other occupier of any lot;
- (15) Not do anything on a lot or on common property which might prejudice or increase the cost of any insurances held by the body corporate.

17. Pipes and Drains

The water closets, conveniences and other water apparatus (including waste pipes and drains installed in the lots and in the common property) shall not be used for any purpose other than the purpose for which they were constructed, and no sweepings or rubbish or other unsuitable substance shall be deposited therein. Any damage or blockage resulting to such water closets, conveniences and water apparatus (including waste pipes and drains installed in the lots and in the common property) from misuse or negligence, irrespective of whether the damage or misuse is caused by such proprietor's own actions or those of his tenants, servants, employees, agents, invitees or licensees shall be the responsibility of the owner.

18. Air-Conditioning

- (1) Air-conditioning units switching the lots are located within the relevant lot and are the property of the proprietor of the lot.
- (2) The air-conditioning units are to be maintained by the proprietor of the lot and at the proprietor's cost.
- (3) The air-conditioning units are not to be moved or removed without the consent of the body corporate.

19. Exclusive use for courtyard

(1) The proprietor of Lots 1 & 2 have the exclusive use of the area shown in Schedule E in the First Community Management Statement for Rocmar and the sketch plan marked "A" to the said Schedule E. Title Reference 50572115 Page 11 of 14

(2) The proprietor and occupier enjoying from time to time the exclusive use of the courtyard area shall keep and maintain that part of the common property to which the proprietor and/or occupier is entitled to use exclusively clean and tidy and generally in good order, maintenance and repair to the same extent as the duties that are otherwise imposed upon the Body Corporate pursuant to the provisions of the Act and Regulations Mode.

(3) The exclusive use are referred to in by-law 19(1) may be used for courtyards only.

20. Balconies and Terraces

All balconies and terraces shown on the approved drawings and document, are to remain unenclosed with no shutters, glazing, louvres or similar permanent structures other than those clearly depicted on the approved drawings.

21. Screening to Air-Conditioning Units

A proprietor of a Lot or the Body Corporate as the case may be shall maintain suitable screening to all air conditioning units, lift motor rooms, plant and service facilities located at the top of or on the external face of the building with materials that are consistent with materials used elsewhere on the facade of the building. In particular, ensure that any proposed external air conditioning units positioned within individual balcony areas are screened at all times from any location outside the site.

22. Smoking

- (1) An owner, occupier of invitee must not Smoke on the common property.
- (2) An owner, occupier or invitee must not Smoke anywhere on scheme land (including, but not limited to, on common property and within a lot (including on a balcony, terrace or courtyard of a lot)) so as to:
 - (a) cause a nuisance or hazard to another owner, occupier or invitee;
 - (b) interfere unreasonably with the use and enjoyment of another lot; or
 - (c) interfere unreasonably with the use or enjoyment of the common property.
- (3) Any Smoke drift caused by an owner, occupier or invitee must not cause an unreasonable interference, nuisance and/or hazard to another owner, occupier or invitee's use and enjoyment of another lor or common property.

Smoke means, to hold or otherwise have control over an ignited smoking product (including vapes and similar products)






