This certificate contains important information about the lot and community titles scheme named in the certificate, including:

- becoming an owner and contacting the body corporate
- details of the property and community titles scheme
- by-laws and exclusive use areas
- lot entitlements and financial information
- owner contributions and amounts owing
- common property and assets
- insurance
- contracts and authorisations

This certificate does not include information about:

- physical defects in the common property or buildings in the scheme;
- body corporate expenses and liabilities for which the body corporate has not fixed contributions;
- current, past or planned body corporate disputes or court actions;
- orders made against the body corporate by an adjudicator, a tribunal or a court;
- matters raised at recent committee meetings or body corporate meetings; or
- the lawful use of lots, including whether a lot can be used for short-term letting.

Search applicable planning laws, instruments and documents to find out what your lot can be used for. If you are considering short-term letting your lot, contact your solicitor, the relevant local government or other planning authority to find out about any approvals you will need or if there are any restrictions on short-term letting. It is possible that lots in the community titles scheme are being used now or could in future be used lawfully or unlawfully for short-term or transient accommodation.

### The community management statement

Each community titles scheme has a community management statement (CMS) recorded with Titles Queensland, which contains important information about the rights and obligations of the owners of lots in the scheme. The seller must provide you with a copy of the CMS for the scheme before you sign a contract.

### Becoming an owner

When you become an owner of a lot in a community titles scheme, you:

- automatically become a member of the body corporate and have the right to participate in decisions about the scheme;
- must pay contributions towards the body corporate's expenses in managing the scheme; and
- must comply with the body corporate by-laws.

You must tell the body corporate that you have become the owner of a lot in the scheme within 1 month of settlement. You can do this by using the BCCM Form 8 –Information for body corporate roll. Fines may apply if you do not comply.

### How to get more information

You can inspect the body corporate records which will provide important information about matters not included in this certificate. To inspect the body corporate records, you can contact the person responsible for keeping body corporate records (see below), or you can engage the services of a search agent. Fees will apply.

Planning and development documents can be obtained from the relevant local government or other planning authority. Some relevant documents, such as the development approval, may be available from the body corporate, depending on when and how the body corporate was established.

### Building management statement

A building management statement is a document, which can be put in place in certain buildings, that sets out how property and shared facilities are accessed, maintained and paid for by lots in the building. It is an agreement between lot owners in the building that usually provides for supply of utility services, access, support and shelter, and insurance arrangements. A lot can be constituted by a community titles scheme's land.

## By-laws and exclusive use areas

The body corporate may make by-laws (rules) about the use of common property and lots included in the community titles scheme. You must comply with the by-laws for the scheme. By-laws can regulate a wide range of matters, including noise, the appearance of lots, carrying out work on lots (including renovations), parking, requirements for body corporate approval to keep pets, and whether smoking is permitted on outdoor areas of lots and the common property. However, by-laws cannot regulate the type of residential use of lots that may lawfully be used for residential purposes. You should read the by-laws before signing a contract.

### What by-laws apply?

The by-laws that apply to the scheme are specified in the community management statement for the scheme provided to you by the seller.

The community management statement will usually list the by-laws for the scheme. If the statement does not list any by-laws, Schedule 4 of the Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997 will apply to the scheme.

In some older schemes, the community management statement may state that the by-laws as at 13 July 2000 apply. In these cases, a document listing the by-laws in consolidated form must be given with this certificate.

### General by-laws

Individual lots may be granted exclusive use of common property or a body corporate asset, for example, a courtyard, car park or storage area. The owner of a lot to whom exclusive use rights are given will usually be required to maintain the exclusive use area unless the exclusive use by-law or other allocation of common property provides otherwise.

## Lot entitlements and financial information

### Lot entitlements

Lot entitlements are used to determine the proportion of body corporate expenses each lot owner is responsible for. The community management statement contains two schedules of lot entitlements – a contribution schedule of lot entitlements and an interest schedule of lot entitlements, outlining the entitlements for each lot in the scheme. The contribution schedule lot entitlement for a lot (as a proportion of the total for all lots) is used to calculate the lot owner's contribution to most body corporate expenses, and the interest schedule lot entitlement for a lot (as a proportion of the total for all lots) is used to calculate the lot owner's contribution to insurance expenses in some cases. Lots may have different lot entitlements and therefore may pay different contributions to the body corporate's expenses.

You should consider the lot entitlements for the lot compared to the lot entitlements for other lots in the scheme before you sign a contract of sale.

## Owner contributions (levies)

## Common property and assets

When you buy a lot in a community titles scheme, you also own a share in the common property and assets for the scheme. Common property can include driveways, lifts and stairwells, and shared facilities. Assets can include gym equipment and pool furniture.

The body corporate is usually responsible for maintaining common property in a good and structurally sound condition. An owner is usually responsible for maintaining common property or assets that their lot has been allocated exclusive use of, or for maintaining improvements to common property or utility infrastructure that is only for the benefit of their lot. The body corporate may have additional maintenance responsibilities, depending on the plan of subdivision the scheme is registered under. ### Sinking fund forecast and balance - maintenance and replacement of common property / assets

The body corporate must have a sinking fund to pay for future capital expenses, such as repairs or replacement of common property and assets. The body corporate must raise enough money in its sinking fund budget each year to provide for spending for the current year and to reserve an amount to meet likely spending for 9 years after the current year. If there is not enough money in the sinking fund at the time maintenance is needed, lot owners will usually have to pay additional contributions.

Prior to signing a contract, you should consider whether the current sinking fund balance is appropriate to meet likely future capital expenditure.

## Contracts and authorisations

### Caretaking service contractors and letting agents – Accommodation Module, Commercial Module and Standard Module

A body corporate may engage service contractors to provide services to the body corporate to assist in the management of the scheme.

If the Standard Module, Accommodation Module, or Commercial Module apply to a community titles scheme, the body corporate may also authorise a person to conduct a letting agent business for the scheme, that is, to act as the agent of owners of lots in the scheme who choose to use the person's services for the letting of their lot.

A service contractor who is also authorised to be a letting agent for the scheme is called a caretaking service contractor. Together, an agreement to engage a person as a caretaking service contractor and authorise a person as a letting agent is typically referred to as 'management rights'.

The maximum term of a service contract or authorisation entered into by a body corporate is:

- 10 years if the Standard Module applies to the scheme; and
- 25 years if the Accommodation Module or Commercial Module applies to the scheme.

You may inspect the body corporate records to find information about any engagements or authorisations entered into by the body corporate, including the term of an engagement or authorisation and, for an engagement, duties required to be performed and remuneration payable by the body corporate.

**SCHEDULE C BY-LAWS****1. DEFINITIONS**

**Act** means the *Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997*.

**Invitee** means any person on the scheme land with the permission of an Occupier.

**Occupier** means an owner of a lot, a tenant of a lot, a licensee of a lot, or any person resident in a lot.

Words and phrases defined in the *Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997* have the same meaning in this document unless the context indicates otherwise.

**2. INTERPRETATION**

Unless expressed to the contrary:

- (a) words importing:
  - (i) the singular include the plural and vice versa;
  - (ii) any gender include the other genders;
- (b) if a word or phrase is defined, cognate words and phrases have corresponding definitions;

(c) a reference to:

- (i) a person includes a firm, association, trust, partnership, body, instrumentality or entity whether incorporated or not, corporation and a government or statutory body or authority;
- (ii) a person includes legal personal representatives, successors, substitutes and permitted assigns;
- (iii) a statute, ordinance, code or other law includes regulations and other statutory instruments under it and consolidations, amendments, re-enactments and replacements of any of them;
- (iv) a right includes a benefit, remedy, discretion, authority or power;
- (v) an obligation includes a warranty or representation and a reference to a failure to observe or perform an obligation includes a breach of warranty or representation;
- (vi) writing includes any mode of representing or reproducing words in tangible and permanently visible form and includes facsimile transmissions;
- (vii) any thing is a reference to the whole or any part of it and any reference to a group of things or persons is a reference to any one or more of them;
- (viii) an obligation on the part or for the benefit of two or more persons will be deemed to bind or benefit as the case may be, them jointly and each of them severally;

(d) headings are included for convenience only and do not affect the interpretation of these by-laws;

(e) in interpreting these by-laws, no rules of construction will apply to the disadvantage of a party because that party was responsible for the drafting of these by-laws or any part of them.

### 3. NOISE

- (a) An Occupier must not create any noise likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of any person lawfully on another lot or the common property.
- (b) Occupiers leaving or returning to a lot late at night or early in the morning must do so with minimum noise.
- (c) Invitees leaving after 11.00 pm must be requested by the Occupier of the lot to leave quietly.
- (d) An Occupier must take all necessary steps (e.g. by closing all doors, windows and curtains) to minimise annoyance to other Occupiers and Invitees caused by unavoidable noise.

### 4. VEHICLES

- (a) The Occupier of a lot must not, without the body corporate's written approval:
  - (i) park a vehicle, or allow a vehicle to stand, on the common property; or
  - (ii) permit an Invitee to park a vehicle, or allow a vehicle to stand, on the common property, except for the designated visitor parking which must remain available at all times for the sole use of visitors vehicles.
- (b) An approval under clause 4(a) must state the period for which it is given, with the exception of designated visitor parking.
- (c) However, the body corporate may cancel the approval by giving seven (7) days written notice to the Occupier, with the exception of designated visitor parking.

**5. OBSTRUCTION/NUISANCE**

- (a) An Occupier must not obstruct the lawful use of the common property by any other person.
- (b) An Occupier must not cause a nuisance or act in such a way so as to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of any person lawfully on another lot or using the common property.

**6. DEPOSITING RUBBISH, ETC. ON THE COMMON PROPERTY**

An Occupier must not deposit or throw upon the common property or any other lot any rubbish, dirt, dust or any other material likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of a person lawfully on another lot or using the common property.

**7. GARBAGE DISPOSAL**

- (a) Unless the body corporate provides some other method of garbage disposal, the Occupier must keep a receptacle for garbage in a clean and dry condition in the garage contained on the lot or on a part of the common property designated by the body corporate for that purpose.
- (b) The Occupier must:
  - (i) comply with all local government laws about the disposal of garbage; and
  - (ii) ensure that in disposing garbage, the Occupier does not adversely affect the hygiene, health or comfort of other Occupiers.

**8. DAMAGE TO LAWNS ETC. ON COMMON PROPERTY**

An Occupier must not without the body corporate committee's written consent:

- (a) damage any lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or flower growing on the common property; or
- (b) use any part of the common property as a garden.

**9. DAMAGE TO COMMON PROPERTY**

- (a) An Occupier must not (without the body corporate committee's written consent) mark, paint, drive nails, screws or other objects into, or otherwise damage or deface any structure that forms part of the common property.
- (b) This by-law does not prevent an Occupier (or person authorised by an Occupier) from installing:
  - (i) any lock or other safety device to protect a lot against intruders; or
  - (ii) any screen or other device to prevent the entry of animals or insects upon a lot;

provided the device or screen is soundly built and is consistent with the colour, style and materials of the building and is maintained in a state of good and serviceable repair by the Occupier.

**10. ALTERATIONS TO LOT**

- (a) An Occupier must not (without the prior written consent of the body corporate committee and/or written approval of the local authority) alter the external appearance of a lot or make any structural alterations to a lot.
- (b) An alteration to the external appearance of a lot or a structural alteration to a lot includes but is not limited to the erection of external blinds, awnings, pergolas, external aerials, changes to utility infrastructure (including gas, water or electrical installations), the installation of an air-conditioning unit.

**11. WINDOW COVERINGS**

An Occupier must not have any window covering (including curtains, blinds, venetians or roller shades) visible from outside the lot unless the window coverings have a neutral backing or the body corporate committee has approved the design in writing.

**12. APPEARANCE OF LOT**

An Occupier must not (without the prior written consent of the body corporate committee) paint, affix or display any sign, advertisement, notice, poster, placard, banner, pamphlet or similar article or hang any washing, towels, clothing, bedding or other articles (except on any clothes lines provided for the purpose of hanging laundry) on any lot or common property in such a way as to be visible from another lot, the common property or outside the scheme land. Provided however while the original owner remains an Occupier of any lot, the original owner may affix or display any sign, advertisement or notice for the purpose of offering any lot for sale or lease.

**13. MAINTENANCE OF LOTS**

Every Occupier is responsible for the interior maintenance and decoration of its lot and must ensure that each lot is kept and maintained so as not to allow infestation by vermin or insects or to be offensive in appearance to other Occupiers. Windows must be kept clean and any broken windows must be promptly replaced (with glass of a similar standard) by the Occupier of the lot (at their expense).

**14. STORAGE OF FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS ETC.**

An Occupier must not (without the body corporate committee's prior written consent) bring on to, or store in a lot or on the common property anything which would increase the rate of fire insurance on the lot or the scheme land or which may conflict with any insurance policy upon the scheme land or the laws/regulations relating to fires or the regulations or ordinances of any public authority.

**15. KEEPING ANIMALS**

- (a) Subject to section 143 of the Act, an Occupier must not without the body corporate committee's prior written consent:
  - (i) bring or keep any animal (including birds, fish, insects, reptiles, livestock, cats, dogs or poultry) on a lot or the common property; or
  - (ii) permit an Invitee to bring or keep an animal (including birds, fish, insects, reptiles, livestock, cats, dogs or poultry) on any lot or the common property.
- (b) Any consent of the body corporate committee may be:
  - (i) given on conditions; and
  - (ii) withdrawn at any time.

**16. BEHAVIOUR OF INVITEES**

- (a) Occupiers must take all reasonable steps to ensure their Invitees do not behave in a manner likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of a person lawfully on another lot or the common property or in a way that is likely to result in a breach of these by-laws.
- (b) Occupiers will be liable to compensate the body corporate for all damage to the common property caused by their Invitees.

**17. USE OF LOTS**

Each lot must be used for residential purposes only and not for any illegal, unlawful or immoral purpose or for any purpose, which may interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of a person lawfully on another lot or the common property.

**18. RECOVERY BY BODY CORPORATE**

Where the body corporate spends money to repair damage caused by a breach of the Act or of these by-laws by any Occupier or Invitee then the body corporate is entitled to recover (from the owner of the lot from which the Occupier or Invitee came) the amount spent as a debt in any court action.

**19. RECOVERY OF COSTS**

An Occupier must pay on demand (to the body corporate) the body corporate's costs and expenses (including legal costs calculated on a solicitor and own client basis) of and incidental to:

- (a) the recovery of levies or any other money the body corporate is entitled to receive from the Occupier; and
- (b) all proceedings, including legal proceedings, taken against the Occupier (and concluded in favour of the body corporate) including, but not limited to, applications for an order by the commissioner.

These amounts are recoverable by the body corporate as a liquidated debt.

**20. EXCLUSIVE USE - COURTYARDS / GARDENS**

- (a) The owner of each lot is granted the exclusive use of that part of the common property for the purpose of a courtyard/garden as identified in Schedule E and on the attached sketch plan marked "A". Each owner to whom exclusive use of a courtyard/garden has been granted pursuant to this by-law shall use the courtyard/gardens for recreational purposes only and shall be responsible for keeping the courtyard/garden in a clean and tidy condition and shall also be responsible for the repair, maintenance and replacement of the courtyard/garden.

**21. POST BOXES**

An Occupier must regularly clear their post box.

**22. FURTHER DUTIES OF OCCUPIERS**

An Occupier must:

- (a) give to the body corporate committee prompt notice of any accident to or defect in the mains, pipes, wires, cables or ducts which form part of the water, sewerage, drainage, gas, electricity and telephone system or service or any other system or service of the building and must allow the body corporate full authority by its agents or servants to examine or make repairs or renovations which are deemed necessary for the safety and preservation of the building;
- (b) permit the body corporate and its servants, agents and contractors at all reasonable times on one day's notice (except in case of an emergency when no notice will be required) to enter a lot for the purpose of inspecting the interior of the lot and testing or carrying out works or effecting repairs on mains, pipes, wires, cables or ducts which form part of the water, sewerage, drainage, gas, electricity and telephone system or service or any other system or service of the building or for the purpose of ensuring that these by-laws are being observed. The body corporate in exercising this power must ensure its servants, agents and contractors cause as little inconvenience as is reasonable in the circumstances;
- (c) carry out all work that may be ordered by any competent public or local authority other than work that is for the building generally;
- (d) give to the body corporate committee prompt notice of any defect in the common property or any body corporate assets;

- (e) in the event of any infectious disease occurring on any lot and which requires notification by any statute, regulation or ordinance, the Occupier must give written notice and other required information to the body corporate committee and must pay to the body corporate any expenses incurred by the body corporate in disinfecting the lot and the other parts of the building and replacing any articles or things the destruction of which may be rendered necessary by such disease;
- (f) observe the terms of any notice displayed on the common property by the body corporate or any statutory authority;
- (g) not permit any auction sale to be conducted on or to take place upon any lot or the common property without the prior written consent of the body corporate committee;
- (h) before moving any heavy furniture, or equipment into or out of any lot give notice to the body corporate committee and must move the same during normal daylight hours and do so with minimum interference to other Occupiers;
- (i) not instruct any contractors or workmen employed by or on behalf of the body corporate;
- (j) if the Occupier wishes to lodge a complaint or application or to bring any matter to the attention of the body corporate committee address the written complaint, application or matter to the secretary of the body corporate or to the body corporate manager;
- (k) not use any water closets, conveniences and other water apparatus including waste pipes and drains installed in any lot and/or the common property for any purpose other than for which they were constructed and must not deposit any sweepings, rubbish or other unsuitable substances into these fixtures; and
- (l) not waste water and must ensure that all water taps in a lot or on the common property are turned off after use.

#### **23. APPROVALS BY BODY CORPORATE COMMITTEE**

Any approval given by the body corporate committee is valid for the period stated in the approval or until such time as the approval is cancelled by the body corporate committee.

#### **24. DISPLAY OF BY-LAWS**

A copy of these by-laws must be exhibited in a prominent place in any lot that is not occupied by the owner of the lot.

#### **25. BALCONY AND TERRACE AREAS**

All balconies and terraces forming part of the Lots must remain unenclosed, with no shutters, glazing, louvers or similar permanent structures other than those which may be approved by the Brisbane City Council and which are consistent with the relevant Brisbane City Plan 2000 – Residential Code (or the successors to that document).

#### **26. GARDENING**

- (a) The Body Corporate will ensure a Gardner attends to the property (common and exclusive areas and street footpath) every fortnight in spring/summer and monthly in winter/autumn. This includes mowing, weeding, trimming and general tidy.

#### **27. TERMITE INSPECTIONS**

The Body Corporate will ensure inspections are undertaken for each lot by a qualified Termite Professional, on periodic time frames and in accordance with any Warranty on Termite Protection products.

## 28. COUNCIL APPROVAL

The Development is to be maintained in accordance with Brisbane City Council Approval Number A001810037 including the following Conditions of Approval:

### Approval Condition 8

#### Community Management Statement

Any Community Management Statement for this site is to contain the following requirements:

- (a) All balconies and terraces shown on the approved drawings and documents, are to remain unenclosed with no shutters, glazing, louvers or similar permanent structures other than those consistent with the Brisbane City Plan 2000 – "Residential Design – Lot Density, Character and Low-medium Density Code" and clearly depicted on the Approved Drawings and Documents.
- (b) The driveway, associated landscaping and vehicle turning areas as shown on the approved plan(s) of layout shall form part of the common property and shall not be designated for the exclusive use of any dwelling unit.
- (c) Provision on site for four (4) visitors' car parking spaces that are to remain available for use at all times by bona-fide visitors, guests or invitees of the tenants of all units, and are not included within an exclusive use area or lot entitlement.
- (d) Directional visitors' parking signage at the vehicle entrance to the site adjacent to or clearly visible from the vehicle entrance to the site.
- (e) Visitors' car parking bays are not to be fitted with a roller door, gate or similar device preventing access to visitor parking bays.
- (f) No gates or similar devices are to be placed at the vehicle entry of the development preventing vehicle access to the site.
- (g) A suitable lighting system to operate from dusk to dawn for the driveway between the vehicle entrance to the site and the visitors' car parking space.
- (h) Maintenance of the acoustic fencing along the western boundary of the site (adjacent to the driveway) and the eastern boundary of the site (adjacent to the visitors' car spaces) as indicated on Site Plan H401-01 B dated 7/6/08.
- (i) Refuse and recyclable bins are to be stored within the individual garages and to be collected from the nominated refuse collection points.
- (j) All sealed traffic areas must be cleaned as necessary to prevent emissions of particulate matter.
- (k) Maintain the acoustic damping of any metal grills, metal plates or similar which are subject to vehicular traffic, so as to prevent environmental nuisance.
- (l) Screening for any externally mounted air conditioning or mechanical plant installations in accordance with the following requirements:
  - (i) No unscreened installations on the proposed development are to be visible from the surrounding sites; and
  - (ii) Any installations which are required to be located on roof, wall or garden areas are to be appropriately screened or shaped according to the acoustic requirements of this development package and so as to integrate in a complementary manner with the overall design of the roof, wall or garden area in which the installation is to be located.

### Approval Condition 11(b)

#### Access to Visitors' Car parking Space(s)

Visitors' car parking bay(s) is/are not to be fitted with a roller door, gate or similar device preventing access to the bay(s).

### Approval Condition 11(c)

#### Vehicle Access to Site

No gates or similar devices are to be placed at the vehicle entry of the development preventing vehicle access to the site.

Approval Condition 19**Fixed Screening to Windows and Balconies**

'Screens', 'Privacy Screens' or similar, as noted on the Approved Drawings and Documents, are to be: 1) Fixed, external privacy screens or fixed obscure glazing to WINDOWS to a height of no less than 1.50m above the finished floor level. 2) Fixed privacy screens to BALCONIES to a height of no less than 1.80m above the finished floor level of the balconies. The screens are to be solid translucent screens, perforated panels, or trellises that are permanent and durable and have a maximum of 25% openings. Note: The screens may be hinged to facilitate emergency egress only.

Approval Condition 22**Balconies to Remain Unclosed**

All balconies shown on the Approved Drawings and Documents are to remain unenclosed, with no shutters, glazing, louvers or similar fixtures other than those consistent with the relevant residential code in the Brisbane City Plan and clearly depicted on the Approved Drawings and Document.

Approval Condition 24**Screening to External A/C or Mechanical Plant**

Provide screening for any externally mounted air conditioning or mechanical plant installations in accordance with the following requirements:

- No unscreened installations on the proposed development are to be visible from the surrounding sites; and
- Any installations which are required to be located on roof, wall or garden areas are to be appropriately screened or shaped according to the acoustic requirements of this development package and so as to integrate in a complementary manner with the overall design of the roof, wall or garden area in which the installation is to be located.

Approval Condition 36**Refuse/Recycle Bins – Storage/Kerb Side Collection**

The proposed development of ten (10) units is to be serviced by a maximum of twenty (20) wheelie bins – ten (10) general refuse bins and ten (10) recycle bins.

Approval Condition 36(a)**Storage**

Each tenant is required to permanently store one (1) general refuse bin and one (1) recycle bin within their garage.

Approval Condition 36(b)**Kerbside Collection**

The bins are to be transferred by tenants to the kerb side for collection day and retrieved by tenants after collection and returned to their respective garages on the same day.

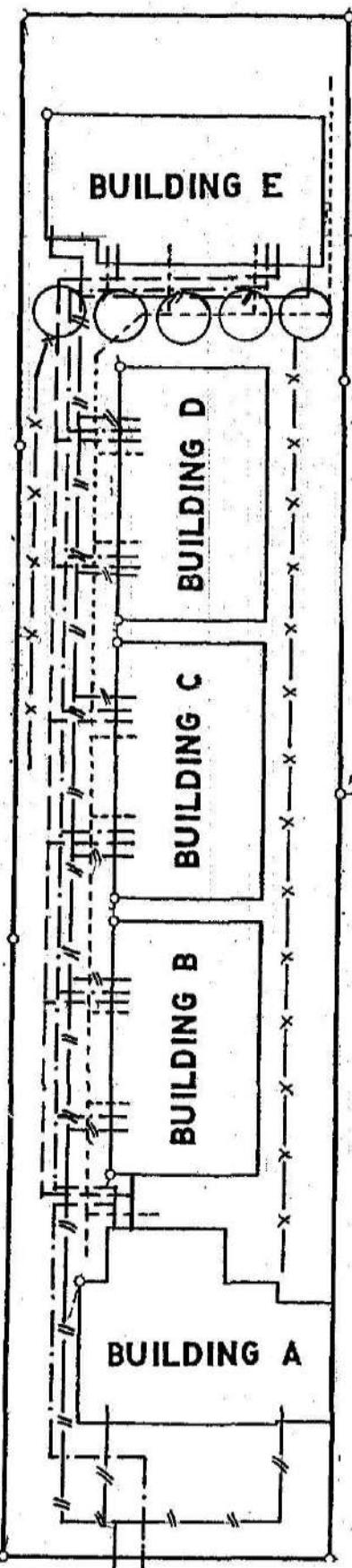

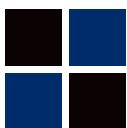
SERVICES LOCATION DIAGRAM
