This certificate does not include information about:

- physical defects in the common property or buildings in the scheme;
- body corporate expenses and liabilities for which the body corporate has not fixed contributions;
- current, past or planned body corporate disputes or court actions;
- orders made against the body corporate by an adjudicator, a tribunal or a court;
- matters raised at recent committee meetings or body corporate meetings; or
- the lawful use of lots, including whether a lot can be used for short-term letting.

Search applicable planning laws, instruments and documents to find out what your lot can be used for. If you are considering short-term letting your lot, contact your solicitor, the relevant local government or other planning authority to find out about any approvals you will need or if there are any restrictions on short-term letting. It is possible that lots in the community titles scheme are being used now or could in future be used lawfully or unlawfully for short-term or transient accommodation.

The community management statement

The seller must provide you with a copy of the CMS for the scheme before you sign a contract.

Becoming an owner

When you become an owner of a lot in a community titles scheme, you:

- automatically become a member of the body corporate and have the right to participate in decisions about the scheme;
- must pay contributions towards the body corporate's expenses in managing the scheme; and
- must comply with the body corporate by-laws.

You must tell the body corporate that you have become the owner of a lot in the scheme within 1 month of settlement. You can do this by using the BCCM Form 8 Information for body corporate roll. Fines may apply if you do not comply.

How to get more information

You can inspect the body corporate records which will provide important information about matters not included in this certificate. To inspect the body corporate records, you can contact the person responsible for keeping body corporate records (see below), or you can engage the services of a search agent. Fees will apply.

Planning and development documents can be obtained from the relevant local government or other planning authority. Some relevant documents, such as the development approval, may be available from the body corporate, depending on when and how the body corporate was established.

Building management statement

A building management statement is a document, which can be put in place in certain buildings, that sets out how property and shared facilities are accessed, maintained and paid for by lots in the building. It is an agreement between lot owners in the building that usually provides for supply of utility services, access, support and shelter, and insurance arrangements. A lot can be constituted by a community titles scheme's land.

By-laws and exclusive use areas

The body corporate may make by-laws (rules) about the use of common property and lots included in the community titles scheme. You must comply with the by-laws for the scheme. By-laws can regulate a wide range of matters, including noise, the appearance of lots, carrying out work on lots (including renovations), parking, requirements for body corporate approval to keep pets, and whether smoking is permitted on outdoor areas of lots and the common property. However, by-laws cannot regulate the type of residential use of lots that may lawfully be used for residential purposes. You should read the by-laws before signing a contract.

What by-laws apply?

The by-laws that apply to the scheme are specified in the community management statement for the scheme provided to you by the seller.

The community management statement will usually list the by-laws for the scheme. If the statement does not list any by-laws, Schedule 4 of the Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997 will apply to the scheme.

In some older schemes, the community management statement may state that the by-laws as at 13 July 2000 apply. In these cases, a document listing the by-laws in consolidated form must be given with this certificate.

General by-laws

The community management statement includes the complete set of by-laws that apply to the scheme.

Exclusive use areas

Individual lots may be granted exclusive use of common property or a body corporate asset, for example, a courtyard, car park or storage area. The owner of a lot to whom exclusive use rights are given will usually be required to maintain the exclusive use area unless the exclusive use by-law or other allocation of common property provides otherwise.

Lot entitlements and financial information

Lot entitlements

Lot entitlements are used to determine the proportion of body corporate expenses each lot owner is responsible for. The community management statement contains two schedules of lot entitlements – a contribution schedule of lot entitlements and an interest schedule of lot entitlements, outlining the entitlements for each lot in the scheme. The contribution schedule lot entitlement for a lot (as a proportion of the total for all lots) is used to calculate the lot owner’s contribution to most body corporate expenses, and the interest schedule lot entitlement for a lot (as a proportion of the total for all lots) is used to calculate the lot owner’s contribution to insurance expenses in some cases. Lots may have different lot entitlements and therefore may pay different contributions to the body corporate’s expenses.

Common property and assets

When you buy a lot in a community titles scheme, you also own a share in the common property and assets for the scheme. Common property can include driveways, lifts and stairwells, and shared facilities. Assets can include gym equipment and pool furniture.

The body corporate is usually responsible for maintaining common property in a good and structurally sound condition. An owner is usually responsible for maintaining common property or assets that their lot has been allocated exclusive use of, or for maintaining improvements to common property or utility infrastructure that is only for the benefit of their lot. The body corporate may have additional maintenance responsibilities, depending on the plan of subdivision the scheme is registered under. Sinking fund forecast and balance - maintenance and replacement of common property / assets

The body corporate must have a sinking fund to pay for future capital expenses, such as repairs or replacement of common property and assets. The body corporate must raise enough money in its sinking fund budget each year to provide for spending for the current year and to reserve an amount to meet likely spending for 9 years after the current year. If there is not enough money in the sinking fund at the time maintenance is needed, lot owners will usually have to pay additional contributions.

Prior to signing a contract, you should consider whether the current sinking fund balance is appropriate to meet likely future capital expenditure.

Contracts and authorisations

Caretaking service contractors and letting agents – Accommodation Module, Commercial Module and Standard Module

A body corporate may engage service contractors to provide services to the body corporate to assist in the management of the scheme.

If the Standard Module, Accommodation Module, or Commercial Module apply to a community titles scheme, the body corporate may also authorise a person to conduct a letting agent business for the scheme, that is, to act as the agent of owners of lots in the scheme who choose to use the person's services for the letting of their lot.

A service contractor who is also authorised to be a letting agent for the scheme is called a caretaking service contractor. Together, an agreement to engage a person as a caretaking service contractor and authorise a person as a letting agent is typically referred to as 'management rights'.

The maximum term of a service contract or authorisation entered into by a body corporate is:

- 10 years if the Standard Module applies to the scheme; and
- 25 years if the Accommodation Module or Commercial Module applies to the scheme.

You may inspect the body corporate records to find information about any engagements or authorisations entered into by the body corporate, including the term of an engagement or authorisation and, for an engagement, duties required to be performed and remuneration payable by the body corporate.

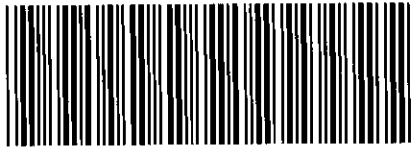

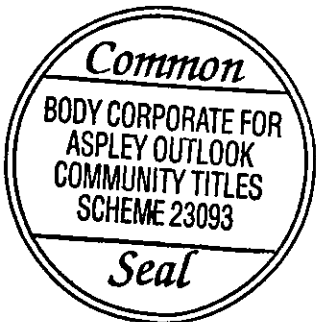

SCHEDULE C BY-LAWS

1. DEFINITIONS

In these by-laws the following definitions apply:

- (a) **Approved Pet:** a Pet granted approval under by-law 17;
- (b) **Authority:** any body, government or otherwise, or person having or exercising control over the use or operation of the Scheme;
- (c) **Council:** Brisbane City Council;
- (d) **Pet Information:**
 - (i) name;

- (ii) age;
 - (iii) breed;
 - (iv) lot number;
 - (v) documentary confirmation that the pet:
 - A is appropriately registered or licensed;
 - B has been micro-chipped (including the micro-chip number);
 - C has been vaccinated;
 - D has been treated for fleas, ticks and worms; and
 - E is insured if property is damaged, or someone is injured, falls ill or is killed, as a result of an incident involving the animal and that the Body Corporate is listed as a named insured on the relevant policy;
 - (vi) a colour photograph of the animal; and
 - (vii) the name of the occupier who is the primary owner and point of contact for the Approved Pet along with a mobile telephone number for the Occupier and an alternative point of contact.
- (e) **Pets:**
- (i) includes dogs, cats, birds and other animals normally kept as pets;
 - (ii) does not include exotic animals or other animals which are inappropriate for a residential development such as the Scheme including, for example, farm animals, snakes or wildlife.

2. SECURITY OF COMPLEX.

- (a) A proprietor or occupier, shall not under any circumstances, disclose to any person other than the proprietor's / occupier's resident family, the security code advised from time to time to the proprietor/s or occupier/s by the Body Corporate and/or the On-site Manager, for the security gate/s erected at the entrance of the Complex.
- (b) A proprietor or occupier shall not under any circumstances allow any security key/s to be provided to any person/s that are not the proprietor/s / occupier/s family.
- (c) All residents of the Complex will observe the lock-up times as advised from time to time by the Body Corporate or On-site Manager, for the front pedestrian gate. Any resident shall, if using during lock-up periods, duly re-lock the gate so as to provide afterhours security for all residents.

3. NOISE

- (a) A proprietor or occupier of a lot, their guests, servants or agents shall not make or permit any noise likely to interfere in any way with the peaceful enjoyment of other proprietors or occupiers of lots or of any person lawfully using the Common Property. In particular, no proprietor or occupier of a lot shall hold or permit to be held any social gathering in his lot which would cause any noise which unlawfully interferes with the peace and quietness of any other proprietor or occupier of a lot, at any time of day or night and in particular shall comply in all respects with the Noise Abatement Act 1979, as amended.

- (b) In the event of any unavoidable noise in a lot at any time, the proprietor or occupier thereof shall take all practical means to minimise annoyance to other proprietors or occupiers of lots by closing all doors, windows and curtains of his lot and also such further steps as may be within his power for the same purpose.
- (c) Guests leaving after 11.00 pm shall be requested by their hosts to leave quietly. Basic courtesy of keeping all noise to a minimum is expected when a proprietor or occupier of a lot returns to the dwelling late at night or early morning hours.
- (d) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not operate or permit to be operated upon the parcel any radio, two-way radio, short wave radio, transmitter, telecommunications device or electronic equipment so as to interfere with any domestic appliance or apparatus (including a radio or television receiver) lawfully in use upon the Common Property or in any other lot.

4. SPEED LIMIT WITHIN COMPLEX

- (a) For the safety and quiet enjoyment of other proprietors and occupiers, each proprietor or occupier of a lot, shall strictly observe the speed limit of 10 km per hour within the complex boundaries.
- (b) Any invitee, visitor or authorised person/s of a proprietor or occupier must also strictly observe this speed limit, and the responsibility of informing such person/s is the responsibility of the lot proprietor/s or occupier/s

5. BEHAVIOUR OF INVITEES

- (a) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that his invitees do not behave in a manner likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of the proprietor or occupier or another lot or of any person lawfully using Common Property.
- (b) The proprietor or occupier of a lot shall be liable to compensate the Body Corporate in respect of all damage to the Common Property or personal property vested in it caused by such proprietor or occupier or their invitees.
- (c) A proprietor of a lot which is the subject of a lease or license agreement shall take all reasonable steps, including any action available to him under any such lease or license agreement, to ensure that any lessee or licensee or other occupier of the lot or their invitees comply with the provisions of the By-Laws.
- (d) The duties and obligations imposed by these By-Laws on a proprietor or occupier of a lot shall be observed not only by the proprietor or occupier but also by the guests, servants, employees, agents, children, invitees and licensees of such proprietor or occupier.
- (e) Where the Body Corporate expends money to make good damage caused by a breach of the Act, or of these By-laws by any proprietor or occupier of a lot or the guests, servants, employees, agents, children, invitees and licensees of the proprietor or occupier of a lot or any of them, the Committee shall be entitled to recover the amount so expended as a debt in any action in any Court of competent jurisdiction from the proprietor of the lot at the time when the breach occurred.

6. RECREATIONAL CONVEYANCES

The definition of recreational conveyances in this section includes but is not limited to, the use of, bicycles, scooters, skateboards and rollerblades.

- (a) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not permit the use of any of the subject conveyances in or around the tennis court and playground area, and the recreational / BBQ area, by him or any of his invitees at any time.
- (b) Such conveyances are to be stored as necessary in the racks or designated area provided outside the tennis court fence and are not to be placed or left on pathways, roadways, nor in gardens or car parking spaces.
- (c) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall at all times cause the user of any recreational conveyance to wear suitable safety attire which may include but not limited to suitable clothing, helmets, shin, knee, wrist and elbow guards.
- (d) The Committee of the Body Corporate may make rules with respect to the use of the recreational conveyances that are not inconsistent with these By-laws.

7. USE OF THE SWIMMING POOL

In relation to the use of the swimming pool and adjacent areas a proprietor or occupier of a lot shall ensure:-

- (a) that his invitees and guests do not use the same or any of them unless their host adult proprietor or adult occupier accompanies them;
- (b) that children below the age of 13 years are not permitted inside the pool gate or around the same unless accompanied by their host adult proprietor or adult occupier, exercising effective control over them;
- (c) that alcoholic beverages or foodstuffs are not taken inside the pool gate or consumed in or around the pool surrounds;
- (d) that glass containers or receptacles of any type are not taken inside the pool gate or allowed to remain in or around the pool surrounds;
- (e) that he and his invitees shall exercise caution at all times and shall not run or splash, or behave in any manner that is likely to interfere with the use and enjoyment of the pool by other persons;
- (f) that no use is made of the swimming pool and surrounding areas between the hours of 10.00 pm and 6 am.

8. MAINTENANCE OF SWIMMING POOL

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not without proper authority operate, adjust or interfere with the operation of any equipment associated with the swimming pool or add any chemical or other substance to the same.

9. USE OF RECREATIONAL / BBQ AREA

All proprietors and occupiers may use the recreational / BBQ area constructed on the Common Property subject to following rules which shall, where appropriate, apply to all guests or invitees of the proprietors or occupiers.

- (a) No use shall be made of the recreational / BBQ area which involves damage, inconvenience or nuisance to any proprietor or occupier or invitee nor which causes damage to the surface, fixtures or fittings of the recreational / BBQ area.

- (b) The recreational / BBQ area shall not be used by a guest or invitee unless accompanied by their host adult proprietor or adult occupier.
- (c) That no use is made of the recreational / BBQ area between the hours of 10.00 pm and 6.30 am.
- (d) Immediately following use, the BBQ plate, sink bench top and surrounding area, is to be left in a clean condition and free of any foodstuffs, beverages or litter.
- (e) The toilet door is to be kept closed following use.
- (f) The occupier of a lot must not without the Body Corporate's approval conduct large social gatherings or parties that interfere with the enjoyment of other proprietors or occupiers of lots or any person lawfully using the Common Property. A proprietor or occupier of a lot must take reasonable steps to ensure that all behaviours, including their invitees, are respectful of the proprietors and occupiers of surrounding lots, and conduct the event for a reasonable limited amount of time that would also permit other proprietors or occupiers of lots to enjoy peaceful use of the Common Property and recreational / BBQ area.
- (g) The Committee of the Body Corporate may make rules with respect to the use of the recreational / BBQ area that are not inconsistent with these By-laws.

10. USE OF TENNIS COURT AND PLAYGROUND AREA

All proprietors and occupiers may use the tennis court and playground facilities constructed on the Common Property subject to following rules which shall, where appropriate, apply to all guests or invitees of the proprietors or occupiers.

- (a) No use shall be made of the tennis court and playground area which involves damage, inconvenience or nuisance to any proprietor or occupier or invitee nor which causes damage to the surface, fixtures or fittings of the tennis court and playground area.
- (b) The tennis court and playground area shall not be used by a guest or invitee unless accompanied by their host adult proprietor or adult occupier.
- (c) That no use is made of the tennis court and playground area between the hours of 10.00 pm and 6.30 am.
- (d) The Committee of the Body Corporate may make rules with respect to the use of the tennis court and playground area that are not inconsistent with these By-laws.

11. USE OF LOTS

Subject to By-law 42, each lot shall be used only as a private residence. A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not use that lot or permit the use of any lot for any business activity or operations, be it for profit or otherwise, nor for any purpose that may cause a nuisance or hazard, or for any illegal or immoral purpose, or for any other purpose that may endanger the safety or good reputation of persons residing within the parcel.

12. VEHICLES

- (a) Save where a properly made exclusive use By-law authorises him to do so, a proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not park or stand any motor or other vehicle upon Common Property, including roadways, visitor's car spaces, or a lot's lawn and garden area, except with the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee.

- (b) All vehicles shall, at all times, be kept in a roadworthy and the like condition.
- (c) The occupier of a lot must not permit an invitee to park a vehicle or allow a vehicle to stand on the Common Property, other than in a regulated parking area designated as being available for visitor vehicles.
- (d) A proprietor or occupier shall not permit any vehicle in excess of (2) tonnes weight, or any vehicle, caravan, trailer, boat, or any such item, onto, or over Common Property, that where its length, height or width would be considered excessive or unreasonable to be housed or stored within or on a lot.
- (e) A proprietor or occupier shall not operate or allow the operation of any vehicle within a lot or Common Property, which would interfere with the quiet enjoyment of other residents within the Complex.

13. CAR SPACES

- (a) A proprietor or occupier of a lot is only entitled to park vehicles upon his lot, in the allocated space provided, that being, one vehicle in the garage, one vehicle on the hardstand in front of garage, and one vehicle in the carport if provided on that lot.
- (b) Car space is to be kept tidy and free of litter.
- (c) The proprietor of Lot 13 (caretaker's residence) has the sole use of two (2) parking bays situated on the common property adjacent to the caretaker's lot and marked as "reserved"

14. VISITORS' CAR PARK

- (a) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not park or stand any motor vehicles or other vehicles upon areas set aside for visitor car parking.
- (b) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall ensure that their invitees use the visitor car parking area only for its intended purpose of casual parking.

15. PRIVATE ROADS AND OTHER COMMON PROPERTY

The private roadways, pathways, drives and other Common Property and any easement giving access to the land shall not be obstructed by any proprietor or the tenants, guests, servants, employees, agents children invitees, licensees of a proprietor or any of them or used by them for any purpose other than the reasonable ingress and egress to and from their respective lots or the parking areas provided.

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not:

- 2.1. drive or permit to be driven any motor vehicle in excess of two (2) tonnes weight onto or over the Common Property other than such vehicles necessary to complete the construction and/or occupation of any residence erected on the land, and any motor vehicles entitled by any statute and/or local authority ordinances;
- 2.2. permit any invitees' vehicles to be parked on the roadway forming part of the common area at any time. Any invitees shall park their vehicles in the vehicles in the visitors' parking bays on the Common Property and shall use such area only for its intended purpose of casual parking.

Title Reference 50089614**16. DEPOSITING RUBBISH ETC., ON COMMON PROPERTY**

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not deposit rubbish or like material on any part of the Common Property except in receptacles intended for that without the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee.

17. GARBAGE DISPOSAL

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall -

- (a) save where the Body Corporate provides some other means of disposal of garbage, maintain within his lot, or on such part of the Common Property as may be authorised by the Body Corporate, in clean and dry condition and adequately covered, a receptacle for garbage;
- (b) that such receptacle/s must be permanently housed behind the building line, within a lot's fenced area, except for the day of collection as notified by the local authority from time to time, where the receptacle/s must be placed and positioned on the footpath directly in front of the unit.
- (c) comply with all local authority By-Laws and ordinances relating to the disposal of garbage.
- (d) ensure that the health, hygiene and comfort of the proprietor or occupier of any other lot are not adversely affected by his disposal of garbage

18. KEEPING OF ANIMALS

- (a) Subject to section 181 of the Act, occupiers must not, without the Committee's prior written approval, bring or keep an animal in a Lot, or on Common Property or permit an invitee to bring or keep an animal in a Lot or on Common Property.
- (b) It will be deemed to be reasonable for the Committee to withhold its consent to a request for approval to bring or keep an animal in a Lot or Common Property if the animal the subject of the request:
 - (i) will, when fully grown, be of such weight as to be considered, in the reasonable opinion of the Committee, to be unsuitable to reside in a Lot;
 - (ii) has been declared a dangerous, menacing or restricted dog (or similar) by the Council or any other Authority;
 - (iii) is a breed that falls within the category (or substantially meets the description) of prohibited breeds as declared by the Council or any other Authority;
 - (iv) is an exotic animal or an animal unable to be lawfully kept as a domestic pet in Queensland;
 - (v) is, in the reasonable opinion of the Body Corporate, an animal of a type not ordinarily or able reasonably to be kept as a domestic pet in a townhouse complex.
- (c) Subject to the discretion of the Committee, where the Approved Pet is a dog or cat, it will be further deemed to be a condition of any approval granted to an Occupier to bring or keep the animal in a Lot or on Common Property (regardless of whether or not notice of such conditions is given to the Occupier at the time of approval) that the Approved Pet, as appropriate:
 - (i) is micro-chipped;
 - (ii) is licensed or registered with Council, and evidence of registration or license is provided to the Committee within 7 days of being requested to do so;

- (iii) is either:
 - A carried; or
 - B leashed when traversing on, over or through Common Property;
 - (iv) is not permitted to be:
 - A on Common Property save for the purpose of entering or exiting the Scheme;
 - B in any Recreation Area at any time;
 - (v) is vaccinated and evidence of vaccination be provided to the Committee within 7 days of being requested to do so;
 - (vi) is treated for fleas, ticks and worms;
 - (vii) is toilet trained (and not permitted to toilet on Common Property including gardens);
 - (viii) is not left alone in a Lot for extended periods;
 - (ix) wears a collar bearing a tag containing the name and contact details of the owner of the animal;
 - (x) is regularly bathed;
 - (xi) is comprehensively insured against property damage, personal injury, illness or death as a result of an incident involving the animal and that the Body Corporate is listed as a named insured on the relevant policy;
 - (xii) does not cause or create a nuisance to other occupiers in the Scheme;
 - (xiii) does not soil, damage or create a mess on Common Property.
- (d) The Committee may devise and adopt a system for the recording of information about Approved Pets. An occupier seeking such an approval must provide to the Committee at the time of making an application (and again if reasonably requested at any time during the time the Approved Pet resides in a Lot):
- (i) the Pet Information; and
 - (ii) such further or other information as the Committee may reasonably require for the compilation of a pet register in accordance with this By-law.
- (e) An approval under this by-law relates only to the original pet the subject of the approval and any replacement will require the further written approval of the Committee.
- (f) The Committee may revoke an approval under this By-law upon a breach by the occupier or the Approved Pet of any part of this By-law or condition of approval.

19. APPEARANCE OF BUILDING – EXTERNAL

- (a) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not, except with the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee, hang any washing, towel, bedding or clothing or other article or display any sign, advertisement, placard, banner, pamphlet or like matter on any part of his lot in such a way as to be visible from the Common Property or any other lot.

- (b) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not at any time place or house in front of the building alignment, or on common property, any personal belongings or items other than footwear and / or a suitably complying garden type table and chair settings. These items may be placed on the front patio area, provided always that they are kept in a clean and tidy state, and do not distract from the overall appearance of the lot
- (c) Proprietors or an occupier of a lot may install an extend-a-line clothes-line within their lot, provided that prior approval is granted by the Body Corporate Committee as to the position and model/make clothes line to install.
- (d) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not permit the installation of any air-conditioning unit/s upon a lot or common property, without the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee.

The Body Corporate Committee will not unreasonably withhold consent for any split-system units, where the main body of the air-conditioning unit is housed behind the fence line of a lot and is not visible from Common Property.

The installation of any box type air-conditioning unit, that is visible from Common Property, shall not be permitted.

20. MAINTENANCE OF LOTS

- (a) Each proprietor shall be responsible for the maintenance of his lot and shall ensure that his lot is so kept and maintained as not to be offensive in appearance to other lot owners through the accumulation of excess rubbish or otherwise. Further, all lots are to be so maintained as to prevent the excessive growth of grass and other vegetation making lots unsightly, increasing fire risks or contributing to the spread of noxious weed to other lots.
- (b) The Body Corporate shall be responsible for the care and maintenance of the garden area between the front of the building erected on each lot and the Common Property adjoining the roadway to ensure uniformity of appearance of all lots in the complex.

21. DAMAGE TO LAWNS, ETC., ON COMMON PROPERTY

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not:

- (a) damage any lawn, garden, tree, shrub, plant or flower being part of or situated upon Common Property; or
- (b) except with the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee, use for his own purposes as a garden any portion of the Common Property.

22. DAMAGE TO COMMON PROPERTY

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not mark, paint, drive nails or screw or the like into, or otherwise damage or deface, any structure that forms part of the Common Property except with the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee.

23. INSTRUCTIONS TO CONTRACTORS ETC.

The proprietors or occupiers of lots shall not directly instruct any contractors or workmen employed by the Body Corporate unless so authorised.

Title Reference 50089614**24. OBSTRUCTION**

A proprietor of a lot shall not obstruct lawful use of Common Property by any person.

25. SECURITY OF LOTS

- (a) A proprietor or person authorised by him is permitted to install:
- (i) any locking or other safety device for protection of his lot against intruders;
 - (ii) any screen or other device to prevent entry of animals or insects upon his lot,

provided that the locking or other safety device or, as the case may be, screen or other device is constructed in a workman-like manner, is maintained in a state of good and serviceable repair by the proprietor and does not detract from the amenity of the building. All doors and windows to the premises shall be securely fastened on all occasions when the premises are left unoccupied and the Committee reserves the right to enter and fasten same if left insecurely fastened.

26. RIGHT OF ENTRY

A proprietor, upon receiving reasonable notice from the Body Corporate, shall allow the Body Corporate or any contractors, sub-contractors, workmen or other person authorised by it, the right of access of his lot for the purpose of carrying out works effecting repairs on mains, pipes, wires or connections of any water, sewerage, drainage, gas electricity, telephone or other system or service, whether to his lot or to an adjoining lot.

27. ALTERATION TO LOTS AND COMMON PROPERTY

- (a) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not construct or permit the construction or erection of any fence, pergola, screen, awning or other structure or outbuilding of any kind within or upon a lot or on Common Property without the approval in writing of the Body Corporate Committee.
- (b) Any alteration made to Common Property or fixture attached to Common Property by any proprietor or occupier of a lot, whether made or attached with or without the approval of the Body Corporate Committee, shall unless otherwise provided by resolution of a general meeting or of a meeting of the Committee, be repaired and maintained by the proprietor for the time being of the lot of which the aforesaid proprietor or occupier was such proprietor or occupier.
- (c) There shall be no external structural alteration or extensions or repainting to a lot without the approval in writing of the Body Corporate Committee. A proprietor shall submit to the Body Corporate's architect all plans and specifications for any such structural alteration or extension.

28. DIVIDING FENCES

A proprietor of a lot shall not without the consent in writing of the Body Corporate Committee erect any fence on the lot unless the same is of a construction approved by the Body Corporate Committee.

29. INFLAMMABLE LIQUIDS, GASES OR OTHER MATERIALS

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not bring to, do or keep anything in his lot which shall increase the rate of fire insurance on any property on the group title plan or which may conflict with the laws and/or regulations relating to fires or any insurance policy upon any property on the group title plan or the regulations or ordinances of any Public Authority for the time being in force.

Gas cooking barbecues are permitted within the lots, provided that they are permanently housed and operated behind the building line of each lot, within a fenced area.

30. AUCTION SALES

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not permit any auction sale or garage sale of chattels to be conducted or to take place in his lot or in the dwelling upon the scheme without the prior approval in writing of the Committee of the Body Corporate.

31. WATER CLOSETS

Water closets and conveniences and other water apparatus including waste pipes and drains shall not be used for any purposes other than those for which they were constructed and no sweepings or rubbish or other than those substances shall be deposited therein. Any damage or blockage resulting to such water negligence shall be borne by the proprietor whether the same is caused by his own actions or those of his servants, agents, licensees or invitees.

32. TAPS

- (a) A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall not waste water and shall see that all water taps in his lot are promptly turned off after use.
- (b) Should the lot be unoccupied for a period of more than a month, then the stopcock on the hot water system will be turned off.

33. REPLACEMENT OF GLASS

Windows shall be kept clean and promptly replaced by the proprietor or occupier of the lot at his expense with fresh glass of the same kind and weight as at present if broken or cracked. This By-Law does not prohibit a proprietor from making a claim on the Body Corporate insurance.

34. CURTAINS, VENETIAN BLINDS AND WINDOW TINTING

A proprietor shall not hang curtains, install venetian blinds, or apply window tinting visible from outside the lot unless those curtains have a white backing, unless such colour and design have been approved by the Committee of the Body Corporate. A proprietor shall not install, renovate and/or replace a curtain backing or window tinting without having the colour and design of same approved by the Committee. In giving such approvals, the Committee shall ensure so far as practicable that curtain backing and window tinting used in all units presents a uniform appearance when viewed from Common Property or any other lot.

35. INFECTIOUS DISEASES

In the event of any infectious diseases which may require notification by virtue of any Statute Regulation or Ordinance happening in any lot the proprietor or occupier of such lot shall give written notice thereof and any other information which may be required relative thereto to the Committee and shall pay the Committee the expenses incurred by the Committee of disinfecting the lot and any part of the Common Property required to be disinfected and replacing any articles or things the destruction of which may be rendered necessary by such diseases.

Title Reference 50089614**36. DUTIES OF THE BODY CORPORATE**

- (a) The Body Corporate shall ensure that the overall appearance of the parcel shall remain uniform and as such will perform the duty of the proprietors to repaint the external surfaces of all buildings requiring such repainting situated within the parcel and will ensure that all such external surfaces are kept in a state of good repair and reasonable wear and tear, not unlike the duties of a Body Corporate constituted by the registration of a Building Units Plan.
- (i) All expenses incurred as a result of this By-law shall be paid from funds contributed to the Sinking Fund.
 - (ii) Authority to expend funds in excess of the prescribed statutory amount to perform work required by this By-law may be given to the Committee by an ordinary resolution of the Body Corporate at a general meeting to which at least two quotations for the performance of this work have been tabled for consideration.
 - (iii) A proprietor, mortgagee or occupier shall not alter the external colour scheme of his lot without prior approval in writing from the Body Corporate Committee pursuant to a resolution of the Body Corporate Committee.
- (b) **Insurance**
- (i) In addition to the prescribed statutory insurance the Body Corporate shall insure and keep insured all buildings on the Common Property and any improvements thereon under a damage policy to the reinstatement or replacement value thereof.
 - (ii) The Body Corporate shall effect and keep current in respect of all improvements made to the parcel, property damage insurance in the joint names of those persons recorded from time to time on the roll as proprietors of the lots in the parcel in an amount nominated by the Body Corporate in general meeting from time to time. Such insurance shall be taken out with a reputable insurance company and shall cover the rebuilding and/or repair of the buildings in a valid claimable event defined in the Policy document.
 - (iii) All insurance premiums payable by the Body Corporate under this By-law shall be paid from funds contributed to the administrative fund.
 - (iv) Each Proprietor/s is responsible to be aware of limitations and exclusions that may apply as Insurance cover is renewed annually.
 - (v) Owner/s are responsible for selecting their own insurance coverage for non-permanent fixtures on their own private lot, such as electrical equipment, carpets, drapes and improvements.

37. CORRESPONDENCE

All complaints or applications to the Body Corporate or its Committee shall be addressed in writing to the secretary or the Body Corporate manager of the Body Corporate.

38. REQUESTS TO THE SECRETARY

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall direct all requests for consideration of any particular matter to be referred to the Committee or the Body Corporate to the Secretary and not to the Chairman or any member of the Committee.

Title Reference 50089614**39. NOTICES**

A proprietor or occupier of a lot his servants, agents, licenses and invitees shall observe the terms of any notice displayed in the Common Property by authority of the Committee of the Body Corporate or of any statutory authority.

40. NOTICE OF DEFECT

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall give the Committee and/or the caretaker prompt notice of any accidents to or defect in the water pipes, gas pipes, electric installations or fixtures which comes to his knowledge and the Committee shall have the authority by its agents or servants in the circumstances having regard to the urgency involved to examine or make such repairs or renovations as it may deem necessary for the safety and preservation of the building as often as may be necessary.

41. COPY OF BY-LAWS TO BE PRODUCED UPON REQUEST

Where any lot or Common Property is leased or rented, otherwise than to a proprietor of a lot, the lessor or, as the case may be, landlord shall upon the request of the lessee or tenant produce or cause to be produced to the lessee or tenant for his inspection a copy of the By-laws for the time being in force in respect of the plan.

42. POWER OF COMMITTEE

The Committee may make rules relating to the Common Property and in particular in relation to the swimming pool, spa, children's playground area, gazebo and barbecue area or other facilities, not inconsistent with these By-laws and the same shall be observed by the proprietors or occupiers of lots unless and until they are disallowed or revoked by a majority resolution at a general meeting of the Body Corporate.

43. RECOVERY OF COSTS

Where the Body Corporate expends money to make good damage caused by a breach of the Act or of these By-laws by any proprietor or the tenant, guest, servants, employees, agents, children, invitees or licensees of the proprietor or any of them, the Committee shall be entitled to recover the amount so expended as a debt in an action in any court of competent jurisdiction from the proprietor of the lot at the time when the breach occurred.

44. INTEREST

- (a) If a contribution lawfully levied is unpaid 30 days after it falls due for payment then the amount of the unpaid contribution will bear interest at an annual rate to be determined by the Body Corporate by ordinary resolution in general meeting from time to time.

Joint Liability

- (b) If, at the time a person becomes the proprietor of a lot, another person is liable in respect of the lot to pay interest on a contribution, the proprietor is jointly and severally liable with the other person for the payment of the interest.

Character of Interest

- (c) The amount of any interest is recoverable by the Body Corporate as a liquidated debt.

Title Reference 50089614**45. MANAGEMENT AND LETTING SERVICES**

Lot 13 may be used as a residence and also as an office, for the purpose of and incidental to the conduct of a management and letting business.

46. SATELLITE DISH

That the Body Corporate be authorised to install satellite dishes, antennae and other devices upon the common property as part of the communication systems for the benefit of all proprietors.

47. IMPROVEMENTS / UPGRADES TO PRIVATE LOTS

A proprietor or occupier of a lot shall direct all requests for alterations, improvements or additions to their private lot in writing to the Body Corporate Committee, or Resident Manager to onforward to the Body Corporate Committee for consideration. An application form will be provided upon request.

Approval for alterations and installations is based upon adherence to guidelines established for the particular type of alteration or improvement such as:

- Satellite Dishes / Foxtel
- Air Conditioning Units
- Solar PV Panels
- Whirly Birds & Solar Powered Roof Vents
- Patio (roofed) extension
- Garden / Tool Sheds

The approval process is inclusive while seeking to protect a standardised approach in the Complex.
