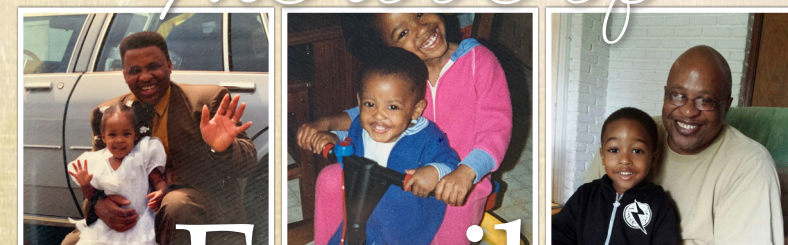
He was preceded in death by his brother, Anthony Scott, Chicago, Illinois.
