Heaven lit up with a mighty presence, as the Angels looked down. Today the Lord was placing the jewels into our mother's crown.

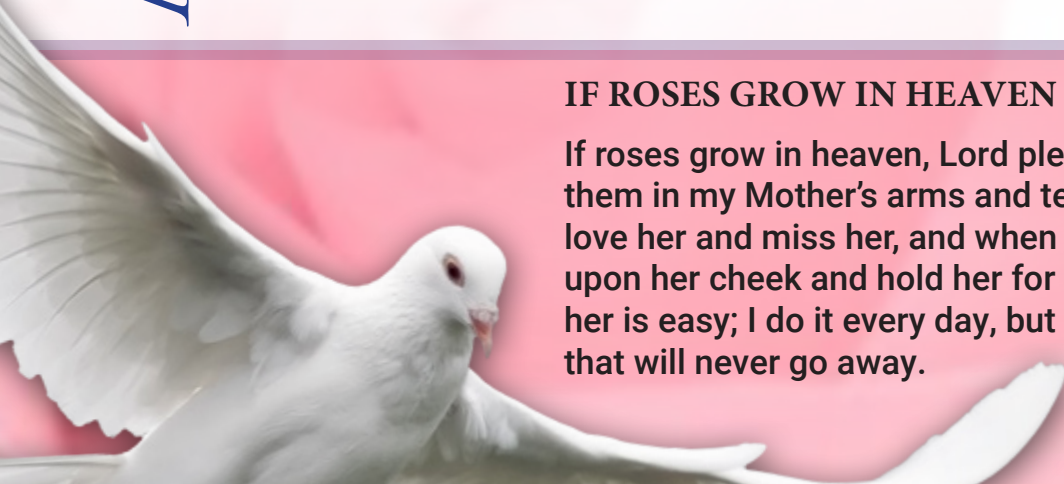
