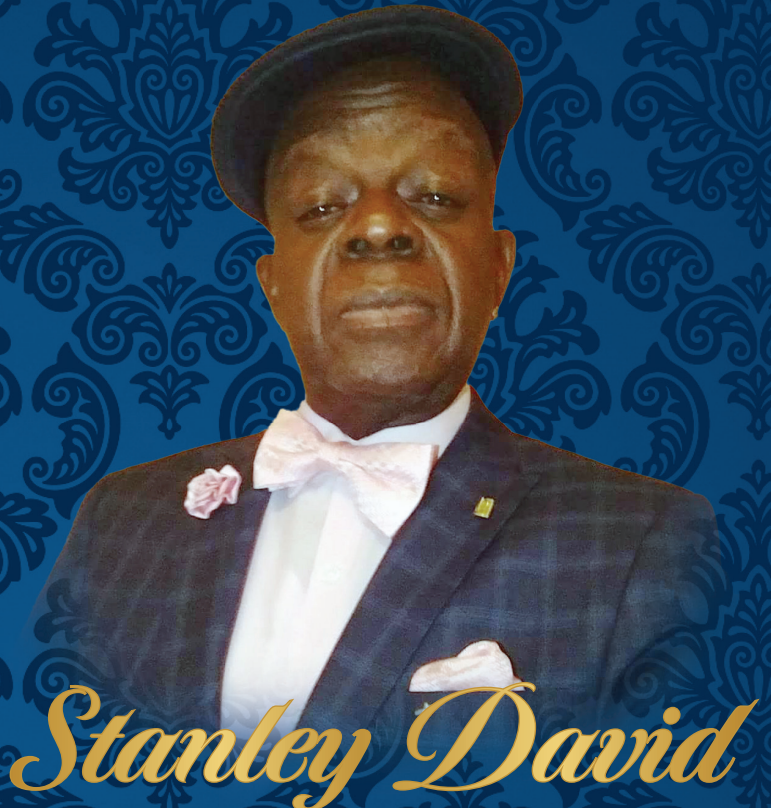

STANLEY DAVID TAYLOR was born on April 28, 1953, in Brooklyn, New York, to the late Fred and Mary Taylor. Stanley's mortal journey ended at WakeMed in Raleigh, North Carolina, on July 13, 2021.

19 years ago, Stanley and Charlene decided to bring their young family to North Carolina. Stanley served 20+ years in the restaurant industry, where he provided many "first jobs" to family and friends. He was always one to keep family first. He loved to cook and was known for his infamous fried chicken and always-perfect potato salad. Stan never met a stranger. If you made it inside the house, you could best believe you didn't leave hungry or thirsty. Stan always had a sense of style from his red rabbit coat to his suits, bow ties, and shoes. This is why we will forever call him "Stan D Man."

Serving as a patient advocate for the Fuquay-Varina Fresenius Dialysis Clinic, he made a lasting impact on so many lives. He raised funds for the annual kidney walk and got all his family, friends, and church members involved. He joined Saint Augusta Missionary Baptist Church in 2007. Stanley was a trustee, a member of the male chorus, and an unofficial choir director. Stan struggled with health-related issues for many years, but was always the first to ask you how you were doing and how things were going and meant it. His spirit and unconditional love will forever be missed.
