## *Life Profile*

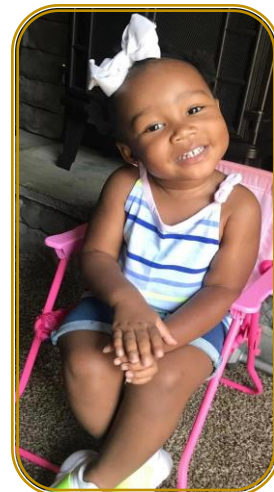
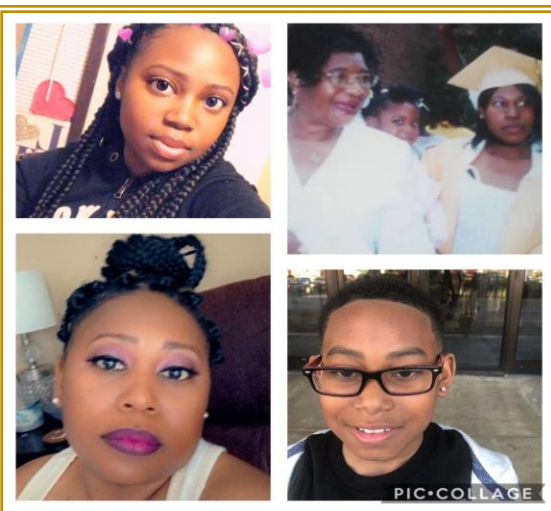
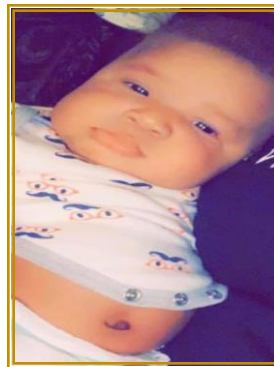
