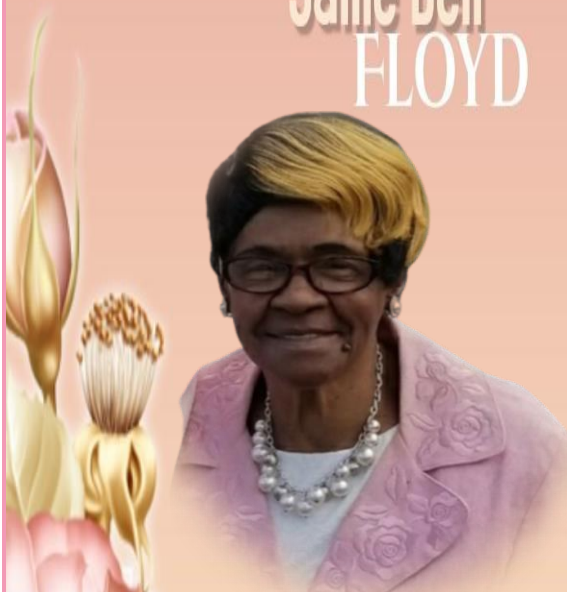

Life Profile of Sallie Bell Speaks Floyd

Sallie Bell Speaks Floyd of Clinton South Carolina was born in Cross Hill, South Carolina on July 2, 1935 to Ella Rainey Speaks and Jim Speaks.
