And, while eternal ages run, rest in your Savior's joy.

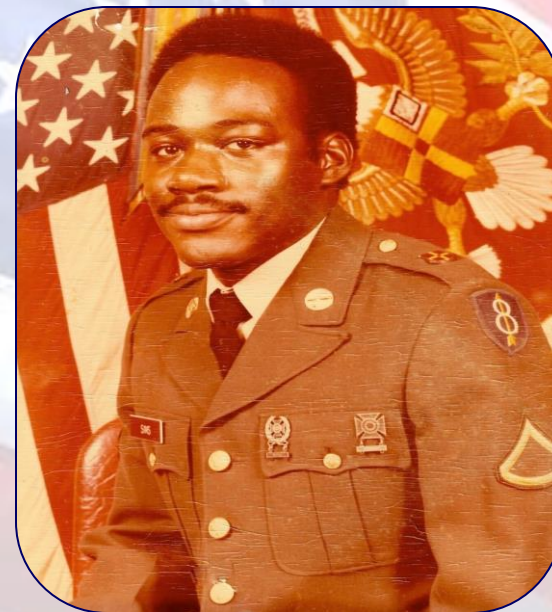
