everlasting love.

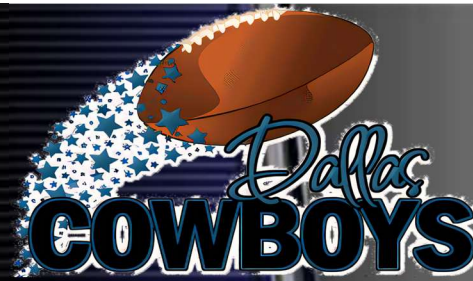
