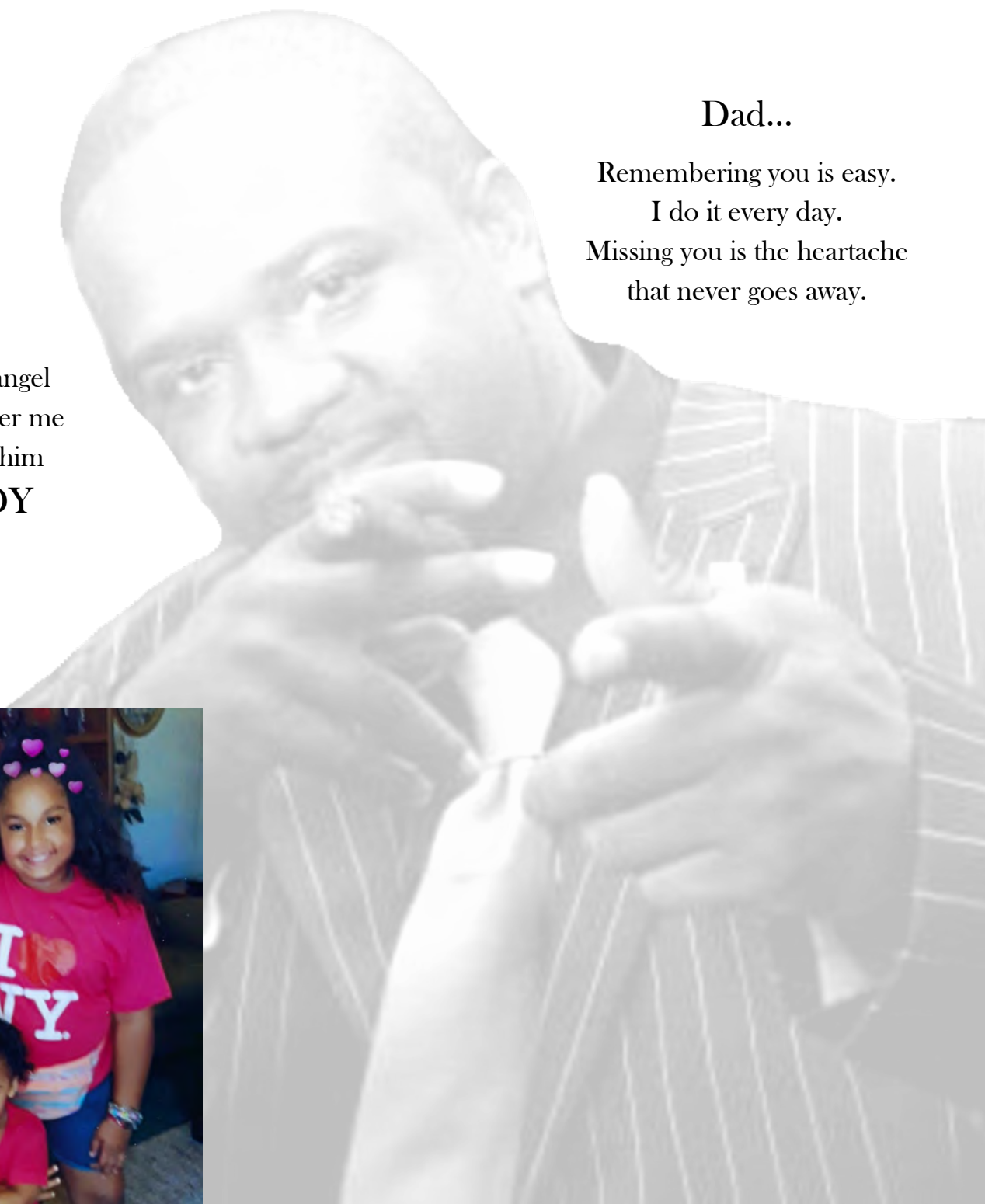
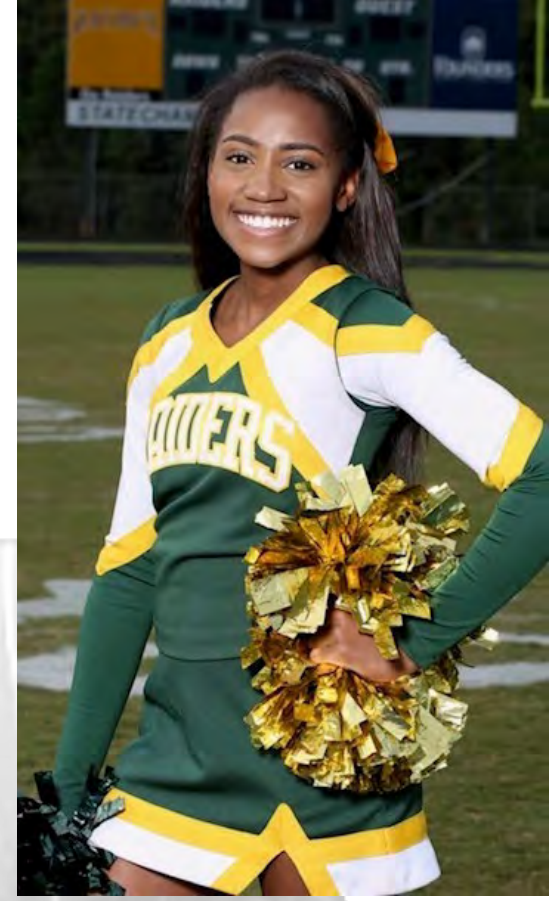


Dad...
