

Eulogy

Calmeta Challenger was born, Calmeta Veronica Hanley, in Cuba on March 17, 1924. Her parents, Ernest Hanley and Urania Pollock Hanley were migrants from the island of Nevis who had moved to Cuba to seek work in the sugar industry.

In 1929, the global economy was severely impacted by the crash of US Stock Market, and as a result the Hanleys returned to Nevis with their three young children (Calmeta 5, Doris 3, and Louvinia 1).

Calmeta was therefore raised in Nevis and knows nothing about the country of her birth. She received her formal education in Nevis and graduated at the top of her class from the prestigious Bridgewater High School with honors. She entered the nursing profession age 17 and worked in several departments in nursing and ultimately became the leading midwife on the island. She was the oldest of four sisters and became a tower of strength and role model for her sisters. As a result, two of her sisters followed in her footsteps and became nurses as well.

In 1952 she wedded William Challenger, and as was customary then, gave up her career and became a devoted housewife. On one occasion when her husband was sick the doctor was summoned for a house call. During that 'house call' the doctor observed Calmeta's Certificates of Achievements which were prominently displayed. He immediately demanded that she return to the hospital, stating that a talent like that was too valuable to be utilized solely as a housewife. She took the advice and was immediately reinstated to her nursing position at the hospital.

Throughout her career Calmeta worked in several departments including Medical, Surgical, Pediatrics, Dental Assistant, Public Health, District Nursing, Maternal Child Health and delivered a multitude of babies during that time. She was affectionately called "Nurse Challenger" and was highly respected by everyone throughout the island.

Very early in the union with her husband, Calmeta undertook to assist her sister Louvina in taking care of her child Joan who was six years old at the time. Through mutual agreement, this arrangement became permanent and Calmeta ultimately raised Joan to womanhood. Through her kind heart and generosity, Calmeta was also instrumental in the upbringing of her sister Doris' kids - Ken, Keith, Janice and Lenore.

In 1968 after 27 years of sterling service in Nevis, Calmeta migrated to St. Croix and took Joan with her. After a short stay in St. Croix, they moved to Brooklyn, New York.

While in New York, Calmeta went back to school and obtained her LPN (License Practical Nurse) license. She obtained employment at Brooklyn's Cumberland Hospital where she worked for 20 years as an Operating Nurse Technician until her retirement.

In 1989 Calmeta relocated to Miami and quickly adopted to the warm tropical climate which she was accustomed to from the Caribbean. She was particularly attracted to Opa Locka's Flea Market and looked forward to her weekly Saturday visits.

Calmeta was a faithful and dedicated member of The Fountain Church in Pembroke Pines under Pastor Wayne Lomax. In 2014 she made a decision to relocate to Virginia with her nephew Ken and his wife.

Calmeta was in excellent health until she suffered a stroke on June 1st, and subsequently passed away peacefully on June 9, 2020 at Sentara Nursing Care Facility in Virginia Beach. She was 96. Her three sisters pre-deceased her. Lou (at age 83) and Edith (at age 84) both died in England in 2011 and 2014 respectively. Doris passed away April 20, 2020 in St. Thomas, Virgin Islands at age 93. All these sisters had longevity in their genes. We pray that the next generation of Hanleys inherit some of those genes.

Calmeta will be sadly missed by her family, and many close friends and relatives. May her soul rest in eternal peace.

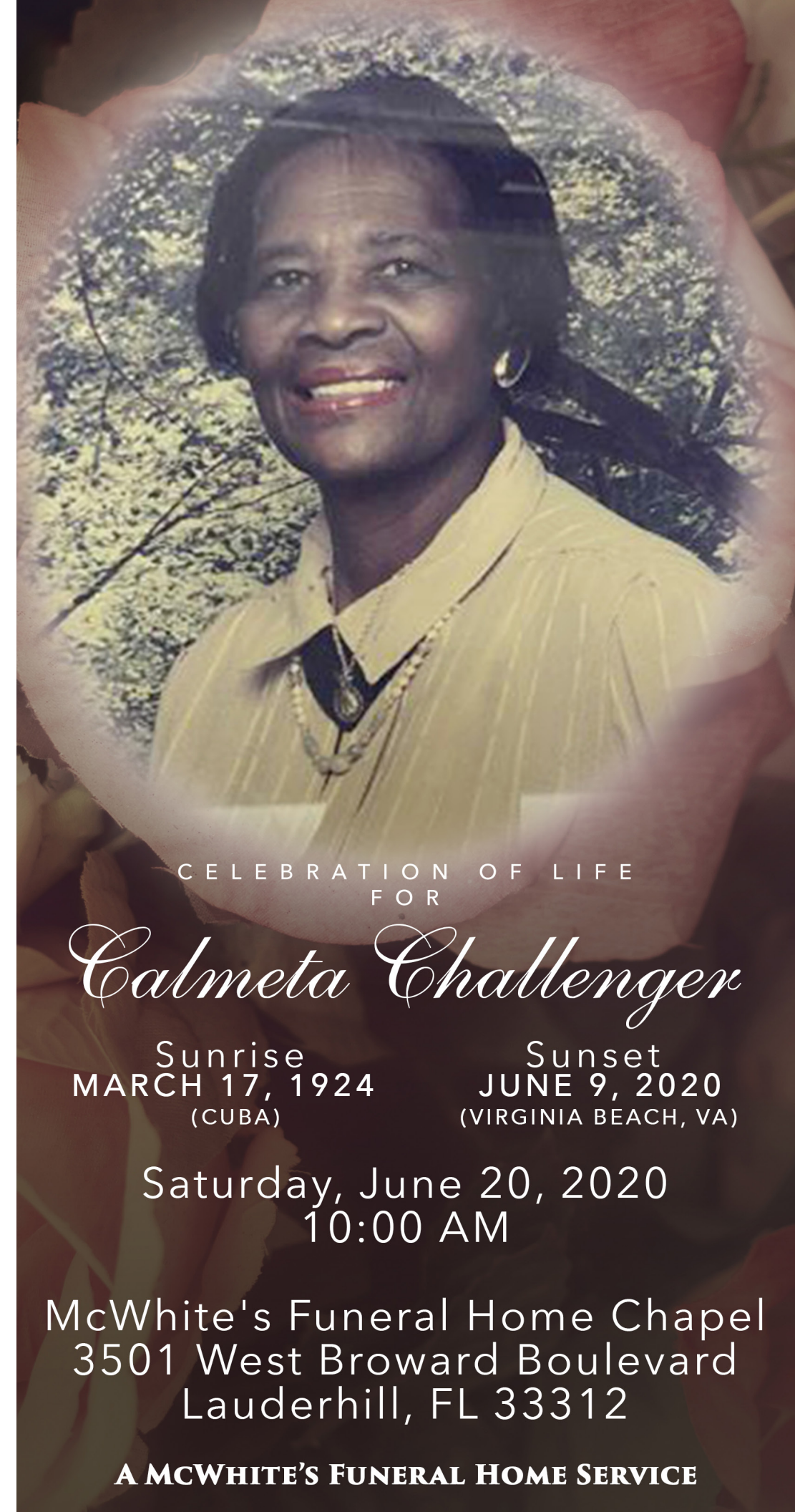
