

HIS STORY

The Life of TC Terry began in Estill, South Carolina on April 24, 1943. He was the fourth of seven children born to the late Henry Sr. and Evelyn Drayton terry. TC's ,eternal uncle, Mose Perrin, built a house for his sister and her family in the Miami Community of Brownsville, commonly known as Brown sub. The family relocated from South Carolina and began a new life in their new city and home.

TC attended Liberty City Elementary and North Dade Senior High School. While attending North Dade Senior High School, he became an outstanding football athlete. Although he did not graduate from North Dade Senior High School, he was determined to obtain his diploma and later earned his GED.

On April 21, 1972, TC married Hattie Mae Hall, who preceded him in death in 2008. Although they did not have children from their union, they had a blended family of four children.

TC was a member of Ebenezer Missionary Baptist Church in Hallandale Beach, Florida under the pastoral leadership of Rev. Joseph "Joe" Johnson. He and Hattie were active members and served on the Ushers Ministry until they relocated to Kissimmee, Florida when TC retired.

During his career, TC worked in a variety of areas. He retired from the City of Hallandale's Public Works Department after a distinguished career. TC's coworkers were often treated to the harvest of his gardening. He would also treat his coworkers to his grilling skills.

TC had a great love and mastery of gardening, fishing, cooking, baking and photography. He and his brothers, Willis and Rufus, enjoyed many fishing adventures on the Florida waterways. TC was a loving father, grandfather, brother, uncle and friend. Those who had the opportunity to meet him were taken to his likeable and warm personality.

In addition to his parents and wife, TC was also preceded in death by his brothers, Henry Jr. and Rufus Chislom; sisters: Ola Mae Terry West and Marilyn Scott Rolle and stepdaughter Shirley Strange.

After a brief illness, during the early morning hours of December 27, 2020, TC answered the call of his Heavenly Father to, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden and I will give you rest".
