Her Story

Shawn Walder was born to Vera Daire Walder and Wilfred Alexander Walder on October 17, 1958. She was a native of Jamaica and hailed from the beautiful parish of Manchester where she grew up in the small town called Walderston.

Shawn was the fifth of nine children and because she tell right in the middle, she often played the role of mediator and peacekeeper. She is survived by six brothers and two sisters. Loxlev Walder, Kay Burton. Walder-Hutchinson, Terran Walder, Joseph Walder, Peter Walder, Patrick Walder and Dale Walder, her two children Williams and Arvid Williams Jr. grandchildren, Kaila, Kasidy and Ryhan, nine nephews, eleven nieces, multiple grandnieces, grandnephews.

In her early years Shawn attended Mount Olivet Basic School, Mizpha All Age School and then continued her education at Christiana Comprehensive High School. One of her best friends recounted how focused and hardworking she was as a student. Shawn took pride in both her schoolwork and deportment; she was attentive to her studies and was respectful to both her peers and those in authority. Shawn would often recount a story from her primary school days about a young man named Duggie Christopher who copied from her paper and mistakenly wrote "My name is Shawn Walder. I am a girl".

In high school she excelled in the skill of dressmaking and the garments that she made in both grades ten and eleven were chosen to be a part of the Christiana Secondary High School exhibit, in the annual all island secondary school skill exhibition. Her friend recounts, only the best quality work was placed on display, and her work being selected two years in a row spoke for itself.

After completing high school Shawn went on to teach at Mizpha Basic School. Over the years she kept in touch with some of her students and that's the kind of person she was. She was the connector, the one who always kept in touch with everyone.

In 1978 Shawn Walder met Arvid Williams Sr. They became friends through communication in a pen pal program. She picked his name out of a Student Challenge book she received at church. They later became man and wife in 1981 and that union produced two children, Alecia Petrenia Williams, and Arvid Shawn Williams Jr.

The family lived in Newport and then settled in Walderston. Shawn always found something for her hands to do. She was a sought-after seamstress who made beautiful clothing and crochet items. She was extremely resourceful, she raised and sold chickens and cows and travelled to other Caribbean islands to buy and resell goods. She was already an entrepreneur in the making as she always wanted better for her family.

In 1990 Shawn migrated to Nassau, Bahamas where she worked as an Au pair. After looking for additional opportunities she decided to go to the United States and settled in Fort Lauderdale Florida. There she started a cleaning company. She serviced boats, luxury yachts and luxury homes in the Fort Lauderdale and Las Olas area. However, her true passion was to be a nurse and take care of people. She later attained her certification as a nursing assistant.

Shawn loved caring for people. She cared for her patients as if they were her own family members. Even after they were deceased, she would continue the relationship with the families.

Shawn was the true definition of a workaholic, however; when she found some free time, she would knit and do needle point. She made beautiful pieces that she would use as gifts and to decorate her and her daughter's home.

Shawn was a Seventh-day Adventist Christian and an active member of the Ambassador Seventh-day Adventist Church where she served as sabbath school superintendent and soloist when requested. She was also a great cook. Her house was the eating spot for some of the young people of the church. Not a sabbath would pass by without a big lunch gathering.

Shawn had the most vibrant personality. She was a social butterfly, mischievous person, life of the party, jokester, prankster, and the best advice giver. Once she entered the room her presence was known, she radiated warmth and love. She was one to always start a conversation and made you feel extremely comfortable. She had several adopted daughters and sons who connected with her regularly and sought her advice. They listened to her stories and laughed heartily at her naughty jokes. She remembered everyone's birthdays and special days. Shawn intentionally maintained connections with everyone in the family and was always the go to person if you couldn't find a contact. As part of staying connected she was kind, in terms of helping anyone that needed some assistance.

She will truly be missed by her family and friends. This is just goodbye for now until we meet again.
