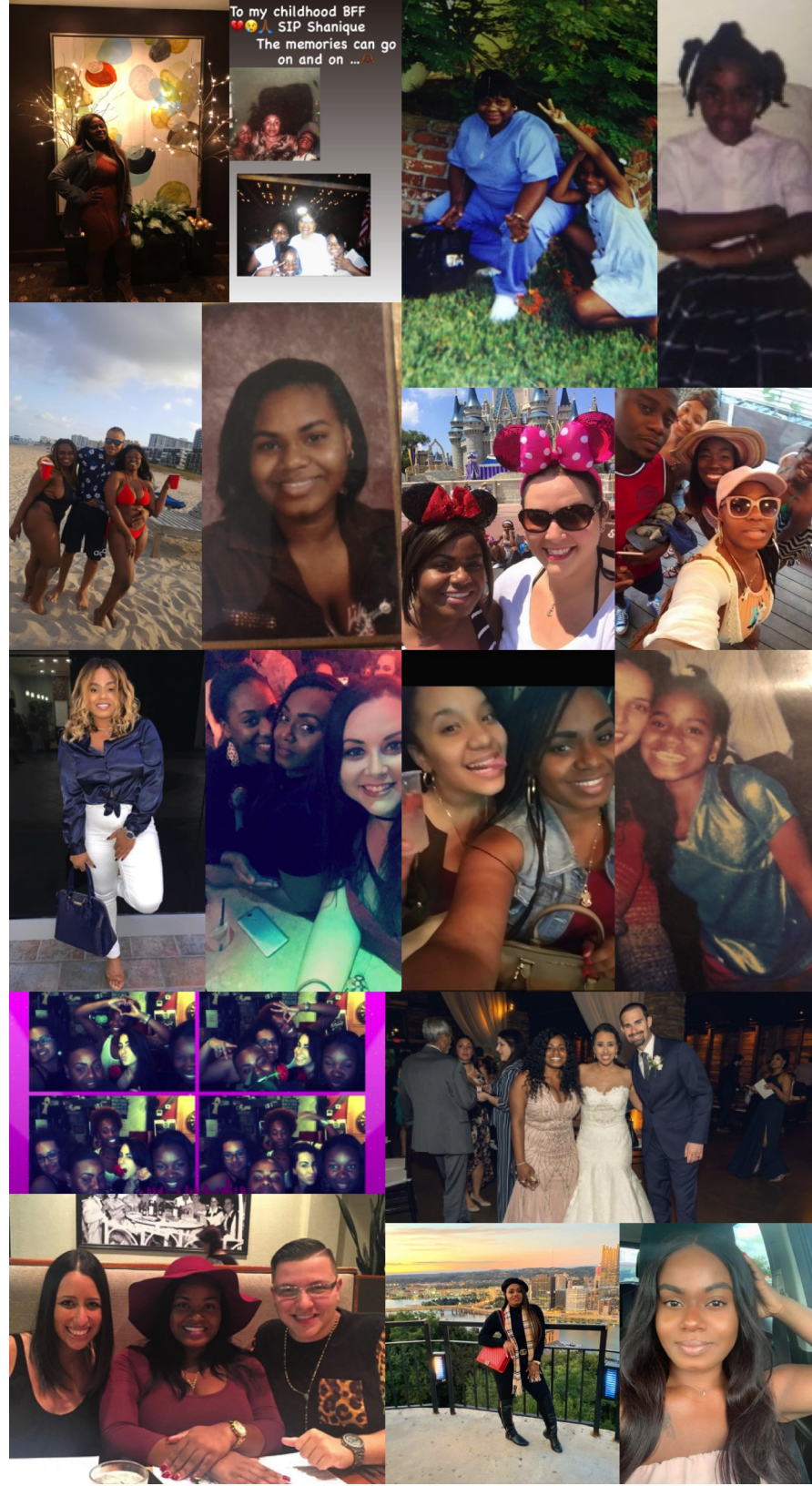
Her Life
