ANTHONY BERNARD JENKINS OBITUARY

Anthony Bernard Jenkins was born on November 1, 1954, the third child of Lula Mae and the late Lenton Jenkins Sr, at the women's clinic in Boca Raton Florida. When he was six years of age, his mother and father moved to Pompano Beach Florida with his two older brothers and one sister ("favorite sister"). Anthony attended Sander's Park Elementary School and continued on to Blanche Ely High School. Due to the closure of Blanche Ely high school in 1970, he was transferred to Deerfield Beach high school. While at Deerfield Beach high, he played football (#75), earn a full football scholarship, and graduated in 1972. Anthony went on to continue his education at Albany State University and then transferred to Florida A&M University. He later became employed with Bell South, now known as AT&T, where he retired after 33years in 2012.

During his lifetime, he had many talents and accomplishments. Anthony was a model, a tailor, an extra in "Ace Ventura Pet Detective" in 1994, a security officer for Elite Security, a limo driver (which he loved doing), and an entrepreneur! But his greatest accomplishment was when he met and married Sheral Jean Ellis. It was during her stay with aunt Julie that Anthony met his wife. Aunt Julie requested that her fellow southern bell workers go to Broward General Hospital to donate blood in Sheral's name. Anthony went to see whom he was donating blood for and that's where their love story began. Three years later on December 10, 1983, Anthony and Sheral were united in Holy Matrimony, and they were blessed with two healthy sons. To God be the glory, in the early 1990's the Jenkins family accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior, and were baptized at Mount Bethel Baptist Church. Later they were blessed with two daughters-in-law and six grandchildren.

Anthony is survived by his sons Anthony C. Jenkins (Hannah) and Joshua B. Jenkins (Syterrial), six grandchildren, Dejanae, Joshua Jr., Skylyn, Sy'jay, Anthony B., and Summer: mother Lula Mae Jenkins (Lenton Sr.-deceased), two brothers Lenton Jenkins Jr. (Judy) and clayton Leon Jenkins (Levolia), a sister Sheila Jenkins Croslin (Jesse-deceased), mother -in-law Edith Ellis, two sisters-in-law Sandra Neal (James) and Deborah Bey Dooley (Therman), one brother-in-law Derek Ellis (Salima), and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
