

"If You Could See Where I Am"


If you could see where I have gone,

Mrs. Fannie A. Garner was born February 7, 1913, in Hawkinsville, Georgia. She was one of eight children born to the late Cisro and Mary Lisa Adams. She was born and nurtured in a Christian home and soon accepted the Lord as her personal Savior. On Saturday night, May 9, 2020, at the age of 107 years, Fannie A. Garner, answered the call of her Heavenly Father, and peacefully went Home to be with Him.

Sister Fannie was educated in the Public Schools of Hawkinsville, Georgia. At an early age, she left home, moved to Jacksonville Florida where she continued her education at Old Stanton School. During her High School years, she returned to Hawkinsville to help take care of her parents. There she met the love of her life and was united in holy matrimony to Eli Dillard. She later moved back to Jacksonville Florida where she was employed by the School Board and she also did domestic work for several families. She was also a Caregiver to all her brothers and sister prior to their deaths.

Sister Fannie joined First New Zion Baptist Church after the passing of her sister's daughter. She raised Dorothy from the age of 2. She had no children of her own and Dorothy became the daughter and love of her life. She later met and married Brother Evan Garner who preceded her in death.

In 1947, Sister Garner joined Greater Friendly Baptist Church where she has been a member for 73 years. She served as President of Usher Board #1 and President of the Deaconess Board. She also served in the East Florida and Bethany Baptist Association Usher's Ministries, Women Mission and Youth Board Ministries. She was a faithful and dedicated servant of MAM of H. Mickins Court #77 – Heroines of Jericho. Sister Garner loved the Lord and she loved her family. She had a sweet soft-spoken, quiet spirit. She loved to share her story. She would say "Come and sit right here." She always offered advice, encouragement and uplifting words. In her Prayers and her Blessings, she would often remind us of her thankfulness to God and of His goodness to all.

She was also preceded in death by her many siblings, nephews, nieces, cousins and close friends.

Sister Fannie A. Garner leaves to cherish her memories one daughter, Dorothy Hilliard (Orzie), Wayne Hilliard and his daughter Carrie, Dr. Aaron Hilliard (Rosland), Aaron, II., and Emmanuel Hilliard, Nieces: Jannie Bell Bembry of Hawkinsville Georgia, Mary L. Wilson, Doreatha Adams (Joe) Jacksonville Florida, Nephews: Monroe Adams and Beauford L. Adams (Robbins) of Jacksonville Florida.
