The Obituary

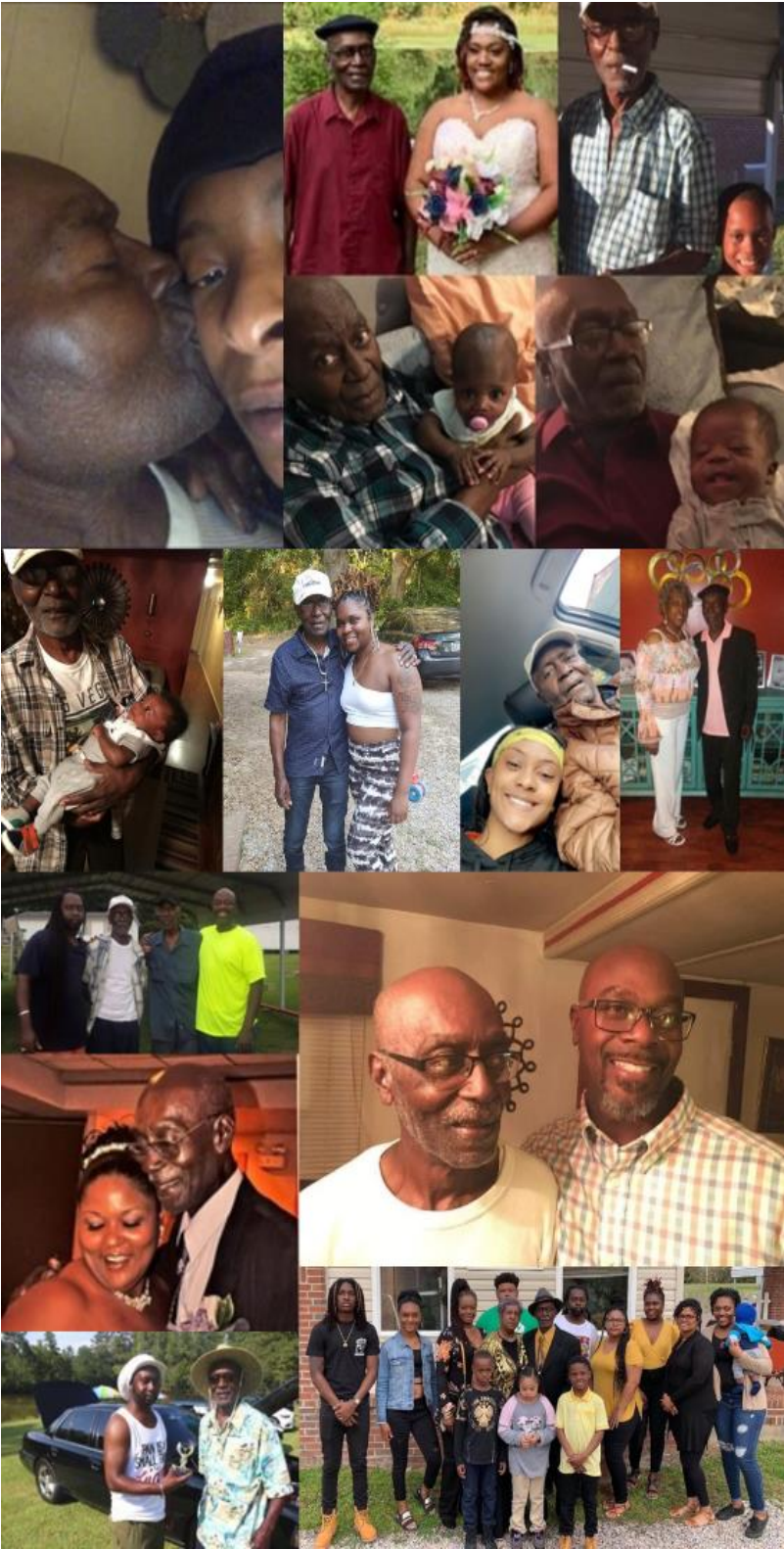
