He was educated in the Atlanta Public Schools System and attended George Washington Carver Comprehensive High School where he studied to become a brick mason. Stan was very athletic at Carver and played baseball, basketball and football helping the teams go all the way to championship status.

Stan as he was affectionally called by family and friends grew up and lived in Historical South Atlanta, Carver Homes, and Joy Land Communities.

At an early age, Stan accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior and joined Providence Baptist Church formerly located in Historical South Atlanta, under the Leadership of the late Reverend Warren Parsons and later Rev. During his time coaching he changed a lot of kids lives. He was a dedicated member of the Carver Alumni Association and the Carver Home Old School Reunion.

Stan was preceded in death by, his grandmother, Agnes Williams, brother, Johnny C. Brown, Gregory Adams and Stewart Jackson.

On January 14, 2020 Stanley Jackson departed this earthly home to live eternally in the heavens.
