- THE OBITUARY -

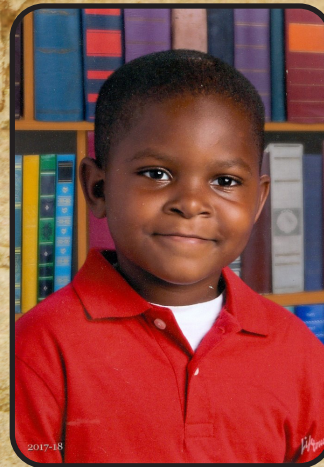
