


When I Must Leave You



Obituary 1

Bishop James W. Johnson was born in Opelika, Alabama on November 4, 1947 to parents Aliene Morgan and Willie James Johnson, Sr. Bishop Johnson was called home to be with the Lord on the morning of Sunday, April 26, 2020.

James was blessed with four loving siblings. He attended E Street Elementary, later renamed Carver Elementary and J.W. Darden High School in Opelika where he graduated in 1966. After high school, he briefly attended Southern Union State Junior College (now known as Southern Union State Community College) before being drafted into the United States Air Force where he proudly served his country for several years.

In 1975, he married Ora Lee Ruffin and they parented four boys. Ora transitioned from this life on April 23, 1988 and James later went on to marry Jessica McCord of Birmingham, Alabama. The new couple was now blessed with seven children because of their blended union.

Bishop Johnson was always a hard worker, but in the early 70s he was called to labor for Christ under the leadership of Bishop Nehemiah Smith in Detroit, Michigan. He accepted the call to preach the gospel in 1975 and became a Minister under his spiritual father, Bishop Ray Trout in Columbus, Ohio and later was ordained as an Elder.

In 1978, he returned to his hometown of Opelika and founded the Apostolic Fellowship Holiness Church. The membership flourished during his tenure as Senior Pastor. In 1989, under the leadership of Bishop Isaiah Jackson (Greater Emmanuel Temple Holiness Church; Birmingham, AL), James was consecrated as a Bishop. He has proudly served on the Executive Board of Bishops for the Higher Ground Always Abounding Assembly in Columbus, Ohio and is still listed on their official website in this position.

Bishop Johnson was a successful businessman and entertainer. He began singing as a youth and continued professionally for decades, most notably with the Kings of Joy. He also started Johnson & Sons Construction Company in 1980 and helped build many of Opelika's most notable structures. Because of his passion to spread the gospel, he wrote and published a book in 2014 entitled God's Immutable Numbers.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Aliene Morgan and Willie James Johnson, Sr.; his first wife, Ora Lee Johnson; his eldest son, James Daryl Johnson; three siblings, Willie James Johnson, Maggie Johnson and Frank Johnson.

He leaves to cherish his memory, his wife, Jessica Johnson; his children, Ricardo D. (Darnisha) Johnson of Atlanta, GA, Marcus F. Johnson, Antwone Jermaine Johnson, Monica (Juan) Jackson, Reshonne (Ben) Davis and Demond McCord, all of Birmingham, AL; seven grandchildren, Nia, Jaia, Angel, Micah, Nyah, Isaiah and Jacob; one sister, Eula Johnson of Atlanta, GA; two brothers-in-law; five sisters-in-law; a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
