- The Obituary -

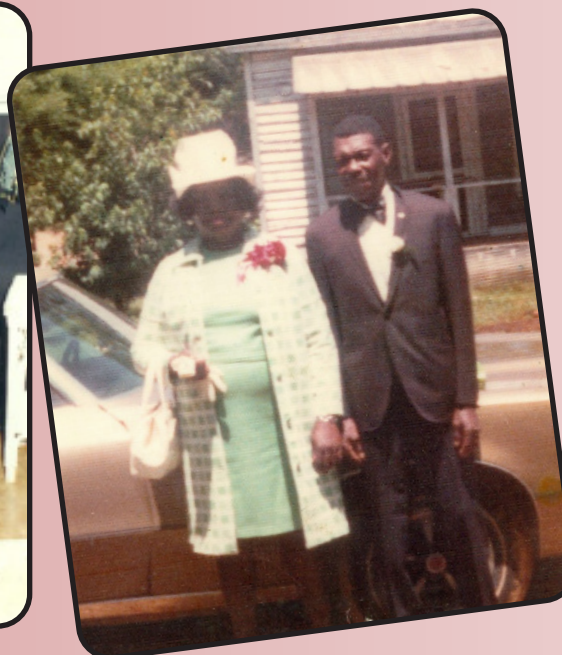
