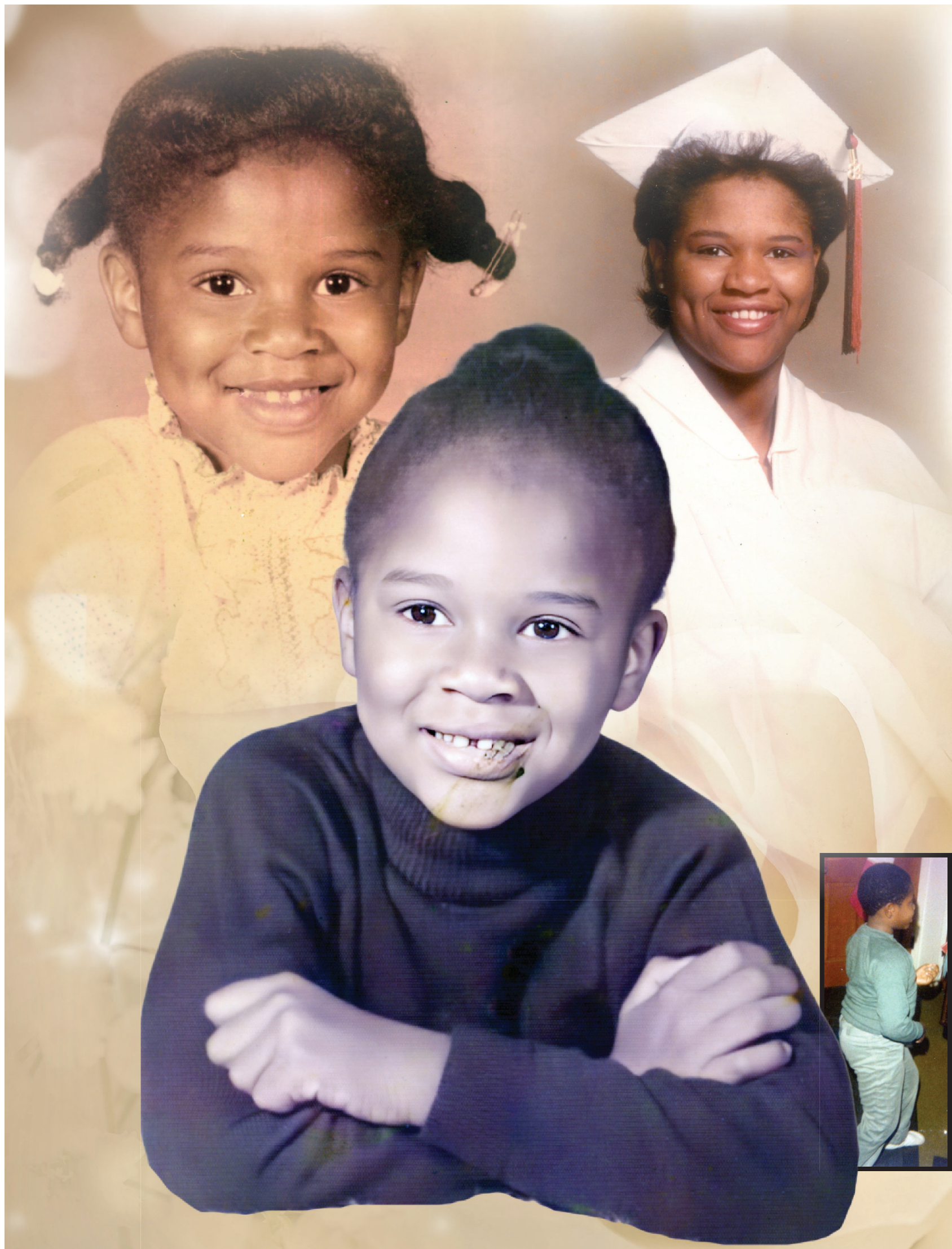
"Jackie" or "Jackie Dee" as she was affectionately known by family and friends, graduated from Opelika High
